

The Listry nurse was honoured at a gala ceremony at the Double Tree Hilton Hotel in Ballsbridge in Dublin.

Declan was chosen for the award after spending 40 minute doing CPR on a man who collapsed on the street while on holiday in Killarney.

58 year old Gabriel Divilly suffered a massive heart attack on High Street in Killarney in May 2014.

Thanks to the quick thinking of Declan's wife Tina who was on the scene, she contacted Declan and he was on the scene in minutes and with the help of Siobhan McAlister who worked in Sceil Eile on High Street, the pair kept working on Gabriel until the emergency services arrived.

The defibrillator used was put in place by the Michael Linehan Heartsafe group in Killarney. Earlier this year Gabriel and his wife Claire came to Killarney to meet the people who saved his life and a group including Declan and his wife Tina, Siobhan McAlister along with Siobhan and Han Linehan enjoyed dinner together.

Gabriel was also in attendance at the awards ceremony on Monday night.

After Declan received his award he said "its very special to get this award - it really is once in a lifetime. I feel very proud and it is in recognition of all nurses.

The award was presented to Declan by Mary Byrne and Linda Martin.

Declan is a nurse at University Hospital Kerry and lives in Listry with his wife Tina, sons Oisin and Fionn and daughter Luisne.

TOP VOCAL COACH MOVES TO KILLARNEY





THE ECLECTIC PICNIC IS BACK IN BEAUFORT

The fourth annual Threshing Cancer charity event on the farm of Brendan Ferris in Beaufort is due to take place on Sunday 25th September. Proceeds from the charity/club event raises money for Recovery Haven, the Oncology Unit at Kerry General Hospital & the Hospice Room at St. Joseph's Home, Killorglin. Since its inception in 2013, Threshing Cancer has raised €76,000 in total for its three beneficiaries. "Everyone is invited to join us by the River Laune but this unique occasion will be of particular interest to historians, teachers, the farming community and those with an interest in heritage and vintage machinery. The threshing event has proven to be popular with overseas visitors with tourists from 11 countries attending since 2013, impressed with the depth of heritage and culture on display. Threshing Cancer's largescale event encompasses 35 acres", Brendan Ferris told the Killarney Outlook. Along with the threshing equipment we will display three different rare balers from the early stages of baler invention. The connection between the agricultural activities of threshing and the food chain will be demonstrated as unique methods of corn grinding for flour and animal feed will take place as will bread-making and porridge-making from the flour and rolled oats produced. Straw produced in the threshing process is used in thatching houses, rope making and in personal dress for festivals. These

three applications will also be demonstrated on the day as will butter-making to accompany the bread. The event will incorporate guided tours and demonstrations of vintage threshing and agricultural machinery, working horses, and the secondary applications such as thatching. Traditional household artefacts such as butter churns and cream separators will be demonstrated & worked on the day. Threshing Cancer's fundraising day will have something for every member of the family. Live entertainment will play throughout the day along with a dog show and horse show-jumping. A whole host of novelty fundraising

activities for both adults and children such as Digger Bucket Swap, Air Suspension Ball and Sheaf Tossing are sure to test the skills of patrons. LIFE COULDN'T BE BETTER FOR SHIUBHAN

A Killarney woman is feeling on top of the world after losing 5.5 stone (35kg) with Slimming World in Killarney and has been crowned Woman of the Year 2016 District Finalist. Shiubhan Lewis from Muckross grasped her second chance with life after being diagnosed with Cancer in 2012.

Encouraged by her inspiration, her daughter Ide, Shiubhan joined Cheryl Kavanagh's Slimming World in The Brehon Hotel.

Here is her story....

"After I had my first child in 1977 I didn't put on any significant weight. That might have had to do with climbing down a cliff face during a camping holiday some weeks before the birth. "In those early years my husband and I led a very active life. Walking and climbing on Kerry hills, in woodlands, by lake and along the coast. Holidays cycling around the Beara Peninsula. Having a very distressed Brendan (our first) on the back of the bike in torrential rain on the way home from Sneem. Cycling every day during our lunch break.

