



The former GAA president and patron for the KN Group All-Ireland GAA Golf Challenge arranged for a specially designed social car to be donated to the young man as part of the competition's fundraiser earlier this year.



"Ian has always been very active in his local Spa GAA club. The injuries he sustained have now left him paralysed from the shoulders down so he is facing a long road to recovery, and his courage has made a tremendous impact on communities around the country. The Ireland South MEP was both a student and teacher in lan's school, St. Brendan's College Killarney, and grew up in the same parish as lan's mother, in Kilcummin.

"The generosity of rural Ireland has always been second to none, and this has been especially true in the case of Ian O'Connell's trust fund over the last year. The GAA spirit of fellowship and friendship has been felt strongly

throughout the community efforts made for lan's rehabilitation."





### SOUTH KERRY CREDIT UNIONS TO MERGE



The Boards of Killarney Credit Union and Caherciveen Credit Unions are pleased to announce that the two credit unions are planning to merge. Caherciveen Credit will undertake a "transfer of engagements" and become part of Killarney Credit Union. By combining resources the merged credit unions will have assets of over €140 million, savings of €123 million and combined reserves of under €17 million. The merger is expected to be completed at the end of September, subject to final approval from the Central Bank of Ireland. Members will be unaffected by this process and can continue to do business as normal with their credit union. This 'transfer of engagements' is a welcome development for both credit unions which will now focus on providing enhanced member services intheir local communities.

The credit union offices will remain open and fully operational and savings at both credit unions remain protected by the Government's Deposit Guarantee Scheme of up to €100,000 per depositor.

The decision was taken for the credit unions to come together in order to improve efficiency for members of both credit unions, and so that the credit unions can work together to grow and meet the increasing demands of members for a wider range and depth of services.

The credit union in Caherciveen Credit Union will now operate under a branch network structure with its head office located in Beech Road, Killarney.

The credit unions will also be able to work together to manage regulatory requirements

with the main objective of enhancing service provision, and will continue to lead the way in the provision of loans, savings and budgeting services and accessible, friendly financial services in the local areas of South Kerry.

This years annual 200KM non stop endurance race -The Kerry Way Ultra Marathon, saw over 70 athletes depart Killarney, from 14 Countries, enduring heavy downpours during nightfall, and glorious evening rainbows along the daunting 40 hour, non stop Ultra Marathon. The Race traverses the MacGillycuddy's Reeks and Iveragh Peninsula, stretching along The Wild Atlantic Way, along ancient trails, old roads and coastal cliffs. It is Ireland's longest distance trail.

The Marathon was won by Gavin Byrne in a time of 26 hours and 38 minutes. Killarney native Sean Clifford, who lead for much of the way came second in a remarkable close finish of just a 3 minute difference - 26 hours and 41 minutes. Another Killarney Native Joe O'Leary was joint third with Stephen Davis. Claire Morrissey won the Ladies title in a time of 37 hours and 55 minutes.

The second race known as The Kerry WayLite Marathon 50Km race departing from Sneem and continues along the Kerry Way Route, taking in Templenoe, Kenmare, the 'Old Kenmare Road', through Killarney National Park returning to Killarney. The race was won by Barry Drennan, in a time of 5 hours and 51 minutes. First Lady was Sarah Enright in 6 hours and 21 minutes.

Race Director Eileen Daly remarked " I will never underestimate the determination of the runners, marshals, support crews volunteers, and kindness of The Kerry Way Landowners. My own back up team worked tirelessly over the weekend. Both marathons reached a phenomenal amount of viewers who engaged with our live tracking on our Facebook page"

All Competitors bring their own support crews who meet them at various junctions along the route, a huge welcome especially during the night watch. 14 countries worldwide were represented this year.

Eileen Added "The Kerry Way Ultra Marathon is a non-profit 'no trace race', with the kind support of South Kerry Development Partnership, Torc Brewing Company, Portwest Outdoors, The Dromhall Hotel, Sheahan's Centra. It has been awarded 4 points by the prestigious Ultra Trail du Mont Blanc (UTMB) which is a testament to the severity of the race."



### CONSIDERING **SHOULD** YOU BE **SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE**

Definitely yes because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. For example on a mortgage of €200000 over 30 years based on a property value of €300000 and comparing current fixed interest rates one lenders 2 year fixed rate is as slow as 2.30% (3.90% APR) which costs €770 per month whereas another lenders 2 year fixed rate is as high as 3.30% (APR 3.96%) monthly repayment €876 per month. The monthly repayment for the lender with the higher rate is a staggering €106 per month more expensive. Over the term of the mortgage you would pay €38,271.60 (approx) more in interest based on the above difference in interest rates and based on interest rates not changing. Of course you would need to qualify for the mortgage with the new lender and also there are many other considerations and information you need to know before proceeding further. 

