

The town of Killarney is set to turn forty shades of green tomorrow for the annual St. Patrick's Day festivities.

The parade is set to begin at 2pm under the watchful eyes of grand marshals WRC drivers Paul Nagle, Rob Duggan,Ger Conway and Noel O'Sullivan jnr, who will take in the atmosphere from the grandstand.

This year's parade will weave its way down Lewis road from Fitzgerald Stadium, Fair hill, East Avenue road, Kenmare place, Main Street, New Street, Beech road and into the New Street lower car park exiting onto Mission road. "The parade is as always about the community, the people, the men,women, boys and girls who walk with pride alongside each other to make our parade happen. Without them there is no parade, so we salute you, our participants, our clubs, our schools, our organisations, who make this parade always a memorable one", Creative Director for this year's parade Fiona Crowley said.

This year's parade has garnered huge interest and is evident by the wealth of talent and diversity in the entries. A new addition this year is a prize of 2 tickets to Phil Collins in June for the best dressed costume on the day. The committee strongly advise everyone to arrive in town earlier than usual. The closure of Plunkett Street due to road works will result in traffic moving a bit slower.

And of course the now annual "Greening of Killarney" will take place over the festival weekend with many of our iconic buildings and businesses, including Killarney Outlook going green. Festival chair Anne Marie Kennelly thanked all the parties who make the festival happen "We would like to thank all the volunteers who make the Parade happen, from the Fitzgerald Stadium committee, to the Gardai, the stewards and first aiders, oursponsors who are generous with their funds and their participation, and Kerry County Council", she told the Killarney Outlook.



MEEKE AND NAGLE WIN MEXICO RALLY IN DRAMATIC FASHION

Kris Meeke and his Killarney codriver Paul Nagle have won Rally Mexico, giving him his fourth World Rally Championship victory, despite a spectacular accident on the final stage. Having dominated the final two days of the event, which is the third round of the 2017 World championship, Meeke and his co-driver, Paul Nagle, were leading by 37 seconds in the final stage when the drama unfolded. Their Citroen caught a bump in the road and spun off track to be left in a spectator car park, 1km before the finish line. He then had to manoeuvre it past parked cars and find a gap in the hedge to get back on the road. The detour cost Meeke and Nagle almost 20 seconds, but they managed to

hold on and win the rally, finishing 13.8 seconds ahead of the Ford Fiesta WRC of Sebastien Ogier/ Julien Ingrassia to give Citroen its first World championship victory of the 2017 season. Meeke was so shocked after the race that he couldn't climb onto the roof of the car to celebrate, and had to be helped by Paul. "I got caught out on a bump after the jump. I'm a lucky, lucky boy. That's certainly one way to finish a rally.

We didn't need that, but we're okay."Asked what went through his mind when he went off he replied "Trying to find my way out of the parked cars, trying to find a gap in the hedge – a lot of things went my way," he acknowledged. Meeke, who previously won Rally Argentina in 2015 as well as World Championship rallies in Portugal and Finland last year. The win moves the pair up to 6th in the world championship standings.

The Maternal and Newborn Clinical Management System (MN-CMS) went live in University Hospital Kerry on Saturday 11th March. This 'go live' marks the introduction of an electronic health record (EHR) for all women and babies receiving maternity services in University Hospital Kerry.

Maternity services in UHK have become the second unit nationally to implement the Maternal and Newborn Clinical Management System, a national system which will be implemented in all 19 maternity units. This new clinical management system will enhance care as all patients will have an electronic record instead of a paper record, allowing clinical record information to be shared with relevant providers of care, as and when required.

The first newborns in UHK to have their own electronic health records from birth are Baby Lorna Scanlon born on Saturday 11th March at

14.48hrs weighing 8lbs to parents Nora & Tim Scanlon and Baby Cadán Moloney born on Sunday 12th March at 01.31hrs weighing 8lbs 4½ oz. to parents Marion and Donncha Moloney.

Such a facility would allow use of the vacant accommodation in the town during the Winter and allow that same accommodation to be used in the Summer to facilitate visitors.

Most importantly for this area, however, it would augment, advance, create new and benefit the already established tourism and related industries in this region.

