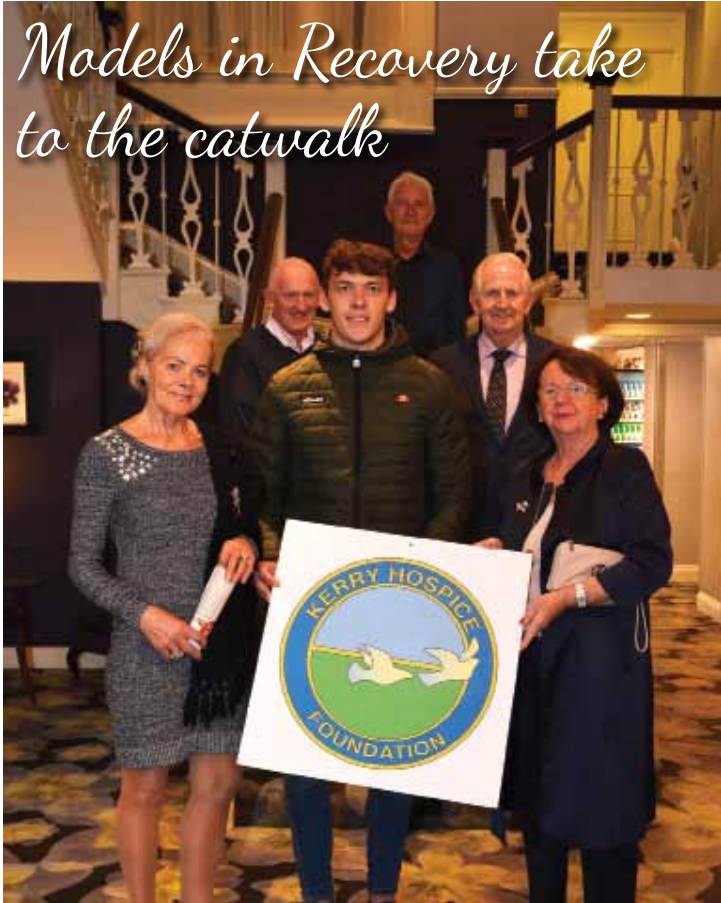

Gary Anderson, two time World Darts Champion and current Matchplay Champion, will be in the Gleneagle on Saturday, September 15 competing against 20 locals, in aid of the Ian O'Connell Trust. "It was an honour to take part in the Ring of Kerry Cycle with my family this year in support of Ian. The influence he has had on people across Ireland is tangible - we can certainly all learn something from his incredible positivity and steely determination.

The former GAA president and patron for the KN Group All-Ireland GAA Golf Challenge arranged for a specially designed social car to be donated to the young man as part of the competition's fundraiser earlier this year.

"Ian has always been very active in his local Spa GAA club. The injuries he sustained have now left him paralysed from the shoulders down so he is facing a long road to recovery, and his courage has made a tremendous impact on communities around the country. The Ireland South MEP was both a student and teacher in Ian's school, St. Brendan's College Killarney, and grew up in the same parish as Ian's mother, in Kilcummin.

"The generosity of rural Ireland has always been second to none, and this has been especially true in the case of Ian O'Connell's

trust fund over the last year. The GAA spirit of fellowship and friendship has been felt strongly throughout the community efforts made for Ian's rehabilitation."

One of Kerry's greatest servants Kieran Donaghy has announced his retirement from Inter County Football.

The Austin Stack's Clubman announced on Tuesday of this week that even though he didn't want his journey to end with Kerry, the time was now right.

"The journey has been full of ups and downs but I never wanted it to end. It has surpassed even my wildest dreams, that a basketball kid from Tralee would end up playing 69 times in the championship over a 14 year period for the famous Green and Gold", he said.

"To every one of my Kerry teammates who I was lucky enough to have played with, I thank you for your patience, help and advice during those years. I'm blessed to have had the time of my life with you boys fighting on my back trying to win games for Kerry. We had some tough times, such as life but the wonderful stories and memories we shared will stick with me forever.

