Dettori to SADDLE UP

at Killarney Races



Legendary jockey Frankie Dettori is confirmed to ride at Killarney racecourse next Wednesday July 17, the third day of their five-day July Festival. This will be the first time the Italian jockey has ridden at the racecourse.

The 48-year-old Italian-born, British-based jockey who is known for his distinctive 'flying dismounts' is one of racing's most successful jockeys and recognised sports people. He has won all the major Flat races around the world including multiple group and classic races in Ireland.

Frankie is having a fantastic Flat season in Britain. He was crowned leading rider at the recent Royal Ascot meeting with a tally of seven winners. He also rode the dual Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine Enable to win the Group 1 Coral Eclipse at Sandown Park last Saturday.

The five-day festival at Killarney runs from Monday July 15 to Friday July 19 and among the winners at the corresponding fixture 12 months ago was recent Epsom Derby hero Anthony Van Dyck. The 2017 Epsom Derby winner Wings Of Eagles is another Killarney graduate, he landed his maiden success at the course in August 2016.

Philip O'Brien, Racing Manager at Killarney Racecourse said: "We are absolutely thrilled to have Frankie ride at Killarney racecourse on Wednesday. He is a household name who transcends the confines of racing and we are delighted that racegoers will get the chance to see such a racing legend in the flesh. It will definitely be the highlight of our July Festival and we are looking forward to a few of his famous flying dismounts in County Kerry."



Special VIP's raise the flag for the 36th Ring of Kerry

The 36th annual Ring of Kerry was launched last Saturday morning by two very special people.... 100 year old Mr. John Coffey - and One year old Logan O'Connor.

Both John, who is Killarney's most famous Centenarian and Logan, with the help of his aunt Triona O'Connor raised the official flag at 7.30am.

Triona's daughter Amy passed away in 2018, after long battle with cancer. Amy raised the official flag with Colm 'Gooch' Cooper in 2017 and this year Triona and her husband Brendan's 'Team Amy' is raising funds for Recovery Haven Cancer Support.

The cycle is the largest single-day charity fundraising event in Ireland. The event attracted thousands of leisure cyclists, completing the 175KM challenge around the spectacular Ring of Kerry, while at the same time fundraising for worthy charities. Over €1 million was raised last year alone. The goal for this year is to continue to raise as much money as possible for the six new charities listed below:



he age old tradition that dates back half a century will be maintained at Killarney Races next week when a third generation of one local family will provide the all-important farrier service at the track.

Timmy McGillycuddy from Ballydribeen, Killarney, will follow in his father and grandfather's footsteps when he joins his dad, Pa, in the farrier forge at the racecourse for the five-day July festival.

The link with the track goes all the way back to 1969 when Patrick McGillycuddy senior – who trained at Murphy's Forge in Barraduff – was engaged by the Race Company to put his skills as a blacksmith to good use.

He passed on his know-how and knowledge to his son, Pa, who is a legendary personality in the industry and, in turn, Timmy took up the trade to ensure the great tradition and top class service continues with father and son working side by side.

"Our 50-year association with the local racecourse is a great milestone and it's certainly a landmark worth celebrating," said Timmy.

While some of the raw materials used might have changed significantly over the past five decades, the essential tools of the trade remain constant and the skills of half a century ago are identical to those used today.

"There might be better nails and shoes and better quality aluminium available now but the principles of the trade remain the same," said Timmy.


He explained that a farrier's goal is still to make a horse's gait as efficient as possible to ensure comfort, increased athletic ability, greater balance and smoother movement.

The McGillycuddy family operates a busy forge at Ballydribeen where pride of place goes to an anvil dating all the way back to 1800 and it has stood the test of time.

It was sourced in the historic Churchtown Estate in Beaufort – where Beaufort Golf Course now stands. The spectacular Georgian house was built in 1740 by Sir Rowland Blennerhassett and the estate was bought in 1860 by James Magill who turned it into one of the largest dairy farms in the south west.



WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR **PENSION & WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?**

Many pensions can be accessed from age 60, a lot of the rules depend on whether you are an employee or self employed. KERRY DELEGATION PROMOTE COUNTY IN THE UK



Representatives from Kerry attended the launch of a new programme which is led by the British Embassy in Ireland and aims to promote closer links between regions of the UK and the southwest of Ireland. The delegation included Kerry County Council and major global companies and innovative indigenous firms including Fexco, Liebherr, the Agri-Tech Centre of Excellence and Tralee Chamber Alliance. The UK launch of the British Embassy-led programme 'Joining the Dots' took place on Wednesday at the Manufacturing Technology Centre (MTC) in Coventry and is the second phase in the programme, following a successful launch in November 2018 with Cork Chamber. The report identifies areas for growth and offers concrete recommendations on how to promote stronger business partnerships and collaboration between the southwest of Ireland and the UK. Launching the report, the British Ambassador to Ireland, Robin Barnett, said that the large Irish delegation

'Today's report launch is the next stage in our Joining the Dots journey and builds on the enthusiasm shown at the Irish launch in Cork last year. For companies in the South West of Ireland, the report highlights that the UK remains a key target market with untapped opportunities. Similarly, Ireland is seen as a logical first step for many UK companies seeking to test their capability in overseas markets.' Mr. Barnett continued: "The South west of Ireland is a region with an exciting future and the strength and quality of the delegation is a testament to the appetite for this initiative. I am delighted that in addition to a strong Cork contingent, we are welcoming senior business and government representatives from Limerick, Kerry and elsewhere in Ireland." The report launch was followed by two panel discussions where attendees heard from Moira Murrell, Chief Executive of

Kerry County Council discuss the subject of 'Creating thriving regional economies' and from and Pat O'Leary, Liebherr, on 'Doing business in the Midlands and South West of Ireland.'

Speaking about the event, Moira Murrell said: 'Regional development and closer links with regions in other countries is a critical part of economic development for rural counties like Kerry. As our closest neighbour and one of our largest trading partners, increased linkages and connections with the regions of the UK are vital at the present time.

'This event gave us an opportunity to highlight key economic initiatives in the county as well as learning from regions in the UK about what they are doing to create jobs, attract investment and sustain enterprise.'

York), a fine accordion player, and Stephen Carroll(Maulykevane) who also played accordion.





Women waiting over one year for Gynaecology appointments at UHK

Fianna Fáil Spokesperson on Primary Care an TD for Kerry John Brassil says women in Kerry are waiting too long for what should be routine gynaecology appointments.

New figures released to Deputy Brassil reveal that there are 761 women on the list for an appointment at University Hospital Kerry, with more than 100 waiting over a year.

Deputy Brassil explained, "Last weekend it was revealed that more than 30,000 women across the country are waiting for an out-patient appointment to see a gynaecologist – a 43% increase since 2014. It appears from the figures released to me that the situation in Kerry is in line with those statistics, which is a very worrying development.

"Waiting lists across all specialties are spiralling out of control and gynaecology is the latest to suffer under Fine Gael's failed health policies.

"There is no doubt that this government's failure to recruit and retain consultants is having an impact on these long waiting lists, and now women in Kerry and across the country are suffering. Early intervention is so important, yet women in Kerry could be facing waits of over one year to be seen by a gynaecologist. This is a shocking record for a first world country.

"We should be providing better care to women in 2019. We have the third highest fertility rate in the EU but less than half of the EU average number of specialists in obstetrics and gynaecology. This deficit must be addressed so that women can receive more timely assessments and intervention", concluded Deputy Brassil.

Water fountain for the town





KERRY v MAYO

PASSENGERS URGED TO 'REFEREE' DRIVING HABITS ON SUNDAY

'Drivers should be aware that they are responsible for passenger safety. So far this year, ten passengers have been killed on Irish roads out of a total of 79 people who have lost their lives on the roads. We don't want to add to those figures this weekend, said Michelle.

 - Distraction and inattention







Take time to smell the roses...

Roses offer the very best value as they flower for a long period and provide colour and fragrance. With a little care you can enjoy them year after year.

Buying Roses

When buying a rose the secret is to purchase early in the gardening season, in November or March depending on the type of plant. You will find there is a greater selection available in garden centres at these times. From autumn into early winter, many garden centres stock bare-root roses. These have been lifted from the ground and their roots wrapped to protect from dehydration. The roses are dormant and can be planted, weather permitting, any time up to mid-March. At any other time of year, roses can be purchased container-grown.

This prevents disturbance of growing roots and allows you a longer planting period. Containergrown roses are usually available from the beginning of March until mid-summer. When buying a rose, quality is all important. It is recommended purchasing from a reliable source. This way, you are guaranteed true-to-name varieties and excellent young plants, which get the very best start.

