# Fionns Family Says *Thank You* With Fundraiser

The fantastic work of Cork University Maternity Hospital's Neonatal Unit and Bru Columbanas are set to benefit from a fundraiser which will be held in K-Town on Friday the 19th of October.

The event is being organised by Denise Lucey and her husband , Aaron Brosnan, of Ardagh, Loreto Road who spent a lot of time there following the birth of their son Fionn at 23 weeks.

"Fionn was born extremely premature at 23 weeks, the survival rate for being born at this gestation is usually about 30%", Denise told the Killarney Outlook.

"Fionn was born Friday the 25th of November at 11.01am weighing a tiny 700grams (less than a bag of sugar). Fionn was admitted directly to CUMH's Neonatal ICU where he spent 168 days.

Denise who works at Holy Cross Mercy Primary School and Aaron, who works in O'Carrolls Engineering have organised the night to show their gratitude to the nurses, doctors and staff in the Neonatal unit.

"During this difficult time we very lucky to have a home from home right across the road from the hospital in Bru Columbanas.", Denie said.

Bru Columbanas offers accommodation to parents who's children are in the neonatal unit in CUMH, as well as other families whose family member is in CUH and the Mercy hospital in Cork and live too far away to travel to see them. It's an amazing service, which is run completely on charitable donations. "Fionn is doing great flying around the place into everything! And his



favourite word is no!", she added. This is all thanks to the fantastic team in cork.'

The event kicks off at 8.30pm and consists of live music from some amazing local talent, a pub quiz a raffle and an auction.

Music on the night will be provided by four amazingly talented local singers - Tom Lucey, Donal Lucey, Lily MacMonagle Shannon and Cathal Flaherty. There will be fantastic prizes up for grabs at the raffle. Tickets will be available on the door that night, 4 people per table at €40.

## Cllr Gleeson Highlights Accessibility Issues

At the request of a local teacher and a visually challenged pupil from his class, Councillor Michael Gleeson has asked Killarney Municipal Authority to undertake the work necessary to suitably adapt the pedestrian crossing on Park Road, Killarney adjacent to the entrance to Ardshanavooly. This work would involve the provision of tactile paving and also the provision of the internationally accepted sound signals. In conjunction with the above work Councillor Gleeson has also asked that Kerry County Council would examine all other pedestrian crossings in order to ensure that they comply with the highest international standards. It is of great importance that this work is undertaken promptly as the Council in co-operation with Killarney Access Group seeks to achieve European accreditation as a fully accessible town. Killarney is currently working to become Ireland's flagship destination for accessible tourism, ensuring



that the town can be enjoyed and accessed by everybody. Recently, people with disabilities and those working on their behalf have highlighted several cases of vehicles without blue badge permits parking in spaces reserved for disabled drivers. There have also been

photographs on social media and in print of wheelchairs being unable to access footpaths because of carelessly parked vehicles. Cllr Gleeson stated " It is vitally important for local people and for visitors that free and safe movement is fully facilitated."

## Call to tackle "Sat-Nav" problems

At the recent Kerry County Council meeting, Cllr. John Sheahan has called on Minister Shane Ross, Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport to tackle the ongoing problem whereby maps and navigational systems are carrying drivers down narrow dangerous roads. "Motorists of all grades, trucks, buses, vans and cars are having their lives put at risk" Cllr.

Sheahan said.

"This is a very serious issue as drivers are being directed onto roads that are totally unsuitable for larger vehicles such as articulated lorries and buses. Tourists are also victim of the inaccurate information and something needs to be done before there is a major issue", Cllr Sheahan added.



Mr Prendergast outlined Owen's lifetime of volunteerism with many groups, including the Credit Union, Comhaltas and politics, and noted how Owen's vision and leadership inspired the many community projects and events in which he has been involved. His most recent success was chairing the 2018 County Fleadh Cheoil, injecting energy and variety into a local festival of traditional music and free family entertainment. Three major concerts were organised, including the unique solstice celebration at the Killaclohane Portal Tomb. Owen thanked the organising committee, and spoke

about Stephen Lawlor, after whom the award is named, and how Stephen was the epitome of community spirit and volunteerism. "He was an exemplary community member, working hard with various local groups including the Tidy Towns and Comhaltas", explained Owen. He also thanked Stephen's mother, Ann Lawlor, who provided the perpetual trophy and travelled from her home in Longford to present the award. Stephen passed away in 2013 and is remembered in Milltown through this award. This year Owen joins previous recipients, local volunteers Willie Hanafin, Denis O'Mahony and Tom Hanafin, as a worthy winner. Owen also spoke about the huge community spirit in Milltown, especially visible at this year's Fleadh. "My work as chairman was made easy by the team of over one hundred local volunteers", he said, and added "I've enjoyed all my community work, and I love the meetings and the craic at events. It's great to be out, doing something positive, building community and meeting new people. The recent culture of

