



# FROM HOLLYWOOD TO HOME FOR MICHAEL FASSBENDER

From the glitz and glamour of Hollywood to the warm embrace of the town he calls home, Michael Fassbender has been honoured in Killarney with the greatest accolade the town he grew up in can bestow.

Fassbender has been inducted into the Order of Innisfallen in recognition of his remarkable achievements in the film industry, which has seen him nominated for Academy Awards, Golden Globes and BAFTAs. And in the process, he availed of every opportunity to promote Killarney on an international scale. The 39-year-old actor was honoured by the town's Chamber of Tourism and Commerce and Kerry County Council at a reception at Muckross House in Killarney National Park on Friday evening and, later, at a gala black tie ball in the five-star Europe Hotel and Resort. He was accompanied on the night by stunning screen star and Oscar winner Alicia Virkander and his Killarney based parents, Josef and Adele.

Michael's family home is in Fossa, on the outskirts of Killarney town. He was once an altar boy at the nearby Prince of Peace Church in Fossa and he attended the local national school before going on to St Brendan's College and, later, successfully chasing his dream to become one of the world's most in-demand actors.

He has starred in such blockbusters as 12 Years A Slave, Hunger, Steve Jobs, Prometheus, Frank, Shame, MacBeth and Jane Eyre and he has just completed Assassin's Creed.

The Order of Innisfallen award is presented annually to people who have made a significant contribution to the economy of Killarney. The presentation was made by Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce President, Kate O'Leary, and Mayor of Killarney, Cllr Brendan Cronin.

Indeed the Mayor during his speech was happy to claim to having something in common with the two time Oscar nominee

"Unlike Michael, I never made it myself in the acting world, but we do have one very important thing in common – we are both former students of St Brendan's College here in Killarney. The 'Sem' has produced many famous graduates over the years and probably none more so than Michael Fassbender."

Mayor Cronin went onto to add "In achieving what he has on the world stage, Michael Fassbender has brought significant international profile to Killarney and Fossa in particular. He is regularly referred to in the media as 'Irish actor' or 'Killarney actor' or even 'Fossa actor' and such references only serve to further raise the profile of our beautiful town and our beautiful county on the international stage. Fossa in particular is particularly proud of its native son. I recall that whenever Michael

has been nominated for an award that the flags and signs go up in Fossa wishing Michael well, particularly with large signs opposite the Golden Nugget pub wishing Michael all the best.

Despite his international stardom, Michael Fassbender has never denied or shied away from his roots in Kerry. He has retained his links with Killarney and is a regular visitor to the town.

Previous recipients of award the include singer Daniel O'Donnell who attracts thousands of fans to his concerts in Killarney every year, Isolde Liebherr whose family has been a premier employer in Killarney for decades, Margaret Cahill, the former head of Tourism Ireland Europe and Brian Stack of CIE Tours International.

The Cairde Chill Airne Order of Innisfallen awards scheme is a joint initiative between Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce and Kerry County Council which was established in 2005 to recognise outstanding contributions of many great people to the economic development of the town and its tourism industry.

# **IUNVA LOOKING FOR NEW MEMBERS IN KERRY**

It is without doubt that soldiers, army medical staff and all those who experience the horrors of war and real life combat have to contend with devastating stress, anxiety and sustained, ever present, threat.

Examples of such resulting mental problems are shell shock and Gulf War Syndrome. However, in more recent times there is a far greater understanding for those recovering

from the horrors of active service. Indeed there are now very helpful services available to help those experiencing Post-Traumatic Stress and other mental health problems resulting from tours of duty.

One such service is the Irish United Nations Veterans Association (IUNVA) which has been in the process of being developed in Kerry since 2010. Membership of this Association (IUNVA) is open to both retired and serving members of the Defence Forces and An Garda Síochána who have served on United Nations missions abroad.

The Association is run by Post 32 Chairman Tom Bermingham who spoke to the Outlook looking to seek out extra members and people who would have an interest in helping out.

"The goal of IUNVA was that there would be a place where a group of people that understand their war experiences will be and where they can receive counselling and other services for the Association members with their families of course. It's a nice thing to have to meet up once a month. In Kerry we currently have 23 members and it is building all the time."

Some of the many admirable objectives of the I.U.N.V.A. are to "Provide advice and counselling services for members and their families and to establish a scheme or schemes to benefit members and their dependants."

"People can help the Association on our Flag Day on Saturday the 22nd in October in Tralee with our members collecting funds in uniform. The best way to help is to pass on the word that we are here and looking for members."

