

ICONIC KILLARNEY HOTEL WILL BE KNOWN ONCE AGAIN AS GREAT SOUTHERN KILLARNEY

One of Ireland's oldest and best loved hotels will soon be known once again as the Great Southern Killarney. In a move that will no doubt please the residents of Killarney, The Malton hotel will have its name reinstated as the Great Southern Killarney on January 26th, 2018.

The Scally family, owners of the Royal Hotel in Killarney and Hayfield Manor in Cork, have owned the Malton since 2014. The landmark Killarney hotel is to be rebranded as the Great Southern Hotel from the start of 2018, a decade after the name change.

The four-star hotel has undergone an extensive two-year refurbishment programme aimed at restoring many of the building's spectacular traditional features.

According to Ettienne Van Vrede, CEO of the Hayfield Family Collection: "It is fitting and appropriate that we bring the wonderful Great Southern brand back to this beautiful property. Over the past two years we have carefully upgraded the hotel

to reflect its heritage, grandeur and position within the town. Ironically, and perhaps not surprisingly, many people still refer to the hotel as the Great Southern such was the strength of its legacy and heritage. We look forward to celebrating the next chapter of this great story".

The Grand Foyer has been restored to the original Victorian design, the public areas have been redecorated in classical style, an extensive bedroom refurbishment programme has been undertaken and the facilities around the Grand Ballroom have been upgraded. The hotel was sold by the State to a Galway businessman in 2006 and in 2007, the property was purchased by a consortium of local businessmen.

As another company had acquired the title of the Great Southern Hotel during the 2006 transaction, the hotel name had to be changed and the then owners chose to name it after a set of prints by 18th century Irish artist James Malton, which adorned the walls of the

hotel. Many locals continued to call it the Great Southern informally. Built in 1854 by the Great Southern and Western Railway Company and called The Railway Hotel- the first hotel to be owned by a railway company in either Ireland or Great Britain- from 1896 until 2009 the

property was known as the Great Southern Hotel Killarney. It was for many years one of the best-known hotels in the country famed for its prized location next to the town's railway station and is one of Ireland's oldest hotels.

PREPARE TO BE INSPIRED AT THE VISUAL ARTISTS' SHOWCASE

The Government Buildings on New Road in Killarney is the venue for the Kerry Visual Artists' Showcase which opens at 5pm on Culture Night on Friday 22nd September.

A key date in the arts calendar in the County, the selected artists are all of Kerry and are building careers for themselves as artists working in Ireland today.

"It's a wonderful platform for our artists and the standard this year is again very high. Kerry County Council is delighted to be able to directly support the Showcase", says Kate Kennelly, the County Arts Officer. She is calling on all of us to support our artists by visiting the show and perhaps buying a piece if we are so inclined. "Audiences will see some of the best who are creating art in the county today. It's a wonderful introduction for all ages to art and a great evening out as it is Culture Night in Kerry the same day that we open the show." Kate confirmed.

There have been eight artists selected for the Showcase this year. Tralee man Des Fitzgerald is a sculptor and photographer whose work is inspired from his strong visual sense and is often theme based, while Portmagee's Karen Hendy uses unconventional media in her work such as plastic wrap, turf and sticks which are then layered with paper, gesso and paint oftentimes referencing the environment. Emerging artist Kaye Maahs works in oils and is a painter whose work is rooted in the personal and the local. Tralee's Roisín McGuigan has expanded from

the tradition of paint on canvas to the use of non-traditional surfaces and includes drawing, digital media and found objects. Her central focus is place and geographic connection. David Morrison makes the familiar appear unfamiliar in his work and uses photography, digital media, canvas and paint to create his works of art. Castleisland based Philip O'Rourke is interested in photojournalism and street photography. He captures fleeting moments and likes to include a human element in the stories he tells through his photography. Niamh Porter uses photography and painting in her work which examines the legacy of Modernist architectural design and the materials that construct Europe's multi-faceted identity. Tracy Sexton is predominantly a painter who works through mixed media compositions and enjoys creating installation work. She is interested in the interplay between dream and reality.

