

KING PUCK REIGNS AGAIN AT ANOTHER GREAT FESTIVAL!

The annual Puck Fair festival comes to an end today - Scattering Day and once again this year it has proved to be a huge hit with locals and tourists alike.

Visitors from all over the globe made their way to the Killorglin to witness the crowning of a wild mountain goat as 'King Puck' and to enjoy all of the merriment that ensues. From street entertainment, market stalls and activities for the kids to the unique experience that is Ireland's longest-running Horse Fair, all of the wild and wonderful events of this year's Puck Fair have once again been the talk of The Kingdom and beyond, as festival goers soak up the atmosphere during this legendary 3-day Irish event.

Organisers of the festival expect to welcome over 100,000 visitors over the duration of the festival, which began on Wednesday 10th August and runs until Friday 12th August. Aside from getting the opportunity of meeting King Puck and his Queen, those attending Puck Fair will also be entertained by a host of fabulous musical acts, including Irish country music sensation Mike Denver, who will perform at 10pm on Thursday night on the festival's main stage.

As usual, King Puck is being given the royal treatment at this year's festival. Aside from enjoying a sumptuous diet of ash tree branches, water and cabbage, he will be checked on at regular intervals by experienced handlers to ensure that he is comfortable and very well-

Kerry, and her lady-in-waiting Bláthnaid Ní Cearnaigh, have already been making the most of the experience, meeting and greeting local tourists as they gear up to take their royal places at some of the festival's most prominent events.

HUGE SUCCESS ON WORLD STAGE FOR WE BANJO 3

A Killarney Recording Studio is celebrating this week after a band which recorded all four of their albums reached the No. 1 slot on the US Billboard world music charts.

Sonas Recording is based in Lough Guitane in Killarney and is owned and operated by musician Tony O'Flaherty. The studio has been in existence since 1994, and since then has worked with the best of musicians, local, national and international. This week We Banjo 3, a band from Galway, that plays a blend of traditional Irish, old time, and bluegrass music they call Celt Grass reached the No. 1 slot in the prestigious US Billboard world music charts.

The band is composed of two sets of brothers, Enda and Fergal Scahill and Martin and David Howley, and frequent substitute Garry O'Meara. Earle Hitchner, music writer for The Wall Street Journal, described their playing as a "freshness and finesse bordering on the magical," and Live Ireland proclaiming them "the hottest group in Irish music..." Their debut album Roots of the Banjo Tree was released

in 2012 and was named "Traditional Music Album of the Year" by The Irish Times. This was followed by the release of Gather the Good in 2014. Siobhan Long, music critic for the Irish Times, said "We Banjo 3 are a musical Betty Ford Clinic, almost single handedly rehabilitating the much maligned banjo in 4 short years." In 2016 the band released their chart topping fourth album String Theory. All the albums have been recorded by Tony who told the Killarney Outlook ""The band are from Galway and are great musicians...... they're getting very popular in the US. They've recorded all of their 4 albums with me at my studio ". The studio is set in a 2000 sq. ft house, used exclusively for the purpose of recording. It includes a control room & three live rooms, allowing musicians to play live together with complete separation between instruments. Three of the four recording rooms provide a stunning view of lake & mountains. The equipment used has been carefully chosen to provide the ultimate signal path from mics to pres to conversion. We



cater for all styles of music plus voice over & audio for video.

Other musicians who have recorded at Sonas include Niamh Ni Charra, Frankie Gavin & De Dannan, John Spillane, Dolores O'Riordan, Christy Moore and Ronnie Wood. The title music for John Creedon's Wild Atlantic Way series was also recorded at Sonas.





HELP AT HAND FOR THIRD LEVEL STUDENTS



With the Leaving Cert results and CAO offers coming out in the next week, many families will see their child or children off to college for the first time. For these families, this can be an extremely stressful time, as the cost of third level education continues to spiral, having a huge impact on family budgets and household spending.

Killarney Credit Union would like to remind their members that the credit union is here to help and have this week launched a new education loan at 6.2 % APR* which can help families in the South Kerry area cover these costs.

