The initially set up the choir with the aim of performing at their end of year mass. ## Call for the Redevelopment of Killarney Library

At the November 2018 meeting of Killarney Municipal District, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked:

"That Killarney Municipal District Council calls on Kerry County Council to commence the creative process that will in time lead to the

redevelopment of a Public Library in Killanrey Town that will be appropriate for 21st Centuary use, be a hub for educational, recreational, artistic pursuit and enhance the image of a town committed to beauty".

Kerry County Council replied that Killarney Library refurbishment is on the capital programme 2019 -2021, subject to funding. An update on progress on the enhancement of the library will be included in the Directorate Report to future Killarney MD meetings.



Councillor Gleeson acknowledged the

improvements to the interior and exterior of the library since 2013 and welcomed the commitment to continue this work. He said that it is imperative that there is ready and safe access to all parts of the library and asked also that any problem with internal dampness would be addressed as soon as possible.

He complimented the Library staff for the wonderful service that they provide to be public.

#### BRIGID IS NAMED WOMAN OF THE YEAR

Brigid Quilligan was presented with the Woman of the Year award by President Emer Moynihan and members of the Killarney Soroptimist Club at a dinner in the Gleneagle Hotel on Wednesday night. The Award was given in recognition of her determination and commitment when advocating for traveller rights, achievement of Minority Ethnic Status for the community and for being a role model for young travellers everywhere.

Soroptimists strive for human rights for all and in particular to advance the status of women. Brigid has balanced the importance of respecting the traditions of her community with the importance of growing, evolving and moving forward in a changing Ireland.

She is a Killarney woman who has devoted much of her life to advocating for Travellers rights. This led to her being awarded an Honorary Doctorate from University College Cork. A passionate and articulate champion for Travellers, she is a former director of the Traveller Movement and currently the manager of the Kerry Travellers Health and Community Development Project.

She has worked to secure recognition of the Traveller community as an ethnic minority and she has also represented the Irish Traveller Movement on the UN Human Rights Committee.

Members are silenced and often in awe of Dan's explanation of bee behavior.

## Citizens Information

## Know Your Rights:

#### QUESTION

How are charities regulated in Ireland?

#### **ANSWER**

The Charities Regulatory Authority (Charities Regulator) regulates charities in Ireland. It maintains a public register of charities and monitors their compliance with the Charities Act 2009. This Act sets out what an organisation must do to be recognised as a charity and the legal obligations for operating as a charity in Ireland.

To be considered a charity, an organisation must:

Operate in the Republic of Ireland (though its target group can be elsewhere)

Exist for a charitable purpose and exclusively promote this purpose (a charitable purpose is a goal that is of public benefit)

Not be an excluded body (such as a trade union, chamber of commerce etc.)

The organisation must first give the Regulator information about itself, so the Regulator can assess if it meets the requirements to be a charity. If the Regulator approves the application, it awards the organisation charitable status, gives it a Registered Charity Number and lists it on the charities register. You can search the charities register on charitiesregister.ie.

It is an offence for an organisation to describe itself as a charity and carry out charitable activities, if it is not registered with the Charities Regulator.

The Regulator can appoint an inspector to investigate a charity's affairs. The charity and its trustees must co-operate fully and give the inspector all the relevant accounts and documents.

The Regulator can choose to take a charity off the register – for example, if it fails to comply with its financial obligations or give the Regulator the information it requires.

If you are concerned about a charity or its activities, you can raise a concern with the Charities Regulator.

# WHAT VAT CAN AN UNREGISTERED FARMER RECLAIM?

Farmers who are not registered for VAT may reclaim VAT paid by them in respect of the following items, provided such building, structure, land or qualifying equipment is for use in a farming business carried on by the farmer for a period of not less than one year from the date of payment:

 Construction, extension, alteration or reconstruction of a building or structure which is designed for use solely or mainly for the purposes of a farming business;

Fencing, drainage or reclamation of land for use for the purpose of a farming business;

 Electricity micro-generators for farming purposes only, for purchases after January 1, 2012.

However, if the item refunded is sold or used for mainly non-farming purposes during the following year, the VAT refund must be repaid with interest.

On what can an unregistered farmer not reclaim VAT?

Repairs to farm buildings, structures, and farm roadways;

- Outlay on roadways to dwelling house;
- Mobile equipment and machinery;
- Repair, service and maintenance of equipment and machinery;
- ESB supply;

Fuel, oil and diesel.

How to make a claim

The reclaim is made on a VAT 58 claim form. You need original VAT invoices and items such as delivery dockets, statements, receipts, quotations will not be sufficient. You have only a four-year window from the end of the taxable period to which the claim relates.