"Three and four years later there were two further arrivals and my long story of getting heavier appeared to start. While this was very gradual by the time the children had reached First Communion age it was not a pleasant experience looking for something nice to wear. "Since the home birth of number five in 1987 it has been an uphill battle. My increasing weight effected everything I did.

"The difficulty and expense of buying clothes. Eating had become an addiction. My whole feeling of self worth. A particularly low point when I was told in the Post Office "congratulations, you're expecting another baby" - which I was not! "For most of 30 years

I have been joining slimming groups of various kinds. I would loose a stone. But then put it back on again ... and more. Disgusted with myself. "Right through these years I continued to enjoy getting out in the open. Down on the incredibly located beach at Dundag on the Muckross Lake. But I didn't swim with the children. Rowing to historic Innisfallen. But in stormy weather I was a passenger. When I motivated myself to go walking it was always hugely enjoyable. But now it had to be on the flat ... gardens, lakeside, in the woods on the beach. Mountains were a memory. Cycling was a dream of the past.

"Then in 2012 a culmination of health problems when I was diagnosed with thyroid cancer.

The fear was terrible, there were some awful experiences but the treatment and care were superb and after a year and a half I came through with flying colours.

"This was a second chance at life. Clearly I was now making life and death decisions.

"In June 2015 daughter Ide suggested we should try Slimming World. Although she had no significant weight problem she suggested otherwise. She and I would do this together.

"Then that historic day. Tuesday 7th July 2015 Ide collected me and we went along to our first Slimming World session in the Brehon.

"Over this past year I have had two guardian angels. Our leader Cheryl inspired with her own story, was endlessly helpful, her wit made everything enjoyable. Ide supported, cajoled, threatened. Anybody who says there are no angels doesn't know what they are talking about.

"There were blips. Putting on seven and a half pounds over Christmas and eight and

a half pounds over holidays. But always the encouragment from 'the two' "past is past ... we will get it off again". And we did. Now 35kgs lighter life has been transformed.

"These past months I have started to walk every evening with neighbours Colm and Kathleen as well as our dog and their two dogs. Walking to the foot of the mountain there is no puffing and panting. Mountains are a real possibility. Maybe even cycling the Ring of Kerry!

"Being told at every turn "you look great" ... "ten years younger" ... "fantastic" ... "you're husband better watch out" - though he doesn't believe that. LIFE COULDN'T BE BETTER.

Thank you Slimming World ... and those two guardian angels ... Ide & Cheryl.



SUCCESS AS SIX CHICKS FLEDGED IN KERRY

A total of six chicks fledged at five nests in counties Kerry, Cork and Galway making 2016 the most successful year to date for the reintroduction of this iconic but once extinct eagle. In total eight pairs nested and laid eggs in 2016 with five of these pairs rearing chicks.

To date 13 White-tailed Eagle chicks have fledged from nests in the wild in Ireland since the first successful nesting on Lough Derg near Mountshannon, Co. Clare, in 2013. Nesting in the wild is the next critical stage in the high profile reintroduction programme, which began in 2007 with the release of 100 young Norwegian eagles in Killarney National Park. The White-tailed Eagle reintroduction programme is managed by the Golden Eagle Trust in partnership with the National Parks and Wildlife Service of the Department of Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural & Gaeltacht Affairs.

The reintroduction programme shown real signs of progress since 2013 with expansion of the breeding population as far north as Galway and south into West Cork from the release site in Killarney. Perhaps most significant in 2016 was the first successful nesting in Co. Cork in over 120 years when a



pair successfully reared a chick at Glengarriff. On the contrary the eagle pair resident near Mountshannon, Co. Clare, failed to hatch eggs in 2016 after having successfully reared chicks every year since 2013. However, it's highly likely this pair will rear chicks successfully in 2017. The increase in the number of pairs fledging young and the number of chicks being produced is encouraging although some way yet from achieving the ultimate goal of the reintroduction project: a viable, self-sustaining breeding population. Over the coming years, it is hoped that the small breeding population will increase to fledge 10 chicks or more annually.

A NEW START WITH KERRY YOUTHREACH PROGRAMME

Kerry Youthreach Programme is a Partnership Programme between the Kerry Diocesan Youth Service (KDYS) and the Kerry Education and Training Board and facilitates young people out of school aged between 15 and 20 who would like a second chance at education. Here one of last year's students tells the Killarney Outlook about their experience of Youthrech in the KDYS.