This has been an important aspect of community work in Milltown, given the dramatic rise in population in recent years. Owen thanked his wife Cecelia for her support in all his involvement, recognising Cecelia's own voluntary work as Treasurer for the 2018 Fleadh saw her head a team that raised the €70,000 to host the event and provide over €12,000 worth of free entertainment in Milltown. Owen also remembered the late Denis Courtney, who worked tirelessly for the community and Owen said it was

his mission to organise "one hell of a Fleadh" in Denis's memory. Hosts at The Plough Bar, Denis and Bernie Griffin, provide a commemorative trophy for the event and this was presented to Owen. Celebrations continued with traditional music and song from Owen's fellow musicians and many friends. As well as his voluntary and professional commitments, Owen is also the author of several books, the latest of which is "A Century of Politics in the Kingdom: A County Kerry Compendium", co-written with Gordon Revington, and goes on sale this month.



## Letter to the EDITOR

*"When we listen to the Government boast of falling waiting times, the reality is people are going to Belfast"*

**Michael Healy-Rae on massive increase in Cross Border directive reimbursements.**

*A Chara,*

In a recent reply from the Assistant National Director of the Cross Border Directive in the HSE, it is clear to see why they say Government waiting lists are falling. Minister Simon Harris states that "we have seen a reduction of 3,100 over the last 13 months" in people waiting for cataract operations, but, what he is not telling us is, that in 2018 alone 2234 people have been reimbursed by the HSE under the Cross Border Directive, of which at least 70% I am told are Ophthalmology and Orthopaedic operations.

In the reply from the Assistant National Director, it is clear to see the massive rise

in people opting to avail of the Cross Border Directive as there is not light at the end of the tunnel in the South, since 2014 we have seen an increase of over €7.5 Million in reimbursements, €29,264.79 in 2014 and as of the August 2018 €7,540,501.91.

So when we listen to the Government boast of falling waiting times, the reality is people are going to Belfast. I have been organising buses for patients to go to Belfast to have their cataracts done over the last year and now I will be offering the same service for people who are waiting for knees and hip operations as I am again fearful that operations will not resume in University Hospital Kerry until the New Year at least.

The hospital that is performing these operations is Kingsbridge Hospital in Belfast. At present, the following is the breakdown of the cost for a hip replacement which is in sterling;

- Consultation- £190(€214) and the HSE will reimburse €130
- Procedure Fee- £9,850(€11,054) and the HSE will reimburse €10,931
- Total Cost- £10,040 (€11,266) meaning your total contribution would be €200 plus your travel and overnight if required.

**And the following is to have a knee replacement;**

- Consultation- £190(€214) and the HSE will reimburse €130
- Procedure Fee- £9,850(€11,054) and the HSE will reimburse €11,461
- Total Cost- £10,040 (€11,268) and the total reimbursement by the HSE is up to €11,591, so your only expense that would not be reimbursed is your travel and accommodation.

Unlike the cataracts, there is more visits needed to have a hip or knee done, usually 4, but, the hospital have agreed to carry out both the Consultation and Pre-Operative assessment on the same day in order to reduce the number of trips. It is all based on demand and the hospital have agreed to do the first batch of patients on the 21st of October in co-ordination with my office, we have a growing list of people as they are beginning to realise that this Government have no regard for the pain and suffering they are going through at present, it is a disgrace and having been told that the Minister would meet with me with regard to the ongoing problems at UHK, his office has been uncontactable to confirm a date.

I will continue to use my office to arrange these trips to Belfast for as long as I can as I am fearful Brexit will have an impact on it, but, for as long as it is there, I will continue to bring people to Belfast and would encourage others in other counties to do the same.