This is the third annual Kerry Visual Artists' Showcase. The exhibition will be opened by Killarney Municipal District Mayor, Cllr. Niall Kelleher, and runs from the 22nd September until the 16th October this year.



Results were issued on Wednesday to 60,248 candidates nationwide, including 1,867 (930 female/937 male) candidates from Kerry, who signed up for the Junior Cert exam. Today they are deservedly celebrating a significant success in their first public exam. The Junior Cert exam is often overshadowed by the more public Leaving Cert exam but it's a very important exam in its own right. Junior Cycle enables students to complete a broad and balanced curriculum and to acquire the knowledge and skills necessary for progression to Senior Cycle. After three years in Junior Cycle, students get their first exposure to a public exam of the State Examinations Commission (SEC). Candidates are awarded a Level 3 qualification on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ). This certificate is a valuable document as it confirms that the candidate has successfully completed Junior Cycle education

at the subject levels and grades shown on the certificate.

Six new grade descriptors - Distinction, Higher Merit, Merit, Achieved, Partially Achieved, and Not Graded - are being used for English this year in the reformed Junior Cycle programme. This format of grading will be phased in until 2021. In the new Junior Certificate exam, candidates will continue to be awarded grades of A, B, C, D, E, F and NG based on marks achieved. In the new Junior Cycle, achievement will be indicated by the new grade descriptors. Both the old and the new grading systems will appear side-by-side on the results issued by the SEC and on the new Junior Certificate Profile of Achievement (JCPA) which will be generated by schools and issued for the first time this year. The broad curricular base of the Junior Cycle gives students insights into their aptitudes. abilities, interests and personality. The exam also measures a candidates standard at the end of the Junior Cycle. As well as the academic content, subjects like Physical Education, Career Guidance, Social and Health Education (SHE), Civic, Social and Political Education (CSPE) along with a comprehensive programme of extra-curricular activities develop selfawareness in each student. In short, a personal career profile begins to emerge during the three years of Junior Cycle.

With very few students now leaving school after this exam, the Junior Cert is a passport to Senior Cycle education, which lasts for two or three years, depending on whether the optional Transition Year (TY) is taken. Senior Cycle caters for students in the 15 to 18 year age group. It includes an optional Transition Year, which follows immediately after the Junior Cycle. TY provides an opportunity for students to experience a wide range of educational inputs, including work experience, over the course of a year that is free from formal exams.

able to do anymore fishing because seals are not just eating all the salmon but they are also tearing the fishermen's nets and causing wholesale destruction.


The population is gone out of control and I have again called on the Minister that a cull will have to be organised to reduce the ever increasing numbers. The Minister replied that

although they are protected under the wildlife act, there are provisions for a license to be issued to prevent individual seals damaging fishing nets. Minister Humphrey's has assured me that officials from her Department have recently had discussions with fishermen about issuing licenses in effected areas to try and deal with this problem.

YEAR END ACCOUNTS - WHAT YOU SHOULD CONSIDER WHILE REVIEWING THE FIGURES

For compliance reasons all businesses produce year-end accounts. It is important that business owners interpret the information contained in the accounts to the best effect. FOCUS ON AUTUMN GARDENING

There is a lot of work to do in the garden this time of the year, so you can reap the rewards later on during the spring and the summer.

You can start by giving your herbaceous plants a tidy up. Some of them are obviously in full flower and looking good but there are also a lot that have finished flowering for a while, so it is best with these to remove all the dead stems.

After this is done the flower bed might look a little bare, so now is a good time to start planting spring flowering plants such as wall flowers, primroses and polyanthis and also of course spring flowering bulbs.

A lot of containers, baskets and window boxes are looking a bit tired at this time of the year. Some plants look ok but others not so much. The best thing to do would be to remove the dead ones as it is only taking from the good ones. If you want you can always add a trailing ivy or a cyclamen as this will keep them looking good for another while and you can include them in your winter display.