I left school at the age of fifteen after I had been diagnosed with depression. I found it difficult to get along with my own peers and became very solitary. I got work in a local hotel and attended an ECDL course but I found it increasingly more difficult to cope with my depression.

I was growing tired of the hotel and had heard of a program called Youthreach running in the KDYS Killarney that offered an education to early school leavers and a way forward, something I badly needed. I rushed to get an interview and sat down with course co-ordinator John Adams, later on that same evening I was told I had a place on the program. The amount of support I was given over the next two years was astounding. My teachers at Killarney Youthreach were so friendly and helpful despite, I'm sure, how difficult I could be at times, they always helped me as much as they could. They ensured I received counselling from a high quality professional from next door (SouthWest Counselling) and helped me through numerous bad spells with depression, alcohol and unsuited medication provided by my GP. I remained shy through my years with them but my teachers gave me confidence and I slowly came out of my shell.

I was far from an ideal student and pulling a "sicky" on a Monday was not above me but I saw the course through and did very well. Well



enough to move on to a course in County Cork were I studied Social Studies. I did incredibly well and moved on to study Social Care in third level - University.

It was in Killarney Youthreach during work placement that I found I loved working with people in need and it helped give me purpose in life. Everywhere I went it was my own experience with my teachers in Youthreach and my worst moments that they guided me through that helped me excel and know just what to do in any circumstance. I'm currently living with my partner of two years, studying to be a care assistant. I've learnt to manage my depression without medication and instead through exercise, healthy living and music. I've completely come out of my shell thanks to Youthreach staff and have many close friends

who never seem to believe I would once just sit in a corner with a book rather than speak with anyone, instead they see a strong, confident person - who can be a little too out spoken, many would say, if only to make up for the quiet years!

Killarney Youthreach gave me back my life and I owe the staff every good thing that's happened since then as it was their time and effort that made it all possible for me.

Transition Year students at Killarney Community College participated in a Mindful Teens workshop with Harriet McGuigan an accredited psychotherapist (with Irish Association of Humanistic and Integrative Psychotherapists) recently. She worked with the TY students of Killarney Community College showing them new ways that they could support themselves to help keep some balance in their lives. Teenagers nowadays need support – sometimes they are distracting themselves through substance misuse, cyber bullying, online pornography, online gambling or self-harm to name but a few. Oftentimes they are doing this because they are trying to cope in their world and manage their lives.

Inspired by the quote 'When we know better we can do better' by Maya Angelou, Harriet created and runs the Mindful Teens Programme to inspire and plant a seed in the teenagers she comes into contact with. During the day they listened and often related to Harriet's story, they worked in small groups

and they got to practice and try out the art of different meditations. The group then chatted together about the challenges and what they enjoyed about taking some time out in a more supportive way. According to TY student Jordan O'Connor "I didn't know what the day was going to be like, I thought I wouldn't enjoy it as much as I did, it showed me how to relax and how to keep calm in situations".

According to TY co-ordinator Kerri McCarthy "It was a great start to our TY school term, by introducing mindfulness to our students it equips them with strategies to deal with stressful situations, nowadays students lead such busy lives and sometimes they nearly forget to breathe so by taking the time to meditate proved very worthwhile for them".

Cllr. Brendan Cronin, Mayor Killarney Municipal Area has welcomed the news that Irish water have confirmed finally the Kilcummin sewerage scheme will be connected to Killarney as originally requested and that this long overdue project is

progressing for the people of Kilcummin. In a statement from Irish water, the company

Irish Water is progressing the necessary studies as part of the preparation of a planning application for the Kilcummin Sewerage Scheme. The proposed project will involve the construction of approximately 8.5 kilometres of new foul sewers and a pumping station. The proposed new sewer network will be connected to the existing Killarney town sewer system and wastewater treatment plant.

This project will ensure that wastewater from Kilcummin is treated and discharged in compliance with the appropriate National and European standards.

It is expected that the planning application will be lodged before the end of this year.

