LIFESAVING AIR AMBULANCE TASKED 512 TIMES DURING 2021

A serious accident in West Kerry which involved Cork cyclist Diarmuid O'Donovan resulted in the call out of the Community Air Ambulance to come to his aid.

Diarmuid was seriously injured when he was thrown over the handlebars of his bike while cycling around Slea Head in May 2021. He said he needed to be brought to a dedicated Trauma Centre quickly, "A moment of carelessness saw me hit the road. I was on my own but thankfully it wasn't long before I was found. Paramedics, a local doctor, the local Fire Service and Gardai all responded. I was drifting in and out of consciousness and it quickly emerged that I needed to be at Cork University Hospital as soon as possible. I wasn't in a suitable state for a two-and-a-half-hour journey by road so the Irish Community Air Ambulance was tasked and landed in Ventry. The journey to CUH by helicopter took just 30 minutes. I had 28 different bone breaks including my spine, shoulder and ribs as well as a punctured lung. I underwent several procedures that evening and spent 12 days in hospital. I believe it



could have been far worse if I had not been transported to CUH so quickly and that my recovery has been much faster as a result."

The Irish Community Air Ambulance was tasked to 512 missions in 14 counties during 2021, its busiest year since the Helicopter Emergency Medical Service (HEMS) Air Ambulance launched in July 2019. There were 490 taskings in 2020.

The organisation is Ireland's only charityfunded HEMS Air Ambulance. It works in partnership with the National Ambulance Service and responds to serious incidents and medical emergencies from its base in Rathcool, Co. Cork. Each helicopter mission costs an average of €3,500, all of which has to be raised or donated.

There were more calls to cardiac arrests, farming-related incidents and falls from heights during 2021. Cardiac arrests accounted for one in five calls with 103 taskings last year, that's up from 81 during 2020.

Amongst the incidents responded to were: 89 Road traffic collisions

- 64 Farming incidents
- 64 Cardiovascular (Heart attacks and strokes)
- 63 General trauma calls
- 61 General medical calls
- 48 Falls from heights 20 Equestrian incidents

July and April were the busiest months of the

year for the service with 57 missions completed each month. Cork, Kerry and Tipperary accounted for the majority of taskings. The Irish Community Air Ambulance was also tasked to Clare, Limerick, Waterford, Wexford, Kilkenny, Mayo, Galway, Offaly, Laois, Wicklow and Kildare.

One in every three taskings required an airlift to hospital. There were 111 transfers to Cork University Hospital during 2021 which equates to 66% of all transfers. University Hospital Limerick accounts for 20%.

There were also transfers to hospitals in Kerry, Tallaght, Galway, Temple Street, Crumlin and The Mater as we saw an increase in the number of times we were required to transfer children and young people to specialist paediatric hospitals in Dublin.

DRAFT KERRY COUNTY DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2022-2028 Still on View

Residents in the Killarney area can view the Draft Kerry County Development Plan which covers the period 2022 to 2028 at the Town Hall until Wednesday February 23rd.

The plan is an extensive statutory plan which sets out how the proper and sustainable development of the county can be achieved over the next six years. at the Town Hall. This week Kerry County Council held an online information webinar this week to facilitate discussion and engagement on the Draft County Development Plan which is currently going through a public consultation process this week and the plan is still available to view. The Draft County Development Plan, which covers the period 2022 to 2028, is an extensive statutory plan which sets out how the proper and sustainable development of the county can be achieved over the next six years. A three-month public consultation period is currently underway.

The draft document provides a broad framework for the way in which the local

economy, society, environment, and the use of land in Kerry should evolve in an inclusive, sustainable, and progressive way. It covers issues such as climate change, towns and villages, water and wastewater, housing, energy, Gaeltacht

areas, and tourism and recreation.

'There has been a lot of very positive engagement so far with members of the public as we continue the process,' said the Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr Jimmy Moloney.

'On Thursday evening at 7.00pm, planning officials will set out the broad parameters of the draft plan and will set out how interested parties can make a submission. I would encourage everyone to participate in this important discussion,' he said.

