



### KCC STUDENT SCIENCE BUFFS TAKE TOP PRIZE

Kachel Griffin, Luke O'Sullivan & Liam Waldron have won the overall prize at Scifest 2022 at the awards held in the MTU, Tralee.

They will now represent MTU – Kerry Campus at The SciFest National Final in November with their project entitled "Self-Similarity and Fractal Geometry: Roots of the Pythagorean Theorem" This was a huge achievement as 58 projects had entered and with over 100 students.

The trio of Rachel, Liam and are all 5th year students in the college, won the overall top award and they also won the Life Science's category award.

They will go on to represent Kerry in the National finals in November.

The Runner-Up on the day from Presentation Secondary School Listowel was Cara Leahy with her project "Are renewable plastics as effective as non-renewable plastics?"

SciFest is an all-island STEM initiative which fosters active, collaborative and inquiry-based learning among second-level students. The programme operates throughout the school year and, being locally and regionally based and free-to-enter, is highly inclusive and accessible. Winners from each regional STEM fair go on to compete at a National Final in November. Winners from the national final compete at the Regeneron International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) in America and in the Hong Kong Global Youth Science and Technology Bowl (GYSTB), attend the Long Night of Science in Berlin and participate in the **Broadcom MASTERS International Programme** in America. The SciFest programme is funded primarily by Intel Ireland and Boston Scientific. Speaking at the opening of the event, Professor Maggie Cusack, President MTU, acknowledged the huge amount of effort by all involved evident from the quality of projects submitted and thanked the teachers for mentoring the projects.



Mount Juliet last year hosted the island of Ireland's national open for the first time since 1995 and for just the fourth time in the event's history, with Australia's Lucas Herbert triumphing in front of sell-out crowds at the County Kilkenny venue.

After that hugely successful hosting, the tournament returns to Mount Juliet this summer, with Sunday tickets already completely soldout after unprecedented demand. Harrington will join his fellow countrymen Séamus Power and Shane Lowry in the field, with many more names to be announced in the coming weeks.

The Festival in a Van will also support shared Ukrainian and Irish Music Sessions in Killarney and Tralee, programmed, and produced in partnership with Music Generation Kerry on May 15.

The Local Live Performance Programming Scheme 3 has helped to support performances by local Kerry musicians, artists, and performers. It has also welcomed back audiences and offered relief through performance and entertainment.

Covid Care Concerts have also returned to the County due to support received through the Local Live Performance Programming Scheme 3. Covid Care Concerts are outdoor concerts organised by the Mobile Music Machine and will perform in 13 nursing homes around Listowel, Tralee and Killarney over 5days beginning Sunday May 15.

Not all festivals welcome thousands. Not all concerts have pop stars. But music and performance always provide the audience with a unique experience. There is the possibility to be transformed or transported. These special series of performances hope to do just that.

On Friday 13 May in Gneeveugilla, Turreencahill Community Centre will welcome Bryan O'Leary in Concert. The concert will feature musicians Bryan O'



The highest hour that can be bestowed by Killarney Municipal District was first mooted a few months back by Cathaoirleach of Killarney Municipal District, Marie Moloney. The Civic Reception will go ahead at a time when Jessie is home to visit family. "Jessie is a w fabulous ambassador for Killarney, her list of achievements is immense and it is important that she is honoured in her home town of Killarney", Cllr. Moloney said.

"As soon as we can organise a date when we know Jessie will be home, we will organise the Civic Reception", the Cathaoirleach said.

A former member of Killarney Musical Society, Jessie, the daughter of Tim Buckley and Marina Cassidy began her career in 2008 as a contestant on the BBCTV talent show I'd Do Anything, in which she placed second. In the same year, she appeared

in the West End revival of Stephen Sondheim's A Little Night Music. She then studied at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art, from which she graduated in 2013. Her early onscreen appearances include portrayals in

Her other roles include Rose-Lynn Harlan in Wild Rose (2018), for which she received a nomination for the BAFTA Award for Best Actress in a Leading Role, Lyudmilla Ignatenko in the HBO miniseries Chernobyl (2019), the Young Woman in I'm Thinking of Ending Things (2020), Oraetta Mayflower in season four of Fargo (2020) and young Leda in The Lost Daughter (2021). Her performance in The Lost Daughter gained her a nomination for the Academy Award for Best Supporting Actress. In 2019, she was recognised by Forbes in its annual 30 Under 30 list. # It's the talk of the town.....



