### Killarney set to welcome The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall



The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall are spending today in Kerry as part of their trip to Ireland. The Royal couple will visit Derrynane House, the ancestral home of 19th century Irish Statesman Daniel O'Connell and will then travel to Tralee to watch a performance at Siamse Tire Irish National Folk Theatre. Later, The Prince and The Duchess will attend a garden party at Killarney House where Their Royal Highnesses will be presented with the Order of Innisfallen, which recognises outstanding contributions to the local economy by people from outside Kerry.

Prior to their visit to Killarney the couple visited Northern Ireland, where they undertook a range of engagements Made at the request

Made at the request of the British Government, Their Royal Highnesses'



visit to Ireland will highlight the essential

partnership and friendship between the two Nations, as well as the deep connections between their people. This is the fourth visit Their Royal Highnesses have made to Ireland in as many years, and offers a further opportunity to celebrate the enduring nature of the relationship.

Their Royal Highnesses began the two-day visit to Ireland in Cork where they were greeted with a civic reception at City Hall, hosted by the Lord Mayor.

The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall jointly visited the English Market in Cork City, which was previously visited by Her Majesty The Queen in 2011.

The Tánaiste (Deputy Prime Minister) Simon Coveney accompanied Their Royal Highnesses in Cork and joined them for a dinner to celebrate connections between the UK and Ireland.

The Prince of Wales visited University College Cork and the National Maritime College of Ireland, while The Duchess of Cornwall visited a Cork refuge, which serves women and children who have suffered domestic violence, a cause that Her Royal Highness has worked to highlight in the UK and overseas.

The Duchess will also visit the Irish National Guide Dogs Training Centre.

#### Kerry women bare all for world breaking record

Two Kerry women were among over 2,000 women who bared all at a Wicklow beach on Saturday, setting a new world record for the largest skinny dip and raising thousands of euros for a children's cancer charity.

Jacqui Tagney from Listry and Lisa Ragosa from Kenmare were among 2,505 women who spent at least five minutes in the chilly waters of secluded Magheramore beach, Co.Wicklow to set the new Guinness World Record.

"It was one of the most emotional experiencesI have ever done", Lisa told the Killarney Outlook.

"I met some amazing strong women and the oldest dipper was 85 years old - It didn't matter what you looked like, everyone had scars some you could see some you couldn't, there was one lady just out of treatment last week wrapped up in cling film to protect her dressings so they didn't get infected", Lisa added.

"I was a first time dipper and didn't know what to expect, I travelled up with my two cousins who also participated", Jacqui told the Killarney Outlook.

"It was a very emotional experience, lots of tears and laughter . I met some of the most amazing strong



women everyone bearing their own scars. It was an truly amazing experience - one I will definitely be doing again next year", Jacqui added.

The event raised  $\in$ 290,000 for the Irish cancer charity Aoibheann's Pink Tie, which was set up in 2010 after Irishman Jimmy Norman's 8-year-old daughter Aoibheann died from cancer, prompting the men at her funeral to wear pink ties because that was the girl's favourite coloor.

Saturday's skinny dip smashed the three-year-old record of 786 people taking the plunge in Perth, Western Australia, at an event to promote positive body images.

Treyvaud's Travels is all about unique characters and stunning locations that don't normally get the attention they deserve and it features some cracking recipes and a whole load of fun.


"The emphasis is on having a

### **Muckross House Makes Top Ten** in Ireland's Top Visitor Attractions

Muckross House has been named Number 9 in Ireland's Top Visitor Attraction in Fáilte Ireland h annual list of Ireland's most popular visitor attractions.

The list, which was published this week shows that almost all our key attractions - many of which have received Fáilte Ireland funding and support in the past – enjoyed another bumper year for visitors in 2017. Topping the list of 'free to enter' attractions, the National Gallery of Ireland surpassed the 1m visitor mark for the first time, experiencing an impressive 41% growth. This was particularly helped by the reopening of its permanent collection halfway through the year, as well as hosting two major exhibitions of Caravaggio and Vermeer. The most popular fee-charging attraction remains the Guinness Storehouse, with a total of 1,711,281 visitors through its doors, up 64,000 on the previous year. The Cliffs of Moher and Dublin Zoo came in second and third place in the same category. Kerry's Muckross House, Gardens and Traditional Farm was in 9th place in this category, with 552,923 visitors.

