Time to go Up the Hill for Jack & Jill

Kerry People urged to take on a hill for Jack and Jill this October

Every day can be an uphill challenge for Jack and Jill families and, this October, the charity is urging people to climb or walk a local hill in solidarity with the 11 Kerry families currently under its care as part of the eighth annual Up the Hill for Jack and Jill fundraising challenge, proudly supported by Abbott.

This is a significant year for the Jack and Jill Children's Foundation, as it celebrates 25 years of funding and providing specialist in-home nursing care and respite support for children with severe to profound neurodevelopmental delay, up to the age of six. This includes children who may have a brain injury, cerebral palsy, a genetic diagnosis or other undiagnosed condition. Another key part of the service is end-of-life care at home for all children up to the age of six who require it, irrespective of diagnosis.

The nationwide charity has reached its own summit in 2022 by providing support to 412 children, the highest number in its 25-year history. Indeed, Jack and Jill has provided support to 76 Kerry families since it was first established. To meet its steep care commitment, the charity is asking people across Kerry to support local families in their community by going Up the Hill for Jack and Jill.

With Jack and Jill, there is no means test, no waiting list and no unnecessary red tape. The core nursing team devises a home nursing care plan that is tailored around the child and the family's needs, with the charity funding and providing up to 80 hours' support each month. Jack and Jill's funding model relies heavily on public donations to mobilise over 500 nurses and carers at community level and, in 2021, they delivered almost 110,000

hours of in-home nursing care and respite support.

Jack and Jill Liaison Nurse Manager for Kerry, Siobhan Reen, says every parent needs a break: "It's a privilege to be a part of the lives of Jack and Jill families. These are ordinary parents facing the extraordinary care needs of a child with a complex medical condition; a child who may not be able to walk or talk, who may be tube-fed or oxygen-dependent, requiring intensive, around-the-clock care, at home. But everyone needs a break, and that's where we come in, literally, into the home, to give them relief and we are very proud to walk this care journey with them."

Siobhan Reen, Jack and Jill Children's Foundation liaison nurse manager for Kerry, who is urging people to go Up the Hill for Jack and Jill during the month of October. The Foundation, which this year celebrates 25 years providing specialist in-home nursing care and respite support for children with life-limiting conditions, supports a total of 11 families in County Kerry. Part of KERRY'S SPORTING HISTORY RETURNS

A fascinating part of Kerry's sporting history has returned to Killorglin in the form of two albums of newspaper cuttings put together in the 1950s by Gillian Mangan, younger sister of the legendary Kerry cyclist, Gene Mangan.

At an event at Killorglin Library on September 13th, Gillian donated the albums to Kerry Library who will hold them for public access in the Kerry Local History & Archives in Tralee. Gillian's collections begin in 1954 when Gene was 17 years old and becoming prominent in cycling circles: 'I was seven years younger than Gene and he was a hero in my eyes. I got all the papers and cut out anything to do with Gene and stuck them into old account books. I'm delighted that they will now be preserved of use for future generations and I'd like to thank the library for hosting them'.

Gene became a national sporting sensation in 1955 by winning the Rás Tailteann at the age of 18. Apart from documenting Gene's early career, the albums also record the glory-days of Kerry cycling in the 1950s and 60s that also include Paudie Fitzgerald's Rás win in 1956 and Mick Murphy's in 1958, as well as the all-important Kerry team wins. A large collection of newspaper cuttings relating to Kerry cycling kept by the Mangan family has also been donated.

In addition, they also include cuttings and pictures of ordinary club races and riders and they are highly evocative in giving a wonderful sense of the cycling scene and the people involved in Kerry at the time.

Speaking on behalf of the library, Kerry County Librarian, Tommy O'Connor, thanked Gillian for her donation which will be preserved in a public archive for the use of future generations and he noted that it will supplement the very scarce copy of Gene's biography that Kerry Library holds -'The Gene Mangan Story' which was written by Seán O'Neill and was published in 1959.

The event was also attended by Mary Concannon, a representative of Killorglin Cycling Club and she also paid tribute to Gene – 'Gene left Kerry in the 1950s for work and eventually settled in Dublin but he has had a life-long loyalty to Kerry cycling and in particular to his original club in Killorglin. He has always been a wonderful supporter and has contributed to Killorglin and Kerry cycling in numerous ways down through the years. We would like to thank Gillian for this donation – it will be highly interesting for everyone with an interest in our sporting heritage and an important part of the town's history'.

