As it has been from day one, everything is free of charge and our staff are fully qualified and provide a professional one-to-one therapeutic service for people who are experiencing suicidal ideation, people who have attempted suicide and people who are engaging in self-harm. A doctor's referral or a psychiatric report is not required.

As 90% of the income comes from fundraising events, we rely heavily on the support and encouragement of our volunteers and friends of Pieta.

# Local based author launches new book

A book focusing on the Faction Fighters of Kerry was launched last night at Killarney Library.

In, Days of the Blackthorn, author, Seán Moraghan, uses eyewitness descriptions, as well as the oral history of local communities, to provide a visceral sense of this exciting and brutal activity in Kerry. From the Battle of Ballyeagh between the Cooleens and the Lawlors that left eighteen dead, to the savage combats of various strongmen, such as Seón Burns or 'Big Mick' Foley, this is a fascinating account of a wild and violent time in Ireland's history.

On town streets or in green fields, at fairs, race meetings and saints' patron days, rival gangs of Irishmen used to meet to battle and beat each other with cudgels and sticks. The practice was particularly prevalent in the 1800s, and involved tens, hundreds and even thousands of men and women at a time.

Days of the Blackthorn uses evewitness descriptions, as well as the oral history of local communities, to provide a visceral sense of this exciting and brutal activity in County Kerry. From the Battle of Ballyeagh between the Cooleens and the Lawlors that left eighteen dead, to the savage combats of various strongmen, such as Seón Burns or 'Big Mick' Foley, this is a fascinating account of a wild and violent time in Ireland's history. In a study of homicide in nineteenth-century

Ireland, it was observed that faction fighting received surprisingly little attention from historians. Faction fighting in Ireland lasted for over 200 years, it involved gangs of men attacking each other heartily with various cudgels, sticks, reaping hooks and sometimes guns. Only a single analysis of the activity was undertaken while it was actually occurring. Regarded as an embarrassment by nationalist Ireland both before and after independence, faction fighting was rarely discussed afterwards.

Seán Moraghan has been a bookseller, librarian, and folklore researcher. He has also worked as an editor, indexer and proofreader. Following a visit to Killarney, he



moved to County Kerry where he has lived for over thirty years. Seán previously published Puck Fair: A History, and a new readers edition of The Ancient and Present State of the County of Kerry.

# Reel Wisdom... Fodhla plans to film in Kerry in 2020

Peter Doyle spoke to Oscar nominated film producer Fodhla Cronin O'Reilly from Cromane about her latest film Ammonite which stars both Saoirse Ronan and Kate Winslet.

Even though she is based in London, Fodhla Cronin O'Reilly still comes home to Kerry on a reguar basis. The film maker is originally from Cromane and attended Intermediate School, Killorglin.

Fodhla's mother Irene works in accounts for the Randles Hotel Group and her father Patrick is well known throughout Kerry through his work as a Fire Inspector. Fodhla first shot to fame in 2013 when "Head over Heels" an animated short film that she produced was Oscar nominated. Fodhla explained, "that was my graduate film, and the acclaim it received gave me the confidence that I could produce feature length films." Fodhla has since formed her own production company "sixty six pictures" and has produced several feature length films including the well known film "Lady Macbeth".

Ammonite is written and directed by Francis Lee and features an impressive cast. It is a period

drama. The film is based on the life of Mary Anning 1799 - 1847 who was an English fossil collector and palaeontologist. The film is currently in post - production stage.

Fodhla's next film will be shot in Ireland and they are hoping to shoot it in Kerry but Fodhla explained, "it is still early days so we are still looking at locations, the script is still been developed, the film is been made with Screen Ireland, the Irish film board." The film will be made over 2020.

Fodhla explained, "that the role of a producer is essentially to be the person to put the project together, the producer can originate an idea, but then hire a writer and director to develop the project. The producer raises the finance but is also responsible for enacting the vision of the director."

