LIR CAFE FUNDRAISER FOR MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE

A coffee morning due to be held on Wednesday 25th January at Lir Cafe is set to raise much needed funds for Motor Neurone Disease.

The charity is very close to the heart of proprietor and organiser of the event, Alan Oliver, who lost his Mum to the harsh disease in November.

Bernadette Oliver was an active woman and mother of seven children when she contracted the disease at the young age of 69.

"She was very active, playing badminton and ten pin bowling when she was diagnosed and lived for three years with the degenerative condition before passing away at the young age of 72" Alan told the Killarney Outlook.

"We cannot praise enough the help we got from the Irish Motor Neurone Disease Association (IMNDA) during my mother's illness", he said. "They provided all the equipment needed for my mother to live her life to the best of her ability including home nursing", he added. Alan who is the proprietor

of Lir Cafe plans to run the event from 8am to 2pm and one of his regular customers has come on board with an offer he couldn't refuse. Frank Murphy of Monex is a regular at Lir Cafe and when he heard about the charity event he

The vibrant community in Beaufort have just taken delivery of a Defibrillator which is installed at the local GAA Clubrooms thanks to an initiative by the GAA and sponsored by Irish Life. Beaufort Community have a very energetic Defibrillator group under the leadership of Mary O'Connor which has led to numerous people in the Parish trained in using it on an ongoing basis. The club got involved when they were selected to take part in a GAA Healthy Club Project. It was a pilot project run by the GAA in conjunction with the HSE. The project was launched in Croke Park in 2013 by the then President Liam O'Neill and Tony Holohan, CMO with the HSE. Phase 1 encompassed a broad spectrum of health related issued including promotion of health through physical activity, social inclusion initiatives and activities, health and safety, healthy eating and diet, drug and alcohol misuse, mental health and well-being, suicide prevention and response, promotion of heath through physical activity, social inclusion initiatives and activities for non-playing members. The club have set up a Healthy Club Committee, its first job was to access the Club and highlight the good work already being done in the area of health promotion and identify areas the Club would like to prioritise in the future. The assessment fell under 4 general categories: Governance, Environment, Partnerships, Programmes.

The initiatives the club has been involved in since getting involved include running Exercise/Pilates Classes for all ages from over 50s to teenage girls and Gym programmes for boys. The progressive club also host the annual Ring of the Reeks Cycle which goes through one of the most scenic areas of Kerry along with a Good Friday Walk in aid of the local Cancer Hospice as well as other walks throughout the year.

There is an annual Quiz held also at Christmas time which gets locals and people home for Christmas enjoying the festivities together.

"We encourage healthy snacks at underage medal presentations and for Blitz's etc. when held in the club", a spokesperson for the club told the Killarney Outlook.

"We are now in Stage 2 of the Healthy Club Project promoted by Community and Health Department in Croke Park with partners HSE and Irish Life Insurance.

"We hope to build on the good work already in place, get more members involved and continue with new activities for all the community", the spokesperson added.



Honey Nut and Banana Porridge

Serves 1 -(Each serving contains approx 280 kcal) The Ingredients 30g oats 150ml low fat milk 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon ¹/₂ teaspoon honey 1 tablespoon chopped almonds 1/2 chopped banana

THE METHOD

Place oats with milk in a pot and place on the hob

Cook for 5 mins on medium heat until creamy Sprinkle with cinnamon.

75g chicken

50g butterhead lettuce 50g spinach 100g baby tomatoes 25g black eyed beans 50g sweetcorn ¼ cucumber 1 scallion

Top with chopped chicken, black eyed peas, sweet corn, chopped cucumber, scallion, grated cheese and coriander. Drizzle with Aoife's BBQ sauce.

Sweet and Sour Vegetable and Cashew Nut Stir Fry Serves 2 -

(Each serving contains approx 540 kcal) **The Ingredients**

1 onion, chopped, 2 carrots, chopped 1 courgette, sliced, 10g broccoli, cut into florets 100g mushrooms, sliced, 55g cashew nuts 50g pineapple, cut into chunks

100g wholewheat noodles

Food Staples

1 tablespoon olive oil 1/2 teaspoon chilli flakes 1 tablespoon honey



2 tablespoons light soy sauce 1 tablespoon rice vinegar

The Method: Bring a pan of water to the boil, add noodles and simmer for approximately 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Heat the olive oil in a wok or pan and stir fry the onions for 1-2 minutes. Add in the carrots, courgettes and broccoli and stir fry for 2-3 minutes. Add the mushrooms, pineapple, honey, soy sauce and vinegar and cook for a further 1-2 minutes In a separate pan, dry fry the cashew nuts for approximately 1 minute and add to the vegetables. Serve the cashew nut and vegetable mixture with the wholewheat noodles.