I would like to thank the Kerry County Board along with our sponsors Kerry Group, backroom staff and medical teams for their constant help and guidance throughout my career. Your unbelievable work is not seen by many but it's massively appreciated by the team and by me.

A huge thank you to the loyal Kerry fans who traveled far and wide to watch and support us. We love football in this county and while there is a pressure to perform we always embrace it.

We need to get behind this young team we will have next year, so get the flags out and get to the games to support the boys.

I would also like to thank all the supporters who live abroad but continue their love and support of Kerry.

I would like to thank my club Austin Stacks, everything I achieved is a direct result of the help and guidance ye gave me from an early age. To represent this great club is always a massive privilege and our county championship win in 2014 gave me the ultimate honour the following season. To be captain of a county like Kerry is something I'm extremely proud to have accomplished.

To my family, without you none of this would have been possible. Mom, I am forever grateful to you for believing in me and showing me how to be a good person first and foremost.

To my wife Hilary, you're all that I could ask for, thank you so much for always putting me first during my career, we have had so many wonderful experiences together throughout this journey and made life long friends along the way I can't wait to start the next exciting chapter together with Lola-Rose & Indie.

To the rest of my family, thank you for your support and always having my back.

I'm a proud Kerry man and to have represented this county meant absolutely everything to me. As the great John B Keane once said, 'I'm one

lucky hoor!'"

Speaking about Kieran Donaghy's

retirement, County Chairman Tim Murphy said retirement brings an end to the inter county playing career of one of Kerry's greatest servants. His leadership on and off the field was extremely important over the last year in particular as a lot of younger players were integrated into the panel for the first time.

He acted as a mentor and confidant to many of these new players and has successfully helped them understand what it really means to be a Kerry footballer. Kieran was an inspirational player for his fellow team mates and supporters alike. His capacity to get our supporters behind the team on match day was unparalleled as was evidenced in many a crucial match for the County.

His performances during 2014 were heroic and memorable culminating in an exceptional individual performance in the final against Donegal. Kieran was always happy to advise and encourage everyone and undoubtedly has left the team, the County and the famed Kerry jersey in a better place. We wish Kieran, his wife Hillary and their children all the very best in the future'

By combining resources the merged credit unions will have assets of over €140 million, savings of €123 million and combined reserves of under €17 million. The merger is expected to be completed at the end of September, subject to final approval from the Central Bank of Ireland. Members will be unaffected by this process and can continue to do business as normal

with their credit union. This 'transfer of engagements' is a welcome development for both credit unions which will now focus on providing enhanced member services in their local communities.

The credit union offices will remain open and fully operational and savings at both credit unions remain protected by the Government's Deposit Guarantee Scheme of up to €100,000 per depositor.

The decision was taken for the credit unions to come together in order to improve efficiency for members of both credit unions, and so that the credit unions can work together to grow and meet the increasing demands of members for a wider range and depth of services.

The credit union in Caherciveen Credit Union will now operate under a branch network structure with its head office located in Beech Road, Killarney.

The credit unions will also be able to work together to manage regulatory requirements

with the main objective of enhancing service provision, and will continue to lead the way in the provision of loans, savings and budgeting services and accessible, friendly financial services in the local areas of South Kerry.

The Kerry Way Ultra Marathon 2018 Rain and Rainbows at the 200k Non-Stop Race

This year's annual 200KM non stop endurance race -The Kerry Way Ultra Marathon, saw over 70 athletes depart Killarney, from 14 Countries, enduring heavy downpours during nightfall, and glorious evening rainbows along the daunting 40 hour, non stop Ultra Marathon. The Race traverses the MacGillycuddy's Reeks and Iveragh Peninsula, stretching along The Wild Atlantic Way, along ancient trails, old roads and coastal cliffs. It is Ireland's longest distance trail.

The Marathon was won by Gavin Byrne in a time of 26 hours and 38 minutes. Killarney native Sean Clifford, who lead for much of the way came second in a remarkable close finish of just a 3 minute difference - 26 hours and 41 minutes. Another Killarney Native Joe O'Leary was joint third with Stephen Davis. Claire Morrissey won the Ladies title in a time of 37 hours and 55 minutes.