'This plan impacts every individual, family

and community in our county and is the most important strategy which will be put in place for Kerry over the next six years,' he added.

The Draft County Development Plan 2022-2028 is now available online and in hard copy at all public libraries and the principal offices of Kerry County Council in Tralee, Listowel and Killarney. Submissions can be made only through the online portal or in writing and must be received by 23 February 2022. Over the coming weeks, the Council will continue to share information on various aspects of the plan on social media and will encourage public engagement.

BROAD WELCOME FOR FUNDING

There has been a broad welcome in Kerry this week with the news that over €1.6 million in funding for rural regeneration has been allocated in Listowel and Killorglin.

Minister for Education and Kerry TD Norma Foley has welcomed the announcement of \in 1,691,104 in funding for two development projects in Listowel and Killorglin under the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund.

The funding, under the Rural Regeneration Development Fund (RRDF), is being invested in projects that will rejuvenate town centres, drive economic growth and footfall, combat dereliction, develop pedestrian zones and outdoor spaces and boost tourism in Rural Ireland.

Under the scheme Killorglin Town centre receives €961,800 to resource the renovation of a key building into a multifunctional hub for tourism, education, training and co-working purposes. The funding also provides for the transformation of a derelict former courthouse into a heritage and cultural centre.

Through this tranche of funding €729,304 is allocated to the Listowel 'Where Story Begins' project to prepare plans for the renewal of the town square and the provision of a multifunctional co-working, tourism, heritage and cultural building. This funding will also assist in the connection of the North Kerry Greenway into the heart of the town.

The funding being announced today will bring these projects through the development stage and to the point where they are ready to commence works.

Minister Foley said: "This timely investment will both enrich and enhance the communities of Listowel and Killorglin. This funding is an endorsement of the great ambition and breadth of vision of these two rich, rural communities. These plans will create economic and social stability in both towns, creating vibrant, modern centres where families and businesses can thrive for years to come." Under the scheme Killorglin Town centre receives €961,800



HOUSE PRICE RISE EXPECTED IN 2022

The price of the average three-bed semi in County Kerry is expected to rise by 6% in the next 12 months, according to a survey by Real Estate Alliance. Three-bed semi-detached homes in the county now cost an average of €263,000, up 16% on the December 2020 average of €226,000, the REA Average House Price Index shows.

The survey concentrates on the actual sale price of Ireland's typical stock home, the three-bed semi, giving an up-to-date picture of the second-hand property market in towns and cities countrywide.

Landlords exiting the market have accounted for almost one in four home sales over the past three months, the data shows. Average Killarney prices currently sit at \in 320,000, an annual increase of 18.5%, while Tralee prices rose by 13.7% in 2021 to \notin 207,000.

"Demand remains very strong, but supply is at an alltime low with no new developments expected in the next 12 months," said Donal Culloty of REA Coyne and Culloty, Killarney.

"Investors are leaving the market and the buyers are mainly owner occupiers which leaves limited supply for the rental market."

As the flight to rural locations continues, prices in the rest of the country's towns rose by 2.6% in Q3 to €190,138.

CALL FOR ACTION FOR COOLMAGORT SEWERAGE ISSUES

The residents of a Beaufort residential housing estate have been enduring for many years, a Sewerage System that not alone, does not work properly, but is also a serious health hazard, according to Fianna Fáil Councillor, Michael Cahill.

.

"Coolmagort Avenue in Beaufort is the same Housing Estate where children and their parents get sick, the same Estate where when it rains, raw sewerage flows around the footpaths and gardens of some of the houses, the same Estate where, on occasion, raw sewerage has found it's way into washing machines in kitchens. And yet, the solution to the problem appears as far away as ever" stated the Deputy Mayor of Kerry County Council and Cathaoirleach of Kenmare Municipal District. "This is a private housing estate and has not been taken in charge by the Local Authority and therefore is legally not their responsibility. This is as horrendous a living situation as I have seen in a modern housing estate and I am now imploring Minister Darragh O'Brien, Irish Water and the Department of Housing to organise remedial works on this Sewerage System on behalf of these long suffering residents" said Councillor Cahill.