Fodhla highly recommends the National Film and Television school in Beaconsfield UK where she completed her Master's. Fodhla explained, "it is a post graduate school so it is for people who know what they want to specialise in." Fodhla also believes the Dun Laoghaire film school is a good place to study for students hoping to pursue a career in film and television.

Fodhla believes Screen Ireland give great support and for that reason there are a lot of opportunities. Fodhla finished by saying that her up coming project will keep her busy for 2020.

# SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE

Yes, because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There has been a lot of discussion recently in the media recently as regards mortgage switching this is because there can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. # Liam Scoops a BT Young Scientist Award

A Rathmore student was among those awarded at last week's BT Young Scientist and Technology Exhibition awards ceremony.

Liam McSharry, a student at Scoil Phobail Sliabh Luachra impressed the judges and took home an award in the Social & Behavioural Sciences category. A total number of 10 projects represented Kerry at the exhibition this year.

Liam outlined his project for the Killarney Outlook:

"My project is a new emotionrecognition system for computers. An emotion recognition system is a system used to figure out someone's emotion based on a particular feature. There have been a few emotion recognition systems developed thus far, e.g. by analysing peoples facial features from photos, and many new Emotion recognition systems have turned to Electroencephalography for ideas. Electroencephalography (EEG) is a test used to measure the electrical activity of the brain. Your brain cells communicate via electrical activity and this can be read by metal disks called electrodes attached to the scalp. My new emotion recognition system uses EEG and shows its correlation with feelings and words. This is done by having participants in an experiment listen to 20 pieces of audio and ask them to rate their feeling on the clip. The audio is then categorised via 42 Neurally Plausible Sematic Features. This means that the audio is broken up into their individual word components and categorised I.e. "The Man went to the Shop", e.g. "Man"-"Person"-"Animate beina". This allows me to correlate a persons feeling (based on the valence/arousal emotion model), the frequency of



the EEG (based on hz) and the word which caused a unique response (based on 42 Neurally Plausible Sematic Features). A model can be develop based on these variable which can be used to train Artificial Intelligence to understand a persons emotional state and empathize with them based on the words they used. I am have spoken to a few Neurophysiologists of the Bon Secours regarding my project along with two professors at UCC and UCD both whom along with the Neurophysiologists support my project as they believe it is of high standard and unique and are helping me get through the ethics department of the hospital so I can begin human trials". Teachers and students at the school are extremely proud of Liam's success.

# CAO APPLICANTS: **KEEP A CLOSE** EYE ON THE TIMELINE!

AO application season is in full swing and with 80,000 plus applicants competing for about 48,000 college places, it's vital to submit a complete application form. Stay focussed and be aware of key dates and the important tasks to be done in the weeks ahead. The 2020 CAO online application remains open until 1st Feb. Open your CAO interactive online account via "Apply" on www.cao.ie, by 20th Jan to get a discount rate of  $\in$  30. After that the fee increases to  $\in$ 45 until the 1st Feb. The closing date for online Change of Course Choices, which is free, is also 1st Feb.

You may use the online Change of Course Choices facility, fee €10, from 5th Feb to 1st March to add any restricted courses not already listed. Restricted category applicants may also use this facility. All other applicants should use the free Change of Mind option, between 5th May and 1st July, to make any course changes. Completed online Higher Education Access Route (HEAR)/Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) forms must be submitted by 1st March. HEAR/DARE supporting

documentation must arrive in CAO by 15th March.

Late online applications, fee €60, will be accepted from 5th March to 1st May. From 5th May, you may register a change of course choices online at www.cao.ie. Check that your courses have been updated by using the "My Application" facility before 1st July. Before the end of May, you will be sent a Statement of Application Record to verify that all your information has been recorded accurately. If you find any error in the document, contact the CAO.