Know Your Rights: LOST OR STOLEN PASSPORT

QUESTION

What happens if my Irish passport is lost or stolen while I am travelling abroad?

ANSWER

If you lose your Irish passport abroad, you should immediately report the loss to the local police and to the nearest Irish Embassy or Consulate. You will be asked to confirm the loss in writing or, if you are applying for a replacement, to include the details of the loss in your passport application.

You must also ask the local police for a written statement that you have reported the loss of your passport. A member of the police authority in the country in which the passport went missing must witness this statement.

You will need this police report to get a replacement passport or Emergency Travel Document from an Irish embassy or consulate.

If there is no Irish embassy or consulate in the country where you are, contact the embassy of any EU member state and they will get in touch with the nearest Irish embassy on your behalf. An embassy of another EU member state cannot issue you with a new Irish passport, but can, in some cases, issue an EU Emergency Travel Document for a single journey back to your country of permanent residence in the EU.

It may be useful to carry a photocopy of the personal data page of your passport with you when travelling, or to scan an image of that page and email it to yourself.

Any passport reported as lost or stolen is no longer a valid travel document. You should not try to travel on a passport that has been reported as lost or stolen.



Padraig McGrogan suffered Ulster final heartbreak against Donegal in 2016. But the bitter memories of that setback fuelled the Newbridge player with a huge motivation to come back this year and go one better. McGrogan is comfortable in defence or midfield but he's forged an impressive central partnership with Oisin McWilliams throughout the 2017 championship campaign. McGrogan was man of the match in Ulster final victory over Cavan, and he's also been prominent in the victories over Sligo and Dublin in the All-Ireland series.

LORCAN MCWILLIAMS

McWilliams was superb at full-forward against Dublin in the All-Ireland semi-final, as his man of the match display registered six points, including five frees. And yet McWilliams started the 2017 campaign on the bench, coming on against Tyrone in an absorbing Ulster guarter-final to score three points.He scored two points against Antrim and six points in the Ulster final victory over Cavan, before missing the All-Ireland guarter-final victory over Sligo. But McWilliams, a twin brother of ace midfielder Oisin, was back for the All-Ireland semifinal clash with Dublin. And his five points (four frees) were crucial as the Oak Leafers claimed a three-point win.

OISIN MCWILLIAMS

We've referenced his midfield sidekick Padraig McGrogan but Oisin McWilliams has also been superb for Derry in the county's march to a first All-Ireland minor decider in ten years. McWilliams was excellent when Derry upset Tyrone in Ulster, and he also notched two goals against Antrim. He kicked a vital free in the Ulster final victory over Cavan and landed four points (three frees) as Derry edged past Sligo in the All-Ireland guarter-finals. McWilliams was also on the scoresheet with a point as Derry came through the Dublin challenge at the semifinal stage. And the pre-match underdogs will need him at full throttle around the middle of the field if Kerry are to be denied the four-in-a-row.





If you are feeling despair and having thoughts about taking your life - it's really important to know that these are just thoughts. No matter how overwhelming they may seem, you don't have to act on them. You may feel like there is no way out of the pain you are feeling. You may feel you can never escape the stresses in your inner and outer world. What I really want to say to you is this; even though you have these thoughts now, however impossible it might sound, there is light at the end of the tunnel. No matter how big or small your problem may be, even if it's just a tiny glimmer, never give up hope. Don't keep these feelings hidden, there is no shame. Know that you are not alone. Many people experience feelings of hopelessness and despair. Jenny is one such person.

