




















Coffee Morning for World Down Syndrome Day

CALL TO DREDGE ROSS BOAT CANAL

At the March 2019 meeting of Killarney Municipal Area, Councillor Michael Gleeson proposed:

"That Kerry County Council calls on the NPWS and /or whatever other organisation is involved to dredge the Boat Canal close to Ross Castle, Killarney in order that boat owners can make productive use of their boats for recreation / fishing".

Councillor Gleeson stated that on far too many occasions boat owners experience difficulty in getting their boats from the Canal onto

Lake waters. This is particularly so during prolonged dry spells where the Canal almost dries out. Last year (2018) proved to be very challenging and some fishermen / women have said that they failed to get their boats afloat. Councillor Gleeson said that the long awaited dredging of the Canal is the only real solution to the problem that frustrates many. He asked that the work would be appropriately prioritised.

Future of St. Finan's remains undecided

At the February 2019 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council, Cllr. Michael Gleeson asked for an update from the Council Management on their on-going discussions with the HSE in relation to the former Saint Finan's Hospital and adjoining land. The Reply sated that discussions continue in relation to the purchase of some land for housing. Following that Council meeting some confusion arose and I would like to clarify the present situation.

The HSE have Plans to develop a new Community Hospital on some of the Saint Finan's land.

The HSE are insistent that the Saint Finan's building and the remainder of the land beside the building must be considered as one unit and will not be sold or disposed of as separate lots. The Institute of Technology Tralee has clarified that it no longer has any interest in acquiring the building.

Therefore, the future of the building and its adjacent land remains undecided.

GLOBAL Award For Sr Orla Treacy

The 2017 recipient of the Hugh O'Flaherty Award has been honoured as an International Woman of Courage.

Each year since 2007, the US State Department has identified 10 exceptional women as "International Women of Courage". On March 7th at a function in The State Department in Washington, US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo presented the Award to the 10 International Women of Courage for 2019, including the 2017 Hugh O'Flaherty Humanitarian Award recipient, Sr Orla Treacy. Sr Orla was nominated for this award by the US Ambassador to the Holy See.

Now in its 13th year, the Secretary of State's IWOC Award recognizes women around the globe who have demonstrated exceptional courage and leadership in advocating for peace, justice, human rights, gender equality, and women's empowerment, often at great personal risk and sacrifice. Since the inception of this award in March 2007, the State Department has recognized more than 120 women from more than 65 different countries. U.S. diplomatic missions overseas nominate one woman of courage from their respective host countries. The finalists are selected and approved by senior Department officials.

The Hugh O'Flaherty Memorial Society members send their heartfelt congratulations to Sr Orla on receiving this wonderful international honour.





ur lives of love and peace should speak louder than words," said Sr. Pauline McShain, as she reflected on the motto of the Society of the Holy Child Jesus, which reads, "Actions not words." This philosophy is the foundation of every Holy Child ministry established during the past 164 years. Since 1946, when Sr. Pauline, or "Polly" as her friends call her, began her life in the Society, she desired to follow the example of Mother Cornelia Connelly.

During the 1990s, Sr. Pauline became a volunteer at Siloam, a non-profit organization in Philadelphia, which offers services to with "infected HIV/AIDS... individuals enhancing their over-all well-being, including their personal spirituality." Pauline was second generation Irish-American.

In the 1880s her paternal grandfather emigrated from County Derry, coming to Philadelphia to join his uncle in the construction trade, building both St. James and St. Agatha churches in West Philadelphia.

Sr. Pauline's father, John McShain, was one of America's prolific builders, active in one of the few growth areas during the Great Depression of the 1930s—government contracts. In 1934 John McShain built an annex to the Library of Congress—no small feat for a Republican during a Democratic administration. Having earned the respect of President Roosevelt, Mr. McShain won contracts to build the Bureau of Internal Revenue, the Department of Agriculture, the Bureau of Printing and Engraving, the Jefferson Memorial, the Longfellow Building, the Naval Hospital and, in 1941, the Pentagon. Under President Truman he was awarded the contract for the Reconstruction of the White House 1949-1952

Sr. Pauline referred to her parents' former



estate at Killarney House. Originally situated on 2,500 acres, the house overlooked the Lakes of Killarney, with their backdrop of mountains. Soon after John McShain purchased this estate in 1959, he arranged with the Irish government that, following his own death and that of his wife, Killarney House would become the property of the Irish State. Accepting this gift, the Irish officials agreed to preserve Killarney House & Gardens in perpetuity incorporated into the Killarney National Park. John McShain died in 1989; the death of his wife Mary occurred in 1998.

