KILLARNEY PARKRUN IS UP AND RUNNING

Last Saturday June 6th was the first of the Killarney parkruns in the wonderful surroundings of Killarney National park. The free weekly recreational runs have been sweeping Ireland lately, with Killarney being the 30th location nationally and Kerry's second event with Tralee parkrun having commenced last January.

Alan Ryan, Event Director said that "All parkruns start at 9:30am in every location and are targeted at recreational runners. In fact you can walk, jog, run, walk the dog or push a buggy. It's what you make of it that counts and it's all very welcoming and friendly. Killarney parkrun's starting point is within Muckross House Car Park, opposite the Muckross Traditional Farms."

According to Córa Carrigg, Co Ordinator with Kerry Recreation & Sports Partnership, "The growth of parkrun in Ireland is attributed to the community and the instrumental volunteers that make these events happen. In addition the support that our state bodies have shown has been tremendous, notably the support of the Department of Arts Heritage and Gaeltacht along with the Killarney National Park staff assistance, which has been invaluable.

Two local brewing companies, Torc Brewing and Killarney Brewing Company have won awards at the inaugural Killarney Beerfest which was held at the weekend.

Over 2000 craft beer aficionados descended on the INEC and Gleneagle Hotel for the first ever Killarney Beerfest and with over 24 brewers in attendance showcasing 71 beers from all over Ireland.

One of the highlights of the festival was the awards programme which featured the awarding of the Champion Beer of Ireland to James Brown Brewery for their Chocolate Orange Stout.

However Killarney brewers, Torc Brewing and Killarney Brewing Company kept the local flag flying with Torc coming up trumps by winning gold in the Dark Ale category and getting a Special Commendation for their Wheat beer while the Killarney Brewing Company won bronze in the Pale Ale section for Scarlet Pimpernel.

The festival, which was held in association with Beoir Ireland and the INEC Killarney treated festival goers to a fantastic line up of entertainment including Picturehouse, Jerry Fish and The Swing Cats, a big screen was also showing the weekend's sporting fixtures. The three day festival also included beer master classes, workshops and beer tastings.

KCC NOTICES OF MOTION

The following notice of motion was raised by Cllr Brendan Cronin at the May Killarney Municipal Area meeting.

CLLR BRENDAN CRONIN: As there is constant traffic congestion on Muckross road, will Kerry County Council undertake a detailed traffic management assessment and review of the timing of traffic lights at Woodlawn junction and Ross Road junction to try improve traffic flow.

REPLY: Kerry County Council are advertising for traffic consultants to carry out a full Traffic Management study for Killarney Town. This study will look at current traffic flows/congestion and recommend where improvements can be made. The interaction of the Woodlawn Junction and Ross Road Junction will be examined as part of the study.

Cllr Cronin welcomed the response and the commitment to carry out an overall review of the Traffic Management study for the town. Urgent action is required as the traffic chaos within the town is at a chronic state. It is not a good advertisement for tourism and it is a hindrance for residents and commuters alike and action must be taken to immediately to improve this situation.

At the May Killarney Municipal Area Meeting COUNCILLOR MICHAEL GLEESON ASKED:

"That Kerry County Council in conjunction with the National Roads Authority (NRA) would devise some scheme to relieve the almost interminable delays endured by road users attempting to exit from the Ballycasheen [Woodlawn] Road on to the N22 adjacent to the Pike Hill, Killarney".

Kerry County Council replied that it will carry out a review of the speed limit By Laws in 2015/16 and that the above junction will be examined in that context. The junction is located in a 60 km zone with traffic from the Cork side entering that zone close to the junction. Moving the 60 km zone further from the junction may help to reduce traffic speed and thus make exiting onto the N22 easier and safer.

Councillor Gleeson stressed the urgency of finding an equitable solution as the present situation can result not only in inordinate delays but also in drivers, locals and tourists, sometimes, due to frustration and time schedules, taking undue risks.

THERAPEUTIC HORSE RIDING AT PONY TALES STABLES

Therapeutic horse riding for adults and children with disabilities has been recognised for decades as a means to improve physical, emotional, social, cognitive, behavioural and educational skills as well as being healthy and fun.

