The South Kerry Branch of MS have released the following statement with regard to their fundraising. They have decided to do this to let people know exactly where their funding is spent and how they help people in the community who are suffering from M.S.

Our Branch caters for the needs of 89 members with MS in the South Kerry area i.e. Killarney, Kenmare, Lauragh, Milltown, Castlemaine, Killorglin, Rathmore, Gneeveguilla, Farranfore, Scartaglin, Sneem, Waterville & Caherciveen. Our Annual Old Kenmare Road Walk & Annual Busking are our main sources of fundraising. We raise funds for:

- 1. Day to day needs of our members.
- 2. In early 2013 at considerable cost we converted/renovated a section of Kerry Cheshire as a therapy centre. This is being held at an annual rent. We provide physiotherapy, reflexology, counselling, reiki etc both in the

members home or in this centre, whichever is more convenient for the person.

- 3. We supply necessary aids and appliances and subsidise home helps and any other needs not met by social services.
- 4. We also help financially and engage professionals to assist with necessary modifications and renovations of living accommodation. As the renovation grants have been cut drastically, we help fill the shortfall. We help with adaption of vehicles to meet the needs of our members as disabled drivers/passengers.
- 5. We give financial assistance with mortgages, fuel, insurance or any emergency that may arise when there is no other agency available to give assistance. We realise that financial stress is to be avoided if a relapse is to be prevented. All decisions are made in strictest confidence by our Welfare Committee in conjunction with our

Community Worker.

6. We take members to Lourdes on what we call a healing holiday giving them a prayerful and happy break and at the same time giving their family and carers a much needed break. This is possibly the only holiday they may have the opportunity to get.

7. We contribute annually to ongoing research into the cause of M.S. thereby hoping to find

All the members of South Kerry Branch give their services totally on a voluntary basis. No one receives any payment. The only money expended on administration of the branch are the usual petty cash day to day expenditure eg postage, telephones etc. Our accounts are audited twice yearly.

However since funding from HSE has been cut dramatically we make an annual contribution to MS Ireland to cover regional services eg community workers, insurance, newly diagnosed weekends etc.

We have written confirmation from the CEO of MS Ireland that there are no top ups to her or any of her staff's salaries. All salaries and accounts are available on the website

INVESTMENTS

Interest rates for deposits in banks and building societies are very low at the moment and have not been this low in a long time. Another problem for people looking for good interest rates is that as well as interest rates being low is that DIRT tax is 41% and form the 1st January 2014 a PRSI levy of 4%can also be applied. The effective tax rate on interest earned on savings can be as high as 45% as both the new higher rate of Deposit Interest Retention Tax (DIRT) tax and the PRSI levy on unearned income have both come into force since Jan 1. If you invested €20000 over 12 months at 2.50%, taking into account DIRT tax and the levy you may only get €275 after DIRT tax and the PRSI levy. Because these returns are so poor people are looking for alternative investments. Thankfully there are other investment options available to you. Investment providers have introduced many different types of products because of the very low returns on deposit type accounts and it is very important that people know about all these products before deciding on what products suit them best. Know Your Rights: APPLYING FOR A DRIVING LICENCE

OUESTION

I heard that you no longer apply to the motor tax office for your driving licence. Where do you apply?

ANSWER

Since October 2013, you have to apply to the National Driver Licence Service (NDLS) when applying for a driving licence or learner permit. The NDLS has a network of centres throughout the State.

The first time you apply to the NDLS (whether it is a new application or a renewal) you must attend in person at an NDLS centre to have your photograph taken and your identity verified. Your signature will also be digitally captured.

As well as the completed application form, the fee and any other required documentation, you will need to bring documents with you that confirm you are the person who is applying for the driving licence or learner permit. If you currently have an Irish driving licence or learner permit, you will need to bring the licence or permit and evidence of your PPS Number. If you do not have an Irish driving licence or learner permit, you will need to bring photographic ID, proof of your residency entitlement, evidence of your PPS Number and proof of address.

Your new licence or permit will be posted to you.