Course choices and preferences may be changed as often as desired, free of charge, between 5th May and 1st July. If you submit a Change of Mind, it cancels all the previous course choices, which you have submitted. The two categories (Level 8 and Level7/6) are completely separate from each other for this purpose. Any restricted application course, added for the first time via a Change of Mind won't be considered unless it shares the same assessment procedure with a course you had applied for by 1st Feb. In early July, offers

of places (Round A) are issued to deferred applicants, mature applicants and to those who need to make visa arrangements. In early August, offers of places (Round Zero) are issued to certain non-standard categories of applicants such as FET/QQI and graduate applicants. Round One, the main body of offers will be issued shortly after the Leaving Cert results. Last year, 50,010 applicants received offers in Round One. CAO will release details of the finalised 2020 offers and acceptance schedule later in the year.

# THE RACE IS ON as General Election 2020 begins

he bid to secure a seat in the 33rd Dail is well underway in Kerry following the dissolution of the current Dail on Tuesday and an announcement by Taoiseach Leo Varadkar that a General Election will take place on Saturday 8th February.

For the first time in over 100 years the vote will take place at the weekend. A Saturday election will benefit families who are working and would have, in the past, had to arrange child care or take time off when an election was held on a weekday. It will also benefit students and those working from home who will now be able to cast their vote at the weekend.

There are currently 10 candidates running in Kerry, including sitting deputies, Fine Gael's Brendan Griffin, Fianna Fail's John Brassil and Independents Michael and Danny Healy-Rae. Martin Ferris, TD will not contest the election and Pa Daly is on the ticket for Sinn Fein in his place.

Other contenders to date include Norma Foley, Fianna Fail, Norma Moriarty, Fianna Fail, Mike Kennelly, Fine Gael, Cleo Murphy from The Green Party and Sonny Foran from Aontú. The Labour party have still to nominate a candidate, as Cllr. Terry O'Brien decided on Thursday that he would not run for the party in the election.

# **Call for Controlled Pedestrian Crossing**

Councillor Michael Gleeson has requested Kerry County Council to reveal when it is intended to provide a controlled pedestrian crossing on Mission Road to facilitate the many who wish to access the beautiful Killarney House and Gardens.

Councillor Gleeson welcomed the acceptance of the great need for the pedestrian crossing and asked that it would be provided at the earliest possible opportunity.

Deputy John Brassil kicks off his 2020 election campaign highlighting Governments failure to make progress on the Killarney Bypass.

Fianna Fail election candidate John Brassil has hit out at what he describes as a lack of interest in Kerry road projects by the last government. Speaking as he launched his 2020 election campaign, Brassil described the lack of progress on the proposed 27 kilometre Killarney Bypass as unforgivable. would be the biggest ever undertaken in Kerry and I think it would show the ambition we have to grow our local economy, create more jobs and continue to make Kerry a great place to visit.

Brassil has called for urgent talks with Transport Infrastructure Ireland to discuss moving this road project forward and has vowed it will be a key priority for a Fianna Fail led government, should the public place their trust in them.

# JIMMY O'SULLIVAN-DARCY takes a looks at all things sport...

#### NEW PLAYING RULES FOR THE GAA

The new rules as passed by a Special Congress of the GAA have come into force for all gaelic football competitions since January 1st, and it was announced last week that they will be retroactively applied to the latter stages of competition like the latter stages of the Corn Uí Mhuirí (Munster Senior Colleges) competition going forward -0 St. Brendans, PS Sliabh Luachra, and Tralee CBS were all in action in the quarter-finals last Wednesday.

#### But what exactly are the new rules?

Kick-outs will be taken from the 20 metre line and must be kicked forward. All players except the kicker must be outside the 20 metre line, outside the semi-circle, and must be at least 13 metres away from the ball as it is kicked. The idea is to eliminate the extreme conservatism of short kick-outs in recent years and force teams to go on the attack and contest possession.

A 'mark' i.e. a free kick from where a player cleanly catches a kick-out past his own'45 metre line, shall be awarded by the referee sounding his whistle as indication if that player raises his arm in the air to claim one. The player then has 15 seconds to take his kick. The player has the option of playing the ball without claiming a mark. Again, the rational is to encourage more high fielding in midfield rather than the present defensive conservatism.