Planting

For best results, bare-root roses should be planted from October until the end of March. Container-grown plants can be planted at any time of year, providing the weather and soil conditions are suitable. Best results, though, are achieved by planting in either spring or autumn. Soil preparation is all-important. Once you have planted your rose, you will expect many years of pleasure and enjoyment from it, so a little time and effort spent on preparing the soil is setting up the right conditions to guarantee you a healthy and beautiful plant for as long as possible.

Dig the soil well in advance and incorporate organic matter, for example, well-rotted manure. This will help to enrich the soil, improving its texture and quality and also provide necessary nutrients for the new rose. As far possible, position your roses in full sun. This will encourage extra fl owers and a strong, healthy-growing plant. Avoid soil where there are extremes of either wet or drought. Roses enjoy average moisture and, in very dry spells, may require additional watering.

Care

Pruning Carry out pruning in winter while roses are dormant. It is important to use a sharp secateurs as this will give a clean cut preventing disease entering the wound. It also means you are less likely to crush the stem. Make Start Gardening Series Growing the success of Irish food & horticulture 13 Roses the cut approximately half a centimetre above a bud. Ideally this should be slightly sloping away to the back but not sloping below the bud itself. If possible, you should avoid leaving long snags above a bud as these will die back sometimes carrying dead growth down behind the bud which may damage new growth.

When pruning, you should cut out all dead and diseased growth. Also, cut back all of last year's growth to between 2 and 4 buds above the ground. Try to select outward-facing buds. This will encourage a more pleasing shape and helps avoid tangled stems. With climbing roses you will need to remove any stems growing in the wrong direction, but rather than cutting hard to the ground you will need to tidy the plant back to the wall.

Dead-Heading

Dead-heading roses is very important and by carrying out this practice you can guarantee yourself extra fl owers. By removing the dead fl owers, you

are preventing energy going into developing seedheads. When the flowers have faded, cut the stem 3-4 leaves below the flower. This will ensure a new flowering shoot, which will bring you extra colour a little later. There is no need to remove dead flowers on roses which are grown for their decorative hips or roses which are only once-flowering.


Feeding

Roses provide a fantastic display and offer superb value for money. But to get the very best from your rose and to guarantee a healthy show of fl owers, it is essential that you feed on a regular basis.

Rose blossoms make a great demand on the plant and so supplementing with feeding ensures a good crop. The most popular rose feeds, which are widely available, are granular fertilisers. These contain a special blend of nutrients, including magnesium, which is very important to roses. This blend is specially formulated to give the rose everything it needs to perform well.

These granular feeds should only be used while the rose is in active growth. They do not contribute to improving the soil but act quickly by feeding the rose. Liquid fertilisers are also available. These are an excellent choice for quick feeding. It is advisable to feed on a regular basis, following instructions.

It is best to use little and often rather than apply one strong application. To improve the quality of soil and feed at the same time, it is a good idea to apply a mulch of well-rotted manure. This can be purchased pre-packed in garden centres. It is most benefi cial when applied in autumn, allowing the winter weather time to work on it.

Final Stages

It's hard to believe that the Run Killarney is coming up next Saturday, 20th July. This is the last article in the series for the race. If you've followed a training plan, then the main thing now is to relax and let the training work.

Race Tips

It's time to create your race plan and stick to it. Don't go out too fast and ruin all your training!

- Night before the race once you've checked out everything at race HQ, try to limit your time walking around. Stay off your feet as much as possible, have dinner booked so that you can eat when suits you. Don't over-eat the night before the race, just a normal dinner, but still plenty of water.
- 2. Sleep try to get to bed at a good time. But don't stress about getting to sleep. Put your mind at ease that actually the most important night's sleep are 2/3 nights before the race, if you don't get much the night before, you'll still be fine.
- 3. Transport and logistics make sure you know how you are getting there, and don't leave yourself tight for time. If you're doing the half-marathon bring warm gear and a hat for the start line. You can pop it in a bag to be dropped down to the finish line by the race organisers.
- Gear don't change from what you have been training in over these months...nothing new.
- 5. Food breakfast, stick to what you know, despite the temptation that might be around in hotels. If you are used to Weetabix for example, ask your hotel if they have it, if not, go out and buy it the night before, or better, bring some with you.
- 6. Start line area before you start queueing for the toilets, which may take some time, take a few pictures, enjoy the moment, you'll want to remember that start line.
- 7. Half-marathon pacers these guys are great for keeping you to your times, you won't miss the big balloons they have. Run with the group, enjoy the chats!
- Water stops make yourself familiar with these on the course map, so you can plan your hydration. Please do not litter.
- Gels only take one if you've trained taking one.
- Finish line enjoy this. Get yourself sometime in the hot tub...you deserve it...and a beer...and a burger!!