Anne Lucey looks at the positive news happening in the town of Killarney

#### **PARKING VIEWS**

A sign is to be placed at the Mangerton viewing point in the national park prohibiting overnight camping and long stays by mobile homes, I am told. The move by the NPWS comes as it is too obvious mobile home owners are sharing "the good news" about undisturbed, free and unofficial "facilities" at the little known but spectacular stop .

Four German registered camper vans and tents took over the whole area for two evenings last week at the site owned by the national park. They were followed by numbers of French registered campers. And this week there are overnights from Wexford vehicles along with UK homes on commonage nearer the foot of the mountain. Not only is the public viewing point being held back from its original purpose — to provide a stop and view over the lakes for everyone, but fires are being lit nightly. Not infrequently the fires are inside in the Scots Pine wood itself.

Just months ago a van went on fire at the entrance to the forest after cooking gas exploded and the fire service were called out.

And we have not raised the question of the "new outdoor toilet area!".

So the new sign cannot come soon enough. Meanwhile, according to the council, talks between the NPWS and the County Council to provide a car park at the Blue Pool are making progress. But is a car park necessary or even desirable? Yet more tarmac taking over from grass?

"Kerry County Council have been liaising with the NPWS on this proposal and there is an agreement in principle for the development of a proposed parking area," the council told Cllr John O'Donoghue, whose uncle Michael Gleeson had also raised the suggestion.

The new car park would remain within the NPWS but it would be developed and maintained by the Local Authority, the council said. In other words some of the fine pastureland where the deer and cattle graze would be tarred over for cars.

Could I point out The Blue Pool area is but a step from the existing car park at the Abbey, which is rarely crowded. It is also alongside a fine hotel with a large car park where people



can stop for a coffee and spend a penny . Perhaps this is where a council subvention might be offered?

The more car parks, the more cars - and camper vans - is my view.

Perhaps what we really need to look at is how to grow the existing private bus shuttle services to and from Killarney.

## MORE FUNDING FOR THE NATIONAL PARK?



There is some expectation that under the new New Strategic Action Plan for the National Parks and Wildlife Service Plan announced by Ministers O'Brien and Noonan, some of the additional €55 million invested in renewing the NPWS and key staff will end up in Killarney. The park has been starved of funding and staff.

But there is perhaps no ill wind, and a turning point seems to have been reached at the big fire of last year.

The ministers – Noonan and O'Brien were visibly shaken to be fair to them – after visiting Killarney in April 21 and seeing the destruction.

Green party TD Malcolm Noonan, who has spent summers working in the rhododendron camps in Killarney, was particularly struck, I recall.

The park was under threat for years it was pointed out to both ministers at the press conference where increases were announced. Figures I obtained two years before the fire revealed how there were seven rangers for the 10,300 hectare Killarney National Park, and the whole region outside it stretching to the Reeks and the Cork border, while there were eleven for the 700 hectare Phoenix Park in Dublin which was run by the OPW!

To be fair there are now six rangers in Killarney and extra general operatives and the park is looking better. But a lot done, more to do.

The local green representative Diarmaid Griffin too is acknowledging how not just funding but a revamping of the department could be a bonus for Killarney.

This could be a major turning point for conservation in Kerry, said Diarmaid.

## THE "ORGANS" OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT GRIND SLOWLY!

Away from the tranquillity of Killarney National Park, busking is raising its head – again.

It is a full 11 years and some months since busking bylaws were sought at the January 2011 meeting of Killarney Town Council. On that occasion, "bad music", played over and over again, was the issue.

Office workers and businesses in the town centre are sick of poor playing and monotonous tunes played over and over for up to six hours on screeching instruments, the report of the meeting in the Irish Times said.

Killarney town clerk Michael O'Leary said some businesses, all ratepayers, were finding it difficult "to transact business due to the sounds created by the buskers".