It is said that out of little acorns grow tall oak

trees and unless we start with new thinking to plant the seed of modern enterprise then the demise of rural Ireland will continue as our brightest and best will be born and educated to work in the cities that grow without limit while schools, shops, post offices, pubs, creameries that once were and churches will be but monuments to times past. Houses in the country will lie idle while those in our cities will complain that they cannot afford somewhere to live.

Why can we not hear the voices of our national representatives and politicians in this matter?

REVOLUTION E CONFERENCE A HUGE SUCCESS

The "Revolution E" conference co- sponsored by The Rose Hotel and hosted by KBN (Kerry Businesswomens Network) was held last Friday and saw over 90 delegates in attendance throughout the day. Know Your Rights: PREPARING FOR RETIREMENT

I will be retiring from work in 2017 when I reach 65. What do I need to know about pensions and other benefits in retirement?

ANSWER

When you retire at age 65 you can claim Jobseeker's Benefit, which is based on your Pay Related Social Insurance (PRSI) contributions. If you do not qualify for Jobseeker's Benefit, you can claim Jobseeker's Allowance, which is means-

At age 66, you may be entitled to the State Pension (Contributory). If you do not have enough PRSI contributions, you can apply for a State Pension (Non-Contributory), which is means-tested. You should apply for a State Pension at least three months in advance.

You may have contributed to an occupational pension scheme during your working life or you may have a personal pension arrangement. You need to contact the pension provider to find out exactly what benefits your pension gives you.

If you move from employment to retirement in the course of the year, you should get a PAYE Balancing Statement (P21) from your local tax office at the end of the year. This will trigger a refund if you have paid too much tax.

Your Jobseeker's Benefit or State Pension and any occupational pension are taxable. However, the tax exemption limits are higher for people aged 65 or over and there are some extra tax credits.

At age 66, you will be exempt from paying PRSI. At age 70, you will pay a reduced Universal Social Charge if your annual income is €60,000 or less.

At age 66, you will also be eligible for a Free Travel Pass and may be eligible for the Household Benefits Package, which consists of a free TV licence and an electricity or gas

For medical cards and GP visit cards, which are means tested, the income thresholds are higher for people aged 66 and over. If you are over 70 there is a different means test for the medical card and you can get a GP visit card without an income test.

A One-Parent Family Tax Credit

Who can Claim?

A One-Parent Family Tax Credit is a tax credit that is available to a single parent, or a person who has custody of and maintains a child who is living with him or her. This can include someone who is single, widowed, a surviving civil partner, deserted, separated (from spouse or civil partner), divorced or whose civil partnership has been dissoved.

Conditions to Qualify

- 1. Claimant is not jointly assessed to tax as a married person or a civil partner
- 2. Claimant is not living with spouse or civil partner
- 3. Claimant is not cohabiting
- 4. Claimant has not been widowed or became a surviving civil partner in the year for which they are making this claim and is not in receipt of the basic personal tax credit to which they are entitled as a result of their bereavement in that year.

Additional Information

- The tax credit is fixed irrespective of the number of children.
- The tax credit is not apportioned between claimants. Each parent receives the full tax credit once the child resides with both parents for at least part of the relevant tax year.
- Child Includes stepchild, informally adopted child or any child for whom claimant has custody and maintains at his or her expense.
- Qualifying Child Child under 18 years of age or Child over 18 years of age if in full time education or permanently incapacitated.



RECORDS ON THE LINE AS OLD RIVALS KERRY AND DUBLIN CLASH

KERRY V DUBLIN

Austin Stack Park, Saturday 18th 7pm

Kerry and Dublin lock horns in their crucial Allainz League Round five encounter this Saturday evening in Tralee's Austin Stack Park.

Kerry will be defending an 84year-old unbeaten All-Time record of 34 games. Kerry's record, which began in the 1928-29 National League, saw them win 32 games drawing just once to Kildare in November 1930. It eventually

came to an end when Meath beat them in the National League in Navan in 1933.

It took Kerry five years to establish that record which has stood since then. That Kerry team was so strong they had fewer games to play as there was no All-Ireland qualifiers in the 1920s and 1930s, while they were also given byes straight into the Munster final.