The next time you apply you will not have to visit an NDLS centre as your identity will already have been verified. You can choose either to continue to use the photograph taken in an NDLS centre previously (if this is less than 5 years old), or submit 2 new passport-style photographs that meet the required standards.

Application forms for driving licences and learner permits are available from NDLS centres, driving test centres, driving theory test centres and Garda stations. They can also be downloaded from ndls.ie.






AIB ALL IRELAND SENIOR CLUB SEMI FINAL PREVIEW

WILL IT BE THIRD TIME LUCKY FOR DR CROKES? By: Colm Kelly.

Dr Crokes of Killarney face into their third consecutive AIB All Ireland Senior Club Semi Final when they face Connacht champions, Castlebar Mitchels, in O'Moore Park, Portlaoise on Next Saturday and, having lost at this stage of the competition for the last two years, a victory is the only thing on their minds.

In Kerry Dr Crokes are something of a phenomenon. They have been the kingpins of football in their home county in recent years having won the County Senior Football Championship for the last four years and further, their victories over their opponents in the finals (Austin Stacks, twice, Mid Kerry and Dingle) have all been by comfortable margins. They have been the Munster Club champions for the last three years so the only thing missing from the trophy cabinet to complete this great period in the club's history is the AIB Trophy.

They have gone into their last two All Ireland Club semi-finals as favourites but have ended up at the wrong end of two fairly tight results. In 2012 against the mighty Crossmaglen they looked to have the game won after a twenty minute opening spell when they blitzed the then reigning champions but the concession of some soft scores in the minutes before half time allowed the Ulster champions back into the game and they subsequently grabbed the initiative in the second half. Last year in Thurles

the Dublin and Leinster Champions, Ballymun-Kickhams, were the opposition. Ballymun arrived with a game plan with a strong midfield coupled with a powerful attacking half back line putting serious pressure on the Crokes from the throw-in. The much vaunted Crokes attack was well held but it was a testament to Crokes durability that they still came up just a few points short at the final whistle.

The opposition on Saturday are the Mayo and Connacht champions, Castlebar Mitchels. They have come through a tough campaign with a narrow victory over Corofin of Galway followed by victory over the reigning All Ireland Club champions, St Brigid's of Roscommon, after extra time, in the Connacht final. They are managed by the vastly experienced former Mavo footballer, Pat Holmes and in midfielder Barry Moran and utility player Richie Feeney they have two current Mayo stars. They are strong at midfield and in Tom King, Danny Kirby and Neil Douglas they have free scoring forwards who will need to be closely marked. On their way to this semi-final Dr Crokes had a relatively comfortable win over Cork Champions, Castlehaven (for the second year in a row) but were lucky to escape with a one point victory over Clare Champions, Cratloe, in the Munster Final. In that match Crokes looked to be coasting to victory by half time having established a seven point lead but suddenly found themselves on the back foot as Cratloe found a new gear in the second half. It was to Crokes credit that they held their nerve to just get over the line in the end.

At the time of going to print the Dr Crokes team line up for Saturday had still not been finalised but veteran goalkeeper, David Moloney, will be the corner stone of the defence and he will be well supported by Fionn Fitzgerald, Eoin Brosnan and Kieran Ward. Ambrose O'Donovan and Johnny Buckley will be expected to start in midfield and in attack Crokes appear to be spoiled for choice with a plethora of accomplished forwards to pick from. Nevertheless one would expect that Alan O'Sullivan, Daithi Casey, Brian Looney, Kieran O'Leary and Colm Cooper have all nailed their starting places.

Whether Dr Crokes like it or not they will go into this game as favourites but they have just got to build a bridge over this unwanted tag and go out and get the result. There are no worries about their defence but they have got to get on top in midfield and the much vaunted attack has to perform to their true potential. Only then will the Final appearance be secured and the opportunity to emulate the All Ireland winning side of 1992.

Throw in on Saturday is 3.00pm.