Jenny's Story "There were times when I felt no way out of this prison of my mind. I just wanted the pain to end. I wanted to disappear. I tried to kill myself but looking back now I'm so grateful I got the right support I needed. In counseling I was able to talk about whatever was on my mind. I had always felt not good enough and somehow thought what had happened to me was my fault, even though I was just a child. I thought it would be best for everyone if I died. I know now I couldn't have been more wrong. After counselling, the 'demons' in my head have quietened and I've moved to a better place within myself. Yeah, sure I have down days but nothing like before. I've started a new course and for the first time ever I'm looking forward to the future."Jenny (not her real name)

THIS COUPLE DEDICATED THEIR LIVES TO CARING FOR ABANDONED CHILDREN

China's One-Child policy, which limited urban families to one child and rural families to two children, started in 1979 and began to lose favour in 2015. Because of the desire of Chinese couples to have male children, millions of baby girls were aborted in sex-selective abortions and many more gave up their girls to orphanages, allowing families outside of China the chance to have a daughter.

However, some of the girls born in China under the One-Child policy were abandoned in the streets.

Yu ShangZhong and his wife from Wenzhou, Zhejiang adopted their first daughter 35 years ago when he was aged 40. About four years later, he found a baby girl dumped in a paper box in his village and they decided to call her their own. Their third child was also a girl he found abandoned at a nearby pavilion, over the years, Yu and his wife started taking in more and more unwanted children until the girls numbered 12 in all.

But life was hard for the family as Yu, the sole breadwinner, earned little money holding only temporary jobs before he finally found more stable work in a mortuary.

"We had tough days. When I was a little girl, my mother carried me on her back, collecting scraps or even begging," said Yu Caisong, the eldest girl now aged 35. "People gave us money and some old clothes."

When one of the 12 girls died from disease, Yu and his wife were grief-stricken, they felt laden with guilt and decided to give up their remaining children for others to adopt so they could have a chance at leading better lives, the elderly man said, adding that he and his late wife eventually kept five of the girls with them. The four youngest girls managed to make it to college despite their poverty. The two youngest which he had found as babies in paper boxes containing their birth information as babies in a span of three days will enrol in a university in Wenzhou this autumn and although the college tuition fees will be partly subsidised by the Wenzhou authorities, it will be still be a challenge for the family to provide for their daily expenses on campus.



ADDITIONAL USES FOR LIP BALM

22 year old Braeden Jones has cerebral palsy and is non-verbal and has travelled all around Australia and to the USA three times.

He and his family are on a mission to prove that

people with disabilities can be globetrotters, despite the challenges of travelling with a wheelchair or other extra needs.

It all started in 2011, when the family won a trip to the USA. "I used to work as a travel consultant, so I really knew how to research all the details for the trip — where the entrances were, which were accessible, what the concessions were, all the nitty gritty information," Braeden's mother Julie Jones said. "I really wanted to take the kids to Disneyland and I wasn't sure how well that would go and whether it would work for us. When it did it was just the most liberating feeling in the world and we just came back filled with so much joy" she said.

Ms Jones decided to share all the information she had found for their trip on the internet, so other people with disabilities, and their carers or parents, could use it as a resource.

Since then the website, Have Wheelchair Will Travel, has grown into an online community where people are encouraged to ask any travel or accessibility-related questions, and to offer their own information and experiences in return.

"People ask really specific questions on the website," Ms Jones said. "They're very interested in hotel accommodation and knowing what facilities are in the hotel, what's nearby, what's in the room, whether the bathroom will suit them, whether they can fit a hoist under a bed etc and we get really lovely comments from our readers".

STUDENT DROVE INTO HURRICANE PATH TO RESCUE ANIMALS AT RISK

Conor a 22-year-old college student was preparing to head back to school when his mother, who volunteers with Lucky Lab Rescue and Adoption, saw a social media post from a foster home in Corpus Christi. The post said that two dogs, named Thelma and Hercules, desperately needed to be evacuated from the area. Connor then decided that he was the man for the job.

"I said why not? And jumped in my truck, I didn't really think — I just figured someone needed to help them."

Connor made the 4-hour drive south from Austin, Texas to where the dogs were in Corpus Christi. Not only that, but he was also driving towards the hurricane that everyone was running away from.

The student, who requested that his last name is withheld, had never conducted an automotive animal rescue before – but after a long day of driving, Connor was able to transport both

When a cat ran across the outfield of Busch Stadium while the St. Louis Cardinals and the Kansas City Royals were playing a Baseball game, it took the internet by storm. The cat was quickly picked up by one of the grounds crew, but that became a show in itself as the cat bit him as he "escorted" it from the field.



