SIMPLY STUNNING: PIANO RECITAL SURPASSES ALL EXPECTATIONS

Michael Gleeson MC for the evening welcomed the assembled and opened the evening in almost total darkness with the recital of a beautiful poem about the power of music. As Michael concluded his poetry and welcomed his audience the light rose on the altar and Michael introduced the first performer of the evening Doireann O'Carroll who enthralled the crowd with her rendition of a Chopin study followed by a sparkling prelude from Rachmaninoff. This really set the tone and you could feel the audience

Hannah the last performer before the interval had really warmed up The Kerry County Council Steinway D Concert Piano and again the audience responded with rapturous applause. Hard to believe that what had just been witnessed had been performed by teenagers.

And so to the much anticipated performance by Young Choon Park. A very slight lady took up her position at the piano and proceeded to take us through over an hour in length of the most wonderful musical rollercoaster you could imagine. Two Beethoven Sonatas No 1 in F minor followed by No 3 in C Major with a stunning Chopin Scherzo No 2 to finish. To say it was stunning, amazing, and brilliant just lends no real description to the quality of this performance. The audience got to their feet and gave an amazing standing ovation which left her with no option but to return to the Steinway. Her encore was a Mozart piece she told me that she is still learning and was in her own words not performance ready. I can honestly say it bore the same hallmark of the

RING OF KERRY CHARITY CYCLE ANNOUNCE NEW REGISTRATION SYSTEM

It has been announced that registration for The Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle, the biggest oneday charity fundraising event in Ireland, will open on Friday, 11th December.

For the first time in its 31 year history registration will be done by way of lottery. In 2015, there was an unprecedented demand for one of the 11,500 places and many regular supporters were left disappointed.

Taking this on board the committee members decided that the fairest system, in order to allow everyone a chance of entry, has shown to be a lottery.

The 2015 event was one of the most memorable cycles so far, raising over \notin 1.85 million, and in 31 years The Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle has raised over \notin 10 million for charities in Kerry.

Cathal Walshe, Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle PRO, explained how it will work:

"We are very excited to get started on our event for 2016 and will open the pre-registration for the lottery on Friday, 11th December, it will remain open for 6 weeks. There will be no need to rush, the final selection is not based on how early you register; in line with any lottery, all selections will be random. This year two entries are permitted per person to allow training buddies and friends register together. There will be a fee of €10 per person to register for the lottery, this fee is non-refundable and all proceeds will go to the cycle's charities. If you are successful this fee will be deducted from your minimum charitable donation, which is the same as last year at €85."

With the date of registration and new format now confirmed, Cathal continued:

"Pre-registration will remain open until midnight on Sunday, 31st January 2016. Then on Monday, 15th February 2016, the Lottery winners will be emailed to inform them that they have been successful along with final instructions on how to confirm their place.

"On Sunday 20th February, 2016, those who have not accepted will see their place reallocated."

OPERATION RESUSCITATION TRAINEES BRAVE THE STORMS

Despite the presence of Storm Desmond, over 70 brave souls arrived at Killarney Racecourse on Saturday last to learn how to do CPR and use a defibrillator.

"It is amazing to see people willing to come out in the worst weather in years in order to protect their friends and neighbours from cardiac arrest," said Dr Fiona Gallagher of Operation Resuscitation Killarney (OR Killarney).

"When enough people in the community learn these skills we will have the incredible achievement of saving hundreds of lives every year."

Kerry Stars made a big impact by training 20 of their coaches. Their newly purchased AED was handed over to Tom Tobin by Hanna Lenihan of Michael Linehan Heartsafe Killarney.

Tom Tobin said CPR and AED use was essential to the sports club. He hoped they'd never have to use it but they wanted to be prepared by having a large proportion of their coaches trained and an AED at hand to give the athletes the best possible chance if something did ever go wrong.

Dr Crokes had several for training and there was a good contingent from Spa Muckross.

The business community was also represented, Daly's SuperValu had a large number of staff taking part in training.