The second race known as The Kerry WayLite Marathon 50Km race departing from Sneem and continues along the Kerry Way Route, taking in Templenoe, Kenmare, the 'Old Kenmare Road', through Killarney National Park returning to Killarney. The race was won by Barry Drennan, in a time of 5 hours and 51 minutes. First Lady was Sarah Enright in 6 hours and 21 minutes.

Race Director Eileen Daly remarked " I will never underestimate the determination of the runners, marshals, support crews volunteers, and kindness of The Kerry Way Landowners. My own back up team worked tirelessly over the weekend. Both marathons reached a phenomenal amount of viewers who engaged with our live tracking on our Facebook page"

All Competitors bring their own support crews who meet them at various junctions along the route, a huge welcome especially during the night watch. 14 countries worldwide were represented this year.

SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE

Definitely yes because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. PRE-LETTING EXPENDITURE IN RESPECT OF VACANT RESIDENTIAL PREMISES

Expenses incurred on a vacant residential premises prior to it being first let after a period of non-occupancy are allowable as a deduction against rental income from that premises.

The premises must have been vacant for at least 12 months and then let as a residential premises between 25th December 2017 (the date of the passing of the Finance Act 2017) and 31 December 2021.

The expenditure must have been incurred in the 12 months before the premises is let as a residential premises.

The deduction authorised is capped at €5,000 per vacant premises.

If the person who incurs the expenditure ceases to let the property as a residential premises within 4 years of the first letting the deduction will be clawed-back in the year in which the property ceases to be let as a residential premises. This cessation can be either on sale of the property or change of use from rented residential property. The claw-back will be made by deeming the deduction previously allowed to be a Case V profit or gain of the year of cessation.

Tusla launches National Child and Family Support Week in Kerry

Tusla-Child and Family Agency has launched its first ever national promotional drive to highlight the range of services it provides as part of its Prevention, Partnership and Family Support (PPFS) programme.

Tusla National Child and Family Support Week will feature special public events across Kerry and will be backed up by a national and regional advertising campaign across media platforms.

There are now almost 863,000 families with children in Ireland and some 1.68 million children in families in Ireland, according to Census 2016. Tusla provides extensive support services to assist all parents, children, and young people as part of its PPFS programme. This programme aims to stop problems experienced by families from getting worse, or from developing into a crisis.

Tusla National Child and Family Support Week aims to create widespread public awareness of Tusla's high-quality PPFS programme, leading to increased engagement with its services by families, parents and children.

Recent studies by the UNESCO Child and Family Research Centre at NUI Galway found that, with regard to help-seeking for a parenting

or family problem, personal support networks – family and friends – were the main source of support for the public. Members of the public turned to their GP primarily if they could not manage a parent or family problem, while increasing numbers of people are asking a teacher for assistance in this area. The findings also suggested that both the public and the media do not clearly differentiate the concept of family support from child protection, and children in care. However, there has been a significant increase in knowledge of Tusla services overall, among the public, in recent years.

Speaking ahead of Tusla National Child and Family Support Week clinical psychologist David Coleman stated: *"I've been working in clinical practice with children, teenagers and their families for over 20 years and have consistently seen that preventative help for parents and children is always better than having to respond in a crisis. I've been jointly involved with Tusla services with some of my clients over the years, and I've seen, first hand, the high level of support that Tusla and the Family Resource Centre network can offer. If it 'takes a village to raise a child', then Tusla can help families to*

connect in with their 'village', accessing those vital community and parenting supports."