The side, which was managed by the great Jack McCarthy, won four All-Ireland championship titles and three National Leagues. Dublin have won two All-Ireland titles and four National League titles since they began their present run of success in 2015.

Dublin come to Tralee fully expecting to equal that record, having remained unbeaten in both the league and championships since March 2015 when they lost to Kerry in Fitzgerald Stadium and recognised all over the country as one of the best teams in the modern era.

Since 2015, Dublin have defeated Monaghan on three occasions, Cork, Kerry, Mayo and Donegal twice, Cavan, Derry, Down and Roscommon once in the league and have drawn with Tyrone and Donegal.

In the championship, they have recorded

wins on two occasions over Westmeath, Kerry and Mayo, and once over Longford, Kildare, Laois, Fermanagh and Donegal, while they have drawn twice with Mayo. This is the 10th occasion in which Kerry and Dublin have met at Austin Stacks Park. The Tralee venue has been a happy hunting ground for the Kingdom as they currently hold an 8-1 advantage over their great rivals, with their sole loss coming in the 1982-1983 league when the Dubs emerged victorious on a 0-8 to 0-7 scoreline.

Dublin go into this game knowing that

another win will move them that bit closer to Kerry's All-Time record.

Kerry's league performances this season have been patchy to say the least. The win over Donegal in Letterkenny was followed by successive home defeats at the hands of Mayo and Monaghan while they didn't look too impressive in putting Roscommon to the sword last time out.

Dublin, on the other hand, looked very impressive when they defeated Mayo in Croke Park two weeks ago.

Prior to that, Jim Gavin's side defeated Cavan, who play Kerry at home next time out and held out for late draws with both Tyrone (who have still to come to Killarney to play Kerry) and Monaghan.

With so much at stake, football followers in both Kerry and Dublin are eagerly anticipating this encounter.

Dublin have had an Indian sign over Kerry in recent years in league and championship and Jim Gavin's side will undoubtedly start as warm favourites.

Bryan Sheehan, who missed the game against Roscommon following his red card against Monaghan, is expected to resume duty and will push hard for a starting berth at midfield.

In a game of very tight corners, Kerry will have to be very focussed and disciplined if they are to defeat the Dubs.

With sharpshooter Dean Rock, son of the great Barney, enjoying a rich vein of form, Kerry will know that any frees they give away will be severely punished. Conor McHugh, Niall Lowndes and Niall Scully have impressed for Jim Gavin's side this season and it will be interesting to see if they will be included in the panel for the trip to Tralee. Jack Savage, one of Kerry's young guns, had a great outing against Roscommon last time out. This will be a big test for the entire Kerry squad. **By Kerry O'Shea.**

HOPING FOR A KERRY V **DUBLIN CLASSIC IN AUSTIN STACK PARK**

Saturday night's unique clash of Kerry and Dublin in Round 5 of the Allianz League is likely to be an occasion talked about, one way or the other, for many a day to come -Kerry and Dublin matches usually are! The Dubs certainly have had the upper hand on their Kingdom opponents in the last six years or so and particularly under the stewardship of Jim Gavin and they come to Austin Stack Park hoping to add to their very impressive record of going unbeaten in 33 League and Championship games - a statistic that includes back to back All Ireland titles.

10 WAYS TO GET MOVING **DURING THE WORKDAY:**

Sometimes workplace activity can be as simple as leaving your desk for a few minutes. Stand up and enjoy the bit of time away from your chair. A good goal is 10 minutes of activity per hour, so here are some ideas to get you moving but begin all exercises very gently and gradually increase the pace.