Best of luck to everyone taking part, it promises to be an awesome day once again! Congratulations on making it to the start line – the hard work is done!



ABOUT THE CHARITIES

Skellig Stars

Skellig Stars Special Olympic Club is a group of children and adult athletes with special needs who train on a weekly basis throughout the school year, training for fun and to take part in the Ireland games. The Skellig Stars annually visit all the clubs in Kerry for a fun day. They also host their own fun sports day in Cahirciveen. Skellig Stars provides children and adults of all ages with an important physical outlet through athletics and basketball games. Currently there are approx. 25 athletes ranging in age from 6 to 62 years old. Skellig Stars are fund-raising to upgrade their facilitates to install an eight lane running track for the athletes to practice and train on. The club currently uses the sports hall in the local secondary school, Colaiste na Sceilge to train indoors. A proper track is important for the athletes to train on as it would allow them to practice on the surface they will compete on. The Kerry Hospice Foundation

The Kerry Hospice Foundation (KHF) is a voluntary organisation to help provide funding and support for palliative care services in Kerry. The core idea is still as important now as the day, in 1990, when the organisation was founded. The voluntary part of our organisation is very important to us, as well as a source of great pride. No member of KHF is paid for any of their work, time, effort or any costs incurred while helping the charity. The Foundation exists only to deliver on services delivered in Kerry. All money raised in the county is spent locally.

Dingle Cliff and Coast Rescue

Irish Coast Guard Units are crewed by 950 male and female volunteers.

Coast Guard Units and their Stationhouses (sometimes known locally as 'The Rocket House' from using the old Breeches Buoy rescue rockets) are positioned at strategic locations around Ireland and possess initial action fast response equipment with adequate geographical range. This kit includes radio communications systems, cliff rescue gear, rescue, patrol, transport and search boats, response vehicles, line throwing apparatus, first aid equipment, personal protective equipment, uniforms, portable generators and lights and day and night search gear. All Units are operated entirely by local crews (live within 10 minutes of the Stationhouse) who give freely of their valuable time and effort to the Coast Guard, local community and 'those in peril on the sea, cliffs and coasts of Ireland'. Training is provided for the volunteers, who are on-call, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.



DID YOU KNOW?

On July 1 1690 or on 12 July 1691 (Julian calendar), equivalent to 22 July on the Gregorian calendar, 30 miles north of Dublin, across the River Boyne a battle began between William of Orange, a Dutch protestant who had recently been jointly crowned monarch of England, Scotland and Ireland during the 'Glorious Revolution' and his uncle, the Catholic James II.

James, the last of the Stuart kings to seek absolute rule, had lost his throne to William the previous year after Protestant nobles encouraged William to seize it, fearing James was founding a Catholic royal dynasty. James chose not to oppose him and was allowed to escape to exile in France.

King William fought, aided by the arms, men, and treasures of his allies in the League of Augsburg, and part of his expenses at the Battle of the Boyne were said to be paid for by His Holiness Pope Alexander VIII, apparently due to the fact that a few years before a French army had marched upon Rome to avenge a slight insult offered to France, it is also said by historians that when news of King William's victory reached Rome, a Te Deum was sung in celebration of his victory over the Irish adherents of King James and King Louis.

France's Catholic King Louis XIV supplied James with troops and in 1689 he landed back in Ireland in the hope of regaining the English crown. A predominantly Catholic Ireland was happy to back him.

William marched south from his landing point in the North of the country to take on James' stronghold near Dublin. The ensuing battle at the River Boyne was the final time two crowned kings of England, Scotland and Ireland met in battle.

James's defeat put an end to Catholic hopes of recovering property that had been confiscated from Irish landowners over the years since Oliver Cromwell's involvement in Ireland. For Protestants in Ulster it ensured the survival of the Protestant, English-speaking areas. The victory is still celebrated every July 12th in Northern Ireland by the Orange Order, named after William of Orange.

The Orange Order is an international Protestant fraternal society, with particularly strong representation in Northern Ireland. Scotland and Newfoundland. The Loyal Orange Institution is a conservative unionist group, seeking to keep Northern Ireland (and Scotland) within the United Kingdom.

