HOLLYWOOD ACTOR takes locals on a Social Spin

The Hollywood actor was hired as part of a promotional video organised by Guinness for social media.

Sean O'Mahony runs Faha Court Bar which is about 8km from Killarney.

Sean says the pub was in a "do or die" situation after the drink driving laws were changed. "We called a meeting of local people where it was decided that something had to be done. The pub is at the heart of our local community and we were determined to protect it."

Social Spin was born and although it only launched in June, Sean says the results so far are extremely encouraging.

"We have 30 volunteer drivers so it really is a community effort. The car is available from 6.30pm to 11.30pm every night. Customers call the Social Spin dedicated mobile number to arrange collection. It's as simple as that.

"It's a volunteer service so there is no charge, passengers can make a donation to a maximum of \in 5 per trip, which goes towards diesel and maintaining the car. Running costs are approximately \in 200 per week."

Sean also mentions solving the insurance issue as a key factor in allowing the service to launch. "I'd like to thank FBD for taking us on board, who worked closely with us while we established Social Spin. In the end we secured open insurance for just over €4k."

The Faha service is now transporting over 80 people to and from Killarney Country Club per week. "We're a small rural community so this is a lifeline. It needs to be rolled out nationwide," says Sean. "The government need to support schemes such as this across the country."

That's a sentiment echoed by VFI Chief Executive Padraig Cribben. Speaking recently in Faha, he said pubs are facing many challenges but the new drink driving laws had impacted rural communities to such a degree that it prevented people from socialising.

"Social Spin is a community driven scheme that facilitates communities to come together," he says. "The pub is the hub and the publican is at the centre of many rural communities.

"We see that the local community welcomes Social Spin, which allows people to get out of their homes and avoid rural isolation."

"The reaction has been super," he says. "Social Spin has lifted everything in the village. We see the service becoming more popular every week. At present we're averaging about \in 280 per week in donations, which is enough to keep the service operating.

"Rural Ireland is coming up with solutions but we need support from government. We're seeing faces in the pub we haven't seen for years. People are depending on the service now – and politicians need to understand that."

Employment contracts - A guide for employers

The agreed terms of an employment contract are of paramount importance in determining the rights and duties of both the employer and employee. Each employee must be given a written statement of their terms and conditions of employment, as per provisions under the Terms of Employment (Information) Acts, within two months of commencing employment.

Guidelines for creating an employment contract

All employer/employee relationships involve a contract of employment whether this is written or implied and it governs many aspects of the employer/employee relationship. It is important to understand what information must be contained in a contract of employment and be mindful that employers have a responsibility to issue certain terms and conditions to employees.

Recent changes

With the enactment of the Employment (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, employers must now provide new employees their 5 core terms of employment in writing within 5 days of them starting employment and the rest of the terms of employment must be given within two months of the employee commencing employment.

The Act also introduced banded hours, it prohibits zero-hour contracts except in the case of work carried out in emergency circumstances or to provide short term relief work to cover routine absences and it has also simplified the National Minimum Wage rates.

Time to celebrate our ancient past on the Paps of Anú

s we approach the shortest day of the $\mathsf{A}_{\mathsf{year}}$, the Winter Solstice on Saturday 21st December 2019, it's almost time to celebrate our ancient past by climbing the Paps of Anú, long associated with the Goddess Anú, in aid of Kerry Hospice Foundation Palliative Care. 'The Paps' resemble a pair of breast shaped hills located in the Derry Na Saggart Mountains, close to the Cork Kerry border. named after Anú, Goddess of Pre-Christian Ireland and Mother Goddess of the Tuatha De Danann. They have been associated with mythology, mystic and majesty, representing all that is earthly fertile, abundant and protective.

With kind permission of local landowner Sean O'Donoghue, Glenflesk, and neighbour Jimmy Moynihan, the walk departs from Garries Bridge - the first bridge after St Agatha's Church, Glenflesk, (2.7km) on the left hand side, (will be signposted) Meeting at 5.45am. An ancient blessing of fire led by Mary Cronin of Glenflesk heralds the beginning of the walk in darkness. The long walk and climb to the summit has two strenuous inclines, leading to the Western Pap at 690 Metres. Sunrise and Craic begin, with Glenflesks finest musicians Derry and Rosie Healy, setting the pace for a Kerry polka set, followed by an ancient ceremonial Blessing of light by Mary Cronin. The trek will be led by expert Mountaineer Donie Mulcahy and crew. The celebration is part of the Christmas in Killarney seasonal calendar of

events.

