The 21 year old former St. Brigid's Presentation School student suffered serious injuries in the crash including fractured bones, abdominal and head injuries.

Track on track for June construction start

G for the Killarney Community Micro Track Project through the South Kerry Development Partnership.

Mayor of Killarney Niall Kelleher made the announcement this week and the news has been welcomed by the fundraising committee.

"We has raised €105,000 privately so far, through a combination of fundraising events and through private donations", Jerry Griffin told the Killarney Outlook.

With just over two thirds of the money raised so far, the project group hopes to start the construction towards the end of June.

The project, which is seen as one of the most innovative community recreational projects in the country will be developed in the middle of the school area in Killarney and adjacent to Kerry Parents and Friends.The site has been generously donated by the St. Brendan's trust on a leased basis to the community group, allowing for a multi million euro impact. Groups from athletics, paralympics, special olympics and community groups are set to benefit

from this project.

"With access for all on a managed basis and easy accessibility by almost 2,000 students in the vicinity the gains through fit for youth and fit for life are priceless", Jerry said.

Sustainability and proximity are the two of the key pillars of this facility so the physical health and mental health benefits will be huge for the community", he added.

"Mass participation through the magnetic effect of the zone, will occur organically and if one has greater elite potential for example in track and field, then this can be supported in this facility to the highest level, by volunteers in a fun environment", Jerry added.

The group are hoping to raise the balance of the funds through donations, to enable the project to be debt free as soon as possible.

A plan is being worked out to reach that objective and donations can be made directly at the AIB bank Killarney.

The voluntary group also welcome any support and idea.





A n investement of $\in 2.25$ million has been announced by Fáilte Ireland, in partnership with the OPW, for work on the Blasket Centre in Kerry, to enhance the visitor experience at the OPW site.

The investment, which forms part of Fáilte Ireland's strategic partnership with the OPW, will see the development of a new walkway and signature viewing point at the Blasket Island Visitor Centre.

It is hoped that this joint initiative between Fáilte Ireland and the OPW will significantly improve the visitor experience and double visitor numbers to 100,000. Fáilte Ireland is providing 75% of the funding for the project from its Capital Grants budget, with the remainder of the funding being provided by the OPW.

The new signature walkway, which will be in place by the end of the year, will include an exciting viewing platform with dramatic vistas of the coastline and the Blasket Island.

The funding will also help to upgrade a number of interpretative galleries at the site, bringing to life the rich story of the Island through interactive tables, which will be available in multiple languages.

Killarney unite in grief for tragic American couple

The people of Killarney were united in grief following the tragic accident which took place at the Gap of Dunloe on Monday last. American couple, Rosalyn Joy Few and Normand Larose were killed when the pony and trap in which they were travelling fell from the narrow road into a deep ravine.

Four other family members, including Rosalyn Joy Few's daughter, her husband and their two teenage children were travelling behind the couple and came on the tragic accident, which has shocked the local community to the core. Emergency workers and members of the Kerry Mountain Rescue Team quickly made their way to the accident scene where the couple were pronounced dead and transferred to University Hospital Kerry. The horse was severely injured in the fall and was put down at the accident site.

Locals gathered at the entrance to the Gap of Dunloe on Tuesday evening when local Priest Fr. Paddy O'Donoghue led a special memorial service for the victims.

The Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce has offered their

deepest condolences to the family of the deceased couple.

"Our thoughts and prayers are with the family of the couple that tragically lost their lives in the Gap of Dunloe yesterday. We offer every possible support to the bereaved family", Paul O'Neill, Chamber President said.

The Cathaoirleach of the Killarney Municipal Area Niall Kelleher has also offered his deepest sympathies on the tragic accident.

A book of condolences has opened at Killarney Town Hall.

Call to Honour Your Humanitarian Heroes!

he 11th annual Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Weekend will take place later this year and this week nominations have been invited for the 2018 Hugh O'Flaherty International Humanitarian Award

As part of the 11th annual Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Weekend, which will take place on Saturday November 3rd & Sunday November 4th 2018 in Killarney, The Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Society are inviting the public, NGOs, voluntary bodies and organisations to nominate the person or organisation they feel is doing outstanding humanitarian work and most deserving of the 2018 Hugh O'Flaherty International Humanitarian Award.

Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty, who was from Killarney, was dubbed the Scarlet Pimpernel of the Vatican for his humanitarian lifesaving exploits during World War II. During the course of the war he was instrumental in saving the lives of more than 6,500 anti-Fascists, Allied escapees, Jews and many others by hiding them from the Gestapo in a number of safe houses, convents etc. throughout Rome. On the day Rome was liberated, June 4th 1944, his organisation was still successfully hiding almost 4000 people, despite the efforts of the Gestapo to recapture them.

The work of Monsignor O'Flaherty follows a long tradition of humanitarian service by Irish people, when he provided refuge and assistance to the oppressed in Rome without any regard for race, colour, creed or political beliefs – applying his own simple yet profound belief that "God Has No Country". In 2013, to mark the 50th Anniversary of the Monsignor's death, a magnificent lifesize bronze memorial was unveiled on Mission Road in Killarney. It is the work of Valentia Based artist Alan Ryan Hall.

After WW2 Monsignor O'Flaherty received many honours including Commander of the British Empire and the US Medal of Freedom. In November 2008, in recognition of his immense humanitarian deeds the people of his hometown of Killarney posthumously presented the Killarney Humanitarian Award to Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty. For subsequent years, the Award was renamed in his honour and presented to worthy recipients.

Last year's 2017 Humanitarian Award recipient was Irish Loreto Sister Orla Treacy. In 2006, she went to Sudan to establish an educational & medical facility in that war-torn country.

Peers share their experience and understanding and offer an exchange of thoughts and techniques around self-care and resilience in a supportive, confidential and proactive environment.

For some people taking the first step can be hard but at an Aware Support & Self Care Group every opportunity is given to reassure you.

When you arrive at an Aware Support Group, you are greeted by two Aware volunteer facilitators who provide you with literature about Aware services. A facilitator opens the meeting by outlining the group rules including confidentiality and explaining the purpose of the Aware Support Group. Facilitators introduce themselves by their first name only and invite all attending to do likewise. The meeting is declared open to anyone who would like to share. Someone in the group shares their thoughts and feelings. To gain understanding for the group, a facilitator may ask some questions to clarify what has been shared. The facilitator asks the person sharing if they want feedback from the group and if so, opens to the group for their thoughts and support. A facilitator briefly summarises any options offered by the group before allowing the space for others to share. A proactive approach is used throughout the Support Group meeting in which participants can express emotion, acknowledge feelings, question thoughts and beliefs and focus particularly on helpful actions they can take.

ESB issue advice ahead of referendum





It is my belief that Killarney town is definitely the tourism capital of not Ireland, Europe but of the world. As a public representative identifying future problems and finding solutions for them is a very important job. One of the biggest problems at present and in the future for Killarney is traffic management and providing adequate parking. 14 years ago a survey identified a shortage of 800 spaces in the town. Nothing has improved and the situation has gotten worse. I compliment Kerry County Council and its engineers who I hold in the highest of regard but we have to work together in identifying future solutions. For example at present the pedestrianising of Plunkett Street is a great experiment to undertake but there is absolutely no need to have it closed to vehicular traffic during the day. In the evening time of course yes try it on an experimental basis see what way it benefits the businesses in the town and if its welcomed by locals and visitors alike. The situation at the top of high street where the whole town is been choked because of unnecessary and unwanted traffic lights. Indeed we hold a record in that the car park at the top of high street is the only car park in Ireland where you have to wait at a red light to get out of the car park. Everybody knows that a small mini roundabout at this location would have been far more successful and allowed for a quicker through put of traffic. I do not blame anybody for this error but what I do suggest is that when a mistake is made and when it is seen to be wrong that people should say 'right we will change this back and put in a better system'. It is many years ago that the late former mayor of the town and then Councillor Dermot O'Callaghan suggested a multi storey car park. The only mistake that he made was he was approximately 25-30 years ahead of his time. Of course he was right. The town is ready for a multi storey car park. Surface parking in a town that is as busy as Killarney is outdated and is a thing of the past. We have to wake up to this reality. We have as I have stated the finest town, the best of facilities, the beauty of a national park adjacent to it, and great people working together to provide what is a first class service but we have to have the infrastructure in place to cater for the people that are and will be coming over the years. Also we must remember that our locals are also suffering with large queues of cars every day trying to manoeuvre around the town. We have excellent public representatives in our local authority and we all need to unite in addressing this most serious issue in the future.