He said there were several complaints to the town hall and the council was being urged to bring in bylaws.

Then Killarney town councillor John O'Donoghue (FF) told how a man with a tin whistle was playing the same tune at the same corner every day, and office workers were being driven to the edge of sanity.

Roll on 2022 and there is still a problem. The Mayor of Killarney has again put it on the agenda .

"Amplified" busking is going on late into the night and the bylaws have to be brought in, Clir Marie Moloney said.

"While most people, locals and visitors alike enjoy a bit of busking, it is the amplification and volume at which it is being played that needs to be dealt with. It is not acceptable that certain individuals come into Killarney town and blast music late into the night. Singing and music can be equally enjoyed by people on the streets without the need for amplification," she said.

How slowly the wheels of local government move! Last week we had the pedestrian crossing on Mission Road which has been raised since at least 2017; This week we have more than a decade waited for the vexing loud and bad music issue. Both issues are of huge importance and impact directly on the day to day life of residents and of visitors, it need hardly be said.

For a town that once hosted a world renowned Bach festival, and that still has some of the finest piano teachers in Ireland not to mention singers and musicals, could we not have a music officer to rule on quality and sound quantity of street music? A lollipop person at the Monsignor Flaherty statue on the Mission Road junction might also help get us across that road.

# THE FRIARY READY TO WELCOME THE

### **RETURN OF THE SWIFT**

With their return to Ireland imminent, the Franciscan Friary in Killarney installed sixteen nest boxes in readiness for the imminent return of swifts to Co. Kerry.

Swifts (Apus apus) or Gabhlán gaoithe are a migratory species, which have recently been declared "of conservation concern" and are now on "the red list" of species which are endangered both here in Ireland & in the UK.

"Swifts are about the same size as a Swallow, but are a dark colour all over. They spend virtually all of its life in the air and are never seen resting on wires, like swallows and house martins, who they might sometimes get confused with. They have tiny feet which do not allow them to move around easily on the ground, but do help them to cling to walls and cliffs. They are one of the fastest birds, in flight in Ireland", Chris Barron from the Killarney National Park Education Centre told Killarney Outlook.

Swifts pair for life and they return to the same site each year to lay and incubate their eggs. They like to nest in houses and churches, squeezing through tiny gaps to nest inside roofs. But as more old buildings are knocked down or are renovated and the gaps in soffits and elsewhere that the swifts used are closed up, their natural nesting sites are fast disappearing and the provision of artificial nest boxes as an alternative, becoming more and more important.

Swifts eat only insects, which they catch and eat while they fly. The adult birds will catch insect prey and bring it back to the nest for the young. It is thought that with the numbers of insects declining so rapidly, that this is also

contributing to the decline of the birds through less food being available to them and their chicks.

"In 2019, thirteen active nests had been counted on the eastern side of the church, but it was discovered last year that these had been blocked up when renovations took place in 2020. When swifts are this week.

building that they have previously nested in, they are known to return for at least six years, trying to gain access. So, every year that they return and cannot get in, is another year that they are not able to breed", Chris added.

The nest boxes that were put up on the friary were produced locally by Stephan de Beer in his small factory, Genisis Nest Boxes in Currow. Leane's Tool Hire Killarney, provided the machine and operator to reach the height that was needed to secure the boxes. Yvonne Quill and Kathleen Foley of Killarney Looking Good (Killarney Tidy Towns) provided the funding for the whole of project.


Bryan has been training since the middle of January for the challenge and has ran over 1400km in training to be able to complete the challenge.







# PHYSICAL FITNESS IS AS IMPORTANT AS MENTAL ALERTNESS

# AT EXAM TIME



/ith the state exams beginning in four Weeks, it's important to keep an eye on your physical fitness. Study and revision are demanding. The pressure, which some candidates feel around exam time, is a good reason to maintain a level of physical fitness. In the context of an exam, physical fitness is every bit as important as mental alertness. A regular exercise programme is a great way to burn off tension. It relieves stress and is good for the self-confidence. Exercise is a welcome break from the demands of regular study. Set aside an hour two or three times a week to exercise in order to keep in good physical shape. The amount of active exercise you take depends on yourself. Strenuous, competitive exercise is not advisable before and during the exam period as it causes fatigue. An aerobic exercise programme results in a feeling of well-being, it helps you to sleep soundly, to build up stamina and endurance and leads to improved concentration.