# **GLEESON WELCOMES PAVEMENT OVERLAY**

At the Kerry County Council meeting of May, 2015 Councillor Michael Gleeson highlighted the deplorable condition of much of the N22 National Primary Road from the County Bounds to Killarney. By way of photographs he sought to impress how potholed and dangerous the road was in places particularly close to Cornamaree Bridge in the town land of Derryreagh, Clonkeen. This week it was

good news for ClIr Gleeson as the TII (Formerly the NRA) approved funding for a 3 Kilometre pavement overlay. Speaking with the Outlook the Kerry Independent Alliance ClIr said "I am now very pleased to inform the travelling public that the TII [Formerly the NRA] has commenced a 3 Kilometre Pavement Overlay scheme at cost of almost €500,000 along the above mentioned stretch.

This will ensure that the road will be much safer for all travelling on the Killarney / Ballyvourney road. There are many other poor sections on this vital access road to our beautiful county, including two very busy roundabouts and a deplorable level crossing at Minish and it is imperative for the economic welfare of Kerry that they too are upgraded as quickly as possible.









# **KERRY TEACHERS TUNE IN TO TRADTIME APP**

Primary school teachers in Kerry can now avail of an innovative software application called TradTime that enables them to easily impart the skills of traditional Irish music playing to their pupils.

Developed by West Limerick man and noted musician, Willie Larkin, the web-based TradTime app is freely available to teachers at primary level for music tuition and practice in the classroom. It uses a combination of the latest computer technology, cartoon characters and musical tunes played by experienced traditional musicians and tutors.

The Education Centre, Tralee scheduled a workshop on TradTime for Primary teachers in its catchment area (Kerry). Teachers were introduced to the new interactive app, the first of its kind in Ireland. The developer Willie Larkin from Templeglantine outlined how TradTime provides a step-by-step, easy-to-follow guide on how to play traditional music, beginning with the tin whistle.

"The app is suited to all age groups at primary level, from Junior Infants upwards" explained Willie. "It is designed to provide a systematic and structured approach to music tuition that can assist teachers, irrespective of their knowledge of traditional music, while also helping pupils to develop their talents in a fun and non-competitive manner," he added.

Referring to the workshop, Caitriona Ní Chullota, Director of the Education Centre Tralee said it is hoped that these teachers will begin to use the software application in the classrooms to support Arts Education with specific reference to the Music Curriculum. "Based on a review of the impact of the introductory workshop, further workshops on the new TradTime programme for teachers in Kerry will be considered" she added.

One of the largest crowds to attend a meeting in Gaelscoil Faithleann turned up to hear Dr Fergus Heffernan discuss how to better understand well-being for themselves and their families.

Organised by the Gaelscoil Parents Council, an audience of more than 150 people heard Dr Heffernan say that, "Anxiety is at the heart of all of our problems and what we are all looking for is a place to belong and feel connected and listened too". There was silence in the large audience for the entirety of his talk, broken only by laughter and applause.

He feels that we are passing on anxiety to our children with pressure to perform well and also involvement in a multitude of activities, with little down time. Dr Heffernan said,

"Children must learn to make mistakes, they must learn about loss and grieving, as otherwise they won't learn to cope or build resilience. He feels two after-school activities are enough for children to be involved with, as they need free time, and they also can learn to opt out at an early age when overloaded." Mary Carroll, Secretary of the Gaelscoil Parents Council said the audience was delighted with the event.

"It was a positive, reflective evening, and everyone seemed to take something from Dr Heffernan's talk. It was a great opportunity for parents to stop in the busy rush of life and reflect on what are the important things to manage for ourselves and our families. Events like this really add to the community of our school."



#### HOW DO YOU GET ACCESS TO YOUR PENSION?

# **KILLARNEY HOUSE BENEFITS WITH** ADDITIONAL HALF MILLION

Seanad, Leas-Cathaoirleach Paul Coghlan welcomed the Minister for Public Expenditure, Pascal Donohue's confirmation that an additional €0.5 million will be allocated to Killarney House, under the Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural and Gaeltacht Affairs. It's one of a number of selected projects across the country that have received additional funding thanks to Budget 2017.

"Killarney House has already received €1.9 million from the Department. The refurbishment of Killarney House was announced in 2011, as a joint project between the Department and Fáilte Ireland, and I believe the house has the capacity to become the top tourist attraction in the

south-west. This continued support by Minister Donohue comes in what has been a crucial year for Killarney House, and will provide a vital link between the town centre and park.



# "A BUDGET FOR FAMILIES YOUNG AND OLD": GRIFFIN

Fine Gael Kerry TD, Brendan Griffin called Budget 2017 'a budget for families - young and old.' Griffin highlighted the childcare package as a signature element of this.

"a second free pre-school year (saving parents on average €4,000 per child), two weeks paid Paternity Leave for new fathers and free GP care for under 6s are all welxome"

In Budget 2017 Fine Gael is taking another step forward in supporting Kerry parents back into work or education, by designing more accessible and affordable childcare. The new scheme will be both universal and targeted in its approach.