- 1) Take a walk outdoors during breaks.
- 2) Get the mail, it may feel like a chore, but this little escape can do wonders for your back.
- 3) Walk down the hall to chat with your neighbour. Sometimes we email someone just an office or two down from us! Skip the digital message and walk over to talk to them instead.
- 4) Stretch your shoulders, upper arms, chest and wrists. Stretching here and there makes an incredible difference. Focus on your upper body and shoulders, as well as your wrists (which can get pretty tense after hours of typing on a keyboard.) also stand up and lift your body up on the balls of your feet to exercise your calves a few times.
- 5) Skip the elevator and take the stairs to your floor. Then during the day, take a break here and there to walk them. This will keep your heart rate up for a while, as well as give you a nice full body workout.
- 6) Lean your back against a sturdy wall with your feet planted about two feet in front of you. Bend vour knees to squat and then straighten them back up. This will engage your abs, strengthen your back, and help with breath support.
- 7) Stretch your lower back Keeping good posture, lean to the side and reach your arm over head to stretch your ribs and waist. Then reach up to touch the ceiling for a few beats.
- 8) Reviewing some data? Considering a problem that needs solving? Just do it while standing. It may even help engage your mind better in the task at hand.
- 9) With good posture, reach your head down to touch your chin to chest. Then do the same side to side, turning your head like you are slowly shaking your head to say 'no.'

10) Grab a Cup of Coffee.

CABBAGE IN IRISH CULINARY HISTORY:

St. Patrick's Day is the biggest holiday for fresh, green cabbage consumption in the U.S., according to the United States Department of Agriculture.

Beginning in the 1600s, land laws forced onto the Irish by the English Crown eventually led to a system where mainly British landowners controlled vast tracts of Irish farmland, while mostly poor Irish farmers paid them rent to use the land. The tenant farm system left most farmers with barely enough food to survive on since the majority of the crops they grew went to pay the proprietors. Beginning in the late 17th century, potatoes became their main crop; they provided a high yield so farmers could pay their rents and still have something left over for dinner. Pigs were the main protein (for the luckier farmers), but most of the livestock also went to pay the rent.

Cabbage was another vegetable these farmers and the rural poor relied on for food, since it was nutrient-dense and grew well in Ireland. One of the first written accounts of cabbage cultivation comes from the 17th century, but it's likely the vegetable was being grown in Ireland before



It became an even more important food staple during the Great Potato Famine. Beginning in 1845, a potato blight that began in Belgium spread across Europe and had devastating effects in Ireland, since the poor there almost completely subsisted on this root vegetable. When the blight caused potatoes to begin to rot in fields and in storage pits across the land, many turned to cabbage for sustenance. And they ate a lot; it's been determined that the annual cabbage intake of the Irish around that period would have been about 65 pounds per person per year, based on crop production.

As the famine continued to rage, eventually killing more than a million people in Ireland over the course of a little more than five years, waves of Irish immigrants began to emigrate to America. They brought with them their food preferences and recipes from home, including colcannon—potatoes and cabbage boiled and mashed together—and Irish bacon and cabbage.

Though great quantities of corned beef were indeed produced in Ireland beginning in the 17th century, it was mainly for export, since most Irish couldn't afford this extravagance and instead ate bacon with their cabbage, since pork was much more affordable. The name "corned beef," coined by the British, refers to the large salt crystals used in the preservation process, which were said to resemble corn kernels.

In America, the majority of Irish immigrants flocked to large metropolitan areas like New York, Boston and New Orleans, and often lived near Jewish enclaves. They soon turned to the plentiful and affordable corned beef found at local Kosher delis for their celebratory dinners, including the St. Patrick's Day meal.

A FEW ST PATRICKS DAY CELEBRATIONS -SYDNEY TO CANADA AND **BEYOND:**

*In Sydney, St Patrick's Day was first marked in 1810, when Lachlan Macquarie, the Governor of New South Wales, provided entertainment for Irish convict workers.

*The tiny island of Montserrat known as the "Emerald Island of the Caribbean" because of its founding by Irish refugees from Saint Kitts and Nevis is one of three places where St Patrick's Day is a public holiday, along with Ireland and the Canadian province of Newfoundland and Labrador. The holiday in Montserrat also commemorates a failed slave uprising that occurred on the 17th of March 1768.

*In Malaysia, the St Patrick's Society of Selangor, founded in 1925, organises a yearly St Patrick's Ball, described as the biggest St Patrick's Day celebration in Asia.

*The Irish Association of Korea has celebrated Saint Patrick's Day since 1976.