Counteract any nervousness by using a few simple relaxation techniques. Stress and anxiety are related to muscular tension. So, by using a relaxation technique to reduce tension in the muscles you will also reduce stress and anxiety. An effective one is to close your eyes and inhale a few comfortable deep breaths. Hold each breath for a few seconds. Then breathe out, slowly and quietly. As you breathe out say 'relax' to yourself and you will feel the tension flowing out of your body. Open your eyes and then carry on with your study. This simple but effective physical relaxation technique can be done in about two minutes and can also be used for periodic breaks during the exam itself

A well-balanced nutritious diet is important around exam time when you need high reserves of energy. Ensure that your mind is clear and alert with a diet that is high on

protein, carbohydrates, unsaturated fats, vitamins, minerals and energy. Take three substantial - but not too heavy - meals each day. Enjoy a high-fibre breakfast to keep the digestive system functioning normally. Eat a healthy dinner, which contains constituents such as vegetables, potatoes, rice, pasta, salads, chicken, fish or lean meat. Take a regular evening meal of brown bread, eggs, cheese and related high protein-based foods. Rather than having three very heavy meals you might prefer to supplement your main meals with a few nutritious snacks made up of yoghurt, fruit, cheese and the like. Don't over indulge in junk food. Drink at least two glasses of milk daily as well as plenty of cool fresh water to avoid dehydration and to keep the fluid levels high. Be moderate in your use of artificial stimulants such as tea and coffee, which contain caffeine. Keep a clear head by abstaining from alcohol before and during the exam period.

Aim to get eight or nine hours sleep each night. A tired mind, however brilliant, cannot perform at its best. So, the importance of an adequate amount of sleep cannot be over emphasised. Long hours of study into the night can be counter- productive and energy sapping. Rather than burning the midnight oil go to bed at a reasonable hour to ensure that you get sufficient rest.

Be particular about your personal hygiene, especially in warm weather. If you feel fresh and comfortable your mind will focus better on the task in hand. Hang up your uniform after school and change into casual clothes before you settle down to evening study. As the tension of the day often manifests itself in the feet, change from your school footwear to lighter more comfortable footwear. Always take the time to enjoy a regular shower or bath. A fresh effervescent feeling will help you to meet the demands of study and exams.

The President of Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce has welcomed the new two-year strategic action plan for the restructuring of the National Parks and Wildlife Service which, he said, contains a number of positive initiatives and innovative proposals that will be of enormous benefit to Killarney National Park.

Niall Kelleher said the plan, which follows detailed independent reviews, features a timeline to implement a number of recommendations to make the NPWS a more resilient and effective executive agency capable of meeting the many challenges of the 21st century.

"The NPWS has a crucial role to play in Killarney with a very complex range of responsibilities, including the implementing of policies, conservation, enforcement, licensing, biodiversity, scientific advice and planning.

"The protection, conservation and, following the recent wildfires, restoration of the park is imperative and for the challenges to be properly met, the NPWS needs to be adequately structured, staffed and equipped," Mr Kelleher said.He noted that, as the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage, Darragh O'Brien, and Minister of State for Heritage and Electoral Reform, Malcolm Noonan, have stressed, the comprehensive internal redesign of the NPWS will result in a much stronger focus on customer service, outcomes and delivery for the public as well as more structured engagement with NPWS stakeholders.

Mr Kelleher said the fact that there will be a substantial €55 million investment in the implementation of the new plan indicates the absolute importance the government is affording to the development and protection of the national parks.

"I particularly welcome the fact that 60 new full-time jobs will be created immediately in the NPWS with the recruitment of conservation rangers

and general operatives. It is equally encouraging that there is a longerterm plan to double the 400 staff currently employed by the service to meet future Irish and European biodiversity targets," he said.

The government is determined to have more NPWS staff available to work closely with communities, farmers and other stakeholders and to be in a position to cater for rapidly expanding visitor numbers.