# Flesk Castle to feature in new festival showcasing Kerry's Architectural Heritage

Flesk Castle is one of the many architectural building to be showcased at the inaugural Architecture Kerry festival which takes place later this month. The event, which will showcase and celebrate the best of the county's architectural heritage, will take place from 28 to 30 September, and will feature talks, free guided tours, exhibitions, workshops and family events.

The aim of the new festival, which is part of the Creative Ireland Programme, is to highlight the wide diversity of the architectural landscape in Kerry and to make some of the best-known sites of architectural significance in the county accessible to all ages. Several public and private buildings across the county will open their doors for free guided tours, Kerry County Museum and Kerry libraries will host exhibitions and workshops, and a wideranging symposium, 'New Life in Old Spaces' will be hosted in the chapel of the former Balloonagh Convent in Tralee.

The weekend will also see Tralee Library hosting an exhibition of the winners of the 2018 Irish Architecture Awards and highlight the contribution that Irish architects make to society for everyone's benefit. The showcase will be opened by the President of the RIAI, David Browne. Kerry architects will also showcase their work throughout the festival. Among the buildings opening up to the public will be Kerry Group in Tralee, Killarney's Flesk Castle, Derrynane House and homes in Killorglin, Tarbert, Waterville and Portmagee. The full programme of events is now available on the Kerry County Council website or via www.kerrycoco.ie/AK2018 and will be available in council offices and libraries around the county.

Architecture Kerry is supported by Kerry County Council and the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht in partnership with the OPW, the Royal Institute of Architects of Ireland, the Irish Architecture Foundation and the Heritage Council. The event forms part of the Creative Ireland Programme in Kerry.





### PRE-LETTING EXPENDITURE IN RESPECT **OF VACANT RESIDENTIAL PREMISES**

Expenses incurred on a vacant residential premises prior to it being first let after a period of non-occupancy are allowable as a deduction against rental income from that premises.

The premises must have been vacant for at least 12 months and then let as a residential premises between 25th December 2017 (the date of the passing of the Finance Act 2017) and 31 December 2021.

The expenditure must have been incurred in the 12 months before the premises is let as a residential premises.

The deduction authorised is capped at €5,000 per vacant premises.

If the person who incurs the expenditure ceases to let the property as a residential premises within 4 years of the first letting the deduction will be clawed-back in the year in which the property ceases to be let as a residential premises. This cessation can be either on sale of the property or change of use from rented residential property. The claw-back will be made by deeming the deduction previously allowed to be a Case V profit or gain of the year of cessation.

### Tusla launches National Child and Family Support Week in Kerry

Tusla-Child and Family Agency has launched its first ever national promotional drive to highlight the range of services it provides as part of its Prevention, Partnership and Family Support(PPFS) programme.

Tusla National Child and Family Support Week will feature special public events across Kerry and will be backed up by a national and regional advertising campaign across media platforms.

There are now almost 863,000 families with children in Ireland and some 1.68 million children in families in Ireland, according to Census 2016. Tusla provides extensive support services to assist all parents, children, and young people as part of its PPFS programme. This programme aims to stop problems experienced by families from getting worse, or from developing into a crisis.

Tusla National Child and Family Support Week aims to create widespread public awareness of Tusla's high-quality PPFS programme, leading to increased engagement with its services by families, parents and children.

Recent studies by the UNESCO Child and Family Research Centre at NUI Galway found that, with regard to help-seeking for a parenting or family problem, personal support networks - family and friends - were the main source of support for the public. Members of the public turned to their GP primarily if they could not manage a parent or family problem, while increasing numbers of people are asking a teacher for assistance in this area. The findings also suggested that both the public and the media do not clearly differentiate the concept of family support from child protection, and children in care. However, there has been a significant increase in knowledge of Tusla services overall, among the public, in recent

Speaking ahead of Tusla National Child and Family Support Week clinical psychologist David Coleman stated: "I've been working in clinical practice with children, teenagers and their families for over 20 years and have consistently seen that preventative help for parents and children is always better than having to respond in a crisis. I've been jointly involved with Tusla services with some of my clients over the years, and I've seen, first hand, the high level of support that Tusla and the Family Resource Centre network can offer. If it 'takes a village to raise a child, then Tusla can help families to

connect in with their 'village', accessing those vital community and parenting supports."

