


He stressed that the town's tourism industry relies heavily on flagship festivals and gatherings such as

CAPTURE THE RESILIENCE OF ZELENSKY

A talented Killarney artist who is now based in Tramore in Co. Waterford captured Volodymyr Zelensky in a pencil drawing of the Ukrainian President while he was in Bucha where residents there have been subjected to a campaign of terror by Russian troups. Bucha is a landscape of horrors.

Originally from Woodlawn in Killarney, Tim Spillane captured Zelensky as he witnessed the atrocities in Bucha which is a landscape of horrors.

From the first day of the war on February 24, civilians bore the brunt of the Russian assault on Bucha, a few miles west of Kyiv, Ukraine's capital.

The horror that President Zelensky viewed was too much for the Urkaine president and he found it hard to compose himslef and difficult to talk about the carnage and horror he witnessed in Bucha.

"I think we all feel helpless as we witness the horrors in Ukraine and I wanted to capture the pain and resilience of this man and his country", Tim told Killarney Outlook.

FIRE PREVENTION A PRIORITY

AT NATIONAL PARK

National Park and Wildlife Service Conservation Wildlife Rangers, William Hunt and Mary Sheehan, at the Eagles Nest, Killarney National Park, assessing areas of popular recreational activity with the latest technology using thermal imaging and assistance of drones ahead of the Easter and Summer holidays. The National Parks and Wildlife Service, wishes to remind visitors of the catastrophic impact of lighting fires. In April 2021, a fire ripped through the Unesco biosphere reserve, resulting in 3,000 hectares being destroyed. Complex ecosystems that took hundreds of years to evolve and Wildlife destroyed, Habitats including wet heath, ancient oak woodlands, blanket bog dating back to neolithic times, lakes and waterways were impacted. Enormous efforts by National Parks and Wildlife Service, Kerry Fire Service, The Air Corps, Killarney Search and Rescue and many local volunteers battled for four days to contain and quench the fire in Killarney National Park. The NPWS is urging more vigilance and heightened public awareness about the dangers of using naked flames outdoors, the need to protect this national resource is paramount. ARTS GRANTS AND BURSARIES 2022 ANNOUNCED



BRINGING THE CLASSROOM OUTDOORS

A Killarney student is part of a new initiative to show how to use outdoor space to teach many other subjects, such as Gaeilge, Geography, History and Art, transforming the Choill Bheag into a Living Classroom.

Jane McGillycuddy is a student at Mary Immaculate College and with her fellow students including Jade O'Connor from Killorglin is part of an initiative with LEAF Ireland who planted almost 100 native trees with students and staff from Mary Immaculate College, Limerick.

An Choill Bheag is a long-term educational programme. It is based on practical sustainable tree planting and long-term woodland and eco-system education, management, and practical skills. It

has a strong emphasis on creating the woodland and hedgerow habitats that are then studied and managed as part of a longer-term educational initiative.

Planting a Choill Bheag on the grounds of Mary Immaculate College will create a small, dense native woodland habitat for biodiversity and an educational and recreational resource for the whole college community to enjoy.

As part of the Choill Bheag project student teachers have attended forest-based workshops in Coillte's Curragh Chase Forest Park, where they were shown a variety of different ways that the outdoors can be used to educate children in all curricular areas.

It's the talk of the town.....



Anne Lucey looks at the positive news happening in the town of Killarney

PARKING WOES CONTINUE

Sources tell me there are plans to impose hefty increases on the already beleaguered Killarney motorist who buys weekly, monthly and annual permits in the car parks dotted around town.

The casual motorist— if he or she can find a parking space in the first place — won't escape either.

The weekly tickets for Euro 30 in Beech Road New Street, The Glebe and Fair Hill are to be scrapped altogether and there will be no weekly tickets there, it is proposed.

The High Street and Lewis Road car parks are to rise from 8 to 28 Euro a week; Rock Road is to go to Euro 24 – and no longer will there be two-week permits at these, I hear.

The annual permit which only apply to Lewis Road and Rock Road is to shoot up from Euro 150 to Euro 500 and Euro 450 respectively. Six-month permits in those two car parks hike from Euro 80 to Euro 270 and Euro 240.

This at a time when petrol and diesel is "rocketing" thanks to the war in the eastern part of Ukraine, and in a town with no practical public transport. (Where is the Killarney electric shuttle bus, for instance?) Street parking and hourly rates in the car parks are set for a hike too.