"The Early Years are a priority for Fine Gael in supporting young children, but also their parents juggling so many different things. Fine Gael is using the benefits of a strong

economy to improve people's lives here in Kerry and across the country. This affordable childcare scheme builds on significant measures which Fine Gael has recently introduced, includina:



#### **BRASSIL WELCOMES INCREASE IN** SPENDING ON EXPENDITURE

Fianna Fail TD John Brassil welcomed the increase in spending on expenditure "Investment in services is what Fianna Fáil has been lobbying for in negotiations leading up to the budget rather than cuts in taxation."

Speaking to the Outlook afterwards he said " Whilst there was a little bit for everyone in the budget, with the increase of €5 in pension payments, plus increases across other welfare payments and cuts across the lower 3 USC rates there is some relief for a relatively wide demographic of the population, however we are still falling short in terms of the provision of vital services and this is where we need to be concentrating our spending, we will continue to seeing growing crises in our housing, health and education if the necessary capital is not invested. Budget 2017 represents a step in the right direction for investment in third level education and the increased allocation for housing in Budget 2017 is critical however a lack of measures to shake up the rental market is deeply disappointing, I am concerned given that the fact that there are no headline measures to deal with the overheated private rental market, and I also have reservations over the design of the new savings scheme for first time buyers. This initiative will see first time buyers chasing fewer than 10,000 new houses or apartments earmarked for construction next year. This scheme is useless without any accompanying measures to increase supply. In fact it could exacerbate the housing crisis by overheating the new builds market, which in turn will lead to increased house prices."



#### NOT ENOUGH FOR STUDENTS

Union of students of Ireland welcomed the €36.5 million in third level education but emphasised that it is insufficient by €100 million. The union recommended spending of €140million in their pre-budget submission to reduce registration fees and increase student support. USI welcomed the reintroduction of postgraduategrantsbutemphasised that it would only benefit 1,100 students from disadvantaged socioeconomic backgrounds,

and further investment would be needed

The union also welcomed the increase in the threshold for the 'rent a room' scheme, up from €12,000 to €14,000 which they said will benefit both homeowners and students but USI President Annie Hoey emphasised that digs was a short-term solution and purposebuilt student housing needed to be invested in as a long-term solution.

# **BUDGET 2017**

Self-employed taxpayers are among the main group who gained from Budget 2017, with a combination of an increased tax credit and cuts in USC rates delivering gains to many of around 2 per cent in take-home pay. The other major tax concession was directed at first-time housebuyers, with a tax refund of up to €20k on those buying newly built homes valued at up to €600k. The Minister also announced a number of positive proposals for entrepreneurs and SMEs. This Budget is cautious and prudent in its approach with no new personal taxes and minimal USC reliefs. Below we have addressed the main financial features of Budget 2017.

#### PERSONAL TAXATION UNIVERSAL SOCIAL CHARGE (USC) -HOW MUCH OF A CUT?

The reductions to USC that were announced in Budget 2017 will have a minimal effect on most people's take home pay in 2017. The Universal Social Charge cuts will benefit around 1.3 million people.

The changes will mean that people earning between €18,772 and €70,044 will see a decrease of 0.5% in their USC deductions. This will mean just an extra €2 a week take home pay for someone on €25k a year or an extra €5 a week for someone earning €55k a year. Someone on the minimum wage will only see an increase in weekly take home pay of €5.42 when the min wage goes up to €9.25.

People aged 70 or more with income under €60k will still have a maximum rate of 2.5% USC.Over 70's with income over €60k will still pay the same rates of USC as under 70's.

Medical card holders with income under €60k also have a top rate of 2.5% USC.

#### OTHER TAX RELIEFS TO INCOME TAX

The Home Carer's Tax Credit that is given to married couples or civil partners where one spouse or civil partner works in the home caring for a dependent person is increasing from €1,000 to €1.100.

The Home Renovation Incentive (HRI) which provide an income tax credit to homeowners who carry out renovation and improvement works on their principal private residences is being extended until 31 December 2018.

The rate of Deposit Interest Retention Tax (DIRT) will decrease by 2% each year for the next 4 years until it reaches 33%.

#### **BUSINESS TAXATION**

- · As committed in last year's Budget to bring the taxation of the self-employed (including proprietary directors) in line with that of PAYE employees, the Earned Income Credit has been increased from €550 to €950.
- An extension of PRSI related benefits for the selfemployed was also announced. The Finance Act will outline details of the additional benefits but it

is expected that the entitlement to the Invalidity Pension and Treatment Benefit schemes will be available to PRSI Class S contributors.

- · There was a further reduction in the preferential rate of Capital Gains Tax (CGT) from 20% to 10% under the Entrepreneur Relief regime. The reduced rate of CGT applied to the disposal of a whole or part of a business up to a lifetime limit of €1 million, subject to certain conditions being satisfied.
- · The Government has also committed to introducing an SME focussed share-based incentive in Budget 2018.
- · The VAT rate for the tourism sector remains unchanged at 9%.