The internet did the rest, naming the cat "Rally Cat" due to the way the game turned after it ran across the field.

The feral cat was brought to a local shelter after being ejected from the game. Now, there are more than a few forever homes being offered for the Rally Cat including the St. Louis Cardinals organisation which said "the cat will be cared for by our team, making the Cardinals Clubhouse his home". Baseball is a game fraught with superstition, and it's not every day that you're handed such a valuable good luck charm. The Feral Cat Outreach is still working with the Cardinals, but it isn't as cut-and-dry as the team may like. The shelter wants what's best for Rally, and that may not include going to the Cardinal's organisation.

The publicity is of course very good for the shelter; let us also hope it will be equally good for the non-famous cats and that the people who will not be able to adopt Rally Cat will offer homes to the other cats in the shelter instead. Surely the whole point of adopting a pet is to offer it love and comfort, every single pet that has been abandoned or is in a shelter because their owner is no longer in a position to take care of it are equally entitled to that love as the "famous" and there are thousands of pets in the Country to choose from. To my mind at least, those that only look for the "famous" are not offering good homes, they only wish to be status symbols themselves.

THE RULES THAT PIRATES USED TO LIVE BY

Back as early as the 16th century, pirates roamed the high seas, robbing and plundering with zestful abandon. For a pirate, every single day was an adventure and every day could be their last.

* Any time a group of pirates returned from a successful plunder, all of the loot was collected and counted. Once a total was recorded it would be divided and distributed to the men. The size of their portion was directly determined by the rank they held on the vessel.

* Every man regardless of their rank on the ship got a vote of "affairs of the moment" and that included the appointment of the ship's officers, when it came to punishment though the Captain's word was law. Any and all food, water and alcohol was divided up equally between the men.

* Once a ship had been successfully plundered, the men were allowed to take any and all personal items they liked from the ship. However, anything like gold or jewellery had to go into the common pot. Theft was punishable by death or marooning. * Fighting among pirates was strictly forbidden while on the ship. Violators got 40 lashes courtesy of the captain. Most disputes between pirates were settled once they got to shore where swords and guns were fair play.

* The loss of a limb while on pirate duty was compensated with 800 pieces of "eight." At the time, a piece of eight was worth 1/8th of a dollar – about \$100 for losing a leg or an arm. Accounting for inflation, which would be about \$3,000 today.

* Gambling was not allowed on the ship itself. All games of cards and dice were reserved for the times when they got off the boat and had a chance to spend the money they had worked so hard to earn.

COUPLE GOT MARRIED ON MT. EVEREST BASE CAMP

James Sisson and Ashley Schmieder have become the first couple to ever get married at the base camp of Mount Everest in a tuxedo and wedding dress – and though they say that it was a long and arduous journey, they said the photos are proof that the event was worth it.

The couple had planned on doing something dangerous and daring for their wedding, but they had not thought about the world's highest mountain until it was suggested by Charleton Churchill: a self-proclaimed adventure wedding photographer.

Mr. Schmieder contacted the photographer one year in advance and started hashing out plans for the trip. The duo hired a crew that would escort them up the mountain, and to prepare, they went to the gym obsessively to get in shape for the hike.

Then, in March, the troupe flew from Seattle to Dubai, then to Kathmandu in Nepal. With their lightweight wedding outfits and gear strapped to their backs, they began the weeklong hike up the mountain but there were some serious challenges along the way. Mr. Churchill got food poisoning, which prevented him from sleeping well and the groom came down with the "Khumbu cough" halfway through the journey.

After eight days of difficult hiking, they finally donned their wedding outfits and said 'I do' and though they both were wearing wool long johns under their fancy getups, they still had to endure minus 20° C weather at 17,600 feet. According to their Sherpa guides, the mountain also dumped more snow on them during their journey alone than the rest of the winter combined.