I would have thought, the proper time to bring in this kind of overall increase is the annual budget in November?

By the way, the long term plans for the Cathedral car park are to impose charges there too, when and if it is acquired by the council, I hear.

The parking byelaws are set to be placed before the public and to be voted on by councillors. I can't see any local councillor supporting such huge hikes. I could be wrong.

TURF TALK

This week we have the clearly nonsensical



proposal by Green Minister Ryan to ban the sale and distribution of turf at a time when, as suggested by Kenmare's Councillor Dan McCarthy just weeks ago, we should all be looking to cut as much of it as we can because of the fuel shortages provoked by the war in the Ukraine.

One of the many deadly missiles being made in Belfast on this island and now being sent to the Ukraine would cause more pollution than ten whole bogs, (bogs, not bags), of turf burnt in the open fire. Yet no Green or any other politician is seeking to ban those missiles and the sale or distribution of those weapons from this island.

Thankfully, the ban on sale and distribution of turf is a million miles away from the "cando-thinking" that emerged at a council meeting this week to solve the housing crisis for our refugees.

On Monday it emerged the housing minister - driven by the EU - has ordered the council to conduct an inventory of all zoned land to put up temporary, because hotel accommodation is running out. This inventory is being carried out in days, senior manager Charlie O'Sullivan told a meeting of the council.

A team of engineers and planners are now looking at all zoned land in the county, Mr O'Sullivan said.

The list is to be returned to the Department of Housing and Local Government "by the end of the week," he said.

I hope we learn lessons from this and employ this kind of quick action for the benefit of Killarney and other towns, long term.

Employers and in Kerry who have tried to build affordable low cost housing for employees in this county have had impossible obstacles placed on their path.

Everything from the kitchen sink has been thrown at them under planning and other "regulations".

For decades the housing crises in Killarney and other towns has been consigned to "turf talk" – going up in smoke!

People have had to move miles away to Milltown, Listry, Barraduff, and beyond and commute back and forth on poor roads because they cannot afford a house or even find a room to rent in Killarney.

(Elsewhere in this column we see how these same workers look set to be penalised

further in their forced daily commute with massive hikes in weekly parking charges)

This is the reality. Now we can see how efficient the authorities can be when there is a will.

This week's sudden conversion is to be hugely welcomed.

Killarney must try to preserve this new road to Damascus thinking by the Housing Minister and Kerry County Council.

A COOL NAME FOR THE GREENWAYS

Up the Kingdom! Councillors in Kerry have elected to crown the necklace of new greenways in north and south Kerry with the umbrella name "Kingdom of Kerry Greenways."

The new name - in Irish it will be "Bealaí Glasa na Ríochta" - is to be accompanied by an "instagramable" crown logo where users can pose for selfies under a crown.

A second option, Kerry Greenways was discarded as too bland and lacking in mystery.

There was some debate about the name, and it was the business savvy Cllr Jackie Healy-Rae who pointed out the marketing value of the use of Kingdom and how it made people think.

The young councillor also pointed out how in social media the crown was very unique and very valuable.

Fine Gael's Jim Finucane echoed him:

"There is a touch of magic about the Kingdom," the Tralee councillor enthused.

The name would provoke curiosity internationally and it would be read rather than said on key social media sites, those with concerns about too many words, were told.

The marketing company Zinc Design Consultants said greenways were "an extraordinary growth area" and as well as new greenways coming on stream, there were route extensions.

But the broad name is not the end of things. Local legs in the new Kingdom of Kerry Greenways would have their own names such as perhaps the Daniel O'Connell greenway in Derrynane, our own Niall O'Callaghan, Killarney councillor said.

We recall how Niall is proposing a greenway to Kenmare so Killarney is not left behind.

Might the Lakes of Killarney leg get the name the Finn McCool greenway? I know others claim the salmon of knowledge was fished from the Boyne, but growing up in Fossa I always heard it was caught at the mouth of the Laune where Lough Leane flows into the river. I can even see the spot where Finn tasted it. The "McCool Killarney Greenway" sounds just about right to me.

FLAG RAISED FOR LAUNCH OF THE **2022 INTERNATIONAL RALLY OF THE LAKES**

The Killarney and District Motor Club launched the 2022 International Rally of the Lakes at The Gleneagle Hotel on Sunday last.