18 HOURS OF UNRELEASED CONTENT WERE KIDNAPPED FROM RADIOHEADS MUSICAL ARCHIVE

The hacker that stole the music of legendary English rock group Radiohead demanded a ransom of \$150,000 for the unreleased music's return – but rather than give in to the demands of a thief, the band published the material to their Bandcamp page for 18 days at a cost of £18 (€20) in aid of Extinction Rebellion, an environmental organisation that now operates in 59 countries with 348 groups across 248 cities and towns.



"The climate and ecological emergency demands courage, truth-telling and generosity like never before," wrote the organisation. Words are inadequate, but actions do change the world. From the bottom of our hearts and on behalf of the Extinction Rebellion movement we thank Radiohead for supporting us so that we can continue to build our already far reaching and powerful movement of non violent civil disobedience,"

THE 5th OLDEST TREE IN THE WORLD

In a stand of bald cypress trees in a North Carolina nature preserve called Three Sisters Swamp, along the banks of the Black River scientists began to radiocarbon the ages of the cypress trees while examining a sample of one great bald cypress, and applying the techniques of a discipline called dendrochronology (the study of tree rings), researchers were able to date the tree back to 2,624 years ago, making it the fifth oldest tree in the world and the oldest in the Eastern United States.

The value of the ancient trees speaks for itself, but they also act as a valuable resource in studying climate change. Their rings provide a detailed weather report going back thousands of years and can be used to help reconstruct a timeline of drought, flooding, and other climactic events.

THIS WOMANS PLAN TOTALLY BACKFIRED

When an unidentified woman was frustrated to see a man sleeping in a McDonald's booth, she took a photo of him and published it to a private Facebook group to express her criticism. After the man was given a chance to explain himself to the community, however, dozens of people rallied to help him get back on his feet. 21-year-old Simon Child was homeless and struggling to support his son since the recent death of his mother. When the woman photographed him napping in the McDonald's booth, he had been catching up on his sleep in between his shifts at the restaurant in Fayetteville, Georgia.

When the young man went into work the following day, he was shocked to find that dozens of people had brought him heaps of nappies, clothing, toiletries, and supplies. The owners of a community eatery offered to lend him a car for job interviews for higher paid jobs and a barber gave him a free haircut so he could look spiffy for his new employment opportunities. Other members of the community are paying for Mr. Child and his son to stay in a hotel until they find permanent housing.

Welcome dear reader we have spoken in the past about leadership - let's look at it from another angle. Happiness in the workplace

For many of us a great deal of our day is spent in the work place - or thinking about work, therefore it makes sense that we would aim to make our working lives a happy and pleasant experience. However, when faced with various frustrating challenges at work our stress levels can increase and lead to anything from burnout to boredom to distraction. Whilst some levels of stress at work are normal, excessive stress can interfere with productivity as well as our physical and emotional wellbeing.

In her book Real Happiness at Work, Sharon Salzberg discusses eight pillars of happiness in the workplace. These include balance; concentration; compassion; resilience; communication and connection; integrity; meaning; and open awareness. Throughout the book she presents formal meditations along with mini meditations and practices for the reader to try out. These exercises are simple, small and practical ways in which we can achieve greater calm and satisfaction.

The following includes some of the advice she gives us to have a more peaceful and happier day at work.

- 1. Before starting a project, meeting or even a conversation, ask yourself: "What do I most want to see happen from this?"
- 2. Before starting your day, set an intention. She gives the following example: "May I treat everyone today with respect, remembering each person wants to be happy as much as I do."
- 3. Try to perform a simple act of kindness every day. The following are such examples: "holding a door, saying thank you in a sincere manner, or listening to someone with a clear and
- 4. Pay attention to your feelings. For example, if you're feeling irritated toward a co-worker, pay attention to your irritation, "not so much the story of why you're irritated, but the actual feeling of it." What does it feel like in your body? Where do you feel it? Identifying irritation as it starts helps you prevent an action you might later regret. "With a more immediate recognition of what we're feeling, we have a choice as to how we want to respond in that moment."
- 5. Think about the people who make your job possible, such as a housekeeper, caretaker or fundraiser - and thank them.

These are just some simple measure we can take to generate more happiness in the workplace. Over the next few weeks we will take a closer look at Stress, Workplace Stress and how we can manage it in our lives.
