COUNCIL WARN OF POTENTIAL ALGAL SCUM ON LAKES

Kerry County Council this week erected signage along the shore of Lough Leane to advise members of the public of the potential for an algal scum which can be harmful to small animals.

Following the taking of samples by council staff in recent days, laboratory tests confirmed the presence of a bluegreen algae which may have the potential to form an algal scum.

In accordance with protocols for these situations, precautionary signage has

been erected at locations along the shore of Lough Leane and those who frequent the shoreline are being advised to exercise caution.

As a precaution, members of the public should ensure that dogs are kept on leads and not allowed to enter the water.

Daily inspections of the shoreline will take place and further samples will be taken as required. The situation is being monitored closely on an ongoing basis by Kerry County Council.

The new Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council has been elected.

Cllr Niall Kelleher will serve in the role for the 2019-2020 term following his election at the first meeting of the newly elected local authority.

The Fianna Fáil councillor was elected to the chair while Cllr Norma Moriarty (also Fianna Fáil) was elected to the position of Leas-Cathaoirleach.

The 64th person to occupy the chairperson's role since the council was established in 1899, Cllr Kelleher has been a member of Kerry County Council since 2014 and represents the Killarney Local Electoral Area. He has been chairman of the Kerry Joint Policing Committee



and chairman of the Local Community Development Committee during the term of the last council. The 33 year-old father is a native of Rathmore and now lives at Knockanes, Headford, Killarney.

Cllr Moriarty has also been a member of the council since 2014 and now represents the new Kenmare Local Electoral Area. She was Cathaoirleach of the South and West Kerry Municipal District over the past twelve months. The first meeting of the new 33-member council took place at Áras an Chontae in Tralee. As well as the election of Cathaoirleach and Leas-Cathaoirleach, a number of nominations were made to bodies on which Kerry County Council is represented by its elected members. The first annual meetings of the each of the five Municipal Districts in Kerry – Tralee, Killarney, Kenmare, Listowel and Castleisland-Corca Dhuibne – will be held on 14 June.





There is still a lot to play for as the State Exams enter the third week



As the state exams approach the end of the second week, many candidates have reached or are close to the end of the road. The optional subjects now take centre stage. As the number of candidates taking these subjects is considerably less than the number taking the compulsory subjects some exam centres will close early. Candidates from these centres will be relocated to a different centre for the remainder of the exam. The number of candidates in the school environment will also continue to decrease, so it's important for candidates who still have a job of work to do, not to feel left behind or to become impatient to get over the finishing line.

Normally in the final days, candidates will have one or two subjects from a standard seven left to do. However, it's not unknown for students to take an eight or even a ninth subject to complete a particular vocational grouping. So, there are still grades and points to be earned.

Candidates must guard against exam fatigue. The buzz of the early days is gone. There is less foot fall around the exam centres. Your remaining subjects are likely to be spaced out. These subjects have to be faced. They must be given priority between now and Tuesday, 25th June. Keep a lid on your impatience and stay in exam mode. Be as motivated, focussed and energetic now as you were on the first exam day.

Eight of the fifteen exam days will have passed by tomorrow, Friday evening. There are fourteen more subject sessions in the remaining seven days. The number of candidates taking these subjects will be much less than in the earlier days of the exam. However, candidates concerned must defer any post exam celebrations. In sporting parlance, as Sir Alex Ferguson has so often reminded us, the game ends only with the final whistle. How right he is! Defeat has often been snatched from the jaws of victory by one untimely lapse in concentration.

The weekend provides an opportunity to recharge the batteries and to plan ahead. Enjoy some exercise and fresh air to prepare for the remaining exams. A good work out will help you to sleep soundly, to build up stamina and endurance and to maintain your concentration for the last lap. Enjoy a few good nights' rest so that your mind and body are fully alert for the remaining papers. Organise your revision sessions for daylight hours. Don't burn the midnight oil but go to bed early. Go over the tips and predictions for your remaining subjects. Resist the temptation to spend endless hours cramming course material. Scan your notes on the eve of any remaining paper so that the key concepts are fresh in your mind.