At Pony Tales Stables Therapeutic Horse riding is an intervention used for people with a wide range of physical, emotional, cognitive and sensory disabilities, such as Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Multiple Sclerosis, Down Syndrome, Muscular Dystrophy, Visual Impairment, Attention Deficit Disorders and Hearing Impairment

It not only focuses on the therapeutic riding skills but also the development of a relationship between horse and rider. It uses a team approach in order to provide therapy for the individual with the guidance of riding instructor.

The amount of benefit gained through therapeutic riding differs from person to person based on many factors such as the type of disability, severity of disability, motivation of the rider and connection between horse and rider. Unlike exercise machines that only focus on one muscle group at a time and do not use natural body movements, riding forces the rider to make use of the entire body to steer, control, adjust the horse and maintain balance. Because horses require not only physical skill



but also cognitive skill for achievement, riding reveals the strengths and weaknesses of the rider. While most traditional therapeutic techniques often reach a plateau where the patient may lose motivation, the pleasure and excitement of riding acts to encourage patients to work through the pain and discomfort. The act of accomplishing something many ablebodied people are afraid to try is a benefit to those with disabilities in itself.

Physical benefits include Improved balance and muscle strength, Improved coordination and faster reflexes, Increased muscular control, Improved postural control, Decreased spasticity, Increased range of motion of joints, Stretching of tight or spastic muscles, Increased endurance and low-level cardiovascular conditioning, Stimulates Sensory integration, Improved visual-spatial perception, Improved gross and fine motor skills and Improved discipline.

Psychological benefits include Improved selfconfidence, Increased self-esteem and selfimage, Development of patience, Emotional control and self-discipline, Expansion of locus of control, Improved risk-taking abilities, Sense of normality, Socialization and improved interpersonal skills

Increased perception of quality of life and life satisfaction, Stress reduction and Improved multitasking ability.

It's often said that an apple a day keeps the doctor away, but often men are the ones who are slow to visit the GP when they have a health problem. We've put together some top tips for men to improve their health:

Who says size doesn't matter? Excess weight, especially around your middle, seriously adds to your health risks. Losing just 10% of your weight can improve your health

Watch your waist: A waist measurement over 37 inches (94cm) puts your health at increased risk. The risk is even higher if your waistline is over 40 inches (102cm)

Eat a balanced diet

This means plenty of starchy foods and fruit and vegetables, some protein and dairy and limiting sugary and fatty foods, such as fizzy drinks and chocolate

Get active: Aim for 30 minutes physical activity at least five days a week. You don't have to go to a gym – just choose an activity that you like and can fit into your routine – anything that makes the heart beat a little faster or brings a sweat to your brow, such as walking briskly, cycling, gardening or mowing the lawn or DIY

Eat fewer takeaways and choose healthily: If you love Chinese dishes, opt for stir-fried dishes and avoid deep-fried dishes such as battered sweet and sour chicken and have boiled rice rather than fried rice. Choose tomato-based sauces rather than cream-based sauces when choosing pasta-based dishes

and choose pizza toppings such as vegetables rather than meat. We have a whole section on healthy menu options.

Eat regular meals: Start the day with a healthy breakfast and have healthy options for lunch and dinner. Include healthy snacks between meals such as fruit and plain popcorn

Rethink your drink: Alcohol contains quite a lot of calories so think about cutting down on the amount you drink, drink alternatives, or drink water between drinks. Aim for no more than 14 standard drinks per week with some alcohol-free days (1 standard drink = $\frac{1}{2}$ pint beer; small glass of wine; 1 pub measure of spirits)

Think long term, not quick fix: Make gradual changes to your diet and lifestyle that you can really stick to. Introduce changes slowly, for example aim to eat breakfast most days one week and then all days the next, and then work on another area such as snacks. When it comes to physical activity, for example, get off the bus a stop earlier and walk the rest of the journey, then try to walk further each week Don't wait until you've been diagnosed with a health problem before you take action!

SUMMER DRIVING

From traffic to tractors – help with the big issues affecting you on the road

High temperatures and the busy holiday routes of summer can put extra demands on cars and drivers.

