WRONG WAY AND HARD WAY ROUND CYCLES PLANNED FOR SEPTEMBER

On Saturday, September 27 cycling enthusiasts from all over Ireland will travel to Killarney for the inaugural Wrong Way Round Killarney Cycling Festival where they will take on the stunning Ring of Kerry but in the opposite direction to the traditional anti-clockwise route.

Cyclists will view the Ring like they have never seen it before as they head off from Killarney, before taking a right at Molls Gap and heading to Sneem. From there on the route is familiar, all be backwards, and takes in Waterville, Cahersiveen, Glenbeigh and Killorglin. Then it's the homeward stretch along the foothills of the MacGillycuddy's Reeks through Beaufort. Cross the finish line at the festival headquarters – The Gleneagle Hotel in Killarney, where a barbeque and live entertainment will be ready and waiting.

PRINCESS CHARLENE OF MONACO HAS KERRY CONNECTIONS!

Tourism Ireland has unveiled previously unknown Irish family connections of H.S.H. Princess Charlene of Monaco - including links to Killarney and Kerry. Research commissioned by Tourism Ireland and carried out by genealogy researchers Eneclann has revealed that Princess Charlene's ancestors can be traced back to the 1520s and a prominent Dublin family called the Fagans. This week Princess Charlene was presented with a Certificate of Irish Heritage by HE Rory Montgomery, Irish Ambassador to France, in the Prince's Palace in Monaco, with her husband, Prince Albert, also in attendance. The Certificate is an official recognition by the Irish Government of those who are proud of their Irish ancestry and heritage.

While the Irish connections of Prince Albert, and his mother Princess Grace, are well documented, this latest research shows that Princess Charlene descends on her paternal line from the Fagans of Feltrim, one of the most successful gentlemen-merchant families in Dublin in the 16th and 17th centuries. In the 1690s, the Fagan family moved to

Killarney, where they continued to prosper in international commerce, trading with the East Indies and colonial America; they had homes in both Kerry and Cork. Between 1695 and 1772, successive generations of the Fagan family married into old gentry and merchant families in Kerry and Cork, including the FitzMaurice, Trant and Gould families.

The last of the Princess's direct ancestors born in Ireland was her great (x 4) grandfather, Christopher Sullivan Fagan, who was baptised in St Mary's, Shandon, in Cork in 1781.



INVESTMENTS

Interest rates for deposits in banks and building societies are very low at the moment and have not been this low in a long time. Another problem for people looking for good interest rates is that as well as interest rates being low is that DIRT tax is 41% and since the 1st January this year a PRSI levy of 4% can also be applied. The effective tax rate on interest earned on savings can be as high as 45% as both the new higher rate of Deposit Interest Retention Tax (DIRT) tax and the PRSI levy on unearned income have both come into force since Jan 1. If you invested €20000 over 12 months at 2.50%, taking into account DIRT tax and the levy you may only get €275 after DIRT tax and the PRSI levy. Because these returns are so poor people are looking for alternative investments. Thankfully there are other investment options available to you. Investment providers have introduced many different types of products because of the very low returns on deposit type accounts and it is very important that people know about all these products before deciding on what

products suit them best. A mixture of different type of investments may be the best way to spread your investments rather than having all your eggs in one basket.

Horse & Pony racing to take place Ballybeggan Park for 2014 Rose of Tralee International Festival, Offering over 20000 euro in prize money over two great days of racing.

Horse and Pony Racing takes place Ballybeggan Park on Saturday and Sunday August 16th and 17th. A fun filled day is planned for all the family.

This year's revival of the sport in Tralee during August should prove to a great spectacle where runners will compete from all over Ireland and also from across the water."

The two day event will see top class racing under the rules of the Horse and Pony Racing Association with cast weights applying.







REMEMBER TO TAKE BREAKS: Studying is hard stuff. You need to take short breaks to allow your brain to process and retain the




information.

 Plan your budget for the week ahead - don't forget to include busses and transportation which can all add up to a considerable sum of money.


7. If you are not living closely and don't have a car, get a bike. They can usually be parked and locked up securely and are relatively inexpensive and useful if your lecture halls are not close by.



