


Spring is in the air this week in the Killarney Outlook as we dust off the cobwebs of Christmas and head into 2018.



DUP LEADER TO DEBATE BREXIT IN Killarney at high powered event

DUP leader Arlene Foster, Agriculture Minister Michael Creed, Fianna Fail leader Micheál Martin and Scottish Government Minister, Michael Russell, will be part of a high-powered gathering of politicians and business leaders at a major conference in Kerry focusing on the impact of Brexit on Ireland, the UK and the European Union.

The Killarney Economic Conference will take place on Saturday next and, in its inaugural year, it will concentrate on Brexit, the challenges it poses for business, the legal issues that will arise, how it will shape future politics and the impact it will have on daily life.

Matthew O'Toole, the former chief press officer at Number 10 Downing Street, has also been confirmed as a keynote speaker at the conference.

Ms Foster, renowned for her forthright views, and Mr Russell, who is spearheading the UK negotiations on Scotland's place in Europe, are high-profile additions to the event which will see intense dialogue involving economic, civic and political leaders from Britain and Ireland.

One of the conference organisers, Simon Kingston, said Brexit will have an influence on virtually every aspect of relations between Britain and Ireland and it makes the choice of topics and the timing of the Killarney Economic Conference particularly apt.

"We are delighted that such a broad crosssection of political leadership and opinion is represented by our speakers. To have the leaders of the DUP and Fianna Fail present, alongside senior colleagues from other parties on both islands, is a great privilege.

"We are looking forward to hearing their different perspectives, as well as their reiteration of a shared interest in the prosperity of both the UK and Ireland," he said.

Another of the conference organisers, William Sheehan, remarked: "Geography and the ties of family and history mean that Ireland and the UK will remain intertwined and the plan is that the Killarney Economic Conference becomes an annual forum to explore and renew that relationship. I think the commitment of so many excellent speakers confirms that this is a shared hope."

"Arlene Foster, as we have seen, will be a key player in the Brexit process, and we are delighted to have her speak in Killarney and share her ideas on the future of the island," he added.

The conference will open with a discussion on the legal implications of Brexit, led by Dr Georges Baur, the Assistant Secretary General of the European Free Trade Association, Gavin Barrett, Professor of European Constitutional and Economic Law at UCD and Catherine Barnard, Professor of European Union Law

How Brexit will shape future politics will be discussed by Democratic Unionist Party leader Arlene Foster, Michael Russell, Minister for UK Negotiations on Scotland's Place in Europe, Deputy Micheál Martin, TD, Michael Drakeford, Welsh Cabinet Secretary for Finance and Simon Kingston, who is co-conference organiser and a member of the executive committee of the British-Irish Association.

The impact on business will be discussed by Mark Kennedy, Managing Partner of Mazars Ireland, Prof Philip O'Regan, Dean of the Kemmy Business School at UL, John Cronin, Partner at McCann Fitzgerald, John McGrane, Director General of the British Irish Chamber of Commerce and independent financial analyst David Clarke.

Other key discussions, including the social and personal impacts of Brexit will be addressed by Prof Ursula Kilkelly, Dean of Law at UCC, Matthew O'Toole, the former Chief Press Officer at Number 10 Downing Street and Sinn Fein TD David Cullinane.

JOHN MOYNIHAN, (1921 – 2017)

John Moynihan, the esteemed President of Dr. Crokes GAA Club, passed away on St Stephen's Day 2017. If ever anyone deserved the accolade of club President, it was John.

His contribution to the Dr Croke club over more than 70 years has been immense. Luckily enough, the work that he did during the '40s and '50s has been recalled to us over the years by his contemporaries of these periods.

John Moynihan, late of York Terrace, became Secretary of Dr Crokes shortly after he joined the Killarney Mineral Water Company in 1939. The manager of the company at the time was that great Dr Crokes Clubman, Eugene O Sullivan, who along with another clubman, Johnny O Halloran, recognised his ability and persuaded John to become secretary of the club, John held this position for the first half of the 1940s. As John once recalled, "my father asked Eugene for a job for his son and Eugene said I will give him two jobs – one here in the mineral water company and another as secretary of the Crokes".

The second World War was raging in the '40s and during this time, employment was at a premium. Many players had to emigrate and John, who was secretary at the time (and later Treasurer) was to the fore in keeping the club alive. On the day of a game, the club secretary had to get enough players, supply a football, boots, togs and stockings for those in need. That was some task in those hard times but John was the supreme provider. His connections with St Brendan's College were important as they often helped out in the 'kit department'. Boots were a particular challenge as very few players had them and this required a huge effort from John to get these, more often than not from the trainee priests down in 'The Sem'.

Later on as Treasurer, John maintained that the club was solvent once we had a football – as can be gleaned from the financial sheets of the time, auditors were superfluous.