The course is a short (two-hour) and simple American Heart Association course showing

how to recognize cardiac arrest, how to do CPR and how to use a defibrillator. People will know how to do these lifesaving procedures after the course. The aim is to train a large portion of the population in order to reduce the death rate from out of hospital cardiac arrest.

"The usual story of cardiac arrest has been one of incredible pain and loss, there are however a small but increasing number of people coming from cardiac arrest alive and well," said Dr John Geaney of O.R. Killarney.

"Eventually many more people will survive. We want that time to be sooner rather than later. The only thing stopping us from saving these people is the small number of people who know CPR."

GLEESON DISAPPOINTED WITH MINISTERIAL RESPONSE

Councillor Michael Gleeson has received the following Reply from the Minister for Finance, Michael Noonan., T.D., to his request that the Department would waive the 23% VAT charge on the purchase of Defibrillators by sporting clubs and voluntary organisations:

The Minister states the VAT rating of goods and services is constrained by EU Vat law with which Irish VAT law must comply. Defibrillators, other than implantable ones, are liable to VAT at the standard rate of 23%. Parts or accessories are also liable to VAT at the standard rate.

The Minister states that there is no provision under EU VAT law that would make it possible to exempt defibrillators from VAT or apply a zero rate to the supply of defibrillators. Councillor Gleeson expresses great disappointment at the response as he had asked the Minister and the Department of Finance to consider refunding the VAT (if it is not possible to exempt or zero rate) following purchase.

He intends pursuing the matter further with the Minister as this point was not addressed in the reply received.

HEAVITHMY OPTHONS AND PORTION SIZES

SPORTS NEWS FROM AROUND THE COUNTY SKY TV AND PLAYER ELIGIBILITY HOT TOPICS AT CONVENTION

Annual Convention, held in the Gleneagle Hotel on Monday night, was a livelier than usual affair and that in itself was a very welcome change. There were no election contests to whet the appetite - all officers were returned un-opposed - but a couple of motions on the Clár did generate guite a bit of debate. A motion from the Beale club which stated that: "At the conclusion of the current T.V. broadcast rights contract, that all televised games be available on free to air TV". was passed despite advice from the Runai that Convention should be wary of tying the hands of the GAA negotiators. The issue generated a lot of debate and delegates felt that the best way to get the message to "Croke Park" was to pass the motion which is exactly what happened.

There were a number of very important changes made to County Bye-Law No. 5 which deals with Playing Eligibility and Transfers. "Permanent Residence" for the purpose of a transfer has now been defined as follows: "Permanent residence shall mean residing at a fixed address which the CCC considers to be his private principal place of residence for 96 weeks prior to date of application". The 96 weeks stipulation replaces the previous wording of "...for the entire previous playing season..."

Heretofore, two of the main criteria for playing eligibility for a player were determined by where that player resides or where the player works. The exact wording was as follows: "A player may play

only with a club in the Parish; i) Where he resides; ii) Where he works". The second criteria i.e. "where he works", has now been deleted from the bye law and that obviously means that players can no longer transfer to a club in a parish based solely on that fact that they are working (but not residing) in that parish. Certainly, this is an important change for the smaller rural club who have seen a player drain to the larger urban areas where players work.

The Byelaws were also updated to reflect the work of the Parish Rule and Player Registration SubCommittee" under the leadership of Joe Crowley where agreements have been reached between clubs in relation players living in areas adjoining neighbouring parishes. Some of these areas have been designated "Open Areas" and the rules have been updated accordingly to reflect the existence of these "Open Areas" as follows; "Open Area" shall mean a specified area overlapping neighbouring parish boundaries designated by the County Committee as "Open" to two or more named clubs".

All those Byelaw changes were overwhelmingly carried. Another successful motion was one to bring our rules in relation to the post of Children's Officer into line with those at national level. The holder of that position is appointed at Convention (as distinct from "elected") on the recommendation of the outgoing executive committee and a change to the Byelaw at Convention means that the Children's Officer is no longer subject to the "5 Year Rule" i.e. they do not have to vacate the position after serving five years in office.