# Medieval brooch to go on display

The National Museum of Ireland is pleased to announce that a medieval period gold ring brooch acquired in 2016 is to be sent on a short-term loan to Músaem Chorca Dhuibhne, Baile an Fheirtéaraigh, close to where it was found. The curator at the museum in Baile an Fheirtéaraigh, Ms Isabel Bennett, was instrumental in reporting the find and the National Museum of Ireland is very grateful to her and especially to the finder, Mr Ian Andrew, who found the brooch by chance while walking on the beach at Cloosmore, Dingle. Ring brooches were worn in medieval times by both men and women in order to fasten their gowns or cloaks at the neck. They may have been offered as a sign of affection or as betrothal gifts.

Approximately 150 ring brooches are known from Ireland, but would usually be of copper alloy. Only a very small number including this example are made of gold.

The finder Mr Andrew was on a holiday visit to the Dingle peninsula, where he has strong family connections. While walking along a rocky coastal foreshore, he noticed a bright



light shining between some rocks. After taking a closer look, he identified and retrieved this tiny but exquisite gold ring brooch. He subsequently reported it and was extremely helpful to the National Museum of Ireland in providing every available detail in relation to the find circumstances.

The National Museum of Ireland has had a long-standing relationship with Músaem Chorca Dhuibhne, Baile an Fheirtéaraigh

and many archaeological objects found on the Dingle peninsula have been on loan there since the 1980's. The ring brooch will be on display in Baile an Fheirtéaraigh from 10.00 to 17.00 on Friday, 5 October and from 10.00 to 13.00 on Saturday, 6 October 2018. This loan has been made possible by the granting of a Mobility of Collections Scheme grant to Músaem Chorca Dhuibhne, Baile an Fheirtéaraigh from the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht. This scheme facilitates loans from the National Collections to regional museums in order to make these collections more accessible for all.

On its return to the National Museum of Ireland, the ring brooch will be displayed in an exhibition entitled "Dressed to Impress" at the National Museum of Archaeology in Kildare Street, Dublin. The exhibition will include three other medieval period brooches found by chance in different parts of the country, all of which were reported and acquired for the national collections in 2016.



**Vincent Harty has been named as the Kerry Person of the year 2018 by the London Kerry Association.**

The Ballinaskelligs native has been selected as a mark of his huge contribution to the life of people in both Kerry and London. He is the long-standing treasurer of the Kerry London Association having been a part of the original group set up in the 1970s and remains actively committed to the good works of the association today.

Vince will be presented with the Dennis Reidy Memorial trophy at the association's gala dinner dance at The Crown Hotel in Cricklewood on Friday 19th October.

He will be joined on the evening by his wife Breda, daughters Sheila, Deirdre, Orla and Niamh along with son-in-laws and his eight grandchildren. His brothers Jack and Anthony

and his sister Helen will also be making the trip from the Kingdom to join him on the evening. Next year will mark Vincent's 60th year in London. He arrived at the age of 16 and started working as a barman at The Brewery Tap in Barking.

Deciding to explore a bit further he joined the building trade as many a great Irishman did before him.

During this time there was lots of rebuilding with new tunnels and roads being constructed post war. These were the days that great friendships were made by the men as they worked side-by-side. This work took Vincent the width and breadth of England and although hard work, it was a happy time.

In 1965 he met and married Breda a native of Murrioch, Dingle. As health problems led to the end of his building career, he returned to the pubs starting at The Crown in Cricklewood eventually running his own pubs, The Windsor Castle, The Tally Ho and The Spotted Dog in Willesden where he won Pub Landlord of the year in the 80s.

He then moved into the City of London.

His last pub The Rising Sun in Carter Lane, St Pauls is now run by his daughter Sheila, keeping up the family tradition.

Vince says he was over the moon when he received the call from Dan Tim O'Sullivan the chairman of KAL notifying him of his recognition.

He said: "I am 75 years old and feel so honoured to receive this award. It's a reward that has been given to wonderful Kerry man and

women in the past. I would like to accept this with gratitude and for all those who have gone in the past with their works of goodness and kindness"

Monika Dukarska from Killorglin has been nominated as Young Kerry person of the year and will receive the Christy Kissane Memorial Trophy on the night.

## Chamber express disappointment over VAT hike



Killarney Chamber of Tourism & Commerce today expressed their disappointment with what they described as a 'short-sighted' decision to return the VAT on the tourism sector to 13.5%.