It is also reported that John would be as drained as any player after Dr Crokes games giving his all from the sideline and he immortalised the catchphrase 'Watch the Break'.

Back in those days, transport to games was mostly by bicycle. There are numerous instance of 'heroic exploits' on the bike such as the one of John, Donal McMonagle RIP and Donie Corkery RIP riding to Barraduff for a match on a single machine – bar, saddle and carrier fully utilised and each taking a turn on the pedals ! John's total commitment was rewarded in 1944 when the club won the Junior East Kerry League and they celebrated with the first all-male club social held in Scott's Hotel on November 29th. Club historians often point to these events in 1944 as the turning point for the club as prior to this, hard as it may be to believe, the Dr Crokes club was very close to going out of existence. John also has great memories of the Fitzgerald

John also has great memories of the Fitzgerald Stadium Project. As secretary of the Dr Crokes, he was to the fore in raising funds to keep both club and 'the Stadium' in a good financial position.

Even though John 'emigrated' to Tralee in the '50s to work with Fitzgeralds Bros., he still remained a loyal Dr Crokes man. He continued as a loyal member and benefactor and went to support our teams whether they were in Killarney, Croke Park, in Kerry or further afield. In the last number of years, he regularly came to Killarney for vital County Championship games. However, during these games, John was more likely to be found in a local cemetery praying that we might get a right result. Clearly, with his beloved Dr Crokes winning seven county championship titles in this century, John's prayers were very often answered.

John was a deeply religious man with a great sense of humour. He was a staunch 'Black and Amber' man whom we will all miss greatly. It was an honour and a privilege for our club members to form a guard of honour and to carry John's coffin at his funeral on Thursday and Friday last week. Everyone in the Dr Crokes family extends their sympathies to his family and friends but especially to his daughter Geraldine who looked after him so well for so many many years and who brought him to be with us on great days of celebration in recent years.

Head Lice

Head lice are extremely common in school going children and their parents! They are small insects which live in human hair and feed on the blood from the scalp. Their eggs are called nits. They are not in the least associated with poor hygiene or dirty hair. They can be difficult to get rid off and it can be even more difficult to prevent re infection. Typically these cause an itchy scalp (by the reaction to them biting the scalp for blood) which is the first sign to look for them!

Transmission

Just being close enough to someone with head lice allows them to travel from head to head. Longer hair and hair that isn't tied up probably facilitates this more easily. Off the scalp, lice can survive for up to 24-48hrs so it is possible but not likely to catch them from a contaminated hair brush or pillow case. Lice cannot fly so contact is required for spread. Pets or other animals do not play a role in their spread. In developed countries lice are less common in the African population as lice appear to have adapted their claws to grasp the hair of other races with more effect.

Diagnosis

The only way to diagnose head lice is to visualise a live louse. This may be difficult in one's own hair but if an individual has a lot of lice they are easily visible on the scalp and nits can be seen as small white specs adherent to the hair follicle- similar to dandruff but more adherent. These are un-hatched eggs that lie very close to the scalp. These take about 8-9 days to hatch. Once grown to adulthood female lice can live for about 30 days on the hair and lay about 6 eggs per day which repeat the hatch/grow cycle. A lice comb has very fine teeth which allow the lice to be caught and pulled out, so can be visualised by the individual.

Treatment

Head lice are treated with combing and insecticides. Everyone infected in the household needs to be treated at the same time.

Items of clothing worn within 2 days of treatment such as hats, scarves, bed linen should be washed at temperatures greater than 53.5 degrees celsius to adequately kill lice and dried in hot hair. Items can must be dry cleaned should be kept in an airtight bag for 2 weeks after. Soaks combs in hot water greater than 53' celsius for 10 minutes. Simple hovering to remove any infected hair from furniture is adequate as lice cannot survive for more than 2 days off hair.

Over the counter treatments are available for the treatment of head lice. These may need to be repeated after 7 days if some nits persist. The liberal and frequent use of combing helps improves clearance rates.

Head lice are very bothersome but are not associated with any significant medical problems. Unfortunately they are often part of growing up!

A Kerryman has kicked off 2018 in style after winning over €550,000 on the National Lottery Christmas Millionaire Raffle. He was one of three lucky winners who between them collected €900,000 from National Lottery. The other winners were Cork man, Leslie Condron, who scooped €100,000 and Cavan-based Polish National, Piotr Katwa, who picked up a cheque for €250,000. It was a day to remember for the lucky Kerry man who made the trip to Dublin to claim his prize, a cheque for a mega €552,182, won through online play for Lotto Match 5 plus Bonus from the Lotto draw on Wednesday 20th December 2017. The lucky online player – who revealed he also won just over €1,500 after



matching 5 numbers on Lotto last summer – revealed he will mark his win by getting a tattoo and a piercing! He said: "I'm going to look after my wife and kids but I've always wanted to get a tattoo and a body piercing but never got around to making a decision. I'm thinking if I don't do this now, when I've won this lovely amount of money, I never will so that's what I'm going to get done now! Apart from this the rest of the money will be spent wisely!" FUNDING ANNOUNED FOR KERRY ROADS

