



DOIREANN IS KILLARNEY ROTARY YOUNG MUSICIAN OF THE YEAR

Talented young Tralee pianist Doireann O'Carroll was announced as the overall winner of the Killarney Rotary Young Musician of the Year Competition at the weekend.

The 14th Young Musician of the Year competition took place last Friday and Saturday, with some 200 students taking part at the Kerry Diocesan Youth Service centre, Fair Hill, Killarney. The INEC Acoustic Club was the venue for the finals-night concert on Saturday night. Doireann, who is a student at Kerry School of Music of international award-winning concert pianist Mantautas Katinas, performed Sergei Rachmaninoff's Prelude in C sharp minor. She was one of six finalists from Killarney, Tralee and Miltown, the others being Oisin Treacy, Louise Sullivan, Charlotte O'Halloran, Emily Sullivan and Mikaela O'Sullivan.

The Gleneagle Concert Band performed at the event, which had Liz Ryan as compere, and the six finalists also stunned the audience with their performances.

Killarney Rotary president Paul Sherry said: "The objective of the competition is

to create a forum for school going musicians of all standards to perform in public in their chosen discipline and we were delighted with the competition and concert, which was very enjoyable and had a great turnout."

A raffle in aid of the Kerry Diocesan Youth Service, a charity supporting the young people of Kerry since 1971, took place at the interval.

GAA GAME OF THE WEEK

KERRY BLITZ STUNS TYRONE INTO SUBMISSION

KERRY 3-15 TYRONE 0-9

After three consecutive defeats, Kerry finally gained a much-needed and morale-boosting victory when they produced a stunning second half performance to see off a shell-shocked Tyrone at Killarney's Fitzgerald Stadium last Sunday.

In dull, dreary and damp conditions, and before a crowd of 5,549, the first-half was a totally different affair to the second, as Tyrone matched Kerry for long stages and indeed, caused some anxious moments for the home supporters with one or two incisions deep into the Kingdom defence.

Eamonn Fitzmaurice's side upped the ante in a major way on the restart, and with some precision moves, sterling work at midfield from Man of the Match David Moran and solid defending from Paul Murphy, Mark Griffin, Peter Crowley, Fionn Fitzgerald, Marc O'Se and sub Pa Kilkenny who replaced Shane Enright late in the first half, the Kingdom recorded their biggest ever win over Tyrone, in 19 league outings, outscoring the Northerners 3-7 to 0-1 in that storming second-half period.

This was definitely the James O'Donoghue show. The Killarney Legion man had an outstanding game, and finished with a personal haul of 3-3, bringing his haul in Kerry's four games in the league to date this season to 4-10. Of the substitutes Kerry used, it was great to see Darran O'Sullivan back at his brilliant best, while O'Sullivan's Glenbeigh/Glencar clubmate Pa Kilkenny acquitted himself very well.

Paul Geaney, who personally had a very difficult week following the untimely death of his mother Chistine, and Kieran O'Leary were impressive, while Johnny Buckley, who was introduced late in the game, upped his game considerably.

Tyrone were more than a match for their rivals in that opening half and driven on by defender Peter Harte who asked plenty of questions of Donnchadh Walsh, and the long-range place kicking of goalkeeper Niall Morgan, Tyrone retired at the interval on level terms, and must have been quietly confident of recording another win on Kerry soil.

Veteran manager Mickey Harte afterwards admitted that this was their worst ever league performance. Bryan Sheehan, who made a welcome return from injury, made a major contribution, amassing five points which proved crucial to Kerry's cause as the sides retired on level terms at the break, 0-8 apiece.

Kerry themselves created two goal chances in that first-half, firstly when Tyrone keeper Niall Morgan got down to deny Peter Crowley in the opening minutes after hat-trick hero James O'Donoghue's quick vision set him up with the chance.

Then in the fifth minute Morgan was again called into action this time to deny O'Donoghue. Kerry Manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice continued

A high ball from Ronan O'Neill came back off an upright and McNiece won the race for possession to be denied by Kelly with a dangerous slapping save.

