

CHARITIES ANNOUNCED AT RING OF KERRY CYCLE LAUNCH

Representatives from the 10 main charities who will benefit from the 2016 Ring Of Kerry Charity Cycle gathered in Aghadoe in Killarney on Wednesday.

The 10 Kerry based charities include South West Counselling services, St Joseph's Nursing Home, Killorglin, Aras Mhuire Listowel, St Ita's & St Joseph's Special School Tralee, Pieta House Kerry, Kerry Branch Irish Kidney Association, Recovery Haven Cancer Respite, St. Francis Special School, Derrynane Inshore Rescue, Talbot Grove, Castleisland. Speaking at the announcement, Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle PRO Cathal Walshe said; "The charities were chosen after an application process that began before Christmas, and we were genuinely overwhelmed with the number of submissions received. It was hard to choose from so many deserving causes and we would like to thank all the unsuccessful applicants for their efforts. The chosen charities provide fantastic support to the people of Kerry and will benefit hugely from the money they receive from this year's Fundraising effort. Last year over €1.85 million was raised and shared amongst the 9 chosen charities as well as 28 smaller charities in Kerry". The cycle, which is now in its 33rd year has raised over €10.6 million for charities that benefit all the communities across the county

explained how important the Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle is in their fundraising efforts, "St. Joseph's Home provides vital care for the elderly in the Mid and South West Kerry area. In order to maintain the high standard of care offered and meet HIQA requirements, we need to invest significant money to convert existing 3 bed wards to single rooms, in 2017. Without the financial support raised through the Ring of Kerry Cycle, this will not be feasible. It is thanks to this one day fundraising event that we are able to keep our doors open and our valued staff can continue to serve the community".

Reminding interested participants how this year's registration process will work, Cathal continued "This year the charities will have a limited amount of places to fill in and we cannot reiterate enough that the best chance of getting a place is to register your interest online. Registration for the lottery closes on the 31st January, leaving less than 3 weeks for people to register, I would suggest that all interested parties get moving and get registered!"

Marie Wade, who is a member of the group

approached local gym Belief Fit / CrossFit Killarney as every year the proprietors Josie and Eric do a fundraiser morning for a local charity. "They loved the idea of what I was involved in, how important this service is to our local

DEVASTATION AT REEN PIER

Members of the Workmen's Rowing Club are currently assessing the devastation caused by Storm Frank at their Boat house at Reen Pier at Ross Castle.

The Boathouse is only accessible by boat since the recent flooding and storms. The damage caused to the 200 year old boathouse and racing boats is estimated to be over €60,000 and because of its location on the shores of Lough Lein, the members are worried that further flooding will render the Boathouse unusable.

Members braved the elements in late December to save some of the boats and move them to higher ground.

"Killarney has a long tradition of rowing on Lough Lein, dating back 260 years. It is a very important amenity in the community", Timmy Moynihan, Chairman of the Workmen's Rowing Club told The Killarney Outlook.



"At the December 2015 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that Kerry County Council would clarify the situation for applicants for housing development in locations where

Japanese Knotweed is growing or has until recently been growing on the proposed site. Kerry County Council replied that in light of recent research, information and training

associated with invasive introduced species, it is now considered opportune to attach a Condition to Planning Permissions in relation to the control and eradication of such species including the Japanese Knotweed. The Condition will be included in the relevant Planning Decisions from early 2016.

Councillor Gleeson welcomed the reply and stated that it is vitally important that intending house purchasers or builders should ensure that the site has been rendered totally free from all Knotweed infestation. He stated that this eradication process may require a multi-annual spraying procedure."



WHAT IS A TRACKER BOND AND IS A TRACKER BOND RISKY?

Tracker bonds are usually considered low-risk investments because many of them offer 100% capital security once you leave your money invested for the full term. This means you are guaranteed to get the original amount of money you invested back. However, even if you get all of your money back, you may have lost money because of the impact of inflation.

Generally, the lower the risk, the lower the level of return on your investment. The rate of return usually depends on the growth of the financial index which the bond tracks. There will usually be a limit on the amount of the growth you are entitled to, for example, a maximum of 50% of the growth.

