# Ian returns home for the first time since accident

A Killarney teenager who was seriously injured in a cycling accident in Killarney National Park in August of last year is set to return home for the first time since the incident.

lan O'Connell from Pinewood Estate who suffered life changing injuries to his neck and spine in the accident, will be returning home to celebrate St Patrick's weekend with his family before returning to Dublin next week.

The 16-year-old St Brendans College student was initially treated at University Hospital Kerry and the Mater Hospital in Dublin before being transferred to the National Rehabilitation Centre in Dún Laoghaire for intensive and specialist physical therapy.

Speaking to Jerry O'Sullivan on Radio Kerry this week, lan stole the hearts of the county with his positive attitude towards his injuries.

lan has said that the support he has received and the fundraising that has been done on his behalf, has been absolutely phenomenal and knowing that people are behind him, motivates him. Depending on progress, he could be fully discharged from the



National Rehabilitation Centre as early as next month. Ian hopes to catch up with friends and visit his local GAA club, Spa. Ian is a juvenile footballer with Spa GAA club, a hurler with Dr Crokes and also plays with Killarney Celtic soccer club. He was delighted to hear that, as he continues his rehabilitation, the Spa minor football team chose him as their captain for the 2018 season.

# Fund launched to help Louise and her family

A Killarney girl, who was involved in a horrific road traffic accident on February 24th remains in a critical condition in ICU in Bajajoz in Spain where the accident happened.

21 year old Louise Lynch, a native of Radrinagh, Spa, Killarney, is the eldest daughter of Seamus and Nora Lynch and sister to Marie and lames.

Louise who works teaching English in Spain studied for her degree in UCC.

However, the crash was so serious that Louise remains in a critical condition with serious internal injuries, cranial, abdominal injuries with many fractured bones.

A Go Fund Me with the name Louise Lynch Hospital Fund Account has been set up and members of the community are appealing to people to donate to help Louise's family at this devestating time.

"Louise with her long, red hair and tall stature is a beautiful girl with



a great sense of humour and has a very energetic personality", a spokesperson for Spa GAA club told the Killarney Outlook, adding that her students in primary school miss her dearly along with her friends and family both at home and abroad.

Growing up Louise attended Tiernaboul National School and then St. Brigid's Secondary School and onto Cork to attend UCC. She



played football with Spa Ladies Football Club, Danced for Spa in Scórna nOg, competed in Spa Muckross Community Games and is a talented musician.

Seamus, her dad, is from Milltown originally and Nora, her mom nee Buckley is from Radrin agh in Spa. James is studying his Leaving Cert in St. Brendan's, Killarney and Marie is attending college in UCC studying nursing.

### Councillor calls for wild flower areas

t the March 2018 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked:

" That Kerry County Council would make a County wide effort to promote the development of Wild Flower Areas in as many locations as possible".

Kerry County Council replied that through the Biodiversity Office it is working with a number of community groups to increase participation in the recently launched All Ireland pollinator plan. The plan aims to increase the number of habitats for pollinators, predominantly bees and butterflies, nationally through local actions. The Council

is also working with other local authorities in order to roll out a special All Ireland pollinator award as part of the National Tidy Towns competition.

Councillor Gleeson welcomed the positive reply and stated that it is of vital importance to ensure the long- term survival of our Bees and Butterflies. At present at least one third of our 99 species of Bees are threatened with extinction due to activities such as the widespread use of insecticides and lack of wild flower meadows and gardens. The future of crop and fruit growing is largely dependent on pollination by Bees and Butterflies. He urged local communities, households



and schools to become involved. Councillor Gleeson also pointed out that Wild Flowers bloom all through the summer and bring fantastic colour and beauty to the landscape they grace and will be enjoyed by all who love the great outdoors.

# **Anthology in Aid of Kerry Cancer Support**







# Contract signed for new €10m road between Killorglin and Milltown

he contract for the construction of a new road at the Kilderry Bends on the N70 between Milltown and Killorglin was signed at the offices of Kerry County Council on Monday. Corkbased Sorensen Civil Engineering Ltd was appointed the contractor to complete the construction of the scheme at the end of 2017 and initial works are already underway on site.