"This work should commence with immediate effect" stated an angry Councillor Cahill.

"These people should not have to suffer this danger and degradation any longer just because of the legal status of their housing estate" added Councillor Cahill.






It's the talk of the town

Deer Oh Dear

A small Bambi has told me of plans for a major celebration and exhibition to celebrate Killarney's unique Red deer next autumn. This will include some of the spectacular photographs of the rut over the years and a look at the contribution the oldest biggest mammal makes to the local economy and the reputation of Killarney as a wildlife haven.

The nod comes as we learn how a whole generation of Killarney deer could have been wiped out just last year. Had the April 2021 "wild" fires occurred just days later, there would be no baby deer, said Damien Hannigan of the Irish Deer Commission.

But the threat to deer is not over. A night time patrol by Killarney wildlife rangers seems to have put a halt to the gallop of what sounded suspiciously like poaching activity after Christmas in the Torc/Mangerton area. Reports of high caliber rifles were heard on successive nights of clear moonlight - but stopped after rangers and the gardai responded with great alacrity to an alert from locals.

There are fears for the well being for the Grand Master, the 21-point huge red stag whose picture is much sought after, but he was safely reposing, far from the suspicious activity.

What exactly was going on, we don't know. But it wasn't authorized culling.

Culling is necessary to manage the herd, and save woods and farms and private gardens too.

The culls are carried out in "a scientific manner", the Department of Heritage assures. And it is carried out periodically "when resources, weather and timing allows", it said this week.

"Culling is a regular and on-going management operation within the National Parks and some Nature Reserves, including Killarney National Park. The Department works towards sustainable herd management of deer in its properties, and as such there is and will continue to be a need to remove a certain percentage of animals from the herd encompassing both age and gender on an on-going basis. This will take place where and when resources allow."



Strong rate of compliance found in Killarney

A very strong rate of compliance with Covid rules was found in dining in Killarney and Tralee premises last November in a check carried out by the Health and Safety Authority.

A Freedom of Information Request replied to just before Christmas documented there were 12 inspections/compliance checks carried out by the region's compliance inspector between September 1st and 24th November 2021. These checks took place at indoor dining premises mainly in retail parks and forecourts.

All checks were unannounced and during the working day on November 3rd and 4th last. None of the food premises is named, but

seven were in Tralee and five in Killarney. No dining was taking place at four of the Tralee premises, so the real scrutiny was on the Killarney premises.

The compliance checks included if contact tracing was being carried out and whether vaccine certs were being sought and if masks were being worn and if there were systems at the door.

Verbal advice about keeping audit check lists and contact tracing on separate documents were issued to a small number of premises. But the premises were compliant with regard to systems controlling point of entry, and no further action had to be taken in any of the premises.

A very interesting covering letter - to me anyway – described the vaccine cert as proof of "immunity":

The focus of the compliance checks under the legislation was to ensure "only permitted persons who have provided a proof of immunity dine or drink indoors," the HSA said.

Does this mean that there was an understanding initially that those vaccinated were actually immune? The disease keeps changing and so does our understanding of it. Hopefully it will whittle down to a cold and just one injection a year!

It is the Environmental Health Officers of the HSE, the Health Authority which carries out checks on restaurants, bars, and clubs and a reply from them is awaited with regard to later night premises Kerry.

Campaign to bring the annals of Innisfallen back to Killarney still alive

The Island of Inisfallen might seem a long way from the acropolis of Athens and the

campaign for the return of the Elgin Marbles from the British Museum.

But the importance of the Annals to Killarney never diminishes. And the campaign for their return never quite disappears.

Just last year, the annals written partly in Lough Leane provided one of the ten top medieval Irish words to be recovered. Interestingly the Inisfallen term related to a disease in the year 1259.

"Galar na placóide" was the name of a disease and the Annals of Inisfallen in the year 1259, told how people and horses suffered from it and that it involved some form of cough.

Every so often attempts are made to have the annals returned to Killarney.

