Dignatries from the Killarnev Municipal Area gathered yesterday, Thursday, to unveil the newly improved facilities for members of the public and a new meeting room at Killarney Town Hall. The meeting room will facilitate meetings of the Killarney Municipal District and other events and was officially opened by Cathaoirleach, Cllr Brendan Cronin, whose father, PJ Cronin opened the Council Buildings in Tralee when he was chairman of Kerry County Council in April, 1989.

Killarney Town Hall has been renovated recently to enhance the public counter area at the main foyer for the benefit of customers and those availing of services at the MD office. There are currently 33 council staff based at the offices on Kenmare Place including the new Municipal District Officer, Eileen O'Donoghue, new Municipal District Engineer, John Ahern and the new Tourism and Economic Development Officer, Maria Ní Cheallaigh.

Meanwhile, a new crest and chain of office for the Municipal District (MD) has been unveiled. The MD had been using the chain of the former Killarney Town Council which has now been replaced by a new one bearing a crest designed to reflect the various aspects of the wider Municipal District area including the lakes, the mountails, the ancient literary traditions from the Annals of Innisfallen and the unique musical heritage of the wider area.

The piece was designed by Catherine Conway, a Kilkennybased designer, and incorporates elements of the natural environment, landscape, cultural, literary and built heritage, and other aspects of the district.

# **KILLARNEY TO CELEBRATE 232 YEARS OF ROWING ON SUNDAY 25TH**

The sport of rowing, which dates back to the early 1800s, is almost as old as the town of Killarney and currently all six local clubs are gearing up for the annual Regatta at O'Mahoney's Point on Sunday, June 25th. Rowing is certainly the oldest sport in Killarney and on checking through old records it is noted that during the 1800s the only sporting events held locally were the annual Regattas at Innisfallen Island and the Races which were held at Coolcorcoran prior to the opening of the present racecourse at Bunrower, while golf was played on the old course at Deerpark prior to the opening of O'Mahoney's Point.

Currently there are six rowing clubs in Killarney. While we have no information regarding the founding of the Muckross clubs there are indications that the club was active in the early 1800s, making it the oldest club in the area.

Commercials, originally known as The Drapers based on its long and close links with the business life of Killarney, was founded in 1886 and after a period of inactivity is now up and running with a new clubhouse and excellent facilities down at Ross Castle. Back west of the town we have Fossa, once known as Aghadoe Boat Club, and this club has a long tradition of rowing since its formation in 1893.

Back down at Ross Castle we have St. Brendans, founded in 1895, and this club was once known as Lough Lein Rowing Club and beside them we have Workmen, founded in 1920, while out in Cahernane we have Flesk Valley, founded in 1924. St. Finans, now defunct, was formed in 1952 by the staff of the now closed St. Finans Hospital. While Commercials have close links with the commercial life of the town, other clubs including Muckross, Fossa, and Flesk Valley were once closely linked with the aristocracy, notably the Herberts, Vincents, and McGillicuddy families. Those links have been perpetuated in the names of the Regatta



In earlier eras Regattas were held off Innisfallen Island and Cahernane Bay before moving to the present course at O'Mahoney's Point and the committee are deeply indebted to the management of Killarney Golf and Fishing Club for making their facilities available since 1954. Much has changed over the years and while the Regatta was the sole event for the rowing fraternity of Killarney, clubs from the area now compete regularly at National and International rowing events and of course it must be noted that three rowers from Killarney, Paul Griffin, Sean Casey, and Cathal Moynihan competed for Ireland at the Olympic Games.

Coastal rowing is also proving most attractive, and local clubs have enjoyed much success at Coastal Regattas.

This year's Regatta Programme will be officially launched at the Avenue Hotel on Thursday, June 15th, during which the contribution of the sponsors will be recognised and also a winning club from 25 years ago will be honoured. The participants for the Regatta Queen Contest will also be introduced on the night. This year's programme of 17 races, including both Mens and Ladies Races, will commence at 9.30am at O'Mahoney's Point on Sunday, June 25th.