Organisers of the upcoming 2022 event have announced details of the event which has attracted a large entry to date.

The 41st edition of the event is a counting round of:

'Acesigns' Irish Tarmac Rally Championship IPS Packaging Southern 4 Championship Moriarty's Centra Kingdom of Kerry Championship

The 2022 edition of the International Rally of the Lakes has 3 title sponsors. Ireland's Pest Experts Rentokil Initial, headed by local man Michael O Mahony, Aherns.ie Motor Group which is home to BMW, Mazda, Seat and Opel in Kerry and their longstanding loyal supporters the Gleneagle Hotel.

2022 Clerk of the Course is Darren McCormick, who is the first-ever second-generation COC of the rally, has announced a compact, centralised route with stages in close proximity to Killarney town. The two-day International event is sure to attract a large number of spectators to the area in what is set to be the start of the tourism season in Killarney.

The rally will roll into the town centre on Friday evening, with a ceremonial start to take place on Main Street from 7 pm. This family-friendly event is a great chance to see the cars and drivers up close in a safe controlled environment.

The stages commence late on Saturday morning with a run over classic East Kerry stages Kilsarcon, Banard and Gortnagane before crews return to service in Liebherr container cranes to ensure the cars are ready to tackle the same loop stages later Saturday



WHAT KIND OF INSURANCE DOES A CARPENTER OR JOINER NEED?

Much will depend on what tasks are performed on a daily basis. Sole trader carpenters who work on sites will need to have liability insurance in place; Public and products liability and Employers liability if applicable. If the business has a workshop with fixed woodworking machinery and stock then a Combined property policy should also be in place. Woodworking risks are typically rated higher than a standard factory rate and safety

measures such as guarded machines and integrated fire and smoke detection systems would be necessary. Below is an outline of the typical covers needed;

Employers, Public and Products Liability Insurance

- Employers Liability Insurance covers your legal liability in the event that you are negligent and required to pay compensation for bodily injuries to an employee in the course of their employment.
- Employee numbers and annual wages will need to be disclosed accurately and annually.
- Public liability Insurance covers your legal liability in the event that you are negligent and required to pay compensation for bodily injuries or damage to third party property in the course of your business activities.
- Your annual turnover will need to be disclosed and reviewed annually. Many main contractors and state bodies may require you to have a minimum of €6.5 Million limit of indemnity.
- Products Liability Insurance covers your legal liability for injuries and property damage in connection with goods sold or supplied.

Additional covers such as tools and equipment and personal accident can be included on

some policies.

Commercial Vehicles

First and foremost, if you have a commercial vehicle then road risk cover is a requirement by law. As with all other motor insurance products, the cover options would be comprehensive, third party fire & theft, or third party only. Optional extras are windscreen cover and trailer cover.

IT'S NOW TIME FOR STATE EXAM CANDIDATES TO

FOCUS ON JUNE'S WRITTEN EXAMS



Just eight weeks remain before the state Jexams get underway on Wednesday, 8th June. The Leaving Certificate exams, the Junior Cycle exams and the Leaving Certificate Applied (LCA) exams will run until Tuesday, 28th June, Monday, 20th June and Thursday, 16th June, respectively.

The H/O grading system and the CAO common points system have been very successful since being introduced in 2017. Grades now cover multiples of ten percentage points and 625 points is still the maximum CAO score. Grades from H1 to H7 are awarded points at Higher Level while grades from O1 to O6 merit points at Ordinary Level.

The Junior Cycle exams are being held for the first time since 2019 and there are significant changes as a consequence of the Junior Cycle reform which has been ongoing for the past few years. All Junior Cycle subjects have undergone syllabus change and no Junior Cycle exam will last longer than two hours. In addition, all subjects will be examined at common level except for Irish, English and Mathematics, which will still be offered at both Higher and Ordinary levels.

Six new grade descriptors - Distinction (90% to 100%), Higher Merit (75% to < 90%), Merit (55% to < 75%), Achieved (40% to < 55%), Partially Achieved (20% to < 40%), Not Graded (0% to < 20%) - were gradually phased in during the past few years in the reformed Junior Cycle programme. The old A, B, C, D, E, F and NG grades have now been phased out.

