

KILLARNEY TO CELEBRATE 4TH JULY

This 4th of July, Main Street Killarney will be transformed into a veritable Main Street USA as Killarney hosts its first-ever 4th of July celebrations. This day long celebration of America's Independence Day is being organised by a subcommittee of Killarney Chamber of Tourism & Commerce headed up by Kate O'Leary of the Laurels Pub & Restaurant, Killarney, in association with Killarney Town Council and main sponsors O'Donoghue Ring Hotel Group, Heineken Ireland, and Gallivan Murphy Hooper Dolan Insurances Ltd, Killarney.


MAN WINS HALF A **MILLION EURO**

Brian Hand from Blackwater in Killarney a student at Cork Institute of Technology (CIT) has been named runner-up in the Engineers Ireland Level 8 Innovative Student Engineer of the Year Awards 2014 sponsored by Siemens. The mechanical engineering student was shortlisted for the entry titled 'Analysis into

wind induced loading on a ship-to-shore

(STS) crane and an investigation into design

optimisation'. The project was undertaken following Brian's work placement with Liebherr in Killarney in response to the complex physical geometry of modern STS cranes combined with the dynamic and unpredictable nature of wind flow which poses a major challenge to the designer and analyst wishing to diverge from the standard based approach to quantify wind loading on these structures.



KERRY ADVENTURER COMPLETES THE FIRST PARAMOTORING FLIGHT FROM MIZEN TO MALIN



MIKE O'SHEA ADVENTURER.

Kerry adventurer and polar explorer, Mike O'Shea, has become the first person to fly from Mizen Head to Malin Head by a paramotor, navigating his journey from South to North, flying over County Kerry and monitoring his health through hazardous conditions using

mobile technology.

Travelling at heights of up to 10,000 feet with temperatures reaching below zero, the adventurer completed the 590km journey over three days³.

His flight was supported by Vodafone Ireland to mark the launch of the Vodafone Firsts programme here, a global initiative that encourages people to do something remarkable for the first time – with mobile technology at the core of their adventure. The adventurer's route took him over Kerry and past some of Ireland's iconic landmarks including picturesque Inch Beach. The changing weather conditions and strong gusty winds that threatened to scupper the flight were monitored closely by his support team using mobile phones and tablets.

GPS tracking enabled ground-to-air tracking of O'Shea during the flight when clouds

obscured visibility, with the team able to check in regularly with him and the helicopter that shadowed the entire flight via high definition mobile calls which picked up even the faintest transmissions.

O'Shea also wore a smart watch which enabled the team to monitor vital signs including the strength of his heartbeat at all times.

Mike O'Shea said: "I'm always on the lookout for new challenges and the chance to take on a new adventure. Becoming the first person to paramotor from Mizen to Malin has been a personal ambition since I first took up this sport and I've been able to achieve it thanks to Vodafone's support and technological expertise.

A total of 130km minimum cycled during the week - so well done!! Bearing in mind the motto "the more mileage I clock up before the Ring of Kerry, the easier it will be for me on the day!" So this week we are aiming for another increase, to 150km.... now did you ever think you would be cycling that distance in a week?! It's a credit to you...keep it up!!

This week's focus will be on national bike week & bike maintenance.

National Bike Week is an all Ireland event, the aim of which is to celebrate cycling and get more people cycling, through organized events. Kerry Recreation & Sports Partnership, through the support of Kerry County Council, is tasked with coordinating and publicizing such bike related events. This year we have reached out to community, schools and sporting groups which has resulted in a variety of cycling events being held throughout the county during bike week, which takes place June 14th - June 22nd.

And former international cyclist Paul Griffin will share his basic and very practical knowledge with respect to food & fluid intake for the Ring. In addition he will share his home made bike fit formula along with providing instrumental advice! So if you have 90mins to spare I would highly recommend attendance.

Also our county libraries are getting involved in bike week, with dedication sections for "Books on Bikes and Bikers... so why not browse your local library and discover the world of cycling.

As an aside Kerry Recreation & Sports Partnership has been granted permission to host the Pedal In the Park, on the eve of the Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle. This event, in its 4th year, is a family 5k & 10k cycle in Killarney National Park, taking place Friday July 4th - More on that later.

bowling, visit an indoor playground and enjoy the roller coasters at Oakwood Theme Park. The pupils had a great time and the school would like to thank the parents who helped out."