NEW SCHOOL YEAR - NEW HOMEWORK CHALLENGES



RETURNING TO THE ROUTINE OF HOMEWORK: The new school year is a return of routine back into the day for families. For lots of children, the homework habit was lost over the summer holidays. For the child who is just starting school, it will be having

a little bit of homework which will be something new for them. Likewise, for the teenager starting 1st year in secondary school, this will be a challenge for them also.

HAVE A HOMEWORK TIME SET OUT: It's good to have a plan for when to begin the homework. Have a routine planned so the child knows beforehand what time the homework has to be started and finished by. It can take a few weeks after they return to school for the children to get back into the routine of the homework. I would say to parents to relax in the beginning and not to get uptight around the child getting started on the homework. Some children love school so homework will not be a problem in the first place.

JOG THEIR MEMORY: Sometimes a child will say "I can't do it". The homework they get from the teacher will have been covered in class during the day. I used to ask my children to go back over what the teacher wrote on the board. This helped to jog their memory to get started. Parents need to have a lot of patience to help a child who may





be feeling overwhelmed by the homework. It may help by breaking down tasks and presenting each part of it separately

to your child. Sometimes they avoid starting into the homework

as they may feel they have too much to do.

is to encourage

The parents' responsibility is to encourage the child to stick with the homework and to get it finished as quickly as possible. Then they will have time to play. They don't need or want to spend the whole evening at the homework.

The encouraging words are: 'well done', 'you can do it', 'stick with it, you're getting through it'.

Words like 'you're fantastic', 'you're brilliant' are praise words. Overpraising children can have them feel discouraged.

BACK TO SCHOOL HEALTHY EATING

Once treat foods are not taken regularly and are not eaten in place of a healthy snack they are relatively fine. Many schools only allow sweets, crisps, cereal bars and biscuits on a Friday but even then the treats should only be "mini" in size. Some examples include mini muffins, smaller bars of chocolate and low or salt free crisps. When planning your child's back to school lunch box, it is advised that you plan out what you would like them to have and have the foods ready. It is important to remember the four food groups: 1. Protein foods, 2. Calcium foods, 3. Vitamins and Minerals, 4. Carbohydrate foods.

Protein foods are meats such as chicken, turkey, tuna, salmon and so on. They provide energy and repair the body after exercise or work. They primarily create and maintain bone development. Food with vitamins and minerals are very nutritious to your skin, teeth and digestive system.

They include boxes of raisins, fresh fruit, vegetables, dried fruit such as mangoes, dates and apricots. Carbohydrate foods provide energy and they include wraps, baps, rolls, bread, rice cakes, pitta bread and so on.

Some specific examples of healthy foods are the following:

 Protein foods: Turkey slices, fish, tuna and salmon (in a sweetcorn or salad dressing), hard-boiled egg or cold chicken portions.

Calcium rich foods: Babybel, cheddar cheese, low fat fruit yogurts, yop, cheeses and other yogurt drinks.

3. Food with many vitamins and minerals: Carrot sticks, mandarins, bananas, fruit, smoothies, seedless grapes and so on. Carrot sticks are highly recommended for vitamins and minerals and are a tasty, crunchy healthy treat.

4. Foods that have carbohydrate: Baps, pitta breads, bagels, brown bread, rolls



and wraps. Recommended treats in this category are cookies made from oatmeal, popcorn, chocolate rice cakes, fruit cakes and fruit muffins.

So is you want to make sure your children are well nourished and full of energy for school and play, the old saying "if you fail to plan, you plan to fail", really applies to organising your child's lunch and lunch box.

PLANTING BULBS

Bulbs are great for adding colour to borders and tulips, for example come in a wide range of colours and sizes.

The best time to plant bulbs such as daffodils, crocus and hyacinths is around the end of September.

Tulips can be planted in November and hardy summer flowering bulbs such as Crocosmia and lilies in September and October while tender Summer flowering bulbs such as Gladioli should be planted in early Spring.


A lot of the hardy bulbs such as tulips and daffodils prefer a warm sunny situation with good drainage as they come from areas with dry sunny climates.

Next week I will focus on planting bulbs in the garden and containers.



Mary is also a member of the Glen Theatre, Banteer, which is a local amateur theatre group.


Keeping fit is another passion of Mary's and she loves keeping fit, especially walking, and completed the last 120km of the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage during Easter.