The Chamber President acknowledged that there has been a significant investment in the provision of additional car parking and enhancement of established trails and walkways in Killarney National Park in recent years. He said specific funding must also be provided for the management of the deer population and the control of invasive species, such as rhododendron, and to help improve biodiversity in the large area of the 26,000-acre park damaged by the devastating wildfires.

Mr Kelleher said the provision of education and outreach programmes to heighten awareness around biodiversity and to promote sustainable tourism was also a key objective that must be met.

# National Parks and Wildlife Service announce Strategic Action Plan

ature has never been higher on the public political agenda, evidenced by the fact that an independent review of the NPWS, commissioned by Minister of State for Heritage, Malcolm Noonan formed part of the 2020 Programme for Government, and more than 3,000 individual stakeholders fed into it during March-May 2021. In February that review was completed by **Ecologist Jane Stout and Former** 

Environmental Protection Agency director Micheal O' Cinneide. That was followed by a Strategic Action Plan that sees a major overhaul of the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS). The Action Plan was revealed last week.

While the authors recognise serious problems derived from chronic underfunding, they highlighted a range of structural issues undermining the ability of the NPWS to achieve its aims even if resources were increased. 'The Review has concluded that in its current form, the NPWS is not aligned effectively to deliver on its current demands and future mandate. This means that the NPWS cannot meet current obligations, let alone plan for and respond to future challenges and legislation, including the requirements of the Climate Action Bill and the EU Biodiversity Strategy to 2030.' The importance of our natural heritage is



becoming more evident with each passing day as we see that its protection translates to our physical and mental wellbeing. The authors of the report recognise that this will be a worthwhile investment: 'There needs to be urgent reprioritisation in government and substantial investment in the service that co-ordinates the restoration and conservation of nature. Like investment health and education, investment in nature has a long-

term public benefit.'

The healing and refiguring begin immediately with the first items on the action list to be completed by the end of June and the last items to be actioned by the end of March 2024

This can only mean benefits for Kerry with Killarney National Park and the 14 Nature Reserves across the county seeing more funding and better attention. Budget increases for the NPWS have increased since the formation of the government in 2020 but more is needed as this only restored funding to its 2008 level. This could be a major turning point for conservation in Kerry and throughout the country, as more funding is promised and the government body is to be restructured as an executive agency. The Plan brings hope for a real change in how we interact, appreciate, and protect our natural heritage as a country.

# Busking by-laws needs to fast-tracked

athaoirleach Killarney Municipal District Cllr Marie Moloney has announced that Kerry County Council are presently preparing by-laws with regard to busking but need to progress them and introduce them without further delay. "While most people, locals and visitors alike enjoy a bit of busking, it is the amplification and volume of it which it is being played that needs to be dealt with. It is not acceptable that certain individuals to come into Killarney town and blast music late into the night. Singing and music can be equally enjoyed by people on the streets without the need for amplification", the Cllr. said.

Killarney has a lot of residents living on the streets and just off the streets, some with very you children, who are constantly being disturbed by high-volumed busking. Music coming from public houses is indoors and does not carry the same as amplified music from the street.

In the interest of fairness to the residents of Killarney town centre, it is imperative that these by-laws be introduced as soon as possible as without them Gardai have little power to act on complaints.

The monument is situated outside St. Columbanus' Home (off the St. Margaret's road entrance.) Untold numbers in the Killarney area perished during An Gorta Mór (The Great Famine) 1845 -1850. Hundreds passed through the doors of the Killarney Union Workhouse which is now St. Columbanus' Home. Within the town boundary are several burial sites where the poor souls lost during this time were laid to rest in unmarked graves.

The monument will be unveiled by Councillor Niall Kelliher Deputy Mayor of the Killarney Municipal District.

# Simply the Best Air Quality found at Castleisland Community College!

Castleisland Community College was invited to take part in the International Globe Air Quality Campaign to ascertain the air quality on school grounds. Levels of nitrogen oxide—which come from cars, buses, lorries etc-were assessed. The air quality is graded according to figures with 0-10= low, 10-20= low to medium, 20-30= medium to high and 40+ = high. The levels found on the school grounds were amongst the lowest recorded in the country 5.17, 4.16 and 5.17. These levels were in stark contrast to urban readings with high readings of over 40 found in Dublin. Students who suffer with asthma are certainly at risk when air pollution levels are so high.