LACK OF PROPER BROADBAND IN KILLARNEY ELECTORAL AREA

I am calling for the urgent upgrading of Broadband service delivery to the Killarney

electoral area as every day people are informing me, that they cannot get a proper high speed broadband service all across the constituency. This is an unacceptable situation in 2014 as many families try to do an amount of work and business on line and it is seriously affecting people working from home and small family businesses. The lack of proper broadband is also having a negative impact and hindering businesses setting up in rural Kerry. This is a serious problem in area's of Fossa, Aghadoe, Listry, Faha, Ballyhar, Currow, Kilcummin, Rathmore, Headford, Barraduff and also other

At this months Council meeting I will be proposing that all Broadband providers operating in Kerry be requested to attend a meeting of Kerry County Council to highlight the problems people are facing in rural area's with the lack of proper broadband.

KERRY COUNTY COUNCIL NOTICES OF MOTION

Cllr Danny Healy Rae put forward the following notice of motion at the Killarney Area Meeting

- 1. He asked Kerry Airport and Ryanair to facilitate German visitors with flights into and
- 2. He asked KCC what progress has been made with the provision of a playground in Firies, KCC are pursuing this matter in accordance with the opportunities which resolution of planning and bond matters in Greenfields estate may present as well as looking at other site opportunities in the area.
- 3. Cllr. Healy Rae asked the housing department if any adjustments can be made to enhance parking in St. Stephens Park, Castleisland, he was promised that the roads department of KCC will investigate the matter.
- 4. He asked that the members of KCC write to the Minister regarding the unfairness in the system, where housing applicants cannot be considered for the RAS if they haven't been on rent allowance for 18 months first, he also asked the housing section to seek funding to build on council owned lands in Killarney and Rathmore now that these lands are back in the ownership of the council.
- 5. Cllr Healy Rae asked KCC to examine Droumcarbin Bridge on the regional road to carry out urgently the necessary repairs, also to control surface water at Headford Railway Bridge as the drain under this bridge was filled in, the water is going down the side road into the properties, he asked KCC to resurface properly the section of road from Coolcaslagh to upper Lissivigeen Road where recent pipe laying took

place, KCC intend to carry out a permanent restoration of the surface water trench on the L3011 - Coolcaslagh to Upper Lissivigeen in late March, he asked KCC to resurface the road from Shinnagh Cross to Cloonts Crosas and to examine the possibility of increasing site distance as you come from Lisheen side, he is glad that due to previous representations there is €108.000 available for these works under the restoration improvement programme to carry out resurfacing works on the L2032 from Shinnagh Crooss to Cloonts Cross,

He also put forward a motion asking KCC and Killarney Town Council to provide access from high street to lower new street to help sustain and revitalise business in Lower New Street, Killarnev.

At the February 2014 Killarney Area Meeting of Kerry County Council Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that Kerry County Council would with all due haste upgrade the surface of the road from the N.22 (Killarney to Tralee road) to Kilcummin Village as parts of it are in a deplorable state.

Kerry County Council replied that it is scheduled to spend €94,500 for resurfacing the road from the N.22 to Coolcorcoran Cross during 2015 and that €156,000 is to be spent on the road through Kilcummin village in 2016. This programme of works for the L3018 was determined when it was assumed that the Kilcummin Sewerage Scheme would be connecting to Killarney Public Sewer. Despite the fact that the plans for the Sewer have now changed the agreed 2013 to 2016 roads programme must remain in place.

Councillor Gleeson expressed disappointment that plans for the Sewer have been altered and asked that every possible effort would be made to ensure that the poor sections of road are maintained to as good a standard as possible."

TARDENING



with John O'Sulliva

Between now and the Summer there is still plenty of time to put a bit of colour in the garden with some Winter/Spring flowering bedding plants.

It is probably best this Spring, to use them in containers and baskets as the ground is saturated from the amount of rainfall we are experiencing. The first thing you have to do is choose the type of container you want. There are lots to choose from for example, terracotta, glazed, plastic and wooden.

Now that you have chosen a pot, the most important thing to do is sort out the drainage. All terracotta and glazed pots should already have drainage holes in them. Plastic ones probably won't, so you will have to punch some holes in them. Put some gravel or broken up aeroboard over the holes on the inside of the pot and then cover with some landscape fabric like mypex.