Know Your Rights:

NOISY NEIGHBOURS

JUNE 2014

OUESTION

What I moved into a new house with my two small children six months ago. A nearby workshop makes a lot of noise and disturbs our family. What can I do about this problem?

ANSWER

In situations like this you should initially approach the business causing the noise and explain that it is a nuisance and try to come to a mutually acceptable solution. If this does not work you can contact your local authority. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Act 1992 gives power to local authorities in relation to noise nuisance. This means that your local authority may serve a notice on the person in charge of the noisy business, for example, a pub, disco, garage or workshop. This notice requires the person in charge to take whatever measures are set out in the notice to prevent or limit noise. The local authority may prosecute for failure to comply with the notice.

Another option, under the same legislation, is to take a private action through the District Court if the noise is "so loud, so continuous, so repeated, of such duration or pitch or occurring at such times" that it gives you reasonable cause for annoyance. You can get a standard form for making the complaint from your local District Court clerk and you must pay a small fee.

Before making the complaint you must inform the person or business that you will be taking them to court using a special form - Environmental Protection Agency Act 1992 - noise form of notice which can be downloaded from courts.ie. It is important that you use this form of notice only and that you complete it fully and accurately.

The District Court will call both parties together and listen to both sides. If the court finds in your favour, it can order the person or body to limit the noise, reduce the level of noise or stop the noise completely. Any orders made by the court must be complied with. A person making noise in the course of trade or business may have a defence if it can be shown that all reasonable care was taken to prevent the noise or that the noise is in accordance with a licence issued under the EPA Act.

OUTLOOK ON THE STATE EXAMINATION

Exams enter the final week

As the state exams approach the end of their second week, the vast majority of candidates have reached or are close to reaching the end of the road. The optional subjects now take centre stage. As the number of candidates taking these subjects is considerably less than the number taking the compulsory subjects some exam



centres will close early. Candidates from these centres will be relocated to a different centre for the remainder of the exam. While this move is only a minor inconvenience, it can distract candidates, whose friends may be finished the entire exam. The number of candidates in the school environment will continue to decrease also, so it's important for those candidates who still have a job of work to do, not to feel left behind or become impatient to get over the finish line.

Normally in the third and final week, candidates will have about two subjects from a standard seven left to do. There will be an opportunity, therefore, to utilise the remaining non-exam days to do some revision. It's not unknown, on the other hand for students to take an eight or even a ninth subject to complete a particular vocational grouping such as Physics, Design & Communication Graphics and Applied Mathematics. So there is still a lot to play for. There are grades and points available to be earned.

Candidates are well settled into the logistics of the state exam as it heads into the final week. The anxiety of the first week has now been replaced by a sense of relief that the end is in sight. Candidates have reacted positively to the demands made on them by the different subject papers. Candidates who have papers in week three must be careful to guard against exam fatigue. The buzz of the early days is gone. The large attendance at compulsory subject papers has given way to a lot less foot fall around the exam centres. Your remaining subjects are likely to be spaced out. These subjects have to be faced. They must be given priority between now and Friday week, 20th June. Keep a lid on your impatience and stay in exam mode. Going into week three you will need to be as motivated, focussed and energetic as you were going into your very first paper on 4th June.

As we reach the second weekend of the exam period, eight of the thirteen exam days will have passed. There are ten more subject sessions in the remaining five days. The number of candidates taking these final week subjects will be much less than in the earlier days of the exam. However, the candidates concerned must defer any involvement with post exam celebrations. In sporting parlance, as Sir Alex Ferguson has so often reminded us, the game ends only when the referee blows the final whistle. How right he is! Defeat has too often been snatched from the jaws of victory by one moment of distraction.

The coming weekend affords candidates an opportunity to recharge the batteries and to prepare a plan of work for the final week's papers. Burn off the residual tension of the second week with a period of active leisure, which will restore your feeling of well-being and your mental and physical equilibrium. Enjoy the freshness of the summer season and soak up the natural beauty of your surroundings. An exercise programme will helps you to sleep soundly, to build up stamina and endurance and to maintain your concentration during the last lap. Enjoy a few good nights' rest so that your mind and body are fully alert for the remaining papers. Organise your revision sessions for daylight hours. Don't burn the mid-night oil but go to bed early. Go over the tips and predictions that are available for your remaining subjects. Be sensible by resisting the temptation to spend endless hours cramming course material. Cramming doesn't work! Scan over your notes on the eve of any remaining paper so that the key ideas and concepts are fresh in your mind.