O'Shea was one of seven debutants handed a Kerry shirt by Eamonn Fitzmaurice on June 3rd in Killarney when Kerry beat Clare 0-32 to 0-10 with O'Shea contributing 0-7. Three weeks later Kerry had a win over Cork, winning 3-18 to 2-4 with O'Shea kicking anther four points. 2018 may well be looked back on as the year that Sean O'Shea a superb young football talent and scoring forward came of age.

# Jerome O'Shea RIP

Three-time Kerry All-Ireland winner Jerome O'Shea has died at the age of 87. The Cahirciveen native made his Championship debut for the county in 1952 and was a substitute for the 1953 triumph over Armagh.

A corner back with renowned fielding ability, the St Mary's man won his first Sam Maguire Cup as a starter in the 1955 victory over Dublin and added another against Galway in 1959. He also won one National League title.Upon retirement from playing, O'Shea presented RTÉ's first weekly Gaelic Games television show 'GAA World of Sport' while pursuing a PHD in UCD. He later served in a variety of roles as an economic advisor and representative of the Irish government at the EEC and the United Nations.We send our condolences to his wife Margaret and sons Diarmuid, Donal and Conor, former Ireland rugby international and current Italy head coach.

The death also occurred of Bridie O'Sullivan Killarney. We send our deepest sympathies to her husband Eddie and to her children Noreen, Patrick former Chairman of the County Board, Deborah Ann and Edmund.

May they both Rest in Peace.

1901 - The 1st table tennis tournament was held (London Royal Aquarium).

# A HOMELESS MAN FOUND \$17,000 CASH AND GAVE IT TO A LOCAL FOOD BANK

Kevin Booth found a brown bag on the ground outside the Sumner Food Bank's community bread box in Washington while looking for the bread that is left outside the building for people to take. When he looked inside, he saw it was filled with cash.

Mr. Booth waited outside the foodbank until it opened about 20 minutes later and handed the bag to a volunteer who opened the door for him. The volunteer initially thought it was food and weighed the package. It wasn't food. It was \$17,000 in cash.

Stunned, they called police. The Sumner police department determined the money was real and used security cameras to try to figure out what had happened. They couldn't determine who dropped off the bag, but they did see who found it.

Police kept the cash for 90 days, the length of time required under state law for someone to make a claim of ownership. No one did, so the money went to the food bank.

To thank Mr. Booth for his honestly, the food bank is giving him part of the money in gift cards as a reward.

The Sumner police department also presented Mr. Booth with a citizen's citation, noting that Mr. Booth had told officers he knew giving the money to the food bank would benefit more people than just himself.

# DEALING WITH DEPRESSION 3

When we are feeling depressed, we can experience our feeling state like a sink that is blocked with no outlet. Our reactions to events and unwelcome thoughts seem to go round and round, rather than just flowing through our mind. Tubridy and Corry describe depression as a natural response to life's experiences – and maintain that depression is an emotion and not a disease. Just as we respond to life with feelings of anger, joy, sadness, love and fear – depression is another way in which we respond to life. Depression however doesn't just come upon us randomly and by chance. Instead it is a defence we build up around ourselves when we feel under threat or in danger. We build up barriers to protect ourselves and these can act as a very effective defence. However, when the time comes to remove the barriers, we may be unable to do so – thus our barriers of protection become our own prison.

Often our Psychological Skin has become too tight or too loose. When too tight we find it difficult to give or to allow others in. We feel the need to control everything ourselves and can't delegate or trust others. This however leads to feeling isolated and being cut off from growth in our lives. When our skin has become too open, we readily take on the problems and worries of others – often feeling overwhelmed and unable to set boundaries and say no. The optimal situation is to be neither too open nor too closed. Permeable boundaries allow us to open and let in when needed say no when we need to and reserve our energy.

Frequently people who are experiencing depression can feel plagued by tiredness. The constant effort to keep everything under control, to not upset people or to meet the needs of others can all lead to a constant anxiety and despair, which in turn leads to tiredness.

### Some ways out of our depression include:

 Have something positive that you can say to yourself (e.g. All will be well, or This too shall pass) or some inspiring music that you can put on when things feel dark and you feel alone. Choose something that works for you

Develop the habit of doing at least one enjoyable, pleasant thing for yourself each day.

 Keep a diary or a journal where you can record inspiring words, valuable insights or special memories. Whenever you feel low, read what you have written.

Counselling can provide a great support to help deal with depression.