"It is a pity that an initiative, which was such a success in terms of job creation is now withdrawn and it will, undoubtedly have a negative impact on the sector" remarked Paul O'Neill, President of the Killarney Chamber. "Tourism is an industry that provides jobs throughout the regions, nowhere more than Kerry, so this is a hammer blow as we are trying to extend the season and develop rural business" he went on.

"This decision will not only be felt directly by the businesses but suppliers and of course consumers. A small tourism business may now have to re-think a renovation or upgrade works." He noted that the minister for finance has pledged to re-distribute some of the tax-take into tourism projects, specifically focused on the regions; "If funds are ring-fenced for tourism related projects, at least this will be of benefit and in Killarney and Kerry we have 'shovel-ready' projects and a proven track record in return on investment", he concluded.



## Local Woman Calls for Support for Kerala

A devastating flood in the South Indian state of Kerala has killed nearly 500 people and caused an estimated \$3 billion damage in the state, including the Divine Retreat Centre, which is dear to the heart of local woman Aideen O'Connor. The Divine Retreat Centre is the largest Catholic Retreat centre in the world run by the Fathers of the Vincentian Congregation. An average of 3000 people visit every week and the retreat Care Centre looks after those suffering with mental illness, HIV positive patients, and destitute women and children. They have set up a bakery ,

dairy farm, piggery and poultry farm which provides occupational therapy and food for the congregation. They have a printing press which they use to print Bibles, this is a form of income for the poor. They have built Charitable homes for the poor and work hard to provide for an enormous amount of people. Unusual heavy rainfall caused the flooding and the deluge was the worst in 94 years in Kerala. A drought immediately followed the monsoon creating the element for the flooding. There has been extensive damage at the centre and the Charitable homes, which have been

submerged in 9 ft of flood water and more in some places. They have been unable to salvage vital machinery, electricity supply boards, generators, elevators, material, farm animals, housing, estimating that there has been over \$7 million worth of damage at the centre alone. Aideen is in contact with friends who are keeping her updated on the tragedy, they have set up a bank account in order to help the Retreat Centre get back to taking care of those less fortunate. **A**dventure enthusiasts from all over the world took part in an adrenalin-packed day in Killarney on Saturday. Over 2000 participants ran, cycled and kayaked against some of the most dramatic and breath-taking scenery in Ireland. Quest, the world's biggest adventure race, takes place in Killarney every October.

Routes encompassed the Gap of Dunloe, Ladies View, and the iconic Torc Waterfall. Now in its 8th year, Quest Killarney continues to attract Ireland's top endurance athletes and competitors from around the world, for one of the must-do events of the year.

First home and clear of the group in the 83km 'Expert' route was Killian Heery in a time of 4hrs 10mins and 17secs. In second place was Barry Cronin (4hrs 16mins 31secs), in third was David Power (4hrs 17mins 13secs).

Laura O'Driscoll was the first female home in an excellent time of 4hrs, 40mins and 31secs.

In second position was Ellen Vitting (4hrs 45mins 15secs), in third position was Ger Kelly (5hrs 8mins 16secs).

Overall winner in the 73km 'Pro' route was Alan Kearney (3hrs 22mins 52secs). Overall female winner was Claire Lambe (3hrs 59mins 15secs). Overall winners in the 55km 'Sport' route was Niall Smith (2hrs 19mins 51secs) and Regina Sheehan (2hrs 42mins 39secs). Winners of the 65km 'Dual' route were Trevor Woods (2hrs 22mins 44secs) and Lorraine Horan (2hrs 49mins 01sec). Winners of the 27km 'Challenge' route were David White (1hr 33mins 19secs) and Eileen McCullagh (1hr 52mins 21secs).

All winners received a stunning trophy made of Valentia Slate, designed by local business Positivity Rocks. The prize-giving took place after the event at The Gleneagle Hotel which was the scene of much celebration after the event.

To add to the excitement Elite Event Management who manage the series launched events for 2019 – Quest Kenmare (2 March 2019), Quest Glendalough (6 April 2019) and Quest Killarney (12 October 2019). Oliver Kirwan, Race Director said, "It's great that we've had even more participants taking part in the event this year. The popularity of Killarney is a great draw and people just loving spending the weekend out on the mountains and with friends they've met on route. Whilst it's our last event of 2018 we launched all our 2019 events so that's what we're working on now already. # RSA issue road safety advice for driving in extreme weather

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) is asking road users to exercise caution while using the roads following Storm Callum are asking road users to check local weather and traffic conditions and be aware of the conditions before setting out on a trip.