Also in attendance was Tom Daly from Killarney who is Vice-President of Cycling Ireland. Tom said that Gene was a significant figure in the history of Irish cycling from both a racing and administration point of view – he was also President of the National Cycling Association for a period and also noted that 'Gene has previously donated important material related to the history of Irish Cycling to the Irish Cycling Archive at the UCD Archives but it is entirely appropriate that this material, related to his Kerry roots, should stay in Kerry'.

The albums and related collection of newspaper cuttings can be viewed at Killorglin library during September and thereafter in the Kerry Local History & Archives at Library Headquarters in Tralee.

CHASING KING CHARLES **AROUND KILLARNEY**

After hours shadowing the man who is now King Charles during his visit to Killarney four years ago, I feel intimately connected with all things royal.

So last week's news of the Queen's death brings sadness. It is one of the few remaining privileges these days of the news journalist in the regions - one minute you are covering the coronation of a goat in Killorglin and next you are beside the King of England in-waiting.

I was alongside him as he listened to a traditional session in an old farmhouse and saw him signs a visitor's book in the big house that both his great grandmothers once visited!

I therefore devoured all the royal coverage across the media last week. The one that struck me most was the editorial in the French daily Le Figaro. Their analysis was precise and their view very different to the English press. The late Queen 's death had brought a rush of emotion from all over the world, Figaro said. Her qualities were dignity, loyalty to history and long term vision Figaro found. "But above all else was her refusal to be governed or to allow herself to be governed by her emotions", it said.

At the same time Sky News and English broadcasters were hailing how "emotional" Charles was. An emotional man is how they described him in terms of his greatest virtue and what he would bring to the throne.

Being able to rein in her emotions was the classic virtue of the queen in French terms, being able to be reigned by his emotions was in English speaking media terms the quality of the new King.

There was more than a cultural gap here, and I wondered about it. Ever since Diana, bleeding heartism in public is considered the greatest virtue for a royal.

But I wondered were they right about an emotional King Charles.

That day in Killarney, I didn't see emotion so much as intelligence and curiosity and good humour in the savvy Prince. Nothing escaped him. He even directed the photograph be taken with the lake not the house in the background -"You want this view!" is what he said.

Up in the farms he quizzed the basket maker and chair maker. He even asked how Muckross came by his great grandmother's brooch. (For

a moment I thought there might be a diplomatic issue).

Back in Killarney House, after a very packed itinerary all day from Derrynane to Tralee to Muckross with hardly a break even for a cup of tea you might have expected a tired Charles and an even more tired and frozen Camilla to lash out during a long session at Killarney House. But there wasn't a sign of the emotion that often comes with tiredness!

There was patience and perseverance and the new King may be more his mother's son and less the bleeding heart than the English realise. At least that was my impression chasing Prince Charlie around Killarney.

Long may he reign as King! Who knows, given he has such interest in the provenance of brooches, and that he was awarded the Order of Inisfallen, we may get him on side for the return of the annals and the Mangerton Lunula.

CITIZENS INFORMATION CENTRES NEED POLITICAL BACKING

There is much anxiety over the decision to reduce voluntary effort at Citizen's Information Centres throughout the country.

Traditionally drop in, these important centres manned by highly trained were mostly and highly discreet volunteers advised on everything from pension entitlements to penalty points. People under great stress were put at ease by the friendliness and effectiveness of these kind of encounters.

Alas the decision now by the board is to effectively get rid of volunteers and replace them with professionals and to reduce public contact to mere telephone calls. Why is the big auestion.

For far too long we are growing too specialised in this country and very few people can join the dots anymore or look outside their specialist area.

"citizens" chief executive Fiona Coyne The said that queries from the public have become more "complex", and that the manner in which people engage with the service has "changed considerably" since the pandemic.

"What we're seeing is more complex queries and people are coming in with multiple queries," she said on RTE.

"People are coming in with very complicated issues, in relation to things like employment or family law, where they might need to be referred

on to the Workplace Relations Commission", Ms Covne added.

"We really don't feel that it's fair to expect that all volunteers would be able to do that," she said

I wonder though if Ms Coyne is really saying is the board is afraid of being sued. I have put queries in but the service has not responded.

A great many centres have not reopened after Covid and this includes Killarney. Face to face meetings have to be arranged and are I am reliably told these are not easy to get. Volunteers have been treated very badly and some have not been contacted or asked to return post Covid Social Democrats TD Jennifer Whitmore has said of the situation around the country

The Killarney Drop in centre was a lifeline for one widow who contacted me. She and others - particularly those unfamiliar with computers are extremely upset at the apparent decision not to reopen the Killarney Office at Beech Road. Could a bit of pressure be put on our politicians locally?