Candidates can approach the state exams optimistically because they are well prepared by a dedicated teaching force. The national results achieved each year in the state exams are very impressive. In addition, places in further and higher education courses, apprenticeships and traineeships are very plentiful in a buoyant economy. At this stage, there will certainly be more places available than there will be applicants to take up these places. More employment opportunities are due to be completed in the next few weeks,

available to school leavers as the economic continues to recover from the pandemic. Nevertheless, if the trend of previous years continues, the vast majority of Leaving Cert exam candidates will continue in education as the changing nature of the work environment means that employers are looking for staff with qualifications at craft, traineeship, degree or post-graduate level.

The stigma of failure is long gone from the state exams. Back in the day, failure in Irish meant overall failure. Thankfully, those days are far behind us. Every candidate's performance is now acknowledged by individual certification. Exam candidates' main aim nowadays is to achieve the minimum entry requirements, the specific course requirements and the points for their preferred courses. The State Examinations Commission (SEC) also provides a range of exam supports, known as "reasonable accommodations," for candidates with physical, visual, hearing and learning difficulties in order to remove, as far as possible, the impact of the disability on the candidate's performance in the exams. This facility ensures that no candidate for the state exams is disadvantaged because of a disability.

Despite all the hype about exam pressure, all you need is a cool head, a positive attitude, optimum use of the remaining weeks, good personal and time management, plenty of nutritious food, rest and an exercise programme to burn off any excess stress. Approach the exams with confidence, do your best during the remaining weeks and at the actual exams. Then forget about them and enjoy the summer. Exams should be kept in perspective. They are just another milestone on the eventful journey through life.

With the oral exams concluding on 14th April except for about 600 candidates in 14 schools whose oral Irish and/or oral German exam has had to be deferred to start date of 4th May due to the unavailability of examiners - and practical coursework, project work and study reports exam candidates have a great opportunity to bank very precious marks. Remaining practical exams will be conducted from Wednesday, 4th May to Friday, 6th May. The Leaving Cert Vocational Programme (LCVP) written exam is scheduled for Wednesday, 4th May. The written exam in Leaving Cert Computer Science will take place on Wednesday, 25th May. In the final term, the written papers now become the major focus of attention as the June exams draw ever closer.





WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR PENSION & WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?

You can normally get access to your pension from age 60, a lot of the rules depend on whether you are an employee or self employed. If you are coming close to retirement then you are probably wondering what options you have when you want to get access to your pension. It depends on what type of pension you have but generally there are four options:

Tax Free Cash: Most people will be entitled to a tax free lump sum, the amount varies however generally you will get at least 25% of the value of your pension in a tax free cash lump sum.

Taxable Cash: You may also be able to take sum of your pension in taxable

Annual Pension: This is a guaranteed income usually paid monthly for the rest of your life that is purchased with the money left after your tax free lump sum, this is subject to taxation.

Approved Retirement Funds: You may be entitled to keep some of your money in an approved retirement fund, money can be taken from the fund to give you a regular income, usually monthly. This is subject to taxation also. Taxation at retirement is often much lower than when you are working.

It is extremely important that you take your time and have all the options explained to you in plain simple English and that you understand all your options clearly before you make your final decision. As well as the above there is much more to be discussed about your pension. You should discuss your retirement options with a financial advisor who has access to a number of different pension providers before making any decisions, he or she will help you with the above options and any other queries you may have.

So hopefully the 2021/22 season will be looked back on as the year the well was dug for the water of future years to be enjoyed. While it may only have been a beginning, "A good start is half the battle".



KERRY LADIES BACK IN DIVISION ONE

Kerry have been dancing on the fringes of promotion ever since they slipped down into the second tier, having lost the Division Two Finals in both 2019 and 2021 (there was no 2020 campaign) only to slip off the edge. Along the way they have blooded a fantastic generation of upcoming players to supplement the proven talents of the likes of Cáit Lynch, Lorraine Scanlon, Anna Galvin, and of course Louise Ní Muircheartaigh. Armagh were formidable opposition – they always are, and the great Aimee Mackin needs no introduction to any follower of the game either – but last Sunday it was the Kerry Ladies who showed a defter touch and, perhaps, a deeper hunger.

Niamh Ní Chonchúir and Aishling O'Connell got Kerry off to a perfect start. Armagh weren't long in replying through Eve Lavery and Catherine Marley, though. The Mackins got in on the scoring act then, with Blaithín notching a point from play and Aimee pointing a free. Erica McGlynn pulled one back for Kerry but Aimee replied with another free. 0-5 to 0-3 at the first water break. This was very good, very fast-paced football on both sides.