The Advance Mark. If an attacking player cleanly catches a ball that has been kicked from outside the 45m line into the opponent's defensive and has travelled at least 20 metres, that player can claim an 'advance mark' by raising his arm. On the referee blowing his or her whistle to indicate the mark, the player has 15c seconds to take a free kick from which he can score. It is important to note that an ordinary free kick will be awarded if the defense do not retreat promptly enough from the kick. Should the mark be claimed inside the large square, the kick is taken from the 13 metre line (this happened early on in IT Tralee's defeat to IT Carlow in the opening round of the Sigerson Cup). This new rule is to discourage blanket defending and incentivise attacking play.

The 'Sin Bin'. A disturbing trait in recent All Ireland Finals in particular was the propensity for cynical fouling by the team in front late in the game. Since the penalty of a black card for such offences included the offending player being replaced by a substitute, the GAA decided to bring in a sanction that would prove more effective in the latter stages of games. Consequentially, where a player now receives a black card (deliberate body check, pull down, or trip of an opponent, verbal abuse of any other player, including a team-mate, or remonstrance with a match official) they will be sent off for a ten minute period, without a substitute replacing them with a team-mate. The time starts when the referee resumes play and the player can only return when the referee gives permission for the player to rejoin play.

#### IT TRALEE SUFFER LATE DEFEAT IN SIGERSON OPENER

IT Tralee have a huge amount of work put into their Sigerson Cup campaign under a management team that included Liam Brosnan of Currow and Kieran Donaghy of Austin Stacks as joint managers and Aidan O'Mahony of Rathmore as physical trainer. Players who featured included a Dr. Crokes guartet of Mark Fitzgerald, Mark O'Shea, Paul Clarke, and Tony Brosnan (0-3, 1f), Seán Kelliher of Beaufort joint captain Conor Keane of Killarney Legion, and man of the match David Clifford of Fossa (0-7, 3f). Aaron McCarthy of Listry, Evan Cronin of Gneeveguilla, Danny Healy of Beaufort, and Eddie Hora was on the panel, while Michael Potts (Dr. Crokes), Eddie Horan (Scartaglin) and Dara Moynihan (Spa) were among a number of players who were on the injured list.

IT Tralee conceded the first score after not retreating fast enough from an advance mark but, with David Clifford giving an exhibition, they led by 1-10 to 0-7 after 49 minutes. IT Tralee lost larla Courtney (Ardfert) to a black card at that stage and the effectiveness of the new sanction was proven as the tide turned completely. They lost Mark Fitzgerald to a red card during the concession of a penalty and IT Carlow used their two man advantage to plunder two more late goals to win by 3-9 to 1-13.

IT Tralee must now face Athlone IT this coming Saturday at a neutral venue in a relegation battle.

#### FREWEN CUP ST. BRENDANS 1-9 HAMILTON HS, BANDON 1-5

In a thoroughly entertaining game. Bandon were actually as good as an excellent Sem team in all departments except for the unfortunate malaise of being unwilling to shoot. They fielded great ball, linked with each other well, covered and tackled with controlled aggression....but every time they got withing shooting distance, they would pass it backwards rather than cough up possession. They only shot twice in the first half, both early and both wide. That said, Peter Cosgrave was probably the Sem's best player and Harry Byrne was another defender who shone brightly.

The massive growth in social media has created enormous problems for employers.

#### How do I deal with inappropriate use of social media by an employee?

- 1. Making adverse remarks about colleagues
- 2. Bullying comments/stalking
- 3. Commenting negatively on the business
- 4. "Sledging" the boss.

#### Questions which can arise:

- Can you discipline an employee for what they do outside the workplace on their "own" social media channel?
- Are the comments likely to impact negatively on your company?
- · Have you a duty of care in respect of other employees for comments made by employees?

Employers should consider dealing with all these cases on their individual facts and circumstances. You may take into account, whether or not it was a one-off incident; the real likelihood of the employer being brought into disrepute; and the employee's knowledge of the rules.

In some cases, a sanction short of dismissal may be appropriate for a first offence. The right an employee has to freedom of expression under Article 10 of the European Convention on Human Rights does not prevent dismissal where the reputation of the employer is damaged. What to Do Now?