But with a little planning and preparation, you can reduce the risk of a breakdown and keep stress levels to a minimum.

Here we detail the main issues for drivers this summer, and the best ways to work around them.

SUMMER BREAKDOWNS DROWNED OR LOST KEY FOBS

It's easy to lose your car keys in sand on the beach, or take the remote control for a swim and then find that car doors won't open.

Salt in sea water can ruin electric circuits and render transponder keys useless.

Most cars will have an alternative method of entry if the remote key fails – check the handbook - but it's better to keep keys safe and dry in the first place.

PUNCTURES

High temperatures aggravate xisting damage to the rubber. Under-inflation adds to the problem, causing friction and more heat which can prove too much for weak spots, causing punctures and blow-outs.

Check tyre condition and pressures, adjusting for extra load if appropriate.

Check caravan tyres for cracking and renew damaged tyres before use.

OVERHEATING

High temperatures can aggravate cooling system problems too. Low coolant level, leaking hoses and broken electric cooling fans can all result in overheating and expensive damage.

If the fan's broken it will soon become apparent when you meet slow moving traffic and engine temperature soars. Check the coolant reservoir level regularly Look out for wet or white staining on coolant hoses.

Check the fan by running the car to normal temperature and allowing the engine to idle for five to 10 minutes – the cooling fan should cut in automatically.

SUMMER FUEL SAVING

If you have to carry luggage on the roof, use a roof box to reduce drag. Alternatively load luggage on a roof rack as low as possible and wrap tightly in plastic sheeting.

If you are staying in one place for your holiday, take the roof rack or box off when you get there – you'll save fuel on day trips.

Open windows cause extra drag. Try air vents first particularly on a motorway.

Once air conditioning has cooled the inside of the car, you may be able to turn it down or off.

Don't start the air conditioning if doors or windows are open.

Increase tyre pressures if carrying extra passengers or heavy luggage (Check the handbook).

Using a windscreen shade and opening up the car as soon as you get back to it will help to cool the inside. Opening windows while you drive out of a car park will lower the inside temperature before you start the air conditioning.

FATIGUE

Fresh air, exercise or turning up the radio may help for a short time but are not as effective as: Break a journey over 3 hours with a 20 minute break

On longer journeys, take a break every 2 hours or so

Frequent short stops (of at least 20 minutes) are better than one long stop

Avoid heavy meals and alcohol before driving Counter sleepiness by taking a short nap (up to 15 minutes) or drink 2 cups of strong coffee.

Remember that it's illegal to stop on the motorway hard shoulder, except in an emergency.

HAYFEVER

Hayfever is particularly bad in the summer and if you sneeze at 70mph you lose your vision for as much as 100 metres.

Only take medication which doesn't cause drowsiness

Get someone else to drive if you are having a particularly bad hayfever day

Ask about cabin pollen filters for your make of car

Keep tissues close to hand

Slow down and drop back if you're about to sneeze

Wear sunglasses to block out bright sunlight Close windows and air vents to reduce pollen grains in the car

Vacuum car mats and carpets regularly during summer, to get rid of dust Loose chippings

Surface dressing – laying tar covered with loose chippings – helps preserve roads and improve skid resistance, but is also a cause of cracked headlamp glasses and windscreens, and damaged paintwork.

Keep your distance and drive within posted speed limits to reduce the risk of damage.

FIRE

Verges and embankments can become bone dry, and a smouldering cigarette butt could be all that it takes for roadside grass to ignite – in previous hot summers we have seen mile after mile of blackened motorway verges.

Roadside fires endanger the countryside, wildlife, and put motorists at risk because of the obvious danger from smoke reducing visibility as well as congestion as emergency services tackle the blaze.

European Rowing Championships in Poznan, Poland is a distant memory now and I have a new focus that is the World Cup 3 event in Lucerne in Switzerland. The event takes places in 6 weeks' time and our preparations are well underway. Having reviewed our races to date I'm optimistic and although things did not go according to plan during the Europeans it is encouraging to see that we are well in the mix in the Women's Pair event. The field is separated by seconds and over the last two months; Leonora and I have shown that we can deliver those speeds. Sickness and a number of things, which were inevitably out of control, spoiled our racing but now, having analysed it and identified areas for improvement, we can move on and start on a fresh canvas.