### Significant funding approved for Two Mile Community National School for refurbishment work

hat a great year for Two Mile **Community National School!** Wednesday 30th August 2017 marked a very significant day as Kerry ETB opened the doors of the Two Mile Community National School. The Two Mile Community National School is the only multi denominational school in the Killarney area. Mr. Brendan Griffin TD, Minister of State at the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport officiated at the launch. One year on, and we gather here once more with Minister Griffin as he announces that, as well as getting sanction to engage an additional teacher for the 2018/2019 academic year because of the increasing enrolment numbers, the Department of Education and Skills have also awarded Two Mile Community National School a grant of over €200,000 to update and refurbish the school. This vital funding will be used to replace the windows and doors, insulate the roof and walls, upgrade the heating distribution system and refurbish the electrical system among other things.

Kerry ETB is a locally based state agency and is already the patron of 8 post primary schools and two Post Leaving Certificate Colleges in Kerry. The ETB provides key administrative, IT, HR, Capital Buildings and many other supports to its schools. This ensures that the staff of the school are not tied up with administrative issues and are free to focus on excellence in teaching and learning.

Speaking at the announcement, Mr. Brendan Griffin TD, Minister of State at the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport said "This is a very

positive progress in such a short time. It is hugely encouraging and a great symbol of a rural community fighting back to secure a future for the school." "We are delighted to be included under the Additional Accommodation Scheme for refurbishment works. Two Mile Community National School is a focal point in the local Community and has gone from strength to strength in the last year, thanks to the hard work and commitment of the school community", Catherine Barry, Principal of Two Mile Community National School said.

Ann O'Dwyer, Director of Schools, Kerry ETB also welcomed the Department of Education and Skills recent refurbishment grant for the Two Mile Community National School in Killarney. "This will build on the remedial works carried out last summer and will address the much needed insulation, replacement of windows and doors, floor covering and general refurbishment. Kerry ETB together with the Two Mile CNS Board of Management and staff look back on a very successful year. Enrolments continue to grow, parents have been hugely positive about the quality of quality of teaching and learning, student care and extracurricular opportunities in the school as well as the commitment to parental and community involvement. The provision of the preschool Little Explorers on site has also been a huge asset to the school. The Parents Council have also joined the Kerry ETB Parents Forum and are now aware of and availing of the opportunities for training and support for parents in ETB schools such as Parenting Courses, ICT Courses etc.", she said.

The Board of Management has every confidence that the school has a bright future. The pupils have applied themselves willingly and they have benefited from their studies. # Celebrations as Meentogues N.S. secure Third Place at NUI Galway

There was huge celebrations when it was announced that pupils from Meentogues National School in Headford, Killarney were third place winners for their randomised clinical trial, How much can teachers influence us? The pupils investigated how much teachers influence pupils and found that having a teacher in the room does indeed influence a pupil's choice. The win was part of the recent Schools Teaching Awareness of Randomised Trials (START) Competition, which took place at NUI Galway.

The START competition, now in its third year, is run annually by the Health Research Board - Trials Methodology Research Network (HRB-TM-RN) based at NUI Galway. The programme is designed to increase young children's understanding and awareness of randomised clinical trials and educate pupils about why we need ran-

domised trials to improve healthcare nationally and globally.

Due to the quality of the entries, the judges were unable to pick a stand-alone third place winner and a joint third place was announced. Pupils from St. Michael's National School, Castlepollard, Co. Westmeath won joint third place for their clinical trial, Can ten minutes of daily exercise increase students' fitness? They evaluated if ten minutes of daily exercise increased the pupils' fitness and found a slight effect but not enough to be conclusive about this result.

aha National School is among five schools in Kerry chosen to participate in pilot Creative Schools scheme from September 2018

Chosen from over 400 applicants, schools chosen to take part in the programme include primary schools, secondary schools, Youthreach centres, special schools, DEIS schools, co-educational schools, rural, urban, single-sex and Irish-language medium schools. Work will begin in September 2018 and run through to the end of the school year in 2019.

In their application, schools had to explain how their participation would support learning and development in the arts and creativity, their capacity to engage as a school and their plans for ensuring that children and young people play an active role in developing, implementing and evaluating their work as a Creative School. Through the programme, the Arts Council is engaging with children and young people across the country enabling their creativity and linking them in with the arts and creative infrastructure in their locality and nationally.

On hearing the news Gerry Fitzgerald of Faha N.S said: "This programme will enable us to increase the professional manner in which the Arts are delivered in our school.