- · Ensure you have an up to date social media policy and it is brought to the attention of all employees.
- If you need to carry out a disciplinary procedure be certain to afford fair procedures and natural
  justice to the employee.

#### LETS ALL HOPE WE WILL NOT NEED THESE HANDY HINTS

\*On particularly cold mornings, windshield wipers can get frozen or even stuck to the windshield. A good way to avoid this from happening is to put the wipers straight up and cover them with old socks.

\*If you do not have an ice scraper, anything with a plastic edge, such as a spatula or a credit card will work just as effectively on windscreens covered in frost.

\* Your car's side-view mirrors are often forgotten during the cold winter days, but they, too, can suffer from frost and mistiness, which can affect your visibility. This can be avoided by covering your mirrors with sandwich bags or ziplock bags when not driving.

\* You can use cooking spray on shovels and ice scrapers to help avoid the snow and ice sticking to your tools.

\*Cat litter makes an excellent alternative to salt when trying to ensure traction for vehicles. Though it cannot help melt the ice, it can help to prevent sliding of vehicles on icy roads.

\*Remember antifreeze is deadly poison for pets and always bang on the front, sides and back of your vehicle to frighten out any animals taking shelter there.

#### NATURAL SERVICES FROM A CULTIVATED BUT SOMEWHAT UNMANICURED LAWN

Lawns, as has been reported by me before on this very website, were a European invention, and though a symbol of wealth as much as anything, convention of the day couldn't help but make them useful. Lawns were originally cultivated with advantageous herbs and plants, and even as they transitioned to grasses, they were used for grazing sheep. Some practical, productive function was included in their make-up.

When gas-powered machinery entered the scene their purpose began to change and suddenly, keeping up with the Joneses required mowing the yard once a week rather than sheep grazing on it. And, there was no space for biodiversity. The goal was a one species of grass, a carpet so to speak, without a dandelion, buttercup or daisy to be found. Then, because this kind of lawn was antithetical to nature, a slurry of fertilisers, reseeding, and chemical weeding were included in an annual crusade for the perfect lawn. Furthermore, it didn't matter where we were arid desert or Ireland—we tried to produce the same results, in some cases pulling freshwater reserves from community piped water supplies to grow grass just to cut it down once a week. In other words, humans went crazy.

The truth is that a lawn, essentially a paddock with no grazing animals, largely left to its own devices doesn't grow one species of grass. It grows a multitude of herbaceous species, including grasses but more so "weeds". Of course, weeds don't really exist when we don't put that label on them. Within this biodiversity, we are able to find a multitude of functions. Bio-diverse plants will invite bio-diverse wildlife - birds, insects, bats, and so on - into the ecosystem as well. Furthermore, we can add productive, desirable components mustard greens, the mint family, chamomile, sorrel, chives etc. to this herbaceous mix.

Dandelions and other 'weeds', we have rediscovered, are actually a great source of food. Common offenders like clover, wild violet, and stinging nettle, are edible and offer a considerable amount of nutrients to those who take advantage. Keep the chemicals off the lawn and not only will these grow, but they'll be organic and again, we can add our own specially selected productive plants to the herbal lawn mix.

#### WOMEN NOW OUTNUMBER MEN ON U.S. PAYROLLS

Job growth in the U.S.A. slowed last month as employers added just 145,000 jobs and 95% of the net jobs added in December went to women, who now hold just over half of all payroll jobs in America, for only the second time in history. The first was during the Great Recession, when a wave of layoffs hit male workers first, temporarily giving women an edge in the workplace.

The hospitality industry alone added 40,000 jobs in December. Women hold 77% of the jobs in health care and education - fields that now eclipse the entire goods-producing sector of the economy.

The sectors that typically tend to employ men, like mining and manufacturing are in steep decline with Factories shedding 12,000 jobs in December, while mining and logging lost 9,000 though construction is one male-dominated field that showed growth last month, adding 20,000 jobs and the Labour Department's count of payroll workers excludes both farmers and the self-employed. Men still dominate both of those categories.