According to 2015 ILCU research in the Republic of Ireland, 94% of parents were supporting their children financially through college, up from 74% in 2014. These parents were contributing an average of €453 per child per month to cover college related expenses. 72% of parents supporting their children through 3rd level education were struggling to cover these costs with 59% of parents getting into debt to cover college costs. In 2015 €5,030 was the average debt per child per annum and parents were saving for an average of 8 years to put their child (children) through college.

This week Killarney Credit Union announced the opening of its 2016 Bursary Award which will give a €4,000 bursary to four third level students to attend college this academic year. The bursary is open to all members of Killarney Credit Union who are attending college for the first time and is also open to students studying aboard and mature students.

Speaking about the awards, Joy Clifford-Vaughan, Youth Officer with Killarney Credit Union said "last year we had over 60 applicants for the awards and the lucky winners were Brian Myers, Sarah Courtney, Rebecca Smith and Natalia Makowska who each received an award for €1,000.00 each. With the increased costs of attending third level, this bursary is a welcome financial aid for meeting those costs" she concluded.

MAKE THE RIGHT MOVES WITH YOUR LEAVING CERT RESULTS WHICH ARE AVAILABLE NEXT WEDNESDAY

The eagerly awaited Leaving Cert exam results will be issued by the State Examinations Commission (SEC) next Wednesday, 17th August, and will, hopefully, contain good news for all candidates. By all means celebrate your achievement but also keep a close eye on the important dates and deadlines. There are tasks to be undertaken and loose ends to tie up before you progress to the next stage of the exciting journey through life.

Leaving Cert results will be available early in schools on Wednesday morning and, from 12noon, online at www.examinations. ie. If you wish to view one or more of your marked Leaving Cert exam scripts return your completed application form to your school by Tuesday, 23rd August. The viewing of marked scripts will be held on Friday/ Saturday, 2nd/3rd September. The closing date for receipt by the SEC of Leaving Cert appeal applications is Wednesday, 7th September. The appeal fee is €40 (LC) or €15.50 (LCA) per subject. Results of Leaving Cert subject appeals will be released in mid-October.

CAO Round One offers and points requirements will be available at www.cao.ie from 6am on Monday, 22nd August. CAO Round One offers may be accepted up to 5.15pm on Monday, 29th August. CAO Round Two offers and points requirements will be available at www. cao.ie from 6am on Thursday, 1st September. CAO Round Two offers may be accepted up to 5.15pm on Wednesday, 7th September. Thereafter, offers will be issued as necessary until October to fill any vacancies which may

Interviews for Post Leaving Cert (PLC) courses, which are practical and vocational in orientation, take place in the period after the Leaving Cert results are released. If you haven't applied for a PLC course and would like to do so, contact the colleges of your choice. There may be vacancies on a variety of PLC courses. The majority of PLC courses are offered at Level 5. A number are offered at Level 6 and the entire list of PLC courses can be found on www. qualifax.ie.

If you are interested in undertaking an apprenticeship in a trade or a traineeship, register at your local Training Centre if you have not already done so. Check the Solas website, www.solas.ie, or Kerry Education and Training Board website, www.kerryetb.ie, for further information.

If a career in agriculture and horticulture appeals to you, then contact Teagasc, which provides a variety of courses in the agricultural and horticultural areas. The agri-food industry is the fastest growing sector of the Irish economy and offers excellent career prospects at all levels. Teagasc website address is www. teagasc.ie.

Contact Failte Ireland if you are interested in a career at the craft level of work in the Hotel and Catering Industry. Many Failte Ireland craft courses are in the CAO application system. However they may not all fill and they also have a range of other training courses to suit a variety of circumstances. Keep an eye as well on the CAO website, www.cao.ie, for vacant places. Failte Ireland website address is www. fáilteireland.ie.

An increasing number of young people are taking a year out after the Leaving Cert to gain work experience or to travel. Many Irish students are young when they enrol in further education. A year out is a maturing experience and allows an extra year to make the transition from second level education. Colleges usually facilitate students who wish to defer taking up the offer of a course for one year.

If you feel that your results didn't do you justice, it's worth considering a return to school to repeat the exam. Most repeat students considerably increase their points. A more competitive result in the Leaving Cert exam might be in your best interests in the long run.