**The RSA has the following advice for road users:**

- Beware of objects being blown out onto the road. Expect the unexpected.
- Watch out for falling/fallen debris on the road and vehicles veering across the road.
- Control of a vehicle may be affected by strong cross winds. High sided vehicles and motorcyclists are particularly vulnerable to strong winds.
- Allow extra space between you and vulnerable road users such as cyclists and motorcyclists
- Drive with dipped headlights at all times.

**Advice to Pedestrians, Cyclists and motorcyclists:**

- Be seen. Wear bright clothing with reflective armbands or a reflective belt.
- Take extra care when crossing the road or cycling in extremely windy conditions as a sudden gust of wind could blow you into the path of an oncoming vehicle.

**Is Your Journey Absolutely Necessary?**

In extreme weather conditions you should ask yourself if making a journey by road is absolutely necessary? If it is not you might consider delaying your trip until the weather and road conditions improve. If using the roads in such conditions is unavoidable be prepared. The golden rule is to drive, cycle or walk with care and caution and expect the unexpected.

**Is Your Vehicle Ready for Winter?**

As the saying goes 'Prevention is better than cure', so take some time to prepare both your vehicle and yourself for the challenges of winter driving.

Don't get caught out when severe weather strikes.

Your first step should be to get your vehicle serviced to ensure it is fit and safe for winter driving. Secondly you should carry out regular checks on the vehicle.

**You should:**

- Check for wear and tear on wiper blades and replace them as soon as they start to smear rather than clean windows.
- Keep tyre pressure at the manufacturer's recommended level and check you have at least 3 millimetres of tread depth
- Check that your spare wheel is in good condition and is fully inflated. Some cars may have an inflation repair kit instead of a spare wheel. Make sure that you know how to use it.
- Make sure all vehicle lights are working and clean and top up with anti-freeze and screen wash.

**Be Seen to Be Safe!**

- When out cycling or walking, especially in rural areas, high visibility reflective clothing and lights are the only way to stay safe when out on the roads.
- A vehicle has a greater chance of seeing you during dark winter days and nights if you wear something reflective and carry a torch. In turn cyclists should make sure their bikes are fitted with front and rear lights.
- As children make the journey to school often in the dark, parents really need to make sure their child can be seen. If walking or cycling to school, especially in rural areas they need to wear reflective clothing. If your child gets the bus to school, please make sure they wear reflective clothing so they can be seen at the bus stop. Don't leave them standing on the side of the road in the dark to wait for a bus!



**Budget 2019 was announced on Tuesday, 9 October. This article by O'Brien, Coffey & McSweeney Accountants and**

**Business Advisors sets out the main changes announced in taxation, social welfare, health and housing. In the coming weeks we will cover the main changes in more detail in our weekly column.**

## **TAXATION INCOME TAX**

The threshold for the higher rate of income tax (40%) will increase by €750. This means, for example, an increase from €34,550 to €35,300 for single individuals and an increase from €43,550 to €44,300 for married couples with one earner (from 1 January 2019).

The Home Carer Tax Credit will increase from €1,200 to €1,500.

The Earned Income Tax Credit for self-employed people will increase from €1,150 to €1,350.

### **VAT**

The VAT rate for the tourism sector will increase from 9% to 13.5% (from 1 January 2019).

The rate for newspapers and sporting facilities will continue at 9%. The VAT rate for e-books and electronically supplied newspapers will be reduced from 23% to 9% (from 1 January 2019).

### **UNIVERSAL SOCIAL CHARGE (USC)**

The 4.75% rate of USC will reduce to 4.5%.

The ceiling of the 2% band will increase from €19,372 to €19,874, so that the salary of a full-time worker on the minimum wage will remain outside the higher rates of USC.

Incomes of €13,000 or less will continue to be exempt from USC in 2019. Once your income is over this limit, the following rates will apply (from 1 January 2019):

- €0 to €12,012 @ 0.5%
- €12,012 to €19,874 @ 2%
- €19,874 to €70,044 @ 4.5%
- €70,044+ @ 8%
- Self-employed income over €100,000: 3% surcharge

The weekly income threshold for the higher rate of employer's PRSI will increase from €376 to €386.

