€10 MILLION SPORTS AND ADVENTURE CENTRE FOR KILLARNEY

Its all systems go for the National Sports and Adventure Centre, a facility which will provide a state of the art sports centre for people with physical or intellectual disabilities at Dereen, Killarney.

An Bord Pleanala upheld Kerry County Council's decision to grant full permission for the 10 million euro National Sports and Adventure Centre (NSAC) which will incorporate a large social hub with Kitchen and hospitality facilities, a six-lane bowling alley, state of art adapted changing rooms and shower area leading to a mini adapted spa facility and two fully adapted assisted changing rooms. The ground floor will also incorporate a dance studio, gymnasium, physiotherapy studio and a first aid room.

Project managers, Impact360, described the decision as a watershed moment for one of the most ambitious and ground-breaking Irish projects in decades.

The planned centre will be constructed on a 4.7 acre site located at Dirreen, Killarney, and will be the first fully-accessible sports and adventure centre in Ireland, designed to top European and international accessibility standards.

The campus includes the first ever Europeandesigned adapted adventure course which allows people with all abilities, including disabilities, experience this leisure and recreation thrill and team-building experience. Every single person in society will be given the opportunity to enjoy any part of the centre, including people with disabilities, which is the real meaning of equal opportunity.

Another main feature is a full seven-a-side astro pitch built within a dome - similar to premiership football team's indoor training facilities in the UK and Europe. The building will also have a full-size international sports arena with adapted seating and large space off court.

The second floor comprises a rehabilitation and health suite, including a counselling suite, speech and language therapy room, occupational therapy treatment room, sensory suite, sensory garden and consultant rooms.

There are several offices on the second floor alongside a board room and a VIP box area overlooking the sports arena.

A sensory walk will be included in the project from the main building to the green area adjacent to the river, taking in a wide range of experiences through senses, relaxation and fun.

The building's main entrance for visitors is to be built from glass and is designed in the shape of the Olympic torch. This represents the bravery of every athlete and person that enters the complex and its flame itself represents purity, the pursuit of perfection and also represents peace, friendship, enlightenment and hope.

Up to half of the car park spaces are designed in size for adapted cars, mini buses and coaches.

The complex will be landscaped, taking into account the beautiful setting of Killarney and its natural beauty.

Impact360 CEO, Paudie Healy, said:

"The core and heart of every part of the project is to facilitate and promote equal opportunity, social integration and enhance the quality of life for people of all abilities. This centre will facilitate national and international competitions for elite sports athletes and teams along with leisure sport athletes, the general public and visitors in recreation and adventure. The NSAC will also be very focused on

supporting people through the rehabilitation suite, health supports and education programs also within the facility".

"From a corporate perspective along with all the other offerings in the project, a Theatre for performances along with hosting seminars and conferences will be also facilitated in a fullyaccessible international centre of excellence for all users, regardless of age, size or ability."

"Impact360 will now finalise governance and policies for the project and create a national and international funding strategy which will be launched later this year" Mr Healy said.

"Technology of this type was only available to top level cyclists only a few short years ago, but now is available in a number of locations including Tralee, Killarney, Dingle and Fenit, we offer group cycling sessions, individual & group fitness testing and rehabilitation programmes" says business owner /head coach Liam Mc Donough "while developed for cycling the Wattbike has been adopted by a number of sports from Rugby to Sailing and can help any sports person.

Tommy Walsh talks about his experience of using the Wattbike as a training tool "We used the Wattbikes at the Sydney Swans, at first the lads were unsure of how cycling was going to help them play football but after a few sessions

we could see our fitness improving FAST".

The Wattbike measures the progression of the cyclist's foot 100 times during one single pedal revolution and it uses the data to calculate 40 different readings including power, pedal efficiency and Heart rate zones to get the very best out of every session.

Despite the width of the spectrum, Kennelly is looking to best target specific areas with the financial resources available to her and in time she hopes that, they too might increase at which time they can further help any budding or existing artists in Kerry.

APPLICATIONS FOR BACK TO WORK DIVIDEND NOW BEING ACCEPTED

Senator Marie Moloney is pleased to confirm that the Back to Work Dividend applications are now being accepted, to help jobseekers with families to return to work and benefit from the economic recovery.

Intreo Offices have this week begun accepting applications for this new scheme from people who are taking up employment which was announced in Budget 2015. It aims to help families to move from Social Welfare into employment, and those in receipt of jobseekers allowance or one parent family payment will receive an additional increase of €29.80 per week for each child, subject to a maximum of 4 children for the first year in employment. Half the payment, €14.90, will continue for the second year provided the family remain outside the welfare system, excluding Child Benefit payments or FIS. The Back to Work Family Dividend can be paid in addition to the Family Income Supplement (FIS) and is not part of a means test for FIS.

While applications are being accepted from this week, payments won't be made until after April 2015 when the legislation is enacted, but all payments will be backdated fully to the date of application.