It will also further develop the existing culture of embracing the arts and promote creativity in our school. It will help build pride, self-esteem and aid personal development for all involved."

Fybough National School in Castlemaine were also chosen and Principal Catherine Ní Mhuircheartaigh said: "We see this as a remarkable opportunity for our students to engage in the arts in a new and exciting way.

We are eager to create a space in which children can express themselves creatively. We want to breathe new life into the arts in our school and this opportunity opens doors to endless possibilities."

Schools selected for the pilot will be provided with a package of support which includes funding and expertise from a Creative Associate to enable them to explore the potential impact of the arts and creativity on school life. With the support of their Creative Associate, schools will develop a Creative School plan and design a unique programme that responds to the needs and priorities of their school.

This process will support children and young people to challenge themselves in new ways, to gain in confidence and to take a more active role in learning.

Other Kerry schools include Pobalscoil Inbhear Sceine in Kenmare, Presentation Primary School in Tralee and Scoil Eoin Balloonagh in Tralee.

Due to the success of the initial venture, the choir was formed on a permanent basis and renamed Roscommon Solstice Choir and continues to tour extensively at home and abroad.



#### USING YOUR PENSION TO PAY LESS TAX:

Pension contributions provide a way of paying less income tax. Up to Revenue Limits, contributions to a pension qualify for relief from income tax. This effectively means that, where the higher rate of income tax is 40% and you are a higher rate taxpayer, a  $\in$ 100 contribution to a pension will only have a net cost to you of  $\in$ 60 (had you not made the contribution, the other  $\in$ 40 would have gone to the government as income tax).

Pensions carry another tax benefit: they grow free of tax, unlike deposit accounts in Banks etc (which are generally subject to tax on interest in the form of DIRT) or investment in property or shares (where rent or dividends are liable to income tax and gains in value are subject to Capital Gains Tax).

When pension benefits are drawn down, a Retirement Lump Sum can usually be taken either completely free of tax or subject to a beneficial rate. The rest of the benefit, usually taken in the form of a retirement fund or a pension for life, is taxable. However many people will find themselves in a lower tax bracket in retirement than when they were working and making pension contributions, and so will often not pay a lot of tax on their pension income when they retire.

#### **Health Insurance Tax Credit**

If you are a member of an approved private health insurance scheme, you may get a tax credit. This tax credit is generally granted directly by the insurance company. Your premium will be reduced by the amount of the tax credit so you will probably not even notice that you have got a tax credit. This is known as Tax Relief at Source (TRS).

However, in some limited situations TRS does not apply, for example, where an employer pays the medical insurance premiums on behalf of an employee. This is treated as a Benefit in Kind and PAYE, PRSI and USC are due on the total amount. This means that the employee does not benefit from the TRS on the medical insurance premium and can make a claim directly to Revenue.

The relief is limited to the cost of the policy up to a maximum of  $\leq$ 1,000 per adult and  $\leq$ 500 per child. A child is considered to be a person under 21 years of age, whether or not they are in full-time education as long as a child premium has been paid for them. For individuals 21 years of age and over, you can now claim relief at the amount set for adults, even if they are getting a child premium.

The relief is given at the standard rate of 20%.

# There is still a lot to play for as the State Exams enter the final week

A s the state exams approach the end of the second week, many candidates have reached or are close to the end of the road. The optional subjects now take centre stage. As the number of candidates taking these subjects is considerably less than the number taking the compulsory subjects some exam centres will close early. Candidates from these centres will be relocated to a different centre for the remainder of the exam. The number of candidates in the school environment will also continue to decrease, so it's important for candidates who still have a job of work to do, not to feel left behind or become impatient to get over the finish line.

Normally in the final week, candidates will have one or two subjects from a standard seven left to do. However, it's not unknown for students to take an eight or even a ninth subject to complete a particular vocational grouping such as Business, Economics and Accounting. So there is still a lot to play for. There are grades and points to be earned.

Candidates must guard against exam fatigue in week three. The buzz of the early days is gone. There is less foot fall around the exam centres. Your remaining subjects are likely to be spaced out. These subjects have to be faced. They must be given priority between now and Friday week. Keep a lid on your impatience and stay in exam mode. You need to be as motivated, focussed and energetic during week three as you were on the first exam day.