The Treasurer reported a healthy day to day operating balance surplus of \notin 96,000 which was welcome news given the fact that many of our intercounty teams in both football and hurling reached the finals of their respective competitions. This surplus increases to \notin 907,417 when income from development fundraising schemes are taken into account.

MINORS AND JUNIORS RECOGNISED AT MEDALS PRESENTATION

The achievements of the Kerry Minor and Junior Footballers in winning All-Ireland titles was recognised by the Kerry GAA when both teams were presented with their All-Ireland medals at the Gleneagle Hotel in Killarney last Saturday night. It was a night to remember for the Minors and their manager Jack O'Connor as they achieved back-to-back All-Ireland titles this season while the Kerry Juniors achieved notable success in August when they defeated Mayo in their All-Ireland final in Croke Park to claim the County's 16th title.

The respective captains, Mark O'Connor and Alan O'Donoghue both addressed

the gathering while the principal speaker on the evening was Kerry Senior manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice who had the honour of presenting

Electronic Tax Clearance Certificates (eTC) will be introduced from 2016.

From 1 January 2016 all applications for tax clearance will be made through the new online eTax Clearance system. The up-to-date tax clearance status of customers will be available to be checked by Public Service Bodies, taxpayers and their agents online on an ongoing basis.

Applicants will apply for Tax Clearance in the new eTC system and will be given a Tax Clearance Access Number which they will provide to the Public Service Body and other parties as required to verify their tax clearance status.

The Public Service Body will use the PPSN / tax reference and the Tax Clearance Access Number to verify the Tax Clearance status of the applicant via Revenue's On-Line Service (ROS).

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: ONLINE SHOPPING AND VAT

QUESTION

I do a lot of online shopping from American websites. What are the rules about VAT and customs duties when shopping outside the EU?

ANSWER

If you buy goods over the internet or from a mail order catalogue or if you receive goods that have been sent as a gift from abroad you are importing goods. In general when goods are imported into Ireland from a country outside of the EU they become liable to import charges. Import charges include VAT, customs duty and excise or other duties where relevant. In some cases, you can get relief from import charges.

If someone sends you a gift from outside the EU, and it is valued at under €45, you do not have to pay any import charges. To qualify for this relief the gift must be of an occasional nature and sent from one private individual to another. You can buy some goods from outside the EU up to a value of €22 without paying VAT. If your purchase costs more than €22 you must pay VAT. VAT is calculated on the full value of the item, plus postage and duties, and not just the value above the allowance.

If you buy goods from outside the EU valued at more than €150 you will have to pay customs duty as well. Customs duty is normally calculated as a percentage of the value. Customs duty is charged on the full value of the goods plus the cost of postage, packaging and insurance. VAT, customs duty and excise duty are always charged on excisable products (such as alcohol, tobacco and perfume) from outside the EU, whatever their value.

All packages received from outside of the EU require a customs declaration, which is usually completed by the sender. The declaration should include a description of the goods, the value and whether they are gifts or commercial items. Some websites offer to undervalue your goods to avoid import charges. This is illegal. You, as the importer of the goods, are legally responsible for ensuring that the information provided is accurate and that all duties and taxes are paid. Some websites may also promise delivery from within the EU, which would eliminate any import charges, but are in fact shipping their products from outside the EU. If this is the case, you are liable to duties and VAT.

SouthWest Counselling Centre ELF ESTEEM IN



Last week we looked at the many ways we can raise our self-esteem and begin to feel better about ourselves. We also identified how these patterns of low selfesteem can start very early in life – and thus it makes sense that we think about developing and promoting self-esteem in childhood. Parents and caregivers can promote positive self-

esteem in their children by encouraging their children and making sure they feel loved, secure and competent.