Tyrone's starting line-up featured numerous positional switches, with just two players holding their starting positions.

The swarming game that one normally associates with Tyrone was non-existent on this occasion and another surprising fact to emerge from the game was that there was no card of any description brandished by Clare referee Rory Hickey. Tyrone's Sean Cavanagh boxed clever in the opening half as he waited to pounce on the breaking ball, but the Tyrone star faded in the second half.

CONSTRUCTION INITIATIVE WELCOMED

68m local authority home building initiative

Fine Gael Cllr John Sheahan has welcomed the announcement of a \in 1,079,768 investment in the construction of local authority housing in Kerry. Cllr Sheahan was speaking after yesterdays announcement of a \in 68 million Local Authority Construction Initiative by Minister for Housing and Planning, Jan O'Sullivan TD.

"The€68 million local authority construction initiative will see some 449 new homes built across the country over the next two years. This is just one of a number of Governmentbacked initiatives to provide high quality homes for families launching in 2014, including:

● A €15 million fund to bring back into use vacant local authority houses

● A €35 million investment over 2014 and 2015 for housing for people with a disability, people without a home and the elderly

● A €30 million investment in 2014 to improve the energy efficiency of local authority housing

• A $\in 10$ million fund to kick start resolution on the remaining unfinished housing

"I am pleased that Kerry will see the benefit of this latest initiative, which should go a long way towards reducing social housing waiting lists and will also create local jobs", Cllr John Sheahan said.

KERRY MORTGAGE HOLDERS HAVE BEEN ABANDONED BY THE GOVERNMENT - NIALL KELLEHER

Fianna Fáil local election candidate for the Killarney Electoral Area has expressed his dismay at the inaction of the government to protect some mortgage holders, including a significant number in Kerry.

Families and homeowners, who in good faith, took out a mortgage with the then Irish Nationwide Building Society, have seen their loans move to the IBRC. Now the government, which owns IBRC, is abandoning them to overseas vulture funds.

Last week Fianna Fáil proposed very straightforward

legislation on the matter, which would address the problems caused by the windup of IBRC.

"Families, including my own, who have an IBRC mortgage, have been potentially left out to dry on this" said Niall Kelleher. "It makes no sense for the government to refuse to support this legislation. Action is needed immediately, not in 6 months time, when families are informed that their mortgages have been sold to vultures. I've met with some families who are extremely concerned and extremely anxious about what could happen. The Fianna Fáil finance spokesperson Michael McGrath, has described this as leaving the mortgage holders extremely vulnerable and having to rely on the kindness of strangers."

Niall Kelleher concluded, "If there was a political will to do this, the government would find a way to protect the IBRC mortgage holders. In the coming weeks, we will see the completion of the sale of the IBRC mortgage book and IBRC mortgage holders will be left high and dry."

At the March 2014 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council, Councillor Michael Gleeson proposed the following Notice of Motion:

"In view of the invaluable work that Sporting Clubs and Community Centres perform for the enhancement and stability of community, that this Council calls on Uisce Éireann (Irish Water) to refrain from imposing either a standing change or a usage charge on the Directors/ Management of those vital social assets".

Councillor Gleeson stated that Sporting Clubs and Community Centres and schools are the very heart of each locality. Many such areas are struggling for survival because of the emigration of the youth.

Councillor Gleeson further stated that the imposition of additional charges, such as for water, could well be the death knell for these vitally important facilities.

The Motion was unanimously agreed and it will be forwarded to Uisce Éireann (Irish Water) for consideration.

CHILD MINDERS


The news that grandparents are obliged to fill in a 26 page tax return form as child minders even if they receive no income is a ridiculous situation according to Cllr Tom Doherty

Elverys is a national brand name and is a strong viable business. The loss of any jobs would be a huge blow to Killarney where the store employs eleven staff which increases during the summer months. It's vital that the management bid is given serious consideration by NAMA who should not ignore the value of employment protection in any takeover negotiations.