Returning to training after a competition is often accompanied by a feeling of urgency as well as increased focus. The urgency comes from the fact that our next event is just around the corner, while increased focus follows the need to make mechanical changes, which are mentally draining to accomplish. Our bodies move in a particular way, which is either easy, natural or became a habit over time. In order to change it, we have to brake the movement down into small elements and address each element individually and once 'fixed', join it together again. It may sound complicated and it is, just imagine making a mechanical change while the boat is moving, you are accompanied by your partner who also makes changes (which are often of a different nature) and there might be strong head wind or a cross wind which hauls our rhythm or speed. Sounds like fun, right. In addition, it is indeed; otherwise, I would not be at it! There is nothing better than a good challenge!

In addition, this week I am delighted to announce that FEXCO, the foreign exchange specialist came on board as my main sponsor for this season. I am honoured to have such a strong company behind me. This gives me a great pride and encouragement that FEXCO recognised my hard work, commitment and dedication to rowing. FARMING OUTLOOK



The proverb says, "Good things come to those who wait". Whether or not it is a good template for life is your own decision but it certainly sums up the main silage season of 2015. A friend of mine, farming near Mallow could not wait and grabbed a dry day last week, his pit moved with the volume of water, knocking a restraining wall in the process. He now has the headache of separating silage and concrete, added to controlling effluent and preserving a wet mess. It is easy to be wise in hindsight, the desire to have highly digestible silage is a worthy one and each day of additional growth into June was reducing the guality of the grass. However high digestibility is worth little if cows do not like the taste. Silage is a lot like wine, bad preservation equals a rancid flavour, and sunshine is needed to increase the sugar content and aid preservation. Wine can be packaged and promoted but cows are not as easily fooled as humans. These days are a silage contractors dream. Driving to Limerick this evening the countryside was alive with activity, tractors, trailers, harvesters, balers mowers and tedders were passing each other in both directions. We dropped fifty acres here at home today, we will turn tomorrow and bale on Thursday, fingers crossed that the weather does what it is supposed to. A week can be a long time

in any walk of life and it is hard to believe that all of last week was fire brigade grazing, saturated land, north winds, low growth, on off grazing with strip wires, poached fields, weather more akin to February than early June and suddenly with a click of a finger a total transformation. Now it is all systems go, that is the Irish climate for you.

It is funny how adverse events can lead to better outcomes, both on big and small scales. The storm of February 2014 left us without electricity for a week, fortunately, we had a generator, and unfortunately, it was an old one. We were cautioned not to charge electronic equipment off such devices, however needs must and I ignored the advice. My phone was a tough durable model and I plugged it into a socket in the dairy, satisfied that it was charging I was about to turn away when it lit up like a Christmas tree. My replacement was a touch screen smart phone and I realised very quickly that my technological skills were sorely lacking. However farming Apps were becoming popular and convenient. The first toe in the water nearly finished me off, hands consisting of ten thumbs meant small screens were a nightmare to navigate but a year on it amazes me how fast we can adjust. My first investment was a good one; Herdwatch has

transformed my recording of data, with real time access to information as the saying goes anytime anywhere. It was good to see them recognised at the rural innovation awards, they did not win but they would have got my vote. **By Tommy Roche**



IFA SPEAK WITH MINISTER OVER HEN HARRIER CONSERVATION

IFA Farm Forestry Chairman, Michael Fleming has met with Heather Humphries TD, Minister for Arts, Heritage and the Gaeltacht to outline concerns in relation to a draft document "Hen Harrier Conservation and Forestry Sector in Ireland" that was presented to the Hen Harrier Threat Response Plan Consultative Committee.