Once submitted, the planning application may be inspected at the offices of the Planning Authority (Kerry County Council) and accessed online at www.kerrycoco.ie

Irish Water will continue to provide updates on this project in 2016 and will continue to liaise with all relevant stakeholders throughout this period.

MAJOR CHANGES IN KERRY UNDER NEW ROUND OF LEADER FUNDING

Potential applicants are being advised that there are major changes to the process involved in accessing LEADER funding under the new programme that is due to start in Kerry in October. Both South Kerry Development Partnership Ltd. (SKDP) and North, East & West Kerry Development (NEWKD) will be holding a series of public meetings in the coming weeks to advise those interested in applying for funding of the new requirements. Circa €10m is available under the new LEADER programme in Kerry which represents a 60% drop when compared to the last programme.

SKDP's public meetings will be held on Tuesday 20th in Killarney (Travel Inn) and Wednesday 21st in Killorglin (Library Place). All meetings start at 8pm.

Expressions of Interest from applicants will be sought for projects under the headings of Rural Tourism, Enterprise Development, Rural Towns and Basic Services when the programme opens in the county on the 3rd of October. Full details of the LEADER Programme and its operation will be given to potential applicants and both Development Companies are encouraging people to attend.



AUTUMN AND WINTER CONTAINERS.

Containers filled with permanent and seasonal plants can be very versatile as they can be moved anywhere in the garden at any time to brighten up any corner.

It is usually annuals that are planted in containers, but you can also plant them with most shrubs, grasses, herbaceous, perennials and even certain types of trees and conifers. Vegetables can also be grown in containers.

If you have an area in your garden you would love to screen-off but haven't got the earth to do it you can plant most climbers in containers, a good type of container for this is a quarter barrel as it can fit right up next to a wall or trailing.

As with all plants in containers, make sure that you water and feed regularly.

When choosing a terracotta container, make sure the label says frost proof rather than frost resistant as these can still crack in prolonged frost. There are also imitation terracotta pots made from plastic which are really very practical.

STAMP DUTY EXEMPTION TRANSFERS OF LAND TO YOUNG TRAINED FARMERS



This exemption from stamp duty is to encourage the transfer of farmland to a new generation of farmers with relevant qualifications. The transfer may be by way of gift or sale.

CONDITIONS: The farmer must be under 35 years of age on the date of execution of the deed of transfer and must also have attained one of the necessary qualifications. Where required, s/he must also be the holder of the appropriate certificate(s) awarded by the Qualifications and Quality Assurance Authority of Ireland (QQAAI) in respect of Teagasc approved training courses (previously awarded by the Further Education and Training Awards Council (FETAC)). The Young Trained Farmer must also, for a period of five years from the date of execution of the deed of transfer spend not less than 50% of his/her normal working time farming the land, and retain ownership of the land.

Transitional arrangements apply in relation to qualifications provided for under previous schemes. These arrangements apply where an academic qualification or a certificate in respect of a Teagasc approved training course, or both, was held before 2 April 2007.

KERRY O'SHEA looks back at Eamonn Fitzmaurice's reappointment as Kerry manager

Kerry Senior Football manager Eamonn
Fitzmaurice has been given a resounding vote
of confidence to continue as manager for
another two years by the Kerry GAA.
Fitzmaurice's ratification came at a recent
meeting of the Kerry GAA committee on the
recommendation of County Chairperson
Patrick O'Sullivan.

Speaking to the media Fitzmaurice admitted that he had little trouble in making his mind up on taking on the position again.

"I met with Patrick O'Sullivan after the Munster final and we discussed a fresh mandate for the following two years. We met again after the defeat by Dublin.

"The players are still buying into what I hope and want to achieve for Kerry. After the Dublin game I might have been questioning myself for a day or two but I was eager to continue." Born in 1977, the Pobal Scoil Corca Dhuibhne Teacher has guided Kerry to considerable success during his tenure in charge including a memorable win over Donegal in the 2014 All-Ireland SFC final.

A holder of three All-Ireland and two NFL Medals, Fitzmaurice has a unique collection of

Fitzmaurice made 48 senior championship appearances for Kerry during his nine-year career from 1997-2006 and has also played at Minor, U21 and Junior level for the county and has made 57 National League appearances. He has also played minor and senior hurling

for Kerry

At senior level, he has played under three Kerry managers-Paidi O'Se, Jack O'Connor and Pat O'Shea.

