THE RING OF KERRY CHARITY CYCLE UNVEIL BENEFICIARY **CHARITIES FOR 2017**

The Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle has announced the 10 main beneficiary charities for 2017 and has set a registration open date for the 25th of February. The event, now in its 34th year, is the biggest one day charity fundraising event in Ireland, attracting over 10,000 leisure cyclists, completing the 112-mile challenge around the Ring of Kerry, while at the same time fundraising for worthy charities. With more than €11.9 million raised to date, the 10 beneficiary charities for 2017 are: Derrynane Inshore Rescue Services, Kerry Rape & Sexual Abuse Centre, Talbot Grove, Recovery Haven, Social Action Group Rathmore, Kerry Parents & Friends Association, Down Syndrome Ireland - Kerry Branch, Camphill Community Dingle, Temple Street Foundation and Valentia Island Hospital. The charities nominated were found to provide invaluable services and support to the people within communities across Munster.

Registration for the cycle will open on the 25th of February 2017 and the process has evolved to make it a straight forward format for cyclists and fundraisers. There will be no lottery system this year, and registrations will be taken on a first come first served basis. There will be 10,000 spaces available and as part of the registration process all participants will be required to select one of the 10 main beneficiary charities, to cycle for. Each charity will be allocated 1,000

Dr Crokes put the heartbreak of recent AllIreland Club semi final defeats at the hands of Crossmaglen Rangers (2012), Ballymun Kickhams (2013) and Castlebar Mitchels (2014) behind them at the Gaelic Grounds on Saturday evening last when overpowering many people's favourites Corofin of Galway to qualify for an All Ireland final showdown with another team that started the day as underdogs, Slaughtneil of Derry inn Croke Park on St Patrick's day. A very positive start from the Killarney side secured them a lead that they never surrendered and though the Galway standard bearers came strong as the second half progressed a wonderful breakaway goal engineered by Daithí Casey and finished by Jordan Kiely paved the way for the black and amber side's return to Croke Park. The fact that 2017 marks the 25th anniversary of their one and only All Ireland title in 1992 will hardly go unnoticed around Lewis Road as they prepare for the final.

MATCH ARRANGEMENTS FOR UPCOMING ALLIANZ LEAGUE GAMES

Kerry's remaining League games are home to Monaghan in Fitzgerald Stadium on February 26th; away to Roscommon on the following Sunday March 5th and then, after a two week break, three games on the trot starting with a home game against Dublin in Austin Stack Park under lights on March 18th; away to Cavan in Breffni Park on March 26th and home to Tyrone in Fitzgerald Stadium on April 2nd. The final is fixed for April 9th.

Tickets are already on sale for the games

against Monaghan and Dublin.

For the Dublin game in particular, patrons should remember that there is likely to be a capacity of 12,000 put on the sell-out attendance for this game in Austin Stack Park. Everyone, including children, will need a ticket to gain admission under health and safety regulations. The good news is that tickets are available to purchase in advance at the discounted price of €12 and that figure included OAPs and students. Childrern's tickets cost €5 and tickets

are available at all the usual outlets including participating Supervalu and Centra Stores throughout the Country, including all Garveys Supervalu Stores, at GAA.ie and at the Kerry GAA Store in the Outlet Centre Killarney and the Pavilion in Austin Stack Park Tralee. The 20% commission applies to midnight on the night before the game only. For the Monaghan game, children Under 16 are free and tickets may be purchased on-line or at participating stores right up to match time.

GLENBEIGH-GLENCAR AWAIT THEIR DESTINY

The biggest day in the history of Glenbeigh-Glencar GAA Club is drawing near and all roads will lead to Croke Park on Sunday next when the Mid Kerry side take on Rock St Patricks of Tyrone in the All Ireland Junior Club Final that has a 2pm throw-in.

These are heady times indeed for the red and black side who had to endure many setbacks before finally winning the county Junior Premier final on the October weekend – and that after a replay against Na Gaeil. Victories over Gerald Griffins of Limerick and Gabriel Rangers of Cork secured them a first ever provincial crown and then, after a very shaky start, their

experience saw them settle and take control of the game against Louisburgh of Mayo in the All Ireland semi final.