Mr. Fleming said that the forest sector contributes €2.3 billon to the Irish economy and supports nearly 12,000 job predominantly in rural areas. He said that the current restrictions being enforced in the Hen Harrier SPAs, bans on afforestation, and restrictions on forest operations are not delivering Hen Harrier conservation and must be removed. "I firmly believe that responsible forest management and Hen Harrier conservation are wholly compatible", said Mr. Fleming. "IFA has joined forces with the forest sector to submit a position paper to the Hen Harrier Threat Response Plan Consultative Committee that summaries how the forest sector can

deliver real conservation benefits to the Hen Harrier.

IFA is looking for a return to pre-2011 procedures within the SPAs where there was a limited afforestation programme and restrictions on forest operations were targeted on actual nest locations, said Mr. Fleming. This is the policy outside of the designated SPA's where Hen Harrier numbers have increased.

Mr. Fleming stressed to Minister Humphrey's that successful requires effective conservation and meaningful consultation that considers the views of all stakeholders. He said that the Hen Harrier Threat Response Plan must provide practical conservations solutions that are proportionate to the risks involved and allows local farmers to realise the economic potential of their land.

SAVE €300 A YEAR BY RESEEDING - TEAGASC

Teagasc was keen to espouse the benefits of reseeding to farmers at the recent Beef 2014 in Grange and said it could help save €300 per year. Philip Creighton and Michael O'Donovan of Teagasc's Animal & Grassland Research and Innovation Centre in Athenry and Moorepark highlighted that many farms in Ireland have swards that cannot grow enough grass during the year, especially in spring and autumn. They said this is mainly due to the absence of productive perennial ryegrasses in pastures.

Teagasc research has shown that economically, pastures with a low proportion of perennial ryegrass are costing farmers up to €300/ha/ year due to a loss of dry matter (DM) production and reduced nitrogen use efficiency during the growing season. If the cost of reseeding is estimated at approximately €700/ ha, the increased profitability of the reseeded pasture would cover this cost in just over two years. This means reseeding is one of the most cost effective on-farm investments. PastureBaseIreland

PastureBaseIreland, the

grassland management application tool, which stores grass data recorded by famers in a centralised grassland database, was also explained in detail to farmers at Beef 2014.

online

Teagasc stresses that the future of

an efficient low-cost production system will depend on increasing the utilisation of grazed grass. On many beef farms, some form of grassland measurement is being completed. It says, historically, this immensely valuable information was not centrally collated and stored in a way that it could be used for research. The development of PastureBaseIreland, which incorporates both a decision support tool to increase the precision of grassland management and a database to store all of the grassland data in a standard format, is an important step to advance grassland research, with an ultimate aim of developing grassland technologies that are more robust for the future.

Know Your Rights: BACK TO SCHOOL CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR ALLOWANCE

JUNE 2015

QUESTION

I am getting Jobseeker's Allowance and my oldest child is starting school this year. Is there a payment to help with the costs of children going to school?

ANSWER

The Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance (BTSCFA) helps you meet the cost of uniforms and footwear for children going to school. Your children must be aged between 4 and 22 on or before 30 September 2015. If they are aged between 18 and 22 they must be in full-time second-level education in a recognised school or college.

To qualify you must be getting a social welfare payment or taking part in a training, employment or adult education scheme. In general, you must be getting an Increase for a Qualified Child with your payment. People getting Family Income Supplement and the new Back to Work Family Dividend can qualify for BTSCFA. Also, your total family income must be below a certain level for your family size. The Allowance is €100 for eligible children aged between 4 and 11 and €200 for those aged between 12 and 22.

The scheme is open from 1 June to 30 September 2015. The Department of Social Protection pays BTSCFA automatically to many customers. This means that they do not have to apply for the payment. If you qualify automatically, you should get a letter stating when and how your Allowance will be paid. If you do not get an automatic payment you must apply for the Allowance. If any of your children are aged 18 or over you must apply for the Allowance for them and supply evidence that they are in second-level education (even if automatic payments have issued for other children in the family).

Application forms are available from June 2015 in all local social welfare offices and Intreo centres, and on the Department's website, welfare.ie. When a decision has been made on your application you will get a letter informing you of this and whether the Allowance has been awarded. If your application has been successful, you will also be told when and where you can collect the payment. If the Allowance is refused you can ask for a review of the decision.