Sr. Pauline's words, "Trust the child," were often repeated, with effective results. Transportation being difficult during World War II, Polly transferred at fifteen years of age to the School of the Holy Child in Suffern, New York. Following her secondary school graduation, and a trip with her parents and a cousin to the West Coast and Canada, she entered the Society. Her spiritual formation was accompanied by an academic grounding; she graduated from Rosemont College with a B.A. in English. Later, while teaching and serving as an administrator, Sr. Pauline earned Masters degrees in Secondary Education, Religious Studies, Guidance and Counseling. She has taught both in the United States and in Nigeria, served as a secondary school principal, director of novices, religious superior, and as Vicar for Religious in the Diocese of Bridgeport, CT, and the Archdiocese of Newark, NJ. For some years, she has been a member of Pax Christi USA.

Sr. Pauline kept regular updates on the restoration of Killarney House & Gardens now completed as the new Visitor Centre and Gateway to the Killarney National Park....a place where she and her parents always referred to as their 'Irish Home'. Up to the time of her passing she still kept in touch with Killarney and sent a lovely letter on the opening of the new Interpretative Exhibition last September... where we hosted members of the extended McShain and Horstmann families.

It is the end of an era for the McShain family both here in the USA and in Killarney. The Irish people and especially the people of the town of Killarney are indebted to John, Mary and Sr. Pauline McShain for the wonderful 'Gift' of Killarney House & Gardens, Ross Castle, Innisfallen Island the Middle and Lower Lakes of Killarney....their Legacy

Generations to for to come enjoy our little piece of 'Heaven on Earth'.

SEAN SET TO LAUNCH HIS BOOK

Former Councillor, Sean O'Grady is set to launch his book "The Wonderful Life of a Councillor" in the International Hotel on Friday night next March 22nd.

The book looks at Seán's experience of growing up, working and living in Killarney and looks at life in politics through the eyes of a political practitioner of over forty years. It looks at his own life, the people of Killarney and his life as a public representative.

With stories about the issues of the day and the lives of the real people of Killarney the book will resonate with most of the citisens of the town.

This is a book about people, change and life. **Here is an extract from the book.**

I was born early in the year the 2nd World war ended. My father John, a harness maker, was born in a house at Faugh Muckross side of the river Flesk. The Flesk is one of two feeder rivers to the lower lake, Loch Leane. The second river the Deenagh, to the north. My mother, Sheila nee Dwyer was a farmer's daughter from Kilcummin, Killarney. They built a house in Lewis road, in the town land of Moyeightragh (lower plane), better known as the road to the very famous

Fitzgerald stadium, on a plot of ground they purchased from the town council around 1938. I had eight siblings, three brothers, Michael, Sylvester and Donal, five sisters Joan, Noreen, Sheila, Mary and Kathleen.

Fitzgerald Stadium, named after a great Killarney man, a powerful Kerry footballer author and patriot, Dick Fitzgerald who wrote the first coaching manual on Gaelic football "How to Play Gaelic Football". It marked the beginning of modern football not because previous analyses of the game were crude but because the game that Fitzgerald analysed was football with the outer posts removed, a goal worth three points with fifteen players aside. This is only a glimpse of what he achieved within the G.A.A. during its most turbulent years, before his sad and premature death in 1930.

As a volunteer in the 1916 Rising, he was interned in the Frongoch prisoner of war camp in Wales. There, he helped to organise football tournaments amongst the internees. He is quoted as expressing his admiration for the Irish Citizen Army- "Men of whom I have great regard"-who would have been among the most politically radical of the internees.

So highly was he regarded, the stadium was built as a memorial to him, driven mainly by his life long friend "Small" Ger O'Leary and Dr. Eamon O' Sullivan and a very vibrant committee and the patients from St. Finan's Hospital.







CYCLE YOUR STARCHY CARBOHYDRATES

Cycle your carbs. What this means is, on days you exercise or are more active you are 'entitled' to more carbohydrate. If you do a very hard training session you could literally add in enough carbs to account for energy that you burnt during that session. Doesn't this go against the point of doing the exercise? No, of course not, otherwise we wouldn't have said it. If you're already eating at a level to lose weight, you'll still lose weight despite 'cancelling out' the energy used during exercise. However, you might choose to only add in half the energy and increase your weight loss slightly that day. Make sure you have a lot of these carbs straight after the exercise session too as there is an increased tendency for the carbohydrates to be stored in your muscles at this time.