FOCUS ON SUMMER BEDDING

Its that time of year again when we think of putting colour in our pots, baskets and containers and also in the ground. Summer Bedding plants can be used very effectively in the ground for filling gaps between shrubs or border perennial plants as they can cover a lot of ground and add plenty of colour very guickly. When planting Summer bedding plants in the ground the first thing you have to do is to dig over the area and dig in plenty of compost. Most Summer Bedding plants need a nice sunny sheltered position but if you have a shaded area, begonias are excellent bedding plants for this situation and they will give you flowers right through the summer and into early autumn. As an added bonus they will also provide you with excellent coloured foliage from light green to dark purple. Always remember when planting bedding to put the taller ones at the back. If you want to do a summer display of bedding on its own in a bed you will have to choose a centre piece - a good plant for this would be a standard fuschia. Then start with the tallest, such as marigolds or antirrhinums and work your way out to the edge of the bed with some begonias or petunias and finally at the edge of the bed with some lobelia and alyssum. A good idea before you plant would be to position all your plants to get an overall view of what it will look like. And remember to water all plants well in afterwards.

EDUCATION OUTLOOK Exam candidates must now focus on June's State Exams

Ust eight weeks remain before the Leaving Cert (LC), Leaving Cert Applied (LCA) and Junior Cert (JC) exams get underway on Wednesday, 6th June and continue until Friday 22nd June, Thursday 14th June and Wednesday 20th June, respectively.

The new H/O grading system and the new CAO common points system were successfully introduced in last year's Leaving Cert exam. Grades now cover multiples of ten percentage points. 625 points is still the maximum CAO score but the new common points scale resulted in a much greater spread of points in 2017. Grades from H1 to H7 are awarded points at Higher Level while grades from O1 to O6 merit points at Ordinary Level.

At Junior Cert level, the State Examinations Commissions (SEC) began phasing in six new Grade Descriptors last year. The new grade descriptors - Distinction, Higher Merit, Merit, Achieved, Partially Achieved, and Not Graded – were used for English in 2017 in the reformed Junior Cycle programme. This format of grading will be gradually phased in until 2021.

Candidates can approach the state exams optimistically because they are well prepared by a dedicated teaching force. The national results achieved each year in the state exams are very impressive. In addition, places in further and higher education courses, apprenticeships and traineeships are very plentiful in a buoyant economy. At this stage, there will certainly be more places available than there will be applicants to take up these places. More employment opportunities are available to school leavers as the green shoots of economic expansion are sprouting copiously. Nevertheless, if the trend of previous years continues, the vast majority of Leaving Cert exam candidates will continue in education as the changing nature of the work environment means that employers are looking for staff with qualifications at craft, traineeship, degree or post-graduate level.

The stigma of failure is long gone from the state exams. Back in the day, failure in Irish meant overall failure. Thankfully, those days are far behind us. Every candidate's performance is now acknowledged by individual certification. Exam candidates' main aim nowadays is to achieve the minimum entry requirements, the specific course requirements and the points for their preferred courses. The SEC also provides a range of exam supports, known as "reasonable accommodations," for candidates with physical, visual, hearing and learning difficulties in order to remove, as far as possible, the impact of the disability on the candidate's performance in the exams. This facility ensures that no candidate for the state exams is disadvantaged because of a disability.

Despite the criticisms often levelled at the state exams, they have stood the test of time and they provide the Irish economy with one of the best educated workforces in the western world. Both Junior and Leaving Cert exams are invariably acknowledged as an impartial, unbiased and comprehensive test of each candidate's level of achievement. The vast majority of candidates will do very well in the state exams. A large number will achieve results that are considerably above average or, even, outstanding.