There was an air of shock and sadness when word filtered through on Wednesday last that Fr. Florian Farrelly lost his life in a traffic accident in Newcastlewest on his way to Killarney.

The 87 year old was travelling from Donegal when the accident happened.

Fr. Florian was a hugely popular member of the Francisan Friary when he was based here during the 1980's and spent a lot of his time at the Friary, who were expecting him on the evening of his accident.

Speaking to the Killarney Outlook, Br. Pat from the Friary in Killarney said that it was with great sadness they received the news that our brother Florian Farrelly was tragically killed in a car accident on the N21 road at Ballingowan, Newcastle west on Wednesday 7th September. He was 87 years old and a member of the Rossnowlagh fraternity. May his good and generous soul rest in the peace of Christ.

John Farrelly was from Sutton, Co Dublin. He joined the friars in 1953 and received the religious name, Florian. He celebrated his Franciscan Profession the following year. After studies in Galway and Rome he was ordained to the priesthood in Rome in 1961. His younger brother Paschal (Michael) also joined the Franciscans and predeceased him in 2000.

During his long and fruitful ministry Florian lived in many of our friaries in Ireland beginning with Waterford. He spent an extended period in Drogheda friary where he was guardian. He was also appointed guardian here in our Friary in Killarney for 6 years up till 1990 also

GRADES ADJUSTMENT KEEPS POINTS VERY COMPETITIVE AS A **RECORD 57,296 APPLICANTS RECEIVE A COLLEGE OFFER IN ROUND ONE**

1,902 traditional Leaving Cert candidates swept up a copious supply of college courses when CAO Round One offers were released last Thursday. There was joy unconfined as a large majority of Kerry's CAO applicants received a college offer. Acceptance of the offer, of course, is predicated on a student's' ability to finance the course and to secure accommodation in difficult times. Any student who is forced to defer or refuse a higher education course due to lack of finance and/or accommodation will be absolutely devastated.

HIGH POINTS

The 2022 Leaving Cert grades were kept at the highly inflated grades levels of 2021. Consequently, points requirements for many courses remain very high for the third consecutive year. Since the last standard Leaving Cert exam in 2019, there has been an overall average grades inflation of 8.5%. More significantly, the percentage of high grades awarded has substantially risen since 2019. The consequence has been that many CAO applicants needed a much higher points score this year to secure a course that was offered at reasonable points in 2019.

BLUE RIBAND DEMAND

1,056 extra college places were offered this year in order to stabilise the points. However, because of the keen competition for the blue riband courses, the points for places on these indemand college courses remained at last year's dizzy heights. A final CAO application figure of 84,420, meant keen competition across many courses. 2,505 applicants applied to CAO from County Kerry. That's a 3% increase on the 2021 figure of 2,424.

POINTS PROFILE

The overall points profile is similar to last year. Points have increased again for some of the hotly contested courses, while many courses were offered on points level that are fairly similar to last year. Primary teaching and nursing have shown a slight easing in points requirements this year, but are still very high. While the majority of the 48,651 applicants to the CAO from the 2022 Leaving Cert class, along with the 2020 and 2021 Leaving Cert classes, had the points to meet the course requirements, it left many candidates who presented previous years' Leaving Cert results struggling to secure a college place. **INCREASED OFFERS**

57,296 CAO applicants received at least one of the 85,894 courses on offer on Thursday afternoon. The offers consisted of 51,807 at Level 8 and 34,087 at Level7/Level 6. Offers are issued independently in respect of the two lists (Level 8 and Level 7/Level 6), so that 28,598 applicants received two offers, one from each list.

GOOD NEWS

The collective good news is that of the 51,807 applicants who were offered a Level 8 course 27,947 (54%), received their first preference and a very impressive 42,268 (82%) received one of their top three preferences. Of the 34,087 applicants who were offered a Level 7/Level 6 course, 30,354 (89%) received their first preference and a whopping 33,559 (98%) received one of their top three preferences. So, despite the high points, the 2022 Class has delivered the goods.