Deputy Danny Healy Rae and Cllr Maura Healy Rae would like to welcome funding for National Roads in Kerry where works will be carried out in 2018. We have made representations at both local and national level. The following is a list of the approved roads:

- €25,000 for the N22 Farranfore to Killarney, this scheme was previously suspended and this funding will allow for revision of the project. -€25,000 for the Lewis Rd Junction. This funding will allow for design and progress of preferred option to rectify the Junction. - Funding for Garries Bridge N22 to allow for detailed design of this section of the Killarney to Cork Rd.

- €100,000 for the N69 Listowel Bypass to allow for detailed design and pre construction surveys.

- €4 million N86 Tralee to Dingle will allow for further land acquisition.

- \in 500,000 for the Kilderry bends N70. This is additional to the 5.3 million in funding provided recently by the TII.

- €200,000 for the N86 Ballynasare and Bal-

lygarret.

- €500,000 for N86 Lispole to Mountoven to allow completion of existing contract.

- 3.5 million for N70 Waterville town centre to River Inny Bridge will allow for improvement of 6 Km section of the Ring of Kerry.

- 1 million N71 Port Rd Killarney.

- €360,000 N72 Barraduff West pavement overlay.

- €1.35 million N72 Forge cross to Rathmore, improvement works in Town Centre. Also 100k for stagmount BENDS

2017 - A YEAR IN CHAMBER

PRESIDENT PAUL O'NEILL LOOKS BACK AT A SUCCESSFUL YEAR AT THE HELM OF KILLARNEY CHAMBER OF TOURISM & COMMERCE

As we start a new year, I wanted to place an emphasis on maximizing the networking aspect of Chamber. We held a (BOI sponsored) speed networking event in February, we produced the first ever Member's Guide, we held a social event at the May races with Killorglin and Castleisland Chambers and the Kerry Businesswomen's network. We have also planned an event with Tralee Chamber early next year.

However, the chief aim was to continue to develop relationships within our organisation and where possible, to make referrals and keep the business within the circle of those that are committed to supporting progress in Killarney - your fellow Chamber members.

The Chamber Retail Group has been very active these year. The 'Shop in Killarney' Christmas draw was all about shopping local.

The inaugural (AIB sponsored) Retailer of The Year awards took place a few weeks ago.

e Congratulations to Scarlett, our very first Retailer of the Year.

We continue to work closely with, and to "pester" Kerry county council and the Killarney Municipal district (elected members and management team). We hold quarterly meetings with the Municipal district management and have lobbied on those matters of most importance to our members (with traffic and parking at the top of the agenda).

The Cultural Centre is currently up for Public Consultation and will hopefully begin renovations early next year. Davide Mosca (whose design was critical in the awarding of the grant) is continuing to work with KCC on the project on behalf of Chamber.

We are currently attempting to access LEADER funding for a project in the town. There have been improvements on the lanes and bin storage but there is undoubtedly more to do next year.

A hugely exciting project, one in which Chamber played a major role, is the cycleway linking the two parts of the National part from Flesk bridge to the Demesne. The planning is now in place and Kerry County Council will seek funding in 2018.

The unveiling of the site on Rock road as a new carpark was very welcome. Credit where it is due to Kerry County Council for addressing this critical matter and proactively securing this site.

However, the traffic and parking issue remains the #1 topic for our members and I will persist with this matter in 2018. Thankfully Killarney is experiencing tremendous growth and our traffic planning must meet this future demand. In December, "Killarney" inducted Enda Kenny into the Order of Innisfallen.

Killarney as an Destination – For - All

All hotels that were part of the ENAT pilot project in 2016 have this year been receiving folders of different reports compiled specifically



for each hotel, the individual hotels are now implementing the required actions and they are progressively working towards certification in 2018.

2017 saw four more hotels starting on the ENAT quality programme on tourism for all. Kerry County Council have also launched a tender for the for provision of training and consultancy services for Accessible Tourism in the public sector which includes Killarney as the lead town for 'tourism for all' development. We will progressively continue in Killarney for 2018 to develop the town as the most accessible destination in Ireland with a world quality offer for all.

Tidy Towns both nationally and here in Killarney endures in its capacity to bring people together and strive to better towns. Killarney Tidy towns, the town and mountain meitheals really crystalize that pride of place and team spirit locally. The 6th annual Kerry County Clean Up took place in April and goes from strength to strength; a wonderful Chamber initiative in association with KWD and Kerry County Council.