Add some compost and ideally some slow release fertilizer mixed with it. Then choose some plants... First of all you need to choose a centre piece and always make sure that centre piece is evergreen and suitable for the size of your container. This way you will only have to change the bedding plants from season to season.

The following is a list of a few good Winter Spring bedding plants for containers: primroses, polyanthus, winter pansies, cyclamen, ornamental cabbages and trailing ivy.

Next week I will focus on early flowering shrubs.



Add the mushrooms, tomato and cheese to the egg mixture with a


pinch of salt and pepper.

ECO-DRIVING

How to get the most out of the fuel you buy

Car choice plays a big part in the extent to which your motoring affects the environment, but whatever car you've got there's a number of simple things you can do to reduce energy use (fuel consumption), CO2 emissions and pollution.

These eco-driving tips are the motoring equivalent of insulating the hot water tank, fitting low energy bulbs and not leaving the tv on standby – simple, common sense tips that really will make a difference. You'll save money on your fuel bills too.

Maintenance

Regular Servicing - Get the car serviced regularly (according to the manufacturer's schedule) to maintain engine efficiency.

Engine oil - Make sure you use the correct specification of engine oil (refer to the handbook)

Tyre pressures - Check tyre pres-

sures regularly and before long journeys. Under-inflated tyres create more rolling resistance and so use more fuel. Getting tyre pressures right is important for safety too. Refer to the handbook as pressures will normally have to be increased for heavier loads.

Before you go

Lose weight - Extra weight means extra fuel so if there's stuff in the boot you don't need on the journey take it out and leave it at home.

Streamline – Roof racks/boxes create extra wind resistance and so increase fuel consumption. If you don't need it take it off, if you do, pack carefully to reduce the extra drag.

Don't get lost - Plan unfamiliar journeys to reduce the chance of getting lost - try the AA Route planner or consider a 'Sat Nav' if you regularly drive unfamiliar routes. Check the traffic news before you go too.

Combine short trips – Cold starts are inefficient so it pays to combine errands such as buying the paper, dropping-off the recycling, or collecting the kids into one trip rather than



making multiple short trips.

Consider alternatives - If it's a short journey (a couple of miles or so) consider walking or cycling rather than taking the car – fuel consumption is worse when the engine's cold and pollution will be greater too until the emissions control system gets up to normal temperature.





ST VALENTINES DAY

The February 14th feast actually commemorated two Valentines: the first a beloved Christian priest rounded up in Claudius the Goth's persecution (269 A.D.) and beheaded outside Rome; the other a bishop of Terni, about 60 miles from Rome, beheaded in another purge a few years later. Legends attribute affectionate letters from prison to both Valentines.

The day was first associated with romantic love in the circle of Geoffrey Chaucer in the High Middle Ages, when the tradition of courtly love flourished. In 18th-century England, it evolved into an occasion in which lovers expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards (known as "valentines"). Valentine's Day symbols that are used today include the heart-shaped outline, doves, and the figure of the winged Cupid. Since the 19th century, handwritten valentines have given way to mass-produced greeting cards.

Valentine's Day still remains connected with various regional customs in England. In Norfolk for instance, a character called 'Jack' Valentine used knock on the rear door of houses leaving sweets and presents for children. In parts of Sussex it was known as the Birds' Wedding Day.

In Slovenia, Saint Valentine was one of the saints of spring, the saint of good health and the patron of beekeepers and pilgrims. A proverb says that "Saint Valentine brings the keys of roots". Plants and flowers start to grow on this day. It has been celebrated as the day when the first work in the vineyards and in the fields commences. It is also said that birds propose to each other on that day.

WELL DONE TO CAROLINE KENNEDY

A few weeks ago Killarney Outlook was brave enough to publish a tweet from Caroline Kennedy in relation to the slaughter of Dolphins in Taiji, Japan.