The development of the new 3.5km section of the main Milltown-Killorglin road between Knockavota and Tinnahally, which will take approximately eighteen months to complete, will provide for improved access on one of the busiest routes between the north and south of the county and will eliminate a series of dangerous bends at Kilderry.

The contract was signed at County Buildings this morning in the presence of council chief executive, Moira Murrell, local councillors, staff of the National Road Design Office in Castleisland and representatives from Sorensen Civil Engineering Ltd.

mid-Kerry and for the whole county. I am delighted that the new road is now at construction phase. This will greatly improve safety for all road users and will improve journey times for those travelling between north and south Kerry. Over 6,500 vehicles will be using the new road on a

daily basis,' said Cllr Sheahan.

'It is vital in a rural county like ours that the necessary transport linkages are provided to allow for increased economic activity and to provide locals and visitors alike with an enhanced road network. I look forward to its completion in 2019,'he said.








# Calls for support as Daffodil Day launched in Killarney

very 3 minutes a person in Ireland gets a cancer diagnosis, and in Kerry 1,149 were diagnosed with cancer in twelve months. Daffodil Day, proudly supported by Boots Ireland, takes place on March 23rd and is a crucial fundraiser in the fight against cancer.

Support for cancer patients is vital according to Retired Chief Superintendent Pat Sullivan, a Volunteer Driver from Tralee who brings chemotherapy patients to their appointments. Speaking at the launch of Kerry's Daffodil Day campaign on 9th March he urged local people to get involved in Daffodil Day and fund supports for patients.

"I've been a volunteer driver for over a year now and it's great to be able to lighten a person's load when they are going through cancer. This service helps to reduce the financial strain on cancer patients and ensures they have a way of getting to their lifesaving treatment. I know of some patients who were paying €100 to get a taxi to their chemotherapy appointment before they were

introduced to the service. Without it, they would not have been able to continue to attend their treatment. By supporting Daffodil Day you can help ensure other families get the same vital support."

Last year 521 journeys were facilitated for 51 patients from Kerry who used the Volunteer Driver Service to get to their chemotherapy appointments. In order to provide services to people affected by cancer, the Irish Cancer Society needs to raise €4m nationally on Daffodil Day this year.

Eugene O'Sullivan, chairperson of the Killarney Daffodil Day committee, who hosted the launch, urged local people to show their support for people in Kerry affected by cancer.

"People of Kerry have been instrumental in raising funds to help people affected by cancer, and we hope to see another show of support on March 23rd this year. As cancer incidence increases, your support is needed more than ever before to ensure no one in our community faces cancer alone. Volunteer to sell Daffodils, or simply buy a Daffodil on March 23rd and make a difference to

the lives of cancer patients and their families," he said.

Boots Ireland is the official main sponsor of Daffodil Day and stores in Kerry will be getting involved.

Catie Aspinal, Store Manager of Boots in Deerpark Retail Centre, Killarney said: Boots Ireland and the Irish Cancer Society have been working together for five years now to improve the lives of those affected by cancer. Cancer affects so many people in the community so supporting this initiative has real meaning for us and we want to continue to help make a difference to the lives of cancer patients and their families. 

### "Signs Speak Louder Than Words"

Transition Year students represented Killarney Community College at this year's Young Social Innovators Speakout which took place last Thursday 8th March in Cork City Hall. The Young Social Innovators (YSI) Programme for senior cycle is a youth-led, team-based, action focused programme. Working in teams, young people aged 15-18 identify a social issue of concern to them, explore it and come up with real actions and responses. The students in Killarney Community College chose an issue they feel very passionately about. The aim of the student's project is to raise awareness of the Deaf Community here in Killarney and encourage people to learn sign language. They believed that this issue needed to be explored

in order to create a more inclusive society especially now that ISL (Irish Sign Language) which is now officially recognised as a native and independent language in Ireland. This legislation was passed by the Dáil in December 2017 which was put forward by Senator Mark Daly. Their teacher YSI Guide Ms. Lorraine Crowley received an award for the most inspiring YSI leader guide to her students. She encouraged and motivated them throughout their project.