In November, Killarney Chamber, in association with the Men's shed Association of Ireland, Haven pharmacies and the National Parks and Wildlife Services facilitated over 60 volunteers from all over Ireland working on tackling the Rhododendron problem. This project generated huge publicity as well as a tremendous 'feel good' factor. They cleared over 60 acres on land.

The cornerstone of much of what Chamber is about in Killarney is our festivals. It was a brilliant year yet again. The St. Patrick's Day and 4th Of July festivals were hugely successful once again and a credit to the committees that toil for months in advance in planning, fundraising and management.

The Spraoi Chairrai festival, a celebration of traditional Irish music, dance and storytelling has been running for 13 years and has been supported by Chamber for several years. This year we enhanced our support and assisted in the festival. Two shows were staged in Killarney House on splendid Sunday afternoons to hundreds of delighted spectators.

The Ring Of Kerry Charity cycle has always been supported by the Killarney business community and once again we played our part in a truely amazing event. So many gave of their time and sponsorship.

The Christmas in Killarney festival this year was a huge success. Yet again, we are positioning Killarney as the "capital of fun", wonderous family destination. It is bringing business into Killarney that simply did not exist before the festival.

Next year we will add the Killarney Mountain Festival to the calendar from 9th to 11th March. There is fantastic potential in a festival that will re-affirm Killarney and Kerry as the adventure capital of Ireland and hopefully attract business at a quieter time of the year.

So, onwards and upwards for all our festivals in 2018 and a big "Thank You" to all our committees.

The promotional activities of Chamber and ongoing efforts with business and the Kerry Convention Bureau have yielded some very noteworthy successes this year. The TBEX conference was, by any standards, an incredible win for Killarney, Kerry and Ireland. I believe that we will reap the benefits of this conference of years to come.

Chamber's support of Kerry Convention Bureau has helped deliver new business in 2017, with 7,450 delegates booked for 2018-2021, with an estimated value of almost €7m. We continue to market Killarney and bid for new business.

Chamber has worked closely with Kerry airport on the promotion of the Berlin flights in particular. As Brexit bites over the next number of years, our visitor diversification is essential for future growth.

The second National Tourism Forum took place in the Brehon in November and with Chamber as one of the main partners, put on a top class show.

Chamber is putting the finishing touches to a Killarney monument trail. This will package some of the existing build assets as a trail. Hopefully, it will provide yet another activity for our customers, keeping them in the town. The Purple Flag continues to fly proudly over Killarney. This joint Chamber/ Kerry County Council initiative was once again successful in retaining the flag in 2017.

Finally, a significant investment in 2017 was a study undertaken by W2 consultants on behalf of Chamber into the 'Economic Impact of Tourism in Killarney'. For too long we have been undervalued and this report will, for the first time, prove Killarney's worth to the economy, both locally and nationally. The aim will then be to argue our case to properly fund this town. I want to once again thank all the members of Killarney Chamber of Tourism & Commerce for their support throughout the year. I want to express my gratitude to the executive council, sponsors, committee members, representatives and volunteers that make this organisation such a driving force.

Lastly, Sean Buckley, Frank Lewis, Tom Randles and Anne Marie Kennelly are stepping down from the executive. I want to sincerely thank each of them for their dedication and commitment over several years. Wishing you and yours a Happy Christmas and a peaceful and prosperous 2018.

CONTRACTS SIGNED FOR SOCIAL INCLUSION COMMUNITY ACTIVATION PROGRAMME

The contracts for the 2018-2022 Social Inclusion Community Activation Programme were signed at County Buildings in Tralee this week.

The Social Inclusion and Community Activation Programme 2018 – 2022 (SICAP) follows the previous SICAP 2015 – 2017 Programme, which saw an overall investment of €4.8 million in social inclusion projects throughout Kerry between 2015 and 2017. Among the many projects which have benefited from SICAP include the 'Steps to Success Programme,' the Kerry Social Farming Project, the Men's Sheds and Revamp projects.

The new SICAP Programme, which came into effect on 1 January 2018 will continue to focus on reducing poverty and promoting social inclusion and equality through supporting communities and individuals using community development approaches, engagement and collaboration.

SICAP 2018 is based on the current programme with a number of key changes. The redesigned programme reflects Ireland's changing social and economic landscape, including the context of reduced unemployment and a general economic recovery. The new programme design has been informed by the results of a national consultation process which took place in the first half of 2017. This consultation process was designed to give a wide range of stakeholders the opportunity to identify areas for development and improvement.

SAVED FROM DEATH THANKS TO DONATIONS From Kerry

Aid agency Concern Worldwide has heaped praise on the people of Kerry and the rest of the country for helping save the life of a starving five-year-old girl in war-ravaged Somalia through their generous donations.

Yasmiin Hassan – one of 1.1 million Somalis forced to flee their homes due to conflict - was suffering from severe acute malnutrition and weighed the same as an average two-year-old when she was brought to a Concern nutrition centre on the outskirts of Mogadishu on March 15 this year.

