WARNING FOR KILLARNEY'S DOG OWNERS

The All Care Veterinary Hospital on the Park road, posted a warning to all dog owners in the Killarney area this week. Danny O'Sullivan, owner of the practice, also known as Danny the Vet from Radio Kerry, posted an urgent warning for all dog owners in the Killarney area, he stated that they are seeing some very unusual poisoning cases in dogs in the last few days. The symptoms are; sudden onset of stiffness and nervous tremors in previously perfectly healthy dogs leading quickly to extensor spasmic seizures which persist and these dogs get progressively

worse . "I havent seen cases like this since strychnine was banned several years ago .We dont know yet what the poison is yet" he said. All Care offered the following advice to keep your pet safe .

1) Keep your dog on a lead in public areas when walking.

2) If your dog scavenges consider a muzzle.

3) Don't let your dog wander unattended.

4) If you notice any of the above signs bring your dog in instantly for veterinary treatment.5)Report any sudden unexpected deaths in pets.

This will be the band's sixth foreign tour, having previously visited Holland in 1985, Germany in 1989, Austria in 2002, Paris in 2007 and Lisbon in 2013. Band conductor Vincent Condon commented: "The band will perform two open air concerts in the centre of Monaco and Cannes. This will be a wonderful spectacle as between our own band and the Blarney Brass & Reed Band there will be close to 100 musicians performing on stage. This tour will be an excellent musical and cultural experience for band members and we are once again extremely proud to be representing Killarney and Kerry abroad." Band manager Ciaran Lynch says: "There are many hidden costs when taking a band on a foreign concert tour. Members pay for flights and accommodation themselves but the band must fundraise to pay for concert venues, hiring percussion equipment transporting

instruments and music stands, bus hire, insurance etc."

Parents and band members have been working tirelessly to fundraise for the trip and will be calling into businesses in Killarney throughout April to sell ads for the Race Night programme. IRISH CANCER SOCIETY WELCOME REVIEW OF CAR PARKING CHARGES

The Irish Cancer Society has welcomed news that the South/ South West Hospital Group will review car parking policy for cancer patients across the six hospitals that offer cancer treatment.The group includes Kerry General Hospital, where cancer patients already receive free parking.The Society has been campaigning to 'Park the Charges' for cancer patients and said this is an important first step in reducing the excessive financial burden these charges place on cancer patients. Of the six hospitals in the South/South West Hospital Group that offer cancer treatment and have a hospital on-site, only Waterford Hospital doesn't provide free parking or concessions for cancer patients. Meanwhile, the South Infirmary Victoria Hospital in Cork, has decided to introduce a new reduced daily rate of €5 for cancer patients.There is strong public support with over 3,000 signatures to the Irish Cancer Society's online petition calling on hospitals to 'Park the Charges'.

€4.5 MILLION REFURB UNDERWAY AT CAHERNANE HOUSE HOTEL

A major \notin 4.5 million investment programme has commenced at the Cahernane House Hotel to upgrade and expand the array of facilities at the 4 star hotel located at the edge of Killarney National Park. 8. Dicate at least 20 minutes to finish your meal. Have a wall clock in plain view from the table to adjust your eating speed; eat your last portion really slowly. If you are still hungry after 20 minutes, it means you are eating too fast! Another way to see this is to recognize when you feel pleasantly full or neither hungry nor full.[1]

a. There is a "sensor" in our brain (in the hypothalamus) that needs about 20 minutes to get activated (give or take a few minutes for individual differences). Digestive and hormonal processes need to take place before our brain realizes we are not hungry anymore; we could feel bloated and still be hungry before this recognition of satiation is set off.

9. If you feel still a little bit hungry after this, stop anyway. Drink a little bit more water. This is where you will need to use a little willpower and to recall your motivation and visualizations. In five more minutes, you won't want to eat more, even if food is delicious, because you will feel satisfied and full.

a. Use distractions if visualization on your reason for eating slowly fails at this point. Go for a walk, watch a favorite TV show, write a poem, call a friend on the phone, go for a swim, knit a sweater, feed an animal, groom your pet, wash the car, change the sheets, etc.

b. Having a hot drink can help to overcome residual hunger feelings. Try a coffee, tea, warm water with lemon, etc.

c. If you're still feeling hungry after eating slowly, you might have nutritional deficiencies or an illness; there may also be continuing underlying psychological problems. It is wise to speak to your doctor about this if it's still the case for you

Income tax exemption for long-term land leasing

Income derived from leasing land on a long-term lease may be exempt from tax up to certain thresholds. Leases between close relatives do not qualify and to qualify a lease of farm land must be in writing or evidenced in writing and for a definite term of 5 years or more.