Your strategy has worked perfectly so far. With the finish line in sight, it's imperative to maintain your disciplined and organised approach over the remaining days. Resist the temptation to indulge in some late night socialising with those who have already finished the exam. Keep your distance from alcohol as you'll need a clear head and lots of energy for the task ahead. Eat well as good nutrition is important in week three to avoid energy loss. Drink at least two glasses of milk daily as well as plenty of cool fresh water to avoid dehydration and to keep the fluid levels high. Be moderate in your use of artificial stimulants such as tea and coffee for another week.

Candidates have performed very well during the past fortnight. Keep up the good work and bring your exam to a successful conclusion next week. Use your free days wisely. Stay positive and be confident in your ability to do well in next week's papers. Take it subject by subject and bring the curtain down on a stellar performance.

After the state exam, applicants to the Central Applications Office (CAO) turn their attention to the CAO "Change of Mind" Form, which must be submitted by 1st July. Next week, I'll have a few words of advice on how to use that facility to best advantage.





CHICKEN BREAST WITH FENNEL AND ROCKET SALAD

Simple and special, salad can be prepared ahead Serves 4

Ingredients

- 4 chicken breasts, skin on
- Juice of 1 lemon
- 1 tablesp. olive oil
 - Salt and black pepper

Fennel Salad

- 2 fennel bulbs, sliced thinly as possible
- 2 tablesp. olive oil
- Juice of 1 lemon
- 1 tablesp. good quality mustard
- Handful rocket leaves per person

To Cook

An hour or two ahead if possible place the chicken breasts in a shallow dish. Pour over the lemon juice, olive oil and seasoning.

Prepare the salad - put the sliced fennel in a large bowl, in another small bowl mix the olive oil, lemon juice and mustard together, taste for seasoning. Mix the fennel and dressing together set aside.

Seal the chicken breasts on a hot pan until well browned. Then finish cooking in the oven for 10-15 minutes.

Serving Suggestions

Slice the chicken, serve with a mound of the salad and the rocket leaves on top. Drizzle with a little olive oil and balsamic vinegar and a little black pepper.





MINISTER MUST TAKE FIRM ACTION ON BEEF PRICES TO RESTORE CONFIDENCE AT FARM LEVEL

Speaking at the Beef Forum in Dublin Castle this week, IFA President Eddle Downey told the Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney that the lack of progress is very frustrating for thecountry's 100,000 livestock farmers. He said the continuing deterioration on beef prices was taking Ireland's €2bn beef and livestock sector into a very dangerous negative spiral.

Eddle Downey told the Minister that the way the fectories had tom up the Quality Payment System since last Autumn using dual pricing and unfair specifications to undermine prices and market returns was totally unacceptable. He told Minister Coveney that this fundamental issue must be corrected without any further delay, if his Beef Forum initiative is to have any credibility with farmers. Michael Dowling made it clear at the meeting that the QPS should operate as originally agreed and Eddle Downey said it is now up to the Minister to ensure this happens. The IFA President said the latest Teagasc Farm Survey data, showing livestock farm incomes ranging from €10,000 to £15,000, confirmed the deep income crisis in the livestock sector and the need for urgent action to address the

Michael Dowling recommended that an agreed system of price benchmarking should be worked out which would allow a comparison. with prices across our main markets. He said live exports are important as

an alternative market outlet and for providing a belancing factor in the market. Eddie Downeysaid IFA pointed out to the meeting that based on Bord. Bia data, carcase weights in Ireland were not out of line with weights in our main export market in the UK and in-seneral were lower than those in our main European markets. For steers the average weight in Ireland is 349kgs. while it is 361kg in the UK and 385kg in France. For young bulls the average weight in Ireland is 357kg, while it is 339 in the UK, 394kg in France, 384kg in Germany and 367kg in Italy.

Eddie Downey told Minister Coveney it is imperative the Taoiseach Enda Kenny on behalf of the Government immediately intervenes at the highest levels in Brussels to stop any eachange of offers, currently being considered by the EU Commission President Barroso in the Mercosur trade negotiations with Brazil and other South American. states.