Despite all the hype about exam pressure, all you need is a cool head, a positive attitude, optimum use of the remaining weeks, good personal and time management, plenty of nutritious food, rest and an exercise programme to burn off any excess stress. Approach the exams with confidence, do your best during the remaining weeks and at the actual exams. Then forget about them and enjoy the summer. Exams should be kept in perspective. They are just another milestone on the eventful journey through life.

With the oral exams now in session and practical coursework, project work and study reports due to be completed in the next few weeks,

exam candidates have a great opportunity to bank very precious marks. Remaining practical exams will be conducted from Monday, 30th April to Friday, 11th May. The Leaving Cert Vocational Programme (LCVP) written exam is scheduled for Wednesday, 2nd May. In the final term, the written papers now become the major focus of attention as the June exams draw ever closer.

In the next article, I'll explain how to plan your strategy for the final weeks before the June exams.

Riding leading or driving horses on the road

Today, riding on the road may be part of a horse's training programme or just for leisure. For riders, it is an enjoyable change of environment, but there are safety risks. These include, but are not restricted to, traffic speeds, road surfaces and motorists' knowledge of dealing with horses. You can reduce these risks with road safety knowledge and training.

Horses and riders have every right to be on our roads. However, they must follow the Rules of the Road. It is vital that every rider has a clear understanding of the Rules of the Road before taking a horse onto a public road.

If you are riding or leading a horse, you must stay on the left-hand side of the road and obey all Rules of the Road.

When leading a horse, you should walk so that the handler is between the horse and the traffic, so as to prevent the horse from interfering with the traffic.

When riding one horse and leading another horse, you must remain on the lefthand side of the road. You should ensure that the led horse is on the lefthand side of the ridden horse, to ensure the rider is positioned between the horse being led and the traffic. This is in order to control the led horse, in the interest of safety of all road users.

Before riding on the road you should always tell someone where you intend to go and when you will be back.

If you are in charge of a horse on a roadway, you must make sure the horse does not block other traffic or pedestrians.

It is best not to bring a horse on the road at night.



If you do, you should carry a lamp showing a white light to the front and a red light to the back. You should also wear reflective clothing and put suitable reflective equipment on the horse.

If the weather is bad, you should not ride on the road unless it is absolutely necessary. Motorists will already be experiencing difficult driving conditions and meeting an anxious horse may present a dangerous situation.

Advice for motorists and other road users

Most collisions on the road involving horses happen when the horse is struck from behind. Horses and their riders are extremely vulnerable in a collision and can be seriously – sometimes fatally – injured.

You must always be careful when passing horses

and riders on the road. A horse may startle. The rider may be a child or an adult in training. Never pass unless it is safe to do so.

• be alert when approaching riding schools or places where horses are likely to appear;

 take special care when overtaking horses, especially loose horses or horsedrawn vehicles. This is particularly relevant at junctions where motorists are advised to keep a safe distance from horses and riders;

slow down when approaching a horse and rider.
 Be prepared to stop and let them pass;

• obey a signal to slow down or stop from someone in charge of a horse. They may know about a potential hazard which you cannot see or hear.

 pass by slowly, driving wide of the horse and rider;

 don't use your horn or lights in a way that might startle or blind a horse. This could cause the rider to lose control of the animal;

• if you are carrying a roof load or towing a trailer, take special care when passing horses;

• if you drive a heavy goods vehicle, know the dimensions of your load. Be aware that the sound of airbrakes might startle a horse; and

 show courtesy to riders and their horses, and take steps to minimize engine and other noise when passing safely.

Always drive at a speed that allows you to stop:

- safely in a controlled way;
- on the correct side of the road;

 within the distance you can see to be clear; and without risk to you, your passengers or other road users.





Some weeks ago we discussed Compassion, and an essential component of developing Compassion is forgiveness. Forgiveness is not a behaviour as such, more of an internal state of being and feeling. Something has happened to cause us to feel resentful, angry or bitter towards someone else. When we feel wronged, hurt or even betrayed we have a negative feeling towards someone or something. We know from many faiths, psychology and life in general that this baggage of negativity harms us more than anyone else, because we carry it!