A little more 'science' — your basal metabolic rate (BMR) is essentially the number of kcals (energy) you would burn in a 24hour period if you simply lay down and did nothing. Most of our clients fall somewhere between 1400-2000kcals for their BMR. So, to just 'BE', your body burns say 1500kcals. . . . how on earth do you think you're not able to lose weight eating 1500kcals considering its doubtful you just lay in bed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. If you do, your potential for 'healthy' fat loss is zero. So, why have we mentioned BMR? Because this is mentioned below.

NEVER EAT LESS THAN YOUR BMR

Never eat less than your BMR for prolonged periods. Eating less than your BMR leads to metabolic disruption. For instance, your hair, skin and nails are all 'alive' and need energy to be sustained. If you eat less than your BMR, less important bodily functions like this become down regulated... hence the dry skin and hair and brittle nails of many low kcal, low fat dieters. You also lower production of important hormones which are key to a healthy metabolism including testosterone (in both males and females) and Thyroid Stimulating Hormone (TSH) which as you can imagine is involved directly with your metabolism. So, in general, if you stick to rule 6... you should be safe for Rule 4 even if it creeps over 2lbs per week...



This week is World Glaucoma Week



WHAT GLAUCOMA? : Glaucoma is the name given to a group of eye conditions where the optic nerve at the back of the eye is damaged. It is often linked with raised pressure within the eye, although the eye pressure can sometimes be normal. When the nerve is damaged, it can start to cause problems with the peripheral vision (side vision) and, if left untreated, can cause permanent damage. With early treatment, further damage to vision can be prevented.

Glaucoma may not have symptoms and this is why it is very important to have regular sight tests.

RISK FACTORS

Age is the biggest risk factor for glaucoma. However, your risk also increases if you have family members with glaucoma.

SYMPTOMS

The danger with open-angle or chronic glaucoma (slow onset) is that, in the early stages, your eyesight may seem perfectly normal. There is no pain, but your peripheral vision (side vision) is being damaged. Eventually your central vision can be affected. This can be described as tunnel vision because it feels like looking down a long tube. It's important to have regular sight tests as open-angle glaucoma often does not have symptoms.

TREATMENT

Open-angle glaucoma is usually treated with eye drops which reduce the pressure in the eye. You will need to use these daily. Occasionally people with openangle glaucoma need surgery to control the pressure.

CHICKEN NAPPIES

In urban areas like New York, Denver, and Los Angeles, it's become a trend for the elite to shy away from traditional pets such as dogs and cats, and to raise chickens instead. It's now not only chic to own these birds, but a status symbol as well, and Julie Baker, an enterprising woman from New Hampshire, is cashing in on the trend by making fashionable chicken nappies and is drawing in \$50,000 a year from this business.

10 years ago, on her small Claremont farm, Julie was raising a whole flock of chickens with her daughter, then they happened upon a YouTube video of a chicken wearing a nappy so it wouldn't leave droppings everywhere and as her daughter often brought her favourite hen Abigail into the home Julie set out to sew cotton nappies for the Old English hen; other chicken owners soon were contacting her, wanting such chicken nappies for their farms as well, so Julie opened an online store with her daughter in 2010 called "Pampered Poultry", as something for her to learn from while being homeschooled. Much to her surprise, her venture exploded in popularity. It began with her fellow poultryloving friends, but her customer base soon grew into urban chicken owners as well. Currently, Julie sells anywhere from 500 to 1,000 nappies a month in all 50 states, with each retailing at about \$18. Eventually, Julie branched out from just selling chicken nappies to also making feather guards and chicken clothes as well.

In a society where poultry owners have gone so gaga over their pets that they even hire "chicken whisperers" at \$225 per hour in order to make sure that they're happy, to getting them personal chefs plus the smartphone-enabled, motion-detecting coop where owners can control the ventilation, temperature, lighting, and security from their phone, to the tune of \$20,000, Julie availed of a golden opportunity and the best of luck to her, but I can't help wondering how many financial institutions would have financed her business plan 9 years ago.

