FUNDRAISING WALK FOR KERRY MOUNTAIN RESCUE TEAM

An 8km charity walk in aid of the Kerry Mountain Rescue Team (KMRT), is being organised by friends of Killarney man, James Cahill, who was brought to safety after being seriously injured on Carrantuohill, last July last year. The walk takes place on Saturday June 10th, 2017, Departing from Muckross Garden Restaurant, Muckross, Killarney. Registration is from 10am-11am. Donations will be welcomed on the day. Father-of-two James Cahill, Ballycasheen, Killarney, is still recovering from his injuries.

He had initially been paralysed from the shoulder down as a result of damaged vertebrae in his neck. But, following long months of medical treatment and difficult rehabilitation, is making good progress and walking again with assistance.

James had been hillwalking with his friend, Cllr John Joe Culloty, on the morning of Sunday July 10, 2016, when he slipped, lost control and fell 40ft over a ledge. He sustained extensive injuries to his face, which required 100 stitches, and right side of his body.

The pair had been descending from Carrantuohill and the accident occurred at a location known as the Zig Zags (Bothar na Gíge), above the Hag's Glen.

Conditions on the mountain were poor, with heavy rain and strong winds throughout the day. After treating James for his injuries at the scene, KMRT members lowered him by stretcher to Ard na Locha from where he was transferred to Kerry University Hospital by Rescue 115 Coastquard helicopter. A total of 15 KMRT personnel were involved in the call-out and it was the third serious incident on this descent route in as many months. "Basically, I owe my life to the rescue team. Only for them, I might not have survived. I was suffering from hypothermia at the time. I couldn't say enough about the rescue team and the helicopter crew," said James, who is continuing to recover at home in Killarney.

James, who was unconscious after the fall, has hardly any memory of the incident. He underwent surgery at the Mater Hospital, Dublin, and afterwards spent four months at the National Rehabilitation Centre, Dun

Laoire, which he described as the "toughest ever".

The determined HSE official, who came out of hospital in a wheelchair, but has not used it, also thanked all those who have been treating him.

"I'm walking with difficulty and the challenge is to improve on that. I must start learning to do everything again. I'm doing physical and occupational therapy and hydrotherapy and my aim is to get back as close as possible to where I was before the accident,"

His wife, Carmel, has been a constant source of help and inspiration and he links her when walking.

RETENTION AND EXTENSION OF NATIONAL PARK

The retention of the existing Killarney National Park Biosphere Reserve and an extension to new areas surrounding the existing reserve is be considered and adjudicated upon by UNESCO in the coming weeks.

The request for the retention and extension will be submitted this week to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) by Kerry County Council and the National Parks and Wildlife Service. The designation is being sought in recognition of the area's unique ecological and cultural heritage and a commitment to sustainable development.

Biosphere reserves are renowned as areas that demonstrate a balanced relationship between people and nature. Killarney National Park was awarded UNESCO Biosphere Reserve status in the early 1980s due to the rare habitats and valuable wildlife found within the park. It is part of the World Network of Biosphere Reserves, including 669 biosphere reserves in 120 countries. There is just one other biosphere reserve in Ireland – the Dublin Bay Biosphere.

To satisfy updated UNESCO criteria, it is proposed to extend the biosphere boundary to include areas of the MacGillycuddy's Reeks mountains and Lough Leane catchment The newly proposed biosphere reserve straddles the Municipal Districts of Killarney and South and West Kerry.

Cathaoirleach of the Killarney Municipal District, Cllr Brendan Cronin said:

"There statutory are nο implications is this designation comes into effect communities within the new biosphere boundary will not be subject to any additional planning restrictions or limitations. Similar to Tidy Towns and Blue Flag awards, this award is an incredible opportunity to showcase the greater Killarney area Kerry as an exceptional area for nature, culture and sustainable development."

It is envisaged that biosphere accreditation will create numerous opportunities in the region including:

- Biosphere branding available for tourism initiatives and local agricultural products
- Website and social media promoting the biosphere reserve and associated groups and events
- Potential funding opportunities for stakeholders e.g. agrienvironment schemes, EU Life projects

Cathaoirleach of the South and West Kerry Municipal District, Cllr John Francis Flynn added:

"Similar to Burren Beef and Lamb and other brands around the country, we hope to develop the biosphere to other parts of Kerry and as a brand to promote sustainable tourism and agricultural products in the region" A decision from UNESCO is expected in mid-June.