Under Fitzmaurice's watch, Kerry have won four Munster Senior titles and reached two All-Ireland finals, winning the 2014 decider against Donegal and losing out narrowly to Dublin last year.

Fitzmaurice's side have suffered just three championship defeats, all at the expense of Dublin.

He served in Jack O'Connor's backroom team following his retirement from inter-county football and was involved with the County U21s as manager for a period before assuming the Senior role in August 2012.

Since then, Kerry have qualified for either the All-Ireland semi-final or the final every year and have enjoyed an unbeaten run through Munster during his term in charge. Fitzmaurice has also enjoyed considerable success at Colleges level having guided Pobal Scoil Corca Dhuibhne through back to back All-Ireland Colleges SFC titles in 2014 and

SHANE RYAN (RATHMORE)

MATTHEW FLAHERTY (DINGLE)

Flaherty like Paul Murphy, he is equally adaptable in both defence and attack. He played a leading role in Kerry's march to All-Ireland glory at minor level in 2014 and is a definite for the notebook.

KILLIAN SPILLANE (TEMPLENOE)

A son of former Kerry great Tom Spillane, Killian was Kerry's leading scorer in their march to All-Ireland minor honours in 2014, finishing the campaign with 0-39 from 6 games. He Inspired Kenmare District to reach the semi-finals of the County SFC last year and continued his good form early in the season with Templenoe in their march to the All-Ireland Junior Club Championship. CONOR KEANE (KILLARNEY LEGION)

A Kerry minor in 2013, Keane showed tremendous form last year in the U21 ranks, scoring 1-7 against Cork in the Munster semi-final. In 2015, he played a leading part in Legion's march to the County SFC final.

CONOR GEANEY (DINGLE)

Another All-Ireland Colleges Medal winner with Pobal Scoil Corca Dhuibhne under Eamon Fitzmaurice and a cousin of Kerry seniors Paul and Mikey Geaney, Conor Geaney is a deadly poacher and scoretaker. A hard grafter, he was Kerry's leading scorer in the 2015 All-Ireland Minor campaign, compiling 4-27 with 2-4 of that total alone coming in the All-Ireland final decider against Tipperary where he gave a superb display and man of the match performance.

JASON FOLEY (BALLYDONOGHUE)

A key member of last year's all-conquering minor team, Foley continued his excellent form this year in the Junior ranks with an impressive showing against Mayo in the decider in Croke Park. He is a natural full-back, mobile, pacey and athletic.


SOUTHERN GAELS BLOW BEAUFORT OFF THE SCALE

EVEN THE CATS IN WHITEHALL ARE **DISAGREEING:**

In February 2011 Larry was adopted from Battersea Dogs and Cats Home and installed as No 10's Downing Street's in order to control the mouse population there. Chief executive Claire Horton at the time described Larry as being very interested in toys, particularly mousey-type toys.

In 2012 Police were forced to step in to break up a fight between Larry the Downing Street cat and his next door neighbour Freya, First Cat of the Treasury. Freya was exiled to the countryside shortly after this event.

In April 2016 the Foreign Office adopted a cat named Palmerston also from Battersea Dogs and Cats home. In July of this year Larry who obviously doesn't believe in "Love thy neighbour as thyself" limped back to Number 10 after a particularly vicious fight with Palmerston, but after veterinary attention made his triumphant return to Number 10. A spokesperson for Downing Street said that the cost of Larry's treatment was covered by donations from Number 10 staff.

And still later in the month Palmerston took his Downing Street ambitions further by sneaking in to Theresa May's new residence while no one was looking, the black-andwhite cat, was immediately evicted by police officers.

David Cameron was disappointed to have to leave Larry behind saying "Sadly I can't take Larry with me, he belongs to the house and the staff love him very much - as do I."

Before Larry, the last Prime Minister's cat to live on Downing Street was Humphrey, who retired in 1997 when the Blairs moved in.