POLYCYSTIC OVARY SYNDROME 1

Polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS), formerly known as the Stein-Leventhal syndrome, is a condition where at least two of the following occur, and often all three: • At least 12 tiny cysts (follicles) develop in your ovaries. • The balance of hormones that you make in the ovaries is altered. In particular, your ovaries make more than normal of the male hormone testosterone. • You do not ovulate each month. Some women do not ovulate at all and so may not have a period.

Therefore, it is possible to have polycystic ovaries without the other typical symptoms that are part of the syndrome. It is also possible to have PCOS without multiple cysts in the ovary.

HOW COMMON IS POLYCYSTIC OVARY SYNDROME? PCOS is common-it is thought that around 1 in 10 women have PCOS - that is, they have at least 2 out of the 3 factors above.

WHAT CAUSES POLYCYSTIC OVARY SYNDROME? The exact cause is not totally clear. Several factors probably play a part. These include the following: **INSULIN:** Insulin is a chemical (hormone) that controls your blood sugar level. Insulin acts mainly on fat and muscle cells, causing them to take in sugar (glucose) when your blood sugar level rises. Another effect of insulin is to act on the ovaries to cause them to produce the male hormone testosterone. Women with PCOS have what is called insulin resistance. This means that cells in the body are resistant to the effect of insulin. More insulin is then produced to try to keep the blood sugar normal. This raised level of insulin in the bloodstream is thought to be the main underlying reason why PCOS develops. It causes the ovaries to make too much testosterone which interferes with the normal function of the ovaries. This causes problems with ovulation - hence, period problems and reduced fertility. It is this increased testosterone level in the blood that causes excess hair growth on the body and thinning of the scalp hair. Increased insulin also contributes towards weight gain.

HEREDITARY FACTORS: PCOS is not strictly inherited from parents to children, but it may run in some families.

WEIGHT: Being overweight or obese is not the underlying cause of PCOS. However, if you are overweight or obese, excess fat can make insulin resistance worse.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS AND PROBLEMS OF POLYCYSTIC OVARY SYNDROME? Symptoms that occur if you do not ovulate:

Period problems- occur in about 7 in 10 women with PCOS. You may have irregular or light periods, or no periods at all.

 Infertility - you need to ovulate to become pregnant. You may not ovulate each month, and some women with PCOS do not ovulate at all. PCOS is one of the most common causes of not being able to get pregnant (infertility).

SYMPTOMS THAT CAN OCCUR IF YOU MAKE TOO MUCH MALE HORMONE TESTOSTERONE:

• Excess hair growth (hirsutism) occurs in more than half of women with PCOS. It is mainly on the face, lower tummy (abdomen), and chest. This is the only symptom in some cases.

• Acne, which may persist beyond the normal teenage years.

• Thinning of scalp hair (similar to male pattern baldness) occurs in some cases. **PCOS:** Possible long-term problems of polycystic ovary syndrome. If you have PCOS, over time you have an increased risk of developing type 2 diabetes, diabetes in pregnancy, a high cholesterol level, and possibly high blood pressure. For example, about 1 in 5-10 women with PCOS develop diabetes at some point. These problems in turn may also increase your risk of having a stroke and heart disease in later life. Other possible problems in pregnancy include more chance of having your baby prematurely and of having pre-eclampsia

(high blood pressure in pregnancy).

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS



IS YOUR DOG AFRAID OF THUNDER STORMS?

A lot of dogs are completely terrified of thunderstorms, and, because they can sense the change in the barometric pressure, they often sense a storm approaching before you do. Some dogs become extremely anxious during severe weather, and resort to destructive behaviours like chewing, pacing, excessively panting, and barking.

*Establish a safe area where your dog can go to when he's feeling uncomfortable during the storm. A kennel with the door open or a small, comfortable room would work well. Ideally it will be a small area that blocks out light and noise. Think of it as your pet's personal storm bunker. He will know that he can go there whenever he is uncomfortable with the weather and that he will be safe.

*Dogs can become frightened very easily during thunderstorms, and have been known to run away in panic after hearing the booming thunder and seeing the lightning. Don't give your dog the ability to escape by making sure all doors and windows are closed. As always, make sure your dog has up-to-date tags at all times, in case he does find a way to escape during the storm.