The TY students completed research to find out the level of knowledge and awareness of the deaf community the students already possessed. They also invited Aileen Curtaine from DeafHear Killarney to visit their class with her daughter Aisling who is a member of the deaf community. Aisling explained how she wants people outside of the deaf community to learn some basic sign language so we can all communicate. This is a wish for many people who are deaf and this motivated the students to organise sign language classes for their Transition Year class. The students are currently learning sign language with John Patrick Doherty who himself is a member of the deaf community. This is a QQI Level 3 Certificate and once they have this completed, these Young Social Innovators hope to teach sign language to the first years in the school. The students are creating a positive influence in the community.

### **USE THE STOPP TECHNIQUE TO CALM ANXIETY & REDUCE STRESS**

### Step 1:

STOP! Say it to yourself as soon as you notice your mind and/or body reacting to a trigger. Step 2:

Take a breath. This helps calm your nervous system

Observe. Notice, without judgement what you are thinking and what you are feeling. Notice too the impulse to react in an impulsive way. Noticing helps you to defuse from those thoughts & feelings and therefore reduce their power & control.

Pull back & put in perspective. Ask yourself if this will matter in a year? What would you say to a friend in this situation? Is there another way of looking at this? What's the bigger picture? Is my reaction in proportion to the actual event?

Practice what works & proceed: Ask yourself what is the best, most kindest thing you can do for you right now? What action can you take that fits in with your values? What will be the consequences of my choices? What is most helpful for the situation and good

Practise the first two steps often for a few days - many times every day at any time. Read through the steps often. Practise STOPP by running through all the steps several times a day, every day...when you don't need it. Start to use it for little upsets. Gradually, you will find that you can use it for more distressing situations. Like any new habit or skill, it will become automatic over time.



### **DID YOU KNOW?**

That after a fairly settled start to March in southern Britain back in 1891, cold air began to sink south across the country in a developing north or north-easterly flow. It was from the 9th of March when the weather really turned. A series of developing Atlantic depressions moved eastwards, close to or across southern Britain. These low pressure systems brought large amounts of precipitation, much of which fell as snow, thanks to the below-average temperatures residing across the country. Strong winds accompanied the snow, leading to blizzard conditions and some enormous drifts.

Snow began to fall during the afternoon of the 9th across Devon and Cornwall, which turned heavier and steadier through the second half of the day. The depression became rather slow-moving as it deepened further in to the night of the 9th and on in to the following day. Much of southern England and the English Channel experienced gale or severe gale force easterly winds with continuous heavy snow. According to reports it claimed the lives of over 200 people and thousands of farm animals also perished, the weather toppled thousands of trees, wiping out large areas of woodland and the gales also led to the sinking of dozens of ships in the English Channel.

On the 11th of March, the complex low pressure system had eased away in to the near-continent. A transient ridge of high pressure allowed for something more settled to move in for a time, bringing a little sunshine for a while. However, this was the calm before the next storm. Another Atlantic low pushed its way in from the west, bringing a fresh wave of gales and heavy snow to south-western England during the night of the 11th, in to the 12th. It took more of a south-easterly track compared to the preceding depression, drifting in to Brest, north-western France rather than across the English Channel and southern England as before.

By the 14th March, the strong winds had abated and a thaw of the snow began. Reports from the time stated that the deep ravine, Tavy Cleave by Dartmoor, had filled with snow to depths of 300 feet as snow was driven in by the gales. Reports also stated that up to ten trains vanished under the drifts, trapping passengers for days before being rescued.

Despite the thawing of snow after the event, it was not until June that the last of the snow disappeared from parts of Dartmoor.

Pause Cat Cafe's mission is kindness, and not just for their twelve rescue cats. The café in Bournemouth, England also run projects to help the local community.

Since the Café opened last February, they have been helping people with special needs develop their skills through volunteer placements in the café.

People have been learning tasks like serving customers, wrapping cutlery and preparing the tables. The volunteers, who have conditions ranging from autism and Asperger's to sight loss and physical disabilities, gain confidence and improve their people skills as well as learning tasks that can help them to be more employable.

Pause are hoping to be able to extend their kitchen soon and make it disability friendly by creating wheelchair access and safety-proofing certain areas to allow people of all abilities to be trained in working with food.