Maintain your disciplined and organised approach over the remaining days. Avoid late night socialising with those who have finished the exam. Keep your distance from alcohol as you'll need a clear head and lots of energy for the task ahead. Eat well as good nutrition is important to avoid energy loss. Keep your fluid levels high to avoid dehydration.

Candidates have performed very well so far. Keep up the good work and bring your exam to a successful conclusion. Use your free days wisely. Stay positive and confident. Take it subject by subject and bring the curtain down on a stellar performance.

After the State Exams, applicants to the Central Applications Office (CAO) turn their attention to the CAO "Change of Mind" Form, which must be submitted by Monday, 1st July. Next week, I'll explain how to use that facility to your best advantage.

Summer Gardening

Transform your garden this June

With a minimum of effort even the novice gardener can add interest and colour to their garden by introducing bedding plants. Bedding plants are a marvellous source of instant colour and should, if watered well and regularly dead-headed, keep blooming throughout the summer right up until September and even later. The majority of bedding should be strategically placed so that it can be enjoyed from the house and can easily be watered every day in hot weather. Prior to planting, the soil requires forking and breaking down to what is known as a fine tilth (crumbly texture). A balanced fertiliser should be incorporated and the ground raked smooth. Additional feeding with liquid preparations can follow once the plants have become somewhat established and made a little growth. Spacing should be regular at around 30cm but much will depend on variety chosen. More precise information can be obtained when making your purchases at the garden centre. By all means create patterns of colour when planting large beds and use as many varieties as you wish but don't randomly mix or jumble them together. Water immediately after planting and give additional water on a twice weekly basis until they're fully established and growing strongly. You can add a liquid feed at every watering if diluted to half the recommended amount. Finally, deadhead (pinching off the dying blooms) often in order that the varieties chosen continue to produce further flushes of bloom. To do less than this would be a signal to the plants to stop producing follow-on blooms, for stimulation is vital from planting to removal.



Top bedding plants...

To help you get some kind of return in terms of colourful blooms in the open ground or in baskets,window boxes and containers this summer, here are the top five:

1) Busy Lizzies especially the newer hybrids in shades of pink and lilac. They are ideal for damp, shady places and are a superb choice for Irish gardens and typical Irish summers!

2) Petunias, especially the surfinia strains. For general bedding choose the multiflora strains for while their blooms may be smaller than those of the Surfinias, they're borne in large numbers and stand up to wet weather much better

3) Lobelia Whether you use the trailing or bunching forms, sheets of colour will be yours.

4) Begonia - these fibrous-rooted reliables perform semperflorens excellently in poor summers. 5 Cirrus Set off any bedding scheme to perfection Senecio cineraria and provide texture and colour by including a selection of foliage plants.

There are a lot of trees suitable for smaller gardens and they come in all shapes and sizes evergreen or deciduous. There are a lot of things to consider when choosing a tree for a limited space, the most important being the eventual height and spread of the tree. Some ornamental small trees can still reach a height of 20/25 feet. Sometimes even these small trees can be too big for a small garden but there is still a lot of choice out there. Examples would be a weeping tree which never gets too tall and is very easy to prune back if need be. On the other hand you can choose a tree that is columnar in shape and it won't spread out too much. Also there are standard trees. These trees are usually about 3ft to 4ft in height and grow from the top to ground level, staying at the height you plant them at.





Every week I get asked by people I meet "Can I do it?". My answer is always the same, **YES YOU CAN!** You simply need to set your expectations and prepare the right way.

About Me

My name is Brian, I run the RunninginIreland.com website and blog. I am not an elite athlete; I don't think I'd consider myself a fast runner either. I just love to run. But I have done a lot of races, including Killarney and I will draw on this experience to help yau on your way.



Choosing your distance

Luckily there are two very good options, either the half-marathon or the **10K**. You may be part of a group with novice runners who are used to distances of **5k or less**. For this group, the 10K option is perfect. It may feel like a big jump, but with a good training programme, anyone can get up to the 10K distance.