Ann Moynihan Senior PPFS Manager for Kerry said: *"Tusla is not just a child protection agency. It has an expanded child and family support role with a spectrum of specialist services. Tusla is a cornerstone in supporting families within their communities. If a child or family needs support, Tusla is there to help. Our Prevention, Partnership and Family Support programme seeks to work with families at an early stage to resolve problems, to prevent harm, and to improve outcomes for children, young people and families. And we work collaboratively with our partner organisations to strengthen families and communities."*

EDUCATION OUTLOOK

Outstanding Junior Cert results but select your Leaving Cert subjects carefully

Results were issued yesterday to 62,968 candidates nationwide, including 1,936 (919 female/997 male) candidates from Kerry, who signed up for the Junior Cert exam. Today they are celebrating a significant success in their first public exam. The Junior Cert exam is often overshadowed by the more public Leaving Cert exam but it's an important exam in its own right.

After three years in Junior Cycle, students get their first exposure to a public exam of the State Examinations Commission (SEC). Candidates are awarded a Level 3 qualification on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ). This Cert is a valuable document as it confirms that the candidate has successfully completed Junior Cycle education at the subject levels and grades shown on the Cert.

Six new grade descriptors - Distinction, Higher Merit, Merit, Achieved, Partially Achieved, Not Graded - are being gradually phased in until 2021 in the reformed Junior Cycle programme. Both the old A, B, C, D, E, F and NG grades and the new grading systems will appear side-by-side on the results issued by the SEC.

The broad curricular base of the Junior Cycle gives students insights into their aptitudes, abilities, interests and personality. The exam also measures a candidate's standard at the end of the Junior Cycle. As well as the academic content, subjects like Physical Education, Career Guidance, Social and Health Education (SHE), Civic, Social and Political Education (CSPE) along with a comprehensive programme of extra-curricular activities develop self-awareness in each student. In short, a personal career profile begins to emerge during the Junior Cycle.

With very few students now leaving school after this exam, the Junior Cert is a passport to Senior Cycle education, which lasts for two or three years. Senior Cycle caters for students in the 15 to 18 year age group. The optional Transition Year (TY), which follows immediately after the Junior Cycle provides an opportunity for students to experience a wide range of educational inputs, including work experience, during a year that is free from formal exams.

During the final two years of Senior Cycle students take one of three programmes, each leading to a state exam - the traditional Leaving Certificate (LC), the Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme (LCVP) or the Leaving Certificate Applied (LCA).

The traditional Leaving Cert exam, a Level 5 qualification, is the terminal exam of post-primary education and is taken when students are about 18 years of age. Syllabi are available in more than 30 subjects and students usually study seven subjects including Irish, English and Mathematics. All subjects are available at higher and ordinary level. A foundation level paper is also available in Irish and Mathematics.

The Leaving Cert Vocational Programme (LCVP), also a Level 5 qualification, is similar to the traditional Leaving Cert, with some additional modules called Link Modules, which have a vocational focus.

The Leaving Cert Applied (LCA), a Level 4 qualification, is a self-contained two-year course, which meets the needs of students who are not adequately catered for by the other Leaving Cert programmes. It is a person-centered course involving a cross-curricular approach rather

than a subject based structure.

Congratulations to all Junior Cert candidates, who got their results yesterday. Most schools will now give those moving on to Senior Cycle a few days to firm up their Leaving Cert subject choice. Carefully consider your Leaving Cert subject choice, think about your course options and the related careers. In the end, select wisely as this is the first step on your path to college.

Next week, I'll have some advice about transition from primary to post-primary school.

Getting that man in your life fitter, stronger, and leaner

This might sound like a touchy subject coming from me, a female trainer. However this weeks tips are coming direct from Neilus Hayes (qualified personal trainer, & strength & conditioning coach). One big tip I will give you is never "force" the man in your life into fitness or eating healthy. Let him come to the realisation himself. All you can do is help, support and gently plants to seeds of change by starting with yourself first and he should follow suit within time.