Senator Moloney said "This new scheme provides incentives to get people back to work and proves that work always pays. Everybody will benefit from the improving jobs situation and from the growing economy. This type of

ACCESS TO THE US MARKET FOR IRISH BEEF IS A BOOST TO **KERRY FARMERS - GRIFFIN**

"The Minister for Agriculture, Simon Coveney has been working on this development for over two years and I would like to commend him on his dedication and persistence.

OUTLOOK ON THE It's January, so it's time to focus on your 2015 CAO application (By Billy Ryle)

Before you tackle the CAO application, study the CAO Handbook 2015, which explains the procedure to be followed when applying for a third level college place. The institutions in the CAO system are listed in alphabetical order by location. All the courses available in a college are listed directly under the college title, with 'Level 8' courses being listed separately from 'Level 7 & Level 6' courses. Using a single application, select your personal preferences from the entire range of courses mentioned in the Handbook. Each course is assigned a code, which you enter on the application. You may apply for up to ten courses in each of the two categories – listed in order of your preference in each case.

The CAO Handbook 2015 does not contain information about general academic requirements, specific course entry requirements nor content of courses. Don't apply for any course without first consulting the information literature or the web site of the institution offering that course. Carefully study the content and the ultimate designation of each course for which you intent to apply. Poor quality research may result in you ending up in a course to which you are unsuited. In that event, you may lose interest in the course or in a worst case scenario you may drop out of college without a third level qualification.

- Before you tackle the CAO application, study the CAO Handbook 2015

- You may apply for up to ten courses in each of the two categories listed in order of your preference in each case
- Don't apply for any course without first consulting the information literature and/or the college web sites
- Poor quality research may result in you ending up in a course to which you are unsuited

SEM BOYS EXHIBIT AT BT YOUNG SCIENTIST EXPO

A young Killarney student with a passion for cycling took part in the BT Young Scientist Exhibition in Dublin last week. Eoghan Patwell, a first year student at St. Brendan's College, Killaney aspired to improve on traditional bicycle models by adopting a novel approach to existing bicycle designs. He came up with

the idea of designing a double chain model. This involves fitting an additional chain to existing models with the supplementary chain running parallel to the original chain.

Eoghan carried out numerous tests on his new design. He tested the bike numerous times on a variety of terrains and over a large range of distances. He collected some very surprising results. Eoghan's project was well received at the exhibition and was the subject of immense interest from the visiting public; particularly those with an interest in cycling. Eoghan plans to continue work on his innovative bicycle design. He is now looking at options to further sophistication of his model by comparing suitable materials and testing their resistance to wear and tear. He plans to enter his new and improved model into St. Brendan's in-house science competition which will be held in March and subsequently into the annual Scifest science competition at I.T. Tralee.

Two other students at St. Brendan's, Luke Murphy and Cian Buckley O'Sullivan, also exhibited their project at the BT Young Scientist Exhibition. They designed a water purifier which can be run with power generated by solar panels. Their project was one of the few projects visited by Mary Robinson at the exhibition. She questioned Luke and Cian on

the feasibility and practicalities of using the product in developing countries.

The boys will continue to work on their project over the next few months to improve on the durability and stability of the design. They also plan to enter the project into the Scifest science competition at I.T. Tralee.

TOP TIPS ON HOW TO AVOID A SLIP AND FALL IN ICE AND SNOW

While walking on footpaths and in public places, or entering and exiting your car or truck, DO NOT underestimate the dangers of snow and ice, advised the Road Safety Authority this week.

Each winter slips and falls on ice or snow cause serious injuries. Even when surfaces do not look especially icy or slippery, it is very possible that a thin sheet of transparent ice or "Black Ice" is covering your pathway putting you at risk. When you approach a footpath or roadway that appears to be covered with ice or snow, always use extreme caution.

Emergency Departments see a big increase in injuries due to falls as a result of snow and icy conditions. The most typical injuries seen are fractures and dislocations of the wrist, shoulder and ankle.

Advising pedestrians Ms. Moyagh Murdock, CEO, Road Safety Authority said, "Many slips and falls happen in places people regard as safe and secure, typically outside their front door, on the door step, on the path or while getting out of the car."

"My advice is to wear appropriate footwear, don't walk with your hands in your pockets, walk with your hands out and wear gloves so you can break your fall if you do slip. You would be surprised at the number of people who pick up with injures after falling while out jogging. Not a good idea in these conditions. Probably best to postpone until they improve.

Ms Murdock concluded by appealing to people to help their older relatives and neighbours. "Give them a call and offer to run any errands or feed animals so they don't expose themselves to the risk of falling on slippy yards and paths."

The RSA has issued the following "Top 10 Safety Tips for Pedestrians" to help avoid the possibility of a broken bone that could easily lead to an operation and a long recovery:

 If a journey cannot be avoided walk on a footpath, not in the street. If there are no footpaths walk on the right hand side of the road (towards oncoming traffic).
 Be extremely careful as frost, ice and snow will

make walking on footpaths very dangerous.

• Remember that footpaths may not be treated so walk with extreme care, make sure you are wearing appropriate footwear and in extreme conditions consider an appropriate walking stick or walking pole.