FOCUS ON HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS What we mean when we call a plant an Herbaceous Perennial is

that in most of the them the stems are soft, succulent and green as opposed to being brown and woody. With most Herbaceous Perennial they will sprout growth from ground level in Spring and will grow and flower right through the Summer and into the Autumn. With most Herbaceous Perennials in late Autumn and early Winter they start to look a bit ragged. But depending on the severity of the Winter some will hold on until the first real cold snap. The maintenance for most Herbaceous Perennials isn't a lot really. During late Autumn early Winter cut the majority of them down to ground level and mulch over with some compost. Some Herbaceous Perennials such as Lupins and semi hardy Fuchsias will have woody stems because of the milder climate here so when pruning back cut right back to just a couple of inches above ground level.

Herbaceous Perennials are a valuable plant in the garden for a number of reasons.

1. Because of the length of time they flower for.

2. Because of the short length of time it takes them to grow to the maximum height and spread.

When planting a Herbaceous Border always remember to plant the taller ones to the back or middle and the smaller growing ones to the front. When choosing your plants pick one plant that you can repeatedly plant in the border to create a sense of continuity to the planting scheme. Herbaceous Perennials flower from April until October/November so you have a wide range of flowering times and colour to choose from. The secret to having a good flowering Herbaceous Border is every few years in the Winter to lift and divide the plants that are suitable for this. *Next week I will focus on Roses.*





RECIPES OF THE WEEK ST. PATRICK'S DAY TREATS - POTATO CAKES WITH SMOKED SALMON

- 3 medium potatoes, quartered
- 100g flour, plus extra for dusting
- ¹⁄₂ tsp baking powder
- For the topping
- 150g pack full-fat soft cheese
- 200g pack smoked salmon
- half a small red onion, thinly sliced
- 1 tbsp caper, drained
- zest 1 lemon

Method

1. Make the potato cakes. Bring a large pan of salted

water to the boil. Tip in the potatoes and cook for 10-15 mins until soft. Drain well, then return to the hot pan for 1-2 mins to allow any excess moisture to evaporate. Pass the potatoes through a ricer or sieve to get a really fine mash.

2. Weigh out 250g of the mash and place in a bowl (you shouldn't have much left over). Tip in the flour, baking powder and 1 tsp salt. Mix together until the mixture forms a soft dough. Shape into a ball, then tip out onto a lightly floured surface. Roll out into a circle about 20cm across and 1cm thick. Cut into 8 triangular wedges and generously dust all over with flour. The potato cakes can be made up to this point 1 day ahead and chilled or frozen for up to 1 month.

3. Set a large, non-stick frying pan over a medium heat (no need to add oil). When hot, dry-fry the cakes for about 3-5 mins on each side until golden and cooked through. You may have to do this in batches. Stir a little water into the soft cheese until it is spoonable. Place the potato cakes on plates, top with dollops of soft cheese and a smoked salmon slice, then scatter over the red onion, capers and lemon zest to finish. MARMALADE & WHISKY BREAD & BUTTER PUDDING

- 8 slices day-old crusty white bread, crusts removed
- 50g very soft butter
- 4 tbsp Seville orange marmalade, plus 4 tsp
- 300ml full-fat milk
- 248ml pot double cream
- 3 large eggs
- seeds 1 vanilla pod
- 4 tbsp golden caster sugar
- 1 tbsp whisky
- icing sugar, for dusting

Method

1. Butter each piece of bread on both sides, then spread 4 with the 1 tbsp marmalade each. Pop the remaining bread on top to make 4 marmalade sandwiches. Cut into triangles and nestle in rows in a large baking dish. Heat oven to 160C/140C fan/gas 3.

2. Beat the milk, cream, eggs, vanilla, sugar and whisky together, then pour over the bread. Leave to soak for 30 mins.

3. Dot the remaining marmalade all over the top of the pud and dust with the icing sugar. Bake for 45 mins-1 hr or until puffy and starting to caramelise where the bread breaks out of the custard. Serve hot or warm.







Know Your Rights: INTERNET SAFETY FOR CHILDREN

QUESTION

My 12-year old daughter is spending a lot of time online. I know she uses the web for homework and other activities but I am worried about how to protect her from cyber-bullying and other dangers. Where can I get help and advice?