There will be no Division One semi-finals this season. Instead, the top two teams will contest the final on April 9th, one week after the Round 7 matches have been completed.



MOTORING OUTLOOK

WINTER BREAKDOWNS

CAR PROBLEMS CAUSED BY EXTREME COLD

The winters of 2009/10 and 2010/11 were among the worst in living memory with widespread snow and ice for weeks on end and temperatures regularly dropping well below -10C.

Records tumbled as the AA had its busiest day ever on Monday 4 January 2010 and then again, less than 12 months later on Monday 20 December 2010 when AA patrols handled more than 28,000 breakdowns.

Battery faults are far and away the most common cause of breakdowns at this time of year but such extreme weather throws up some unusual types of breakdown as well.

Frozen screen washers: Not really a breakdown, unless you keep running the pump until it burns out and blows a fuse affecting something like the immobiliser system! Use a screenwash additive all year round - undiluted in winter.

Frozen wipers: Trying to operate windscreen wipers stuck solid to the glass can lead to blown fuses affecting other more vital systems. If low temperatures are forecast make sure that automatic windscreen wipers are turned off – so they don't try to operate when you turn the ignition on. Make sure the wipers aren't stuck to the glass, before setting off too.

Frozen engines: Due to lack of anti-freeze. Make sure you get it checked regularly and top-

up using a mix of the correct type of anti-freeze. **Stripped teeth on cambelt causing engine damage:** Try to start a car with a frozen waterpump and you could strip the teeth off the timing belt leading to expensive internal engine damage.

Frozen door locks and door seals: A squirt of a water-dispersant like WD40 in the locks will help as will a light smear of Vaseline or silicone polish on the door seals. If snow falls clear it from the car while still soft rather than leaving it for days on end – the car will turn into a block of ice.

Frozen ignition locks: It's hard to keep the inside of the car completely dry when it's cold and wet outside but it'll help avoid this rare but annoying problem – don't leave wet clothes or boots in the car overnight.

Windows frozen to their frame: Windows can become detached from the mechanism inside the door if you try to power them down while the windows frozen in the frame. Best left until the car's warmed up and the ice melted.

Diesel fuel waxing: In extreme cold, wax crystals form in diesel fuel and can block fuel lines and filters. All diesel sold in the UK between 16 November and 15 March has to meet the 'Winter diesel standard' which ensures protection against waxing down to -15C. There's not much you can do to avoid it if the temperature goes really low – apart from using a garage overnight if you have one and trying to keep the car warm. Electric fuel filter heaters are available.



Electronic parking brake not releasing: If the driven wheels are on an icy road and can't grip it's possible that an automatic parking brake won't release.

Frozen rear drum brakes and handbrake cables: It's good to clean your car regularly through the winter to remove corrosive road salt but not if you use a hose or pressure washer and blast water inside brake cables or drums and the temperature drops. A drive after cleaning can help but it's best to take care when hosing wheel arches or wheels.

Frozen alternators: Fortunately very rare, but poor design of under-bonnet drains can lead to water from the windscreen getting into the alternator and freezing the rotor. A screaming noise from the 'fanbelt' accompanied by smoke, a burning smell and a battery warning light on the dash will tell you there's something wrong.

BATTERY BREAKDOWNS

Most common cause of breakdown at any time of year but particularly in winter.

Battery faults are the most common cause of breakdown. AA patrols were called to more than half a million battery breakdowns in 2010 and replaced more than 140,000 batteries. Batteries can die at any time of year but it's more likely in winter when cold temperatures

hit car batteries with a triple-whammy: Power output drops ability to accept a charge drops, so the battery doesn't recharge as quickly when you're driving, load increases – lights, blowers, wipers, heated seats, rearscreen heater etc are all used more. Add in the fact that many cars stand unused over the Christmas holiday and it's no surprise that the first day back to work after New Year is always one of the busiest of the year for the AA.