# **JOHN EGAN UNVEILING THIS WEEKEND**





Walkers who took part in the Kerry Walking Festival charity climb of Strickeen last Friday, didn't forget their dancing shoes. The organisers of the Walking Festival organised the 'Sun Set' event to raise funds for the Kerry Parents and Friends Association's Buy A Bus campaign. The charity Kerry Parents and Friends has played an enormous role in the lives of families in Kerry, living with intellectual difficulties . The 'Bus Fund' is the initiative of Agnes Rooney, who is a full time carer for her sister Mairead, since their mother's passing in 2015. Mairead has Down's syndrome and has been helped by the group for decades. Agnes says she'd "be lost without the association's assistance" and is determined to push the campaign to raise €60,000 to purchase a wheelchair-accessible bus for the charity. The current fleet of 17 buses is deteriorating with no funding for replacements. Agnes says "These buses take Mairead and her friends to work, home, hospital appointments, social training, respite and holidays. They travel all over Kerry and truly support them and their families in ways that the greater community may not understand."The rain didn't dampen spirits as the Charity walk departed Kate Kearney's Cottage, Gap of Dunloe, at 7.30pm. Walkers danced a Kerry Polka on the summit, to the music of tin whistles and bodhráns. Plenty of fun was had and, importantly, funds were raised for a great cause. The 'Buy a Bus' campaign is also one of the beneficiaries of the Ring of Kerry Charity cycle this year, Agnes is actively seeking Cyclists to register for the 'Buy a Bus' charity on the Ring of Kerry Website.





# **DUGGAN TAKES POSITIVES FROM GRUELLING RALLY ITALIA**

Rob Duggan claimed 6th place among the Junior World Rally Championship runners on last weekend's Rally Italia Sardinia. His finishing position however, doesn't quite reflect how successful an event this was for the former Motorsport Ireland Young Rally Driver of the Year.

In his first event with new navigator Tom Woodburn, Duggan set a string of fastest times and ended the event on a high by being the guickest JWRC driver over the final day of the rally. Duggan's speed however, was curbed by an impact with a rock on Friday while battling for the lead and his attempt to charge back up the leaderboard on Saturday was thwarted by a broken driveshaft. Duggan remains philosophical however and he's already looking ahead to Rally Poland in just a fortnight's time. "It was an incredibly tough event. The heat and the terrain were like nothing I've ever experienced but we were encouraged by our pace. Obviously it was really disappointing to have to retire on Saturday while in contention for the lead and the time penalty we received for restarting meant we really couldn't finish much higher than 6th unless people retired but we were delighted to pick up four bonus points for our fastest times over the weekend. Tom did a great job on his first rally with me and at least I know now that I have the pace to compete at this level, I just need to work on

my consistency. Poland isn't far away and by all accounts it's a real high speed event which should suit my driving style. Keeping out of trouble will be vital as it's really cost me on the previous rounds. Nil Solans has a healthy lead in the points now but if anything, that means there's more pressure on him. There are four rounds left and I aim to be in the hunt for all of them." After the event, Rob finds himself 6th in the drivers' standings on 20 points with leader Solans on an impressive 62 points. With a maximum score of 48 points on offer in Poland however, the JWRC title race is far from decided and Rob cites the case of fellow Irish driver Craig Breen when he found himself in similar circumstances during his WRC Academy winning year in 2011. "After two rounds, Craig was 45 points adrift of the series leader. He battled back to clinch the title on the last stage of the last rally, so we aren't going to throw in the towel." # TWO MILE SCHOOL TO REOPEN

Kerry Fine Gael TD, Brendan Griffin, is warmly welcoming confirmation that the Two Mile National School, Killarney, is to re-open as a Community National School this September. The school did not open last September and has been empty since then. In January of this year, Deputy Griffin organised a meeting between local people and officials from Kerry Education and Training Board to explore the prospect of the school becoming a Community National School. Arising from this exploratory meeting, a wider consultative meeting was organised by the local community, where Deputy Griffin was called upon to formally witness the unanimous support in the community for the Community School proposal. Since then, formal efforts have been ongoing to finalise the process of re-opening the school and Deputy Griffin has been liaising closely with the local community, Minister for Education and Kerry ETB.