ANSWER

The Irish Office for Internet Safety (part of the Department of Justice, Equality and Law Reform) publishes a Guide to Internet Safety for Parents. It summarises the key areas of concern and suggests ways to help your children benefit from the internet while staying safe. The Guide suggests that you should:

• Be involved with what your children are doing online and be familiar with the systems they use.

• Talk to your children about potential dangers and encourage them to talk to you about any difficulties they may be having

• Set guidelines on internet usage and encourage your children to treat other users with respect.

• Use available resources, such as filtering, blocking and parental control systems to help protect children from inappropriate or obscene content.

• Keep computers where you can see them and keep an eye on the sites your children are visiting.

It's also important that children understand that people they communicate with online may not be what they seem. In particular they should be careful about how they interact with others and the information that they disclose to others. Any instances of suspected online child abuse should be reported to hotline.ie (run by the Internet Service Providers Association of Ireland) immediately.

Other resources for parents include the Webwise website from the Irish Internet Safety Awareness Centre which promotes the safe, responsible use of the internet and mobile devices by children and young people. Visit webwise ie to access internet safety information, advice and educational resources. Watchyourspace. ie is a website for young people. It aims to empower and support young people as they take action to address bullying, in particular cyber-bullying, in their communities.



HEDGECUTTING IS ILLEGAL SINCE MARCH 1ST

Illegal hedgerow cutting is detrimental to Irish wildlife and the Irish Wildlife Trust is calling for an immediate halt to this destructive practice. Unless for reasons of health and safety, hedge cutting is in breach of the Wildlife Act 1976 (as Amended, 2000) which bans hedge cutting from March 1st to August 31st each year.

The Irish Wildlife Trust hope that with continued pressure on offenders they can stop illegal hedge cutting and protect the green veins that support so much wildlife in our countryside. Hedgerows are essential for maintaining wildlife diversity, supporting species such as badgers, owls, hedgehogs, stoats, blackbirds and innumerable plants, butterflies and other insects. Not only are they an invaluable resource for much of our wildlife they are vital in providing pollinators, cleaning our air, defining our landscape, storing carbon and by holding back the flow of water off land they can alleviate flooding.

WATER

Here in Ireland at present everyone including myself is hoping for some dry weather as safe. clean drinking water is something most of us take for granted, but for 768 million people around the world, it's not.

Access to clean water improves lives in more ways than you might think. For instance Clean water saves lives. Every day, 1,400 children under five die from diarrheal diseases that are directly linked to poor water, sanitation and hygiene. In Africa alone, people spend 40 billion hours every year walking to collect water — time that could be otherwise spent on other activities, like generating income. Two thirds of that burden is borne by women.

BIRTH OF RARE LION CUBS IS GOOD NEWS FOR ENDANGERED SPECIES

The birth of three extremely rare (and extremely cute) Asiatic lion cubs has officially been announced by the Besancon Zoo in eastern France.

The babies were born in late December to their mother, Shiva, in the zoo's care. The zoo, however, was hesitant to make news of the births public until it was confident the trio would survive.

Now, over two months later, the two little females and one little male cubs are thriving. Shiva is "raising the new cubs brilliantly," said the zoo's veterinarian, Dr. Melanie Berthet "this is a big deal for the species, as there are only an estimated 350 Asiatic lions in the wild and about 300 additional in captivity.

THE LEGENDARY TEXAS LONGHORN

Spaniards first brought cattle to Texas in the 1500s. Some of those cattle escaped or were released into the range. They are the first ancestors of the legendary Texas Longhorn.

Early Texas cattle developed disease resistance, including immunity to the tick-borne "Texas fever." Feral longhorns also developed longevity, ease in calving and thrived on native vegetation, all while surviving droughts. And those horns – long, even spiraling racks that can span up to six feet.

Before the widespread availability of supplemental feed or water from windmills, the only cattle that could thrive in Texas were longhorns. Long horns were important for defence against predators, so cows with long horns left more offspring than did cows with short horns.