• Avoid walking in the streets at all costs if possible. Remember, cars and trucks slip and slide, too! If it's an emergency, and you can't avoid the street, wear bright or reflective clothing.

• Visibility is reduced in snowy condition so wear high visibility clothing or carry a torch

• Wear clothing that does not restrict your vision. Stay warm, but DO NOT impair your vision with hoodies, ski masks, scarves, hats, etc. This type of clothing could prevent you from spotting icy conditions that may lead to a fall or not enable you to see a car that is spinning out of control.

• Snow and ice cause havoc quickly, so use extra caution when crossing roadways, and always cross at pedestrian crossings.

• Ice can easily hide under a light dusting of snow. Just because you don't see the ice doesn't mean it's not there waiting for your unsuspecting footfalls.

• If you can't avoid the ice and snow, bend your knees slightly and take slower, shorter steps to

help reduce the chance of a slip and fall and an injury.

• If forced to use the steps at someone's home, apartment, or other public building, walk slow and take shorter steps when descending. The same is true of driveways and other hilly terrain; these areas can be very dangerous when they become slippery with ice or snow. Steps especially can be hard to clear and build up ice easily.

• Be aware of overhead hazards! Falling icicles and chunks of snow pose a serious risk. In extreme cold weather icicles can build up in size very quickly and are lethal. Be aware of what's happening above you, and stay clear from the edges of buildings.

The RSA has prepared a helpful guide 'Severe Weather Advice for Road Users' which you can download from the RSA's website. It has lots more useful advice on dealing with the difficult road conditions.

BULLYING

Bullying is defined as the tendency of individuals or groups to use persistent aggressive or unreasonable behavior against an individual. It can take different forms including physical, verbal, cyber, social and mental bullying.

There is a common misbelief that the victim of bullying somehow brings bullying on themselves. Some victims wrongly believe that if they were stronger or different in some way then they wouldn't be bullied. But I cannot stress strongly enough that anyone can be a target of bullying and the responsibility for bullying always lies with the bully. There are many reasons why people are targeted by bullies and these can vary from personality characteristics to personal vulnerabilities. People can be targeted by bullies because of physical features, an illness or disability, sexual orientation religious or cultural beliefs or belonging to a particular racial group. Bullies often bully as a means to exert power over others and to make themselves feel better. They are most likely doing it as a way to deal with their own problems, insecurities and low self-esteem. And not because of anything you've done. No one deserves to be bullied and it should not go unchallenged. Dealing with bullying can be tough yet it is really important to do something about it.

If you are being bullied – verbally, physically, socially, psychologically or online – telling someone about it and seeking advice can help. There is nothing weak about reporting a bully or getting advice and just confiding in someone can help to lighten your load. If you don't feel you can talk about it out loud or face to face, then write it down in a letter or an email. Many bullies want attention so ignoring them or walking away is your best bet. Be assertive and confident; adopt a 'Don't mess with me attitude' (even if you are trembling inside). It is important to not take anything bullies say to heart. Show them that their words have no effect on you. Some bullies may be jealous of you because of your success or popularity – so be proud of who you are.

FLU VACCINATION INFORMATION

WHAT IS INFLUENZA (FLU)?

Influenza is a highly infectious acute respiratory illness caused by the influenza virus. Influenza affects people of all ages. Outbreaks of influenza occur almost every year, usually in winter. This is why it is also known as seasonal flu.

HOW SERIOUS IS FLU?

Flu is often self limiting with most people recovering in 2-7 days. However, flu can be severe and can cause serious illness and death, especially in the very young and in the elderly. Serious respiratory complications can develop, including pneumonia and bronchitis, to which older people and those with certain chronic medical conditions are particularly susceptible. Pregnant women have also been found to be at increased risk of the complications of flu. Some people may need hospital treatment and a number of mainly older people die from influenza each winter.

HOW DO PEOPLE CATCH FLU?

Flu is a highly infectious illness. A person carrying the virus can spread the illness by coughing or sneezing. A person can spread the virus from 1-2 days before they develop symptoms and for up to a week after symptoms develop.

WHO IS MOST AT RISK FROM FLU?

Anyone can get the flu but it is more severe in people aged 65 years and over and anyone with a chronic medical condition. Chronic medical conditions include chronic heart conditions, chronic respiratory disease, diabetes mellitus and immunosupression due to disease or treatment. Pregnant women have also been found to be at increased risk of the complications of flu. These groups of people are targeted for influenza vaccination. How can Flu be prevented ?

Flu can be prevented by vaccination. Flu vaccine is a safe, effective way to help prevent flu infection, avoiding hospitalisation, reducing flu related deaths and illnesses.

WHAT IS THE SEASONAL (ANNUAL) FLU VACCINE?

Each year the seasonal (annual) flu vaccine contains three common influenza virus strains. The flu virus changes each year, this is why a new flu vaccine has to be given each year.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW

Legion PRO Kevin Griffin chats to former club members who are living abroad.....