"I am delighted that this day has come, after many months of hard work by the local community, Kerry ETB and the Bishop of Kerry. "I am glad to have played my part in ensuring that this fine school will re-open in September to serve the needs of the local and wider community. "I want to pay tribute to everybody involved in this effort and it is great to have such a positive outcome", Deputy Griffin told the Killarney Outlook.

#### **Clir B Cronin:** To request the urgent resurfacing of the road from Woodlawn Junction to Dromhall Park as this road is in terrible condition.

**Reply.** Resurfacing works on Woodlawn Road from Woodlawn junction to Dromhall park is scheduled to be carried out in Quarter 3 of 2017.



**COUNCIL MATTERS** 

**Clir B Cronin.** To ask the Roads Department to urgently provide improved safety measures for the residents of Port Road Killarney, to address their serious concerns regarding speed of traffic and road safety when exiting their homes, also pedestrian safety and also to address the surface of the road which is deplorable.

**Reply.** Killarney Municipal District will carry out speed surveys along Port Road to determine if vehicles are travelling in excess of the 50klm limit. If these surveys indicate that vehicles are travelling in excess of the speed limit, then a feasibility report will be prepared and submitted to the TII. This section of road has been submitted to the TII for a pavement improvement and the Council are currently preparing pavement design documents for submission to the TII for funding available.

**Clir B Cronin.** Has progress been made on my repeated requests to make the public toilets in the High Street car park accessible for people with disabilities. **Reply.** A proposal has been developed and we are currently investigating a funding stream for these works. The proposed new design layout will also be discussed with local disability representatives. **Clir B Cronin.** To request Kerry County Council to carry out urgent repairs to damaged bridge parapets on our rural road network, in particular both sides of the bridge between Rathcomane cross and the railway crossing.

**Reply.** Kerry County Council are currently pricing the works required on various bridges which have damaged parapets including the one between Rathcomane and the level crossing. It is hoped the work the work will progress early in Q3 of 2017. Rae: How many grave spaces were left in Aghadoe graveyard. REPLY: The council explained that there is currently 28 double plots

and 6 single plots.

take; how much it will cost and where will the finances from a CPO come from.

**The council replied:** "The CPO for the new graveyard was published on 3rd May 2017 and was on display until 7th June 2017. Parties with an interest in the property being compulsory purchased have until 22nd June to lodge an objection to An Bord Pleanala. If no objections are received by An Bord Pleanala by the specified date, Kerry County Council can confirm the CPO and commence the development process".

**CLLR. MAURA HEALY RAE:** In relation to a number of dangerous junctions around Killarney has Kerry County Council received any report from the TII as to what is going to be done with the Lewis Road, Madam's Hill and Coolcaslagh and I highlighted that urgent action needs to be taken. I also reiterated that I had previously requested that the speed limit be reduced between Lissivigeen and the Pike Hill and at Madam's Hill.

**The council replied:** "In relation to Coolcaslagh, the NRDO in Castleisland is currently preparing a feasibility study for traffic calming proposal from Lissivigeen School to Daly's Roundabout". KCC also said in relation to Madam's Hill that the junction is "being reviewed by the NRDO and a feasibility study will be forwarded to the TII for safety works". An official from the NRDO office assured those present at the meeting that at the next meeting of the Killarney Municipal District in July that a proposal will be shown to members in relation to the Lewis Road junction.