JOBS MATTER

The overriding conclusion from the points' trends is that CAO applicants were totally focussed on the jobs market. They applied in large numbers for courses with strong employment growth. UCC's flagship Biological and Chemical Sciences degree again hit the heady heights of 553 points, while its Engineering degree has jumped from 499 points to 510. Physiotherapy at the University of Limerick came in at 601* points again this year. Primary Teaching at Mary Immaculate College Limerick is down from 522 points to 509 and MTU Tralee's excellent General Nursing Degree dropped from 463 points to 433. Health Science courses remain very popular putting them beyond the points' totals of most CAO applicants. Dentistry at UCC, for example, requires a staggering 625* points again this year - a perfect Leaving Cert exam result!

HEALTHY DEVELOPMENT

School leavers continue to rush to college in unprecedented numbers. The steady flow also

WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR PENSION & WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?

You can normally get access to your pension from age 60, a lot of the rules depend on whether you are an employee or self employed. If you are coming close to retirement then you are probably wondering what options you have when you want to get access to your pension. It depends on what type of pension you have but generally there are four options:

Tax Free Cash: Most people will be entitled to a tax free lump sum, the amount varies however generally you will get at least 25% of the value of your pension in a tax free cash lump sum.

Taxable Cash: You may also be able to take sum of your pension in taxable cash.

Annual Pension: This is a guaranteed income usually paid monthly for the rest of your life that is purchased with the money left after your tax free lump sum, this is subject to taxation.

Approved Retirement Funds: You may be entitled to keep some of your money in an approved retirement fund, money can be taken from the fund to give you a regular income, usually monthly. This is subject to taxation also. Taxation at retirement is often much lower than when you are working. It is extremely important that you take your time and have all the options explained to you in plain simple English and that you understand all your options clearly before you make your final decision. As well as the above there is much more to be discussed about your pension. You should discuss your retirement options with a financial advisor who has access to a number of different pension providers before making any decisions, he or she will help you with the above options and any other gueries you may have.

WHAT IS A CATARACT?

A cataract happens when the lens within your eye becomes cloudy. It can happen to all of the lens or just part of it. There are different types of cataract, but the most common is agerelated cataract, which is more common in people over 65. It can be found to some degree in almost all older people.

Risk factors

Age is the biggest risk factor for developing cataracts. Apart from age, smoking increases the risk of cataracts and often causes the cataract to develop earlier and more quickly. Excessive exposure to sunlight and ultraviolet light can increase the speed at which cataracts develop. In some cases, people are born with cataracts.

Symptoms

Cataracts can cause your vision to become cloudy and less clear. You may notice that you're more easily dazzled by vehicle headlights, or that objects appear less colourful. Cataracts don't cause eye pain or make your eyes red

TREATMENT

At first following a sight test we may be able to prescribe new glasses that will help with changes to your vision caused by the cataract. When this no longer helps you to see well enough, the only effective treatment is surgery. Surgery is usually only recommended once the cataract is causing problems with everyday activities, such as driving, watching television and reading.

Cataract surgery improves the vision of nearly all patients and has one of the highest success rates of all surgery. If you experience blurred or cloudy vision you should have a sight test.

GROUP ONE Kenmare Shamrocks 0-17 Shannon Rangers 1-10

It was an open secret that Shannon Rangers were struggling a bit for numbers. Everyone, including myself, thought that this one was going to be a foregone conclusion. We were wrong, and I'm delighted for it. Shannon Rangers put up a great battle here and proved that there's no lack of heart in North Kerry football Kenmare led by 0-7 to 0-3 at the break, having just scored two from play in total (Shannon Rangers hadn't scored from play at all). Shannon Rangers opened the second half with a Cillian Langan penalty before he got their first point from play. Cat among the pigeons now! At the end of the third quarter, Shannon Rangers were in front - and deserved it. Kenmare's response says something about them, though, and is a reminder why Stephen O'Brien and Seán O'Shea are nominated for All Stars. O'Brien really took the game by the scruff of the neck - we all know how hard he is to stop in possession with his speed and low-gravity zig-zags, but I'd forgotten just how accurate he is. I hadn't forgotten Sean's famous free against Dublin (will we ever forget it? Let's hope not) but they were plenty of reminders of that too as he closed the game out with dead ball accuracy. Shannon Rangers will and should be very proud of their defiance of the odds and their proof of character. Kenmare took a while to answer the hard questions, but a good test will stand to them down the road as well.