Louise Ní Muircheartaigh had yet to trouble the umpires, but she changed that with a rapid brace to level matters. However, she departed on a yellow card after a mis-timed tackle on the dynamic Catherine Marley – ostensibly wing forward, Marley covered an amount of ground. That swung the pendulum back in Armagh's direction, with Aimee Mackin, Catherine Marley, and Niamh Coleman all firing over. Just before half-time Erica McGlynn kicked her second point to make it a two point game. Kerry were playing better than the scoreline suggested, with Erica unlucky to see good efforts crash back off the crossbar and the post, while Niamh

Kerry, in the meantime, had brought on Rathmore teenager Danielle O'Leary, and she more than anyone was to electrify the game. She pointed within a minute of her introduction, but Mackin responded with a brace. Things looked bleak for Kerry at that stage, trailing by 0-11 to 0-7. The game turned on a stunning burst of pace by Danielle, slicing through a hapless defence to bury a brilliant goal. Aoife McCoy made it 0-12 to 1-7 in favour of Armagh just before the second water break, but one could sense a greater positivity about Kerry.

Louise Ní Muircheartaigh trimmed the gap back to one. Cáit Lynch made a trademark burst up the field to level matters. The next score was crucial, and once the ball fell to Danielle O'Leary again, Kerry were in front for the first time since the opening minutes. Ní Muircheartaigh slotted another free after Danielle was fouled before Armagh lost the influential Marley to a yellow and Kerry's deadly duo repeated that sequence for the clinching score.

Comhgairdeas to all the Kerry team and to mentors Declan Quill and Darragh Long. Division One football is fast, hard, and demanding, but I've had no doubts for quite a while now that not only are Kerry well able to compete at that level, but that it will provide the sharpness that they need to get back to the heights of yore.

LADIES DIVISION ONE FINAL

Meath Donegal

It isn't that long ago at all that Meath were competing in Intermediate grade and with Kerry in Division Two – not only that, but we were usually well able for the Royals. Then they went on one of the most meteoric rises in sports that I can remember, ending up dethroning red hot favourites Dublin and ending the year as All Ireland champions. It wasn't any flash of the pan, either, as they proved by winning their first ever Division One National League last Sunday against Donegal. They made a lightning start, but Donegal reeled them in and it took a cracking goal by Niamh O'Sullivan midway through the second half to put Meath back in the ascendancy.

AFL GLORY FOR IRISH LADIES

Ladies football has probably been the fastest growing sport in the country over the past decade – the likes of the 'One Club' and 'Mothers and Others' initiatives and the superb sponsorship by Lidl have been huge factors, but the hard work put in by clubs and schools on the ground has really been phenomenal. It's also raised appreciative eyes in farther shores, namely Australia. The Ladies version of

AFL has enjoyed a similar growth period, and just like the mens' game, the similarities in style and the recruitment rules regarding foreign players make Irish recruits particularly welcome. A good few players have embraced that opportunity with both hands in recent years. Fair play to them – good education, a supportive environment, decent pay (not as much as the men, but a lot closer than it used to be!) and a chance to play sport at a professional level. I have no great tolerance for the kind of nonsense that suggests that they 'owe' it to their native shores to forego such opportunities, the very notion is ridiculous.

As such, I am delighted to see Irish players, including Dingle's Mark O'Connor like Tadhg Kennelly before him, prosper in antipodean climes.

Irish women have broken two big barriers in the AFLW recently. In 2019 Ailish Considine from Clare signed with the Adelaide Crows and played a key role in helping them to a Grand Final victory. This year she became the first Irish player to win two when the Crows triumphed 29-16 over the Melbourne Demons. Fellow Irishwoman Sineád Goldrick starred for Demons, with 20 disposals, three marks, three tackles, and four clearances (just trust me – those are superb numbers).

Arguably an even bigger milestone was achieved by Tipperary's Orla O'Dwyer. Last year she helped Brisbane Lions to their Grand Final triumph (beating Considine's Crows along the way). This year was less successful





for the team, being eliminated by Demons, but O'Dwyer's stunning form was recognised when she was selected on the 2022 AFL Womens' All Australian team. She is the first Irishwoman to ever attain the coveted accolade, and only the second Irish person after the late Jim Stynes back in 1993.