MONTREAL HAS TURNED IT'S MOSTHISTORICHOSPITALINTO A SHELTER FOR HOMELESS PEOPLE AND THEIR PETS

Patient rooms in the former Royal Victoria Hospital have been converted into an 80-bed homeless shelter that is now open to women and men—and their pets.

The temporary refuge was launched in January after city homeless shelters found themselves filled to capacity and struggling to accommodate rough sleepers amidst falling temperatures.

And because the overwhelming majority of shelters do not allow pets, officials worked to create a situation where people and their animals would be welcomed.

Though the hospital which was closed in 2015 will ensure warmth and safety for Montreal's homeless until April 15th, provincial legislators will be working with city officials to secure more long-term solutions and permanent housing for when the shelter closes in the spring.

Welcome back dear reader "...do not grieve the Holy Spirit" (Ephesians 4:30). Jesus promised that He would send us a Helper - the Holy Spirit. He is our Comforter, Teacher, Advocate and Attorney, the Presence of God Who leads us into Truth. His ministry brings glory to the Lord Jesus, the Son of God, in Whose Blood was written the New Covenant of Salvation. Before Jesus came, people would try to live good lives according to the Old Covenant Law to save themselves, but it never worked, because it was dependent upon them keeping rules that they constantly broke. "The letter (Law) kills, but the Spirit gives life....where the Spirit of the Lord is there is freedom" (2 Corinthians 3:5-18). Men added more and more laws to the original Law and brought in traditions and doctrines that God never gave or approved of. Jesus tackled this with the religious leaders when He told them "you have nullified the word of God with your tradition" (Mark 7:6-23). He showed that God didn't want people worshipping Him with lip service only and not their hearts - i.e. doing things repetitively for show because that's how it's always been done. He taught them that even though they were diligent to abide by rules and rituals of outward cleanliness, they were in fact defiled by the sin inside of them. It is only the Holy Spirit Who can change us from the inside out. When a person receives Jesus as Lord and Saviour and repents of sin 'times of refreshing come from the Presence of God' (Acts 3:19). As we study His Word and acknowledge Jesus' sacrifice for us, we are transformed by the power of God. Jesus told the Samaritan woman in John chapter 4 that God was not looking for people to worship Him according to the laws of man, but those who would worship Him in Spirit and in truth. The Holy Spirit gives us the desire, the ability and the language to connect with God through Jesus and communicate with Him. God's Word is His Truth, but many don't hear or understand it because they have not received the baptism of the Holy Spirit. When we ask God to baptise us in His Spirit He fills us with His transforming power and we begin to comprehend God's heart and beat in rhythm with Him by turning from sin, thus pleasing, and not grieving His Spirit.



Last week we discussed Compassion, and an essential component of developing Compassion is forgiveness. Forgiveness is not a behaviour as such, more of an internal state of being and feeling. Something has happened to cause us to feel resentful, angry or bitter towards someone else. When we feel wronged, hurt or even betrayed we have a negative feeling towards someone or something. We know from many faiths, psychology and life in general that this baggage of negativity harms us more than anyone else, because we carry it!

The first step of forgiveness is learning to let go, as these negative feelings stand in our way of solving problems or finding a healthy way to change. It really is not simple nor easy to let go that negative feeling, but if we can understand that it releases us more than the other person it would be an excellent start. We are attached to that anxious hurt and negative internal feeling, and by releasing that negative emotion we can think more clearly and thus it allows us to be able to respond to the situation rather than just react blindly.

By forgiving, it is almost like climbing up an emotional ladder or flying above our emotional river, so that we can get some distance or perspective on those feelings and emotion. Once we forgive, we can get perspective of the emotions by feeling without getting overwhelmed, then we can learn emotional signals. By doing this we can calm down and use our logic to respond.

In order to forgive, we do need to understand ourselves better, we need to learn to deal with our raw, almost primitive feelings, Elizabeth Kubler-Ross who has written about and worked with grief for many years said that the root of all emotions is fear. These feelings of fear lead to out-of-balance anxiety and a sense of resentment which can in turn lead to aggression rather than a healthy reaction.

Many people confuse forgiveness with forgetting, or condoning or excusing offences or wrongful behaviour. It does not obligate us to reconcile with the person who harmed us, or release them from legal accountability. Instead it brings the forgiver peace of mind, freeing us from corrosive anger or other negative feelings. In this way it empowers us to recognise the pain we suffered without letting that pain define us, enabling us to heal and move on with our life.