For our first delve into the archives of Legionairres that have moved away from their hometown, we touch down in Chicago USA and catch up with former underage and senior star LIAM O'CONNOR. Liam who hails originally from Marian Terrace, Killarney was well known and respected in both Gaa and soccer circles in the town, playing his soccer trade with Killarney Celtic. Liam started his football career as a wirey ten year old when he donned the Legion jersey for the first time back in 1976 and quickly made a name for himself as a tenacious and skilful midfielder. He played at all age groups for the club, improving every year, and it was no surprise when he got the call up to play with the Kerry minors in 1984. At this stage he was already a central player with the clubs senior team. Liam speaks highly of a lot of the players that he lined out with and against during his playing years but the players that he respected the most were Timmy Moloney and Denis O'Mahony of the Legion and Pat O'Shea of Dr Crokes, the latter being a player that often broke his heart on the playing pitch he recalls. In soccer, Liams standout players of that era were Ray Hoctor, who also played football for Legion and Tommy O'Shea who is still very active in soccer circles working for FAI. 1985 was a sad year for Legion as Liam decided to travel to Chicago but he came home soon after as sadly his Dad passed away. Liam stayed in Killarney for a while and in 1987 he had a dilemma as he was on the Kerry U21 team but he also had a desire to return to Chicago. His dilemma was sorted when after starring for the County u21 team in successive games, he was informed on the Tuesday before a major championship game that despite having impressed in the previous matches that he was not to be on the starting 15, and by the Friday before the game he went back to a place he now calls home, Chicago. Liam by his own admission never held a hammer in his hand until he got off the plane in America but now he runs a successful construction business in the windy city, something, he reckons his former woodwork teacher Des Mangan, in the Killarney Community College would find rather amusing. It was inevitable that Liam, being the keen sportsman that he was, wouldn't take long to get involved in Gaa in his newly adopted hometown and soon joined local club St Brendans Chicago where he played for many years up to 1996 with a brief sabbatical in 1991 when he returned home to Killarney for five months. The reason for his trip was to play senior football for the club and in doing so, he helped them gain promotion back to Division 1. After that Liam settled full time in America and found love in Ann Connolly. The couple got married and now have two sons, Rory aged 16 and Cathal aged 14. When Liam's playing days were finally over, he stayed actively involved in the GAA and was a founder member of a new club Windy City Gaels and is currently secretary of the club. When asked if he still keeps an interest in Legions activities and progress, he says that he definitely does mostly online and through social media and as he says, with his

nephew Podge O'Connor captaining last years senior side, he has an added reason to keep an eye on progress. Though Chicago is now Liam's permanent residence, he returns every year to see his mother, Patricia who he adores and his brothers Chris, Joe, Padraig, Michael, sister Geraldine and cousin Michael Dann and his many friends. Speaking about things that he misses most about Killarney, he says his old neighbours from Marian Tce. are what he misses most, the popping in and out of each others houses to borrow a cup of sugar etc. He says the likes of neighbours like Con O'Keeffe were one in a million and he says to this day he brags that his neighbourhood had the best looking women in Killarney. I asked Liam if he saw much of a difference between footballers now and from back in his playing days and he reckons that the footballers of today are definitely fitter and stronger but argues that the skill level was higher back then. When I finally asked him who in the Legion club had an influence on him during his playing days, he had no hesitation in saying Larry Fagan and Weeshie Fogarty.

ROWING TO RIO The Monika Dukaraska Blog



Welcome and thank you for joining me on my exciting journey in seeking Olympic qualification in rowing and hopefully will ultimately lead me to racing in the 2016 Olympics at Rio in Brazil

This journey will be interesting and one of a kind, It will be filled with loads of hard work, excitement and enjoyment but also frustration, disappointment and pain. There is also an element of routine, which is crucial in an athlete's life. This corner will give you an idea what I am getting up to on a weekly basis and what it takes to aim to compete for Ireland in rowing at the highest level possible.

I have been involved in rowing for the past eight years and I always aspire to get to the top. However, it requires a lot of sacrifice. Besides having no social life, little personal time and sometimes even energy to do anything demanding outside of rowing, it also forces you to have your life very structured and guite simple in nature.

Full time athletes usually sleep, eat and row. This cycle is ongoing. Training starts at 7:30am each day, first session begins at 8am, second at 11:30am and two to three times a week I have a third session which starts at around 3:30pm. In between training, which consists of activities like rowing on the water, ergometer, blke work and weight lifting, I eat and sleep. After returning home, I eat again, cook for the next day or go food shopping.

Training during the winter aims at building endurance; it means I spend a lot of time on the water or in the gym covering long distances to build my stamina. During the summer months, my work will consist of racing preparation. This is shorter but the workouts are very fast and more dynamic.

As much as I would love to have stayed in Kerry, chasing the Olympic dream has forced me to relocate.

In order to be part of the Irish High Performance team I had to move to Cork and train at the National Rowing Centre in Farran Wood in Inniscarra.