So, even though you'll be relieved when the waiting is over and the precious Leaving Cert results are in your hand, don't take your eye off the ball. Be aware of closing dates, carefully read your correspondence and take the appropriate steps to allow a trouble free passage on your education journey. Good luck to all candidates who will be getting Leaving Cert results exam on Wednesday.



PART TWO

In my experience once you have mastered these basics it will form an excellent core foundation for all other forms and types of exercises. For example:

- The hip hinge is the first part of the squat, we slightly go into a hip hinge before we squat down. It keeps our back straight, abs engaged and chest tall so we are not leaning forward into the squat and using our backs to lower instead of or legs and
- The push up position is the starting position for many high intensity exercises such as mountain climber or for a lot of the TRX workouts. Also if learned correctly it can help with a weighted barbell bench chest press.
- The hip hinge technique and squat is essential for any deadlifts. the very basic things you will have to master are the hip hinge to keep the back protected and the squat technique for picking up and lowering the bar.
- The hip hinge technique is essential for any kettlebell swing.
- A good plank hold and abdominal bracing is essential or a lot of TRX exercises to prevent the lower back hurting due to the hips dropping in the exercises.

GARDEN MAINTENANCE IN AUGUST

It is important at this time of year to do some pruning in the garden. Climbers such as wisteria and pyracantha should be pruned back now after flowering. Rambling roses can also be pruned back if they too have finished flowering.

Shrubs like hebes should be given a light pruning at this time of year as the flowers are fading in them.

You can also give your hedges a final trim until next year as they will be putting on very little growth from now on. Don't go too hard especially with coniferous hedges as that would leave them with dead looking patches for the winter.

Also the time is right to deadhead your roses as this will keep them flowering into early autumn. Roses that aren't looking too good now and have lost some of their foliage can be cut back a bit further to encourage new growth.







Following their successful era of the 1950's, due to emigration, retirements and a lack of a proper underage structure, the Spa club went into gradual decline and became defunct for a 4 year period, which saw many of their players assisting St Finian's in East Kerry competitions. The first tentative steps in the revival of the club came in 1963 when a Spa/Glenflesk amalgamation won the East Kerry Minor League, and this victory, which coincided with the decision by St Finian's not to continue to compete in East Kerry competitions, heralded the revival of the Spa club. At the club AGM in the old Macra Hall in March 1966 a decision was taken to enter the senior East Kerry League for the O'Donoghue Cup. After a narrow victory over Currow in their opening game, they were defeated by Listry in the next round and their future in the competition very much hinged on what was to be a crucial clash with Gneeveguilla. Conscious of their plight, the

team prepared well for this game and, after a titanic struggle, Spa emerged victorious by the narrowest of margins. After defeating Rathmore in the next round on July 20th, the scene was set for an O'Donoghue Cup final against a fancied Kilcummin side, and again, after another titanic struggle, and a cracking Paddy Dennehy goal in the 20th minute, the Cup was on its way to Spa for the first time.

At the next EKB meeting, it was decided to initiate a knock-out competition commencing in early September, and once again a narrow victory over Dr Crokes paved the way for the side to progress to the final on Easter Sunday 1967, and Spa were now winners of both the League and the knock-out competition, which was to be the format for the O'Donoghue Cup competition over the subsequent 50 years - a competition which Spa won on a further nine occasions.

What makes the 1966 victory so special is that it proved to be a motivating factor for the years ahead and those players, who went on to represent the club, developed a sense of achievement and self-belief that helped to sustain them in subsequent years.

Last Thursday August 11th the surviving members of the panel, and representatives of those who have passed away in the interim period, assembled at Spa clubhouse for a special reunion function during which Mass was celebrated at 7pm by one of the playing members of the side.

KERRY LADIES REACH QUARTERS FOR NINTH SUCCESSIVE YEAR

KERRY 3-19 WATERFORD 3-10

Sarah Houlihan was the scourge of Waterford again as Kerry stormed into the TG4 All-Ireland ladies senior football quarter-finals for a ninth successive year.

Houlihan collected 1-6 when the sides met in the Munster championship and she was on song again in Birr, notching seven of her nine points from play.