After descending the ancient mountain, a ceremonial solstice coffee and scones takes place in the Plaza Hotel, Killarney at 10.30am (the Basecamp) Donation of \in 20 per adult will be collected on the morning and afterwards in Killarney Plaza Hotel. For those who are unable to climb please join us for the solstice breakfast, at the Plaza Hotel from 10.30am, or even before hand at the fire blessing at 5.45am

It is advised to wear/bring Head Torch, Warm clothes, hiking boots, waterproof jacket and pants, gloves, hat, food and a drink. A good level of fitness is required. Guides will be on duty for gear check before departure.

Killarney woman appeals for support

WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR PENSION & WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?

Many pensions can be accessed from age 60, a lot of the rules depend on whether you are an employee or self employed. Tax Free Cash: Most people will be entitled to a tax free lump sum, the amount varies however generally you will get at least 25% of the value of your pension in a tax free cash lump sum.

Annual Pension: This is a guaranteed income for the rest of your life that is purchased with the money left after your tax free lump sum.

Approved Retirement Funds: You may be entitled to keep some of your money in an approved retirement fund, money can be taken from the fund to give you a regular income.

Minister Creed Launches MacGillycuddy Reeks EIP Project

The MacGillycuddy Reeks European Innovation Partnership Project was officially aunched this week by Minister Michael Creed at an event held in Cronin's Yard. The project, which is managed by South Kerry Development Partnership CLG, aims to improve the sustainability and economic viability of farming in the MacGillycuddy Reeks. This will be done through the development of practical, achievable actions and innovative solutions in order to improve the condition of the habitats of this unique Natura 2000 area, in close conjunction with the landowners/farmers in the area.

In his address to the large attendance, Minister Creed noted that the Reeks area was one of the most beautiful places in the country and it is only when one understands the visual element of this that one realises how important a project such as this is, particularly since it is locally owned and developed. He noted that the great thing with it is that it is playing to the strengths of the area and that the solutions being developed were locally engineered. He described the Reeks project as a good example of where he would like to see more policy initiative development and noted that the knowledge gained is transferrable to other regions in the country and indeed across borders given the links this project has with similar initiatives in other EU countries. The MacGillycuddy Reeks Project is a European Innovation Partnership (EIP) co-funded by the Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine under the Rural Development Programme 2014-2020.

In the run up to one of the busiest times of the year, Peter Doyle spoke to Denis Cronin of Cronin's Butchers on High Street which is one of the oldest businesses in town.

Denis explained that, "my great grandfather started the business across the street where the 3 mobile phone shop is now." Denis added that, "the shop was there for five to ten years before my grandfather Denis relocated the shop to where it is today." Denis said, " unfortunately my grandfather died a young man, so my father Tommy took over at a young age and he has been working in the shop for close to 70 years."

The shop is run by Denis, his wife Bernie and Denis's parents Tommy and Cait whom are in their 80's but still work every day. They also have six full time employees. Denis explained that they have a lot of loyal local customers but they also get a lot of tourists. They also supply a lot of local hotels and restaurants in town. Denis said "we appreciate the support and we give both a good service and product in return."

Denis added that, "we do have our own farm and produce some of our beef on it but obviously not all of it." Denis added, "it is killed in a local abbatoir in Fossa, meaning the carbon footprint is very small."

"The biggest changes are in both shopping trends and people's eating habits and the challenge is to move with the times", Denis said. "We are the last traditional butchers in Killarney, we are killing our own beef and lamb which is a huge selling point for us as people know where their meat comes from." Cronin's is open six and a half days a week including Sunday mornings. They will be open until Christmas Eve. They are running special offers on both Christmas turkeys and Christmas hams and will continue to expand as they embrace their second century of business.