The return tends to be higher in the case of tracker bonds that don't give you 100% capital security at maturity for example 90% or 95% capital security.

Jim O'Shea, Veteran Athlete tells The Killarney Outlook his views on the world of sport today.....

As we start 2016 let us just think of what a glorious sporting year that 2015 was. The World Cup in Rugby, The Euro Oualifiers in soccer, The Wimbledon Tennis, The British Open golf, The in World Athletics Championships

and on the domestic scene, the All-Ireland Football and Hurling Championships. But are we losing the sporting element and is sport today just a business?

The top performers in sport today are earning mind boggling figures in money terms. Last year Jordan Spieth won ten million dollars for his victory in a golf tournament and because he finished top points scorer over a select six tournaments, he netted a further twelve million dollars; a total of twenty two million in one week.

Another example, Wayne Rooney of Manchester United is reputedly on a weekly wage of three hundred thousand pounds sterling, these are just two examples of the crazy earnings in sport today.

Rugby is also gone professional in recent years. I can remember back in the 1960's, when the famous Mike Gibson from Northern Ireland was awarded the Texaco trophy for outstanding rugby player in Ireland for that year but was barred from accepting it by the I.R.F.U. on the grounds that it would infringe on his amateur status. Today rugby players go to clubs where the best financial package is to be found.

To reach the top in the sport today, some sports people resort to drug taking, blood doping and other suspect means to reach the big money. Over the years, drug testing was guite common in athletics. Ben Johnson was probably the best known as he "won" the Olympic 100 metres title. He was stripped of his gold medal but it was later proved that six out of eight men in that final were drug takers. Just a few weeks ago, a marathon runner from Kenya in an effort to win the cash prize on offer in a race in his own country engaged in blood doping and collapsed and died during the race.

Blood doping entails the athlete taking blood (usually one pint) from the body and storing it in a refrigerated state until three or four days before the event when it is pumped back in and allows the athlete to have extra oxygen during his/her event. This unfair method has been widely used all over the world, in this country and indeed in this country.

Cycling is another sport that has a history of drug taking. British cyclist Tommy Simpson collapsed and died by the side of the road during a stage of the Tour DE France in the 1960's and through the year's right up to the

recent banning of Lance Armstrong, the sport of cycling has been bedevilled by drug taking. Nowadays, young boys who want to progress rapidly in field sports are attending gyms and lifting weights far in excess of what their young bone structure are capable of. The result is joint problems and hip operations in their very early twenties. Many are also taking excessive doses of whey and protein powders which bulk up the body but which can have disastrous results later in life with kidney and other health issues. Even in GAA circles, the guest for success comes at a price. Practically all counties and indeed the major clubs now have managers, coaches (for goalkeepers, backs and forwards), physios, medical staff etc. Croke Park's bosses will tell you that all those people are only on expenses, but believe me, expenses can cover a multitude. Many counties and clubs are deeply in the red because of such structures. An example is Mayo Co. Board who is reputed to be eleven million euro's in deficit. This applies to other counties and clubs albeit for lesser amounts. And is it getting tougher on the players? Of course it is. Some clubs now have training sessions at seven o'clock in the morning in the build up to finals. We hear of players giving up the day job to concentrate on football or hurling. But we also hear of players packing it all in at 28 or 29 years of age. The pressures take a toll at an

Less young people take part in sporting activities today, and of those who do a high number drop out at the age of 16 or 17 due to school pressures and over demanding coaches in lots of sports teams.

We are told that you cannot stop change but I pose the question, is sport losing its fun and enjoyment? I say a very definite yes. It would be good if people went back again to simple sport for enjoyments sake. People of course should be competitive and try to achieve the highest standard that they can without putting themselves through undue pressures and stresses. Sport should be a level playing field and nobody should resort to methods which will give them an unfair advantage over their fellow competitors.

Chicken Noodle Soup

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon rapeseed oil
- 2 carrots, chopped
- 1 onion, sliced
- · 2 sticks celery, thinly sliced
- 950ml chicken stock (950mls water + 2 stock cubes)
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 90g whole wheat fusilli pasta
- 150g cooked chicken



Method

- 1. In a large pot, heat the oil over medium heat.
- 2. Add the carrots, onion and celery.