Over the next few weeks, I will give you an idea of my training. Since the national trials in December, which I won in the Women's Single category, I have been injured and my training had to be modified to aid recovery. I suffered from a protruding joint in my lower back, which restricted my hip movement and caused pain. Thankfully, it has now settled and long hours on a watt bike are finally over. Training full time with a day off every three to four weeks strains your body and mind. Unfortunately some small niggles sometimes turn into bigger problems which need to addressed.

I hope you will join me weekly in pursuit of my Olympic dream and you will find this journey as exciting as I do.

ACTISAF REDUCES ACIDOSIS AND IMPROVES BUTTERFATS

Dairy farmer, Michael McGrath, has a longstanding focus on cow performance. Back in 1985 he won the Creamery Milk Supplier of the Year award, and the pedigree Robinview herd continues to go from strength to strength, with current average milk yields of 10,238 litres per year and annual milk solids of 730kg.

The 120-strong herd of pure Holsteins are run on a grazing-based system, typically turned out around March 1 with additional buffer feed through April and then again from mid September. Around 40 per cent of the herd calves in the winter, with the remainder calving in the spring to make the most of grazing. Milk is sold to Dairygold on a manufacturing contract, so Michael is focused on milk solids as much as he is on yield.

"We have a real focus on breeding for type, but also look for bulls that add at least 400kg of milk," explained Michael. "All our cows are bred to Holstein, and we sell any helfers that are not needed as replacements."

Michael started farming back in 1966 and moved the family's dairy cows there in 1974. Since then he has been focused on growing the farm and the herd, buying and leasing land whenever the chance came up. The family now runs two dairy herds on nearby farms, with a total of 240 cows. Over the years herd output has also increased, although Michael used to see problems with acidosis, particularly after the cows went out in the spring.

"We used to see stomach upsets and acidosis when we turned the

cows out to grass and had more LDAs than we would like," he explained. "We discussed this with our nutritionist and he suggested we add Actisaf live yeast to our ration."

Actisaf improves rumen function, resulting in improved performance, particularly when cows are being fed lush grazing or are on diets high in starch.

It is now two years since Michael started using Actisaf and the benefits have been clear. "Since we

"We used to find that a cow that had acidosis never really got to peak and was held back for the whole lactation, which was a big issue, but thankfully those days are behind us."

IFA CALL FOR REVIEW OF ENERGY REGULATOR AS ENERGY BILLS FAIL TO REDUCE

IFA's Inputs Project Team Leader James McCarthy has called for an immediate review of the performance of the energy regulator, following the failure of energy companies to fully pass back savings to businesses and consumers, as a result of massive reductions in oil and gas prices. businesses and families. Each year farmers spend over €500m on diesel fuel, electricity and other energy. It is not acceptable that energy prices rise rapidly when oil and gas prices increase, but then fail to go down quickly when prices fall."

He said, "The CER is failing to deliver on its responsibility of improving the competitiveness of the energy sector. This is costing hard-pressed farm

Mr. McCarthy called on Minister for Energy, Alex White TD to intervene with the CER and ensure that costs are reduced in line with international oil and gas prices.

IFA SAYS CATTLE PRICES RISING

IFA National Livestock Chairman Henry Burns has said cattle prices are continuing to drive on into the new year with prices rising and factories having to pay above quoted prices to get tighter supplies.

He said the base price of steers has moved up to \leq 4.00/kg and for heifers to \leq 4.10/kg. He said more is being paid to get numbers and top prices of \leq 4.20/4.30 paid in order to procure specialist lots over the last few days.

Henry Burns said a large number of plants are very active to purchase bulls ranging from O grade Friesians at €3.90 to R and U grade continentals, making €4.10/kg.

The IFA Livestock leader said cattle supplies have tightened considerably and factories are having to pay higher prices to get stock from feeders. He said agents are finding it very difficult to get numbers and feeders are digging in, insisting on higher prices to cover

the extra costs of shed feeding. Henry Burns said cattle supplies will be very tight this spring with Bord Bia forecasting numbers to be back 150,000 head for 2015. "Tighter supplies will make a big difference and should swing the balance in favour of the feeder selling."

The IFA Livestock leader said a critical factor for the beef sector going forward is a strong live export trade for dairy calves. He said the decisions farmers make regarding calves from the dairy herd this spring will be crucial in the years ahead. What happens this spring will have a significant impact for farmers selling cattle in two years' time.

Henry Burns said IFA is very clear that we need to have a strong live export trade for price competition and particularly for male calves from the dairy herd. He said in 2014 the live export trade was strong with total volumes of almost 240,000 head, up 27,000 or 13% on 2013 levels. He said calf exports were strong with almost 40,000 head to Holland, 22,000 to Belgium and 44,000 to Spain. The international live trade was also active with almost 18,000 head exported to Libya. He said there are very strong opportunities for live exports in 2015 and IFA will work hard to drive this and maximise price competition in 2015.

As you grow older, it's as important as ever to eat well. The right diet can help you feel better and stay more active. If you have a specific health condition, then your doctor will advise you on the diet that's best for you. But if you're in good health, then the usual healthy eating guidelines apply.