Caroline Kennedy's Tweet sparked global outrage over the 'Cove' slaughter and for the first time, a Japanese newspaper has denounced the slaughter, a move that has heartened activists and put the Japanese government on notice that the tides may be changing within the country.

The Japan Times, the country's oldest and largest Englishlanguage newspaper, ran an editorial that stated, simply, "The dolphin hunt is an inhumane practice that should be stopped."

The editorial breathed new life into the controversy over the Taiji slaughter, in which roughly 900 dolphins are killed annually in the tiny fishing village, and it led activists to declare a small but significant victory.

The Japan Times editorial pulls no punches. "The slaughter is not for the faint of heart. Despite claims of humane killing methods, a video shows the fishermen hacking into the heads and backs of the panicked dolphins."

Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe has defended the slaughter, and Chief Cabinet Secretary Yoshihide Suga recently told reporters that dolphin "fishing" is "traditional" and "carried out appropriately in accordance with the law."

Animal activists challenge such assertions.

"Their argument that the force of tradition justifies the herding, capturing, and slaughtering of dolphins is a flimsy one," The Japan Times stated, adding that the drive didn't become a largescale industry until 1969, "so its roots are guite shallow."

This is a major victory for everyone who signed a petition to stop the slaughter and for every magazine and newspaper that published Caroline Kennedy's tweet, bad publicity hurts and as a result of 'The Japan Times' editorial more and more Japanese people will become aware of the cruelty involved and the bad press Japan is getting all over the world.

DO YOU LIKE WESTERNS?

If you ever read a Western or watched "Cowboy Movies" you will know that the "Indians" were always portrayed as the bad guys and the writers even forgot to mention that "Indians" learned scalping from the 'white man'.

Women of the Lakota Sioux living on Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota can expect to live 52 years; men typically live 48. These simple numbers bear witness to the story of a people living in some of the most desperate circumstances on the North American continent.

These appalling living conditions manifest themselves everywhere at Pine Ridge. Many are homeless; those lucky to have homes more often than not live in structures that are infested with black mold and lack plumbing and electricity. Unemployment and high school dropout rates are off the charts compared to U.S. national averages. Lakota Sioux residents of Pine Ridge also experience epidemic levels of tuberculosis, obesity, heart disease, and diabetes and rampant alcoholism, gang culture, and poverty.

These conditions did not arise by themselves. The history of relations between the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Lakota Sioux is littered with broken treaties and violated human rights. The U.S. government has displayed a persistent pattern of inhumane, even genocidal treatment

of the Lakota Sioux and other indigenous groups. We need look no further than the Wounded Knee Massacre of 1890, which was perpetrated at Pine Ridge, to discover the reality of this history and the connection between that history and the Lakota's suffering today.

Yes, the most monstrous of the atrocities occurred many decades ago but the treaties are still being violated. The Bureau of Indian Affairs has failed to honour the 1868 Fort Laramie Treaty to return land to the Lakota Sioux, or to return the spoils of that land to the Lakota to help alleviate their suffering.

WHY WAS CHARLES **DICKENS DYING** WISH IGNORED ESPECIALLY HIS DECENDANTS?

Charles Dickens stipulated that when he died there should be no memorial to his life, save his writings. However, his home city of Portsmouth has now erected a statue to the celebrated author.

"I conjure to my friends on no account to make me the subject of any monument, memorial or testimonial whatsoever. I rest my claims to the remembrance of my country upon my published

Those were the words of Charles Dickens' will as he stipulated his wishes for his funeral in 1870. And for 144 years there has not been a statue of him in his homeland as his wish was honoured. But on what would have been the author's 202nd birthday, a bronze statue of him has been unveiled in Portsmouth, the city in which he was born.

More than 40 of his descendants were at the ceremony and many helped to meet the £140,000 cost.

Mr. Dickens had also stated in his will that he be buried in an inexpensive, unostentatious and strictly private manner, that no public announcement be made of the time or place of his burial and that those "who attend my funeral wear no scarf, black bow, long hat band or other such revolting absurdity. I direct that my name be inscribed in plain English letters on my tomb without the addition of Mr or Esq.