EXCITING PLANS REVEALED FOR KILLARNEY RACECOURSE

Exciting plans to enhance facilities at Killarney Racecourse and foster stronger bonds with the local business community are priorities for the new Chairman of Killarney Race Company, Gerard Coughlan. The former senior manager with Kerry Group has taken over at the helm from auctioneer, John Buckley, in time for the threeday May racing festival which will come under starter's orders next Sunday.

A new, state-of-the-art 54-unit stable yard will be officially unveiled by the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Michael Creed, prior to the first race. Built at a cost of €350,000, the American barn style development is in addition to the recently upgraded existing stables and it is a signal of the many improvement in store at the picturesque track.

Mr Coughlan said his main aim as chairman will be to work more closely with the local business community and to develop stronger ties between the town and the racecourse.

"The races have a great deal to contribute to Killarney with the three annual festivals bringing 80 races over a total of 11 days. The conservative estimate is that the races are worth in the region of 6.2 million to Killarney with an additional 1.42 million in prizemoney," he said.

"My aim is to secure extra racing for the town, whether it's by adding on days to the three festivals we have already or opting for a new stand-alone festival. There might be some merit, for example, in adding a fifth day to the four-day July festival or maybe introducing a new meeting in October," Mr Coughlan added.

He believes Killarney Races can be development along the lines of the hugely successful Galway Festival of Racing as the infrastructure is already in place.

"The track is great and the oncourse facilities are excellent with a lot of effort gone into the course management over the past 15 years. The standard is right up there and the potential is massive," he said.

Killarney celebrated 80 years of racing last year and the opportunity for growth at the racecourse is enormous with the new man at the helm determined to maximise potential in tandem with local businesses.

Mr Coughlan is acutely aware that the facilities offer great scope for attracting non-racing events to the town and the Ross Road

landmark already plays host to major conferences, nightly entertainment shows, an active racegoers' club and private functions as well as a nine-hole golf course within easy walking distance of town.

"As it is we are just tipping the iceberg and the intention is to make full use of our extensive facilities to attract more people to Killarney," Mr Coughlan said.

He succeeds John Buckley who has stepped down as chairman after a successful 13-year term and he is joined by two new joint vice chairpersons, former Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce President, Kate O'Leary, and Dublin-based Billy O'Sullivan, a son of Phyllis and the late Dr William O'Sullivan from Killarney. Long-serving director and Turf Club member, Con O'Mahony, is the newly appointed company secretary.

A former general manager of Dawn Dairies, Mr Coughlan is married to Reidin and they have three children, Gearoid who is doing his masters on Business and Analytics, Lydia who is studying Commerce and Spanish in UCC and Chloe who is a student at St Brigid's Presentation in Killarney.

TODAY IS - INTERNATIONAL **NURSES DAY**

Nursing is the largest health care profession in the world and nurses are well trained and educated for maintaining the health and wellness of the patients; they are the key to achieving the Millennium Development Goals.

Ever the underdog, nurses play a key role in all of our medical institutions, being responsible for the welfare, safety and recovery of patients. Nurses have an enormous amount of knowledge and many diverse skills they spend years perfecting and developing, all the time working in decidedly tough environments where extreme stress is just a part of the job. Nurses help bring new life into the world, care tirelessly for the sick and injured, and sometimes watch the patients they did everything to save pass away despite their best efforts.

In 1953, Dorothy Sutherland, an official with the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, contacted President Dwight D. Eisenhower proposing he proclaim a "Nurses' Day", however, he did not approve her proposal at that time. The International Council of Nurses has celebrated on May 12th since 1965. May 12th is an important date to all nurses, as it is the anniversary of the birth of Florence Nightingale, who is widely considered the founder of modern nursing. In January 1974, this day was finally officially made International Nurses Day.

Florence Nightingale was a trailblazing figure in nursing who greatly affected 19th and 20th century policies around proper care. During the Crimean War, she and a team of nurses she had trained greatly reduced the death count by improving the sanitary conditions at a British Army hospital in Scutari where up to then more soldiers were dying from infectious diseases like typhoid and cholera than from injuries incurred in battle, she was also known for her night rounds to aid the wounded, establishing her image as the 'Lady with the Lamp.

Her writings sparked worldwide health care reform, and in 1860 she established St. Thomas' Hospital and the Nightingale Training School for Nurses in London. A revered hero of her time, she died on August 13, 1910, in London.