The last serious attempt was by then Arts Minister Jimmy Deenihan. He told the Dail in 2013 he was seeking the return of the Annals from the Bodleian in Oxford.

Before him, Brian O'Leary then councillor made an all out effort and the late councillor Michael Courtney as mayor hoped to bring them back on loan to be exhibited in a newly restored Killarney House - which was at one time expected in 2005.

There have been many calls, beginning with Dean Swift in 1734. Swift wanted them to remain in Ireland and be placed in Trinity College.

Left in a will to Oxford in the mid 18th century., they were lent briefly to Killarney in the 1980s.

Annals aside, what is often lost in the debate is the wider reputation of the Abbey on Inisfallen to learning. Apart at all from the manuscript – much of which was written in Tipperary - Inisfallen produced several leading scholars, including an advisor to Brian Ború who studied there.

The return of the annals would be great because it might also be a symbol to mark the wider scholarly reputation of Inisfallen

The facsimile route might be a way forward – exact replicas have been produced and one might not go astray as a permanent display in Killarney House?

Meanwhile I have come across a petition on line by transition students at Killarney Community College, which seems to date to have begun nine months ago and is still live.

"Not only would the Annals of Inisfallen be an important historical source for students to study but would provide a source of tourist revenue for our town and county. This is an Irish artefact and belongs in Ireland," the petition to Dail Eireann, TDs the Bodleian and others states.

NEW ONLINE PLATFORM LAUNCHED TO **ASSIST SECOND LEVEL STUDENTS WITH ACADEMIC AND CAREER PATHS**

'Pathway', the new academic tool, aims to reduce college dropout rates, particularly STEM subjects and Access among programmes

Idi's new store on Park Road was opened yesterday, Thursday 13th January and among those present at the opening was retired Irish Rugby Captain Ciara Griffin.

Ciara was joined by local politicians for the opening including Cathaoirleach of Killarney Municipal District Marie Moloney, MEP, Sean Kelly, Deputy Danny Healy-Rae, Cllr. Niall Kelleher and Cllr. Donal Grady.

The new store in Killarney has created 7 permanent jobs in the local area. Located on Park Road, the store was officially opened today by Store Manager Patrick Lawlor. The new €8M store will replace its existing store at Ardshanavooly, a short distance away, which closed on January 10th after 14 years, ahead of the new store opening.

The new single-storey supermarket includes an off-licence as well as two smaller retail outlets, and comes after a study of shoppers living or working in Killarney by leading independent market research agency Behaviour & Attitudes revealed that 90% of shoppers agree that a bigger Aldi store would be good for Killarney.

Aldi's existing stores across Kerry are deeply involved in their local communities. Retired Ireland Rugby Captain Ciara Griffin, a native of Kerry, joined the Store Manager in opening the store today. As part of the store opening, Aldi has donated three Aldi Play Rugby kits to Scoil Bhríde Loreto National School, Muckross, Killarney. To date, the Kerry stores have donated almost 127,000 meals to local charities through FoodCloud, saving the charities more than €160,000. Each store is also part of Aldi's Community Grants network, with St Francis Special School and Youth Suicide Prevention Ireland just some of several charities that have availed of the €500 bursary grant this year.

CAO APPLICANTS SHOULD KEEP A CLOSE EYE ON THE 2022 TIMELINE



AO application season is in full swing and with 80,000 plus applicants competing for about 50,000 college places, it's vital to submit a complete application form. Stay focussed and be aware of key dates and the important tasks to be done in the weeks ahead. The 2022 CAO online application remains open until 1st Feb. Open your CAO interactive online account via "Apply" on www.cao.ie, by 20th Jan to get a discount rate of €30. After that the fee increases to €45 until the 1st Feb. The closing date for online Change of Course Choices, which is free, is also 1st Feb.