Killarney Credit Union reports strong financial year

Killarney Credit Union Ltd has reported a strong financial year at its 2019 AGM with over \in 140 million in assets. The credit union has grown its membership by 1,319 in the past 12 months. We see great opportunities for the credit union to grow and strengthen for our members in the coming year and this will be our priority. While we have a membership of 34,000, only 20% of our members actually borrow from us. In the past year, we have seen our loan book fall by 1.15%, as such lending is a core aspect of the business and we would encourage everyone to consider the credit union for their

lending needs".

Mark continued "We know our members value the continued face-to-face personal service we provide. Indeed, Killarney Credit Union joined with other credit unions in Ireland in winning the CXi award for customer experience for the fifth consecutive year. We also want to take this opportunity to thank all of our members for their loyalty over the past years. A BAR THAT ALSO HOUSES FOSTER DOGS RESCUED FROM KILL SHELTERS

Fido's Taphouse is being hailed as the world's first bar and restaurant that also doubles as a foster home for pups that were rescued from kill shelters in central California.

Since the Portland-based establishment opened in 2018, they have helped 70 different shelter dogs find homes.

Fido's founder Scott Porter says that he was inspired to launch the taphouse after he learned about cat cafés. Additionally, he hopes that the foster dogs will help give families the same kind of love and therapeutic support that his own dogs have offered to him.

"My own dogs helped me through some pretty severe depression he said "They were extremely loving and attentive to me. And they understood that I was going through some tough times."

The bar typically accommodates three or four shelter dogs at a time in a room that is separated from the dining area, although their facilities are equipped to house eight. If a potential adopter decides to adopt one of the lucky pups, they are required to wait three days before signing the paperwork so staffers can be sure that alcohol did not influence their decision.

A FEW CHRISTMAS HINTS AND TIPS

*Many of us unthinkingly put our tree by a radiator or fireplace, but all that heat will dry the tree out more quickly. A cool, draughty place, such as a hallway, will mean you don't spend the whole festive period vacuuming up pine needles. *It might seem early to think about Christmas dinner, but a surprising number of dishes can be made ahead of time. Potatoes, parsnips and stuffing can all be cooked and frozen, then defrosted and reheated in the oven on the day itself. *Christmas wrapping paper can be expensive, especially if you have a large family. Instead, buy a large roll of brown paper and some string. Your presents will look both charmingly old-fashioned and the paper is recyclable. Nothing makes wrapping presents more stressful that constantly scrabbling to find the end of the sticky tape. Slip a paper clip over the end of the tape, and you can wrap in peace. If last year's leftover wrapping paper is a little rumpled, iron it, reverse side up, on a low heat.

*Chinese researchers tested 57 drinks, from herbal tea to milk, and found that the most successful in abating hangover symptoms was Sprite. *For a delicious St. Stephens Day treat, make Christmas pudding rolls: simply roll out a pack of shop-bought puff pastry, cover it with chunks of leftover pud, then roll up and chop into equal sections. Pop into a 200C/400F/Gas 6 oven for around 20 minutes, or until crispy. You can also mix crumbled Christmas pudding into ice cream for an easy dessert to scoff in front of the television. *And for next year...when you take down your Christmas lights, instead of just dumping them in a box, wrap them around a coat hanger, or even a piece of cardboard, and they won't tangle up when you unearth them next Christmas.

HOW TO PET-PROOF YOUR CHRISTMAS TREE

It can be very difficult to keep a young, stillin-training pet away from the Christmas tree, particularly if this is his or her's first Christmas. Even for an older pet, who may have learned not to jump on the tree — either because it fell on him last year or because your admonitions worked — you will still need to be cautious with the ornaments you place within his reach.

A live tree can be especially hazardous. Dogs and cats like to chew on sticks (i.e., limbs) and greenery, and the fir tree oils can be irritating to the mouth tissue causing such symptoms as drooling and vomiting. Also, if your pet is chewing on the branches, there is a good chance he is also swallowing some of the needles. If enough needles are swallowed they can get caught in the intestinal tract, puncturing the lining or bunching together and causing obstruction. Both can have deadly consequences.