- Now add the thyme, pasta and chicken.
- Bring to the boil, reduce heat to medium and simmer for 10 15 minutes until pasta is cooked.

Ingredients

- 90g chopped broccoli
- 30g Baby spinach
- 30g cheddar cheese
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 10g onion
- 2 eggs
- 60ml low fat milk
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon mustard
- ¼ teaspoon ground pepper (optional)
- 6 small wholewheat pitta breads (1 pitta per serving)

Method

- Preheat oven to 200°C.
- 2. Put paper liners in a muffin tray.
- 3. Steam the chopped brocolli for 5 minutes.
- 4. Grate the cheese, and chop the onion.
- 5. In a medium bowl, beat the eggs. Then add milk, mustard, salt, pepper, onions, parsley. Whisk again.
- 6. Divide the spinach and cooked brocolli equally among muffin cups.
- 7. Pour egg mixture evenly into the muffin cups.
- 8. Place the muffin tray in the oven for 20 minutes or until eggs set or top becomes lightly golden. Sprinkle on the cheese for the last minute of cooking until melted.
- 9. Toast pitta to lightly golden. Slice the quiche cup in two and place in pitta.

Keep a very close eye on the CAO timeline

The CAO application season is up and running and continues until all college places have been allocated in October. With more than 80000 applicants competing for about 49000 coveted CAO college places, it's vital to submit a complete application form. So stay focussed and be aware of the key dates and the



important tasks to be undertaken in the weeks ahead. The 2016 CAO online application opened on 5th November and remains open until 1st February. Open your CAO interactive online account via "Apply" on **www.cao.ie**, by 20th January to get a discount rate of €25. After that the fee increases to €40 until the 1st February. The closing date for online Change of Course Choices, which is free, is 31st January.

You may also use the online Change of Course Choices facility from 5th February to 1st March on payment of an additional processing fee of €10. This facility can be used to add any restricted courses not already listed on an application or by restricted category applicants. All other applicants should use the free Change of Mind option, between 5th May and 1st July, to make any course changes.

Completed online Higher Education Access Route (HEAR)/Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) forms must be submitted by 1st March. HEAR/DARE supporting documentation must arrive in CAO by 1st April.

Late online applications, accompanied by a fee of €50, will be accepted up to 1st May. Late application may not be made for restricted application courses. From 5th May, you may register a change of course choices online at www.cao.ie. Check that your courses have been updated by using the "My Application" facility before 1st July. Before the end of May, you will be sent a Statement of Application Record to enable you to verify that all information has been recorded accurately. If there is any inaccuracy in the document, contact the CAO immediately. If the data is correct, you need do

Course choices and preferences may be changed as often as desired, free of charge, between 5th May and 1st July. If you submit a Change of Mind, it cancels all the previous course choices, which you have submitted. The two categories (Level 8 and Level7/6) are completely separate from each other for this purpose. Any restricted application course, added for the first time via a Change of Mind will not be considered unless it shares the same assessment procedure with a course you had applied for by 1st February.

In early July, offers of places (Round A) are issued to deferred applicants, mature applicants and to those who need to make visa arrangements. Last year, 6922 applicants received offers in Round A. In early August, offers of places (Round Zero) are issued to certain non-standard categories of applicants such as FETAC and graduate applicants. Last year, 2797 applicants received offers in Round Zero. Round One: the main body of offers will be issued on the 22nd August. Last year, 50427 applicants received offers in Round One. Round Two: a second round of offers will be issued on 31st August to fill any remaining vacancies. Last year, 1162 applicants received offers in Round Two. Thereafter, offers will be issued as necessary until the 19th October to fill any vacancies, which may arise.

If you are applying to CAO for any of the five undergraduate medical courses you must also apply for the HPAT- Ireland test by 5.15pm on 20th January. The test will take place on 27th February at centres in Cork, Dublin, Galway, Limerick, Sligo and Waterford.



KERRY CHALLENGE FADES ON THE DAY AS GALVIN RETIRES

MCGRATH CUP ROUND 1 KERRY 0-9 **CLARE 0-12**

On a day when an under strength Kerry team failed to defeat Clare it was the news of a retirement that made the headlines.