Her condition was so bad, her mother, Aamiina, believed she would suffer the same fate as one of her brothers, who sadly died with similar symptoms at a time when they had no access to a health clinic.

However, after 12 weeks of treatment, Yasmiin made a full recovery and Concern's health and nutrition team maintain contact with her to ensure she remains healthy.

"Life and joy returned to her eyes," said Concern's Regional Director for the Horn of Africa, Carol Morgan.

"She increased her weight from 12.4kg to a healthier 16.7kg – and measurements of her left upper arm also confirmed an improvement to her health.

"It brings immense joy to the staff when you see the recovery of children we care for like Yasmiin. The staff know they saved that child's life.

"Her smile is a great relief just weeks after being in such an emaciated state. It is truly heart breaking to see any child malnourished.

"You see an emptiness and loss of happiness in their eyes. They stare ahead at nothing, not focusing on anything. They don't play and have no energy – so it is such a relief to see them recover."

Carol and her team praised the Irish public for donating over \in 1.5 million to Concern's East Africa Appeal this year – which helped fund a greater response to the ongoing food crisis in the region.

The appeal, which involved the use of those first images of Yasmiin, followed the severe drought across East Africa, which left an estimated 20 million people facing starvation.

"You can see from the photograph taken that day just how badly malnourished and ill she was and the new photograph, which was taken when Yasmiin dropped in for a check-up, shows her back to full health, proving even more that aid works," said Concern's Hashim Jelle, who treated Yasmiin and who continues to treat

tens of thousands of children in Somalia.

Yasmiin's mother, Aamiina, who has seven children, said she is "very thankful" to the Irish public and to Concern for the "kind support" her family are receiving.

Concern photographer, Kieran McConville, who took the first photographs of Yasmiin when she was malnourished, described his delight on hearing she had made a full recovery.

"At a time when the people of Somalia are dealing with so much darkness, this is a glimmer of light," he said.

CAO APPLICANTS MUST KEEP A CLOSE EYE ON THE TIMELINE by Billy Ryle



The CAO application season is up and running and continues until all college places have been allocated in October. With more than 80,000 applicants competing for about 48,000 coveted CAO college places, it's vital to submit a complete application form. So stay focussed and be aware of the key dates and the important tasks to be undertaken in the weeks ahead. The 2018 CAO online application opened on 6th November and remains open until 1st February. Open your CAO interactive online account via "Apply" on www.cao.ie, by 20th January to get a discount rate of €30. After that the fee increases to €45 until the 1st February. The closing date for online Change of Course Choices, which is free, is 31st January.

You may also use the online Change of Course Choices facility from 5th February to 1st March on payment of an additional fee of \in 10. This facility can be used to add any restricted courses not already listed on an application or by restricted category applicants. All other applicants should use the free Change of Mind option, between 4th May and 1st July, to make any course changes.

Completed online Higher Education Access Route (HEAR)/Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) forms must be submitted by 1st March. HEAR/DARE supporting documentation must arrive in CAO by 1st April. Late online applications, accompanied by a fee of €60, will be accepted up to 1st May. Late application may not be made for restricted application courses. From 4th May, you may register a change of course choices online at www.cao.ie. Check that your courses have been updated by using the "My Application" facility before 1st July. Before the end of May, you will be sent a Statement of Application Record to enable you to verify that all information has been recorded accurately. If there is any inaccuracy in the document, contact the CAO immediately. If the data is correct, you need do nothing.

Course choices and preferences may be changed as often as desired, free of charge, between 4th May and 1st July. If you submit a Change of Mind, it cancels all the previous course choices, which you have submitted. The two categories (Level 8 and Level7/6) are completely separate from each other for this purpose. Any restricted application course, added for the first time via a Change of Mind will not be considered unless it shares the same assessment procedure with a course you had applied for by 1st February.

In early July, offers of places (Round A) are issued to deferred applicants, mature applicants and to those who need to make visa arrangements. In early August, offers of places (Round Zero) are issued to certain non-standard categories of applicants such as FET/QQI and graduate applicants. Round One: the main body of offers will be issued on the 20th August. Last year, 52,374 applicants received offers in Round One. Round Two: a second round of offers will be issued to fill any remaining vacancies. Thereafter, offers will be issued as necessary until the 17th October to fill any vacancies, which may arise.

If you are applying to CAO for any of the five undergraduate medical courses you must also apply for the HPAT- Ireland test by 5.15pm on 20th January. The test will take place on 24th February at centres in Cork, Dublin, Galway, Limerick, Sligo and Waterford.