Bernie Breen, Emma Sherwood and Louise Ní Mhuircheartaigh chipped in with goals for the Kingdom as they set up a last-eight clash with Ulster champions Monaghan on 20 August. But it wasn't until the second half that Kerry pulled away as Waterford trailed by just two points at half-time — 1-7 to 1-9 — but they needed to be closer or ahead having played with the breeze from the start.

And Kerry unloaded with a run of 1-7 without reply in an 11-minute spell after the break to move out of danger.

While Kerry will be happy with the tally of 3-19 they racked up, the concession of 3-10 is a cause for concern.

And they got off to the worst possible start when Gráinne Kenneally, who scored goals in both halves, netted for Waterford with just 25 seconds on the clock.

Kerry's response was good, however, as they reeled off three points to level and the sides were deadlocked on four occasions within the first 15 minutes.

The Kingdom didn't get ahead for the first time until the 12th minute, when Houlihan pointed, and the prolific Beaufort ace had four points on the board by half-time, including

three from play.

Kerry's crucial first-half goal came from midfielder and former skipper Breen, who was on hand to slot the ball home from close range after an extremely patient build-up. Ní Mhuircheartaigh provided the killer pass and Breen stayed cool to side-step a defender and find the net in the 16th minute.

At the other end, Edel Murphy pulled off an excellent double-save as Caoimhe McGrath and Kenneally threatened and Kerry had their biggest lead of the half, 1-9 to 1-5, six minutes before the break.

By the 22nd minute, Kerry had five of their six forwards on target and Laura Rogers tried her luck at goal from an acute angle but Katie Hannon comfortably saved.

Kerry stepped on the gas after the break, with Emma Sherwood goaling in the 39th minute after hard-working Rogers provided the assist. And there were more goals to come as goalkeeper and captain for the day, Katie Hannon, finally opened Waterford's secondhalf account with a 43rd minute penalty goal after Kenneally was fouled.

Ní Mhuircheartaigh was the next player to raise a green flag three minutes later, reacting quickest after Houlihan's shot was saved by Hannon, but Kenneally replied in kind within a minute as Waterford kept plugging away. 

Can the same be said of the skin on your feet as you move your toes? What about the skin around your Achilles tendon?



Despite being less than a month old, the calf is already over five feet tall and has been exploring her enclosure at the reserve near Ashford. The animal park is part of a European breeding project designed to save the Rothchild's breed. Only around 750 Rothschild's giraffes are thought to remain in the wild.

1658 - The 1st US police corps formed in New

Amsterdam (now New York).

1753 - Thomas Bewick, artist (British Birds, Aesop's Fables) was born in England.

1762 - The British captured Cuba from Spain after a two month siege.

1944 - *Death of US Airforce Pilot Joseph P. Kennedy Jr*.

1932 - Birth of Porter Wagoner, country singer, who also discovered Dolly Parton.

*Joseph Patrick Kennedy Jr. was born on July 25, 1915, in a Hull, Massachusetts, in a house his parents had rented for the summer. The older brother of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy, he was the firstborn child of Joseph P. and Rose Fitzgerald Kennedy. Joseph Jr. graduated from Choate, a boarding school in Wallingford, Connecticut, in 1933. After Choate, he headed to the London School of Economics briefly before entering Harvard University. He graduated cum laude in 1934 and began studying at Harvard Law. With World War II underway, he left law school and joined the U.S. Navy in June 1941 and was awarded his aviator wings a year later.

He began flying Caribbean patrols soon after, until he was sent overseas to England in September 1943 to join a B-24 squadron. Within the British Naval Command, he was among the first pilots to fly B-24s, which were large bombers. As the war went on, he became one of the most experienced combat fighters in the ranks of the navy, and the sheer amount of missions he had flown gave him