INTERPROVINCIAL **CHAMPIONSHIPS**

There was welcome news for Kerry rugby followers as it was announced during the week that both Killarney (Aghadoe) and Tralee (O'Dowd Park) have been selected as host venues for the Junior Interprovincial Championships.

Munster, coached by John Lillis and Geoff Kenny, will open their campaign against Connacht in Aghadoe on Saturday 23rd April (2.30pm) and it should be a feast of rugby.

A literal feast, in fact, as Killarney RFC are planning to host a barbecue for the occasion. Admission will just cost E5 for adults, with U16s admitted free, and it should be an occasion to savour as well as an opportunity to see some of the brightest young talent rising rapidly through the provincial ranks.

A week later O'Dowd Park will host Ulster in Round Two.

RUGBY IRELAND OFF THE MARK Womens' Six Nations: Ireland 29 Italy 8

A win is a win, and Ireland desperately needed a win here. In fact, let's be honest. Italy are not really a force in Six Nations rugby (that's not to disrespect their mens' fantastic victory over Wales this year) and a win over them wouldn't exactly count as collateral towards a loan.

Go back a decade ago and Ireland were the $dominant force in ladies \, rugby \, and \, starting \, on \, a$ journey that would culminate in them winning the World Cup. We've slipped somewhat from that pedestal - I think it isn't much of a secret that a lot of former players have criticised the level of support for the womens' game at national level. The game is very healthy on the ground, as indicated by Killarney's U16 Girls triumphing in Musgrave Park - that would have been unthinkable when the likes of Ciara Griffin first picked up a ball.

In the past couple of years, we were a strong third in the Six Nations. We didn't really have the depth to trouble the big two of England and France regularly, but we could compete with them and the likes of Beibhinn Parsons was able to pull out a touch of magic often enough to worry them. This year we have already lost to Wales and France, following on from our disastrous failure to qualify for the World Cup. In the circumstances, this win over Italy was a badly needed boost.

An early penalty for Italy had them 3-0 ahead early on but good Irish pressure at the scrum opened space for Lucy Mulhall to get over in the corner. Beibhinn Parsons almost got in down the left sideline but Italy recovered very well. Amye-Leigh Murphy Crowe had a try disallowed. Ireland were playing with confidence though, Nicole Cronin almost in for a try. Ireland's second try finally arrived five minutes before half-time, the sheer strength of the Irish forwards driving through for Neve Jones to touch down. Those scores never delight purists, but they are hard to execute in their own right.

The second half was just three minutes old when Eve Higgins caught a Kathryn Dane kickthrough brilliantly and outsprinted everyone to the line. Great execution, but Italy, having worked so hard to that point, will surely be disappointed at coughing up a score that easily. Nicole Cronin salted the wound with a good conversion. 17 - 3. With that scoring cushion, Ireland could afford to press more and Nimah Higgins created panic stations with a good run that ended up with a penalty try being awarded. With just eight minutes left Italy did get in off a lineout maul for a try they deserved it for effort alone. In the dying minutes Katie O'Dwyer got a real poacher's score when the ball spilled loose from an Italian player after a wicked bounce, and Ireland had try number five to seal a comprehensive win. It'll get tougher from here on in, of course, but hopefully this can be a launching pad.

Darragh set a new personal best in the 3000m Steeplechase, finishing in 10m18.18s.

GOLF IRISH SHINE AT AUGUSTA

There was quite a lot of fuss made in the Irish media about having no less than four Irish golfers at the US Masters this year questing for that famous green jacket. A bit too much for my liking, to be truthful. Both Rory and Shane have been dogged with patches of inconsistency. They can play five or six holes in a row dramatically - and then suddenly drop two shots on the next with what feels like carelessness. Quite simply, people who call consistency "the hobgoblin of lesser minds" have never played Augusta and have almost certainly never played golf. Augusta appears (I have never played it) to require the lowest margin of error of them all. Frankly, I expected Rory to be hovering around the top ten - the expectations placed on his shoulders by the Irish public are ridiculous - this is one of the best golfers in the world in the past decade and always in the running. He's quietly picking up millions along the way, smiling with unfailing politeness while we lesser mortals practically demand that fourth major.

Shane has the feel of one of our own. More so than Rory, you can easily imagine having a pint with him – maybe it's the GAA connection. His understated sponsorship of Offaly GAA has a common touch to it. To be honest, where Rory was an instant phenomenon practically from childhood – one of the most prodigious talents the game has ever seen, in fact – it always felt as if Shane had to graft that little bit harder. I remember being delighted for him winning the Irish Open – like I say, he felt like one of our own – but I honestly never suspected that he would ascend to the elite ranks of work golf.