Eight of the thirteen exam days will have passed by tomorrow, Friday evening. There are ten more subject sessions in the remaining five days. The number of candidates taking these final week subjects will be much less than in the earlier days of the exam. However, candidates concerned must defer any post exam celebrations. In sporting parlance, as Sir Alex Ferguson has so often reminded us, the game ends only with the final whistle. How right he is! Defeat has often been snatched from the jaws of victory by one untimely lapse in concentration.

The weekend provides an opportunity to recharge the batteries and to plan for next week. Enjoy some exercise and fresh air to prepare for the third week. A good work out will help you to sleep soundly, to build up stamina and endurance and to maintain your concentration for the last lap. Enjoy a few good nights' rest so that your mind and body are fully alert for the remaining papers. Organise your revision sessions for daylight hours. Don't burn the mid-night oil but go to bed early. Go over the tips and predictions for your remaining subjects. Resist the temptation to spend endless hours cramming course material. Scan your notes on the eve of any remaining paper so that the key concepts are fresh in your mind.

Maintain your disciplined and organised approach over the remaining days. Avoid late night socialising with those who have finished the exam. Keep your distance from alcohol as you'll need a clear head and lots of energy for the task ahead. Eat well as good nutrition is important in week

three to avoid energy loss. Keep your fluid levels high to avoid dehydration.

Candidates have performed very well during the past fortnight. Keep up the good work and bring your exam to a successful conclusion next week. Use your free days wisely. Stay positive and be confident in your ability to do well in next week's papers. Take it subject by subject and bring the curtain down on a stellar performance.

After the State Exams, applicants to the Central Applications Office (CAO) turn their attention to the CAO "Change of Mind" Form, which must be submitted by Sunday, 1st July. Next week, I'll explain how to use that facility to your best advantage.



he Road Safety Authority (RSA), Cyclist.ie the Irish Cycling Advocacy Network, Department of Transport Tourism and Sport, and An Garda Síochána are urging drivers to be aware of cyclists and to give them the space to ride safe when overtaking. Cyclists are also being reminded to follow the Rules of the Road. All road users need to be aware there will be an increase in the number of cyclists on the road over this period, drivers in particular are asked to treat them with

respect and to share the road safely - not only during the upcoming National Bike Week, but every day of the year.

three important pieces of advice for drivers.

• Give cyclists the space to ride safe when overtaking them. (1 metre in speed zones under 80km/h and

1.5 metres in zones over 80km/h). Cyclists can be thrown off course by sudden gusts of wind or when having to avoid uneven road surfaces.

• Check mirrors regularly. Remember a cyclist could be in your blind spot, look carefully before making your manoeuvre.

• If you or passengers are getting out of the vehicle make sure you check for passing cyclists before opening the door.

#### Dear Editor,

For many years in the late 1900's and early 2000's Kerry County Council undertook many Local Improvement Schemes whereby local residents private on roads made a percentage contribution to the Council for surface dressing of their road. This Scheme transformed the lives of many rural dwellers as it allowed them to have safe and decent roads leading to their homes.

Sadly the Scheme was abandoned for a number of years and many rural



dwellers were condemned to travelling potholed bóithríns of very poor quality. Happily common sense has returned and the Scheme has been reintroduced. Following a recent advertisement by Kerry County Council for applications for the new scheme, 675 new applications were received. As there were 126 applications existing from the previous scheme there are now over 800 applications awaiting assessment by Council. It is hoped that the assessment will be completed by early 2019. If there is to be

any realistic hope of this large number of roads being completed withing a reasonable length of time it is imperative that government would annually over the next 3 to 4 years make a worthwhile sum available for this important work.

There is much talk about rural regeneration and making life in the country more acceptable to people. The speedy implementation of the Local Improvement Scheme would be a great boost to many and an encouragement to continue to reside in their inherited place.

### LOOKING AFTER YOUR HEDGES

Hedges are an attractive and functional part of any garden. A common mistake is to leave the hedge grow too much before pruning or cutting it, especially if you want a formal hedge as this needs attention from the day you plant it.

You can prune new deciduous hedges when they are dormant in the Winter, while newly planted evergreen hedges need to be planted in the Springtime. Established hedges need to be pruned annually to keep them in shape but before you start pruning any evergreen hedge, always check to see if there are birds nesting.

Lastly, remember when you plant a hedge - its up to you how tall or wide you want it go grow - you can keep it to the shape you require by regular pruning and cutting.