Eddle Downey said there is real fear that President Barossa and Trade Commissioner De Gucht are determined to make a substantial EU offer on agriculture and market. access in the Mercosur negotiations during the lull period between the European elections and the establishment of the new Parliament. He said "There is a very real threat that: an attempt will be made to bypass the system and urgent intervention is required at the highest political level."

FRIDAY 13TH LUCKY FOR SOME

Ironically, and in definite defiance of the laws of probability, the 13th day of the month is more likely to fall on a Friday than on any other day of the week. The precisely aligned pattern of our calendar -- days, weeks and months -- repeats itself exactly every 400 years. In that 400-year period there are 688 Friday the 13ths. 2012 has three Friday the 13ths. Up until the patriarchal revolution, both Fridays and 13s were held in the very highest esteem. Both the day and the number were associated with the Great Goddesses, and therefore, regarded as the sacred essence of luck and good fortune.

In ancient Israel, 13 was a sanctified number, At 13 years of age, a boy was (and still is) initiated into the adult Jewish community. Jews around the world still begin the observance of the Sabbath at sunset on Friday evenings and Friday is the Sabbath in the Islamic world.

Thirteen was also auspicious for the Egyptians, who believed that life has 13 stages, the last of which is death -- the transition to eternal life. Friday the 13th is ultimately the celebration of the lives and loves of Lady Luck. On this, her doubly-dedicated day, let us consider what fortuitous coincidences constitute our fate. The lucky blend of just the right conditions, chemistries, elements, and energies that comprise our universe. The way it all works. The way we are. That we are at all. That, despite whatever major or minor matters we might think are unlucky, we have somehow managed to remain alive and aware. This Friday the 13th, let us stand in full consciousness of the miraculousness of existence and count our blessings.

TO SENTENCED **DEATH BECAUSE SHE WILL NOT** DENY HER CHRISTIAN FAITH

On May 31st all of us that had signed petitions to stop the hanging of the 27 year old mother were delighted when an official from Sudan's Foreign Ministry told the BBC that Sudan planned to release Meriam, this has since been officially denied. Meriam Yehya Ibrahim was born in Sudan to a Muslim father, who left her Ethiopian Orthodox mother to raise her from early childhood. She was raised in her mother's faith and married a Christian man; she was eight months pregnant when she appeared before a court in Khartoum, Sudan's capital city, on 15 May on charges of 'apostasy' and 'adultery'. When she refused to renounce her Orthodox Christian faith, the judges sentenced Meriam to death by hanging. Meriam has also been sentenced to 100 lashes for being married to a Christian man. Meriam gave birth in the prison hospital on 27 May with her legs in chains. She remains jailed with her newborn baby girl, Maya, and Martin, her 20-month-old son, in Omdurman Women's Prison in Khartoum. With Maya and Martin beside her, there are now three innocent people in Meriam's prison cell. Meriam has been shackled by heavy chains around her ankles since her death sentence ruling - customary practice for all prisoners awaiting execution. Her lawyers say that Meriam remained chained by her legs even while she was in labour. Daniel Wani, Meriam's husband and the father of Maya and Martin, was briefly allowed to meet his new baby daughter in prison. Daniel has thanked those around the world who have taken action for Meriam (over 900,000 have joined Amnesty's global campaign alone) and called for continued pressure on the Sudanese authorities for her release. Sudan's Criminal Code states that a pregnant woman sentenced to death must give birth and nurse her child for two years before her execution can go ahead. No date for Meriam's execution has yet been announced. Those charged with apostasy have three days to renounce their religion and follow Islam. Meriam first appeared before the court in Khartoum on 11 May. When, on 15 May, she refused to renounce her Christian faith, her

death sentence was confirmed.

WE TALK **ABOUT** BIODIVERSITY A LOT. -**BUT WHAT DOES IT REALLY MEAN? SHOULD WE CARE?**

All living beings in an ecosystem are part of the web of life, including us. Together there are an estimated 8.7 million species of plants, animals, and insects on Earth, each interacting to create a resilient environment upon which we all depend for survival. When the web is weakened, our future is threatened. Maintaining diversity of species in our ecosystem - including the 2.2 million marine species and the 6.5 million terrestrial species –is of critical importance.