# **CAIRN OF PEACE TO BE ERECTED IN KILLARNEY**

A monument to commemorate Killarney's staging of the second ever World Ploughing Championships in 1954 is to be built and erected in the town. Wherever the international competition is held, it is established tradition for the host venue to erect a cairn of peace to mark the event but, for a variety of reasons, that didn't happen in Killarney 63 years ago when ploughing experts from throughout the world gathered to compete at the venue in Gortroe, Fossa.

But now, thanks to the initiative of the Killarney Valley Classic and Vintage Club – organisers of the annual South Kerry Ploughing Championships and Harvest Show – the cairn is finally being commissioned.

Club chairman, Tom Leslie, enlisted the support of Mayor of Killarney and ploughing enthusiast, Cllr Brendan Cronin, who secured agreement from the Killarney Municipal District Council to provide a suitable site for the development.

Council engineers Kieran O'Halloran and Breda Mulryan suggested four possible locations and National Ploughing Association organisers, Anna May McHugh and her daughter, Anna Marie, visited Killarney this week to visit the four sites and to nominate their preferred option. The chosen location is a green space opposite St Mary's Cathedral, close to the entrance to Killarney National Park on Mission Road, and work will now commence on designing the cairn which will be floodlit by night.

Anna May and Anna Marie were presented with bouquets of flowers and signed copies of Valerie O'Sullivan's book on the MacGillycuddy's Reeks while a delighted Saran was given a gift of a Kerry jersey signed by team captain Johnny Buckley. After the lunch the group visited the farm of John O'Leary in Aghadoe which commands a spectacular view of the site in Gortroe where the 1954 Ploughing Championships were held and they then visited the four proposed sites for the cairn.

Anna May, who was secretary of the National Ploughing Association when the world championships were held in Killarney in 1954, said she was absolutely thrilled that the cairn of peace is being commissioned and she looks forward to returning to town for the unveiling ceremony.





# **ORNAMENTAL GRASSES**

Ornamental Grasses can grow in a wide range of conditions. There are grasses to suit damp or dry soils, shady and sunny positions. Grasses can add great colour to any shrub bed and they also look great in containers.

Ornamental grasses don't need much feeding as this only encourages a log of growth in the foliage at the expense of flowers. There is a large section of grasses to choose from. There are grasses like the Pampus, which is tall to the Carex Algod which is small.

If you are planting small grasses in the garden try and plant them in groups of three rather than on their own.

Grasses are also ideal plants for containers but only choose an evergreen one such as Phormium or an Astelia as they will give you colour all year and you can plant your seasonal plants around them.

Cllr. Maura Healy Rae raised the following

motions at the Killarney Municipal District meeting Rennily which are of interest to the community.

She asked if Kerry County Council could make

funding available for the Maughantourig Road as it is in a desperate state. She asked if it would be possible to get funding from CLAR or could any discretionary funding be provided by Kerry County Council this year. Kerry County Council replied by saying that currently there is no funding to carry out resurfacing works on the Maughantourig Road. However, the roadway can be considered for inclusion in the Multi-Annual Restoration Improvement Programme, which is due for renewal at the end of this year. She noted that she had requested that this road be considered for this programme. Kerry County Council agreed that they will carry out minor maintenance works until funding for resurfacing works would be made available.

Secondly, she highlighted the issue with the Cullawa

River and when will more works to clear the river be carried out as what works had been done were a significant help but that more works to remove silt and the rover were still remaining to be done. She also noted that a commitment to do these works had been given and that the silt should be removed in the open season. Kerry County Council replied by noting that in 2013 a sum of 40,000 euro was made available by the OPW to Kerry County Council to remove bushes, shrubbery and overhanging branches along the channel of the Cullawa River. These works were completed. She asked that further funding is required to complete the clearing of the river. Kerry County Council said that an application for further funding will be made to the OPW for additional works.





## MOTOR FINANCE – BE INFORMED BEFORE YOUR SIGN UP

With the 712 car registrations on the horizon, it's important that you inform yourself on the motor finance deals that are on offer and consider all your option before signing on the dotted line.