PRESIDENT'S CUP SEMI-FINAL LAKERS OVERPOWERED IN PRESIDENT'S CUP

Scotts Lakers St Paul's Killarney 74 Ballincollig BC 98

Despite enjoying an impressive start, Scotts Lakers were overpowered by Ballincollig in the Hula Hoops President's Cup Semi-Final in The Neptune Stadium Cork last Saturday night. The Cork side took over in the second quarter and their advantage was never really threatened after this. American Cameron Clark led the way for Ballincollig with 39 points against a Killarney side that failed to play to true potential on the night.

Scotts Lakers started in convincing fashion with Dailian Mason, Antuan Bootle and Philip O'Connor helping them to an early 10-5 lead. However Clark found his range and it was 10-10 midway through the first quarter. Lakers kept in touch with Mason prominent while Dan Griffin and Padraig Lucey caused problems for Ballincollig under the boards. Mark Greene added a three-pointer but Clark and the O'Sullivan cousins -Ronan and Ciaran- were dominant and the Cork side enjoyed a 22-19 lead at the end of the first quarter.

Leading 28-23 after one minute, Ballincollig extended that advantage to 37-23 after three minutes with Clark and the O'Sullivans continuing to impress. Their pressurising full court press forced a succession of turnovers from Scotts Lakers while the Killarney side also failed to convert several free throws. Ballincollig led 48- 28 with three minutes left in the half. Baskets from Mason, Bootle, Griffin and Greene narrowed it to 55-39 at half-time.

It was still a big mountain to climb for Scotts Lakers as Mason and Bootle gave a glimmer of hope with baskets that closed the gap to 55-43 early in second half. However it was the closest they could get as there was no stopping Cameron Clark and Ballincollig led 62-43 after three minutes. Ballincollig made shot after shot and committed little or no violations in what was an extremely strong quarter for the Corkmen and they led 79-53 entering the final period.

The final quarter was a mere formality as Ballincollig's advantage extended to 30 points at one stage, 83-53. Another three-pointer from Dailian Mason and a succession of late

scores from Antuan Bootle brought it back to 84-66 midway through final quarter . Bootle had 12 points in the final quarter where Lakers actually outscored Ballincollig 21-19 but it was all too little too late at this stage to threaten the Cork side's dominance.

Ballincollig enjoyed a comfortable 24 point win in the end and progress to the Cup final to meet Keane's Killorglin. Scotts Lakers will reflect on what might have been. It was never going to be easy against opposition that has one of the best Americans in the league in Cameron Clark and two outstanding Irish players in Ciaran and Ronan O'Sullivan. A costly 14 turnovers and 10 missed free throws didn't help the Lakers cause either. They struggled to make any serious impact in the match and failed to punish Ballincollig in areas where pre-match expectations indicated that they had the potential to do so. 2. Place your hand over that area and breathe in deeply through your nose (as if you are smelling a rose). Exhale through your mouth (as if you are blowing out a candle).


3. Be in the moment as you connect with your breathing and body. Feel the peace that this moment brings and remind yourself quietly "Right now in this very moment, all is well."



HOW TO KEEP YOUR LOCAL HOMELESS CATS SAFE:

While many are skilled at surviving harsh weather, and finding their own food and shelter, they can always use a helping hand during the winter months. As temperatures drop, there are plenty of simple ways you can help the cats in your community stay even warmer.

Specially-built shelters guarantee feral cats a warm spot to escape harsh winter storms. Aim for a shelter about two feet by three feet and 18 inches high, providing just enough space for three to five cats to huddle. If you're sheltering smaller numbers of cats, make the shelter smaller—the smaller the shelter, the quicker it can be heated up with body heat.



The door should be between six and eight inches wide. Consider installing a flap on the door to keep out snow, rain, and wind.

Insulate the shelter with straw, but not blankets or other materials like hay that absorb moisture. Elevate a shelter off the ground for warmth, and place it in a quiet area with minimal foot traffic.

As the weather turns colder, feral cats will also need extra calories to maintain energy levels. Providing extra food and water, and keeping them from freezing, is an important step in helping outdoor cats this winter. Wet food in insulated containers is best, as it takes less energy for cats to digest than dry food. To keep water drinkable, use bowls that are deep rather than wide, and refill them with hot or warm water. Place the bowls in a sunny spot and add a pinch of sugar to keep the water from freezing as quickly.

Remember to check under the car before starting it, as cats will sometimes crawl into the engine or hide underneath it for warmth. Winter is also the time of year for antifreeze, which often tastes irresistible to cats and other animals, but is toxic and deadly. Keep it out of reach, and clean up any spills.

DID YOU KNOW?

They still make Furbies, but an original could sell for \$900 and '80s Cabbage Patch dolls are going for \$3,000. A FEW WAYS TO REUSE OLD PLASTIC BOTTLES AROUND THE GARDEN:

Around the world about one million plastic bottles are purchased every minute, they're a regular part of modern life and contribute to the massive amount of waste that is currently plaguing our planet. Luckily, if you have a garden, there are plenty of ways to recycle your own plastic bottles.