*The first St Patrick's Day parade in Russia took place in 1992. Since 1999, there has been a yearly 'Saint Patrick's Day" festival in Moscow and other Russian cities.

*St Patrick's Parades are now held in many locations across Japan. The first parade, in Tokyo, was organised by The Irish Network Japan (INJ)

*Astronauts on board the International Space Station have celebrated the festival in different ways. Irish-American Catherine Coleman played a hundred-year-old flute belonging to Matt Molloy and a tin whistle belonging to Paddy Moloney, both members of the Irish music group The Chieftains, while floating weightless in the space station on Saint Patrick's Day in 2011 Chris Hadfield took photographs of Ireland from earth orbit, and a picture of himself wearing green clothing in the space station, and posted them online on Saint Patrick's Day in 2013. He also posted online a recording of himself singing "Danny Boy" in space.

*The shortest St Patrick's Day parade in Ireland takes place in Dripsey, County Cork. The parade lasts just 100 yards and travels between the village's two pubs.

TORONTO DOG **SAVES OWNER'S LIFE EVERY DAY IN** DIFFERENT WAYS:

Sinead Ellis is 25 years old and lives with Parkes Weber Syndrome (PWS), a rare congenital condition, for which there is no cure as yet. The U.S. National Library of Medicine notes that PWS causes arteries and veins to form abnormally, often causing excruciating pain and sometimes even heart failure. In addition, PWS often causes one limb to grow abnormally large compared to its match. In Sinead's case, her right leg is almost two times larger than her left leg.

Sinead deals with her condition with grace and good humour, but perhaps most life-saving has been her dog, Paddington who has already not only healed a literal hole in Sinead's right foot, but he has helped with her anxiety, balanced Sinead on walks despite her legs being different sizes, and even learned to monitor Sinead for signs of internal bleeding.

The hole in Sinead's foot had been there for

more than 10 years. Despite numerous medical interventions, doctors were unable to permanently close it. However, Paddington quickly began working on the foot after he joined Sinead's life in 2015. He began holding Sinead's foot every day for an hour. He did this for more than three weeks – and managed to close the hole!

Paddington can sense when Sinead's anxiety is acting up, and he'll leap into action with a soothing hug that calms Sinead down and helps keep the worst of the anxiety at bay and Sinead is again able to leave her house with Paddington's help.

He also has learned to monitor Sinead for internal bleeding that can occur as a result of PWS which causes chemical changes that Paddington smells. He knows to then wake Sinead up if she's asleep so that she can get prompt medical treatment.

THE TRAGIC POACHING OF A WHITE RHINO **IN FRENCH ZOO:**

On the night of March 6, 2017, poachers broke into the Thoiry Zoo in France, shot and killed a four-year-old white rhino, and then hacked off his horn to sell on the black market. This is believed to be the first case in Europe's history where a zoo has been targeted by poachers.

The young rhino named Vince was born in the Netherlands in 2012 and arrived at Thoiry Zoo in 2015.

Despite security cameras and on-site zookeepers, the selfish greed for rhino horns led poachers to break into the rhino's enclosure, shoot him dead, and used a chainsaw to cut one horn off. His second horn was partially cut; causing reason to believe the poachers either feared being caught or their tools malfunctioned. Due to their relatively nonaggressive nature, white rhinos can be more easily targeted by poachers than some other animals.

At time of writing the poachers were still at large.

There are five species and eleven sub-species of rhinoceros in the world, and all are considered extremely endangered or threatened. The demand for their horns, particularly in China where horns are nonsensically considered an aphrodisiac, is fuelling these heinous acts. Sadly, rhino horns are composed of nothing more than keratin, the same substance that makes up our own hair and nails. In 2015, a kilogram of rhino horn was selling for \$54,000.

Poaching threatens the world's biodiversity and affects each and every one of us on the planet, please help spread awareness of its tragic effects. Though there have been improvements in laws regarding poaching and smuggling of animals, poaching will only end once the selfish demand for animal parts ends.

A SOLAR-POWERED, PLASTIC-EATING MACHINE:

The city of Baltimore in the U.S. state of Maryland has taken crushing plastic a step further by introducing a hydro-powered, solar-powered, plastic-eating machine. His name is Mr. Trash Wheel and he lives in Baltimore's Inner Harbour.