When we talk about biodiversity in the Amazon, we're talking about the greatest repository of life on Earth. The Amazon is home to about 2.5 million insect species, tens of thousands of plants, and 2,000 birds and mammals. To date, at least 40,000 plant species, 2,200 fish, 1,294 birds, 427 mammals, 428 amphibians, and 378 reptiles have been scientifically classified in the region. And there are thousands more discovered that have yet to be documented. One in five of all the bird species in the world live in the rainforests of the Amazon, and one in five of global fish species live in Amazonian rivers and streams. A 2001 study finding that 62 acres of Ecuadorian rainforest supports more than 1,100 tree species, meaning that the biodiversity of plant species there is the highest on Earth. In the Amazon alone we find almost four hundred billion trees! Among those trees live scarlet macaws, woolly monkeys, three-striped poison dart tree frogs, sloths, monkey frogs, capybaras, red howler monkeys, ocelots, harpy eagles, squirrel monkeys, green iguanas, jaguars... and hundreds more. Those are just the animals! The Amazon is our richest repository of biodiversity, and it is under great threat. Maintaining the integrity of the Amazon means protecting one of the densest sections of our planetary web of life.

GOOD NEWS

Wild cats and people living in and around their habitats across the globe will have a better life thanks to a generous contribution from General Shaikh Mohammad Bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Deputy Commander of the UAE Armed Forces and Abu Dhabi Crown Prince.

Shaikh Mohammad has pledged to contribute \$20 million to a collective fund of \$80 million being established by him and three other environmental philanthropists from China, India and the US. This global alliance is supporting a Cornerstone Funding for a \$200 million programme for wild cats initiated by Panthera, a New York-based leading organisation working for conservation of wild cats. All sections of people irrespective of their religion, nationality, etc want one thing in common — a better life for their children, and this initiative will give better education and health care to thousands of children and their parents living around wild cat habitats, a senior executive of Panthera said.

The \$80 million collective fund has been committed for a period of ten years. It will immediately fund the most effective solutions for conserving big cats. The solutions will address poaching for local and international trade, retaliatory and punitive killing from conflict with humans, unsustainable hunting of prey, and the loss and fragmentation of habitat. Apart from Shaikh Mohammad, Jho Low, CEO of Jynwel Capital and Director of Jynwel Charitable Foundation Limited in Hong Kong: Hemendra Kothari, Chairman DSP Blackrock India and the Wildlife Conservation Trust: and Dr. Thomas Kaplan and Mrs Daphne Recanati Kaplan, Panthera's founders, have contributed \$20 million each to the collective fund.

7TH-GRADER'S **SERVICE DOG GIVEN A PLACE IN HER** SCHOOL YEARBOOK

For the last four years, 7th-grader Rachel Benke and her devoted service dog Taxi have been inseparable companions -- so much so, in fact, that now their special bond will be preserved for perpetuity in her junior high school yearbook. Rachel who has suffered from epilepsy since she was a baby, goes everywhere with the golden retriever-lab mix, but he's much more than just a pet. Taxi has a remarkable ability to detect when a seizure will strike, giving Rachel crucial time to get medical attention.

Before the service dog came into her life, Rachel's mother Theresa said, she'd shown little improvement in her condition and had even been fearful of animals, but that all changed the moment she met Taxi.

"Next thing we knew Rachel just hugged him, it was the cutest thing you've ever seen and they've been a team ever since,"Theresa added.

FARMERS - LOOKING FOR AN ADDITIONAL INCOME? EVER THOUGHT OF SELLING **DONKEY MILK?**

Two things that may surprise you. One, you can milk a donkey. Two, people love the milk.

Over the past couple of months, Jean-Michel Eveguoz, a chef and teacher at Les Roches International School of Hotel Management in Switzerland, has been experimenting with donkey's milk, with a view to figuring out just how well it lends itself to traditional European cuisine. Thus far, he's made a simple panna cotta, a "mousse au chocolat blanc" and he's working on an emulsion of donkey's milk and wild flowers to complement a poached lobster. "The milk works very well in a number of recipes," says Evequoz, "and when you add in sugar and chocolate in particular, the taste is amazing." Eveguoz is one of a small yet growing number of donkey milk aficionados in Europe, all of whom are instrumental for what's become a sort of renaissance of both the milk as well as the animal that produces it.