Pecan & Maple Salad


Ingredients


- 1 Butternut squash
- 2 tbsp Pumpkin seeds 1/2 cup Pecans
- 1/3 cup Feta cheese
- Tbsp Olive oil
- Green Salad leaves
- 2 Fresh beetroot
- Tbsp Maple syrup
- Tbsp Balsamic vinegar
- Method
 - Cut the butternut squash into discs from top to bottom. Carefully remove the rind with a sharp knife, and where necessary remove the seeds.
 - Chop the squash into small cubes and put onto a roasting tray and roast in the oven at 180 degrees for 25 minutes or until some pieces start to brown.
 - Also peel and chop the beetroot and roast in the same oven for 15-20 minutes.
 - Place the pecans on a roasting tray, drizzle with 2/3 tbsp of maple syrup and toast in the oven for 10 minutes approximately (be careful not to burn them).
 - Dry fry the Pumpkin seeds in a frying pan for 3 minutes. Allow the butternut squash, beetroot, pecans and pumpkin seeds to cool.
 - Wash and dry salad leaves of your choice and place on a large flat plate or salad bowl.
 - Chop the feta cheese and place it on the leaves
 - Then sprinkle the beetroot, Pumpkin seeds, Butternut squash and pecans on top.
 - Dress the salad lightly with 1 tbsp olive oil, 1 tbsp balsamic vinegar and 1/3 tbsp of maple syrup.


TRALEE MAN IS 2014 KERRY FBD YOUNG FARMER OF THE YEAR

The Kerry FBD Young Farmer of the Year county finalist is Kieran Counihan from Tralee. He will go on to represent Kerry at the semi-final of the 16th annual FBD Young Farmer of the Year Competition, run by Macra na Feirme in partnership with the IFA. The 28 county finalists will each compete in the national semi-finals taking place on the 20th and 22nd August. Six overall finalists will then go through to the rigorous final interview on the 2nd September in the Westlodge Hotel, Bantry, Co. Cork.

Kieran Counihan (28) is a liquid dairy farmer milking 80 cows in Tralee. With all the talk of expansion in the dairy industry, Kieran plans on making his herd more efficient to increase production. With his land being fragmented he feels that with more work in grassland management he can produce more milk which in turn might lead to expansion.

The aim of this prestigious competition is to recognise and reward the top young farmers in the country. Entrants are judged according to a number of criteria including farm business

initiative and innovation, levels of farm efficiency and enterprise quality, farm safety and environmental protection awareness, as well as agricultural knowledge and community involvement. Prizes will be awarded to first, second and third place as well as to winners of the "Innovation" and "Community Involvement" Awards and to each county winner. The overall winner of the competition will receive a bursary to undertake international travel and study farm practices. A previous winner of this prestigious award includes Martin Brosnan (Kerry) in 2004.

RURAL IRELAND MUST HAVE ACCESS TO QUALITY, AFFORDABLE BROADBAND

Every home and business in the Ireland must have access to a costeffective, high-speed broadband service, IFA Deputy President, Tim O'Leary said in advance of the end of the National Broadband Scheme on August 25. "Broadband access is a key infrastructure requirement for the 21st century. Quality broadband services are of national strategic importance for both urban and rural dwellers. The Government must ensure that broadband access is improved, and guaranteed throughout the country. Investing in the infrastructure to allow the service to improve for rural Ireland will pay significant dividend in terms of job creation and investment opportunities," O'Leary said. "The National Broadband Scheme guaranteed access to broadband of a minimum standard in certain rural areas. The expiry of the scheme means users in these rural areas will no longer have any guarantee of minimum speeds or standards and

yet costs for the service could now increase. It would be completely unacceptable to increase the price of an inadequate or disimproved service." Tim O'Leary continued. A new National Broadband scheme was announced by the Minister for Communications earlier this year but details have not yet been finalised.

This Scheme must be rolled out early and widely, Mr O'Leary insisted: "Thousands of homes and businesses in Ireland have zero access to broadband and the service available to those that do is substantially below the standard available in urban areas. The new broadband scheme must close the digital divide and deliver highspeed broadband at affordable prices for all businesses, homes and schools in rural Ireland. It is vital that this scheme is rolled out at an early date"

MINISTER MUST DIRECT TEAGASC TO BE INVOLVED IN **GLAS PLANS**

IFA Rural Development Chairman Flor McCarthy has insisted that Teagasc must be involved in GLAS plans or the Minister for Agriculture Simon Coveney must instruct them to do so. Otherwise many farmers will have difficulty getting into the scheme when it opens later in the year.