Opponents Rock St Patricks had a couple of tough games in the latter stages of the Ulster championship, but like the Kerry representatives, they eventually had it all their own way against Edinburgh side Dunedin Gaels in the semi final.

Kerry Clubs have dominated this competition down through the years winning seven of the fifteen finals played (Duagh and Kenmare were defeated finalists) and indeed Glenbeigh-Glencar are attempting to make it three titles on the trot for Kerry clubs with Brosna and Templenoe having won the last two finals. Tyrone clubs, including Rock in 2008, have lost three finals over the years but Greencastle did win the 2007 title and between the Junior and Intermediate grades, the Red Hand county have a pretty good record in the competition.

The Kerry standard bearers will have to be at their best to add another club title to Kerry's list and they take the good wishes of all Kerry supporters in their endeavours.

"At the recent Killarney Municipal area meeting Councillor Michael Gleeson pictured right asked if the Council and the TII had progressed the vital matter of ensuring greater safety at the Shronedarragh and Upper Barraduff junctions onto the N22 in the village. The Council replied that the Road De-

sign office is currently examining the N.22 in the village in order to establish the geometric, constraints, road condition, signage and accident history with a view to developing potential solutions to address the problems. The findings and report when finalised will be forwarded to the TII for its consider-

ation. It is expected that the report will issue in April of 2017.

Councillor Gleeson stated that much concern has been expressed about these junctions by residents, in particular by a deputation to Council by the Community group."

The capital programme announced earlier this year provides for the replacement and refurbishment of 90 nursing homes across the country over the next 5 years.

Under this programme it is proposed to deliver a new community Hospital Unit in Killarney by 2021, this will replace the existing facilities where the physical environment requires significant improvement.

Michael Healy Rae says " this is a great announcement for Killarney and indeed the entire county as we all know the shortage of long term beds for our elderly is at a crisis level and it is vital that the elderly in the area can be cared for so that their families can visit them regularly if they live near by and I am glad to hear that Killarney is getting this urgently needed unit"



SIPTU calls on the Minister for Health to immediately investigate why two newly built, state of the art buildings in the Kerry Mental Health Services are lying idle for the past two years.

These include a 4 bed intensive care unit for mental health in Kerry University Hospital as well as a 40 bed purpose built unit, 'Deer Lodge' in Killarney. The latter will accommodate patients presently resident in the O'Connor unit at the rear of St Finans Hospital as well as providing 10 beds for rehabilitation purposes. The HSE have committed millions of euro to providing these buildings which are necessary

to deliver a progressive and modern mental health service in Kerry. However, the HSE is undermining its own positive work by continuing to delay the opening of these buildings and allowing patients remain in old dilapidated buildings, which are no longer fit for purpose.

In addition hundreds of thousands of euro has been spent preparing residents in Cluain Fionnain, an intellectual disability unit in Killarney for transfer into residences in the Community. This process has been ongoing for over two years with very little results to show. A number of outside agencies have been involved in the process and have cost the taxpayer needless sums of money with very

JUST WHAT THE DOCTOR ORDERED AS CROKES CRUSH COROFIN

DR CROKES 2-11 COROFIN 0-8

When Dr Crokes last won the All-Ireland Club SFC title back in 1992, one of the great images of the day was that of a young red-haired boy in the middle of the team proudly supporting club's colours.

Like Dr Martin Luther King, that young boy had a dream. That dream was to win an All-Ireland Club SFC Medal with his beloved black and amber.

Colm Cooper would go on to become one of his club's and county's most enduring and brilliant footballers.

Dr Crokes' mentor Harry O'Neill summed up what qualifying for the decider means to the Lewis Road Club and was keen to stress that they had won nothing yet.

O'Neill paid tribute to the team and admitted that the panel this year is stronger than it has been in recent years.

"Well I think our panel is probably stronger, in fairness, and I mean you have to lose something to win something and if you can't learn from the experiences that you're putting down at the moment which is having been beaten in three All-Ireland semi-finals then there's something wrong with us.