Following their opening McGrath Cup loss Kerry manager Éamonn Fitzmaurice confirmed that Paul Galvin has retired from inter-county football

Galvin initially retired at the start of the 2014 season, but made a shock return in March

"Paul won't be back," Fitzmaurice said. "He is finished up. He got married, is moving back to Dublin. Other than that everyone else will be back." Clare recorded their first win at senior level over Kerry since the 1992 Munster Final when they consigned the Kingdom to defeat in last Sunday's McGrath Cup at Fitzgerald Stadium, Killarney.

Eamonn Fitzmaurice fielded a largely experimental side which featured none of the team that lost last September's All-Ireland final

With the Kingdom likely to be shorn a number of first-team regulars for the early stages of the league, this was a welcome opportunity for players who have aspirations of playing Senior Football with Kerry in the future to answer the

One of these players, Gavin O'Grady from the Glenbeigh-Glencar club, certainly caught the eye as did the Austin Stacks pair of Shane O'Callaghan and Wayne Guthrie.

Shaun Keane from Killarney Legion made a notable impression when introduced in the second half while Jeff O'Donoghue also caught the eye.

The first-half was a relatively cagey affair and after 19 minutes the sides were level on 0-3 apiece but Kerry finished the stronger and scores from Jamie O'Sullivan, Jeff O'Donoghue, a member of last year's All-Ireland Junior panel, and Gavan O'Grady pushed the Kingdom four clear at the break, 0-7 to 0-3.

A physically stronger Clare outfit grew with confidence as the game wore on and points from substitute David Tubridy (two) and Eoin Cleary brought the Bannermen back into contention.

Keelan Sexton levelled for Colm Collins' side in the 49th minute and Sean Collins' point in the 56th minute put the Claremen into a lead they refused to surrender.

Kerry continue their McGrath Cup programme next weekend when they face Tipperary in Sean Treacy Park, Cashel.

STREETSMART KIDS

StreetSmart is an exciting initiative set up by the Road Safety Authority which aims to bring issues of road safety to life for young school children. StreetSmart is designed for three distinct age groups: 4-5, 5-8 and 8-12 years. There is a combination of interactive activities available for each age group.

StreetSmart also involves a streetscape mat which invites children to carry out typical, everyday cycling or pedestrian tasks. They can dress up and adopt various roles such as a nurse, doctor, fire officer or ambulance driver. The Road Safety Authority representatives are on hand to coordinate the activities with the help of teachers at the school. It is an action packed, fun filled day that enhances the student's knowledge of the rules of the road.

WHAT WILL YOUR CHILD/STUDENT LEARN?

- Road Safety
- Cycle Safety
- Travelling safely in a car/bus

How will your students learn these lessons? Step Left, Step Right quiz

This will test the child's knowledge on a range of common road safety issues, educating them as to the right way of doing things through fun and engaging exercises.



A VIEW FROM A WHEEL

This will allow children to sit behind the wheel of a toy car, letting them see the traffic conditions from the perspective of a motorist and illustrating how it can be difficult to see pedestrians.

ROAD SAFETY DVD

Using a series of filmed street scenes, we will ask children for feedback as to what constitutes safe and unsafe pedestrian behaviour.

ROAD SAFETY STORIES

The objective is to get pupils discussing issues of road safety, prompted by a series of short stories.

PERSONALISED SAFETY LICENCES

As part of the programme students will receive a personalised safety license as a reward for completing their road safety activities.

STREETSMART STREETSCAPE

As mentioned above this is a typical street scene where students take on different roles such as pedestrians, cyclists and motorists. They learn from their own experiences and those of their classmates. The Streetscape is in the form of a giant mat (9 metres x 10 metres) with a number of props provided to simulate a



real street and which is assembled in the school hall or community centre.

There are several questions that we need to ask you about your location before we can process your request for StreetSmart.

ROAD SAFETY UPDATE— HAZARDOUS ROAD CONDITIONS

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) is advising road users to take extra care on the roads as temperatures have dropped.