#### **INCREASED BENEFITS TO LANDLORDS IN 2017**

The ceiling for exemption from income tax under the Rent a Room scheme for income received from the letting of a room or rooms in a person's principal private residence is being increased from €12,000 to €14,000 for 2017 and subsequent years.

The residential rental property relief available for qualifying interest payments on monies borrowed to purchase, improve or repair residential rental property is being increased from 75% to 80%. This measure will apply to both new and existing mortgages. In addition, full interest deductibility for landlords will be restored on a



phased basis. It will increase by instalments of 5% until the full 100% deductibility is restored.

#### TAX MEASURES FOR FARMERS

There are quite a few changes to tax measures for farmers in budget 2017.

The Farmer's Flat-Rate Addition will increase from 5.2% to 5.4% with effect from 1 January 2017.

The scheme of accelerated capital allowances for energy efficient equipment which could include bulk tanks and heating equipment is being made available to sole traders and non-corporates.

The Income Averaging regime is being amended to allow an "opt out" in a single year of unexpectedly poor income, and, instead, pay only the tax due on a current year basis with any deferred tax liability becoming payable over subsequent years. This may be availed of for the 2016 tax year.

Farm income and other income from off-farm self-employment will be assessed at 70%, (down from 100%) for Farm Assist.

#### HOUSING SECTOR

The Help to Buy Scheme is a welcomed initiative for first time buyers of newly built primary residences. This provides a rebate of income tax paid over the previous four years up to a maximum of 5% of the purchase price, capped at €400,000. No rebate on house purchases in excess of €600,000, and second hand properties do not qualify. Any rebate will be taken into account in the calculation of the deposit require to be eligible for a mortgage.

Those who will qualify:

- First time buyers who signed a contract to buy a new home after 19 July 2016
- First time buyers with a Loan to Value greater
- · First time buyers and joint purchase between first time buyers, both purchase must be first

The Mortgage Interest Relief is to be extended beyond December 2017 out to December 2020.

#### KERRY HOTELIERS WELCOME **RETENTION OF 9% VAT RATE**

The Irish Hotels Federation (IHF) welcomed the retention of the 9% tourism VAT rate announced by Minister Noonan as part of Budget 2017. Terence Mulcahy, Kerry Branch Chair of the IHF said the rate has been instrumental in the recovery of the tourism industry, which has created some 50,000 new jobs since the measure was introduced in 2011. "This measure has been the single most important fiscal initiative for

Irish tourism in the last decade and we are pleased the Government has retained the rate. It demonstrates that it has been highly effective in job creation and also acknowledges that we have a pro-tourism Government who see the value the industry brings to every part of our country located on the periphery of Europe. The decision is a vote of confidence in the tourism industry at a time of uncertainty due to Brexit," he said.



#### ONLY A SMALL DIFFERENCE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

Rehab, one of the country's largest disability charities, believes Budget 2017 will make only small changes to the lives of people with disabilities. While a €5 increase in social welfare

payments is welcome. it will do little to close the gap in income that people with disabilities have experienced over the last 8 years.

Of particular concern is the decision to limit reductionsinprescription charges to people aged over 70. This reduction should also have been extended to people with disabilities aged

under 70. A disability knows no age and does not distinguish between somebody who is 20-years-old or 75-years-old.



# A STEP TOWARDS SOLVING THE **HOUSING CRISIS**

Federation (CIF) welcomed housing measures but warned increased infrastructure investment is required to transform new housing estates into vibrant communities over the

next decade. CIF Director General, Tom Parlon said:

"The measures introduced are a significant step towards solving the housing crisis by addressing the chronic lack of supply in new builds. In terms of resolving the housing crisis, the CIF's Irish Home Builders Association welcomes the introduction of this tax rebate scheme aimed at helping firsttime buyers to save deposits for starter homes. There is an acute shortage of activity

in this sector because first-time buyers cannot secure mortgages. As a result, banks won't provide finance to home-builders making the building of new starter homes unviable.



# **IGNORES THE WORKING POOR** AND LACKS COHERENCE

"Budget 2017 yet again ignores the working poor. Although it contained a number of welcome initiatives, the working poor gain the least" - stated Dr Seán Healy, Director Social Justice Ireland at the launch of the organisations' Budget Response today.

"The choices Government made in cutting the Universal Social Charge and income tax are unfair and provide larger gains to those on higher incomes compared to those on lower incomes. For example, a single person earning €25,000 gains €127.60 per annum while a single person on €75,000 gains almost three times more (€352.82 per annum). For the same amount of money (€383m) Government could have made tax credits refundable (thus tackling the working poor issue) and given every tax-payer an additional tax credit of €100 per annum. In practice this would have meant that everyone would be €100 better off while the working poor would gain a little more"



# DOESN'T CREATE THE ENVIRONMENT FOR JOBS IT PROMISED

Retail Excellence Ireland felt the Government does not create jobs it creates the environment for jobs but this Budget does nothing to create such an environment.