"Mr. Trash Wheel" combines old and new technology to harness the power of water and sunlight to collect litter and debris flowing down the Jones Falls River.

The river's current provides power to turn the water wheel, which lifts trash and debris from the water and deposits it into a dumpster barge. When there isn't enough water current, a solar panel array provides additional power to keep the machine running.

When the dumpster is full, it's towed away by boat, and a new dumpster is put in place.

"Mr. Trash Wheel" was created by John Kellet, who experienced the trash problem first-hand working on the harbour. Not only has Mr. Kellet worked hard to ensure cleaner waterways for Baltimore, but he has also kept track of all the different types of trash picked up by this giant googly-eyed machine since it's start in 2014 which has amounted to more than one million pounds of garbage and debris since it's launch according to Waterfront Partnership of Baltimore.

Emotional intelligence can be a key to success in life and the ability to developing good relationships. Therefore El is a very important skills for parents to teach their children. When parents have it themselves, their child will automatically learn El. Parents with El will naturally attune to their child and understand what their child is feeling. This in turn helps the child to learn how to read and respond to his own feelings and those of others in a healthy way.

However parents who struggle with EI themselves may lack the necessary skills to teach their child. This can set up a cycle of low El within a family across the generations. When we ignore a child's feelings, don't notice when they are upset or anxious or tell them that their feelings are irrelevant, we are teaching them to ignore their own feelings. The child therefore grows up to believe that feelings are irrelevant. As adults they can struggle with emotions and in their relationships.

The following are ways in which parents can enhance their Child's Emotional Intelligence.

- Know your child's true nature: Pay attention to see what your child likes, dislikes, gets angry about, is afraid or struggles with. Communicate these observations to your child in a nonjudgemental way. This helps your child to begin to see themselves through your eyes – and they can feel how well you know them. Your child will see themselves reflected in your eyes, thus helping them to know who they are. This can boost their confidence and make them resilient to life's challenges.
- · Connect emotionally to your Child: Make an effort to empathise with your child and feel what they are feeling. Your child will feel an instant bond with you when your feel their emotion. This in turn helps your child to learn how to be empathic with others and to form healthy relationships. When your child sees you trying to understand their feelings or feel their feelings, they receive a powerful message.
- Respond non judgementally. When you child is emotional do not judge their feelings as right or wrong - instead look beyond the feelings to the source of this emotion. Help them to name and manage the emotion rather than judging it. This will help your child to develop a healthy relationship with their own emotions. It also teaches them to regulate and manage their emotions.





FOCUS ON ROSES

Every garden should leave a space for roses. The colour and scent will provide plenty of interest in your garden from early summer to late autumn. There are a lot of different classes of roses to choose from but most of the time it is the hybrid tea or floribunda roses that are usually used. A hybrid tea rose produces the showlest blooms of all roses. There is a huge range of hybrid team roses to choose from so take your time as not all hybrid tea roses are as good as each other. For example some blooms are affected by wet weather and some can be more vigorous than others so if you are going to have a mixed rose bed make sure that they are all going to grow to about the same size.

Floribunda roses: There are lots of good reasons to plant a floribunda rose even though the blooms lack the size and fragrance of the hybrid rose. The advantages of the floribundas would be the continuity of its flowering. Most floribunda roses will flower from early summer till late autumn and the flowers usually provide a much larger splash of colour than the hybrid tea rose.

Planting roses: When planting a rose, the most important thing to do is prepare the soil well as all roses are very hungry plants. Incorporate a lot of well rotted farm yard manure "horse manure' if possible before planting. When your roses are planted make sure you firm them in well with your heel as this will avoid any root disturbance later.

Pruning your roses: In early spring, cut out any old wood and any stems which are damaged. The pruned surface should be white if it is brown, prune back futher. Remove any stems which rub against another so you will end up with an open centre. You can now prune about a third of the stems that are left. In the autumn you can remove dead flowers and tidy up the rose. Make sure to feed your roses throughout the growing season. Next week I will focus on Confers.