Flor McCarthy said that it is vital that there is the support structure for farmers and Teagasc through its 250 advisers play a key role in supporting farmers throughout the country. "In the delivery of schemes for farmers, the public/private mix has worked effectively over the last 20 years as direct payments have become more important for farmers. It would be a travesty if Teagasc were to leave this just to the private sector as farmers have worked very closely with the organisation over many years".

The IFA Rural Development Chairman said the priority must be to ensure that the Minister for Agriculture introduces the GLAS scheme at the earliest possible opportunity. He must also ensure every farmer is given an opportunity to join the scheme which is so vital to support farm income. To achieve this, the Minister must direct Teagasc that they have to be centrally involved in GLAS Plans.

He pointed out that farmers, particularly in the peripheral regions, depend greatly on Teagasc and any diminution of their services will have a catastrophic effect as farmers in these areas are very dependent on direct payment supports.

The Rural Development Chairman also pointed out at a meeting with the Agricultural Consultants Association the importance of the provision of a top-quality service to farmers at a competitive pricing structure. If Teagasc were to remove themselves from GLAS, it would reflect a further dilution of their advisory support service to farmers.



DAIRYMASTER IN CAUSEWAY SEEN BY UP TO 74 MILLION... THANKS TO THE BBC

What was originally planned as a piece for the BBC's award-winning website turned into something much larger when the broadcaster visited the Causeway headquarters of Dairymaster. Now the segment is running on the BBC World News channel and is being broadcast to 350 million homes worldwide.


"When they got in contact we thought it would be great to have a small piece on their site," said Dr Edmond Harty, CEO, Dairymaster. "But when they saw what modern technology can do on farms they spent a whole day shooting and we found ourselves being broadcast within a week."

Shooting tookplace over 23rd and the 24th July, and because Dairymaster produces 95% of their products at the Causeway site, allowed the BBC to see everything that the company does. Their attention focused on the combination of agricultural innovations and in-house capability, in particular the latest Swiftflo Milking Parlour that milks cows naturally and the necklace for cows

that detects health and fertility the MooMonitor.

"We checked and it turns out the BBC World News doesn't just hit 350 million homes around the planet," said Harty. "It is shown in 1.7 million hotel rooms, on 81 cruise ships and 46 airlines. But my favourite stat is that you can watch it on 35 mobile phone platforms. There will be cows everywhere."

One of the key points about Dairymaster and their decision to base themselves in rural Kerry was highlighted by the report. It explained how Ned Harty's (Edmond Harty's father and founder of the company) vision has become reality. "With emigration again affecting many rural communities in Ireland in hard economic times, the realisation of Ned Harty's dream has meant jobs at home in Causeway and a cadre of locals with high-tech skills. Ireland's Silicon Valley for cows perhaps, created by an entrepreneurial spirit which provides local jobs while helping farmers as far away as Siberia and Japan."

LEAVING CERT – RESULTS TIME

If the results are not what you wanted them to be, then you may be feeling devastated, stunned, unable to see things logically and struggling to think of the many options available to you. Remember however that you have many options and it is important to remain positive and realise that it is not the end of all your plans and hopes. Some of your options include:

• View Your Script/Results Appeal

Speak to Your Guidance Counsellor

• Repeat Leaving Cert Year

• Some PLC courses will enable you to access third level.

Talk to others about your worries – Friends may also be going through the same problems and it will really help to talk about it. If you are feeling really down don't suffer in silence, talk to your parents, phone the Samaritans or talk to your doctor. Consider seeing a counsellor. There is a lot of support out there for you and you will get through this difficult time.

The National Parents Council Post Primary operates a helpline for anyone who needs support after the results. The service is provided by Guidance Counsellors who will give advice to both students and their parents. The helpline number is **1800 265 165** and will be available for advice on the first round CAO offers from Monday 18th August 8am – 7pm, Tuesday 19th August 8am-7pm and Wednesday 20th August 8am-1pm.