Transition year students who form the Green

School Committee in the school, tested the air quality in three different locations around the school under the guidance of Doreen Killington (Green School Co-Ordinator). One test tube was located near the road, another at the bus turning point and one at the back of the school away from traffic. They were left for three weeks and afterwards the test tubes were sent back to a laboratory where the Globe county coordinator tested and rated the air quality of the three locations around the school.

The Globe Air Quality Campaign is a science project to assess traffic-related air pollution at schools. This is an educational project designed to raise awareness about air pollution and showcase the potential of citizen science to gather unique datasets and insights into our environment.

This project is coordinated by the GLOBE Team (Ireland), as part of The Environmental Education Unit (EEU) of An Taisce. The school is one of 132 schools in Ireland taking part in the project. This is an international project that has schools across Europe and the world taking part in it.

Our results have certainly highlighted the beautiful pure air that we breath -Aer Úr Ciarraí!



### MISTAKES TO AVOID IN THE GYM

#### THIS WEEK IS MIGRAINE **AWARENESS WEEK**

Retinal migraine (ocular migraine) is an eye condition that causes brief attacks of blindness or visual problems like flashing lights in one

These episodes can be frightening, but in most cases they're harmless and short-lived, and eyesight goes back to normal afterwards.

Some people migraine every get few months, although the frequency can vary.

Retinal migraine is a separate condition and should not be with headacheconfused type migraine or migraine with aura, which usually affects the vision of both eves.

The symptoms of retinal migraine may include:

- partial or total loss of vision in one eye – this usually lasts 10 to 20 minutes before vision gradually
- headache this may happen before, during or after the vision attack

It's unusual for an episode of vision loss to last longer than an hour. The same eye is affected every time in almost all cases.

Vision may slowly become blurred or dimmed, or there may be flashes of light. Some people see a mosaic-like pattern of blank spots (scotomas), which enlarge to cause total loss of

Retinal migraine is caused by the blood vessels to the eye suddenly narrowing (constricting), reducing the blood flow to the eye.

It may be triggered by:

- stress
- smoking
- high blood pressure
- oral contraceptive pill
- exercise
- bending over
- high altitude
- dehydration
- · low blood sugar

excessive heat

Retinal migraine tends to be more common in:

- women
- people aged under 40
- people with a personal or family history of migraine or other headaches

Treatment for retinal migraine usually just involves taking pain relief for any headaches and reducing exposure to anything that might be triggering the retinal migraine.

If you experience any sudden changes in you vision it is important to have a sight test to rule out more serious causes.

#### SECTION A - GLENAHOO TO ANNASCAUL (13KM)

This historic valley route, Macha na Bó Trail, passes over the fabled Wolf Step river crossing. The harsh ascent on the Glenahoo side is rewarded with stunning views and a rapid descent to Annascaul Lake and onwards to Annascaul Village. Take time here to avail of the refreshments before continuing on the next section from Annascaul to Camp.

#### SECTION B - ANNASCAUL TO CAMP (17 KM)

#### KERRY PASS TOUGH **CORK TEST**

Munster Semi-Final: Kerry 0-23 Cork 0-11

It finished along expected lines, with Kerry pulling away to win comfortably, but that wasn't how most of this game played out. For one thing, the expected furore over ticket shortages turned out to be self-important fantasy; the hard truth is that there wasn't as much interest in this contest as pre-supposed. Part of that was the expectation that Cork would fold fairly easily; I assume that nobody reads history books anymore. Cork, defying all the odds, really put it up to Kerry for a long time - I'm delighted, a tough test was good for us and great for them. We got asked hard questions - they'll only get harder now. The simple fact is that Cork played a very defensive game (quite rightly - I'd have done the exact same, and ignored all the armchair aesthetes while doing it) and the deployment of Powter as a sweeper worked out well. This was a good Cork team who could leave the pitch with their