Born on May 12th, 1820, in Florence, Italy, her mother hailed from a family of merchants and her father was a wealthy landowner in Derbyshire and Hampshire. From a young age, she used minister to the ill and poor people in the village neighbouring her family's estate and she eventually came to the conclusion that nursing was her calling. When she approached her parents and told them about her ambitions to become a nurse, they were not pleased and forbade her to pursue appropriate training. Determined to pursue her true calling despite her parents' objections, she eventually enrolled as a nursing student in 1850 and 1851 at the Institution of Protestant Deaconesses in Kaiserswerth, Germany.

International Nurses Day is celebrated every year in Great Britain by organising a candle lamp service in Westminster Abbey, London. A candle lamp is handed over from one nurse to another (symbolising the passing of knowledge from one nurse to another) to place it on the High Altar. A ceremony is also held at St. Margaret's Church, Florence Nightingale's burial place, a day after her birthday.

On May 12th, international attention and respect is requested for all Nurses, we all



know the attention they devote to their fellow human beings and their bedside manner is of immeasurable benefit.

WOULD YOU BE HAPPY TO WEAR OCEAN PLASTIC?

When you consider clothing that carries a sustainability factor, things like organic cotton materials and buying second-hand items probably come to mind. It appears we can now add recovered ocean plastic to the list of wardrobe innovations for the environmentally aware.

Pharrell Lanscilo Williams an American singersongwriter, rapper, record producer, film producer and fashion designer is currently championing an awesome clothing line that aims to put recovered ocean plastics to good use. Partnering with clothing company G-Star RAW, the singer is helping introduce the world to denim that is made partially from recovered ocean plastics, the special line is called RAW for the Oceans

Recovered ocean plastic is shredded into fibres alongside plastic water bottles and then formed into the snazzy jeans, shirts and hoodies that make up the RAW for the Oceans line. So far the company claims to have collected and repurposed in excess of two million plastic containers recovered from beaches around the world.

THE **CLOONEY'S** DONATED \$10KTO HELP DOGS **DUMPED IN THE DESERT BY A** CRUEL BREEDER

Actor George Clooney and his wife Amal have donated \$10,000 to nine dogs rescued from a Mojave Desert backyard breeder. These dogs were saved by Camp Cocker Rescue in Sherman Oaks, California organisation.

A spokesperson for Camp Cocker Rescue said, "Some generous donors of ours heard about the plight of the nine new dogs we just took in from the backyard breeder and they wanted to lend a paw. The medical bills and medical to do list is getting longer by the day. The dogs in question had been living outdoors in filth with only doghouses for shelter from the heat and cold before being heartlessly dumped in the desert by their breeder and when they were discovered by the rescue organisation, they were in desperate need of care and attention.

Providing medical care and shelter for these rescued dogs is no small task and Camp Cocker relies heavily on donations. They share that their average donations are around \$5-25, all of which makes a difference in their ability to help dogs – but seeing a donation like \$10,000 is just amazing, and that's not where the good news ended. For the month of May, the Clooney's have said they will match every donation made to Camp Cocker, up to \$10,000 on top of the \$10K they have already donated.

FIREFIGHTERS THROW BABY SHOWER FOR WOMAN WHO LOST EVERYTHING IN FIRE

The Lauderhill Fire Department in Florida hosted a Baby Shower party after Nicola Taylor's apartment and baby gifts were lost in the blaze. Two days before the fire, Ms. Taylor's family and friends threw her a baby shower. All the gifts she received were destroyed.

"The firefighters were seeing a whole bunch of burned up baby items and it was very emotional for the guys, being parents themselves, it hit home. They were compelled to do something" Captain Jerry Gonzalez said.

They collected donations and received everything from baby clothes to baby carriers, gifts and gift cards. And they saved the best gift for last.

"The members of the fire department, the community, the people have donated. We were able to get you a new lease, a new apartment," Captain González said as he handed Ms. Taylor the keys. "We've covered your deposit and a few months rent".

ALL CHARGES DROPPED AGAINST ANIMAL **ACTIVIST WHO GAVE** SLAUGHTERHOUSE-BOUND **PIGS WATER**

Canadian animal rights activist, Anita Krajnc, who compassionately gave water to pigs on a transport truck headed to a slaughterhouse, has been found not guilty of criminal mischief

In June of 2015, Anita, the co-founder of Toronto Pig Save, a group founded in 2010 that "bears witness to animals sent to slaughter," stood on the median of a highway waiting for the truckload of pigs during a routine transport. The animals, which were being moved from the Van Buckel Hog Farm to the Fearman's Pork Slaughterhouse, were crammed into hot metal trucks with very little thought given to their well-being. When the truck stopped next to the median, Ms. Krainc and her friend began to give water to the thirsty animals through the slots on the side of the truck. She was later served with a summons and was formally charged with criminal mischief in October of 2015.