THEY HAVE ISSUED THE FOLLOWING ADVICE:

- Check local and National weather forecasts before setting out on a journey. Clear your windows and mirrors before you set out, carry a screen scraper and de-icer. Do not use hot water on the windscreen as it can crack the glass.
- Remove ALL snow from your vehicle before commencing your journey. Snow left on the roof will become loose and can drop onto the windscreen during braking, thereby causing sudden and severe restriction to your vision. It can also fall off during your drive and cause injury to pedestrians or a reflex action by another driver.
- In snow and icy conditions manoeuvre gently, slow down and leave extra distance between you and the vehicle in front. Too much steering is bad and avoid harsh braking and acceleration. Use the highest gear possible to avoid wheel spin. Select a low gear when travelling downhill especially if through bends.
- Remember that heavy snowfall can reduce visibility. Use dipped headlights and decrease speed smoothly.
- Use your dipped headlights so that others will see you. Make sure your headlights and taillights are all in working order, replace broken bulbs.
- Watch out for vulnerable road users such as pedestrians, cyclists and motorcyclists and allow extra space.
- Check tyres, including spare wheel, replace them if the tread depth falls below 3mm and

make sure they are inflated to the correct tyre pressure. Lack of grip can occur even on treated roads so drive slowly in the highest gear possible, manoeuvre gently and avoid harsh braking.

PEDESTRIANS AND CYCLISTS ARE ADVISED TO:

Be seen. Wear bright clothing with reflective armbands or a reflective belt.

Take extra care when near traffic or crossing the road in snowy conditions as visibility can be greatly reduced.

MINIMUM RATES OF PAY

Since 1 January 2016, the national minimum wage for an experienced adult employee is €9.15 per hour. An experienced adult employee for the purposes of the National Minimum Wage Act is an employee who has an employment of any kind in any 2 years over the age of 18.

There are some exceptions to those entitled to receive the national minimum wage. The legislation does not apply to a person employed by a close relative (for example, a spouse, civil partner or parent) nor does it apply to those in statutory apprenticeships. Also some employees such as young people under 18 and trainees are only guaranteed a reduced or sub-minimum rate of the national minimum wage.

UNDERSTANDING AND MANAGING SUICIDE

Suicide is something we hear about thanks to the recent openness which started some years ago. Talking about it has been and is a challenge as previously we did not consider it something we could be up front about due to the associated stigma. This stigma which is still hanging on for some has its roots deep in our psyche and history. In Greek and Roman times suicide was accepted if life had become impossible and the State even assisted by paying technicians who advised on it. In post Judo Christian tradition, it was looked less kindly on it and St Thomas Aquinas in the 13th century equated it with rejection of God's love so it was prohibited initially by religious precept and then the legal system. Suicide does not discriminate between people of differing faith and no faith.

Most people if they are honest will have had passive suicide thoughts at some time but more active suicidal thinking and planning to commit suicide is most often encountered when we are depressed or experiencing another mental illness or overwhelmed by the enormity of life. People when completing suicide see death as the only alternative and as they become more accustomed to the thought it may gain more currency as a viable option for them.

The evidence is that we can do a great deal to influence people when they are feeling hopeless and if these thoughts are disrupted and the person is facilitated to explore alternative options, the outcome can be different. People experiencing thoughts of suicide are often withdrawn from friends and family, hopeless and unhappy, they may have disturbed sleep pattern, feel unwanted or that believe they are a burden and are unable to access an alternative in the "stuckness" of the moment. The priority here is keeping the person safe, allowing them to talk openly without judgement, letting them see you are concerned and want to help and getting them to see their GP or taking them to a place of safety. It's important that they avoid self-medicating with non-prescribed drugs or alcohol as this lessens the natural inhibition and increases risk. People who are feeling suicidal see no point in living but the evidence is that after getting through the hopelessness phase, they regain their previous zest for life.

Thankfully we are inching away from a time when an attempt at suicide would have defined someone moving to a place where we are ready to acknowledge the strength and courage shown by people who talk about it.