Lynn Drumgoole, Communications Director with Retail Excellence Ireland, the country's largest retail industry body said 'The failure of the government to reduce the 23% VAT in light of Brexit, means we are losing competitiveness and retail jobs will be lost. As Sterling continues to weaken the growth of cross border shopping and online sales to UK companies means there is a real risk to the growth of the Irish economy.' Lynn also highlighted that leaving Employers PRSI at 8.5% goes against the Programme for Government 2016 'The PRSI rate doubled 2 years ago from 4.25% to 8.50% and the Programme for Government clearly states that they will cut the rate "for low income workers to mitigate the cost of minimum wage increases, in order to protect jobs" yet this hasn't happened. We are calling for an immediate reduction in employers PRSI otherwise jobs will be lost.'

Minister for Finance, Michael Noonan, T.D. and Minister for Public Expenditure & Reform, Paschal Donohoe, T.D. delivered their Budget speeches on Tuesday, in which they laid out a number of measures aimed at "repairing the damage done to our economy in the past and to ensure that we can look forward to a new Ireland with an equitable tax system that provides sustainable funding for efficient and effective world class public services".

#### David Moran outlines some of the key measures announced in Budget 2017 were:

- Cuts to three lowest rates of Universal Social Charge- 1% rate cut to 0.5%; 3% rate cut to 2.5%; 5.5% rate cut to 5%
- 2.5% USC rate ceiling increased from €18,668 to €18.772
- New income tax rebate of up to 5% under a Help to Buy Scheme for new homes valued up to €400.000
- State Pension will rise by €5 from March
- €5 increase in all weekly social welfare payments in line with State pension
- Christmas Bonus for those on social welfare will rise to 85%



- €1.2bn in funding for housing, with 47,000 new social housing units by 2021
- Additional €105m to enable 15,000 more households to avail of Housing Assistance Payment Scheme
- 2,400 additional teaching posts announced, of which 900 will be resource teachers
- 800 new gardal to be recruited in 2017, with more civilian staff to be hired too to free up deskbound officers
- €100 increase in Home Carers' Credit to €1,100
- Medical card for all children who receive domiciliary care allowance
- Additional €15m to NTPF to reduce hospital waiting lists
- €25 cap on prescription charges for over 70s reduced to €20 from 1 March
- Excise duty on pack of 20 cigarettes to go up by 50 cents

- Mortgage Interest Relief will be extended beyond December 2017 to 2020
- Earned Income Tax Credit for self-employed increased by €400 to €950
- Intention to introduce tax on sugar sweetened drinks in April 2018 after public consultation
- €28m increase in allocation for emergency accommodation to €100m
- New Single Affordable

- Childcare Scheme from September 2017 meanstested subsidies, based on parental income, for children between six months and 15 years and universal subsidies for all children aged six months to three years
- €15m to help progress National Broadband
- €319m to be spent on regional and local roads throughout the country

The Finance Bill is due to be published shortly and it will contain legislation for the provisions which were announced in the Budget. The proposals announced may be subject to change and additional provisions may be introduced when the legislation is enacted.







# TAX Matters with



#### TAX ISSUES FOR TENANTS

If you are renting accommodation privately and pay income tax, you may be eligible for tax relief on part of your rent. You can only daim this relief if you were already renting at 7 December 2010. If you were renting at 7 December 2010 you will continue to qualify for this relief even if you enter a different rental agreement after that date. The relief is being phased out and 2017 will be its last year.

Only the rent for private rented accommodation that you use as your sole or main residence will qualify for tax relief. This includes flats, apartments and houses. You cannot claim tax relief for rent paid to a local authority or a State agency.

You must provide receipts for rent you have paid if the Revenue Commissioners request them. You should keep your receipts for at least 6 years

#### RATES

Tax relief on private rented accommodation is calculated at the standard rate of 20%. The maximum amounts on which you can daim relief are as follows:

## **FOCUS ON DIVIDING** HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS

If you divide your herbaceous Perennials regularly it will ensure healthy, vigorous plants that will look good and should perform year after year. It also gives you the opportunity to multiply your plants.

Every two to three years should be enough to divide most perennials to maintain good vigor and healthy plants but if you want to divide them for the purpose of propagation, it can be done more regularly.

The best time to divide herbaceous Perennials is when the plants are dormant, so anytime from November to mid

A lot of spring flowering plants such as Irises, are best divided in Summer after flowering when they produce new shoots.

When you have divided your plant and you have either planted some in the border or in pots, remember to keep well watered until established.



Rathmore will rue this loss as they came very close to achieving their first-ever county SFC decider but came up inches short.


The East Kerry side created some great goal scoring opportunities, five in total over the 60 + minutes, but a failure to capitalise on any of these was to prove very costly.