*Although the name would suggest that it is only intended for thunderstorms, the Thundershirt actually helps to calm a number of different anxieties in dogs. By applying a gentle pressure to your dog, similar to swaddling an infant, the Thundershirt works to calm them down and reduce their anxiety. They can be bought over the internet if not available in your area.

*Making more of an effort to soothe, cuddle, and coddle your pet may do more damage than good. They will pick up on the fact that you think something is wrong and will start to get anxious. You should simply be a calm and strong force that they can go to for support. Note: You should obviously never punish your pet for being obsessive or clingy during the storm. This is not a bad behaviour that they are doing on purpose. Be supportive, but not overly obsessive to their needs.

*Try to distract them from the scary noises and lights outside by getting them interested in a different activity. Play a game with them, throw a ball, or break out a new toy. If you do this enough, they may develop a positive association with storms because it means more attention from you!

*Dogs can and will pick up on your nervous energy if you are showing any. Try to remain calm and collected during the storm and it will help your dog calm down too. Talk to them in a happy and calm voice, and laugh whenever you can.

S-OIL'S 'HERE' BALLOON CAMPAIGN TO SAVE OIL:

South Korea's capital – Seoul – has some of the highest petrol consumption in the world. Car use is increasing (approx a car for every 2.5 people), petrol costs rising, and parking spaces scarce.

Everyday a Seoul driver wanders 500 meters to find a parking space. Which means

 $500m \times 30$ days = 15km a month or approximately 1 litre of petrol.

What if people could be told there was a parking space right here? With HERE balloons, S-Oil did exactly that. They set up a bright yellow balloon with the word here printed on it in each space. When a car drives into a parking space the car nudges the balloon tether and the balloon is lowered out of sight, and rises again when the car leaves. Drivers could see the colourful balloons from far away and spot empty spaces. Quick parking means saving time and saving oil.

In just one day, 700 cars used 23 litres less oil. Over a whole year, they saved much more. S-Oil had engaged with people: now they knew it was a company that cared about saving oil.

*Scholars believe that the origin of Father's Day is not a new phenomenon, as many believe it to be. Rather they claim that the tradition of Father's Day can be traced in the ruins of Babylon. They have recorded that a young boy called Elmesu carved a Father's Day message on a card made out of clay nearly 4,000 years ago. Elmesu wished his Babylonian father good health and a long life.

In more recent times on July 5, 1908, a West Virginia church sponsored the nation's first event explicitly in honour of fathers, a Sunday sermon in memory of the 362 men who had died in the previous December's explosions at the Fairmont Coal Company mines in Monongah, but it was a one-time commemoration and not an annual holiday.

The next year, a Spokane, Washington woman named Sonora Smart Dodd, one of six children raised by a widower, tried to establish an official equivalent to Mother's Day for male parents. She went to local churches, the YMCA (The Young Men's Christian Association), shopkeepers and government officials to drum up support for her idea, and she was successful: Washington State celebrated the nation's first statewide Father's Day on July 19, 1910. Slowly, the holiday spread. In 1916, President Wilson honored the day by using telegraph signals to unfurl a flag in Spokane when he pressed a button in Washington, D.C. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge urged

state governments to observe Father's Day. However, many men continued to disdain the day. As one historian writes, they "scoffed at the holiday's sentimental attempts to domesticate manliness with flowers and gift-giving, or they derided the proliferation of such holidays as a commercial gimmick to sell more products– often paid for by the father himself.

INNOCENT WOLF KILLED AFTER VISITORS BREAK ZOO RULES:

A wolf has been killed due to repeated human error at one state's zoo and people are outraged.

The incident began late last month at Menominee Park Zoo, a small public zoo in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, when a worker left a gate to an off-limits area of the zoo open. Several visitors took advantage of the open gate to slip into the staff-only area and get up close to the zoo's wolf pack.

While one mother was busy snapping pictures of the captive animals, her four-year-old son approached the enclosure and stuck his fingers through the chain-link fence. A curious 12-year-old wolf named Rebel wandered up and nipped the child's hand.