SOLAR **OVENS** ARE CHANGING LIVES IN THE **DOMINICAN REPUBLIC:**

Forty-one percent of people in the Dominican Republic are living under the national poverty line, according to a 2013 national labour force survey. Petroleum and products made from it, such as propane, are a top import to the island nation, and propane accounted for about \$3.72 million in imports in 2014, says the United Nations. Purchasing gas for cooking takes a toll on most families in the country because of their limited incomes. Families who are even further into poverty use wood as a cheaper cooking material. Inhaling the smoke or standing over the fire can damage

Rick Jost, the organisation's director, hopes solar oven use will allow people in the Dominican Republic to save money to better their quality of life and reduce the risks of cooking with wood.

The organisation reported between 200 and 250 solar ovens sold in the Dominican Republic between August 2015 and July 2016. Each oven costs 1,000 pesos, or about \$22. Although funding to build and transport the ovens comes entirely from donations in the United States, the purchase price goes toward running the workshops throughout the country.

Solar Oven Partners worked in Haiti for 14 years before starting in the Dominican Republic in 2015. The organisation sold and distributed almost 10,000 ovens there. The money saved from purchasing other cooking materials can go toward more nutritious meals, medical care, and sending children to school.

SOUVENIR BUYERS ARE **DOOMING A 500-MILLION-**YEAR-OLD CREATURE:

Humans have for centuries coveted the chambered nautilus for its elegantly spiralled shell. But too much beauty can be a dangerous gift. We buy nautilus shells in unbelievably huge numbers, mostly to gather dust as knickknacks. As a result, chambered nautilus populations appear to be crashing in their deep-sea Indo-Pacific habitat.

Nautilus shells are sold by the basketful in Hawaii tourist shops for as little as €4.50 apiece. If someone has bothered to polish the shells to bring out their pearliness, the price may go up to €8 apiece. You can also get them on Amazon for €23, and the higher-quality ones sought by serious collectors can sell for upwards of €90.

Most of the nautilus catch now comes from the Philippines. With other fisheries there depleted, fishers now set traps 1,000 feet deep to harvest the nautilus but for all the work put into it, the catch has declined 80% since the 1980s.

Most people, on both the buying and selling

sides, have little grasp of what they are dealing in. The nautilus is a cephalopod, related to the squid and the octopus, and people think of squid and octopus being quick to reproduce, but the chambered nautilus is not calamari: Recent research has demonstrated that it is rare in the wild and takes about 15 years to reach sexual maturity.

One other factor makes large-scale commercial exploitation misguided: The nautilus has survived largely unchanged for half a billion years and is thus older than almost anything else alive on Earth. Somehow this type of organism—the ammonoids and nautilus—have lived for 500 million years and have survived five mass extinctions, and now humans are wiping them out

Later this month, a conference in South Africa will take up the question of what to do about it. Four nations, including the United States, have proposed protecting the nautilus under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species. A CITES II listing would not ban the trade but would sharply limit it.

The Centre for Biological Diversity has also petitioned the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to protect the chambered nautilus under the Endangered Species Act, which would completely end imports. (The nautilus is found in American Samoa, a U.S. territory. But its range extends from Indonesia to the Philippines.)

DOG IN VANCOUVER HOSPITAL TRACKS ANTIBIOTIC RESISTANT **SUPERBUGS:**

Clostridium difficile, or C. diff, is one of the most common strains of antibiotic-resistant bacteria. It makes its home on previously sterilized surfaces, then reproduces when a human comes in contact with its spores. The CDC estimates C. diff kills as many as 15,000 people from digestive tract infection every year, and while medical facilities have been ineffective in slowing its spread, they have

found a means of detecting it.

It took a year and a half of extensive training, but now certified by the Canadian Ministry of Health and outfitted with a hospital ID. Angus. a two-year-old English Springer Spaniel, is walking Vancouver General Hospital's floors on the hunt for C. diff.

"We strive to continue to find ways to provide better care, and sometimes the answer is not more technology, but instead, man's best friend," said Canadian Health Minister Terry Lake.

Angus is the first dog in Canada certified to detect infectious disease. It was actually a C. diff infection that brought him and his owner and trainer Teresa Zurberg together. Shortly after being treated for a leg wound, Ms. Zurberg began losing weight dramatically, almost died and hospitalised for a week.