You may use the online Change of Course Choices facility, fee €10, from 4th Feb to 1st March to add any restricted courses not already listed. Restricted category applicants may also use this facility. All other applicants should use the free Change of Mind option, between 5th May and 1st July, to make any course changes. Completed online Higher Education Access Route (HEAR)/Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) forms must be submitted

CAO 2022 APPLICATION TIMELINE

20th Jan: apply by 5pm to avail of the online discount rate of €30

21st Jan: closing date to register for HPAT (Under Graduate Med.) test

30th Jan: closing date to register for MSAP (Mature Students) test

Before the end of May, you will be sent a Statement of Application Record to verify that all your information has been recorded accurately. If you find any error in the document, contact the CAO.

Course choices and preferences may be changed as often as desired, free of charge, between 5th May and 1st July. If you submit a Change of Mind, it cancels all the previous course choices, which you have submitted. The two categories (Level 8 and Level7/6) are completely separate from each other for this purpose. Any restricted application course, added for the first time via a Change of Mind won't be considered unless it shares the same assessment procedure with a course you had applied for by 1st Feb. In early July, offers of places (Round A) are issued to deferred applicants, mature applicants and to those who need to make visa arrangements. In early August, offers of places (Round Zero) are issued to certain non-standard categories of applicants such as FET/ QQI and graduate applicants. Round One, the main body of offers will be issued shortly after the Leaving Cert results.

Last year. 55,121 CAO applicants received at least one of the 82,175 courses on offer in Round One. The offers consisted of 49,358 at Level 8 (Honours Bachelor Degrees) where demand is always strong and 32,817 at Level7/6 (Ordinary Bachelor Degrees/Higher Certificates) where interest continues to decline. CAO always issues more offers than there are places available in anticipation of a level of refusal by applicants. Offers are issued independently in respect of the two lists (Level 8 and Level 7/6), so it's well worth filling in both lists. CAO will release details of the finalised 2022 offers and acceptance schedule later in the year.

School communities – including teachers and their students – are currently working to these curricular and other arrangements.

The preservation of Ireland's high quality, fair, and independent State Exams system is vital.

Unfortunately, due to the pandemic in 2020, and the absence of a

vaccination programme at that time, students could not undertake their Junior Certificate exams as normal. A significant number of these students are now in their Leaving Cert year. This means that there is no Junior Cert data from externally assessed Junior Cert exams available for these students.

Leaving Cert students are currently preparing for a variety of nonwritten examinations such as practicals and orals to take place in Spring, alongside their preparation for the written examinations in June. Speculation regarding previous one-off grading processes during the pandemic is unhelpful at this stage, particularly given that the data used for these processes is not available for all 2022 Leaving Cert students.

JANUARY IS A GOOD TIME TO CLAIM TAX RELIEF ON A RANGE OF EXPENSES – Griffin



January offers a good opportunity for Kerry people to avail of the tax reliefs to which they are entitled on expenses including medical bills and working from home, Deputy Government Chief Whip, Brendan Griffin TD has said.

Deputy Griffin said: "Managing your finances can often seem like a daunting task, but many individuals and families in Kerry can avail of number of tax breaks they may not have known they were entitled to.

"People can claim relief on the cost of health expenses, which can be yours or those of a family member. 20% tax back can be claimed on health and medical expenses and non-routine dental expenses.

"You can also claim 20% tax back on the cost of private medical insurance. Medical expenses can be claimed easily by using the myAccount facility on the Revenue website and ensuring you keep the receipts for what you are claiming.

"PAYE workers can claim e-working expenses incurred across last year. In 2021, the allowable cost was 10% of electricity and heat and 30% of broadband.

"However in line with Government policy to facilitate and support remote working, Finance Minister Paschal Donohoe announced on Budget Day that, from January 1st, an income tax deduction amounting to 30% of the cost of vouched expenses for heat, electricity and internet incurred while working from home can be claimed by taxpayers. The employee must have incurred the cost and it is the responsibility of the employee to retain proof such as receipts.

"Revenue advise that the simplest way for Kerry taxpayers to claim their e-working expenses and other tax credit entitlements is by using the myAccount facility on the Revenue website.

"Also, the Government recently approved the establishment of the Electricity Costs Emergency Benefit Scheme under which a payment of €100 will be made to each domestic electricity customer.