Children who are scared to try new things and speak negatively about themselves may have low self-esteem. They tend to give up easily or wait for someone else to do the task for them. They can also be overly critical and easily disappointed in themselves. They tend to view temporary problems as permanent and can be pessimistic. In contrast, children with healthy self-esteem are comfortable in social settings and enjoy interacting with others. They enjoy working independently as well as interacting in groups. They work towards finding a solution when faced with a challenge and don't put themselves down. They are generally more optimistic and know their strengths and weaknesses.

To help build your child's confidence, encourage your child to take healthy risks. Allow them to take (age-appropriate) chances, make choices and take responsibility for them. When children make their own age-appropriate choices this empowers themand gives them a sense of control over their bodies.

Children also need opportunities to demonstrate their competence and feel that they make a valuable contribution. This can mean asking them to help out at home – by setting the table or dusting. Encouraging them to take on tasks that they show particular interest in is a great way to boost their confidence. Teach your child to set goals and take pride in their accomplishments. It is important to ensure that their goals are within reach and at an appropriate level for their ability. However, if your child tries and doesn't succeed, this is a fantastic opportunity for you as parent to help build their self-esteem. Let them know that no matter what the result, your love is unconditional. Encourage them to try and try again.

Overly praising a child is not the way to develop their self-esteem and confidence. Confidence comes from them trying, failing and trying again. If we tell them they are doing a 'terrific job' whatever they do, this confuses children and they learn not to trust their own instincts. However when praise is appropriate, specific and earned it is a valuable self-esteem builder.

THE WORLD OLDEST RINGED BIRD

Wisdom, a Laysan albatross who is the oldest known ringed bird in the world, has continued to surprise wildlife officials and her fans by reappearing every year at the Midway Atoll National Wildlife Refuge in the Pacific, and this year is no exception. On November 19th at the tender age of 64 she returned again with her mate. Wisdom was first ringed back in 1956 when she was believed to be just 5-years-old and has managed to survive decades, outliving many of her relatives whose lifespans are estimated to be between 12 and 40 years in the wild. She's also believed to have logged six million ocean miles of flight time since then.

According to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS), which oversees the refuge, her most recent reappearance is almost a year to the day she returned to these nesting grounds last year, when she thrilled her supporters after meeting up with her mate and laying an egg. Laysan albatrosses mate for life, after engaging in an elaborate courtship ritual and lay only one egg every year. However, it's suspected that Wisdom has had more than one partner during her long life and has raised as many as 36 chicks since she was first ringed. Her longevity and success as a mother in light of the growing problems seabirds face has offered

hope for these birds and is seen as a sign that conservation efforts to protect the refuge, which lies within the Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument, are paying off. "In the face of dramatic seabird population decreases worldwide - 70% drop since the 1950s when Wisdom was first banded -Wisdom has become a symbol of hope and inspiration," said Refuge Manager, Dan Clark. "We are a part of the fate of Wisdom and it is gratifying to see her return because of the decades of hard work conducted to manage and protect albatross nesting habitat." Today, the refuge, which is about 1,200 miles northwest of Hawaii, is home to the world's largest population of Laysan albatross, who are listed as Near Threatened on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species. The main threats to their survival include getting caught in fishing gear, and an unfortunate amount of plastic pollution. Sadly, many albatross parents unwittingly feed deadly plastic debris to their chicks, which is taking a devastating toll.

CHINA TO CLONE 1 MILLION COWS A YEAR

Boyalife, the first stem cell bank in China, is now underway in cloning cows to meet the country's skyrocketing demand for beef. The company hopes to initially produce 100,000 cow embryos annually and eventually increasing that number to 1 million annually. The product could be available on Chinese shelves by next year. In addition to beef cattle, the facility in which roughly \$31 million (200 million yuan) has been invested into the project will clone other animals including drug sniffing dogs, pet dogs and racehorses. The centre, which will be the largest facility of this kind worldwide, will also include a gene storage area and a museum. The mass production of cloned animal meat isn't new in China. The Chinese company BGI, the world's largest centre for the cloning of pigs, reportedly produces 500 cloned pigs a year. Dolly a sheep, the world's first mammal to be

cloned from an adult cell, was born in 1996 in Scotland.