Remember, if you failed an exam it is not the end of the world. You are not a failure - you are still a good person, just a good person who failed an exam. It may mean that you have to repeat, so there's a delay of plans, your future is still waiting. NON - SPECIFIC LOWER BACK PAIN IN ADULTS

PART 2

Less common causes of low back pain

Arthritis (inflammation of the joints) of the spine sometimes causes back pain. Osteoarthritis is the common form of arthritis and usually occurs in older people. Ankylosing spondylitis is another form of arthritis that can occur in young adults and causes pain and stiffness in the lower back. Rheumatoid arthritis may affect the spine, but you are likely to have other joints affected too.

Various uncommon bone disorders, tumours, infections, and pressure from structures near to the spine occasionally cause low back pain.

What is the cause of non-specific low back pain?

Non-specific low back pain means that the pain is not due to any specific or underlying disease that can be found. It is thought that in some cases the cause may be a sprain (an over-stretch) of a ligament or muscle. In other cases the cause may be a minor problem with a disc between two vertebrae, or a minor problem in the structures and tissues of the lower back that result in pain.

Do I need any tests?

Usually not. Your doctor will usually be able to diagnose non-specific low back pain from the description of the pain, and by examining you. Current guidelines are clear that routine tests such as x-rays and scans should not be done unless there are symptoms and signs during a doctors examination to suggest that there may be a serious underlying cause for the back pain.

Treatments

Exercise and keep going

Continue with normal activity as much as possible. This may not be possible at first if the pain is very bad. However, move around as soon as you are able, and get back into normal activities as soon as you can. In the past, advice had been to rest until the pain eases. It is now known that this was wrong. The evidence from research trials is that you are likely to recover more quickly by getting back moving again, and getting back to work as soon as possible.

Medication

If you need painkillers, it is best to take them regularly. This is better than taking them now and again just when the pain is very bad.

Paracetamol is often sufficient if you take it regularly at full strength.

- Anti-inflammatory painkillers. Some people find these to work better than paracetamol. Some people may not be able to take anti-inflammatories – for example some with asthma, high blood pressure, kidney failure, or heart disease.


- A stronger painkiller such as codeine is an option if anti-inflammatories do not suit or do not work well.

- A muscle relaxant such as diazepam is occasionally used for a few days if the back muscles become very tense and make the pain worse.

MARGARET'S RAMBLINGS



LESSENING FOOD WASTE:

Why are we wasting so much food? A lot of it has to do with rot as a result of buying more than we need/can use. But, there are certain tricks you can employ to make sure even your most perishable food will stick around a bit longer.

*Keep salad from becoming soggy. If you keep your greens in a plastic bag, simply blow into the bag and seal it very tightly. The carbon dioxide will keep your greens fresh for longer. *Have trouble keeping asparagus fresh? Just cut and inch off of the bottom of the stalks and store asparagus upright in a medium mason jar with an inch or two of water. Gently place a loose plastic bag over the top, using a twist tie to keep it from fitting to the jar. It will stay fresh for 2 weeks.

*Get all of the juice out of a lemon with a pair of tongs. No need to waste any juice whatsoever! This also works for lemons, limes, and oranges. *Sick of your halved avocados turning brown? Store them with a cut onion! The sulphur compounds from the onion may play a role in preserving and preventing oxidation. It will keep fresh for 1-2 days, which is a huge feat for anyone who eats a lot of avocados.

*Tell the difference between a good egg and a bad egg without tasting it. The secret is that bad eggs will float in water, whereas really fresh eggs sink.

*Stop your onions from sprouting or moulding. Start storing them in a hole-punched paper bag to keep them fresh and firm for months. Just use a single-hole punch to punch 4 columns of holes in the top 3/4 of the bag. Then, place in your onions, shallots, or garlic, fold over and hold closed with a paper clip. Don't forget to label!

*Keep brown sugar from hardening. Apparently, the only thing that can save your sugar is... more sugar! Just toss a few marshmallows into the bag and close the bag tightly.

*Keep you potatoes from budding. Store them with an apple. Why does this work? The ethylene gas released by the apple stops the buds and preserves the potato.

*Save empty butter wrappers in the freezer. The small amount of butter that remains on them is perfect for greasing pans when baking.