TOP TIPS WITH NEILUS

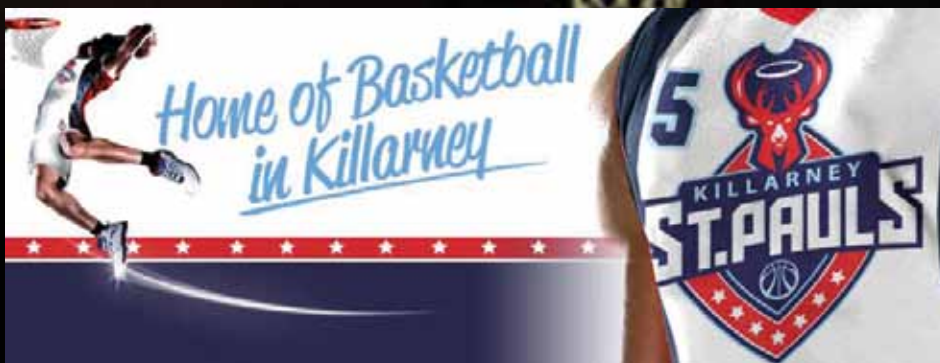

CARING FOR CREATION:

By now, we're all too familiar with the horrific photos of wild animals caught in plastic rings, and in an effort to cut down on six-pack ring waste, brewing company Carlsberg has introduced a rather ingenious solution – a Snap Pack held together with glue.

The Danish company described its new concept as a "world first for the beer industry" and reports that the introduction of the Snap Pack will cut the amount of plastic used in its traditional beer multi-packs by as much as 76%. Once the packaging appears in the stores, it is set to reduce plastic waste by more than 1,200 tonnes a year, which equals approx 60 million plastic bags. The glue is strong enough to keep the cans safely together, especially during transport, but the cans can also be easily pulled apart by the consumer.

"We always strive to improve and today's launch clearly shows our ambition to follow in our founder's footsteps towards a better tomorrow," said the Carlsberg Group CEO.

The brewery is also switching to Cradle-to-Cradle Certified™ silver inks on its bottle labels to improve recyclability and introducing a new coating on refillable glass bottles to extend their lifespan.

THE GLOBAL STANDARD FOR THE EXACT MASS OF ONE KILOGRAM SITS UNDER LOCK AND KEY OUTSIDE PARIS:

Since 1889, the mass of a kilogram has been defined by an object known as the international prototype kilogram (IPK) which is located in an environmentally monitored safe in a lower vault in the basement of the International Bureau of Weights and Measures in Sèvres, Paris. Housed under three bell jars, access to this precious cylinder requires three keys, operated independently, of which only two are kept in France.

Since its creation in 1889 (it was forged in London before being taken to France), the cylinder has only been removed from its secure housing once every 40 years. This rare appearance only occurs so that its mass can be checked against sister copies, which are housed in locations across the globe. It's a delicate process, as hydrocarbons on fingertips or moisture in the air could contaminate the original's pristine surface, potentially causing tiny changes in mass to the world's definition of a kilo.

A LIQUORICE FESTIVAL:

For those who enjoy the sweet, medicinal flavour of liquorice, Pontefract's annual Liquorice Festival each July the town celebrates its leading role in England's love affair with liquorice, in particular through the "Pomfret" or Pontefract cake. Created in 1760, these black, coin-shaped "lozenges" were made of cooked liquorice sap and could be dissolved in water. Once used to treat ailments and sweeten other medicines, the cake eventually became better known as a snack toward the end of the 19th century. In the 1920s, as many as 10 factories and their mostly female labour force in Pontefract and the surrounding region were transforming locally farmed liquorice into hand-stamped cakes.

Liquorice-based fashion is a big part of the annual festival, which began in the 1990s, with some years featuring all kinds of wearable confectionery, including dresses, liquorice-lined boots, and even a liquorice jewellery-making station. The town also provides free travel on the "Liquorice Land Train" to Pontefract Castle, where people can take a tour or watch movies such as Willy Wonka & the Chocolate Factory on the grounds.

And for the tried and true liquorice lovers, the festival features a vast array of classic liquorice plus innovative savoury snacks such as liquorice-laden Yorkshire pies and sausage rolls and rare liquorice plants.

Plastic Whale, an environmental organisation describing itself as the "first professional plastic fishing company in the world," is the operator of that option.

Popular with locals and tourists alike, Plastic Whale's two-hour sightseeing-cum-plastic litter removal expeditions are the only cruises in town where passengers are provided with mesh nets and encouraged to actively remove things — plastic waste, specifically — from canals.