Research conducted by the Competition and Consumer Protection Commission (CCPC) regarding consumer behaviour when purchasing cars indicated that 54% of respondents to the survey planned how much they were going to spend and how they would finance their car prior to choosing their last car, while 46% chose the car first.

Chapter 23 - Kerry and West Limerick Credit Union advise customers to set a budget when purchasing a car and stick to it, as often customers can be swayed by dealer finance on offer and commit to purchasing a car without considering all the facts.

The key difference between a credit union loan and say dealer finance, is that you own the vehicle Day 1 with a credit union loan. With PCP/Hire Purchase with dealer finance, you are effectively renting the car as you don't own it until the final repayment is made.

Helen Courtney Power, Chapter 23 Credit Unions stated "we are advising our members to be prudent when looking at car finance



and as sometimes the devil is in the detail. With PCP/Dealer Finance they may be deposits required at the start, balloon payments at the end, mileage restrictions, wear and tear, these restrictions don't apply in the credit union.

Competition and Consumer Protection Commission back up this claim. This May, the CCPC raised concerns about car finance products with the Department of Finance and Central Bank of Ireland following an increase in people buying new cars using types of hire purchase.

The commission said it was "of the strong view

that there are certain characteristics of car finance products that mean some consumers could take out a product which may not be affordable or in their best interests in the long term"

With a credit union loan, there are no fees, and no charges and you also have the flexibility of clearing your loan early without any penalty. Also, if you run into arrears, you can sell the car, such options aren't available under PCP deals, as you are essentially renting the car until the final payment is made.

The credit union offers free Loan Protection and Life Savings Insurance so in the event of your death or permanent disability your loan is cleared. With dealer finance, there is no such protection, so repayments will still have to be made or alternative arrangements made to pay outstanding debt.

Helen added "Chapter 23 Credit Unions is made up nine credit unions throughout Kerry and West Limerick, so a local credit union is never too far away. Call and ask for a car loan quote today It's worth putting in the time to study and understand the different finance options available, it will save you money in the long run" she concluded.







## **NEW VOLVO XC 60 MODEL AT BILLY NAUGHTONS**

Looking every inch the shrunken XC90, Volvo has revealed the new XC60 at the Geneva Motor Show. The new XC60 will put Volvo right in the heart of the increasingly combative premium 4x4 sector, and it stands a chance of becoming the Swedish brand's biggest seller.

"We have a strong heritage in designing stylish and dynamic SUVs that offer the latest in technology. The new XC60 will be no exception. It's the perfect car for an active lifestyle, and it represents the next step in our transformation plan," said Håkan

Samuelsson, president and chief executive, Volvo Car Group. Prices for the new XC60 will start at  $\in$ 53,950 in Ireland when it arrives in the coming months, in time for 172 registrations.

Samuelsson outlined Volvo's wider model rollout that will see another small SUV, the XC40, launched inthe latter part of the year and then a mid-sized S60 saloon next year. He estimates the SUV/crossover format will represent two-thirds of the firm's sales.

#### Autonomous driving:

We've already covered the XC60's biggest innovation – an emergency system that takes control of the steering and prevents you hitting things (see here) and the Pilot Assist self-driving system, which is standard on the S90 and XC90, will be available optionally on the XC60. Samuelsson says that Volvo will have an



advantage in the autonomous age, given its reputation for safety. "It's a bit like getting into a car with a driver you don't know. You sometimes find yourself moving your feet like braking in the passenger seat. Volvo will have the benefit of being a brand you can trust to get you around safely."

However it will not be cheap. Autonomous options will add significantly to the price. While VW reckon in some instances it could double the price, Samuelsson was less committal but reckons the added cost will be seen as a worthwhile investment in return for greater productivity, particularly in the company fleet market.