A popular tree decoration called flocking, an imitation snow product, can also cause serious problems when significant amounts of it are swallowed. If you are going to have a tree in your home, it is best to at least get a non-flocked tree. In addition, some trees are treated with chemical preservatives to keep them fresh longer. These chemicals leach into the water in the feeding dish, making the water poisonous to drink — which pets will do if the water is left uncovered. If you do not have a tree skirt to cover the water dish with, you can use towel, plastic wrap, or aluminium foil.

DID YOU KNOW?

Friday the 13th has a long history of freaking people out. When this day rolls around, people buy less stuff and travel less frequently. In fact, the global economy is estimated to lose as much \$800 million every time a Friday lands on the 13th. However, it's been proven by the Dutch Centre for Insurance Statistics that Friday the 13th is actually statistically safer than other Fridays — there are fewer accidents and reports of fire and theft on these days.

Dealing with Depression II

Thoughts are constantly streaming through our minds which in turn can impact on how we feel and how we behave. These thoughts can be friendly positive thoughts or hostile, critical and negative ones. It makes sense therefore that we would try to reduce the negative ones as much as possible. Just as we wouldn't allow any stranger to just enter our house and take over, we need to be just as vigilant with our thoughts. We need to take more control over what we allow into our minds and what we prohibit from entering. We have much more choice than we realise - and therefore rather than just reacting to every thought we begin to take more control over our mind. Slowly we begin to realise that just because we think something it doesn't mean it's true! By examining our thoughts as they flow through our mind, we begin to increase our awareness of how our minds are focused. Then we begin to allow these thoughts -- whether they are positive or negative, exciting or boring - to just flow through our mind stream without reacting or responding. This is the basis of mindfulness.

For many people experiencing depression they can create an endless cycle of 'If onlys' and 'what Ifs' in their mind. There is an underlying non-acceptance of the past as they constantly think how their lives would be different 'If only I hadn't taken his advice', 'If only I hadn't behaved in that way'. This all leads to feelings of anger, hopelessness and mistrust of others. Accepting how things are right now- not as we wish they were, but as they actually are – is quite a radical step. It can however mark the starting point from which we can come to terms with past events and begin to move forward.

Just as there are many paths leading to feeling depressed, there are also many routes out of it. We don't get depressed as a result of an adverse event or experience – but in how we respond to it. When our emotional needs go unmet this can lead to considerable mental distress and depression. If we were to consider depression as a means of drawing our attention to an underlying problem, we must ask ourselves what is the message my feelings of depression are trying to tell me. Counselling can provide a great support as we explore what this underlying message might be. Counselling helps to find contentment and peace of mind through fostering a healthy, non-judgemental, loving relationship with oneself.

Next week we will continue to look at ways we can deal with depression.

Question

I usually get a gift voucher at Christmas. What are the new gift voucher rules that came in recently?

Answer

Gift vouchers are any voucher, coupon or other document (including an electronic document) that can be used instead of money to pay (or pay in part) for goods and services.

Since 2 December 2019, the Consumer Protection (Gift Vouchers) Act 2019 sets out the following new rules for gift vouchers:

• Gift vouchers must have no expiry date or be valid for at least 5 years.

• Traders cannot specify that a gift voucher is spent in one transaction.

•Traders cannot charge a fee to change the name on a gift voucher, (if you have to register a name on the voucher).

•If the balance remaining on a gift voucher is more than €1 after you buy something with it, a trader must reimburse the balance to you. They can give you cash, make an electronic transfer or give you another gift voucher.

These new rules do not apply to:

• Vouchers that you can only use to buy specified goods and services at a discounted price, from a specified trader on a specified date, or for a specified period of 3 months or less. For example, vouchers from deal websites such as Groupon or Piosback.

• Vouchers issued as part of a customer loyalty or promotion scheme.

Vouchers issued as a refund for goods you returned to a trader.
Vouchers and gift cards sold before 2 December 2019. The expiry period and the terms and conditions that applied at the time of purchase apply to these vouchers.

The new rules do not apply to electronic money gift cards (for example, One4all gift cards) which are already covered under the European Communities (Electronic Money) Regulations 2011.