# **RENT-A-MOURNER**:

In Taiwan, the practice is so deeply entrenched in popular culture, that there is actually a famous mourner, known for her prowess at expressing grief on command, she explained that she is able to cry at every funeral because she listens to the stories around the room and connects with the grief that is surrounding her and in that way she is also affected by the death, also mourning the one who has passed.

# HAVE YOU EVER HEARD OF A 'KNOCKER-UP'?

The modern worker rolls out of bed, groans, and turns off an alarm clock. But In the 19th century and well into the 20th, a human alarm clock known as a "knocker-up" would walk the streets and wake paying customers in time for work.

Whilst most 'knocker-uppers' were men and used long sticks to tap on windows Mary Anne Smith used her trusty pea shooter around London's East End in the 1930s. Every morning except Sunday she used rise at 3am to wake up local workers with the rapping, clacking sound of her peas against windows and doors. She charged sixpence a week and her nearest competition was an old man three miles away who did the same job using a fishing rod to tap on upstairs windows.

Later on, Mary Smith's daughter, also named Mary, took up the pea-blasting practice in her stead.



# Know Your Rights: CARER'S SUPPORT GRANT

### QUESTION

I am 17 years old and I have just finished school. I would like to get a part-time job over the summer. Are there restrictions on the number of hours I can work and will I get the minimum wage?

### **ANSWER**

The maximum working week for young people aged 16 and 17 is 40 hours, and you cannot work more than 8 hours a day. If you work for more than one employer, your combined daily or weekly hours of work cannot be more than this maximum. Usually, you are only permitted to work between 6am and 10pm, but in licenced premises (pubs and restaurants) you are legally allowed to work until 11pm at weekends and during school holidays.

The national minimum wage for an experienced adult is currently  $\in$ 9.55 per hour. People aged under 18 are only entitled to up to 70% of the experienced adult rate This is  $\in$ 6.69 per hour. Your employer is free to pay you more than the minimum wage if they wish, but they are not required to do so by law. You must get a payslip from your employer. A payslip is a statement in writing from the employer that shows your total pay before tax and details of deductions from your pay.

If you get tips from customers there is nothing in law to state you are automatically entitled to these tips. However, the law does not require you to hand these tips to your employer either. Instead, it depends on the custom and practice in your workplace.

These rules are set out in the Protection of Young Persons (Employment) Act 1996. Your employer must give you the official summary of the Act, along with other details of your terms of employment, within one month of your start date. All employers with employees under 18 must display the official summary of the Act somewhere visible where it can be easily read. Your employer must also see a copy of your birth certificate, or other evidence of your age, before employing you.

# EXAM STRESS SOME TIPS FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS



### FOR PARENTS

Exams are here and will be over before we know it. The best way to support your teen at this time is to make home life as calm and pleasant as you can. You may notice that although you are desperate to know how the exam went, it's wise not to launch into an inquisition – so give your teen some space.

Feeding them healthy snacks and good nutritious food will all be very welcome. Make sure they eat a good breakfast on the morning of the exam. Be sure to remind your child to take study breaks and get some fresh air to help clear the mind. After an hour or two of study, let them chill out but within reason. They need to switch off from exam student mode too. It's ok to be a couch potato at this time.

A good night's sleep is vital before an exam, so make sure your child isn't staying up late. Encourage an early night but don't let it turn into an argument. Insisting your eighteen year old goes to bed at 11pm doesn't really work, especially if he/she is not able to get to sleep and ends up tossing and turning until 4am. On the other hand it is not good either to turn a blind eye to 'gaming' until the early hours. Remind them that the brain needs at least 7 hours to absorb what they have learnt and to function well the next day. Lack of sleep can cause concentration and memory problems. Often, the study done after midnight is wasted.

### FOR STUDENTS

The Psychological Society of Ireland offers some last minutes tips and advice to students how long to study. They advise students to study "regularly and briefly - rather than "cramming" at the last minute. Try to study in blocks of time which do not exceed your concentration span. For example, break up a study session into periods of about 50 minutes each." They also offer valuable advice to gain control over the exam situation as follows: "Ignore what other people do in the exam. Do not look around you in the exam-hall when the papers are handed out and do not pay any attention to students who request extra paper from the exam supervisors. Remember that it is the quality rather than quantity of the answer that attracts good marks. In any case, many "hand raisers" write on only one side of a page or perhaps skip every second line of their answer book. So, be selfish in an exam - ignore everyone else."