#### **Plug-in hybrid:**

The new XC60 will also come as a pluginhybrid, using a development of the T8 twinengine system seen in the XC90. That powertrain has been a surprise hit for the brand, representing 15 per cent of sales of the firm's big SUV. Samuelsson expects a similar sale share for the new XC60.

Volvo claims that it has 407hp and a 0-100kmh time of just 5.3secs, and its CO2 emissions will be well under the 50g/km mark.

The rest of the engine range will mirror that of the XC90 and S90, with the 190hp D4 and 150hp D3 diesel engines being the primary ones for the Irish market, for now.

#### Styling:

Style-wise, the XC60 looks very much like a smaller XC90, with the same counter-sunk grille, the same "Thors Hammer" headlights and the potential for Volvo to be accused of following the same "cookie cutter" approach to styling that has plagued Audi, Mercedes and BMW of late. The cabin also lifts much from the XC90 and S90, but has a few more curves and surface changes on the fascia, so does look a little more distinctive. The centre screen boasts new functionality that makes it easier to control.

Given that the current XC60 makes up 30 per cent of Volvo's global sales, and that there seems to be an insatiable thirst for premiumbadge SUVs, this new car could soon be Volvo's best-selling model.

## HELP TO BUY (HTB) INCENTIVE

A first-time buyer of a house or apartment who purchases or self-builds a new residential property between 19 July 2016 and 31 December 2019 may be entitled to claim a refund of income tax and DIRT paid over the previous four tax years.

The first-time buyer must not have either individually or jointly with any other person (directly or indirectly), previously purchased, or built a property.

Where more than one individual is involved in purchasing or building a new home, all of the individuals must be first time buyers.

The property must have been purchased or built as the first-time buyers home. It does not include properties acquired for investment purposes.

The property must be occupied by the first-time buyer or at least one of the first time buyers in the case of multiple first time buyers for a period of five years from the date the property is habitable.

## Know Your Rights: RETIREMENT AGE

## **QUESTION**

My employer says that I have to retire when I reach the age of 65. Can an employer make you retire at a certain age?

## **ANSWER**

There is no single fixed retirement age for employees. If you are employed, your retirement age should be set out in your contract of employment. The usual retirement age in contracts of employment is 65.

Many contracts have provisions for early retirement from age 60 (or in some cases from age 55) and most have provision for early retirement on health grounds. Some occupations – for example, firefighters, An Garda Síochána and the Defence Forces – have provisions for earlier retirement.

While employment equality legislation prohibits discrimination on the grounds of age, employers are still allowed to set retirement ages in employment contracts. Since 1 January 2016, under the Equality (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 2015 an employer may set a compulsory retirement age if the employer can objectively justify the retirement age of an employee. This could be for health and safety reasons, for example, the physical demands and requirements of the job.

If an employee has reached the employer's mandatory age of retirement, this legislation provides that they may still be legitimately offered fixed-term contracts, provided that it is objectively justified. The provisions of the Protection of Employees (Fixed-Term Work) Act 2003 would still apply.




## **CYCLING TO A BETTER WORKFORCE**

Over half way through exams now it is essential to stay calm and keep positive. It is important to put your exams into perspective and remember that whilst the results will have a bearing on your future the results are not a measure of your worth. Be sure to continue eating a well-balanced diet, do some exercise and get sufficient sleep each night. If you are finding it difficult to cope or don't feel you have the necessary support, be sure to seek professional advice.

#### For Parents

It's important that your child knows that you are interested in their work. Tell them that they can only try their best and even if they don't do as well as they'd hoped, you still love them just as much. Whilst we're not suggesting bribery it's fine to provide small treats by way of encouragement – and be sure to celebrate the end of exams with a treat that everyone can look forward to, such as a meal out or a trip to the cinema.

Your sympathy and support is all important at this time – so recriminations about the past and 'I told you so' speeches will not be welcomed at this time. Professor Aidan Moran advises parents to "avoid doing post-mortems with your children after the exam – it's neither helpful nor accurate" (as students don't always remember what they wrote in an exam). He also states that "parents should praise their children for doing their best and for staying in the exam until it's over."