In the seven years that Plastic Whale has been in operation, the company and a revolving cast of volunteer fisher-people have removed over 146,000 plastic bottles from Amsterdam's UNESCO Heritage Site-listed canals. As of this past May - 2,194 bags of "plastic soup" have been hauled away and in a tidy full-circle twist, the contents of these bags are being used to build Plastic Whale's ever-growing fleet of boats. Over 15,500 volunteers have embarked on Plastic Whale canal cruises to date. The cruises also serve as a popular team-building activity for local companies and as an educational tool for school groups.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I have a small farm that I work on full-time but the profit margins are very low. I am married with two children. Is there any State support available?

ANSWER

Farm Assist is a means-tested social welfare payment for farmers aged between 18 and 66, paid by the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP). To qualify, you must satisfy a means test.

To qualify for Farm Assist, you must show that your means are below a certain level. Your means include:

- Any income that you and your spouse or partner have (including income from farming, other forms of self-employment and from schemes)
- Any property that you and your spouse or partner have (except your home)
- Other asset(s) that could provide you with an income

When you apply for Farm Assist, a social welfare officer visits you to carry out the means test.

Different assessment rules apply to different types of income. For farm income, 70% is assessed but there is an annual disregard of €254 for each of your dependent children. (The disregards for your children are applied first and 70% of the balance is assessed.)

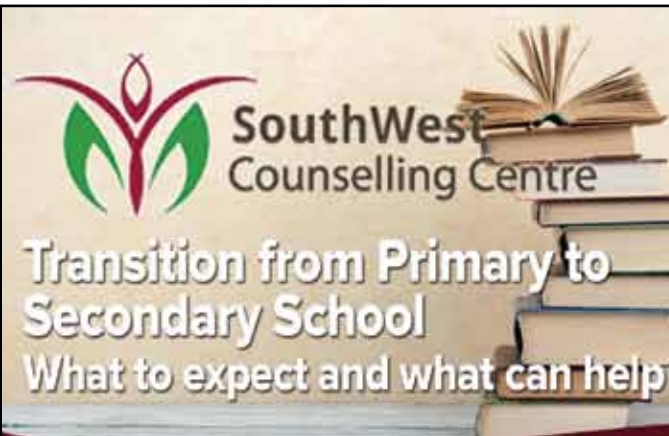
Your means from all sources are added together to get a total assessed weekly means. If your weekly means are less than the maximum rate of Farm Assist (that is, the maximum amount your family could get if you had no means), you will be paid the difference between your means and the maximum rate.

You can apply by filling out form Farm 1 which you can download from welfare.ie. You can also get forms from your local Intreo Centre or Social Welfare Branch Office. Further information is available from the Citizens Information Service below.

By the time you reach your final years in primary school, you will be totally comfortable with your school environment. By sixth class, you are one of the most senior people in your school and you are used to being given responsibility and looked up to by the younger children. However the transition to secondary school means that you have to revert to being the most junior again and have to cope with a brand new environment. Change can be a daunting task for any one of us and can take a lot of adjusting to.

Easily the biggest change when entering secondary school is going from the experience of one teacher all day in one classroom to encountering eight or nine different teachers and subject/classroom changes every forty minutes or so. A tip to help you cope with this is to write down the name of each new teacher beside the name of the subject and write your own version of the class timetable. The second big change is the constant movement between classrooms throughout the day. Depending on your subject choices, you will be moving all around the school. Getting lost during the first few weeks will be inevitable and a good tip is to always stay with at least one other person from the class. Another big adjustment is the number of specific subjects you will be covering. Students in First Year will cover up to sixteen different subjects; many of these will be new to you. Discuss all the subjects at home with your parents and let them know which ones you struggle with. Everyone will have their own favourites and will excel at certain subjects.

Your timetable will take a lot of getting used to and you may need help initially in the organisation of your schoolbag each day. Each student will also be provided with a locker and be sure to use your locker to avoid 'heavy bag syndrome'.