the chance to return to the United States, but he refused to go back, instead persuading his crew to stay on and fly more bombing missions. June and July of 1944 found him continually in the air, running bombing strikes against the Axis forces, and as August approached he was given the opportunity to head home once again. This time, he decided to stay but told his crew to head back to the States. Joseph Jr. opted to remain in Europe so that he could volunteer for a dangerous, top-secret bombing mission, called Operation Aphrodite, over Normandy, France. On the night of August 12, 1944, he and his crew flew a drone loaded with 21,170 pounds of explosives into the skies over a German V-2 rocket-launching site. At some point, he and the crew were to bail out once two "mother" planes had taken control of the drone via remote control which would then be flown remotely into the German launch site after the crew in the drone had parachuted to safety. However, the explosives in the Kennedypiloted drone detonated prematurely in flight, and the aircraft exploded, killing all aboard instantly. After his death, he was awarded the Air Medal and Navy Cross for heroism. In December 1945, the navy commissioned a destroyer and named it the USS Joseph P. Kennedy Jr. A year later, Joseph Jnr's younger brother Robert briefly served aboard the ship.

RESCUED BABY POSSUM FOUND A NEW HUMAN **'MUM' AT TARONGA ZOO**

A tiny yellow-bellied glider who survived a collision with a barbed wire fence has found a surrogate mum at Taronga Zoo on the shores of Sydney Harbour. The 10-week-old joey arrived with her mother at the zoo's hospital in July after being rescued by wildlife carers after the mother was found with a series of injuries, with the joey still inside her pouch, after becoming entangled in a barbed-wire fence. Hospital staff had to step in to care for the baby glider when her mother stopped producing milk. Felicity Evans, Taronga vet nurse, has been providing round-the-clock care, carrying a makeshift pouch and feeding her six times a day from a dessert spoon.

"She gets really excited about food and can be quite a messy eater," Ms. Evans said. "She grabs hold of the spoon and pulls it down so she ends up with milk all over her paws and stomach, I have to carefully clean her fur afterwards and wipe off her little milk moustache." "She's got a big personality for such a tiny animal," Ms. Evans added. "She climbs all over me and is very vocal if I have to wake her up for a feed. She doesn't like being interrupted during sleep." Thanks to Ms. Evan's care the joey has made a remarkable recovery, growing from 48 grams to 80 grams in two weeks. The joey's mother is also recovering at Taronga Wildlife Hospital, where she continues to receive antibiotics and treatment for her wounds.

THIS MAN MUST BE WONDERING IF HONESTY REALLY IS THE BEST POLICY

Chicago-based Uber driver Jose Figueroa noticed a wallet in the back of his vehicle after dropping a man, who'd just arrived into the country from Ukraine, to an apartment complex in the city. According to Uber, their app deletes any passenger information after the fare ends and that left Jose with no way of contacting the owner of the wallet. Jose had to fight the temptation to keep the money but being of strong Christian faith, felt he had to do all he could to reunite the passenger with his lost wallet - which also contended the man's immigration documents; he returned to the complex and rang every door bell until he found the man. His perseverance paid off as finally the passenger's sister opened the door and there he returned the wallet to a very grateful Volodymyr Kytsknuik. Mr. Kytsknuik who had sold his business in Ukraine and had come to the U.S. looking for work, immediately handed Jose \$100 and insisted he stay for dinner as a thank you.

HOW PEANUTS GROW

Many people are surprised to learn that peanuts do not grow on trees like pecans or walnuts. Peanuts are legumes, not nuts. The peanut plant is unusual because it flowers above ground but the peanut grows below ground. Planted in the early spring, the peanut grows best in calcium rich sandy soil. For a good crop, 120 to 140 frost free days are required. Farmers harvest the peanuts in the fall. The peanuts are pulled from the ground by special machinery and turned over to dry in the fields for several days. The combine machines then separate the peanuts from the vines and blow the tender moist peanuts into special hoppers. They are dumped into a drying wagon and cured by forcing warm air through the wagons. Afterwards, the peanuts are taken to buying stations where they are inspected and graded for sale.

IT DOESN'T ALWAYS PAY TO BE A HERO IN AUSTRALIA

Brayden Mitchell had driven to the Queen Elizabeth Avenue floodway south of Perth in mid-July with his girlfriend to check out the state of the flooding, when he noticed a woman throwing a toy to her dog who then ended up in the water. The woman tried to rescue her dog but she was dragged in by a strong current from the recent heavy rain and was being swept out to sea. The teenage surfer did not hesitate and jumped in to help the woman but the water was freezing and very rough and they were being swamped by waves, he eventually managed to get the woman close to shore and his girlfriend pulled them both out of the water. Witnesses of the incident called an ambulance, both were taken

to hospital and treated for treated for mild hypothermia and Mr Mitchell was released after an hour and was presented with a bill for \$932 to cover the cost of the ambulance call out! A friend of Mr Mitchell's family set up a Go Fund Me page to help him pay the bill as the teenager is only on an apprentice wage.