Qualifying lease taken out from 1 January 2007 to 31 December 2014

For periods up to 31 December 2014 an individual aged 40 years or over, or an individual who is permanently incapacitated by mental or physical infirmity from carrying on a trade of farming, may be entitled to an exemption from income tax of certain income arising from leasing of farm land.

The amount of the relief, (subject to the maximum limit) is allowed as follows:

- €20,000 where the lease / leases are for a term of at least 10 years
- €15,000 where the lease/ leases are for a term of at least 7 years
- €12,000 of annual leasing income where the lease/leases are for a term of at least 5 years

Leases entered into on or after January 1, 2015

With effect from 1 January 2015 the age restriction and the requirement to be permanently incapacitated were removed, the amount of income that may be exempted under a qualifying long term lease was increased and a fourth threshold introduced for lease periods of 15 or more years with income of up to €40,000 being exempted.

- €40,000 where all the qualifying leases are for 15 years or more,
- €30,000 where all the qualifying leases are for 10 but less than 15 years,
- €22,500 where all the qualifying leases are for 7 but less than 10 years, and
- €18,000 where all the qualifying leases are for 5 or 6 years.

NESTING SEASON

For many people, there's no greater thrill than to have a family of birds take up residence in your garden. Now is a great time to ensure you welcome these feathered friends.

Providing nesting materials can make your garden very appealing to nesting birds. Here are a few ideas for providing natural nesting material to attract your favourite species!

Twigs: When small branches or twigs fall from a shrub, leave them for birds to pick up. Almost any tree or shrub will work, but the sticks should be under 4 inches long.

Mud: If the ground is dry remove grass etc from a spot near a hedge add a little bit of water to create mud, since it is a favoured nesting material for swallows, swifts and robins.

Dry Grass: Grass is a common ingredient in songbird nests, used by species from native sparrows to robins. After trimming your lawn, leave dried grass cut 2 to 4 inches long.

Moss: Moss is easy to grow in shady spots. Its velvety texture is beautiful and it's a favoured building material of many species.

Catkin Greenery: Some birds line nests with soft plant matter. You can provide this in future years by growing catkin-bearing trees and shrubs such as willows, poplar and beech.

Fluff: Many birds prefer fluffy material, such as seeds with silky attachments or seed pods with a soft, hairlike covering. You can provide these items via milkweed, honeysuckle, and clematis. For many birds, nesting wouldn't be possible without trees, if you have any spare corners



please consider planting fruit bearing trees and plants that produce berries. Feeding birds this nesting season is also very important as the Country's cut back hedges will not provide food or shelter.

ARE YOU GOING TO EAT CHOCOLATE ON EASTER SUNDAY?

Chocolate is something that's been consumed for 3000 years and has outlasted most cultures and societies and empires. Its made from the fruit of the cacao tree, native to Central and South America, although it's now grown in regions all around the equator and for most of its history it was a drink.

When the fruit is harvested, the sweet, pulpy flesh is scooped out and fermented before the seeds are separated and dried. These seeds are the cacao beans, which are roasted (usually), ground, and processed into chocolate.

The Maya were the first to grow cacao millennia ago, drinking it hot or cold and blended with flavours such as honey, chili, or vanilla. Chocolate came to Europe in the 16th century, where it became wildly popular in part because it was the first caffeinated beverage introduced to the continent, predating tea and coffee.

The first chocolate bars didn't come around until the 19th century, when chocolate makers in Europe devised the process of blending ground cacao beans with extra cocoa butter (the fat present in the beans), as well as sugar, dairy, and other ingredients.

This was the first time these pups had even felt human touch and they were terrified, but as as the second rescuer petted them more and more they calmed down.

He finally got all eight of the pups but crawled back into the 18 foot cave to make sure there were no more. That's when he heard sounds and saw one more pup! The ninth puppy was much smaller than the rest and must've been the runt of the litter. He got a hold of him and brought him to safety.

BOY SAVES HIS MOTHERS LIFE BY DOING THE OPPOSITE OF WHAT SHE SAID

Children are taught to do what their parents tell them to do – but in this case, it's good that Camdyn Smith didn't follow his mother's orders; otherwise she may not be alive today.