Battery problems can be avoided: The garage that services your car should check that clamps and connections to the battery are secure and free from corrosion, but there are a few simple tips you can follow to reduce the chance of your battery letting you down in the depths of winter;

Age: If the battery is more than five years old and there's any sign of it struggling to start the car, get it replaced. Some will struggle on for a bit but many won't. It's much better done at your convenience than as a roadside emergency.

Charge: If you mostly do short journeys or leave the car standing for days at a time, invest in a modern battery conditioner/intelligent charger. These can be left connected to the battery indefinitely and can prolong its life without overcharging it.

Load: Check that everything electrical is turned off when you park up – even an interior light, boot light, or radio left on overnight can kill a battery when it's cold.

Give the battery a chance: Switch off everything electrical and dip the clutch to reduce the load on the battery when you start a cold car.

CYCLE TO WORK SCHEME

Benefits of the scheme for employees/directors?

As the bicycle and/or safety equipment are exempt from tax the employee/director will not be liable to income tax at his or her marginal rate, employee's PRSI or USC on the cost of the benefit, as reflected in the amount of the salary sacrificed.

Benefits of the scheme for employers?

The employer benefits in that the employer's PRSI is not payable on the cost of the bicycle and/or safety equipment.

Note, however, that employers will not be able to reclaim the VAT paid on the bicycle and/or safety equipment.

Do all employers have to participate in the scheme?

Participation in the scheme is voluntary for employers. However, employers choosing to participate in the scheme must make it generally available to all employees/directors who wish to avail of it.

How often can an employee avail of the scheme?

The tax exempt benefit-in-kind may only be provided to an individual employee once in any period of five consecutive tax years. The tax year in which the bicycle is provided is counted as the first year.

Employees should note that if they avail of the scheme for even a small amount of expenditure relating to the provision of bicycles and/or safety equipment they will not be able to avail of the relief again for five years.

CLEANING PRODUCTS YOU SHOULD NEVER MIX:

*Two different drain cleaners or even using one right after the other. These are powerful formulas, and could even explode if combined. Use one product according to package directions. If it doesn't work, don't try another product. Instead, call a plumber.

*Baking soda is basic and vinegar is acidic. When you put them together you get mostly water and sodium acetate. Vinegar causes baking soda to foam up; if stored in a closed container, the mixture can explode.

*Combining hydrogen peroxide and vinegar in the same container creates peracetic acid, which is potentially toxic and can irritate the skin, eyes, and respiratory system.

*Bleach + vinegar produce chlorine gas, which even at low levels, can cause coughing, breathing problems, and burning, watery eyes. *Bleach and ammonia produces a toxic gas called chloramine. It causes the same symptoms as bleach and vinegar — along with shortness of breath and chest pain. Many glass and window cleaners contain ammonia, so never mix those with bleach.

*Make it a rule to never mix bleach with anything but plain water.

FRENCH WORKERS NOW HAVE LEGAL RIGHT TO IGNORE OUTSIDE OF OFFICE HOURS EMAILS FROM BOSS:

A new law, already in effect from January 1st is mandating French companies grant their employees a "right to disconnect" from workrelated technology outside of office hours. The mandate applies to companies with 50 or more employees, and employers will be granted a grace period to negotiate the details with workers. If an agreement can't be reached, companies will instead create an explicit charter spelling out what rights and obligations workers have when at home. The law will not necessarily ban any after-hour emails from popping up, since some employees might decide for themselves when they'd like to receive them.

People in every field are dealing with more and more workplace stress, in part because they feel they can't turn off from work once they leave the office.

BALLOON RELEASES ARE KILLING WILDLIFE AND MARINE ANIMALS:

While those who organise and participate in balloon releases probably have the best of



intentions, what they fail to consider is what happens when those balloons eventually land – and when they do the results are detrimental to wildlife and marine animals.

Balloons negatively impact our environment by littering streams, lakes, and beaches. It's basically the same as intentionally throwing rubbish on the ground or into the ocean. Even balloons marketed as biodegradable or "ecofriendly" can still take years to disintegrate, meaning they're not any better for the environment than standard balloons.

When balloons make their way into the water, their tattered ends and floating pieces can resemble jellyfish or other sea life consumed by marine animals such as sea turtles, fish, and dolphins. When the pieces of latex or Mylar are mistaken for food and ingested, they can get lodged in the digestive tract, inhibiting animal's ability to eat and causing a slow and painful death by starvation.