Time catches up with all of us. Pádraig Harrington set the benchmark for Irish golf and did it in a very likeable way - again, having a father who played inter-county GAA for Cork doesn't hurt – but somehow the conviction to win doesn't seem to be quite there. He's always good, but I suspect we have already seen the apex of his greatness – and it was great.

Seamus Power has been slowly, patiently working his way upwards. He was recognised as a talent from a young age but adding that last two or three per cent to elevate you to competing at the elite professional level is a much bigger climb that most people think (that's true of all sports, by the way).

I didn't have high expectations for the Irish players, to be honest. And boy, was I wrong! Pádraig Harrington missed out on the cut by just one shot – a tough one. Seamus finished on +4 – he was well able to hold his own at this level and pocketed \$111,000 for his trouble. Shane has quietly and calmly become one of the best golfers in the world – his shot selection in particular has really tightened up. Less spectacularly ambitious bombs and more precision missiles. Tied for third at Augusta at -5, winning \$870,000, is an incredible achievement.

I've always had a soft spot for Tiger Woods. Yes, he made mistakes in his lifestyle – if you had given some-one as immature as me that much money and success, I'm fairly sure I couldn't remotely have handled it. There but for the grace of God....I was delighted to see the one time giant of the game and breaker of an unseen and unspoken race barrier in the game (Augusta in particular has a despicable record in that regard) make the cut, if only barely, finishing in 47th with +13.

Scheffler went into this tournament as the favourite – and the favourite almost never wins at Augusta, but this guy is different gravy and was a worthy winner. -10 at Augusta? Almost immaculate from start to finish. I suspect that we won't see golf like this too often in the future.

But it was Rory's final round that took all the headlines. He started the day no less than ten shots behind Scheffler and I for one expected him to finish within a respectable chasing pack. I did not remotely expect what he actually did. Much has been made of his spectacular chip in at the 18th, and it was a phenomenal shot, especially under that kind of pressure. I'll admit that I've been a bit sceptical of Rory in those circumstances, with the eyes of the whole world on him, but he was cool as a breeze. Less heralded, but even more significant for me, was his eagle at the 13th. By then he hadn't had a single bogey and was already racking up birdies, but that one catapulted him straight into the race. In the end he shot 64, the best finishing round ever at the Masters and just one shot off the course record. Second place and a cool \$1.76m. No grudging Scheffler he didn't put a single shot wrong with Rory metaphorically breathing down his neck - but my word, what a finish!

GER MCKENNA

Genial schoolteacher Ger McKenna was one of the greatest orators I have ever heard. He didn't speak too often in his role as President of Kerry GAA at County Board Meetings, but when he did, everybody listened. An old school education meant that his words were not only laced with regular latin and greek phrases (he would courteously translate when he saw the attending media's puzzled looks - I suspect that he was always hiding a gentle smile) but also with no little humour. He was not only knowledgeable about the rulebook, but also instinctively astute. Most of all, he was very much about the roots of the organisation, and some of the best players and managers in the history of the game respected him all the more

He was a key member of the County Board from the sixties onwards (it was Ger, on the

suggestion of then County Chairman Dr. Jim Brosnan, who formally proposed the instigation of Bórd na nÓg in 1968) and became Chairman in 1972. Kerry football had been the crest of a wave, winning All Irelands in 1969 and 1970, but there were ominous signs, most notably Cork's minor success in the era. In 1975 Ger approached the Kerry footballer and popular selector Mick O'Dwyer to ask him to take over the senior team. There is a lot of myth about the appointment. I remember talking to Ger about it and mentioning that the story was that he had driven down to Waterville to persuade O'Dwyer to take the team. Ger only laughed -"Believe it or not, school principals and hotel managers did have access to phones in those days!". O'Dwyer was already managing the Kerry U21s and had served as a senior selector even in his playing days, plus he was well aware of the talent coming through the ranks. Mickey Ned, Egan, Deenihan, big Tim Kennelly, the O'Keeffes.....but Ger knew that they needed the right man to manage them, and he got him.