*What to do with the end of a jam jar? Instead of fruitlessly trying to scrap out the last remnants of jam, make a fruity vinaigrette. Just add oil, vinegar, and shake!

Stop wasting your money on food you're going to throw out! Make the most of every food Euro by being smart about storing your food. Don't be afraid to get creative!

THE IMPORTANCE OF TOBACCO TO VIRGINIA:

The year was 1614, and the sailing ship Elizabeth was setting off from the young English colony of Jamestown, bound for London with a cargo that included four barrels of tobacco, about 4,000 pounds. Few probably knew that those four barrels would change the entire economy of Virginia in less than a decade.

The barrels were a test batch, grown by an enterprising settler named John Rolfe who wanted to see if Virginia could break the tobacco monopoly then enjoyed by Spanish plantations in the Caribbean and South America.

The reaction to that first modest shipment was huge. By 1617, tobacco exports from Virginia to England totalled 20,000 pounds. Colonists sent 50,000 pounds back home in 1620, and production exploded 30-fold to 1.5 million pounds by the end of that decade.

Rolfe, also remembered in the history books

for marrying Pocahantas, planted his first crop along the James River around 1612, at a time when the Virginia Colony was riding a long streak of failed commercial ventures including timber, silver, gold, iron, pitch, tar, potash, glass, silk and wine.

In tobacco, though, Virginia finally stuck the jackpot. Within a few years of Rolfe's first crop, shareholders in the Virginia Company were exchanging shares of stock for 100-acre land-grants to get in on the tobacco rush.

Since its founding, the Virginia Colony had excited the hopes of those who saw it as a potential land of plenty. Lord De La Warr, one of the first colonial governors, wrote in 1611 of Virginia's "wonderful fertile and very rich" land. A few years earlier, John Smith described in some detail how the Indians around Jamestown cleared the forest to plant corn and beans. In a later history he published of Virginia, Smith includes a 1619 account from Rolfe claiming than an "industrious man" in Virginia could tend four acres of corn - enough to feed five people - and 1,000 tobacco plants. "They say also English Wheat will yield but sixteen bushels an acre, and we have reaped thirty," Rolfe boasted. In Jamestown's earliest days, though, the colonists made little attempt to grow their own food, says Egloff. Instead they relied on re-supply from England and trade with the Indians. It was a tenuous arrangement, given the unreliability of the ocean crossing and the exchanges of violence, rather than goods, that the settlers and the Indians often engaged in. During the winter of 1609-10, almost twothirds of Jamestown's population died during "The Starving Time," when the colonists were reduced to eating mice, snakes, acorns, hides and, in at least one case, each other. Of the nearly 300 that began the winter in the colony, just 90 survived.

Afterwards, as the tobacco craze took hold, the colonial authorities began passing laws that required farmers to also grow some food. In 1614, the governor began allowing individual settlers to cultivate three acres of tobacco, but mandated an annual contribution of two and a half barrels of corn each year to the common storehouse in return.

In addition to corn, crops grown by the settlers in Jamestown included wheat, peas, barley, turnips, cabbage, pumpkins, carrots, parsnips and herbs. There were also cattle, goats, hogs and Poultry.

Tobacco, though, was where the money was, and just a few short years after the entire colony nearly starved itself out of existence, the settlers seemed eager to grow it above all else. In 1616, Rolfe returned from a hiatus in England to find Jamestown almost empty, with its "streets and all other spare places planted with tobacco" and "the Colony dispersed all about, planting tobacco."

In 1619, the colonial government again passed a law requiring every farmer to contribute an amount of corn, based on the size of his household, to the storehouse.

By the Revolutionary War Virginia was growing

55 million pounds of tobacco per year, making it the richest and most powerful of the American colonies; today, it is still one of the state's top 10 commodities.

DID YOU KNOW

Butter is one of the oldest foods, dating back to 6500 BC. Legend says that butter was first discovered when a nomad tied an animal skin of cream to his horse. After a long journey the cream had turned to butter, and hey presto: butter is invented. But who has time to tie cream to the side of a horse and gallop around the countryside? This is where the churn comes in.