Dr. Crokes 2-14 St. Kierans 0-14

I saw St. Kierans as having a real rattle at the latter stages and, despite the lack of preparation time, I expected this to be a ferocious test of Dr. Crokes' credentials. It was, too, but they passed with flying colours. The most recent Kerry kingpins – second only to the great Mitchels' team of the early sixties and arguably the Tralee Mitchels outfit that became Stacks, Rahillys, and Mitchels, sent out a real message here. Take the likes of Gavin White and Micheal Burns (who has been playing fabulous stuff recently)....I thought that a physically strong

St. Kierans' side might be a bridge too far. The thing is, Crokes have a few young players who might not be able to walk on water just yet, but they are plenty comfortable swimming! I still remember the young lad thrown in at corner forward away back in 2000 as they won the County Championship, I was worried the crathur of a child would get hurt. It turned out that Mike Cooper's youngest lad had an inkling about football! Fionn Fitzgerald, Brian Looney, and Mark O'Shea led the way as Crokes opened up a 0-9 to 0-3 lead. Philip O'Connor and Paul Walsh trimmed that by the break, but on the restart the likes of Mark Fitzgerald, Mark Cooper, Neil O'Shea, Micheal Potts, and David Shaw lifted the gears and a beautiful team move saw Sem star Cian McMahon drill a great goal – he's making a bit of a habit of that. Kieran O'Leary, who made a habit of it over all those years of success, reminded everyone that he's as dangerous as ever with a second goal. This was no bad display by St. Kierans at all - but Crokes sent out a very big message here.

GROUP TWO

East Kerry 2-20 Kerins O'Rahillys 1-11 No alarms and no surprises here. Both sides were missing big guns. The absence of David Clifford and Darragh Roche would be a crippling blow for most teams - East Kerry simply switched Shane Ryan as a very effective target man up front. You had a lot of big names on the field. Ten of East Kerry's starting fifteen have worn Kerry senior jerseys. That's without the younger Clifford brother - Paudie played a creative link role, and he's probably the best in the country at that role. The star of the show hasn't – yet – but he is rapidly growing into one. Most people flagged Ruairi Murphy as one to watch after his superb displays for the Kerry U20s and Listry this year. He's tough, direct, and very accurate – he picked off 1-5 on the burst. Rahillys were missing Jack Savage, Tommy Walsh, and the under-rated Con Barrett, but let's be honest; it wouldn't have made that much of a difference. They gave it everything; nobody could fault them. The returned Cormac Coffey and sharpshooter Conor Hayes were

outstanding. Hard to judge individual East Kerry players, given their overall superiority. That was some peach of a goal by James O'Donoghue, absolutely sublime. But the truth is that this was a one-sided contest and spectators were drifting away well before the finish. No fault to either team, but it lacked the excitement you'd be hoping for.

Dingle 4-10 Spa 1-6

In fairness, Spa were missing Dara Moynihan, Cian Murphy, the McCarthy brothers Mike and Niall, Shane Lynch, and Eoin Fitzgerald from their starting team. But they'll be disappointed with their display here – after all, Dingle were missing Tom Leo O'Sullivan and Conor Geaney, and that's a fair pair of aces too. Spa actually led by 1-2 to 0-1 after ten minutes, the goal a very quick and clever executed mark by David Spillane. But Dingle were that bit sharper and hungrier in the trenches - Mikey Geaney had a huge influence and the likes of Barry Dan O'Sullivan, after an early injury scare, were trojan and effective workers. The long ball option into Paul Geaney was always a viable one, and he won a penalty clinically despatched by Mikey to put them 1-6 to 1-3 ahead at the break. They clipped over two more points at the start of the second half and Spa were always chasing after that. They got it back to a goal, but then Paul Geaney latched onto another long one and finished from close range, with Billy O'Connor and Niall Gaeney adding two more goals. Liam Kearney and Shane Cronin played their hearts out for Spa, but the truth is that Dingle looked much the sharper side here.