Perhaps you have done a 10K before and are worried about the step up to the half. This may seem daunting as it is quite a jump from 10k to 21k. However, it is definitely doable with the right approach. There are really good training plans available on the Run Killarney website that will help you with this increase. Most importantly for me as regards Killarney is that, if this is your first attempt at a half-marathon, this is probably one of the best ones in the country (and beyond) for a 'first timer' to try. The course really helps you along (starting in Molls Gap and bringing you down the National Park), and there is a super atmosphere among the runners on the route and at the finish line. You may have done a half before, and you run regularly. Well then you need to think about your longer term goals for this year. Do you have a big target for later in the year, are you focusing on lowering your times? Will the 10k or the half help you towards other goals?

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I am moving back to Ireland after several years in Germany. Am I allowed to bring my dog and cat home with me?

ANSWER

Strict controls are in place for bringing pets into Ireland to ensure that diseases such as rabies are not introduced. If you are moving to Ireland or coming on holiday you can bring your dog or cat with you. The EU system of Passports for Pets allows dogs, cats and ferrets to travel between EU member states.

Any private veterinary practice can issue an EU Pet Passport which will certify that the pet is travelling from an eligible country, is identified by an implanted microchip and has been vaccinated against rabies at least 21 days before travel. Cats, dogs or ferrets coming from countries other than the UK, Finland or Malta must be treated against tapeworm between 24 and 120 hours before travel. The time and date of treatment are entered on the passport. Treatment for ticks is not compulsory, but it is advisable to get it at the same time as the tapeworm treatment.

Registered airlines may choose to carry pets complying with the Pet Passport regulations. Compliant pets may travel on any ferry. The pet must travel with its owner or with a person acting on behalf of the owner (unaccompanied pets cannot travel to Ireland under the EU Pet Passport System).





EXAM STRESS Some tips for parents and students

FOR PARENTS

Exams are here and will be over before we know it. The best way to support your teen at this time is to make home life as calm and pleasant as you can. You may notice that although you are desperate to know how the exam went, it's wise not to launch into an inquisition - so give your teen some space. Feeding them healthy snacks and good nutritious food will all be very welcome. Make sure they eat a good breakfast on the morning of the exam. Be sure to remind your child to take study breaks and get some fresh air to help clear the mind. After an hour or two of study, let them chill out but within reason. They need to switch off from exam student mode too. It's ok to be a couch potato at this time. A good night's sleep is vital before an exam, so make sure your child isn't staying up late. Encourage an early night but don't let it turn into an argument. Insisting your eighteen year old goes to bed at 11pm doesn't really work, especially if he/she is not able to get to sleep and ends up tossing and turning until 4am. On the other hand it is not good either to turn a blind eye to 'gaming' until the early hours. Remind them that the brain needs at least 7 hours to absorb what they have learnt and to function well the next day. Lack of sleep can cause concentration and memory problems. Often, the study done after midnight is wasted.

FOR STUDENTS

The Psychological Society of Ireland offers some last minutes tips and advice to students how long to study. They advise students to study "regularly and briefly - rather than "cramming" at the last minute. Try to study in blocks of time which do not exceed your concentration span. For example, break up a study session into periods of about 50 minutes each." They also offer valuable advice to gain control over the exam situation as follows: "Ignore what other people do in the exam. Do not look around you in the exam-hall when the papers are handed out and do not pay any attention to students who request extra paper from the exam supervisors. Remember that it is the quality rather than quantity of the answer that attracts good marks. In any case, many "hand raisers" write on only one side of a page or perhaps skip every second line of their answer book. So, be selfish in an exam - ignore everyone else."

A PALM OIL ALTERNATIVE FROM USED COFFEE

Two Scottish Entrepreneurs Are Working to Replace Palm Oil With the Oil From Used Coffee Grounds:

Since palm oil has been linked to deforestation, the prosecution of native people, dangerous sources of greenhouse gas emissions, and the destruction of wildlife habitats, food and cosmetic companies have been coming under increasing pressure to ditch palm oil from their ingredients lists.

Now Scott Kennedy and Fergus Moore are honing a chemical technique that extracts oils from used coffee grounds. The young men first got the idea to use coffee waste oil when they were working in cafés during their time in college. According to the duo, the bulk of café waste is made up of used coffee grounds. In Great Britain alone, used coffee grounds collectively add up to about half a million tons of landfill waste every year.