The first step of forgiveness is learning to let go, as these negative feelings stand in our way of solving problems or finding a healthy way to change. It really is not simple nor easy to let go that negative feeling, but if we can understand that it releases us more than the other person it would be an excellent start. We are attached to that anxious hurt and negative internal feeling, and by releasing that negative emotion we can think more clearly and thus it allows us to be able to respond to the situation rather than just react blindly.

By forgiving, it is almost like climbing up an emotional ladder or flying above our emotional river, so that we can get some distance or perspective on those feelings and emotion. Once we forgive, we can get perspective of the emotions by feeling without getting overwhelmed, then we can learn emotional signals. By doing this we can calm down and use our logic to respond.

In order to forgive, we do need to understand ourselves better, we need to learn to deal with our raw, almost primitive feelings. Elizabeth Kubler-Ross who has written about and worked with grief for many years said that the root of all emotions is fear. These feelings of fear lead to out-of-balance anxiety and a sense of resentment which can in turn lead to aggression rather than a healthy reaction.

Many people confuse forgiveness with forgetting, or condoning or excusing offences or wrongful behaviour. It does not obligate us to reconcile with the person who harmed us, or release them from legal accountability. Instead it brings the forgiver peace of mind, freeing us from corrosive anger or other negative feelings. In this way it empowers us to recognise the pain we suffered without letting that pain define us, enabling us to heal and move on with our life.





BLACK CATS ARE FOR LIFE – NOT FOR BAD LUCK:

I grew up with cats, and so to me a home isn't really complete unless there is a little furry blob curling up on the top of a press, on top of my laptop or keeping my feet warm in bed in cold weather. I've had ginger mixes, tortoiseshells, black and whites, tabby's and even the occasional calico colour and of course I've had and still have several black cats and each and every one of them regardless of their colour were and are adventurous and entertaining but despite all cats being the same, black cats in almost every Country in the Western World find are the least likely to be adopted from an animal shelter.

In ancient Egypt, the act of killing a cat was punishable by death, and when a cat would die it would be mummified followed by the family entering into a period of mourning. Roman cultures considered the cat to be sacred and brought this animal into Europe yet a vast majority of people consider a black cat crossing their path to be bad luck and will avoid them whenever they see them.

Luckily, in some cultures the perception of the black cat began to change and it went from being seen as bad luck to good luck in countries like Scotland who still regard a strange black cat on your porch as a sign of prosperity to come and in England, fishermen's wives used keep black cats in their homes while their husbands were away in the belief that these animals would prevent danger from occurring to their husbands while they were off at sea. Not only were cats welcome aboard British vessels to hunt mice, but sailors generally thought a black cat in particular would bring good luck and ensure a safe return home. A few of these kitties have been enshrined in maritime history, like Tiddles, who travelled more than 30,000 miles during his time with the Royal Navy. If you're a single lady in Japan, owning a black cat is said to increase your number of suitors; if you're in Germany and one crosses your path from right to left, good things are on the horizon.

The superstitions surrounding black cats date back to the Middle Ages when they were associated with witchcraft and elderly ladies seen feeding black cats were burned at the stake, we are now in the 21st Century and supposed to be educated to some degree so its surely time to stop letting that ancient, falselycirculated and overrated news fool you. The fact is - all cats are the best cats!

THIS MAN WENT TO EXTREME LENGTHS TO HIDE HIS BURIAL PLACE:

In the late second century, Cao Cao emerged as one of the main warlords in China as the Han Dynasty crumbled. He successfully built up the state of Wei in northern China, ruling from 208 AD until his death in 220 AD.

Historical records suggest that Cao Cao went to great lengths before his death to keep his final resting place secret. He made a will that stated his burial site should not be identified, and according to legends, he had 72 coffins created that were transported to 72 different sites on the day of his funeral. The transporters were all killed to prevent each of those locations from being revealed. However Cao Cao's son, Cao Pi, did not want his father's resting place to be hidden and had a great mausoleum constructed to honour his death, though it is believed that the son later ordered the destruction of the monuments on the surface for fear that his father's tomb would be targeted by opponents or robbers.