GROUP THREE Austin Stacks 0-14 Na Gaeil 1-8

I actually think that Na Gaeil will be happy enough with their display here. Your senior championship debut against the reigning champions. A derby game, but you couldn't say that there's been a strong local rivalry. Austin Stacks already had nine county titles in the bag and were the reigning All Ireland champions when the idea of Na Gaeil was first mooted back in 1978. I have to say that the phenomenal rise of Na Gaeil over the past decade has been genuinely phenomenal, and the graph shows a clear and steady upward curve all the way from the underage academies - it's uncanny. A lot of unsung heroes very clearly put hard graft in on the ground - in case anybody's wondering, by the way, Austin Stacks' underage academies have a rich and continuing record themselves - take a look at the Tralee District toeam who won the U15 Championship or their minor team who took North Kerry to extra-time and are in the Club Final. Na Gaeil gave them a fierce rattle here and were a match in open play. Their problem was scoring forwards. Jack Sheehan scored a stunning goal after a great fetch - he could have taken a mark and didn't, going for goal instead. I like it - the forward mark robs the game of a lot of both defensive and offensive skill for me. The problem is that the goal was Na Gaeil's only score from a forward. Diarmuid O'Connor was phenomenal and he kicked six points from frees. Stacks got nine points from play from their starting forwards and always had the scores in the bank, so much so that Kieran Donaghy, who came on as a replacement for the back carded Ben Quilter (look, I understand the idea of a keeper supplementing the defensive to provide an extra option in both soccer and football - I still think it's an unnecessary risk) actually slotted in at the back. The problem for Stacks - and it's a big problem - is losing both Joe O'Connor and Jack O'Shea to injury. The tight playing schedule is only going to get harder.

Mid Kerry 1-14 West Kerry 1-10

It's no secret that I rate Mid Kerry, and they passed a very good test of their credentials here. In fact, a very good test, because they had to re-jig the ship in the face of a seven point deficit and did so successfully. West Kerry looked the more assured side at the start, Cian O'Grady slotting a rebound to the net early on. Mid Kerry picked their way through a tight defence for three points, two frees, but with Roibeard Ó Sé the dominant figure at midfield, West Kerry slotted five points on the trot. Mid Kerry finished the half strongly though. Darren Houlihan scored a beauty from long distance and Kieran Dennehy, who has been immense for Beaufort en route to an Intermediate semi-final, scored a crackling goal. That cut the gap to 1-9 to 1-5, and Mid Kerry had the strong wind in the second half. They also had Colin McGillicuddy and Seán Coffey. McGillicuddy transformed midfield and Mid Kerry were able to open the channels thereafter. They still needed brilliance from their keeper, though - Coffey made two phenomenal saves, really superb, and he rose high to claim two balls going over a bar as well. That's an eight point swing in any language. West Kerry will be disappointed with the result, of course, but I don't think they will be unhappy with their display, they will be a strong test for anybody. Mid Kerry had to dig deep to win it, but they had good shovels for the task.

GROUP FOUR

Feale Rangers 0-15 St. Brendans 0-13 This one came as a surprise to me, to be honest. I know that St. Brendans were missing eight

players – six Na Gaeil lads including an intercounty midfield - from last year's team, but I felt that there was enough strength in depth to get past Feale Rangers. It's no secret that North Kerry football has been struggling for over a decade now - Feale Rangers' defeat of South Kerry in 2007 has to go down as one of the great shocks in the history of the competition. This one wasn't comparable, but I don't think I saw a single prediction last week that Feale Rangers would win. I and many others forgot that the one great virtue of North Kerry football is dogged durability, and Feale Rangers typified that. And there's quality there - Martin Stack was phenomenal; he really was. That's the best player in this year's first round after a stunning eleven point display. He wasn't alone, though - Bryan Sweeney and Barry Mahony gave them a brilliant platform at midfield and Cillian Trant was always at the heart of the action. St. Brendans had plenty of battlers – Joe Lenihan excelled and Rob Monaghan didn't hurt his growing reputation – but no executioner. They were actually a point ahead midway through the first half, but had left a fair bit behind them. Feale Rangers led by three at half-time, maybe a fraction flattering. A bright opening to the second half saw them cut it back to one point.... and then the scores just completely dried up for them, while Stack was nailing every chance that came his way. Brendans actually finished very strong with the last four points - and Fionán Mackessy with half a goal chance - but those scoring dry spells ultimately cost them. I still don't really see Feale Rangers as overall contenders, but this one answers all critics and they'll have a lift in their step from here on.