"There are oils in coffee with a wide range of uses in different industries – cosmetics, pharmaceuticals, food and drink, household products – you name it, there's probably a use there and the coffee grounds have all the same components as palm" Fergus Moore said.

The two young men started the Revive Eco startup company to begin implementing their procedure in Scotland, and they already have plans to start expanding into additional European cities.

MAN CARRIED HIS BLIND DOG FOR 800 MILES SO SHE COULD BUILD CONFIDENCE TO WALK THE REST OF THE EPIC HIKE

Kyle Rohrig and his dog Katana had been halfway through completing the 2,650-mile hike of the Pacific Crest Trail when Katana's left eye started to cloud over from glaucoma, they took a break from the trail so she could undergo surgery for her vision loss, but they quickly returned to the west coast so they could finish the hike.

Two years later, Katana was blind in both eyes – and Kyle was heartbroken to see his onceintrepid hiking companion anxiously attempting to manoeuvre their living room.

Instead of resigning his dog to retirement, however, Kyle started formulating a plan to help Katana regain her confidence and after doing some initial training with Katana, Kyle resolved to take her on the Florida Trail: a gruelling 1,100mile hike through the swamps and rivers of the Everglades.

Despite her disability, Katana would walk a few miles of the trail on her own every day but whenever the companions encountered marshes or floodwaters, Kyle strapped the 21-pound dog on top of his backpack and carried her through the treacherous terrain.

After 72 days of hiking, they finished the trail in late March. Collectively, Kyle had carried Katana for 800 miles – but since Katana had also walked 200 miles of the trail all on her own, she had undergone a noticeable transformation.

THE WORLD'S MOST EXPENSIVE CHEESE IS MADE FROM BALKAN DONKEY MILK

Pule is a crumbly white cheese that is not even available on the commercial market. Its high cost is attributed to the considerable time and resources needed for production. While most cheeses are made using cow, goat or sheep milk, this cheese is made from the milk of a Balkan donkey, native only to Serbia and Montenegro, and requires 25 litres of milk to produce just one kilogram (2.2 pounds) of cheese and no expensive ingredients are added during the cheesemaking process. The donkeys milked for the cheese aren't wild, either. They're domesticated and live on a farm in a Serbian natural reserve called Zasavica. But donkey milk is exceptionally rare and difficult to produce. A female donkey produces only about 1.5–2 litres of milk per day. Donkey milk also contains significantly fewer solids than cow milk, meaning far more milk is needed to make the equivalent amount of hard cheese.

Costs of labour also influence Pule's sales price. Donkey milking—which occurs three times per day—must be done by hand, as no milking machinery exists to accommodate such a small, specialised industry.

Normally priced at around €1,000 per kilogram the cheese is produced in cupcake-sized mounds, has a yellowish tinge and is less crumbly than goat cheese. Its flavour has been described from "sweet, clean and mild," to "intense, with a natural saltiness". Currently the cheese is made only on advanced order basis and you will have to travel to the Zasavica reserve to collect it.

Zasavica donkey reserve is a donkey farm inside Zasavica, about 80 kilometres from Belgrade which produces the donkey cheese from a herd of about 100 endangered Balkan donkeys. By selling the donkey cheese at \in 1,000 per kilogram (app. \$576 a pound), the Zasavica donkey reserve plans to sponsor their conservation work.

THERE'S A SECRET APARTMENT AT THE TOP OF THE EIFFEL TOWER

When Gustave Eiffel and his team built the landmark in Paris it was intended as a temporary exhibit meant to broadcast France's industrial power to the rest of Europe. Eiffel knew that the terms of the construction project meant the tower was going to be demolished in 1909, so he contacted the world's most prominent scientists in an attempt to provide the tower with a legitimate scientific purpose that would save his namesake creation from being destroyed.

Upon the tower's completion, the apartment served as a laboratory for atmospheric measurements, astronomical observations, and physics experiments and he finally found the perfect accomplice in Captain Gustave Ferrié, who used the tower for the French Army's wireless telegraphy experiments in 1903. The tower was able to broadcast wireless signals as far as North America, making it indispensable to the city that would otherwise have torn it down only six years later.