In 2009 while workers at a nearby kiln were digging up mud to make bricks and local authorities seized a stone tablet carrying the inscription 'King Wu of Wei' from grave robbers who claimed to have stolen it from the tomb, archaeologists discovered the ruins of an enormous mausoleum complex with two constructions, an underground tunnel, and the remains of an adult male in his sixties and two women inside. The initial claim was met by scepticism, however, confirmation of the find has now officially been made public after the Henan Provincial Institute of Cultural Heritage and Archaeology concluded that the remains almost certainly belonged to Cao Cao.

A museum is currently being built at the site that will house more than 250 artifacts, including gold, silver, pottery, paintings, a sword, scabbard, and 59 engraved stone plates already discovered there and is expected to open to the public within the next few years.

Know Your Rights: BACK TO WORK FAMILY DIVIDEND

QUESTION

I am getting Jobseeker's Allowance and have just been offered a job. My husband looks after our two children at home. Can I get any social welfare assistance if I stop signing on and go back to work?

ANSWER

There is a scheme for people with children who stop claiming a jobseeker's payment, or a one-parent family payment, because they are in – or are taking up – work or self-employment. The scheme is called the Back to Work Family Dividend (BTWFD).

The BTWFD is a weekly payment for up to two years after you start work. For the first year in employment, you are paid the equivalent of any Increase for a Qualified Child that you were getting on your jobseeker's payment or oneparent family payment (up to a maximum of four children). You get half of that amount weekly for the second year.

To qualify, you must have at least one qualified child and have been getting one of the following payments: Jobseeker's Allowance or Jobseeker's Benefit (for at least 12 months), One-Parent Family Payment, or Jobseeker's Transitional payment. You and all members of your family (including your adult dependant) must sign off all primary social welfare payments.

The BTWFD can be paid with other social welfare payments including Working Family Payment (formerly called Family Income Supplement), Back to School Clothing and Footwear Allowance, Child Benefit, Domiciliary Care Allowance and Rent Supplement.

You can get BTWFD for up to two years if you stay in employment. If you or your husband claim a primary social welfare payment within two years of you starting work, the BTWFD payment will stop. If you lose your job and claim a social welfare payment, the BTWFD stops. However, it may restart if you get a new job. You can get a maximum of two restarts per claim.

HRI FOR HOMEOWNERS AND LANDLORDS

The Home Renovation Incentive (HRI) is a relief from Income Tax (IT) for homeowners, landlords and local authority tenants. You can claim the HRI Tax Credit for repairs, renovations and improvements to your home or rental property.

To be eligible for HRI:

- you must pay tax under Pay As You Earn (PAYE) or self-assessment
- your Local Property Tax (LPT) payments must be up to date (this does not apply if you are a local authority tenant)
- the work to your property must be carried out by HRI qualifying contractors

The HRI is an online only scheme for homeowners and landlords. If you pay tax through PAYE, use myAccount to claim the HRI Tax Credit. If you pay tax through self-assessment, use Revenue Online Service (ROS) to claim the HRI Tax Credit.

What type of work qualifies under HRI?

To qualify for the tax relief, you must have paid Value-Added Tax (VAT) at 13.5% on the work done to your qualifying property. Examples of qualifying works include:

- painting, decorating and tiling
- · plastering, plumbing and rewiring
- bathroom upgrades
- fitted kitchens
- window replacement
- extensions and attic conversions
- garages, driveways and landscaping
- septic tank repair or replacement
- insulation.

If you buy materials yourself, for example, paint or tiles, you cannot include them in your claim for tax relief.





This also applies to our nation - we need to extend a helping hand to hurting people suffering around the world, and one final area is in relation to Israel which is God's chosen people. We have told you before - Google it for yourself - but any people or nations who curse the nation of Israel are opening themselves up for destruction, judgement and curse. The Lord is very serious and specific He '...vill curse those who curse Israel, butvill bless those who bless her'.