Care of those bereaved by suicide should focus on firstly helping them through the crisis by meeting their immediate needs. Staying available to them for the longer haul is equally important as there can be an awkward bashfulness around knowing what to say or how to sit with their grief. The advice from those who have lived through it is to help them with the practical things if needed, stay close, avoid hollow reassurance, don't ask for an explanation, help them celebrate the life of the deceased, acknowledge the uncertainty and don't be afraid to allow them to grieve openly. A compassionate approach is the key to enabling them to re find their bearings.

NSAI ISSUES WARNING AFTER CHARGER CAUSES FIRE

NSAI (National Standards Authority of Ireland) is warning consumers to be extremely careful when buying and using electrical products. It comes after a fire broke out in an apartment in Islandbridge, Dublin this week.

A charger left on a bed overheated and burst into flames, causing extensive damage.

"Everyone knows the rules of basic fire safety and indeed many look out for safety standards, such as the CE Mark, when buying electrical products. However, although the device may be manufactured to the correct safety standards, it can still become very dangerous, very quickly, if not used in the appropriate environment," warned Pat Bracken, NSAI's Director of Corporate Services.

"Electrical products like hair straighteners, hairdryers, laptops and phone chargers can be incredibly dangerous if left on beds or sofas. Although duvets and quilts often undergo flammability tests, accidents like this can still occur," he added.

Between 2005 and 2014, there have been 326 fatal fires in Ireland, claiming the lives of 366 people. In the 158 instances where the cause of the fire was known, electrical appliances were suspected in 28 fatal fires (18% of cases) while a further 3 per cent of fatal fires were attributed to electric blankets. In 2011 alone, 241 fires in Ireland were caused by electrical equipment. **NSAI Fire Safety Tips**

- Smoke alarms: Make sure you have at least one on every floor.
- 2. Test your smoke alarms weekly or ask someone to check it for you.
- Obvious dangers: Look for fire risks like overloaded sockets, candles and unattended appliances.
- 4. Plan your escape route: Keep access routes clear and have your keys at the ready.












UNICEF'S GOAL IS TO VACCINATE EVERY CHILD

In recent years, an estimated 2 to 3 million deaths, along with countless cases of illness, were prevented thanks to vaccinations. However, out of the 22.4 million children born each year, nearly 1 out of 5 is still not immunised. Fortunately, as the largest buyer of vaccines, UNICEF has helped quadruple global immunisation rates since the 1980s. By working with governments, communities and other partners to increase the demand for immunisations and the supply of lifesaving vaccines, UNICEF has been able to increase awareness and provide vaccinations for more than one third of the world's children.

THE PINEAPPLE IS THE UNIVERSAL SYMBOL FOR HOSPITALITY

If you were a rich 1700s nobleman, had a dinner table, and wanted to impress your fellow gentry, a pineapple would be the way to go. Thanks to centuries of pillaging and colonising, the pineapple has travelled far and wide and come to represent something more than tasty fruit. Up until the 15th century, pineapples were not known by the Western world. In South American countries like Brazil, they were grown and enjoyed by the locals, but few others outside these countries knew of the pineapple's existence. Historical accounts claim that Christopher Columbus was the first European to come face to face with the fruit during his second voyage in 1493, when he and his crew found a Caribbean village that ate pineapple. They tried it and reportedly liked it quite a bit, deciding to bring it back to their European home. The very concept of pineapples equating to hospitality comes from these Caribbean trips, explorers went to these remote islands, and discovered that natives who hung the fruit in front of their entrances were welcoming to strangers. Once they reached Europe pineapples became widely considered a gentry symbol of hospitality. The concept travelled to America too, where colonial houses began showcasing the pineapple's image in common areas. Plantations took up the trend and started carving pineapple-like shapes into columns at their entrances. This, in fact, became a wellknown addition to entrance architecture.

The European pineapple symbol, however, meant more than just hospitality - it meant prestige. The richest of the rich bought these fruits, however expensive to show off to other their ability to have them. Since demand relied on the few shipments between the faroff continents, supply would often be scarce. This led to a brand new pineapple rental market taking the European gentry by storm, although, by the 1700s, Europeans started growing them in their own hothouses. In America, one pineapple could be sold for as much as the equivalent of \$8000. In Europe the price was no less excessive, with a pineapple's value reaching as much as the equivalent of £5,000. It became a trend for hostesses to show off the large spiny fruits in parlours and dining rooms.