The child suffered four small puncture wounds, which were easily patched up after the incident. But when the Wisconsin Division of Public Health became involved, things got much worse for Rebel, who was the alpha of his four-wolf sibling pack.

The Division of Public Health (DPH) considered Rebel a rabies threat because the rabies vaccine hasn't been proven effective in wolves. The operations manager for the Wolf Conservation Centre, said that the vaccine hasn't been studied because no one wants to kill the requisite number of wolves to research it, but that all evidence points to the vaccine working. Rebel was up-to-date on his rabies shots through 2018.

Despite the zoo's protestations, the DPH let the parents decide whether to give their child preventative rabies shots. If they didn't want to, Rebel would be killed so he could be tested. The parents chose to kill him. Rebel tested negative.

TESTING HUMAN URINE IN ORDER TO REPLACE CHEMICAL FERTILISERS:

In 2012 The Rich Earth Institute (REI) in Brattleboro, Vermont, collected 600 gallons of

urine from friends and neighbours. The next year, the organization brought in about 3,000 gallons from 170 human volunteers.

Rich Earth hopes to double that amount this year to a round 6,000 gallons — enough to fill a third of an average American swimming pool. Urine contains nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium — essential plant nutrients that are usually mined from the earth and from the air for agricultural use.

One farmer that volunteered a few hay fields for the initial stages of the project in 2012 spread a urine solution over the crop from a horse-drawn applicator and, at harvest time, observed that urine-treated fields were twice as productive as unfertilized fields. The success earned Rich Earth a \$10,000 SARE grant from the USDA to expand the trials at Fair Wind in 2013. This year, urine will go to three farms for collaborative trials.

Across the Atlantic, studies have long established urine as a powerful fertiliser. A study conducted by the Stockholm Water Company in the late 1990s diverted urine from four housing projects to a grain farmer outside the city using urine-diverting toilets, which the Swedes have reliably engineered. The scientists concluded not only that urine could replace quick-acting mineral fertilisers, but also calculated that one Northern European adult pees enough plant nutrients to grow 50 to 100% of the food requirement for another person. Other successful trials have taken place in China and Mexico, though none as detailed as the Swedish one.

Urine is actually sterile when it exits the body, save for rare cases of a bladder infection or salmonella poisoning. REI has nevertheless developed two strategies for eliminating the risk of pathogens, either by solar pasteurisation or long-term storage in a warm greenhouse. Both have proven effective.

Traces of pharmaceuticals that end up in urine are a real concern for Rich Earth and the EPA has granted Rich Earth funding to conduct a study of traces of drugs in urine with the help of the University of Michigan and SUNY Buffalo.

SCHOOL FIRES CAFETERIA WORKER WHO GAVE CRYING FIRST GRADER FREE LUNCH:

It's tough for children to pay attention in math or English class when their stomachs are growling. So last week when Della Curry, the former kitchen manager at an elementary school in suburban Denver, was confronted with a first-grade student who was crying because she didn't have money for lunch, Ms. Curry did what anyone with a compassionate heart would do: She gave the child a meal for free. Now the humanitarian action has cost Curry her job.

The Cherry Creek School District released a statement clarifying that just because children are hungry doesn't mean a school has to feed them.

"The law does not require the school district to provide the meal to children who have forgotten their lunch money, that is a district decision. According to our practice, we provide hot meals to students the first three times they forget their lunch money and charge their parents' accounts. The fourth time, we provide a cheese sandwich and milk," the district said in its statement.

Ms. Curry had previously provided the cheese sandwich and milk to hungry children; the healthy fruits or vegetables served to other children aren't included in that meal. Children often were still hungry after eating the cheese sandwich, so Ms. Curry frequently just bought a full lunch for the children with her own money.

A report released in January from the Southern Education Foundation revealed that for the first time in 50 years, a majority of students enrolled in America's public schools are eligible for free and reduced-price lunch. According to the U.S. Department of Education, in 2013 a full 21 percent of school-age children in the United States were living below the poverty line of \$23,550 for a family of four. That's a 6% increase since 2000.