There are many different types of butter churns. The most common, and one of most classic, is the plunge churn. This worked by plunging a paddle up and down in a container, mixing the cream. This method dates back to the 500s. Other more unique methods included the crank operation and even a rocking chair powered churn.

3 WEALTHY CEOS WHO SHARED THEIR WAGES WITH THEIR EMPLOYEES

Income equality is as out of control as ever. The average CEO earns 300 times more than their general employees, up from a 20:1 disparity just 50 years ago. It's clear that the heads of companies are becoming unfathomably wealthy while the employees who work to earn them these rewards struggle to make ends meet. Fortunately there are a rare few CEOs who seem to understand how lucky they are and share some of their pay/bonuses with their workers.

1. Raymond Burse - Upon accepting the job of president at Kentucky State University this year, Dr. Raymond Burse asked to forfeit \$90,000 of his salary so that that money could be reallocated to the university's lowest paid workers. By shifting this money over, college employees paid minimum wage will now receive \$10.25 per hour. Although Mr. Burse is only serving as an interim president, KSU has vowed to maintain the new minimum wage rate moving forward so that their workers can receive a living wage.

2. Yang Yuanqing - In 2012, Yang Yuanqing, the CEO of Lenovo, a gigantic computer company in China, gave up his \$3 million bonus so it could be distributed to Lenovo's lowest paid workers. Split amongst 10,000 employees, the manufacturing workers each got a bonus of the equivalent of 317 U.S. dollars which is more than the average employee's monthly salary. Mr Yuanqing explained that he did not feel it appropriate to attribute his company's recent success to his own efforts. "The strength of the company's business performance belongs to workers on the production line," he said.

3. Lord Wolfson - For the past two years, CEO

Lord Wolfson has passed along his annual bonus to his workers in full. As the head of Next, the UK's biggest department store chain, he received about 4 million pounds at the end of 2013. Divided between his 20,000 retail employees, the redistributed bonus equals approximately 1.5% of their annual salary.

CHILDREN DISPLAY E X T R A O R D I N A R Y CREATIVITY REGARDING THE THINGS THEY MANAGE TO GET STUCK IN:

Since 2001 London Firebrigade has helped 16 children in Bromley with their heads stuck in banisters, gates and railings and in the past year alone they have rescued 1,508 young people who were stuck on things or in things. Recent incidents have included a child with its head stuck in a potty, one with its arm stuck in a television speaker and one with its leg wedged in a statue in a Kensington car park.

A child in Brent got a toy train stuck on its finger, one got its foot stuck in a merry-go-round in a park in Dulwich and a 13-year-old had to be released from a baby swing in Havering.

WOMAN BONDS WITH CAT IN CEMETERY, FRIENDSHIP SAVES THEM BOTH:

A cemetery isn't a place someone might expect to be saved, especially by a black and white cat, but that's exactly what happened to Roza Katovitc.

Ms. Katovitc was homeless and says she was chronically depressed when she met an unlikely saviour, a black and white homeless cat she named Miss Tuxedo.

In 2000, Ms. Katovitc was a union electrician and living with her boyfriend of 22 years when he died suddenly of a heart aneurysm while the couple was watching a movie in their apartment in California, Ms. Katovitc's father died three days later and those tragedies led her into a spiral of depression and medical problems that eventually prevented her from returning to her profession.

Two years ago, she lost her apartment due to the building being sold and she resorted to staying in a series of motels. She spent most of her days gazing at the crosses in the cemetery where her boyfriend is buried, or sometimes tending flowers she's planted or talking to the many feral cats.

"I don't know why, but Miss Tuxedo started following me around," Ms. Katovitc says "She wouldn't let me touch her for the longest time. Slowly I'd get her tail. Then I got her head. One day she let me scratch her ears, and that was it. From that moment on, she wouldn't leave me alone.

"I'd be fixing a vase for Rich, and she'd be pushing her head under my hands," she explained. "It was like she was saying, 'No, no, love me.' Suddenly I had a purpose. I don't know why, but this cat loved me."

A friend the pair made at the cemetery paid for Miss Tuxedo to have a cancerous tumour removed from her face.

Ms. Katovitc applied for public housing and was given an apartment in December and best of all, the managers allowed Miss Tuxedo to move in as well. "I got permission to bring her," Ms. Katovitc said. "My doctor said my life depended on it. I guess it does."