The fundraising page raised more than \$1400 in three days from residents of the small town who wanted to thank the teenager for his heroic efforts, and the dog is also home safe and well.

ARE YOU LOOKING FOR WORK

The Antarctic Heritage Trust is looking for four seasonal workers to spend the Antarctic summer - from November to March - at Port Lockroy on Goudier Island, Antarctica. You'll run the post officer, shop and museum as well as carry out maintenance. Recruiters are looking for skills including co-ordination, retail experience and environmental awareness.

If you will be happy not to shower for up to a month, live in close proximity to three people and 2,000 penguins for five months, don't mind the cold and living without mains power then you could be just the person they are looking for. The Port Lockroy jobs are advertised in February on The Antarctic Heritage Trust website, and full details of the job and how to apply will become available at that time. Short-listed applicants must be able to attend a two-day selection event held in the UK in May at their own cost. If you are successful you will get an all expenses trip to the other side of the world, where you'll also be paid more than £1,000 per month and be employed from November to March on a six month contract. Port Lockroy was established in 1944 and was operated as a British research station until 1962. It was made a historic site and monument and in 1996 it was restored as a "living" museum About one or two ships arrive each day during the short summer period, with a total of about 18,000 visitors.

Workers in the post office have to handle 70,000 items of mail over the season.

Further information and job application forms will be available in February 2017 on the Antarctic Heritage Trust website and the post is open to people of all nationalities.

NEW ZEALAND TOWN WITH 'TOO MANY JOBS' AND HOUSES IS LOOKING FOR NEW RESIDENTS

About 800 people live in the town of Kaitangata on the South Island of New Zealand and it certainly has a problem that is unknown in Ireland - too many affordable houses and job opportunities and not enough people to fill them. Now the officials and residents of Kaitangata have teamed up with local businesses to offer discounted home-

buying legal costs and new job opportunities to entice people to the area, saying there is almost 1,000 job vacancies in the wider Clutha region. At the moment there are job opportunities in nursing, building and the military to name but a few and some starting salaries begin at NZ\$50,000 (€31,250).

Amenities include a local primary school, a bar and a pizza parlour. Many rural areas in New Zealand are facing similar issues and a scheme was launched in Auckland, recently paying people who need social housing to move out of the city.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO BUY A TOWN NEAR LOS VEGAS?

70 miles south of Las Vegas a town containing a casino, diner, supermarket, 10-room motel, motor home park and a mile-long airstrip is for sale for \$8m. The town of Cal-Nev-Ari was founded in 1965 by Nancy Kidwell and her late husband, Slim, but now at the age of 78 the owner believes "It's time for someone else to do something with it." It doesn't have tarred roads, but it does have deep-water wells, a sewer system and a utility company and for 8 million dollars you will own everything except about 350 residents, some privately owned homes, the small community centre and a volunteer fire station. For further information just enter the towns name in your search engine!

FINALLY THIS WEEK

It's 2016 and the modern world has brought us smartphones, broadband internet, and cheap international travel but incredibly when it comes to forced labour we're stuck in the past. 189 countries are yet to take an easy step that would update an international law from 1930 and protect us from slavery today. Although the original convention created protections for large parts of the global population, it also stipulated caveats which meant that for many countries where colonial rule existed - forced labour was still sanctioned and today almost 21 million people are victims of forced labour - 11.4 million women and girls and 9.5 million boys and men. Almost 19 million victims are exploited by private individuals or enterprises and 4.5 million of these are victims of forced sexual exploitation. Migrant workers and indigenous people are particularly vulnerable to forced labour and domestic work, agriculture, construction, manufacturing and entertainment are among the sectors most concerned. Forced labour in the private economy generates US\$ 150 billion in illegal profits per year.