Continue to focus on the exams ahead reminding your teen that it's 'never too late, and a lot can be achieved in a short time'. Encourage them to continue trying and that it's worth 'having a go' and it will all be over soon.

Let them know that you love them unconditionally. Let them know that this time will pass and they will get through it. Let them know that no matter how the exams go, you will be there for them.



## TODAY IS THE 193RD ANNIVERSARY OF THE SETTING UP OF THE RSPCA

The Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (RSPCA) is a charity in England and Wales that promotes animal welfare. Since its founding in 1824, it has inspired the creation of similar, but independent, organisations in other countries, including the Scottish SPCA, ISPCA in Ireland, RSPCA Australia and the ASPCA in the USA.

The first anti-cruelty bill was introduced by Richard Martin MP, who later earned the nickname of 'Humanity Dick', leader of a group of twenty-two reformers. Also leading the group were William Wilberforce MP, who was already famous for his efforts to abolish slavery in the British Empire, and the Reverend Arthur Broome. The Act was passed in Parliament on 22 July 1822 and was against cruelty to farm animals, particularly cattle. The group assembled at the "Old Slaughters" Coffee House in London to create a society with the will and authority to enforce the new law. The SPCA, the first animal welfare society in any country was thus founded on 16 June 1824, and was subsequently granted its royal status by Queen Victoria in 1840.

## 3 REASONS YOU NEED EARTHWORMS IN YOUR GARDEN

Earthworms are strange little creatures, they are believed to be sightless and they have a body made up of rings surrounded by bristles which they compress and expand to move straight through the soil. They're pretty incredible too while they weigh on average only around onethirtieth of an ounce, they can regularly move two-ounce stones, which is about the same as a 150-pound human moving a 9,000-pound rock. \*Earthworms help create humus, which is a dark brown-black type of soil that holds important nutrients in place for plant growth and use. The worms feed on plant debris such as manure, grass, leaves and dead roots, as well as the soil. The digestive system of the worm concentrates the mineral and organic compounds in the food they consume, so their casts become richer in available nutrients including Nitrogen and Phosphorus than the soil around them.

\*Earthworms also improve drainage and prevent soil erosion and waterlogging, as their extensive channelling and burrowing help to loosen and aerate the soil and improve soil drainage. Research has found that soil with earthworms drain as much as 10 times faster than soil without earthworms. In zero-till soils, where worm populations are high, water infiltration can be up to 6 times greater than in cultivated soils. The tunnels they make also serve, under the influence of rain, as irrigation and gravity, as passageways for lime and other material.

\*When your soil has worm castings, they help to improve the structure and fertility of every type of soil, even on reclaimed land that has little or no topsoil. As the castings are water soluble, they have an immediate positive impact on plant growth. Research conducted on farms found that the most productive pastures contained up to 7 million worms per hectare, weighing 2.4 tons. They also discovered a close correlation between pasture productivity and total worm weight.

## **DO YOU CHEW GUM?**

Originally, gum was made out of chicle, a type of tree sap and a natural form of rubber. But after scientists created synthetic rubber, manufacturers also begin to replace natural rubber in gum with polyethylene and polyvinyl acetate. That means, if you chew gum, you're chewing on plastic – and, it could very well be toxic plastic as that as polyvinyl acetate is made using vinyl acetate which is a chemical that's been found to cause tumours in laboratory rats. When you throw out that used gum, you're also tossing out more plastic into the landfill.

## AN EASY WAY TO CLEAN A GLASS STOVE TOP

Wipe off all the lose debris with a towel. Then, soak rags in hot, soapy water and sprinkle baking soda over the cold stove top. Place the soaked rags on top of the glass surface and leave them there for 15-30 minutes. Come back, and left over debris should just wipe off.