TRAINING A PUP

Mouthy puppies can be sweet and funny when they are little, but nipping can become dangerous fast. Don't allow your dog to make teeth-to-skin contact with anyone, ever. KOREA ANNOUNCES BAN ON ANIMAL TESTING FOR COSMETICS

The Korea National Assembly has passed a Bill to ban companies testing cosmetics and ingredients on animals by 2018. It comes two years sooner than was originally planned. The Bill, proposed by Representative Jeong-Lim Moon, will be signed by the President in the next few days. The ban follows two years of work by Cruelty Free International with Rep. Moon, members of the Korean government and the Ministry of Food and Drug Safety. Cruelty Free International Director of Policy

Cruelty Free International Director of Policy Dr Nick Palmer began discussions with the Korean National Assembly two years ago. He said: "This is a great start to the New Year. With bans already in place in the EU, India and New Zealand, Korea joins the ever-growing list of nations that no longer see animal experiments as necessary for cosmetics. We are delighted to have played a big role in this breakthrough and look forward to helping other Asian countries take similar steps in 2016."

A CHAIR THAT FOLDS DOWN TO THE SIZE OF A BEER CAN

While standing around for hours at a music festival, a couple of Danish entrepreneurs started thinking about chairs. The standard folding chair is awkward to carry, awkward to unfold, and awkward to use in a standing crowd. At large festivals, the chairs also tend to end up in the rubbish when the music is over. Three years later, the pair has come up with a portable chair called SitPack that fits in a pocket. Folded up, the chair is a couple of inches taller than a standard beer can, and about the same diameter. It flips open to create a seat, and a pole pulls out to create a base. Though made of plastic, it's strong enough to hold someone weighing up to 286 pounds. The chair is also designed to keep your spine and pelvis in the right position, and your legs stay active as you balance. Since the design is so compact, the startup hopes that people will begin to use it in everyday life. It might even encourage more people to take public transport, since it's a guaranteed seat. The designers say "You can just pop it out when you're waiting for the bus or the train and you can also actually flip it out and lean

back when you're inside. It has a rubber foot, so it doesn't slip around, and it's safe to use even in a moving bus. Unlike a typical folding chair, it can also go in the recycling bin".

"It's made of polycarbonate, the same material as Lego bricks and riot shields. It's absolutely durable, and can be unfolded and folded thousands of times" the designers added.

WYOMING CAN NOW PUT YOU IN JAIL FOR SHARING **NATURE PHOTOS WITH THE** GOVERNMENT

You can face a \$5000.00 fine and up to a year in prison if you share your nature photography with the government, according to a new Wyoming law. Ostensibly a private property/trespassing law, Bill 12 is incredibly wide-reaching: It makes it a crime to "collect resource data" from any "open land," meaning any land outside of a city or town, whether it's federal, state, or privately owned. The statute defines the word collect as any method to "preserve information in any form," including taking a "photograph" so long as the person gathering that information intends to submit it to a federal or state agency. In other words, if you discover an environmental disaster in Wyoming, even one that poses an imminent threat to public health, you're obliged, according to this law, to keep it to yourself, unless you've obtained specific permission from the landowner before collecting that data — you would be breaking the law by reporting it to the authorities.

The Clean Water Act clearly articulates that citizens should be involved in helping to keep the water clean and the source of E. coli in Wyoming's water is clear. It comes from cows spending too much time in and next to streams, but don't take a photo of the cows to show to the government.

MUSLIM MAN SMASHES STEREOTYPES BY GIVING THE HOMELESS CHRISTMAS **PRESENTS**

Generosity, goodwill, peace, and love - those are just some of the virtues associated with the spirit of Christmas. But at a time when anti-Islamic prejudice is on the rise in some parts of the world, a video by 23-year-old British resident Nubaid Haroon serves as a heartwarming reminder that such qualities transcend religious differences. As seen in the clip, Mr. Haroon decided to play Santa on the streets of London and give gifts to people in need. He purchased presents with his own money, wrapped them, and distributed the festive packages to the homeless. Along with helping out folks who have fallen on tough times, Mr. Haroon also set out to dispel stereotypes about Muslims. "I think that a lot of people think because Muslims don't celebrate Christmas that we don't accept it when people