John Galvin, of course, has managed South Kerry to county SFC glory against Crokes in 2009 and this adds more fuel to the fire. Galvin is widely recognised as one of Kerry's top coaches and he has an impressive CV under his belt, as has Pat O'Shea, who famously led Kerry to that never-to-be forgotten All-Ireland SFC final victory in 2007. To get to the final, Crokes comprehensively defeated West Kerry in Round 1 and followed up with wins over St Kieran's (Round 2), Kerins O'Rahilly's (Quarter-final) and Dingle (Semi-Final) while Kenmare District recorded wins over St Brendan's (Round 1), Killarney Legion (Round 2), Austin Stacks (Quarter-final) and Rathmore (semi-final) to set up what should be a mouth-watering and intriguing contest. Kenmare are backboned by players from Kenmare Shamrocks, All-Ireland Junior Champions Templenoe and Tousist.

Their semi-final victory over Rathmore was achieved at a cost as Gavin Crowley and Adrian Spillane had to retire injured which could see both doubtful.

Both of these players have been vital to Kenmare march to the decider but Crowley will almost certainly be ruled out as he suffered a broken collar bone while Adrian Spillane, who was inspirational in the win over Rathmore, faces a race against time to be fit. Kenmare District have outstanding players in

Kerry minor skipper Sean O'Shea and Kerry senior Steven O'Brien are also vital cogs in John Galvin's machine.

On the other hand, Crokes are laced with household names. Players like Michael Moloney, David O'Leary, Daithi Casey, Brian Looney and Kieran O'Leary and his brother David need no introduction to Kerry football followers and are multi County SFC medal winners.

Add in the infusion of young talent this year like Gavin White, who looks a real prospect for the Kerry set-up, Gavin O'Shea and Tony Brosnan and you see why Crokes are favourites.

When one talks of the Crokes one has to mention their county stars, Johnny Buckley and of course the legend that is Colm 'Gooch' Cooper, who is now in the twilight of his career and would love to win another County SFC medal while Eoin Brosnan is still playing some great football for his club and played a vital role in their semi-final win over Rathmore.

The Crokes bench too is very strong and contains players like Mike Milner, Jordan Kiely, Michael Burns, Jamie Doolan and Chris Brady to name just a few.

# **Know Your Rights:**

# **REPLACING LEAD PIPES**

#### **OUESTION**

We think that the water pipes in our house are made of lead and pose a risk to our health. We can't afford to spend a lot on replacing them. Can we get a grant?

#### **ANSWER**

The local authorities administer a means-tested grant scheme to help low-income households with the cost of replacing lead pipes and fittings.

You will need to provide evidence of your household's income when applying to the local authority for the grant.

- If your income is below €50,000 a year, you may get a grant of up to 80% of the cost, up to a maximum of €4,000
- If your income is between €50,001 and €75,000, you may get up to 50%, up to a maximum of €2,500

You must own the dwelling and live in it as your principal private residence (your main home). You must get the remedial work done before applying for the grant.

The contractor who does the work must give you the following: a current tax clearance certificate; itemised receipts; written confirmation that materials used are of appropriate quality and written confirmation that a proper standard of workmanship has been applied.

You must also get evidence of a risk of lead contamination in your home. This can either be:

- A letter from your water supplier, advising that your water system is likely to contain lead pipes and fittings, or
- A certificate from an accredited laboratory, showing that the amount of lead in your water supply is over the statutory limit

You will need to enclose all these documents with your grant application.

#### HALLOWEEN:



As much as we dread to think of it, Halloween is just over two weeks away, it is now time for farmers to make sure their roadside fences especially are stockproof and their cubicle houses, fields and feeding yards are made as safe as possible for terrified animals trying to flee the hisses and bangs of Fireworks.

Dog owners it is the law to have your dog microchipped but please also make sure your pet is wearing a collar with visible identification (at least your telephone number) for contact if it escapes, not everyone has the means of taking a stray dog to a Vet or the Gardai to read your information on a microchip.

Cat and other pet owners – I am not sure I agree with collars in case of strangulation if your pets' escape, that is a decision you will have to make for yourself but if your pet is wearing a collar then please make sure your contact details are clearly visible on it.

If your dog or other pet is obviously terrified of fireworks now is the time to ask your Vets advice on the best way of caring for your pet – sedation for example.

And finally for all of you people that enjoy terrifying babies, the elderly and animals please be aware that Fireworks are illegal in Ireland and their use or supply results in very large fines. If you don't hold a licence to import a firework or if you are found in possession of a firework, ignite a firework or cause it to be ignited in any place, you are guilty of an offence. The offence of igniting a firework can take place anywhere and not just in a public place and can include the garden of a private house, you are liable on summary conviction (in the District Court) to a fine of €2,500 or to imprisonment for up to 6 months or to both.