1. You can do wonders for seedlings and other tender plants by cutting the bottom off of a clean, clear bottle and placing it over the plant. The bottle will protect the delicate seedling from the elements while still letting in water, oxygen, and sunlight and creating a toasty environment.

2. Instead of setting up an expensive electronic irrigation system for your garden, try popping a few holes on the side of a large (and clean) plastic bottle. Then make sure it's buried right next to your favourite plant, with the neck elevated just above the earth. Fill it up with as much water as it can take, and you're all set!

3. All you need to water your plants is a plastic bottle, so an ordinary watering can isn't necessary! As long as it's clean, you can drill a few small holes in the cap, and once you fill it with water, you're good to go.

4. Poke a few holes into the side of a clean twolitre plastic bottle, and you'll have yourself a sprinkler in no time! Just add a female swivel, a female hose end, a few washers for the hose, and connect them all to your normal garden hose.

6. Scooping up whatever you need with what used to be an ordinary plastic bottle makes gardening a breeze, whether you're spreading out mulch or digging holes for plants. Detergent, vinegar, or any other tough plastic bottles are perfect: just be careful as you cut out the sides and bottoms!

7. Some people put rocks and pebbles at the bottom of pots to increase drainage, but this makes them heavy. You'll have no problem lifting them up and moving them around, though, if you collect clean plastic bottles, with the caps still on, then add as much soil to the pot as you think you need.

8. Plastic bottles can be "upcycled" by cutting out the bottoms (carefully!) with a sharp knife, then using threads to decorate them. Now all you need to do is hang them and fill them with your favourite plants!

MAN WHO FOUND A TINY BIRD FROZEN TO A POLE USED A CLEVER TRICK TO SAVE IT:

This time of year brings with it flurries of snow and cold temperatures. Even if you dream of places that get a white Christmas, those who are used to snow are quite over its supposed charms. It's annoying, starves wildlife and causes many injuries.

The winter is a great time for caring people to help out a little more though. You can put out a little more bird seed and scraps and keep an eye out for animals that are fighting the harsh weather.

Nelson Wilson was out feeding his horses one frozen morning. The temperature was somewhere around minus 17 Celsius.

As he was checking on his own animals, he noticed a small bird sitting still on the steel fence. He was surprised when it didn't fly away even as he got closer and closer, but he soon realised what had happened. He kept his stock tank heated so that his horses could get to the water, which would otherwise ice over and freeze solid, it's common practice where he lives in Idaho that consistently reach belowfreezing temperatures.

Of course, this makes the trough a source of available water for local wildlife, too, and the birds and beasts regularly made use of Mr. Wilson's heated tank. This little bird must have dipped into the trough for a much-needed drink, and then sat on the frozen steel pole. Mr. Wilson quickly cradled the bird in his hand

to keep it from fluttering around and injuring itself.

At first he tried to use the warmth from his hand on the bird's feet and the pole to warm up and separate them. After realising that wasn't enough, he began to breathe on the pole, and eventually the bird's feet were gently pried free. The bird flew off with a few loud cheeps and disappeared against the clouds.

"Gentle sideways motion with my finger and thumb brought freedom for the frightened bird and a smile of satisfaction to my face... a delightful way to start a new year" he said.

HAVE YOU EVER HEARD OF LEG CRICKET?

Imagine a cricket field, all players in place. Then, imagine a bowler running towards the batsman with a football-sized ball under his arm and delivering it with an under-arm action to the batsman who uses his foot to send the ball across the boundary.

No I am not making it up - Leg Cricket is a sport registered with the International Leg Cricket Council and is played in four nations — India, Nepal, Bhutan, and Sri Lanka.

Leg cricket is similar to cricket in many ways but has its own set of rules. It is played on a circular ground with a radius between 80 and 120 feet. The pitch is eight feet wide and 42-48 feet long, depending on the age group or category of the players. On winning a toss, a captain can choose legging (which is identical to batting) or fielding. There are ones and twos, and even boundaries but no use of the bat. Instead, the players use a soccer-style shot to kick the ball. The idea of leg cricket was born in 2010 because there were many children in different states in the 4 Countries, who wanted to play a sport like cricket and soccer but did not have enough financial means, so the best of both games were simply amalgamated to make it easy on the pocket.

THE FIRST PASSENGER-READY HOT AIR **BALLOONS WERE TESTED ON ANIMALS:**

The brothers Joseph-Michel and Jacques-Étienne Montgolfier who pioneered the hot air balloon as we know it in the late 1700s were just two of 16 children born to their family in a region of south-central France, which at the time was known for its paper-making. They built boxes made of lightweight wood, which they covered in thin taffeta fabric and then filled with hot, smoky air, the experiments worked, and after a series of successful scale tests in 1782, it was time to try the real thing.