Anita's case garnered international attention and thousands of animal lovers stood up defending

Anita pleaded not guilty to the charge, although admitted she gave water to the pigs. One of her lawyers said Anita was acting in the public good and was therefore not breaking the law, with the farmer arguing that Anita was interfering with his property and possibly giving the pigs an "unknown substance." On May 4th, after over a year of trials and waiting, Justice David Harris said in the courtroom "he was not satisfied beyond a reasonable doubt that Anita Krajnc willfully interfered with a farmer's property in



the incident."

APPROXIMATELY AFTER 500 YEARS IN BUSINESS. WHITECHAPEL FOUNDRY WILL CLOSE

London's Whitechapel Bell Foundry, established in 1570 (but with records dating even earlier), will close later this month after centuries of casting historic bells for clients all around the world. According to the company's current owners, the decision to close is a reflection of the changing nature of how the modern world communicates. "We don't need bells anymore," Alan Hughes, whose family has owned the foundry since 1904 said "they were needed in the sense that they were the way of communicating basic information to what was then a largely illiterate population. They warned of invading armies and dangers; they actually served a practical purpose".

In addition to low demand and rising costs the East London neighbourhood that Whitechapel has called home since 1738 has also drastically changed.

"In recent years the area in which we are located has changed from commercial use to almost entirely residential use," Mr. Hughes says. "New developments now in the process of being built adjacent to our site will give us neighbours who would find difficulties with our industrial output and noise. A much changed road network adjacent to the buildings makes it almost impossible for large vehicles to access our premises for loading and unloading."

The Whitechapel Bell Foundry in its day sent at least 27 bells to the American colonies in the 1700s, as well as the original 2,080-pound Liberty Bell. It also handled the casting for the "Great Bell" of Big Ben, the "Clock Bells" at St Paul's Cathedral, and many more cathedrals and churches around the world. Following the Sept. 11th attacks, it also cast the "Bell of Hope," a gift from the people of London to New York City and the 23-ton 'Olympic Bell' the Foundry cast for the 2012 London Olympic Games is the largest harmonically-tuned bell in the world.

On March 22nd last, Whitechapel Bell Foundry cast its final tower bell for the Museum of London. The historic piece will join other artefacts from the company's centuries of business, including rare and old machinery, records and other priceless items.

CHINESE MAN TRAPPED IN INDIA FINALLY ARRIVED **HOME AFTER 54 YEARS**

Wang Qi, a Chinese army surveyor who says he accidentally crossed into India was jailed and detained, and then relocated into a remote region where he eventually started a new family. After a BBC report revealed his situation, Chinese officials travelled to his location and arranged for him to travel back to his homeland in February, along with his new family, to be reunited with old friends and relatives.

He has lived in "utter poverty" since his capture and it is unclear whether he and his wife and four children would return to India.

Friends and family enthusiastically greeted the 80-year-old at the airport with a large banner that is said to have read, 'Welcome home, soldier, it's been a rough journey.'

STAG CLIMBS TO ELDERLY **WOMAN'S WINDOW TWICE A** DAY FOR A SNACK

Every day of the winter season, 80 year old Mette Kvam leans out her window with homemade cookies and biscuits in order to feed her friend Flippen - a massive wild stag.

Since they first met one another outside Mette's window, Flippen has visited her house in Aurland, Norway every winter for the last three years – and Mette is always waiting for him.



FOCUS ON SUMMER BEDDING

Filling window boxes and containers

Again there is a large range of different types of window boxes and containers. The most popular ones are the plastic. If it's a plastic window box that you have the first thing you must do is sort out the drainage.

Turn the window box upside down and you will see holes marked out. You can either use a screw driver or a drill to punch out these holes. Turn the box back up and put some small stones or polysterine around the holes. Fill the box with compost and a slow release fertiliser to about half an inch from the top of the box and firm in compost. When choosing the plants for the window box make sure that the taller plants are at the back trailing plants towards the front and medium sized plants for fillers inbetween.

A good example for tall plants at the back of the box would be upright geraniums or upright fuchsias. Good trailing plants for the front of the box would be trailing geraniums or trailing petunias. Other examples of good trailing plants for fillers would be trailing lobelia, bacopa and bidens.

When you box is planted, water in plants well and don't put into position for a few days.

Remember that all window sills slope so when your trailing plants start to grow you will need something to hold you box in position.