## HEDGING

Hedges can make a much more natural background to a garden than a wall or a fence. They can provide shelter and are cheaper and require a small amount of maintenance. Because a hedge allows the wind to filter through it reduces its velocity. Tall or low growing, clipped or informal, there is a hedging plant for every purpose. One thing to remember about a hedge is that it is intended to be a permanent feature in the garden so therefore should be chosen with care and planted in well prepared soil, to choose the right hedge for your garden here are a few pointers to think about

1. The type of soil you have.

How exposed the garden is, i.e. what direction is it facing.
 The eventual height and width the hedge will be.

 The eventual neight and would the 4. Does it need to be evergreen.

When you have chosen the type of hedge that you want it is time to prepare the soil, start preparing the soil by digging thoroughly and forking in some well rotted farmyard manure. Hedges can be planted all year around, but the ideal time is between November and March as all hedging plants will be domant at this time. What that means is when you go to buy your hedging plants they are lifted straight from the ground and are called bare-rooted hedging. This enables you to replant straight back into the ground when you get them home. Just make sure when planting that the roots are spread out well as this will encourage them to root quickly when the growing season starts. Now is the perfect time to plant hedging, however if you wish to wait until the end of March you can plant container grown hedging all year around. Next week I will focus on trees.

## Know Your Rights:

#### Question

I was in hospital recently and I was not happy with my experience there. When I complained to the nurse in charge I wasn't satisfied with the response. How can I take my complaint further?

#### Answer

The Health Service Executive (HSE) has a complaints system, called Your service your say, that you can use to make a complaint about your experience of a service provided by the HSE or on behalf of the HSE.

If you want to make a complaint about a public hospital to the HSE, you can get support from the new Patient Advocacy Service to help you make your complaint. The Patient Advocacy Service is fully independent of the HSE. It is a free and confidential service that provides information and support to people who want to make a formal complaint about an experience they have had in a public acute hospital.

The Patient Advocacy Service provides support by phone helpline, on 0818 293003, and on its website, patientadvocacyservice.ie, where you can find information and a contact form. The service can explain how to make a formal complaint, including what you should include in your complaint and how to write it.

If there is a delay with the processing of the complaint or if you are not satisfied with the outcome, the Patient Advocacy Service can give you information about your options.

As social beings, we are hard wired to connect and most of us feel the need for rewarding social contact and relationships. Loneliness is the feeling we get when our need for this type of contact is not met. Loneliness of course is not the same as being alone. We may choose to be alone and live very happy lives without much contact with others. Or indeed we may have much social contact, be constantly surrounded by people, and yet feel very lonely. Loneliness can have a significant impact on our mental health and can contribute to mental health problems, such as anxiety and depression. Loneliness can have many different causes and affects people in different ways. Some people feel lonely due to their personal circumstances (e.g. moving to a new area, loss or bereavement). For others however, loneliness can be a deeper more constant feeling that comes from within.

Connecting with the world around us can be a great way to combat loneliness. This may be having a small conversation with the cashier when we pay for our groceries or saying hello to someone we meet in the street. Phoning or sending an email to family and friends can be a good reminder that we do have people in our lives.

Our brain can try to make sense of the feeling of loneliness by telling us things such as 'It is because nobody loves me' or 'There is something wrong with me' These thoughts are not facts – and can make us feel worse. Thus it is important to accept how we are feeling without overreacting. When we feel lonely, the tendency might be to withdraw into ourselves and this can be counterproductive. The healthiest thing to do if we are feeling lonely is to reach out and cultivate friendships. Reaching out can be difficult and at times we will resist it. However, think of it in the way you might approach exercising - whilst we may feel tired or lazy it is a beneficial thing to do.

We need to tackle loneliness one step at a time. It may involve finding a new hobby or joining a club or exercise class. Another skillful way to combat feelings of loneliness is to volunteer as it's a great way to meet new people and also to learn new skills.

Loneliness is a profoundly human emotion and a signal that our need for connection is going unmet.