It's important that you keep active too if you can. Walking, gardening, dancing and climbing stairs all count. Staying active helps keep older bodies flexible and is the best way to keep your appetite. There are a few little extras to consider in your later years too...

HEALTHY BONES

We often think of children and young people when we talk about needing calcium for strong bones. But the truth is we need to look after our bones just as much as we grow older. Getting enough calcium and vitamin D helps to protect your bones and keep them strong.

Dairy foods like milk, cheese and yoghurt are the best sources of calcium. Other

good sources of calcium are:

- Tinned fish with the bones (like sardines) or salmon)
- Green leafy vegetables (like broccoli or cabbage, but not spinach)
- Soya beans and tofu

Make sure to eat some calcium-rich foods every day.

Vitamin D helps your body to use the calcium you get from food. This vitamin is actually made in our bodies when we expose our skin to the summer sunlight. We also get it from:

 Oily fish like herring, mackerel, sardines, salmon and trout (oily fish are also great for heart health)

Egg yolks

Some brands of milk and dairy spreads which have vitamin D added (check the label)

You may not be getting enough vitamin D if you are over 65 and:

- rarely get outdoors, or wear clothes that cover all of your skin when you are outdoors
- are of Asian origin eat no meat or oily fish

Speak to your doctor or pharmacist if you are concerned. Some older people will need to take a supplement of 10µg (micrograms) of vitamin D each day.

FIBRE AND A HEALTHY GUT

When it comes to preventing constipation and keeping your gut healthy, fibre is the way to go. But many of us don't eat enough fibre. Here are some simple tips to keep your digestion healthy:

 Switch from white starchy foods (like white bread, pasta or rice) to the wholegrain versions (wholegrain bread, wholewheat pasta, brown rice and wholegrain cereals)

Eat four portions of fruit and vegetables each day Include peas, beans and lentils in your diet

Try to drink 8 glasses of fluids each day. Water and milk are best.

Know Your Rights: INCOME TAX BANDS AND RATES

JANUARY 2015

QUESTION

What are the income tax bands and tax rates for 2015?

ANSWER

The income tax bands and tax rates for 2015 were announced in Budget 2015.

Nearly all income is liable to tax. The amount of tax that you have to pay depends on your personal circumstances. There is a range of income tax reliefs available that can reduce the amount of tax that you have to pay.

Tax is charged as a percentage of your income. The percentage that you pay depends on the amount of your income.

The first part of your income, up to a certain amount, is taxed at what is known as the standard rate of tax. The amount that it applies to is known as the standard-rate tax band. The remainder of your income is taxed at a higher rate of tax.

For 2015 the standard rate of tax remains at 20% but the standard-rate tax bands have been increased as follows:

The higher rate of tax that applies to the balance of your income has been reduced from 41% in 2014 to 40% for 2015.

FOCUS ON EARLY SPRING FLOWERING SHRUBS

Now that the storms have hopefully abated and with the hope that the rain will ease somewhat, it is a good time if you are planning a new garden or trying to add some colour to an established garden to plant some early flowering spring shrubs. One of the best known shrubs is the Camellia and these popular shrubs are starting to flower in most places at the moment. The Camellia is a very valuable shrub in the garden as it can give a focal point to any shrubbery all year round with its glossy green leaves and showy blooms from early spring. A lot of people think that Camellias are a difficult shrub to grow, but in fact they are no more difficult than Rhododendrons or azaleas, and most varieties on sale now are hardy. When choosing the spot to plant your Camellia, make sure it is sheltered from cold winds as they can damage the flowering buds as can frost. When planting your Camellia make sure to mix plenty of moss peat with the earth, rather than on its own around the plant, as it will tend to root out quicker. Camellias are also ideal for growing in containers. Remember if you are planting your Camellia in the ground, that it might be small initially but most will grow to the size of a small tree, so allow plenty of room around it. There is very little maintenance with Camellias only to prune out old dead wood, clean up old blooms that fall to the ground, and to mulch around the base of plants every spring with some moss peat. There are a lot of other good spring flowering shrubs, here is a list of just a few: Forsythia, Cythisus, Corylus, Berberis Darwinii, Ribes, and Skimmia.

6 WAYS TO KEEP SENIORS SAFE DURING WINTER WEATHER:

Though we all hope we will not get freezing temperatures and frost and snow, in case the worst happens readers might find some of the following tips useful:

• Hypothermia: The elderly are particularly susceptible to becoming dangerously chilled because they have less fat, slower circulation and a more sluggish metabolism. A senior can even become hypothermic while indoors, so the thermostat should never be set below 18.5°C for a person who is 75 or older. Make sure that an elderly person is warmly dressed when inside the house as well as outside.

• **Dehydration:** Seniors are especially prone to becoming dehydrated simply because they eat and drink less than younger people, thus they consume less water. In general, people also feel less thirsty during the winter and so are more prone to not drinking enough as they should. Make sure your elderly loved one is drinking consistently.

• Ice and snow: Footpaths slick with ice and snow pose a serious falling hazard for an elderly person. Make sure that the porch, driveway, footpath, etc. of the senior has been thoroughly cleaned. Try not to let them do it themselves - bring a shovel or hire somebody. To maximise a senior's stability, be sure that they have rubber-soled shoes and new treads on their walker or cane.