"This is one of a range of measures to mitigate the effects of the unprecedented rise in electricity prices on householders. The scheme is currently being finalised, but it will be automatic and will apply to all customers.

"Tax relief of 20% can also be claimed on third level tuition fees, as well as housing tax reliefs for home renovations and renting a room.

"The start of the year is a good opportunity for people to organise their financial affairs and also to shop around to see if they can secure better offers by switching providers on a range of services.

"It's definitely worth sitting down and taking the time to claim for certain expenses as it can result in hundreds of euro back in your pocket," Deputy Griffin concluded.

Minister for Health announces

updates to public health management of COVID-19 cases and close



Following advice from the Chief Medical Officer, and, in light of the latest available evidence and international experience relating to COVID-19, the Minister for Health, Stephen Donnelly TD, has announced changes to Ireland's self-isolation and restriction of movement rules following a Government meeting on Wednesday, a day that saw the 10 millionth dose of COVID-19 vaccine administered.

The changes relate to the public health management of COVID-19.

Given the high levels of infection across the country, it is particularly important that cases and close contacts continue to follow the public health advice issued to the general population. For a period of 10 days (including the 7 days self-isolation or restricted movements) all cases and close contacts are advised to:

LIMIT close contact with other people outside their household, especially

in crowded, enclosed or poorly ventilated spaces

WEAR an appropriate face mask/face covering in crowded, enclosed or poorly ventilated spaces and where they are in close contact with other people

TAKE an antigen test before entering crowded, enclosed or poorly ventilated spaces and prior to having close contact with other people from outside their household **AVOID** contact with anyone who is at higher risk of severe illness if infected with COVID-19

work from home unless it is essential to attend in person **FOLLOW** all public health protective measures

The period of restricted movements for close contacts applies from date of last contact with positive case if known or, if not, from date of notification as a contact. Close contacts of any age who have recovered following COVID-19 detected by a PCR or antigen test carried out since 1st December 2021 are not required to restrict movements or test if asymptomatic. If they become symptomatic, they should immediately self-isolate, get tested and wear a mask as appropriate.

Cabinet have decided that these updates will come into effect from today, Friday 14 January. The Department of Health and the HSE will now work to operationalise same.

Meanwhile, a pop up COVID Testing Centre was opened HSE in Killarney on Wednesday 12th January. It offered people who are the longest waiters on the list an offer of an appointment.

The venue at St Mary's Parish Hall was opened due to the extraordinary and unprecedented demand for this service experienced over the past week or so, far outstripped the capacity of the test centre in Tralee which is usually in a position to offer swabbing service within 24 hrs of demand. "With the huge efforts of staff and the deployment of antigen testing to those under 40 in certain circumstances, the waiting list is reducing significantly daily and we would hope to return to a more timely offer of service over the coming days. This pop up centre will assist the local service in Kerry to do so", a notice from the HSE said.

Driving and vision

It is important that you can see clearly to be able to drive safely. Conditions that may affect your visual field and driving include strokes and brain turnours, as well as eye conditions such as diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma (if you have them in both eyes).

Make sure you have regular sight tests and if your optometrist tells you that you must not drive, you must stop all driving immediately. Driving when you are medically unfit to do so is a criminal offence, and you may be prosecuted if you are involved in an accident.

Driving glasses

If you have been advised to wear glasses for driving, make sure you wear them, even for short trips – and keep a spare pair in the car. Choose glasses with thinner sides for driving as they won't block your side vision as much as thicker ones. If you wear contact lenses, keep a pair of glasses in the car in case you need to take your lenses out. Even if you don't need to wear glasses all the time, you will probably find they are particularly helpful when the lighting is poor, and for driving at night.

Headlights of oncoming traffic can

be dazzling when you are driving at night or in poor weather conditions. Special driving lenses designed with a specially-developed glare filter and a contrast-enhancing filter can help reduce reflections and uncomfortable glare from oncoming traffic.

If glare is an ongoing problem for you, make sure your windscreen and headlights are thoroughly cleaned and free from grime and dirt. If you wear glasses, and don't forget to keep them clean too. If you find that problems with glare at night persist, make an appointment to have a sight test.