celebrate Christmas, but in reality my family give chocolates and food to neighbours and friends regardless of their race or religion. Muslims accept all religions and celebrations, it's just about being one with the community" Mr. Haroon said. The video captures the surprised reactions of homeless people when they realise Mr. Haroon is offering them a gift. "A few did ask questions as to why I was offering them gifts when it wasn't something that Muslims celebrate. I was more than happy to share my opinions with them and explain how important it is to spread love," Mr. Haroon added. As for what he'd like people to do in their own communities after watching his video, Mr. Haroon has one wish: "Ideally, I'd just like people to go out and just take into consideration how other people are and how they feel rather than stereotyping everyone in the same way," he said. "Whether that person is Muslim, homeless or whatever they are. We're all the same, and that's the notion I want

WHALES OLDER THAN MOBY DICK STILL SWIM THE SEAS

It's incredible to know that there are likely whales alive today that were already swimming the oceans when the legend of Moby Dick was born. Scientists studying bowhead whale populations off the coast of Alaska have discovered several individuals near the second century mark and at least one that may be 250 years old. It's now believed the species is the longest-lived mammal in the world. Evidence for the species' longevity first appeared in the early 1980s, after native Alaskan Inupiat hunters began finding harpoon tips made of ivory and stone in the blubber of freshly killed bowhead whales. The use of those materials in hunting would date the whales to at least 1880. It wasn't until 2000, however, that a more accurate dating method, one involving the amino acids in the lenses of a whales' eyes, discovered individuals aged 172 to 211 years old.

FOSTER FATHER IS BRINGING CHANGE TO MYANMAR

When Jim Connor from Pennsylvania was a teenager his disenchantment with America's public school system inspired him to explore an alternative education. At the age of 15, he got into yoga, meditation, Buddhism, and being vegetarian, and he realised that life is kind of about being happy, says the now 43 year old. "I hadn't been happy, and I found the school system oppressive. I thought there must be some other way of teaching and learning, and I was set to find that." After graduating from Evergreen State College in Washington, where he created his own curriculum focusing on holistic childhood development, Mr. Connor began seriously considering becoming a foster parent.

"Adoption was expensive, and I started thinking that there are lots of kids who are stuck," says Mr. Connor. "Instead of adopting one child for \$50,000, I thought I could travel and take that and support a large number of kids." In 2004, he founded his NGO, Whispering Seed, and began caring for 25 children of sex workers on a 12-acre farm in Sangkhlaburi, Thailand, 10 miles from the Myanmar border. The children — many born in brothels, where AIDS, abuse, and malnutrition were common previously had no access to health care or education. For nine years, Mr. Connor cared for these children, and after nearly a decade, almost all were placed back with family members or caregivers deemed willing and able to support them. Four Burmese children, however, were left with no one, so in January of 2013, Mr. Connor decided to move to Myanmar with these children to give them a fresh start in their native land. For three years now, Mr. Connor and his children, who range from 12 to 21, have lived like a proper family in Myanmar, and he's turned his efforts to various education initiatives in addition to fighting for paperwork for three of his four children. His eldest received citizenship in early 2013.


"My three youngest children can get into government school, but it's challenging. They're not eligible for a national registration card, which would give them citizenship, allow them to own property, work, and vote," explains Mr. Connor. Working to give his children the life they were deprived of in Thailand while sticking to his long-held education values, Mr. Connor supports an array of engaging, interactive initiatives, for both children and adults that take learning beyond textbooks and classrooms. Trained in earthen building, Mr. Connor is also facilitating the construction of 13 schools, including a heart-shaped kindergarten, in Myanmar's northern Kachin State using permaculture, sustainable design, and international expertise. "We're teaching locals to develop vegetable gardens, compost pits, water catchments, fruit orchards and the like, which are all part of a school's design," says Mr. Connor. "We're now bringing in people from Thailand and Indonesia to teach bamboo treatment."

Looking to give teenagers the education he once longed for, Mr. Connor organises workshops that expose them to creative, outside-the-box learning methods from around the globe.