# KITCHEN SCRAPS CAN HELP TO FEED BIRDS: (Continued from last week)

\*Meat: Insects are a popular source of protein for many birds. Offering scrap meats such as bacon rinds, beef grease drippings, beef fat trimmings, meat bones or marrow bones can help birds get essential protein even if insects aren't available. As with cheese, no rancid or rotten meat should ever be available to birds. \*Pet Food: Both dry and wet food for cats and dogs is formulated to be healthy for pets, and it can be an equally healthy food source

for birds. Dry food should be moistened or crushed before being offered to the birds.

\*Fruit: Windfall or bruised fruit from backyard trees is always appetising to the birds. The fruit can be collected and chopped up to add to feeders, or it can be left on trees for the birds to find. Other fruits, such as old berries, raisins, grapes, bananas, oranges, grapefruits and the seeds of watermelons, honeydew melons, pumpkins and cantaloupes can also be offered to birds.

\*Cereal: Stale or leftover cereal and oats, including rolled or quick oats, is a tasty bird treat. For the best nutrition and most attractiveness, offer birds cereal with a lower sugar content and fewer artificial dyes.

\*Nuts: While peanuts can easily be purchased raw as bird food, other nuts such as almonds, pecans and walnuts are also tempting for birds. Offer finely crushed nuts or whole nuts for the birds to take, or use peanut butter to attract different birds. Coconut halves can also be used as small feeders in addition to being tasty treats themselves. Do not offer birds nuts with sugar or choco;ate coatings or spice flavourings.

\*Eggs and Eggshells: While it may seem contrary at first, cooked eggs can be a popular feeder food that offers many essential nutrients for birds. Crushed eggshells are also an important source of calcium for nesting birds and grit to help birds' digestion.

Offer scraps in hanging feeders to make them less accessible for pests and to keep the scraps out of reach of pets.

If birds ate nothing but scraps, they would not get sufficient nutrition for healthy growth or proper energy. To minimize this risk, offer scraps only on rare occasions and only in limited quantities in addition to your regular bird food.

It was Jo Du's wedding day in Ontario, Canada when the dress's zipper broke.

While everyone was scrambling for a pair of pliers, some of the guests walked next door to the house of Jo's neighbor David Hobson.

When they returned, they came bearing interesting news: David had taken in a family of Syrian refugees, the father of which was a master tailor who said he would be happy to help.

With toolbox in hand, Ibrahim Halil Dudu walked over and stitched up Jo's dress in front of an astonished wedding party.

The photographer, Lindsay Coulter, was there to witness the whole thing. "Every weekend I take photos of people on the happiest days of their lives, and today one man who has seen some of the worst things our world has to offer came to the rescue," Lindsay said.

"I am so proud to live in Canada, a country who has opened our doors to refugees countless times. I'm in awe of the families who have welcomed these strangers in to their homes and lives, and I'm inspired by the resilience of the Syrian people. We are truly blessed."

The encounter was especially fateful since Jo and her husband Earl are both immigrants themselves.

Ibrahim and his family had only been in Canada for four days before the incident. Since none of them spoke a word of English, they had been communicating solely through Google Translate.

#### "BABBETTE'S SEEDS OF HOPE":

A stretch of farmland in the U.S. A. usually reserved for corn and sovbeans is now home to over four miles of beautiful sunflowers, planted in memory of Babbette Jacquish, who died of cancer in November 2014.

Jacquish was known around town as the "Sunflower Lady" for her love of the tall yellow stems, so, in her honour, her husband planted the big yellow blooms in five neighbouring farms near Eau Claire, Wisconsin.

While she was alive, Jacquish had the idea to

plant the flowers and harvest the seeds to sell as birdseed, giving the proceeds to charities that support cancer research and patients, to keep that dream alive, her husband and daughter created "Babbette's Seeds of Hope" thanks to five generous farmers.

### **OUR ANCIENT RELATIONSHIP** WITH CATS:

A recent study by scientists shows that cats were found at more than 30 archaeological sites across Europe, the Middle East and Africa, and they lived between 15,000 and 300 years ago — a time frame that roughly spans from the dawn of agriculture to the Industrial Revolution.

In 2004, scientists reported on a 9,500-yearold human burial from Cyprus that also held the remains of a cat, suggesting humans kept domestic cats as far back as the advent of agriculture. Farming began in the Fertile Crescent about 12,000 years ago, and would have provided a practical reason for people to ally with cats, given the threat rodents can pose to grain supplies.

We also know cats held special status in ancient Egypt, where they were apparently domesticated by about 6,000 years ago, but there are still big gaps in our history of human-cat relations, and that's what inspired Eva-Maria Geigl, an evolutionary geneticist and her colleagues, Claudio Ottoni and Thierry

Grange, to dig deeper.