It wasn't all about Cork's defiance, though. The truth is that Kerry were a bit laboured here. Cork set out their stall early. Ian Maguire, clearly and creditably playing past injury, sent a long ball into Cathail O'Mahony. He was fouled - I'd have real concerns about Kerry's tackling technique after this game, it simply wasn't good enough - and Steven Sherlock opened the scoring. David Clifford did well to pick up a loose ball and convert after a quick exchange of passes. A somewhat clumsy foul by Jason Foley on Brian Hurley saw Sherlock double his and Cork's tally. Seán O'Shea drew a foul himself with some good footwork, and David converted. His brother cut in neatly and Paudie had the skill and awareness to clip it over. Kerry won the kick-out - that was a regular feature - and Stephen O'Brien sliced through easily for a fine point. Good work by Diarmuid O'Connor saw Seán O'Shea cut in and fist over. 0-5 to 0-2 and Kerry taking control.

Once again Munster's Champions' Cup hopes

come to an end at the hands of Toulouse, and this one was much more of a heartbreaker than last year. We were fairly well beaten back then; this time out we could well have snatched it. Munster actually led by 10 points halfway through the second half, with veterans Peter O'Mahony and Keith Earls (I've been critical of both recently - oops!) but Toulouse have good steel about them and deserved to draw level. Ben Healy had a late and difficult chance to win it with a late penalty, but it just curled to the left. Back in the days when Munster performed miracles on a regular basis, those were going over, often enough seemingly by divine intervention. Ah well, even God was a Munster supporter back then.

In the end it came down to the lottery of a penalty shootout, and it went Toulouse's way. As the Toulouse supporters themselves might say, "c'est la vie".

A lot of Munster eyes will be on the designated messiah – in fairness, there's no sarcasm there – Ronan O'Gara has definitely established himself as one of the best up-and-coming coaches in Europe. He previously coached Racing 92, before moving to New Zealand for a few years (I believe it's a necessary step – their club game is suffering from a lack of money these days, but it's the spiritual home of rugby and has an intensity lacking elsewhere) and now coaching with last year's finalists La Rochelle.

In the last quarter-final, Racing 92 knocked out Sale 41-22 to end English participation in what I still think of as the Heineken Cup (or Rugby-Champions-Cup-thingy). My own belief is that Ireland organised fast and well, and stole a bit of a march on other countries when rugby entered the professional era (England were still paying spendthrift money on star players without building foundations – Munster and to a lesser extent Leinster at the time were laying foundations) and have regressed to the mean. But England? I really don't see why England

aren't dominating all but the big spenders in France when it comes to the Heineken Cup.

One of the diversionary sub-plots that will fascinate about that one is O'Gara – not only is he now trying to out-fox his old team, but he got a sideline ban against them earlier this year.

#### **BOXING**

Good job that I'm not a betting man. I would have put the house on Canelo Alvarez to beat Dmitry Bivol with plenty to spare. Shows what I know - the Russian didn't look as stylish as Canelo (I considered him the pound for pound best in the world) but handed Canelo just his second defeat in 61 fights. The last one came early in his career to Floyd Mayweather in 2013 - Canelo was a little bit callow back then, this one will hurt a lot more. Essentially, Bivol stayed reasonably cautious against Canelo, who packs a knock-out punch in both hands but never got a chance to unleash either. Bivol stuck to move and jab, and it worked. The 31 year old was a bit of an unknown quantity to me, but he simply outworked Canelo and kept neatly picking off those deadly jabs. There will surely be a rematch (like Taylor v Serrano, this was simply that good a fight) but other boxers will have paid attention to Bivol's handicraft. I'm thinking there of Gennady Golovkin, of course. Canelo v Golovkin again is a fight I'd love to see.

It's no secret that boxing worldwide has some serious problems - put it this way, you can read a lot about boxing in newspapers without turning to the sports pages. Being excluded from the Olympics sends out a big message. The travails of Irish amateur boxing predates all that, with Bernard Dunne the latest to step down as High Performance Director. He hasn't made any secret of his disillusionment with the IABA. It seems that the shadow of Billy Walsh, our most successful coach (and Ireland has a great pedigree in amateur boxing) who now successfully plies his trade in the States with their womens' team, having himself departed the Irish set-up in acrimonious circumstances. A pity, our great boxing tradition, so well nurtured down the years by the likes of John 'Killer' O'Callaghan in Killarney, deserves better.