Teresa's husband, Markus Zurberg, read about a dog in Amsterdam who was trained to sniff C. diff. He relayed the idea to Teresa, who works as a trainer for bomb and drugdetecting dogs.


Angus now helps the Vancouver General Hospital find and eliminate C. diff with as much as 99.99% certainty, then a specialised cleaning robot is directed to the contaminated areas for additional cleaning with ultraviolet light.

"Angus is just as vulnerable to infection as the rest of the humans in the hospital, but regular veterinary check-ups to make sure he is healthy will substantially lessen that risk" said Dr. Elizabeth Bryce, medical director for infection control with Vancouver Coastal Health.

And of course apart from finding infectious diseases, dogs have been providing comfort to hospital patients for decades now.

Did you know that Kiwi eggs take up about 25 percent of the mother's body, making it the largest egg of any bird, relative to its mother's body size. But laying an enormous egg has its benefits; the chick is almost ready to live on its own once it hatches.



BOOSTER SEATS

15kg upwards (from approx. 4 years)

Booster seats are light, easy to fit and popular with children. A happy child is less likely to distract you while you are driving.

There have been significant changes in this group and group 3 over the past few years as child seat manufacturers have developed seats to protect your child in a side impact as well as in a frontal crash. One in four crashes involves side impact so this is an important development.

In the past you might have thought in terms of a shallow-backed booster seat where the back can be removed to convert it to a booster cushion for older children.

Now the market is dominated by adjustable, high back boosters – seats with deep side wings the height of which can be adjusted to provide side impact protection until the child reaches 12 years or 135cm tall.

FEATURES

The adult lap and diagonal seat belt restrains both the child and seat – there's no integral

harness for the child.

In some cases the seat back can be removed and the remaining base used as a simple booster cushion. While it's true to say that a booster cushion is better than an adult belt alone they don't offer any protection against side impact so are best used only for occasional trips where it's not convenient to use the full-sized seat. Some 'booster seats' incorporate a removable, integral five—point harness so that they can be used for the younger weight range too. Look for seats marked Groups 1, 2, and 3. Look for seats with a wide range of head support adjustment and good protection against side impact

FITTING TIPS

- The diagonal part of the belt should lie across the child's shoulder, not against the neck.
- The lap part of the belt should lie across the top of the child's thighs, not around the abdomen.
- Belts should lie flat on the child avoid twists, which can increase the loads on the

child in a crash.

- Never pass the diagonal part of the belt under the child's arm.
- Static rather than automatic seat belts must be used for children under three years (i.e. At the lower end of the weight range). Don't worry if you have automatic belts fitted though, many now have a so-called ALR/ELR facility that allows them to be 'converted' to static operation. Check your car's handbook.
- Many seats come with a locking device that effectively converts your belts to static operation. The locking device often acts as a belt guide too, allowing you to adjust the angle and height of the diagonal part of the belt to suit your child's height.
- Booster seats generally suffer less from compatibility problems in relation to the car's seat belt design and geometry compared with two-point mounting seats. They are easier to fit and more likely to be fitted correctly.

QUESTIONS ON DRINK-DRIVING TO BE ADDED TO DRIVER THEORY TEST FROM 10 OCTOBER



The Road Safety Authority (RSA) has announced that from Monday 10 October, questions on drinking and driving will be added to the Driver Theory Test for the Motorcycle, Car and Works Vehicles Driver Theory Test. This is in direct response to a report issued by the RSA earlier this year which showed that drink-driving is still a significant road safety issue, particularly among some young people.

The main Driver Theory Test Question Bank will have 17 new questions on alcohol and driving. Two of these questions will be presented in each of the changed tests from 10 October 2016. The overall format of the test will not change. Learning material on the new

questions is available at **www.theorytest.ie**Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport Shane
Ross TD said:

"Learning to drive is an exciting, formative time. For many people, this is when safe and positive attitudes to driving are established. Therefore it's critical that we reinforce key road safety behaviours at every stage of the learning to drive process, from theory to practice. The addition of drink-driving as a subject area in the first stage, the Driver Theory Test, will help to remind learner drivers that this behaviour is unsafe, irresponsible and destroys lives."