## THREE-YEAR-OLD RAN OFF TOWARD NEIGHBOUR'S HOUSE

On a chilly February day in Gloucester, Virginia, Kelsea Spouse was at her mother's house to pick up her 3-year-old son, Jaxon Lopez. As she went to load her vehicle, the little boy followed her outside.

Around the same time, the neighbour next door was going through a frightening incident. She had started her day feeling ill and was walking downstairs to call for help. She suddenly collapsed in the kitchen and bumped her head pretty hard. The injured woman was able to make it to her garage, where she hoped someone would eventually come to her aid.

Ms. Spouse was wearing unplugged headphones when she heard Jaxon randomly mutter the word "help." She assumed he was just being a typical toddler mimicking something that he heard, but her son took off running toward the neighbour's house.

Ms. Spouse followed her son to see what the matter was and once she entered the neighbour's yard, she called out to see if anyone needed help and heard a faint response. She entered the garage

and saw the neighbour on the floor, bleeding. She quickly dialled 911 and asked Jaxon to go get his grandmother from the house.

'I said 'Ganny, neighbour's in trouble," Jaxon recalled later. His grandmother, Danette Lopez, was quite confused by the child's behaviour, so he grabbed her by the wrist and tried pulling her to the door. "I thought he was playing but I let him lead me to my neighbour's house" she said. The neighbour was taken to the hospital where she made a quick recovery, but Jaxon's good deed didn't just stop there. "I got neighbour flowers," he said.

The neighbour eventually returned back to work after the scary incident. Ms. Lopez said the woman was overwhelmed by her grandson's heroism and said "I couldn't have made it without him".

## HUMAN AND ANIMAL DOCTORS HELP AN ENDANGERED GORILLA GIVE BIRTH

After nearly 24 hours in labour, the Philadelphia Zoo and mom, Kira a 17-year-old western lowland gorilla, welcomed a new baby gorilla into the world. The baby was delivered Friday, June 2nd after a team of veterinarians and doctors intervened. This is Kira's first birth and the third baby sired by pack leader, Motuba. Gorilla labour is typically quick and the mother

shows few signs of stress or fatigue. Zoo staff noticed Kira looking tired Thursday night and her condition continued to worsen. In an effort to save Kira and her baby, she was brought to the zoo's veterinary hospital. There a team of doctors and vets, including an obstetriciangynaecologist and anaesthesiologist, put Kira under anaesthesia to give birth.

With the help of forceps, the doctors delivered a healthy five pound male gorilla. Kira slept off the anaesthesia while vets cared for the baby during his first hours of life, then Kira was officially united with her baby. She has taken to motherhood quickly, as she observed another gorilla at the Philadelphia Zoo give birth last August.

Kira also helped raise her three younger siblings, so zoo staff believes she is well-prepared. Motuba will play a protective role in the baby's life, and as the baby gets older engage in playtime.

In the wild, the western lowland gorilla is critically endangered. The Philadelphia Zoo, along with other zoos around the world is working with the AZA Species Survival Plan to manage the population. The largest threats to gorillas in the wild are poaching and diseases, such as the Ebola virus. Climate change and deforestation also play a role in damaging the gorillas' natural habitat.



and others. So often we are offended by people, holding un-forgiveness for things that have been done to us, and not forgiving ourselves for the mistakes we have made. Listen – God loves you friend. He has accepted you just as you are, and once you have asked Jesus to be Lord of your life you then receive the benefits He won for you at the Cross, but it's dependent on forgiveness (Psalm 103; Mark 11:22-25). It's time for you to forgive yourself and those who have hurt you, and release offences, shame and pain out of your life. The last part of that Scripture is the promise that He has given us a sound mind – that comes from knowing the Lord is in charge, no evil shall overcome us when we trust in Him, and that He has only good things planned for us (Psalm 91; Jeremiah 29:11). This coupled with living free from bitterness and offence is a recipe for a sound mind and total peace. More next week...