Ann Moynihan Senior PPFS Manager for Kerry said: "Tusla is not just a child protection agency. It has an expanded child and family support role with a spectrum of specialist services. Tusla is a cornerstone in supporting families within their communities. If a child or family needs support, Tusla is there to help. Our Prevention, Partnership and Family Support programme seeks to work with families at an early stage to resolve problems, to prevent harm, and to improve outcomes for children, young people and families. And we work collaboratively with our partner organisations to strengthen families and communities."

### **Outstanding Junior Cert results but select your Leaving Cert subjects carefully**



Results were issued yesterday to 62,968 candidates nationwide, including 1,936 (919 female/997 male) candidates from Kerry, who signed up for the Junior Cert exam. Today they are celebrating a significant success in their first public exam. The Junior Cert exam is often overshadowed by the more public Leaving Cert exam but it's an important exam in its own right.

After three years in Junior Cycle, students get their first exposure to a public exam of the State Examinations Commission (SEC). Candidates are awarded a Level 3 qualification on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFO). This Cert is a valuable document as it confirms that the candidate has successfully completed Junior Cycle education at the subject levels and grades shown on the Cert.

Six new grade descriptors - Distinction, Higher Merit, Merit, Achieved, Partially Achieved, Not Graded - are being gradually phased in until 2021 in the reformed Junior Cycle programme. Both the old A, B, C, D, E, F and NG grades and the new grading systems will appear side-byside on the results issued by the SEC.

The broad curricular base of the Junior Cycle gives students insights into their aptitudes, abilities, interests and personality. The exam also measures a candidates standard at the end of the Junior Cycle. As well as the academic content, subjects like Physical Education, Career Guidance, Social and Health Education (SHE), Civic, Social and Political Education (CSPE) along with a comprehensive programme of extracurricular activities develop self-awareness in each student. In short, a personal career profile begins to emerge during the Junior Cycle.

With very few students now leaving school after this exam, the Junior Cert is a passport to Senior Cycle education, which lasts for two or three years. Senior Cycle caters for students in the 15 to 18 year age group. The optional Transition Year (TY), which follows immediately after the Junior Cycle provides an opportunity for students to experience a wide range of educational inputs, including work experience, during a year that is free from formal exams.

During the final two years of Senior Cycle students take one of three programmes, each leading to a state exam - the traditional Leaving Certificate (LC), the Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme (LCVP) or the Leaving Certificate Applied (LCA).

The traditional Leaving Cert exam, a Level 5 qualification, is the terminal exam of postprimary education and is taken when students are about 18 years of age. Syllabi are available in more than 30 subjects and students usually study seven subjects including Irish, English and Mathematics. All subjects are available at higher and ordinary level. A foundation level paper is also available in Irish and Mathematics.

The Leaving Cert Vocational Programme (LCVP) ), also a Level 5 qualification, is similar to the traditional Leaving Cert, with some additional modules called Link Modules, which have a vocational focus.

The Leaving Cert Applied (LCA), a Level 4 qualification, is a self-contained two-year course, which meets the needs of students who are not adequately catered for by the other Leaving Cert programmes. It is a person-centered course involving a cross-curricular approach rather than a subject based structure.

Congratulations to all Junior Cert candidates, who got their results yesterday. Most schools will now give those moving on to Senior Cycle a few days to firm up their Leaving Cert subject choice. Carefully consider your Leaving Cert subject choice, think about your course options and the related careers. In the end, select wisely as this is the first step on your path to college.



## **CARING FOR CREATION:**

By now, we're all too familiar with the horrific photos of wild animals caught in plastic rings, and in an effort to cut down on six-pack ring waste, brewing company Carlsberg has introduced a rather ingenious solution – a Snap Pack held together with glue.

The Danish company described its new concept as a "world first for the beer industry" and reports that the introduction of the Snap Pack will cut the amount of plastic used in its traditional beer multi-packs by as much as 76%. Once the packaging appears in the stores, it is set to reduce plastic waste by more than 1,200 tonnes a year, which equals approx 60 million plastic bags. The glue is strong enough to keep the cans safely together, especially during transport, but the cans can also be easily pulled apart by the consumer.

"We always strive to improve and today's launch clearly shows our ambition to follow in our founder's footsteps towards a better tomorrow," said the Carlsberg Group CEO.

The brewery is also switching to Cradle-to-Cradle CertifiedTM silver inks on its bottle labels to improve recyclability and introducing a new coating on refillable glass bottles to extend their lifespan.

## THE GLOBAL STANDARD FOR THE EXACT MASS OF ONE KILOGRAM SITS UNDER LOCK AND KEY OUTSIDE PARIS:

Since 1889, the mass of a kilogram has been defined by an object known as the international prototype kilogram (IPK) which is located in an environmentally monitored safe in a lower vault in the basement of the International Bureau of Weights and Measures in Sèvres, Paris. Housed under three bell jars, access to this precious cylinder requires three keys, operated independently, of which only two are kept in France.