Wildlife can also fall victim to balloons and balloon strings when the pieces fall to the ground or onto trees and bushes. Birds have been found injured with ribbons wrapped around their beaks or wings, and have strangled themselves when they become entangled in strings attached to trees or power lines. And just like marine animals, they can succumb to a painful death after ingesting balloons.

If you know of someone planning a balloon release, please urge them to reconsider and use earth- and animal-friendly options instead, there are so many other symbolic acts that don't involve the use of balloons., the list is almost endless and freely available on the internet or why not use your own imagination.

MILLIONS OF PEOPLE STILL RENT DVD'S:

Streaming sites have grown so much over the past couple years that the "experts" said in 2014 that DVDs would go the way of VHS starting in 2016 and be near obsolete in 2018.

But just one company in the United States of America alone says about 5.3 million people still wait for DVDs and Blu-rays to get delivered to their mailboxes from them, with subscribers paying \$5 to \$12 each month for a collection of more than 93,000 titles that bring in about \$132 million in revenue each quarter.

While numbers are dwindling the world over, whether it's because people want more selection than streaming services have to offer or because they don't have great Internet where they live, the demand for DVD's is still alive and well.

However if you have a favourite singing artist or film actor maybe it's time to start building up your DVD library before they become impossible to buy.

U.S. NAVY-TRAINED DOLPHINS TO HELP THEIR ENDANGERED PORPOISE FRIENDS:

The Vaquita, a tiny porpoise that lives in the Gulf of California and is considered by the World Wildlife Federation to be the rarest marine mammal in the world, might get some help repopulating its species from Navy-trained dolphins.

The Navy Marine Mammal Programme, which trains dolphins to use their sonar to find sea mines, will deploy four of its dolphins to find the elusive Vaquitas, of which fewer than 60 are believed to still exist. The hope is that they can be rounded up and placed in a large pen, where they'll be safe and free to breed in semicaptivity.

However the World Wildlife Fund fears that attempts to capture Vaquitas, which were discovered in 1958 and have never been captured alive, will only cause more of them to die without any guarantee that they would even breed. But if conservationists do nothing at all, the Vaquitas, whose population has declined dramatically due to being caught in illegal fishing nets, may be extinct within just a few years.

If all goes as planned, Navy dolphins will start rounding up Vaquitas this spring.

EVER HEARD OF A SMART CLOTHES PEG?

The clothes peg dates back at least to the 1800s, but in 2016 it became "smart." Peggy, the laundry peg will "help you lighten the load" by telling you when the washer cycle is over and if the weather is nice enough to hang your clothes outside. The device connects to your phones and sends you alerts when the weather changes or when you need to remove your clothes.

What a marvellous invention when you remember back to when you and your ancestors had to rely on common sense to tell you when the weather was lousy by simply looking outside and in slightly more modern times you knew when your cycles were over when the washer and dryer stopped making noise.

However the product is also another way hackers can get into your home as the more technology you have, the greater the chance of hackers breaking your codes.

THE CAR OF THE FUTURE WILL PREDICT ITS OWN BREAKDOWNS:

The Israel-based "predictive maintenance" startup company, 3DSignals, has developed an artificial intelligence system that can decipher your car's weird sounds better and earlier than you can by using neural networks to learn how a machine should sound when it's functioning properly, the goal is that their system will detect any disruption that might mean a problem is about to arise.

The company is currently working with a major steel manufacturing and a renewable energy company where ultrasonic microphones in those factories and plants are recording audio so the neural network can learn how the machines are supposed to sound. Initially, these companies are only benefiting from a basic feature that predicts when some machine parts may wear out based on physics models. But as the system records more data, it will be able to detect unusual sounds. Clients can then train the system by labelling sound patterns that connect to particular problems.

At the moment, the systems are only being used on industrial machinery but it is believed the technology will soon be adopted by auto manufacturers' services.

BRAVE MAN SAVES A DROWNING 400-LB BLACK BEAR:

Bears have an incredible sense of smell, and when they're hungry, bears will go to some pretty crazy extremes to get their paws on a snack. Bears are also very intelligent, so once they learn that humans provide a seemingly endless supply of snacks, by way of rubbish or half-eaten candy bars that get left behind, they will search out residential areas to find something tasty to eat.