The RSA Pre-Crash Report on Alcohol showed that between 2008 and 2012, alcohol was a factor in 38% of fatal collisions, claiming the lives of 286 people. 43% of drivers killed who had consumed alcohol were between 16 and 24 years old and 57% of motorcyclists killed who had consumed alcohol were between 25 and 34 years old.

Moyagh Murdock, Chief Executive of the Road Safety Authority (RSA) said it was vital that young people understand the consequences of driving under the influence of alcohol, no matter how little the amount consumed.

"The report we issued earlier this year dispels the myth that this killer behaviour is a thing of the past. It's not - it is very much still present in communities throughout the country. What's even more worrying is the number of young people who are dying on our roads because of alcohol. We need to use every opportunity we can to help new drivers to understand the dangers and consequences of drinking and driving."

Candidates are advised to use the current versions of the supporting learning materials (The Official Driver Theory Test - Book and CD, 5th or 6th Edition) in addition to the PDF with information on the new section related to drink-driving. The PDF is available on www. theorytest.ie and www.rsa.ie







LONELINESS

As social beings, we are hard wired to connect and most of us feel the need for rewarding social contact and relationships. Loneliness is the feeling we get when our need for this type of contact is not met. Loneliness of course is not the same as being alone. We may choose to be alone and live very happy lives without much contact with others. Or indeed we may have much social contact, be constantly surrounded by people, and yet feel very lonely. Loneliness can have a significant impact on our mental health and can contribute to mental health problems, such as anxiety and depression. Loneliness can have many different causes and affects people in different ways. Some people feel lonely due to their personal circumstances (e.g moving to a new area, loss or bereavement). For others however, loneliness can be a deeper more constant feeling that comes from within.

Connecting with the World around us can be a great way to combat loneliness. This may be having a small conversation with the cashier when we pay for our groceries or saying hello to someone we meet in the street. Phoning or sending an email to family and friends can be a good reminder that we do have people in our lives.

Our brain can try to make sense of the feeling of loneliness by telling us things such as 'It is because nobody loves me' or 'There is something wrong with me' These thoughts are not facts - and can make us feel worse. Thus it is important to accept how we are feeling without overreacting. When we feel lonely, the tendency might be to withdraw into ourselves and this can be counterproductive. The healthiest thing to do if we are feeling lonely is to reach out and cultivate friendships. Reaching out can be difficult and at times we will resist it. However, think of it in the way you might approach exercising - whilst we may feel tired or lazy it is a beneficial thing to do.

We need to tackle loneliness one step at a time. It may involve finding a new hobby or joining a club or exercise class. Another skillful way to combat feelings of loneliness is to volunteer as it's a great way to meet new people and also to learn new skills.

Loneliness is a profoundly human emotion and a signal that our need for connection is going unmet. Next week we will discuss loneliness in Older Adults and explore ways we can tackle this.

Know Your Rights:

PATERNITY BENEFIT

My partner and I are expecting a baby in September. Can I claim the new Paternity Benefit? Are there any other benefits I can claim?

ANSWER

Paternity Benefit is a new payment for employed and self-employed people who are on paternity leave from work and covered by social insurance (PRSI). The PRSI classes that count for Paternity Benefit are A, E, H (with the exception of serving members of the Defence Forces) and S (self-employed).

Paternity Benefit is paid for two weeks (in one block) and is available for any child born or adopted on or after 1 September 2016. You can start paternity leave at any time within the first 6 months following the birth or adoption placement. If you are already getting certain social welfare payments, then you may get half-rate Paternity Benefit.

You must notify your employer four weeks before you intend to go on paternity leave (12 weeks if you are selfemployed). You must provide proof of the expected date of birth (this is a certificate from your spouse's or partner's doctor confirming when the baby is due) or confirmation of the birth if you are applying after the baby has been born. In the case of adoption, you must produce a certificate of placement.

Paternity Benefit is available from 1 September 2016. You can apply online at mywelfare.ie for Paternity Benefit from 5 September 2016 (your payment will be backdated if necessary). You must have a Public Services Card to apply for Paternity Benefit.

You can also claim up to 18 weeks of unpaid parental leave from work (until your child's eighth birthday - or 16th if they have a disability). Both parents have a separate entitlement to 18 weeks' parental leave.