Wild longhorns began to mix with English cattle breeds in the early 1800s. By the 1850s, Texas cattle were following trails to markets in New Orleans and California. Cattle were first shipped by rail to Chicago from Abilene, Kan., in 1867. Longhorns gained weight on the trail north from Texas.

According to the Texas Historical Association, 5 to 10 million longhorns were trailed out of Texas for about 20 years after the Civil War, which provided a huge boost for Texas' economy.

Longhorns had nearly disappeared in the 1920s, when Congress established a national longhorn herd in Oklahoma, helping save the breed from extinction and preserving the breed that was vital in launching the Texas beef industry.

Today, some Texas ranches maintain longhorn herds to provide stock for rodeos and meat that satisfies a new type of consumer who craves ultra-lean, "heritage" beef.

QATAR LOOKS TO THE FUTURE

The 2022 FIFA World Cup, an international football tournament, is going to cost Qatar approximately US\$220 billion which is almost sixty times what South Africa spent on the 2010 FIFA World Cup. This is the first time a country in the Middle East will host the World Cup and the destination choice has been met with a lot of complaints and criticism.

In response to the mounting controversy of Qatar's ability to host the event, Qatari authorities are planning on building floating hotels, luxury villas and a water park off the coast of Doha. This will help in accommodating the influx of visitors expected for the World Cup.

•The hotels and the luxury apartments are part of a new island called Oryx Island off the coast of Doha. This new island will be equipped with its own utilities and power and these new hotel buildings will exist entirely off Qatar's grid. •These floating hotels and luxury apartment will help accommodate over 25,000 people. •Electrical vehicles, water taxis, ferries and private boats will help visitors get to the

mainland.

•These space-saving hotels will have an independent sewage treatment plant, power generation and recycling possibilities, freeing them from the limitations of the infrastructure in the surrounding area.

•These energy-efficient structures are designed in a luxurious way; the interiors depict modern design with large expansive glass walls to take in the ocean views.

Although the environmental impact of these hotels is fairly unclear, these floating hotels have definitely put forward a beautiful solution to the continual need for housing during our melting ice-cap era.

CANDLELORE IN OLD IRELAND

To snuff out a candle by accident is a sign of a wedding; and no candle should ever be allowed to burn down to the socket of the candlestick. It should be blown out before that. Otherwise, misfortune may come to someone in the house, and in certain coastal areas, a sailor or fisherman may drown at sea.

At one time it was thought to be very unlucky to light three candles with a single taper. This superstition has survived in the avoidance of lighting three cigarettes with one match. It was also asking for misfortune to burn three candles at the same time. Apparently, Charles Stuart Parnell, the Irish nationalist leader was well-acquainted with the superstition. In his book, Life of Parnell, Barry O'Brien writes that a friend once visited Parnell when he was ill and found him lying in a bedroom illuminated by four candles. During the visit, one of the candles went out; Parnell immediately snuffed out another while remarking how unlucky it was to have three lights burning together.

It was considered very ill-omened to leave a candle burning in an empty room. The only exception is the Christmas candle which should be left to burn all through the night of Christmas Eve to light the way for the Holy Family and also to ensure light, warmth and plenty in the coming year.

It is also said to be very ill-omened to light a candle from the fire on the hearth. There are those who believe that if a person does this, they will become impoverished.

EVEN IN OUR DISPOSABLE SOCIETY PLEASE REMEMBER A PET IS FOR LIFE

Recently, a 15-year-old Pomeranian was surrendered by his owner to an animal control, and that individual did not even attempt to pretty-up the reason.

There was no mention about a "change of lifestyle," or a lack of time...there was not an excuse about moving or an inability to pay for care...instead, there was the truthful response, indicative of the individual's thoughtless mentality, "too old, got newer dog to replace."

The elderly dog had a sad life prior to being surrendered to animal control; by the individual's own admission, the dog, named "Chelo," lived outside 24 hours a day - usually under the porch.