Sunshine can be dazzling too, particularly when the sun is low in the sky. If you wear glasses, you may find it helpful to have a pair of prescription sunglasses in the car, or to wear clip-on sunglasses over your prescription glasses. Polarised sunglasses are great for driving in bright conditions. Polarised lenses are lenses with a special built in filter to reduce glare and improve vision in bright conditions







GARVEY'S TRALEE WARRIORS 79 DBS ÉANNA 70

Garvey's Tralee Warriors will take on C&S Neptune in the InsureMyHouse.ie Pat Duffy National Cup final after they overcame the challenge of DBS Éanna in the semi-final at Neptune Stadium on Saturday evening. The outstanding Quigley then found the time to plant his feet to hit a huge three following an Éanna turnover and then stepped his way to the board to see the Warriors take a four-point 58-54 advantage into the final quarter.

Quigley continued his rich vein of form early in the fourth but Éanna embarked on a game changing run sparked by a Dolenko steal and lay-up to take the initiative back. Dolenko was on the mark again before Reynolds fired in a three from the corner and suddenly Éanna led 65-60 with five minutes left in the contest. 





KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

GIFT VOUCHERS

Many people give and receive gift vouchers at Christmas. There are many benefits to gift vouchers but there are also some risks. You may lose the voucher, it may expire before you can use it or you may not be able to spend the balance on a gift voucher. It is important that you know the conditions and rules that apply before you buy a gift voucher.

What are the current rules that apply to Gift Vouchers?

Since 2 December 2019, the Consumer Protection (Gift Vouchers) Act 2019 sets out new rules for gift vouchers. These include the following: • Gift vouchers must have no expiry date or be valid for at least 5 years from the date the gift voucher is issued. You must be given details of the expiry date in a durable format (for example, on paper or by email) at the time you buy the gift voucher.

Traders cannot specify that a gift voucher is spent in one transaction.
 Traders cannot charge a fee to change the name on a gift voucher, (if you have to register a name on the voucher).

• If the balance remaining on a gift voucher is more than €1 after you buy something with it, a trader must reimburse the balance to you. They can give you cash, make an electronic transfer or give you another gift voucher.

Do these rules apply to gift vouchers purchased before 2nd December 2019?

The legislation does not apply to gift vouchers bought before 2 December 2019. Some traders may be flexible. If your voucher has expired, you should contact the trader to see if they will extend it. However, if you bought the gift voucher before 2 December 2019, they have no legal obligation to do this and some may charge a fee.

What are my rights if I lose a voucher?

Gift vouchers are like cash, so if you lose them, the company does not have to replace them. If a voucher was made out to you specifically and is not transferable to anyone else, you may be able to get a replacement. This depends on the gift voucher's terms and conditions and the company's policy. If you lose a gift card, you may be able to get a replacement card but you need to check with the retailer. You could be charged a fee for the replacement card.

What happens if the shop goes out of business?

If a trader goes out of business before you use the voucher, you may have difficulty getting your money back.

Usually the trader will owe money to several people so your claim is just one of many. There are rules for the priority to be given to the various debts owed in the case of the business going into liquidation or receivership. Generally, you will be low in the order of priority.

Generally, you will be low in the order of priority. You will need to make a claim in writing to the appointed administrator or liquidator (if applicable) providing proof of your voucher. However, it is unlikely that your voucher will be honoured. If a new owner takes over, they do not have to honour your voucher. For this reason, you should buy gift vouchers using a credit or debit card,

INSOMNIA

Sleep is as important to us as air, water and food. Anyone can suffer from insomnia, which can be frustrating, exhausting and depressing, affecting both our mental and physical health.

Different types of Insomnia:

 Transient insomnia – which lasts for a short time period only, typically this can be associated with a stressful event e.g. an exam, a bereavement.

Chronic insomnia - lasting for several weeks, months or sometimes years

Signs of insomnia?

Difficulty falling asleep - common in young people

 Being a restless and light sleeper - waking often, lying awake in the middle of the night. In younger people it may be associated with depression.