EXPENSIVE WEDDINGS DO NOTALWAYSHAVEPOSITIVE MARITAL OUTCOMES

A study found that couples who spend less on their wedding tend to have longer-lasting marriages than those who splurge. The study, by two economics professors at Emory University, in the US found a similar correlation between less-expensive engagement rings and lower divorce rates. The research was based on a detailed survey completed by 3,151 adults in the United States who are, or have been, married. The authors believe theirs is the first academic study to examine the correlation between wedding expenses and the length of marriages.

Research showed that women whose

wedding cost more than \$20,000 divorced at a rate roughly 1.6 times higher than women whose wedding cost between \$5,000 and \$10,000. And couples who spent \$1,000 or less on their big day had a lower than average rate of divorce. Planning a wedding? In addition to slashing costs, you might want to invite those extra co-workers and far-flung cousins. The Emory study also found that the greater the number of people who attend a wedding, the lower the rate of divorce. "This could be evidence that support from friends and family may help the couple to get through the

challenges of marriage, or it could be that the type of couples who have a lot of friends and family are also the type that tend not to divorce as much" one of the study authors said.

USEFUL HINTS

• Add two aspirins to the water in a vase of flowers and your flowers will stay fresh for longer. You can also do this by using lemonade instead of water.

• Save yourself some time and effort when cleaning by placing waxed paper on top of your kitchen cabinets. The paper will prevent dust and grease from building up.

• Try crisscrossing two rubber bands over the claw of your hammer before you remove a nail from one of the walls in your home. The bands will prevent the wall from getting damaged.

• Rubbing waxed paper along your shower's curtain rod will stop your shower curtain from getting stuck every time you try to open or close it.

• Hot sauce doesn't just set your mouth on fire – it's great for shining any copper fixtures or ornaments that you may have in your home.

• Brighten up your silver by using whitening toothpaste to remove any tarnish. Using whitening toothpaste will also retain any patina built up on the silver.

• Lime buildup can be taken care of by making a paste from one tablespoon of vinegar and two tablespoons of salt. Apply the paste to your shower, sink or other fixtures and rub the lime buildup with a cloth to remove it.

When Veronika Scott was a student at the College for Creative Studies in her native city of Detroit, Michigan, she received an assignment to "design to fill a need." She dreamed up an idea for insulated overcoats that would double as sleeping bags, made 25 of them, and handed them out to people living in makeshift shelters on a run-down city playground. While her efforts were greeted mostly with enthusiasm from those braving Detroit's brutal winters, one woman voiced dissent. "We don't need coats; we need jobs," she told Veronika. Then she had her second inspiration. Veronika, now aged 26, found an expert to teach two homeless women to

sew and hired them to assemble the coats. She paid them with donations she received through her blog. At first, the coats were constructed in a homeless shelter's utility closet. After graduating from college in 2012, she moved the shop into an old downtown warehouse for socially conscious businesses and founded the Empowerment Plan, a nonprofit organisation. Clothing manufacturer Carhartt donated several old industrial sewing machines and reams of fabric and zippers. GM and other companies chipped in operating funds and insulating material. To date, the Empowerment Plan has produced more than 10,000 coats and distributed them in 30 states, Canada, and elsewhere abroad. The group employs about 20 people-mostly single mothers, some of whom have served time or worked as prostitutes-and pays them more than Michigan's minimum wage. The Empowerment Plan provides free GED and financial-literacy classes and offers microloans to those who gualify. Nearly all the employees eventually move into permanent housing, and some go on to jobs in the auto industry and construction.

Your cat's safe place should have a litter box, a food and water station, and a soft comfortable place to rest. It should be a private area where guests are not allowed.