Since its creation in 1889 (it was forged in London before being taken to France), the cylinder has only been removed from its secure housing once every 40 years. This rare appearance only occurs so that its mass can be checked against sister copies, which are housed in locations across the globe. It's a delicate process, as hydrocarbons on fingertips or moisture in the air could contaminate the original's pristine surface, potentially causing tiny changes in mass to the world's definition of a kilo.

## A LIQUORICE FESTIVAL:

For those who enjoy the sweet, medicinal flavour of liquorice, Pontefract's annual Liquorice Festival each July the town celebrates its leading role in England's love affair with liquorice, in particular through the "Pomfret" or Pontefract cake. Created in 1760, these black, coin-shaped "lozenges" were made of cooked liquorice sap and could be dissolved in water. Once used to treat ailments and sweeten other medicines, the cake eventually became better known as a snack toward the end of the 19th century. In the 1920s, as many as 10 factories and their mostly female labour force in Pontefract and the surrounding region were transforming locally farmed liquorice into hand-stamped cakes.

Liquorice-based fashion is a big part of the annual festival, which began in the 1990s, with some years featuring all kinds of wearable confectionery, including dresses, liquorice-lined boots, and even a liquorice jewellery-making station. The town also provides free travel on the "Liquorice Land Train" to Pontefract Castle, where people can take a tour or watch movies such as Willy Wonka & the Chocolate Factory on the grounds.

And for the tried and true liquorice lovers, the festival features a vast array of classic liquorice plus innovative savoury snacks such as liquorice-laden Yorkshire pies and sausage rolls and rare liquorice plants.

There's really nothing as exhilarating as taking in the sights and sounds of Amsterdam from the water aboard a scenic canal cruise. And in a city that champions inclusivity while boasting a concentric network of 17th century canals there's naturally a cruise option for everyone including cruises that involve plucking plastic rubbish from

waterways.

Plastic Whale, an environmental organisation describing itself as the "first professional plastic fishing company in the world," is the operator of that option.

Popular with locals and tourists alike, Plastic Whale's two-hour sightseeing-cum-plastic litter removal expeditions are the only cruises in town where passengers are provided with mesh nets and encouraged to actively remove things — plastic waste, specifically — from canals.

In the seven years that Plastic Whale has been in operation, the company and a revolving cast of volunteer fisher-people have removed over 146,000 plastic bottles from Amsterdam's UNESCO Heritage Site-listed canals. As of this past May - 2,194 bags of "plastic soup" have been hauled away and in a tidy full-circle twist, the contents of these bags are being used to build Plastic Whale's ever-growing fleet of boats. Over 15,500 volunteers have embarked on Plastic Whale canal cruises to date. The cruises also serve as a popular team-building activity for local companies and as an educational tool for school groups.





By the time you reach your final years in primary school, you will be totally comfortable with your school environment. By sixth class, you are one of the most senior people in your school and you are used to being given responsibility and looked up to by the younger children. However the transition to secondary school means that you have to revert to being the most junior again and have to cope with a brand new environment. Change can be a daunting task for any one of us and can take a lot of adjusting to.

Easily the biggest change when entering secondary school is going from the experience of one teacher all day in one classroom to encountering eight or nine different teachers and subject/classroom changes every forty minutes or so. A tip to help you cope with this is to write down the name of each new teacher beside the name of the subject and write your own version of the class timetable. The second big change is the constant movement between classrooms throughout the day. Depending on your subject choices, you will be moving all around the school. Getting lost during the first few weeks will be inevitable and a good tip is to always stay with at least one other person from the class. Another big adjustment is the number of specific subjects you will be covering. Students in First Year will cover up to sixteen different subjects; many of these will be new to you. Discuss all the subjects at home with your parents and let them know which ones you struggle with. Everyone will have their own favourites and will excel at certain subjects.

Your timetable will take a lot of getting used to and you may need help initially in the organisation of your schoolbag each day. Each student will also be provided with a locker and be sure to use your locker to avoid 'heavy bag syndrome'

Homework time is obviously going to increase. However not all subjects are covered every day and not all subjects involve homework. Learn how to successfully manage your time and don't rule out the possibility of supervised study. Schools reports may also be a new experience that comes with secondary school as regular reports come home from the school. Taking part in games and P.E. is a great way of getting to know more students in your school. Find activities which you and enjoy and try out new activities even if you haven't tried something before, or if you don't know what the activity entails:

If you find yourself struggling with any aspect of this change be sure to talk to someone: Your parents, a friend, a class teacher or school counsellor. This time will fly by, and before long your new school will feel like your second home!!