Amy screamed out for help and that's when a good Samaritan, who wishes to remain anonymous, saw what was happening and quickly jumped into action.

The woman was driving south on Main Street after dropping her child off to school. She saw the other woman had Amy in a one armed bear hug and was forcing her down the street.

The car driver told the woman that she was Amy's mother and was shouting to let her go, the woman did and Amy sat into the car the Good Samaritan said. She then took Amy to school and called the police.

"I want to say thank you for saving my life and you're my hero," Amy said.

Santa Ana police later arrested a woman for the kidnapping attempt.

BRAVE MOUNTAIN CLIMBER RISKED HIS LIFE TO SAVE TWO DOGS STUCK ON A MOUNTAIN IN FREEZING TEMPERATURES

37-year-old Scott Pilling decided to search for the lost dogs after seeing a Facebook post about a missing German Shepherd and Mongrel. The post said the dogs were last seen in The Lake District in England.

Mr. Pilling, who had never met the dogs' owner, rallied a few hikers and drove 94 miles from his home to carry out the successful rescue mission.

"When I spotted them in the distance and they responded to my whistles I couldn't believe it," Mr. Pilling said. "If they'd been there much longer they would not have survived. The bigger dog was shielding the smaller dog from the elements, which was amazing to see. The smaller one needed to be cuddled and rubbed as he was so cold."

The dogs' owner, Colette Kilroy, who had also been out searching, said she was overwhelmed by Mr. Pilling's efforts.

"I cannot put into words how thankful and appreciative I am," she said. "You are a hero in my eyes and I feel so blessed and thankful that you were there. Thank for risking your life for my dogs and persisting to rescue them both."

# Lakers clinch Div 1 B Title

**Scotts Lakers St Pauls 87** Paris Texas Kilkenny 81

Scotts Lakers clinched the division one B title following a dramatic six point victory over Paris Texas Kilkenny in Killarney Sports Centre last Saturday night. Trailing 81-70 with five minutes remaining, the game appeared well out of reach for the home side but the Lakers enjoyed a storming finish hitting 17 unanswered points keeping Kilkenny scoreless for the closing five minutes.

Indeed it was a match where both sides enjoyed significant periods of dominance at different stages. Scotts Lakers squandered a 13 point advantage after leading 21-8 at one stage in the first quarter while Kilkenny led by the same margin, 56-43, early in the third quarter. The closing five minutes where Scotts Lakers went on a 17-0 run was an outstanding finish from the home side but it also reflected a dismal period from a Kilkenny side that ran out of steam and pressed their own self destruct button.

Both sides went into this match at the top of division 1B knowing that a victory would secure the title. Scotts Lakers were out of the blocks early with Antuan Bootle, Dan Griffin and Dailian Mason all on target to open up 15-4 midway through the first quarter. The Lakers extended their advantage to 21-8 with less than three minutes left but Kilkenny responded well through Julian O'Keeffe and American Taylor Young to narrow the gap to 23-15 at the end of the first quarter.

Lakers maintained their advantage with a three-pointer from team captain Philip O'Connor to lead 30-23. Paul Clarke, off the

bench, also added a basket but Taylor Young really stepped it up for Kilkenny and he tied the game at 34 points each with 4.22 remaining in the half. Kilkenny took the lead for the first time through Brian Hogan, 34-36, with four minutes left and with O'Keeffe and Young continuing the impress, Kilkenny were in front, 43-44, at the interval break.

It didn't get much better for Scotts Lakers upon the resumption and with Taylor Young dominating, Kilkenny opened up a 13 point lead, 43-56, early in the third quarter. After trailing by the same margin in the first quarter, it was an impressive 26 point turnaround by the visitorsy. It was a full three minutes before Scotts Lakers opening their scoring account in the second half and they trailed 50-60 midway through the third quarter. Antuan Bootle and Mark Greene kept the home side in contention with some big three-pointers but Kilkenny were in command to lead 61-72 at the end of the third quarter.