THE **ALERT** CARRIER PROGRAM

One of the most important points of social contact for some older adults is their post person. In the U.S. Mail carriers come by six days a week with mail and packages, so they provide a much-needed human and friendly face, but

they also make sure the people on their rounds are safe. In fact, the United States Postal Service has run a voluntary program called the Carrier Alert Program since 1982. When a participating mail carrier notices signs of a problem, like a senior not answering her door, or evidence of a fall, he can contact a supervisor to escalate the situation if the senior is enrolled in the program. Mail carriers can also act outside the program to call law enforcement or emergency medical services if there's a life-threatening emergency affecting one of their customers. Since they interact with their customers almost every day, they know what to look for, and how to tell if something is wrong. In Cincinnati, a mail carrier saved the life of an elderly man when he fell at a condo complex; a North Carolina mail carrier intervened to save a stroke victim on his route; a Michigan mail carrier helped an elderly woman after a fall in her home; an Indiana mail carrier helped another stroke victim; and a Minnesota mail carrier rushed to the rescue with CPR to help a customer after a heart attack. The post office says that: "Neither snow nor rain nor heat nor gloom of night stays these couriers from the swift completion of their appointed rounds," but it takes its role as a member of the community, and the family, very seriously. Letter carriers who work on door delivery routes have to take the time to walk up to each door and often end up interacting with people as they deliver their mail. So when Portland letter carriers heard that their district post office was pushing property owners to switch to what's known as "cluster delivery," a group of boxes at the corner or another central point, they fought back saying it would eliminate the important interaction between mail carriers and seniors on their routes. Without door delivery, mail carriers might miss signs that something's going wrong until mail starts building up in a mail box, which means a senior could lie for days after a fall, stroke, or heart attack, and disabled customers could face similar delays if they need help. Cluster boxes are also less convenient than door delivery, of course, but more importantly, they're less secure: they're easier for vandals to damage and break into, and they present a risk for identity theft as well as stolen property. While the post office is pushing for mass adoption of cluster boxes, mail carriers, community advocates and seniors know it's not a good idea.

FINALLY THIS WEEK

Did you know that certain types of trees warn each other when they're under siege by insects? Since the late 1970s, researchers have studied this phenomenon in willows and poplars. Collectively, they've found that trees infested with insects will produce an excess of chemicals in their leaves. These chemicals not only reduce the nutritional value of the leaves for the insects, but also warn neighbouring trees. Following the warning, nearby trees will begin to produce the same chemicals, defending themselves from a similar attack.

Health Matters.... With Dr. Michael Moloney

ACNE PART 1

Acne is common and usually treatable. Most people with acne are aged between 12 and 25, but some older and younger people are affected. Acne usually affects the face but may also affect the back, neck and chest. The severity can range from mild to severe.

Some myths about acne

- Acne is not caused by poor hygiene
- Diet has little effect on acne. There is no evidence chocolate, sweets, or fatty foods cause acne.
- Stress does not cause acne.
- Acne is not just a simple skin infection. The cause is a complex interaction of changing hormones, sebum, overgrowth of a normally harmless bacteria, inflammation, etc.

You cannot 'catch' acne-it is not contagious

- Acne cannot be cured by drinking lots of water.
- There is no evidence to say that sunbeds will help to clear acne.
- Some people believe that acne cannot be helped by medical treatment. This is not true. Treatments usually work well if used correctly

What causes acne?

Acne is a condition that affects the sebaceous glands (grease glands). Sebaceous glands are the tiny pores in the skin that produces oil to protect the skin. The activity of the sebaceous glands is influenced by the male hormones — androgens (women also have small amounts of this hormone). The sebaceous glands sometimes produce too much oil and this leads to a blockage at the tip of the gland. The result is a white bump (whitehead) or a black bump (blackhead).

These are called comedones. These blocked glands are much more likely to get inflamed. The inflammation is caused by bacteria which normally live harmlessly on the skin. The result is redness and swelling.

Treatment

The aim of treatment is to clear spots as much as possible and to prevent scarring. Treatments can be 'topical' (treatment that you apply directly to the skin) and/or tablets. Treatment will usually clear most spots if you use it properly. It is important to start treatment early and treat long enough, a minimum of 2 months for topical gels or creams and 3 months for oral preparations.

Antiseptic washes are heavily advertised but are unlikely to make any **PART 2 NEXT WEEK** difference.