### **CAPITAL ACQUISITIONS TAX (CAT)**

The Group A tax-free threshold, which applies primarily to gifts and inheritances from parents to their children, will be increased from €310,000 to €320,000. This increase applies to gifts or inheritances received on or after 10 October 2018.

### **STAMP DUTY**

The exemption for young trained farmers from stamp duty on agricultural land transactions continues for another 3 years to the end of 2021.

## **EXCISE DUTIES**

### **TOBACCO PRODUCTS TAX**

From midnight on 9 October 2018, the excise duty on a packet of 20 cigarettes will increase by 50 cent (including VAT) with a pro-rata increase on other tobacco products. There will be an additional 25 cent on roll-your-own tobacco.

### **BETTING DUTY**

The duty on bets placed by customers in the State will increase from 1% to 2% for bookmakers, and from 15% to 25% on the commissions earned by betting intermediaries.

## **SOCIAL WELFARE**

### **INCREASES IN SOCIAL WELFARE PAYMENTS**

The maximum rate of all weekly social welfare

payments will increase by €5 per week with proportional increases for qualified adults and people on reduced rates of payment. This also applies to employment programmes such as Community Employment (CE), Tús and the Rural Social Scheme (from week beginning 25 March 2019).

People aged 25 and under who are getting a reduced rate of Jobseeker's Allowance will get the full €5 increase (from week beginning 25 March 2019).

The weekly rate for a qualified child will increase by €2.20 from €31.80 to €34 for children under 12 years of age. It will increase by €5.20 from €31.80 to €37 for children aged 12 years and over (from week beginning 25 March 2019).

### **CHRISTMAS BONUS**

A Christmas Bonus of 100% will be paid in December 2018 to people getting a long-term social welfare payment (minimum payment of €20). (December 2018)

### **PARENTAL BENEFIT**

A new scheme will be introduced providing 2 weeks' Parental Benefit for insured employees and self-employed people. It will be paid at the same rate as Maternity Benefit and Paternity Benefit (from November 2019).

### **SELF-EMPLOYED PEOPLE**

Jobseeker's Benefit will be extended to self-employed people (late 2019).

### **ONE-PARENT FAMILIES**

The earnings disregard for the One-Parent Family Payment and the Jobseeker's Transition payment will increase by €20 per week, from €130 to €150 per week.

### **WORKING FAMILY PAYMENT**

A maintenance disregard of €95.23 per week for housing costs, with the remainder assessed at 50%, will be introduced for the Working Family Payment to bring it in line with other social assistance schemes.

### **BACK TO SCHOOL CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR ALLOWANCE**

The Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance will increase by €25 per child, from €125 to €150 for children aged 4-11 and from €250 to €275 for children aged 12-22 in full-time second-level education.

### **FUEL ALLOWANCE**

The Fuel Allowance season will be extended by 1 week, from 27 to 28 weeks. The extra week will apply to the current fuel season.

### **DOMICILIARY CARE ALLOWANCE**

Domiciliary Care Allowance will continue to be paid for 3 months in cases where the child being cared for has died.

### **PAYMENTS TO PEOPLE IN DIRECT PROVISION**

Daily Expenses Allowance (formerly called a Direct Provision Allowance) weekly rate will increase from €21.60 to €29.80 for children and €38.80 for adults.

### **EMPLOYER'S PRSI**

The weekly threshold for employer's PRSI will increase from €376 to €386 (from 1 January 2019).

### **COMMUNITY EMPLOYMENT**

Additional funding of €2 million for materials will be made available in 2019.

## **HOUSING**

A total of €2.3 billion is allocated to the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government for housing in 2019. In addition, local authorities will spend an extra €93 million on housing programmes, funded from Local Property Tax surpluses. This brings the total spending on housing to almost €2.4 billion for 2019.

### **PEOPLE IN MORTGAGE ARREARS**

€23 million has been allocated to the mortgage to rent scheme for 2019. This will allow over 400 households to avail of the scheme, which lets people in mortgage difficulty switch from owning their home to renting their home as a social housing tenant.

### **PRIVATE RENTED HOUSING**

The interest relief that landlords can claim against loans used to buy, improve or repair a rental property has increased from 80% to 100%. (This will be effective from 1 January 2019).