Templenoe 1-11 South Kerry 0-14

Templenoe are everyone's favourite Kerry story of recent years. A small but resilient catchment area has produced talent in abundance, and when you look at the likes of Aidan Crowley, the production lines haven't stopped yet. But think about South Kerry for a minute. They didn't win any County Championship at all until 1955 and had few enough county players (I suspect that the urban centres of Tralee and Killarney were easier to observe logistically). But as travel became easier with the increase in car ownership, South Kerry rose, and just kept rising. They haven't been great in recent years in terms of the top table, but they remind me of Meath in the late eighties. They were physically tough – never as dirty as legend has it, not even close – but their greatest strength was that they just refused to be beaten. You could be five points up with two minutes left to play against Meath – it'd be a very long two minutes. The first half here was tight - 0-5 apiece at the break was a fair reflection. Around the three quarter mark Templenoe had nudged just a point ahead, but then a perfect long ball from Gavin Crowley (he's been doing that superbly in recent games; it's a deadly weapon), Killian Spillane off-loaded to Brian Crowley, and Crowley has always been more of a predator than a defender. The excellent Spillane and Morley put six points between them. Templenoe lost both midfielders to injury, though, and South Kerry showed their resilience, Graham O'Sullivan and Dylan O'Donoghue leading the way. Five points on the trot. Aidan Crowley nailed a '45, but South Kerry responded. In injury time, they picked off an equaliser, and I don't think anyone would say that it was undeserved.

BRENDAN HENNESSY RIP

I've not hidden my love of Kerry hurling, nor am I going to. Kerry are much better а hurling countv than we are ever given credit for, we actually bat far above our weight in that regard. And Kerry hurlers are respected in the tight-knit world of hurling. Pádraig Boyle and Shane Conway are our latest top guns, you had the Bricks of

Brendan Hennessy RIP

Kilmoyley, Tom Murnane, 'Boxer' Slattery....the Leahy brothers fashioned the craft for a lot of them as youngsters. Christy Walsh – a serious talent. He was a dual player, of course, as many of the great ones were – Phil The Master, John Joe and his sons, Johnny and Mickey Culloty, the Galvins and Fitzmaurices of Finuge, all the Boyles of course, Tom Collins with three Munster Finals in a day....

The general consensus would be that the Hennessys of Ballyduff were the best hurlers out of Kerry, and Brendan Hennessy was the best of the Hennessys. He is still considered one of the best Harty players to ever come out of that school – have a quick google at the hurlers that came out of Flannans. He was the star of the show when Ballyduff ended a 64 year drought in 1955 (South Kerry famously won their first football title the same year)and captained the winning team in 1957. Michael went on to win 11 Kerry titles and Teddy 6. Brendan had emigrated to New York, where he would play midfield alongside his brother. He played with the Kilkenny club and, curiously,

they never won a New York title – he did win six football titles with the Kerry club. New York were a strong team back then in both football and hurling (the likes of Jim Foley of Keel and Mick Moynihan of Rathmore were fabulous footballers), helped by the annual games against the National League champions. In 1958 they sensationally beat a Wexford team that included the Rackards, Nick O'Donnell, Art Foley, Ned Wheeler.....Brendan and Mick were at least as good as any of those great hurlers that day. New York rattled an awful lot of cages in those days – ask the likes of Mick O'Connell if you don't believe me, and they will confirm.

In 2003, Brendan was inducted into the Munster Hall of Fame for hurling (guess how many Kerrymen have received that particular honour?) alongside Mick O'Dwyer – no introductions were necessary between the two giants.

Of course, sporting medals aren't the measure of any man. Mickey Whelan, who was the brains of the operation and set the coaching when Kevin Heffernan rejuvenated Dublin football in the seventies, tells a lovely story about Brendan. Whelan rented a room in Brendan's house when he first moved to the US, where he would win a National Football League alongside the Hennessys. When he was leaving, his wife Irene and young children flying over to join him in a rented house, Brendan gave his Dublin friend what Mickey assumed was a best wishes card. When he opened it later, it was the money he had paid in rent over the past months, returned to him. That tells you everything you need to know about Brendan Hennessy.

Sadly, Brendan passed away in New York last week. Kerry is the poorer for his passing.

GOLF SHANE LOWRY TRIUMPHS AT WENTWORTH

A lot of golf conversations nowadays focus almost exclusively on the growing rift between LIV and the PGA. It's an important conversation, and I'd be very firmly on the side whose main argument doesn't rely on how much money they have to spend. But it's almost becoming a lazy, media-driven narrative in itself. [The Wentworth PGA Championship featured some really good golf, and Shane Lowry's victory deserves to be celebrated in its own right. Lowry is one of the most likeable Irish sporting stars out there. Somehow, I can imagine Rory McIlroy obliging with a selfie or an autograph, but I can envision sitting down and having a pint with Shane Lowry – "Just between you and me Shane, Seamus Darby absolutely did push Tommy Doyle in the back...."I should point out, of course, that I have never spoken to either man in my entire life and very much doubt if I ever will.