Camdyn returned to his home in Sedro-Woolley, Washington after school to find his mother Kimberly suffering from chest pains and having trouble breathing.

Though his mother insisted that she just wanted to take a nap and sleep off the pain, the 9-yearold kept telling her that she needed to go to the hospital.

After sufficient pestering, Kimberly relented and went to see a doctor.

The mother wasn't there very long, however, because medical officials immediately called her an ambulance and sent her to the emergency room.

Doctors found that Kimberly was suffering from pulmonary embolisms, a condition in which the arteries in both of her lungs had become blocked by blood clots.

If Kimberly had taken the nap like she wanted, she may not have ever woken up. She says that after spending seven days in the hospital being treated for the condition, she can honestly say that she owes her life to the persistence of her son Camdyn.

BABY ELEPHANT ALMOST LOST HER TRUNK TO BUSHMEAT POACHERS

The David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust (DSWT) has another new baby elephant under its wings. Little Enkesha was rescued by the organisation after she survived a terrible attack from bushmeat poachers who almost severed her trunk and what she went through was unimaginable.

Bushmeat poachers target animals living in the wild and sell their meat as luxury items on the black market. Sadly, the senseless taste for "exotic" meat results in the killing and suffering of countless wild animals every year.

Enkesha's trunk was almost completely severed by a poacher's snare. Once the baby was in the hands of the rescuers, it became obvious that the only way to help her, avoid infection of the serious wound, and alleviate her pain, was to carry out an emergency surgery.

This, unfortunately, meant that she would have to be separated from her mother in the bush and flown to the DSWT Orphanage.

Initially, the operation was a success, but the elephant's stitches popped out after two days. The vets and caretakers did not give up on the calf and her trunk, though.

Vets were reluctant to partially amputate her



trunk since Enkesha could still use the tips. So instead, they opted to consciously clean her trunk until it healed on its own. Thanks to the special care from the team, Enkesha now can use her trunk far better than anyone expected! She can lift it, pick up twigs, and she even tries to give herself a dust bath!

After so much trauma and pain, this little baby is now on her way to complete recovery and will soon return to the wild!

MAN BREAKS GUINNESS WORLD RECORD FOR MOST HAMBURGERS EATEN IN A MINUTE

24 year old Ricardo Francisco from the Philippines polished off five burgers at a hamburger eating contest at Zark's Burgers in Manila on March 27th.

Asked how he felt after breaking the record, Ricardo shouted, "Still hungry!"

Ricardo's consumption of five burgers beats the previous Guinness record of four burgers set by Peter Czerwinski, of Toronto, in July 2013.

EDMONTON COUPLE WINS LOTTERY FOR THIRD TIME

A couple from Edmonton in Alberta, Canada is walking away with just over \$8 million 1116,000 after striking it big on the February 22nd Lotto 6/49 draw.

"I knew we had all the numbers, but I didn't know how many winners there were," Barbara Fink said,

but she wasted no time calling her husband, Douglas, who was working out of town at the time.

It's the third time the Finks have won the lottery. In 1989, Douglas shared in a \$128,000 Lotto 6/49 win with four of his friends. And in 2010, the Finks both shared in a \$100,000 Extra prize together.

The winning ticket was a free play won on a previous draw, which Barbara redeemed.

The couple say they plan to use the recent winnings to travel the world, buy a new house, and ensure their daughters and grandchildren are looked after.

A 25-YEAR-OLD MAN SUED HIS PARENTS FOR HIS ALLOWANCE

The parents of a 25-year old Spanish man told

him to either look for a job, or they would stop paying him a €588 monthly allowance. They followed through on their threat, and he sued them in court. The judge dismissed his complaint and ordered him to move out of their home and find a job. He said the man, who was studying law, albeit at a slow rate, would probably not complete the degree for several years, but he thought he was still capable of finding some work.

EUROPE'S FIRST AD-FREE CITYREPLACEDADVERTISING BOARDS WITH TREES

The French city of Grenoble became the first European city to totally ban outdoor advertising, replacing over 300 advertising boards and instalments with community notice boards and trees.

The city's ban included 326 advertising signs – 64 of which were Billboards – that were removed in the spring of 2015; although, bus and public transportation stations will still feature ads until the city's contract with advertising company JCDecaux ends in 2019.

The change came as an election promise of Green party mayor Eric Piolle.

The municipality, which plays host to a population of 160,000, first started using outdoor advertising in 1976. By not renewing the outdoor advertising contract, the city stands to lose about \$640,000 of income from the exchange.