Waking early and being unable to get back to sleep.

Symptoms:

Feeling tired during the day, headaches, feeling irritable or finding it hard to concentrate. Here are some typical causes of insomnia:

 states of mind - anxiety, depression, anger, grief, preoccupation with a future event e.g. a child's leaving certificate exams, anxiety and worries about the pandemic

- · Change moving house, new job, end of relationship....
- Environment noise, jet lag...
- Pain

Medical conditions - heart, breathing, stomach, digestive, high blood pressure, arthritis, anorexia.

Recreational drugs (e.g. hard drugs like LSD) –but this also includes nicotine, caffeine.

Other prescription drugs - including some contraceptives, diuretics, slimming pills, beta-blockers, stimulants.

Suggestions: Consider...

Your Environment: You need a comfortable bed and a room that's quiet, not too cold or too warm and dark enough.

Your Lifestyle: Cut down on all stimulants. These include: coffee and tea, alcohol, nicotine, fizzy drinks, food additives, 'junk food', slimming pills or appetite suppressants. Try to avoid heavy, rich foods within two hours of bed. Get regular exercise. Aim for 30 minutes or more of daily activity, but not too close to bedtime. Avoid stimulating activity and stressful situations before bedtime. This includes vigorous exercise, big discussions or arguments, or catching up on work. Turn off screens one hour before bedtime. The light emitted from TV, tablets, smartphones, and computers suppresses your body's production of melatonin and can severely disrupt your sleep. Instead of using technology try listening to a book on tape, a podcast, or reading by a soft light.

Seek Professional Help

If you are still having trouble getting the sleep you need, a doctor or counsellor may be able to help. Seek professional help for insomnia if:

- Your insomnia doesn't respond to self-help as mentioned above.
- Your insomnia is causing major problems at home, work, or school
 You're experiencing symptoms like chest pain or shortness of breath, (contact you General Practitioner immediately).
- Your insomnia occurs almost every night and is getting worse




The Anniversary Mass for Dymphna will take place in St. Mary's Cathedral on Saturday 15th January at 6.15pm.



Welcome back dear student, I pray and believe that as you study God's Word and obey it by putting it into practice, this coming year will be a turning point in your life. When an explorer begins an expedition their compass is a most valuable instrument, pointing them in the right direction; and that compass is a key to survival, saving many from disaster. Last week we saw that each new year, even every new day, is a fresh opportunity for us to set sail on our faith journey, and seek out God's plan for our future (Jeremiah 29:11-14; Lamentations 3:22-25).

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus reveals a vital spiritual compass. He gave instructions that we are to 'have God's kind of faith' so, we must ask - of what does God's faith comprise? Here we see three components.... (1) Speaking forth His truth, making faith proclamations with the mouth, (2) believing that truth with the heart, and, (3) obeying that truth by walking in it - always in mercy and love. Jesus gave us these amazing keys in the following passage. "Have faith in God (constantly walking in God's kind of faith). Truly I tell you, whoever (1) - says to this mountain, 'be lifted up and thrown into the sea' and (2) - does not doubt at all in his heart, but believes that what he says will take place, it will be done for him. For this reason I am telling you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe (trust and be confident) that it is granted to you, and you will get it. And (3) - whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him and let it drop (leave it, let it go), in order that your Father Who is in heaven may also forgive you your own failings and shortcomings, and let them drop. But, if you do not forgive, neither will your Father in heaven forgive your failings and shortcomings" (Mark 11:22-25 Amplified Bible) God's faith works in the way that Jesus demonstrated, by putting it into practice. No lost explorer will know where they are, or find their way unless they take out their compass and navigation tools and use them. It is exactly the same for us dear friend. Many people are enduring difficult circumstances, struggling with sickness, fear and despair, and living in brokenness and defeat because they have never been taught the truth of His Word and thus have never understood the tools that God has given them to find their way out to the victory that Jesus paid for with His blood at the Cross. Sincere Christians have prayed and faithfully trusted God, but have not seen answers to their prayers. It is said that the definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over expecting different results. If something is not working it's time to change it! 