The good news is Ireland signed the international law in 1931 but that doesn't mean there are no slaves in Ireland – if you believe there is something suspicious going on in your neighbourhood please let the Gardaí know.

RELEASING **BUCKLES**

HOW TO STOP CHILDREN UNDOING THEIR SEAT BELTS: Most children will eventually find they can undo their seat belt. So why don't they make seat belts that can't be undone by a child? This is because it must be possible to release the belt in an emergency, quickly and easily. At worst this might be with a car inverted in a ditch at night, with access at arm's length through a window, or by a person in shock, unfamiliar with such equipment. Any form of 'Chinese puzzle' is out. The catch cannot be hidden, must be obvious and accessible and must not require a large force to release it. A different type of catch, perhaps a friend's seat, may not be undone as easily as one with which a child is familiar but this is usually only temporary. Given the right conditions they will soon get the knack. Don't be tempted to make additional security attachments to the buckle. Anything like this will inevitably compromise safety and again tends to be only temporarily effective, presenting a new challenge rather



than solving the problem. Diverting the child's attention Rather than trying to persuade your child that the buckle cannot be undone, try persuading them that there is no advantage in doing so. These are techniques you might like to try. Show that the car does not go (or soon stops) with the belt undone. The best time to start this approach is when you get a new seat (or perhaps when a car is changed). But remember to do it when there is no deadline for the journey. If the child is old enough to really want to get somewhere, that's ideal. Try telling the child that unless the seat belt is fastened, they won't get to the party, zoo, etc. A raised seat can also be some help, as it will increase your child's field of view. A 'play tray' attachment can provide some distraction and may make the buckle less tempting.

BUYING A USED CAR

Tips on what to watch out for Buying a used car is an intimidating prospect for many consumers. The fear of dodgy deals and the fact that you could be buying someone else's problems make the hunt for honest value seem daunting. The AA advises all potential used car buyers to avoid side-of-the-road sales and go to SIMI dealers, to buy an AA Autocheck car or failing that to have the vehicle professionally inspected before purchase. No reputable seller will object to an independent inspection. Many publications carry ads offering secondhand cars for sale. Most are genuine but unfortunately there are still unscrupulous dealers posing as private sellers. If you decide to make contact, say that you are asking about 'the car for sale.' If he has to ask you which car then he is a dealer. Having blown his cover, steer clear of his car! Never buy a car in the dark as this easily conceals various blemishes and possibly even evidence of accident damage. A key fact

that you want to be sure of is that the car has not been involved in an accident. No matter whether its from a private individual or from a dealer ask the critical question, preferably in front of a witness "has the car ever been crashed or had any bodywork repairs carried out whatsoever". The response given has significant legal implications. The National Car Test (NCT) was introduced to Ireland in January 2000 and since then the quality of used cars in Ireland has improved greatly in recent years. All cars now need to undergo and NCT after four years initially and after two years thereafter. This has meant that it is no longer possible to run 'rolling wrecks' on Irish roads. There is very good value to be found in the second-hand market. For every new car bought in Ireland almost 2.5 second-hand ones bought and most people are happy with the results. You have to look out for the pitfalls, do the homework and remember the maxim caveat emptor - let the buyer beware.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN A SECOND HAND CAR - pro tips • Check the body lines for consistency • Look for any evidence of repainting, such as overspray on window rubbers or any inconsistency in the paintwork Check for uneven tyrewear
 Look out for different makes of headlights • Watch for different consistencies of stonechips over the front of the bonnet compared to the adjacent wings. • Examine carefully the wear at the pedal rubbers, the gear stick and the steering wheel • Closely examine the odometer for any sign of interference

Make sure the keys provided operate in all of the locks and that there is a spare set

Try all keys provided in the ignition and make sure that they start the engine - as occasionally a 'cut' key is not a 'transponder key.

The day has finally come and once you get your exam results, the immediate stress may be reduced. Congratulations! Now you can consider your next step. Some people will be celebrating; others may be a bit disappointed but it is important to consider the following:

YOU ARE MORE THAN YOUR LEAVING CERT RESULTS. Your performance in the exams is a judgement of your knowledge on certain subjects NOT a judgement about you the person and NOT a judgement of your own self worth. Disassociate your performance from who you are, everyone has different abilities and skills.