Thanks to rescuers - those people who are always waiting in the wings to pick up the pieces - today Chelo is safe. The elderly dog is with Muttville Senior Dog Rescue in San Francisco, California.

COPING WITH LOSS

Whilst we may often think of grief resulting from the death of a loved one, any loss can cause grief. These losses may include divorce or the break up of a relationship, a miscarriage, loss of a pet, loss of our health, a job, a cherished dream, a friendship, financial security, or selling the family home.

Grieving is a highly individual and personal experience and the way in which we grieve can depend on many different elements. These include our personality, our life experiences, our faith, the nature of the loss, our resilience and coping style. Grief can be like a roller coaster – with ups and downs. Powerful feelings can come unexpectedly some more intense and longer lasting than others. Feelings can range from shock and disbelief, to guilt, sadness, anger, fear and frustration. Physical symptoms are also common such as weight loss/gain, insomnia, fatigue, nausea, aches and pains. Forgetfulness and poor concentration are also symptoms of grief. All of these feelings are perfectly normal and there is no right or wrong way to feel. Sometimes people can feel guilty about their anger – but it is okay to be angry.

It is important not to go through this alone and to talk and share your feelings. This may be with family and friends or you may prefer the support of a counsellor. Counselling can offer the space and time to talk through your feelings and overcome obstacles to your grieving. Allowing yourself time to experience your feelings is very important even if, at times, they are difficult. For many people their faith, prayer, meditation or going to church can be a great solace in times of loss. Support groups where you can share your sorrow with others who have experienced similar losses can be also be of tremendous help.

It is vitally important that you take care of yourself when you are grieving. You are coming to terms with a major upheaval in your life so give yourself permission to take things a bit easier. Your energy may be low, so do not place too many demands on yourself and make sure you get enough rest and sleep. It is important to look after your physical health by eating healthily and getting some exercise each day. Don't rush things and put off making major decisions such as moving home or changing jobs for at least six months to a year.

Health Matters.... With Dr. Michael Moloney

GOUT

What is gout?

Gout is a form of arthritis which can cause severe pain in one or more joints. It is caused by a build up of uric acid within the joint which can be followed by inflammation thus causing pain. Gout affects about 1 in 200 adults, is more common in middle aged men and can tend to run in families.

An attack of gout can present very quickly and develop even over the period of a few hours. It can be extremely painful and can last several days. Usually an acute attack only affects one joint (most typically the big toe); however multiple joints can be affected. Occasionally sites other than joints can be affected.

Uric acid levels are may rise for a variety of reasons thus precipitating gout in susceptible people. Certain foods can cause a rise in uric acid levels. Typical 'rich' foods and alcohol as well as certain medications (including some blood pressure tablets) may bring on gout. Occasionally gout may be brought on by an underlying medical condition.

Diagnosis of Gout

Gout is often a clinical diagnosis made easily by your GP. The diagnosis may be confirmed by a blood sample showing a raised uric acid level. Uric acid may be normal during an acute attack. Some individuals may even have normal uric acid levels in the blood and still suffer from gout. **Management of an attack**

An acute attack of gout may be helped by elevating the affected limb and applying ice packs for 15-20mins. Also over the counter analgesia such as ibuprofen may help the symptoms.

Some people may be sensitive to ibuprofen or other anti inflammatory medications prescribed by their GP. Such medications can occasionally cause bleeding from the bowel or aggravation of asthma. One should always check with their pharmacist or GP if they have any concerns regarding their medication.

Medications other than anti inflammatory painkillers such as colchicines and steroids may be used to settle an acute attack.

Prevention of gout

General lifestyle changes such as increasing exercise, reducing alcohol intake and improving the overall quality of the diet can reduce recurrence of gout. There is some evidence to suggest vitamin C supplementation may reduce exacerbations. Medication may be used if attacks are frequent.

Allopurinol is a medication commonly used to prevent gout attacks. It is not used during an acute attack and can take up to 3 months to lower uric acid levels and thus prevent an attack. The dose of allopurinol used can vary from person to person and may be tailored according to uric acid levels.

Other treatment options are available for persisting or troublesome gout