## **EMPLOYMENT AND BUSINESS**

### **NATIONAL MINIMUM WAGE**

The national minimum wage will increase from €9.55 per hour to €9.80 per hour (from 1 January 2019).

### **FUTURE GROWTH LOAN SCHEME**

A new Future Growth Loan Scheme will offer loans over 7-10 years to allow businesses make strategic investments after Brexit.

### **THREE YEAR START UP RELIEF (SECTION 486C)**

Three Year Start Up Relief provides corporation tax relief for profit-making start-up companies which create and maintain jobs. The relief is being extended a further three years, until the end of 2021.

## **EDUCATION, SKILLS AND CHILD AND FAMILY SUPPORT**

### **PRIMARY AND POST-PRIMARY SCHOOLS**

From September 2019, there will be an extra 372 teaching posts in schools. 271 of these are in response to rising numbers of pupils and 101 are to provide additional special classes.

The standard capitation grant will increase by 5% from September 2019.

A further 950 Special Needs Assistants (SNAs) will be recruited

### **CHILD AND FAMILY SUPPORT**

Extra funding of €89 million allows for increased income thresholds for the Affordable Childcare Scheme and ongoing development of the scheme, along with measures to improve early years inspections.

Additional funding of €33m is allocated to Tusla.

## **TRAVEL, TOURISM AND SPORT**

€35m is allocated to the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport to provide targeted supports for the tourism sector, including €4.5 million for regional initiatives such as Ireland's Hidden Heartlands and the Wild Atlantic Way, and nearly €10 million for the further development of the greenways.

Vehicle Registration Tax (VRT) relief available for hybrid electric vehicles is being extended until the end of 2019.

A 1% VRT surcharge (applied across all VRT bands) is being introduced for diesel engine passenger vehicles registered in the State (from 1 January 2019).

The 0% benefit-in-kind rate for electric vehicles introduced in Budget 2018 is being extended for a period of 3 years, with a cap of €50,000 on the Original Market Value of the vehicle.

## **HEALTH**

The prescription charge for medical card holders over the age of 70 will be reduced from €2 per item to €1.50 per item.

The weekly income limits for the GP visit card will be increased by 10%.

The monthly threshold for the Drugs Payment Scheme will be reduced from €134 to €124.



## PETER KEANE RATIFIED AS KERRY SENIOR MANAGER




## London Kerry Person of the Year

**WHAT YOU SHOULD CONSIDER WHILE REVIEWING THE FIGURES**

For compliance reasons all businesses produce year-end accounts. It is important that business owners interpret the information contained in the accounts to the best effect.

**Know Your Rights:**

**QUESTION**  
I'm thinking of getting the flu vaccine. Can you tell me about this vaccine?

**ANSWER**  
Influenza, usually known as the flu, is highly infectious and anyone can get it. However some groups are at greater risk of complications if they get the flu. This includes people over the age of 65, pregnant women and people who have a chronic medical condition.

The flu vaccine can help protect you from getting the flu. The flu virus changes every year and this is why there is a new vaccine each year. Vaccination is strongly recommended if you:

- Are aged 65 or over
- Have a long-term medical condition, for example, diabetes or chronic heart, kidney, liver, lung or neurological disease
- Have an impaired immune system due to disease or treatment
- Have a body mass index (BMI) over 40
- Are pregnant
- Live in a nursing home or other long-stay institution
- Are a carer or a healthcare worker
- Have regular contact with poultry, water fowl or pigs

If you are aged 18 or over, you can get the vaccine from your GP (family doctor) or pharmacist. Children can get the vaccine from a GP.

The vaccine itself is free of charge if you are in one of the recommended groups. However, doctors and pharmacists may charge a consultation fee when they give you the vaccine.

If you have a medical card or GP visit card, you can get the vaccine without being charged a consultation fee.

Those who have completed Leaving Certificate (or higher) but are in receipt of jobseeker payments or means-tested social welfare benefits, and holders of medical cards, and their dependents are also entitled to free tuition. All others will be charged fees. The current fee per module is €75.00 for Level 3 and Level 4 and €150.00 for Level 5 and Level 6.