It looked all over for Scotts Lakers when a Paul Leigh three-pointer pushed Kilkenny 65-77 clear with less than seven minutes remaining and the home side trailed 70-81 with five minutes left. Amazingly, Kilkenny failed to score again as Mark Greene and Andrew Fitzgerald narrowed it to 74-81 with 4:30 remaining. Kilkenny were in serious foul trouble at this stage and accurate free throw shooting from Mark Greene and Antuan Bootle cut the gap to 80-81 with 2:30 left . With the home supporters on their feet sensing victory, a big Dan Griffin basket raised the roof and Scotts Lakers took the lead, 82-81 with 1.52 remaining. A huge three-pointer followed from Dailian Mason with 30 seconds left while Philip O'Connor added the insurance baskets to secure a memorable six point win for the Lakers.

Kilkenny will look back on this game as one that slipped away so easily. Significant factors in their loss will point to their scoreless return in the closing five minutes. They managed just four baskets in the final quarter and American Taylor Young was held scoreless by great defence from the Lakers in that period. Also the impressive Julian O'Keeffe, who netted 15 first half points, was held scoreless for the duration of the whole second half. Full credit to Scotts Lakers for the great comeback and superb defence that limited the Kilkenny threat . The overall Lakers performance wasn't one of their better ones but it was a very rewarding one for coach Cormac O'Donoghue and his squad and securing the plate title was a real bonus considering that it is the Killarney side's first season back in national league basketball after nearly a decade.

### **TOP FOUR PLAY OFFS**

After winning the Division 1B title, Scotts Lakers will now compete in the league play-offs with a place in the final top four up for grabs. The Lakers will host IT Carlow in Killarney next Sunday, March 18th and the winners will go forward to the top four where the opposition is likely to be Division 1A winners Killorglin, Neptune and Ballincollig.

Carlow finished in fourth spot in division 1A and will be a much tougher test than recent opposition for Scotts Lakers. The sides clashed in Carlow last December with the home side winning 88-77 on that occasion. American Jimmy Gordon is an outstanding three-point shooter and he is well supported by the likes of Kevin O' Donoghue, Alan O Neill and Armands Kaikuls.

Despite some wet weather appearing for the event the brave souls started and finished their event in the Square in Kenmare, covering as much as 67km. This is the first year Quest Kenmare has taken place and plans are afoot to return in 2019 already. Adventure racers came from as far afield as the US, France and Finland to take part in the event.

Winners of the Expert route were Shaun Stewart, from Donegal and Ellen Vitting, a Kenmare local, much to the delight of onlookers and supporters. Winners of the Sport route were Philip Smith from Cavan Kayakarun Triathlon and Cycling Club and Aishling O'Connor from Dublin. Winners of the Challenge route were Sheldon Kirkwood from Cork and Birte Offick from Galway (see notes for

# **Know Your Rights:** REBUILDING IRELAND HOME LOAN

My partner and I have been unable to get a mortgage to buy our own home. Will we be eligible for the new Rebuilding Ireland Home Loan?

### **ANSWER**

The new Rebuilding Ireland Home Loan provides mortgages to first-time buyers at reduced interest rates (2%-2.3%) to buy new or second-hand properties or to build a home. You can choose to fix the rates for the full term of the mortgage, so you have the same repayments for the whole time you are repaying the loan.

To qualify for a loan under the scheme:

- You must be a first-time buyer aged between 18 and 70 years of age
- Your income cannot be more than €50,000 (€75,000 for joint applicants)
- You must have a deposit of at least 10% of the purchase price of the property
- · You must have evidence of two insufficient offers or refusals for a mortgage loan by two banks or building societies
- · You must have a satisfactory credit rating
- · The main applicant must have been in continuous employment (or self-employed) for at least two years

The property must not be over 175 square metres. If you are buying in Cork, Dublin, Galway, Kildare, Louth, Meath or Wicklow, the maximum market value of the property cannot be more than €320,000; in all other parts of the country, the value cannot exceed €250,000. You also need to show that you can afford the monthly repayments, which must be less than one-third of your monthly household income.

You can use the Home Loan Calculator rebuildingirelandhomeloan.ie to work out how much you can borrow.

The Rebuilding Ireland Home Loan is available nationwide from local authorities. You must make an appointment with your local authority to submit your application form and supporting documents in person. You can also call the Rebuilding Ireland Home Loan help desk at (051) 349 720 for more information.