The study's authors say cat populations seem to have expanded in two waves. The first occurred in early Middle Eastern farming villages, where wild cats with a distinct mitochondrial lineage grew along with the human communities, eventually reaching the Mediterranean. As rodents congregated to steal food, wild cats were probably just capitalising on the easy prey at first, then were adopted as farmers realised their benefits. The second wave came millennia later, as the descendants of Egyptian domestic cats spread around Africa and Eurasia, the rapid expansion of cats was most likely linked to ship travel as like farmers, mariners were often plagued by rodents seeking their food stores and naturally welcomed rat-killers on board. Cats were a popular theme in Norse mythology and there's even archaeological evidence of cats in Greenland, where they were almost certainly introduced through Viking ships.



### SLUM RESIDENT FINDS \$1,400 AND RETURNS IT TO OWNER:

Last month Bruno Temistocles withdrew \$1,400 in cash for an upcoming trip to Europe. The money was still in an envelope with his personal information written on the front when his brother-in-law, a 7-year-old child, put it in the rubbish bin by mistake.

That same night, a poverty-stricken man named Joao Rodrigues was looking for recyclables in the rubbish of Bruno's building when he found the envelope. Despite his living conditions, Joao said he never thought about keeping the money.

Since he was on a budget for his trip, Bruno couldn't afford to give a reward, but he told a few friends about it got Joao a job in a construction field in the neighbourhood, the slum resident said this was a better reward than cash itself.

But Joao's fortune didn't stop with the new job. Gabriel O'Pensador, a famous Brazilian singer, had a concert in a nearby city and was touched when he saw the story on TV. So he decided to make a quick fundraiser with his friends and local producers and gathered \$3,000. With the cash in hands, he visited the slum and gave Joao the money. "This man's character is amazing and I wanted to tell him while looking in his eyes that he deserves this cash", said the singer.

### THE LONGEST RECREATIONAL TRAIL IN THE WORLD IS SET TO **OPEN NEXT YEAR:**

Canada's Great Trail when it opens next year will stretch for 20,000 kilometres (14,864 miles), it isn't a single trail but a collection of small, community-based trails, all maintained and operated by local jurisdictions, linked together to form a single network. It will composed of more than 400 individual trails snaking across all 10 provinces and three territories from St. John's in the East to Victoria in the West with a huge looping detour north through the Yukon and Northwest Territories to the Arctic Ocean.

Since it was first dreamt up in 1992 the trail is largely the handiwork work of volunteers working within local conservation groups, provincial governments and municipalities.

Different modes of transportation will be required to complete different stretches. Individual sections of the trail are open to cyclists, hikers, horseback riders and crosscountry skiers. Significant portions, such as the Lake Superior Water Trail and Mackenzie River Trail can only be navigated by kayak or canoe. In fact and 26% of the Great Trail will travel across water. And although motorised vehicles will be prohibited by law along the Great Trail, certain sections are also open to snowmobiles.

Twenty-five years in the making, the Great Trail — a hugely ambitious project made possible by Canadians from Canadians is gearing up for its grand completion/connection on July 1st in conjunction with Canada's 150th anniversary next summer.

# DRIVING IN STRONG WINDS SUDDEN GUSTS CAN CATCH OUT EVEN THE MOST EXPERIENCED DRIVER

Wind rarely blows steadily, and sudden gusts can catch you out no matter how experienced a driver you are.

Expect sudden gusts at any time but particularly on open stretches of road, when passing bridges or gaps in hedges or when overtaking high-sided vehicles.

Whether it's strong winds, snow, floods or fog, if extreme weather is forecast it is always best to avoid travelling unless your journey is absolutely necessary.

There are three potential problems to be aware of if you're driving in high winds

#### You can be blown off course.

Keep both hands on the wheel, particularly if you're being buffeted by the wind or the slipstreams of other vehicles and anticipate stronger winds and gusts on exposed stretches of road or when passing high-sided vehicles.

It's important to keep your speed down too. The faster you're travelling the further off-course you're likely to drift in a sudden gust before you get the vehicle back under control. Other vehicles can be blown into your path.

High-sided vehicles and caravans are most affected by high winds but sudden gusts can blow any vehicle off course. Keep your distance from all other vehicles and take particular care around cyclists, motorcyclists and horse-riders. If you break down on the motorway or on any busy road in gusty weather it's important to



bear in mind that lorries and other high-sided vehicles could be blown off course suddenly and may veer onto the hard shoulder. It's safer to move to a safe location away from the vehicle rather than wait in the car to be rescued.

There could be trees or other debris in the road. Inevitably, some trees or branches will come down when winds are high. If you see twigs or small branches in the road there could easily be a tree or large branch in the road around the next bend. Hitting debris like this at speed could be fatal so it's important to keep your speed down and drive with great care particularly on country roads early in the morning.

Trees can partially fall too and hang above the road, sometimes above the sweep of the headlights making them very difficult to spot.

#### If you do have to drive.

In case of an emergency, always carry a fully-charged mobile phone and warm, weatherproof clothing.

Plan journeys carefully and check both weather and traffic bulletins regularly – low speed limits or even temporary closures may be imposed on exposed bridges and road closures due to falling debris or accidents will be more frequent.