The average Dane marries in their early to mid-thirties, so most of them are single when their 25th birthday rolls around, which calls for getting “cinnamon-ed.” Often, friends attack the birthday pebersvend or pebermø by tying them to a lamppost, making them don goggles, and then pelting them with handfuls of spice. Some strategic celebrants add eggs to the batter for maximum adhesion.

At age 30, the cinnamon attack is upgraded to



pepper, and the birthday victim is likely to receive at least one pepper grinder as a gift. And after merrymakers finish up a few rounds of spice-bombing, everyone heads out for a few rounds at the bar.

## A GOLD MEDAL WINNING GREAT-GRANDMOTHER

Man Kaur is a 102-year-old Indian woman, that has three children, nine grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren and has severe osteoporosis and a curved spine but routinely competes in the World Masters Athletic Championships, and she almost always is in the medals. Of course apart from her fitness it also helps that she's often the only competitor in her age bracket.

Ms. Kaur didn't start running until 2009 when her son Gurdev Singh then aged 71 suggested she take up track and field to pass the time.

Mr. Singh has been competing in track events since his college days, and continues to participate, racking up a more than 80 medals since 1992. He brought her to the track with him to show her what it was all about.

Ms. Kaur began to improve her running time, and after two years, Mr. Singh registered her for the same international events he was participating in, including the World Masters Games, an athletic competition held every four years for those over the age of 35. Ms. Kaur is often the oldest woman competing at the games. She has won more than 30 medals since she started competing. At the 2017 World Masters Games in Auckland, she won the gold for the 100-meter and 200-meter races. She also tried her hand at two other sports, shot put and javelin, and broke a record for hurling a javelin 16 feet. She took the gold in both events.

In the mornings, Ms. Kaur consumes kefir, soy milk and fresh juices. An early lunch consists of lentils, vegetables and flat bread. At 4 p.m., she has a snack of wheat grass juice, nuts and seeds. Dinner is more lentils and vegetables with another glass of soy milk.

She hits the track every day for about an hour. Three days are devoted to shot put and javelin while the rest of the week is spent on the track. Sprint and run days are alternated. On sprint days, Ms. Kaur runs for 30, 40 and 50 meters, with 100- and 200-meter runs on the alternating day.

### FOCUS ON WINTER BEDDING PLANTS

With most of the summer bedding displays in hanging baskets, containers and window boxes nearly finished now is the time to start replanting them with a winter selection of bedding plants. Even though you won't have as much of a selection of winter bedding as you have in the summer, there is still a large range to choose from. When you are choosing your winter bedding plants, try to pick the biggest and the strongest as they don't grow during the winter. The good thing about winter displays in containers is that you can choose what you want as a centre piece, because you will probably get a few seasons out of it in the container and you can plant it somewhere in your garden afterwards. Some good centre pieces for containers are large, ie: Phormium, Cordyline, (green or purple), Variegata, Holly or Bay Tree. Small, ie: Carex Algold, Heuchera, Euonymus, Azalea, but just make sure when choosing that the plant is evergreen. There is also a good selection of flowering winter bedding such as Violets, Pansy, Primrose, Polyanthis, Cyclamen, Ornamental Cabbage. Next week, planting your baskets and containers for winter.

Relationships suffer when couples are negative, criticising, resentful and holding grudges. However, some negativity is normal and realistic and it is important that frustrations and grievances are aired. Striking a balance between the two extremes is vital.

**Empathy** refers to the ability to understand from the other person's perspective. Individuals appear to be happier in their relationship when they believe that their partner understands what they think and feel.

**Commitment** to the relationship is vital despite the inevitable challenges and obstacles that couples encounter. When couples are prepared to compromise and balance their concern for self with concern for their partner, they are more likely to find happiness and joy in their relationship.

**Acceptance** is one of the most basic needs in any relationship. Feeling truly accepted for who we are – leads us to feeling more secure and confident in our relationship. Interestingly, studies show that change is more likely to occur when couples respect difference and accept each other as they are (as much as they may not like it).

**Love and respect** are vital components for a healthy relationship. All too often couples can begin to neglect the love and romance that was once so present. It is important to continue to cultivate and rekindle this love and respect throughout the lifetime of the relationship. Doing so will greatly help sustain a long-lasting and fulfilling relationships. We will continue to focus on the topic of Relationships in the coming weeks and look at what we can do to make our relationships stronger, more enjoyable and satisfying.