PERSPECTIVE If your results are what you expected, great but if not, remember that the Leaving Cert is a stepping stone on a journey to something bigger. The exams are not just goals in themselves; they can be a means to a goal. The stepping stones are very important but the main thing is to use them productively to arrive at where you want to be. The points should not be the main goal - they only help you reach the next level or to get closer to your chosen career.

If you are disappointed about your results, remember that your goal does not need to change but how you reach it may be different. If the results aren't all you wanted it to be, remember you do have options, these include:

RESULT APPEALS: If you are not happy with your exams results and feel they do not reflect your work or ability you can arrange to appeal. Talk to your school about how to do this.

Speak to a qualified career counsellor: Take advice, talk to your Career Guidance Teacher. They know the Leaving Cert system so they should be a great help. You can also go to your local careers office, youth information centre and ask for advice. There are also excellent website e.g. headsup which even has information on goal setting.

QUERIES ABOUT RESULTS: If you have any queries in relation to your results, the National Parents Council (Post-Primary) provides a free helpline that provides advice and guidance to students. The helpline number is 1800 265 165 and will be available during results time and also following the issue of the CAO offers next week.

REPEAT THE LEAVING CERT: this may not have been part of your original plan and you may initially be reluctant to delay things but it is only for one year and it shouldn't be dismissed too quickly. You would be older and maybe wiser and you know that you have got through the Leaving Cert once. You're young and one year won't make a huge difference, especially with the way

the economy is, you still have plenty of years ahead. **EXPECTATIONS** Remember that everyone has different expectations of themselves and goals in life. One person's disappointment is another person's success. Be mindful of this during the exam results period.

TRUST YOURSELF After you receive your results, have the confidence to know that you have done your best. It is not useful to look back and think that you could have done more. Retrospective thinking may not always be the same as realistic thinking. CONTINUED NEXT WEEK

Know Your Rights:

BACK TO SCHOOL CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR ALLOWANCE

OUESTION

What is the Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance?

The Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance (BSCFA) helps you meet the cost of uniforms and footwear for children going to school. You must be getting a social welfare payment or taking part in a training, employment or adult education scheme. In general, you must be getting an Increase for a Qualified Child with your payment.

Your children must be aged between 4 and 22 on or before 30 September 2016. If they are aged between 18 and 22, they must be in full-time second-level education in a recognised school or college. Also, your total family income must be below a certain level for your family size. The allowance is €100 for eligible children aged between 4 and 11 and €200 for those aged between 12 and 22.

The scheme is open from 1 June to 30 September 2016. The Department of Social Protection pays BSCFA automatically to many customers. This means that they do not have to apply for the payment. If you qualify automatically, you should receive a letter stating when and how your Allowance will be

If you do not get an automatic payment you must apply for the Allowance. If any of your children are aged 18 or over, you must apply for the Allowance for them and supply evidence that they are in second-level education (even if automatic payments have issued for other children in the family).

You can get application forms in all local social welfare offices and Intreo centres, and on the Department's website, welfare. ie. When a decision has been made on your application, you will get a letter informing you of this and whether a payment has been awarded. If your application has been successful, you will also be told when and where you can collect the payment. If the Allowance is refused, you can ask for a review of the decision.

EMPLOYEE EXPENSES FLAT RATE (EMPLOYMENT) EXPENSES

These are expenses that are incurred in the performance of the duties of the employment and are directly related to the 'nature of the employee's employment'. A standard flat rate expenses allowance (deduction) is set for various classes of employee. A full list of flat rate expenses is available on the revenue website. The amount of the deduction is agreed between Revenue and representatives of groups or classes of employees (usually the employees are represented by trade union officials). The agreed deduction is then applied to all employees of the class or group in question.

ROUND SUM EXPENSES

Round-sum expenses payments (lump sum expenses payments) whether paid weekly, monthly, yearly or otherwise, which are paid to the employee to cover expenses, must be treated as pay and taxed accordingly. An example of a round sum payment is where an employer

agrees to pay, say €150 per month in addition to basic salary in order to cover expenses. This €150 must be treated as pay and taxed accordingly.

Your request will be granted no matter how impossible it may seem.