Shane has been two shots ahead with five to play this year, and didn't close it out. In one of those cases another golfer simply played phenomenal, it's outside your control. But in the other, Shane definitely wobbled a bit. And the thing is that those little one or two hole misfires have been a general feature of Shane's play. Golf is very much a game of consistency. Over 18 holes, pretty much everyone is going to have that one great hole where everything goes right (you and I mostly call them 'birdies'). But even the really good amateurs have that one or two holes that just go off, it's almost as inexorable as gravity. At the stratospheric professional level, just one slip knocks you twenty places down the leaderboard instantly. You have to be incredibly consistent just to get within a donkey's roar of professional golf. It's not about the phenomenal shots you do make.....it's about the bread and butter shots that you don't miss. Even being consistently bad is actually better than being sporadically brilliant - consistently bad means that there are small errors that you can remove from your dame.

Last weekend, Shane Lowry did not drop a single stroke over 54 holes. Jon Rahm, who led for most of the way through, shot a truly spectacular round of 62 and frankly, I was sure it was all over. Shane had started the day two shots behind – and was playing well enough to be ahead if the putts had dropped that little bit sooner. And then the putter heated up a bit – sometimes I actually think it's got nothing to do with technique or mentality, sometimes I think God just smiles at you. But Shane hit the kind of form coming to the closing stages that is unstoppable. Five birdies and two eagles in the last nine rounds.

Shane had gone ahead of Rahm at this stage, but Rory McIlroy was still in the hunt, and McIlroy genuinely belongs in any conversation as Ireland's most talented sports person ever. People count the major wins, but I repeat, consistency is the measure of golf greatness and this guy is in the top ten almost every single time. He had a putt to take it to a play-

off – and Rory is very calm in play-offs. It was a very long, difficult putt....but it only missed by millimetres. Rory exchanged a rueful grin and congratulations with the Offaly man; it was a nice touch.

Like I say, it was the phenomenal burst at the finish that got Shane over the line. But it was the golf that he played to get into that position that I found interesting. |He's always the occasional piece of brilliance in his game, but it seems to be allied to a new sureness and solidity. He could be very interesting to watch going forward....

RUGBY

I don't know a lot about sevens rugby and I'm not pretending to. It's a very, very different game in so many ways. The movement patterns are different. Actually defensively, it's a bit closer to American Football. I know that sounds counter-intuitive, but in terms of blocking and secondary lines.....

I didn't see the games – there's just so much on at the moment, and I'm loving every bit of it, and that's even before the basketball season kicks in – but Ireland narrowly losing to New Zealand (where their smaller population means that sevens rugby is hugely popular) and bearing Australia fair and square to take the bronze medal is a huge achievement. They had already beaten Portugal, England, and South Africa along the way.

APPLE FLAPJACKS

850g or 5 large apples (peeled, cored and chopped) 200g Oats 70ml Golden syrup or 5 tablespoons 100g Butter 40g Sugar 1 Pinch of salt Half teaspoon of cinnamon

IRISH GOVT SHOULD CONSIDER FLOATING STORAGE REGASIFICATION UNITS TO ENABLE LNG BE IMPORTED INTO THE COUNTRY

reland South MEP and Member of the European Parliament's : Environment and Climate Action Committee (ENVI), Billy Kelleher has said that the Irish Government should give serious consideration to the possibility of buying or renting a Floating Storage Regasification Unit (FSRU) to allow the country import LNG and to pump it into the gas network.

Commenting, the Fianna Fáil MEP said, "Many of our fellow EU Member States are already well along the way to doing this as a means of diversifying their electricity and energy supplies.

"This facility, installed in one of our harbours or ports, and in close proximity to an access point to our gas network, would enable two things.

1. Allow us wean ourselves off our long term dependence on gas from the UK;

2. Provide potentially cheaper gas for our citizens

"Longer term, we will need a permanent LNG terminal in Ireland with

connections into the grid but such a facility would take up to five years to build. However, my proposal could provide Ireland with a short-term solution.

"In addition, many countries are also installing 'powerships or power barges', in effect floating power stations, to allow them to burn natural gas onsite and provide additional electricity supply. It has been estimated that each unit could supply up to 500MW.

"Natural gas will always play a role in powering some proportion of Ireland's energy needs. It might only be 5-10% but it could be the difference between the lights staying on if the wind doesn't blow for a few days.

"The Government needs to start thinking big. The energy crisis will be with us for years to come. It won't end with the conclusion of the Russian invasion. The countries that secure their own energy independence will be the prosperous countries of the future," concluded Kelleher.