• **Disaster kit:** Winter storms can be fierce enough to knock down power lines and forcibly confine seniors to their homes. It is essential to make sure a senior is equipped with a disaster kit to help them get through these times. Each kit should include enough food and water for several days (at least 3 gallons of water per person per day), a few days-worth of medication for the senior, a flashlight, a weather radio, extra batteries, and first-aid essentials.

• **Space heaters:** While they can provide an elderly person with some much-needed warmth during the colder months, precautions need to be taken so these sources of heat don't become health hazards. If the heater is gas powered, make sure the senior has a fullyfunctional carbon monoxide detector. If the heater is electric, make sure the cords aren't damaged or fraying. Keep all heaters away from flammable materials such as cloth and paper and make sure the smoke detector is working properly.

Clothing: Mittens, scarves, sweaters, hats, and coats are a few of the must-have articles of clothing for seniors. Even when an elderly person is indoors, they should be dressed in warm layers so they can take clothes off if they are too hot, or put more on if they are too cold.

AUSTRALIAN PEOPLE ARE BEING ASKED TO HELP MAKE MITTENS FOR BURNED KOALAS:

People are being asked to help make mittens for koalas that burned their paws in the recent bushfires in Australia. The Australian Marine Wildlife Research and Rescue Organisation Inc (AMWRRO) have been sharing photographs of an injured koala they have named Jeremy who has suffered second degree burns to his paws on their Facebook page.

AMWRRO said Jeremy was injured in a bushfire in the Sampson Flat area. Bushfires have been sweeping across parts of Australia, not only damaging homes but also affecting local wildlife.

The recent bushfires were the worst seen in South Australia for three decades.

Jeremy is said to be "doing very well and is in great spirits and AMWRRO says they hope to release him back into the wild in weeks to come.

AMWRRO is asking people to donate to help animals like Jeremy, which can be done through its website. The International Fund for Animal Welfare is encouraging people to make mittens to help protect the koalas' paws. It has a mittens pattern on its website.

1922 - Michael Collins took control of Dublin Castle from the British authorities on behalf of the new Irish state

1935 - Death of Gobnaitt NiBhruadair (Lady Albinia Broderick), Nurse and Irish republican activist.

Today is the 60th anniversary of the death of Gobnait Ní Bhruadair who was one of the foremost Irish republican women of the twentieth century. A lifelong radical, Gobnait campaigned passionately for causes as diverse as the reform of nursing, protection and promotion of the Irish Language and the freedom of Ireland from British rule.

Gobnait was born the Hon. Albinia Lucy Brodrick in London on December 17 1861. She was the fifth daughter of William Brodrick, 8th Viscount Midleton and his wife Augusta Mary. The family had an estate in Surrey as well as estates in Co. Cork.

An uncompromising activist all her life, at the age of 42 she trained as a nurse in England. She went on to qualify as a midwife in Dublin, and got certificates as a health visitor and health inspector. Throughout her life she advocated the training and registration of nurses to ensure high standards of care. She was also an ardent

fuel

campaigner for nurses' rights and pressed for the formation of a union for nurses.

Appalled at the poverty she had witnessed in South Kerry on an earlier visit during which she had learnt Irish, she returned to Kerry in 1908 to build a hospital in Derrynane. The area was covered by the Congested Districts Board of Ireland which was set up with the aim of promoting development in overpopulated areas where the inhabitants were regarded as permanently close to starving.

With her father's death in 1907 she had become financially independent and in 1908 bought 13.5 acres of land on the Burns-Hartopp estate from the Board for £40, the price it had paid for the land.

She reclaimed 4 acres from the bog, planted 5000 trees, laid a road and dug a 6m deep well. The same year she established an agricultural cooperative there to develop local industry. She organised classes educating people on diet, encouraged vegetarianism and, during the smallpox epidemic of 1910, nursed the local people. She sunk all her money into construction of the hospital but by 1912, she did not have the funds to finish and open the building and went to the U.S. to fund-raise.

She offered the British government the use of the hospital for treating the wounded of WWI but the British war office informed her in 1915 that it wouldn't be needed.

By this time, the venture had cost $\pm 11,000$ a vast some of money in those days for example according to the London 1910 Land Tax Valuation, the Old Bailey in London was valued at $\pm 6,600$.

At the age of 54, Ms. Broderick, sister of the staunch Southern Unionist Lord Midleton, rejected the imperialist views she was raised on and changed her name to Gobnait Ní Bhruadair. (Gobnait, the patron saint of bee keepers, was a 6th century Irish abbess of Ballyvourney, Co. Cork) she became an ardent republican, supporting the 1916 Easter Rising, visiting republican prisoners and nursed several of the wounded Irish freedom fighters as well as playing the harmonium in her local protestant church in Sneem.

She joined Cumann na mBan, became a member of the republican party Sinn Fein and went on to become Sinn Fein Councillor for Kerry in 1920.