A great-great grandson of Charles Dickens has revealed that he was buried in Westminster Abbey.

LITTERING IN THE PARK

Despite there being several notices at park gates and regular articles highlighting the dangers of throwing rubbish in the countryside, some people still ignorantly throw out the trash without realizing the deadly consequences it has to wildlife.

So for those of you who are guilty of this behaviour, thinking it is ok to do so because "its only a bottle cap or just a plastic bag", this story is for you!

A wildlife photographer on a recent trip to Tsavo East, on what seemed like a perfectly rewarding day photographing a Cheetah and her Cub that he had been monitoring for 6 months (Malkia and Binti) discovered the day almost turned into tragedy for this beautiful endangered animal.

The Cheetah Cub found a discarded canvas bag hidden in the grass while walking with mom and curiously picked it up.

Excited with its new find, the bag quickly became a play toy and after having its share of fun for about ten minutes, when the time came to move on and let go of the bag, the strings became caught in its teeth.

In a desperate attempt to shake the bag loose, the canvas bag got tangled around the cubs throat turning the situation critical. As social beings, we are hard wired to connect and most of us feel the need for rewarding social contact and relationships. Loneliness is the feeling we get when our need for this type of contact is not met. Loneliness of course is not the same as being alone. We may choose to be alone and live very happy lives without much contact with others. Or indeed we may have much social contact, be constantly surrounded by people, and yet feel very lonely. Loneliness can have a significant impact on our mental health and can contribute to mental health problems, such as anxiety and depression. Loneliness can have many different causes and affects people in different ways. Some people feel lonely due to their personal circumstances (e.g moving to a new area, loss or bereavement). For others however, loneliness can be a deeper more constant feeling that comes from within.

Connecting with the World around us can be a great way to combat loneliness. This may be having a small conversation with the cashier when we pay for our groceries or saying hello to someone we meet in the street. Phoning or sending an email to family and friends can be a good reminder that we do have people in our lives.

Our brain can try to make sense of the feeling of loneliness by telling us things such as 'It is because nobody loves me' or 'There is something wrong with me' These thoughts are not facts - and can make us feel worse. Thus it is important to accept how we are feeling without overreacting. When we feel lonely, the tendency might be to withdraw into ourselves and this can be counterproductive. The healthiest thing to do if we are feeling lonely is to reach out and cultivate friendships. Reaching out can be difficult and at times we will resist it. However, think of it in the way you might approach exercising - whilst we may feel tired or lazy it is a beneficial thing to do.

We need to tackle loneliness one step at a time. It may involve finding a new hobby or joining a club or exercise class. Another skillful way to combat feelings of loneliness is to volunteer as it's a great way to meet new people and also to learn new skills.

Loneliness is a profoundly human emotion and a signal that our need for connection is going unmet. Next week we will discuss loneliness in Older Adults and explore ways we can tackle this.

MANAGING FOOD THAT SHOULD **BETREATS**

Treat food are foods high in sugar, fat and salt.

TIPS

- Cut down on treat foods, but don't ban them. Banning them makes them more appealing.
- Shopping is a danger time just buy treats sometimes and don't have a supply at home. If they're not in the house, they can't be eaten.
- Keep the sweets cupboard or cookie jar out of sight and out of mind.
- Tell family and friends you're making changes so they know about the new routine.
- When you have sugary foods, eat them with a meal. It's better for their teeth and means they won't fill up on treats between meals
- 6. Say the kitchen is closed when mealtimes are over, but allow them access to healthy snacks such as fruit, chopped vegetables and water and then send them off to play.
- 7. In the long run, it's kinder to say no – don't be afraid to say it!
- Praise them and offer non-food treats, like a game of football, a trip to the playground or disco-dancing at home.
- Limit the amount of treats by:
 - Getting into the habit of having them every second day or less
 - Keeping portions small choose mini or snack versions
 - Offering healthy alternatives, such as water instead of sugary drinks or juice and fruit instead of sweets or chocolate.
- Keep treats exactly that treats! Not every day and not always food!