#### VANILLA MARBLE LOAF

#### Ingredients

225g butter, softened 225g gem caster sugar

4 eggs

225g self-raising flour

- 3 tbsp milk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 tbsp cocoa powder

#### Method

- 1. Put the butter and sugar in large bowl and mix
- 2. Add in the 4 eggs & vanilla extract and mix
- 3. Sift in the flour and mix then add in the milk and mix together
- 4. Divide the mixture into two bowls
- 5. Sift in 2 tbsp of cocoa powder into one of the bowl and mix together
- 6. Line a loaf tin with parchment paper
- 7. Take 2 spoons and use them to dollop the chocolate and vanilla cake mixes into the tin alternately when the mixture is all used up tap the bottom on your work surface to ensure that there aren't any air bubbles
- 8. Take a skewer or knife and swirl it around the mixture in the tin a few times to create a marbled effect.
- 9. Bake the cake for 45-55 mins @180 fan until a skewer or knife inserted into the centre comes out clean

### ORNAMENTAL GRASSES

Ornamental Grasses can grow in a wide range of conditions. There are grasses to suit damp or dry soils, shady and sunny positions.

Grasses can add great colour to any shrub bed and they also look great in containers. Ornamental grasses don't need much feeding as this only encourages a lot of growth in the foliage at the expense of flowers. There is a large selection of grasses to choose from. There are grasses like the Pampas, which is tall to the Care Algod which is small. If you are planting small grasses in the garden try and plant them in groups of three rather than on their own. 



He gets no glory from sickness or disease. "And as Moses lifted up the bronze snake on a pole in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him will have eternal life. For this is how God loved the world: He gave His One and Only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life. God sent his Son into the world not to judge the world, but to save the world through Him" (John 3:14-17 NLT). Jesus was referencing the Scripture in the Book of Numbers where God's people rebelled by speaking against God and against Moses (Numbers 21:5-9). What happened then was snakes attacked the camp and bit the people and killed many of them. When the remaining ones repented of their sin, God in His mercy instructed Moses make a bronze serpent, put it up on a pole and if anyone was bitten by a snake they would be healed by simply looking at it. This was God demonstrating His future plan of Salvation where His Messiah (or Saviour) would die upon a cross for all mankind's sin and whoever studies the work of the cross will be healed. Jesus went on to say that He came from God because of God's deep love for the inhabitants of the earth so that we would not have to perish — but, just by believing that Jesus is the Son of God, that He died on the cross to take our sins we can be 'saved'. The word saved here translates as follows - "safe"; to save, i.e. deliver or protect, heal, preserve, do well, be (make) whole. At the cross the Son of God allowed His body to be broken with sin, sickness, pain, sorrow and grief - He perished - so that we who would follow Him and believe in Him don't have to perish but can be healed (Isaiah 53:3-6). The word 'perish' brings to mind foods stored in the cupboard. There are some foods that will keep for years — non perishables, but there are others like meat or fruit that are perishable and corruptible. Our bodies are perishable, but Jesus paid the price for sin so that we could be made whole instead. Therefore when sickness attacks we don't have to receive it. Isn't that wonderful? Jesus did die on the Cross - but He is no longer there! God raised Him from the dead to finish the work of Salvation - the promise of eternal life when we do leave this world. God does not want anyone to die prematurely. He told Noah 'the years of man shall be 120 years.' (Genesis 6:3). Moses lived until he was 120 years old 'yet his eyes were not dim and his frame was strong' (Deuteronomy 34:7). How sad we don't see many like this nowadays. "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge" (Hosea 4:6). With all the education and advancements, few people know and understand God's Word. In fact they have been tricked into avoiding it by the enemy. Why is that? Because what the devil fears most is believers who will seek God for themselves, and take Him at His Word, obey Him, and receive all that Jesus paid for us to enjoy.

The Legion of Mary are celebrating their 100th Birthday all this year. The Legion was founded by Frank Duff, a native son, born in Dublin in 1921.