A 400-pound black bear set out to follow his nose and wandered all the way from his home in Osceola National Forest to a residential area in Alligator Point, Florida. When he was discovered shuffling through one of the residents rubbish, wildlife authorities set out sedate the animal as that would be the safest way to capture him so they could transport him back to his home.

After being hit with a tranquilizer dart, the bear took off towards the ocean and hopped into the water. As he was swimming out into the Gulf, the tranquilizers began to kick in and he became drowsy and started to drown.

Luckily, Adam Warwick, a biologist with the Wildlife Commission was nearby...without even flinching at the size and strength of the bear, Mr. Warwick dived into the sea and grabbed hold of the floundering animal, but the bear was beginning to lose feeling in his legs and struggled to crawl onto Mr. Warwick to stay afloat.

Knowing he would need to act quickly and stay as calm as possible, Mr Warwick began to drag the bear to shore while trying to keep his head above water as the bear was losing more and more mobility.

The brave biologist just kept swimming, despite the growing weight of the 400-pound bear and managed to tow the bear the entire 25 yards to land. Finally on shore, the groggy bear and exhausted Mr. Warwick were hoisted onto land, as the bear weighed too much for the crew to handle they used a tractor and loader to move the still sedated bear and Mr. Warwick made sure the bear made it safely onto the transport vehicle.

11 YEAR OLD RAISES MONEY BY OFFERING ADVICE TO STRESSED NEW YORKERS:

Ciro Ortiz – also known as the Emotional Advice Kid – sets up his work station in a New York City subway to offer emotional advice at \$2 per five minute session.

The 11-year-old first got the idea for his entrepreneurial adventure after he was bullied in school. Because he was raised by parents who encouraged him to be kind to others, Ciro funnelled his feelings into helping his fellow New Yorkers with their life problems.

On a typical day, this young shrink can make up to \$50, which he always funnels back into feeding his classmates at school.

Ciro reportedly has a knack for addressing anxious adults with impressively simple responses for instance one afternoon recently; he was approached by a husband who was upset that his wife had become a vegan. "I told him she likes to eat what she wants and he likes to eat whatever he wants so they're just gonna have to deal with it."

Ciro said he hears the most grief from his patients about how the times are changing and the world used to be so much better in the old days. His response? "Try to accept change. Everything changes. We have to change too."

DOG SPENT DAYS PROTECTING INJURED FRIEND FROM PASSING TRAINS:

A devoted guard dog was found recently keeping watch over a fallen canine companion who had injured herself on a set of snowy train tracks in western Ukraine, protecting his friend by keeping her warm and ducking their heads every time a train went by.

The two were finally found on Christmas Day by Denis Malafeev who posted pictures of the striking friendship on Facebook. Although their rescue attempts took several tries due to the male's viciousness in protecting his companion, she was eventually lifted off of the train tracks and taken to a veterinarian.

"He kept her warm for at least two days under the constant threat of danger!" wrote Mr, Malafeev "I don't know what to call it: instinct, love, friendship, attachment. I only know this: not every human is capable of this. We should all learn from it!"

The dogs, named Panda and Lucy, were treated for their injuries and then returned to the original owners who had reported them missing.

IRISH MOTHER IS DONATING TWO ORGANS TO SAVE HER LITTLE BOY'S LIFE:

Sarah Lamont from Antrim says she hasn't doubted for a second her decision to donate both a kidney and part of her liver to save her 4-year-old son Joe.

Born with a rare condition - autosomal recessive polycystic kidney disease - Joe was forced to have his kidneys removed and has depended on constant dialysis ever since.

He has also developed advanced liver disease, which could prove life threatening without a transplant.

Joe has been on the transplant list for more than a year and his mother said she could wait no longer to get him the help he needs, there has already been a few times where she has been told he's not going to make it.

Ms. Lamont adds that Joe's experience shows how vital organ donation is. "I'm lucky I can give Joe a liver and kidney, but if he had a heart problem he could die waiting," she explained. "You also don't know how long organ transplants last, so he'll probably need multiple transplants in his life."

Urging others to register as a donor immediately she said: "If you're on your deathbed of course you would take an organ, so if you're prepared to take it you should of course be prepared to give." The liver transplant is planned for January 25th, with the kidney operation in the following months when both mother and son have recovered.