### WHO SHOULD REGISTER FOR SELF-ASSESSMENT?

### You should register for self-assessment if you:

- are self-employed
- receive income from non-Pay As You Earn (PAYE) sources, for example:
- rental income
- investment income
- · foreign income including foreign pensions
- maintenance payments
- · fees that are exempt from PAYE
- · have profited from share options or share incentives.

You can register for self-assessment by using the eRegistration service or by completing Form TR1

### You do not need to register for self-assessment if:

- · you only have PAYE income
- or
- your taxable non-PAYE income does not exceed €5,000 and your gross non-PAYE income
  does not exceed €30,000, and this income is taken into account in calculating your tax
  credits and standard rate cut-off point for PAYE purposes. In this case, you must submit a
  Form 12 online
- If your taxable non-PAYE income exceeds €5,000, or your gross non-PAYE income exceeds €30,000, you must register for self-assessment.



# GARDENING



with John O'Sullivan

### **FOCUS ON CLIMBERS**

The importance of climbers in a garden should never be underestimated as they are ideal for covering walls and disguising sheds and if you don't have much space they will allow you to garden upwards. The easiest types of climbers to grow are the ones we call self clinging. The good thing about self clinging climbers is that there is very little maintenance. All you need to do is keep them under control. If your self clinging climber is growing on your house make sure that you keep it pruned back from gutters and windows. A good example of these climbers are evergreen or varigated ivy.

TWINING CLIMBERS: Most of these climbers could probably scramble up most sheds or walls but will need support to do so with some trellis or wire. Heavy growing climbers such as Solanum (Potato Plant) would need to grow on a very sturdy structure as it can get quite woody and grow very vigorously in a season. Lighter climbers such as Honeysuckle or Clemintas can also grow vigorously but can be controlled by cutting to ground level. There is also a lot of shrubs that can be used as climbers on small walls or pillars. There is probably a little bit more work in these as they don't cling to the wall. You will have to keep them well trimmed as if they get too heavy they will come away from the wall. A good example of a shrub that will do this is a plant called Cotoneaster Horizontalis. This plant can be planted on the garden side of a wall and can grow up and over and cover the outside of the wall. You can use a climber anywhere in the garden by planting it alongside some trellis which can give a whole new look to that particular area. Next week I will focus on Plants for Shade.

# COPING WITH LOSS



Loss is considered to be a natural part of life – yet coping with loss is one of the most difficult challenges we will face in our lives. Grief is a natural response to loss and the more significant the loss, the deeper our grieving will be. When a loved one dies, we may experience all kinds of difficult emotions - and it can feel like this pain will never ease. This is a normal reaction. Grieving is a vital process and typically, over time, these intense feelings will diminish in intensity. Everyone reacts differently and there is no right or wrong way to grieve. Equally there is no 'normal' period for someone to grieve and it may take months or years to come to terms with a loss. For most people, grief doesn't go away - but it fades into the background. Thoughts and memories of our loved one are woven into our minds – and whilst missing our loved one may be part of our life - it doesn't interfere with us living our life. Sometimes however, we can experience what is termed 'Complicated Grief'. This refers to an intense and long-lasting grief that takes hold and doesn't seem to lessen as time goes on. Many people come through the loss on their own – supported by friends and family – others benefit greatly from bereavement counselling.

Whilst there are no right ways to grieve - there are however, healthy ways to deal with the pain. People often report that grieving the loss of a loved one gave them a renewed sense of meaning, purpose and direction in their life.

### Helpful steps include

- Accept what you are feeling: If we deny or ignore our feelings it will only make it worse in the long run. For healing to occur, we need to acknowledge and face our feelings.
- 2. Talk about the death of your loved one: Talking to family and friends can help us to understand what has happened and remember our loved one.
- 3. Remember and celebrate the life of your loved one: Honor the individual – perhaps through making a collage of photos, planting a tree in their memory, donating to a favourite charity etc.
- Be patient and allow the grieving process to naturally unfold. Whilst we may often think of grief resulting from the death of a loved one, any loss can cause grief. Over the coming weeks we will explore grief and loss and ways we can deal with this.