On September 19, 1783, the Montgolfier brothers set up an exhibition of their new flying balloon at Versailles, which would, for the first time, carry living creatures. Over a year or more of testing, their balloon had evolved to resemble the bulbous shape we're familiar with today, and they knew from previous public tests in their hometown that it would fly. What they didn't know was what altitude might do to a living thing.

In addition to the thousands of people who gathered to watch the flight, the Versailles demonstration had been organised for the benefit of Louis XVI and Marie Antoinette. To best test the effects of altitude, the King suggested that the brothers send up a couple of convicts, but the Montgolfiers instead went with a trio of animals. A sheep was chosen for its similarities to human physiology; a duck, clearly already able to fly at high altitudes, would act as a control; and a rooster, a bird that never gets very high off the ground, would act as a comparative case for the duck.

The animals were placed in a cage suspended beneath the now-iconic blue-and-gold balloon, and they were set aloft, it was heavily buffeted by wind as it was being inflated, and eventually lifted off, sailing uncontrollably for about eight minutes before landing in a wooded area approx. two miles away.

When the animals were finally recovered they appeared virtually unharmed from the trip (not accounting for psychological damage), the only obvious injuries suffered were from the sheep kicking the rooster.

The Montgolfier brothers would go on to perform a series of successful hot air balloon flights with humans aboard, and the rest is aviation history - but in the meantime nothing has changed for animals as they are still the first to be used in all forms of research and trials, despite the well proven facts showing that the results of tests on all animals are completely useless when it comes to human conditions.

LONLINESS



As social beings, we are hard wired to connect and most of us feel the need for rewarding social contact and relationships. Loneliness is the feeling we get when our need for this type of contact is not met. Loneliness of course is not the same as being alone. We may choose to be alone and live very happy lives without much contact with others. Or indeed we may have much social contact, be constantly surrounded by people, and yet feel very lonely. Loneliness can have a significant impact on our mental health and can contribute to mental health problems, such as anxiety and depression. Loneliness can have many different causes and affects people in different ways. Some people feel lonely due to their personal circumstances (e.g moving to a new area, loss or bereavement). For others however, loneliness can be a deeper more constant feeling that comes from within.

Connecting with the World around us can be a great way to combat loneliness. This may be having a small conversation with the cashier when we pay for our groceries or saying hello to someone we meet in the street. Phoning or sending an email to family and friends can be a good reminder that we do have people in our lives.

Our brain can try to make sense of the feeling of loneliness by telling us things such as 'It is because nobody loves me' or 'There is something wrong with me' These thoughts are not facts – and can make us feel worse. Thus it is important to accept how we are feeling without overreacting. When we feel lonely, the tendency might be to withdraw into ourselves and this can be counterproductive. The healthiest thing to do if we are feeling lonely is to reach out and cultivate friendships. Reaching out can be difficult and at times we will resist it. However, think of it in the way you might approach exercising - whilst we may feel tired or lazy it is a beneficial thing to do.

We need to tackle loneliness one step at a time. It may involve finding a new hobby or joining a club or exercise class. Another skillful way to combat feelings of loneliness is to volunteer as it's a great way to meet new people and also to learn new skills. Loneliness is a profoundly human emotion and a signal that our

need for connection is going unmet.

In 2018, if your income is €13,000 or less you pay no Universal Social Charge (USC). (This limit was $\in 10,036$ from 2012 to 2014, $\in 12,012$ in 2015 and $\in 13,000$ in 2016 and 2017.) Once your income is over this limit, you pay the relevant rate of USC on all of your income. For example, if you have income of $\in 13,000$ you will pay no USC. If you have income of $\in 13,001$ you will pay 0.5% on income between $\in 12,012$ and $\in 13,001$.

GARDENING OUTLOOK

with John O'Sullivan

Between now and the summertime there is still plenty of time to put a bit of colour in the garden with some winter/spring flowering bedding plants.

It is probably best this Spring, to use them in containers and baskets as the ground is saturated from the amount of rainfall we have experienced.

The first thing you have to do is choose the type of container you want. There are lots to choose from i.e. terracotta, glazed, plastic and wooden.

Now that you have chosen a pot, the first and most important thing to do is sort out the drainage. All terracotta and glazed pots should already have drainage holes in them.

Plastic ones probably won't so you will have to punch some holes in them. Next you need to put some gravel or aeroboard broken up over the holes on the inside of the pot and then cover with some landscape fabric i.e. mypex.

Now its time to add some compost and ideally some slow release fertilizer mixed with it. Then choose some plants... First of all you need to choose a centre piece and always make sure that centre piece is evergreen and suitable for the size of your container. This way you will only have to change the bedding plants from season to season. Here is a list of a few good winter spring bedding plants for containers, primroses polyanthus, winter pansies, cyclamen, ornamental cabbages and trailing ivy.