Homework time is obviously going to increase. However not all subjects are covered every day and not all subjects involve homework. Learn how to successfully manage your time and don't rule out the possibility of supervised study. Schools reports may also be a new experience that comes with secondary school as regular reports come home from the school. Taking part in games and P.E. is a great way of getting to know more students in your school. Find activities which you enjoy and try out new activities even if you haven't tried something before, or if you don't know what the activity entails.

If you find yourself struggling with any aspect of this change be sure to talk to someone: Your parents, a friend, a class teacher or school counsellor. This time will fly by, and before long your new school will feel like your second home!!

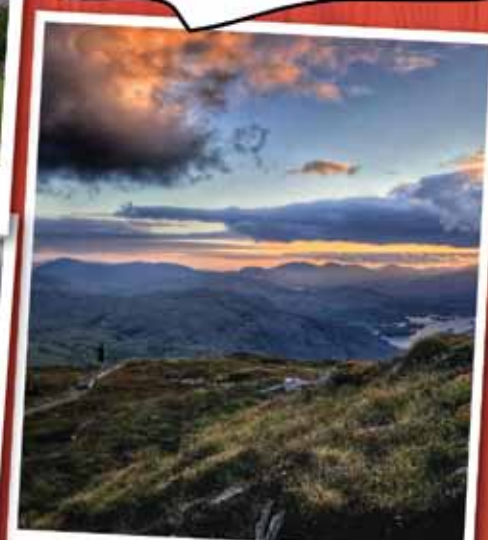

FOCUS ON WINTER BEDDING PLANTS

With most of the summer bedding displays in hanging baskets, containers and window boxes nearly finished now is the time to start replanting them with a winter selection of bedding plants. Even though you won't have as much of a selection of winter bedding as you have in the summer, there is still a large range to choose from. When you are choosing your winter bedding plants, try to pick the biggest and the strongest as they don't grow during the winter. The good thing about the winter displays in containers is that you can choose what you want as a centre piece, because you will probably get a few seasons out of it in the container and you can plant it somewhere in your garden afterwards. Some good centre pieces for containers are large, ie: Phormium, Cordyline, (green or purple), Variegata, Holly or Bay Tree. Small, ie: Carex Algold, Heuchara, Euonymus, Azalea, but just make sure when choosing that the plant is evergreen. There is also a good selection of flowering winter bedding such as Violets, Pansy, Primrose, Polyanthis, Cyclamen, Ornamental Cabbage.

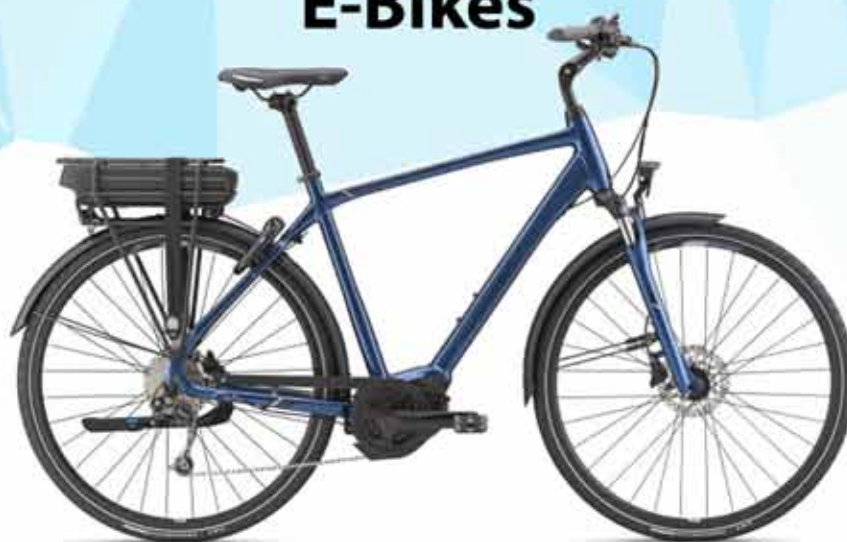