In 1921, Civil war broke out over the Anglo-Irish Treaty. She hid both men and arms during this period. A cyclist, she travelled everywhere wearing her blue nurse's uniform. One day in May 1923, she cycled on a republican errand to Sneem. When the sixty-one year old refused to stop her bicycle for the pro-treaty forces, they shot her in the leg.

She was imprisoned in the North Dublin Union where, despite her wounds, she immediately went on hunger strike. 14 days later, and close to death, she was released.

She owned the paper supporting republicanism, 'Irish Freedom' from 1926 to 1937, contributing articles and acting as editor in its later years. At the 1933 convention of Cumann na mBan, Ms. Broderick and others split from the group. She formed a new group,

Mna na Poblachta with her close friend Mary McSwiney, sister of Terence McSwiney, Lord Mayor of Cork who had died in October 1920 after 74 days on hunger strike in Brixton prison. Ms. Broderick had ploughed all of her wealth into building the hospital but perhaps, due to her political views, she never got official approval for her plans for the hospital. After all her efforts, it just lay empty and unused and though she kept the co-op shop going until her death she was forced to wear her boots until they wore out and her clothes until they were worn to a thread.

She died at home in 1955 at the age of 93 leaving an estate worth £17,000. She left the hospital to republicans "as they were in the years 1919 to 1921 - a bequest that was ruled by Justice Sean Garron decades later in 1979 to be "void for remoteness". The land was later returned to the Brodrick family.

The abandoned ruins remain and thankfully are listed buildings they are now a reminder of ("Lady" - a title she despised) Albinia Brodrick's pioneering and altruistic dreams for a hospital for the "children haunted by tuberculosis, the women tortured by childbirth and the men struck low before their time", and promoted daylight and open windows for sick children instead of the darkened closed rooms which had previously been the norm.

It is also mostly forgotten that The Sound of Music is based on the story of the children of her niece Agathe, her husband Georg Ludwig von Trapp and his second wife, Maria.

Gobnait Ní Bhruadair is buried in the Church of Ireland graveyard in Sneem.

THE DANDELION HAS INDUSTRIAL WORTH AS AN ALL-NATURAL RUBBER RESOURCE:



Mitas, a Czech Republic-based manufacturer whose North American branch exclusively produces agricultural tires, has been researching ways to turn the Kazakh dandelion into rubber and will have dandelion tyres to test later this year.

The Kazakh dandelion is a rarer cousin of our golden wildflower variety and originates from the Kazakhstan/Uzbekistan region. The latex extracted from its roots is of particular high quality; perfect for Mitas' rugged tractor and combine wheels. Mitas is part of the DRIVE4EU project, an industrial and research consortium that aims to leverage the Russian dandelion for both rubber and inulin, a common plant carbohydrate that can be converted to alcohol This is not the first time the species has been harvested as a synthetic rubber alternative. During World War II, the Soviet Union successfully produced dandelion rubber tires for some of its military ground fleet; the U.S., cut off from traditional trade routes, also began experimenting with an all-natural tire. After the war the natural tire was abandoned until worldwide depletion of rubber trees and a renewed interest in sustainable materials made the researchers look to the past for ideas for the future.

At Ohio State University researchers have been breeding and rebreeding the Kazakh dandelion, attempting to create a more generative form of the wildflower, at present the U.S. imports its rubber from Southeast Asia at a cost of \$3 billion a year. The Ohio State researchers believe they can cultivate an acre of the dandelion for just \$100, as they require no irrigation and no fertilizer.

BEE RUSTLING IN THE US IS TAKEN SERIOUSLY

In the rich agricultural fields of California's Central Valley, bee hive thefts have increased over the past decade as the number of bees has shrunk.

Since Colony Collapse Disorder began decimating hives by the thousands across the United States in 2006, the incentive to steal bees is greater and many of the Bees Rustlers are experienced beekeepers themselves.

Two years ago one commercial beekeeper discovered hundreds of hives missing during a routine check of his hives, he immediately organised a search, drove down country roads in search of clues, found lids from the stolen hives scattered along a road, leading to the broken-down apiary.

The thief knew the beekeeping rudiments well enough to know that no matter how fierce competition may get among beekeepers, it's understood, that you don't hurt the bees.

The owner of the destroyed hives called the Sheriff and the thief was arrested but was immediately out on bail and over two years later was tried for the \$65,000 bee robbery, the thief was convicted, sentenced to 3 years in jail and had to make restitution payments of \$65,000.

Commercial Beekeepers in the US now often make their living travelling from State to State leasing out their hives to fruit producers etc as the bees are needed to pollinate the crops and there are no longer "wild" bees to do so.

FINALLY THIS WEEK

Taking the time to name a "richness of martens", "a conspiracy of lemurs" a "a shrewdness of Apes" a "cauldron of Bats or a "murmuration of starlings," for example, suggests a basic lack of contempt for the wildlife in question. Even our more derogatory labels, like an "obstinancy of buffalo" or an "unkindness of ravens," reveal a certain respect for the nonhuman neighbours that share our environment.