Ger never sought the credit for Kerry's success in that era, but he was a huge element of it. He was unfailingly a players' man, and not just the best-known players. He held on to the Chairmanship after a tough challenge in 1977 after Kerry had lost to Dublin two years in a row – it was never personal, it says much about both men that Ger and his opponent remained good friends afterwards. Each respected the honesty of the others' position. I have heard it said that the fact that Ballyduff man Ger had the full backing of the hurling clubs was the key factor. Nonsense, Ger had enormous backing simply because of who and what he was. His talent had already been recognised at national level - he had been a key member of a national committee to broaden the appeal of hurling, and would go on to become a Central Council delegate and a GAA Trustee.

Ger never sought to make headlines, but very few people can match his contribution, not just to Kerry GAA, but to the whole Kerry community, as generations of schoolchildren can willingly attest. Ar dheis De go raibh a anam.


EASTER EGG CHEESECAKE




Welcome back dear student, last week we saw how David defeated Goliath with just a slingshot and a stone. The testimony of David stirs courage in our hearts. The giant Goliath had come out every morning and evening for forty days as the opposing sides were arrayed for battle. The Philistines were lined up on one hillside - the Israelite army on the opposite, with a valley between them. But they never fought, even though they were fully dressed for battle with armour and weapons, because the Israelites were paralysed in terror. So this circus carried on day after day. The giant was an arrogant bully - much bigger and stronger than anyone in the Israelite army. He enjoyed taunting God's people making them feel weak and helpless - their fear exposed and courage stripped bare. But when David's faith in God propelled him out onto that valley to fight the giant everything changed!


David had experienced God personally deliver him many times. He obeyed God's Word and knew God's ways, and he understood God's power by fellowshipping with Him. He was not distracted by the giant's taunts — he ran out believing that God would somehow deliver His people. Because David ran out there, the entire nation of Israel was set free. Up to then, when Goliath would start cursing the Israelites they would literally flee for their lives, because of the fear. But when David killed the giant, it was the Philistines who fled! Now the Israelites, set free from their bondage of fear, chased down and overpowered their enemies, their courage resurrected because of David's victory (1 Samuel 17:24-52). It took just one teenage boy trusting in the God of Angel Armies to bring freedom to his entire nation. "Say to those with fearful hearts — 'be strong, do not fear!' Behold, your God will come with vengeance.....He will come and save you" (Isaiah 35:4 NKJV). Whatever has been terrorising your life dear friend - God has already paid the price to set you free from it (1 Peter 1:18-21). And when you come to know His Son Jesus, your hope and joy will be resurrected so that even those in your household and nation will be affected by the change in you.

The Lord Jesus came to set the captives free (Isaiah 61:1-3; Luke 4:18-19; Acts 10:38). Jesus understands your fears. He felt such fear in the Garden of Gethsemane that He sweated blood at the prospect of what was facing Him (Luke 22:44; Isaiah 52:13-15). However, He set His face like flint to carry out God's plan of Salvation (Isaiah 50:6-7; Isaiah 53). He endured the Cross for the joy of seeing His children set free from sin and death (Hebrews 12:1-3). And God raised Him from the dead as proof that He is our Deliverer. So many people are held in slavery to fear. It doesn't matter what the fear is - it provokes the same response. David learned to trust God long before he went out onto the battlefield. Trust is earned and takes time to develop. I encourage you to get into Bible study to get to know God - for it is the only stabilising force you will experience. FOCUS ON ROSES

Every garden should leave a space for roses. The colour and scent will provide plenty of interest in your garden from early summer to late autumn. There are a lot of different classes of roses to choose from but most of the time it is the



Floribunda roses: There are lots of good reasons to plant a floribunda rose even though the blooms lack the size and fragrance of the hybrid rose. The advantages of the floribundas would be the continuity of its flowering. Most floribunda roses will flower from early summer till late autumn and the flowers usually provide a much larger splash of colour than the hybrid tea rose.

Planting roses: When planting a rose, the most important thing to do is prepare the soil well as all roses are very hungry plants. Incorporate a lot of well rotted farm yard manure "horse manure' if possible before planting. When your roses are planted make sure you firm them in well with your heel as this will avoid any root disturbance later. Pruning your roses: In early spring, cut out any old wood and any stems which are damaged. The pruned surface should be white if it is brown, prune back futher. Remove any stems which rub against another so you will end up with an open centre. You can now prune about a third of the stems that are left. In the autumn you can remove dead flowers and tidy up the rose. Make sure to feed your roses throughout the growing season. Next week I will focus on Confers.