He paid tribute to Colm Cooper and spoke of Cooper's importance to the team and the club as a whole. "Colm has been fantastic for us all through the years. He is 33 years of age now and it would be great for him if we could get up the steps of Croke Park. But look, that's another day's work," added Harry O'Neill.

This was another typical Dr Crokes performance as they proved just why they the top side in this competition this year with another clinical display.

The Killarney side were underdogs when they faced a hotly fancied Corofin but Pat O'Shea's side firmly put the pain of three semi-final defeats in recent years behind them as they advanced to the final for the first time since 2006 where they face Derry's Slaughtneil in Croke Park on St Patrick's Day.

A large battalion from Killarney travelled to Limerick for the occasion and they thoroughly enjoyed the victory. Former county star Kieran O'Leary was outstanding as he tormented the Corofin defence at every opportunity and finished the game with five points, all from play in a man of the match performance while Daithi Casey showed just why he was named as the Munster Player of the All-Ireland Club series with another power-packed performance, which must have impressed Kerry boss Eamonn Fitzmaurice.

Colm Cooper had a relatively quiet afternoon but was involved in a lot of Crokes moves which led to scores.

Crokes got off to a great start when Brian Looney and the outstanding Kieran O'Leary (2) added early minors which saw them take a 0-3 to 0-0 lead after five minutes.

Corofin's Ian Burke and Daithi Casey exchanged points before Michael Farragher added Corofin's second to leave Crokes ahead by 0-4 to 0-2 with 12 minutes gone. Kieran O'Leary added another Crokes score before points from Jason Leonard from a free and Gary Sice reduced the Crokes lead to the minimum.

Corofin were now more in the game but their hopes suffered a critical blow in the 26th minute when Gavin O'Shea goaled for the Killarney men, O'Shea's shot for a point somehow deceived Corofin goalkeeper Bernard Power and ended up in the net. Kieran O'Leary added another Crokes point and an exchange of scores between Gary Sice and Kieran O'Leary meant that the Kerry representatives led 1-7 to 0-5 at the short whistle.

SECOND HALF

Corofin resumed in determined fashion but Colm Cooper, from a free and Daithi Casey, also from a free, added points to extend Crokes' advantage.

Corofin were now on the ropes but to their credit they mounted a decent fightback. Jason Leonard pointed a free as the Galway side mounted a series of attacks. They missed a glorious goal chance in the 37th minute when their danger man Gary Sice blazed wide.

Dylan Wall landed a brace of points for Corofin both within a minute of each other as the Connacht champions cut the gap to four, 1-9 to 0-8 with 17 minutes remaining.

The next score would certainly prove crucial



and thankfully it went to the Crokes and what a score it was.

Daithi Casey, one of many Crokes' heroes on the day, made a typical sally up the field and set up sub Jordan Kiely who finished in style for his side's second major of the game.

That was effectively game, set and match to Dr Crokes as Corofin's day went from bad to worse. Gary Sice missed a convertible free as Crokes, who had a commanding advantage were content to close out the game.

Substitute Tony Brosnan and goalkeeper Shane Murphy from a free rounded off the scoring as Pat O'Shea's side advanced to the decider where they meet Derry's Slaughtneil on St Patrick's Day.

- A cup of home made Vegetable soup: carrots, onion, squash, garlic, and any veg of choice.. try keep away from potatoes ... all cooked up with stock and water, add herbs of choice to flavour, and blend if prefer smooth consistency. This will do for a few snacks and is handy on the go.
- Stewed apple and cinnamon with a handful of toasted walnuts when cooked with a dollop of coconut yoghurt, make up a large batch and it will do for a few days so less time prepping.
- Guacamole with vegetable sticks(carrots, and celery great with this)

These all require a little bit of preparation but very simple to make and will do you for the week so no excuses get prepping and get some nice containers to bring them along with u in the car or in your handbag to work or out and about.


















TAX Matters with



START YOUR OWN BUSINESS RELIEF

The **Start Your Own Business** scheme provides for relief from Income Tax for long term unemployed individuals who start a new business. The scheme will provide an exemption from Income Tax up to a maximum of €40,000 per annum for a period of two years to individuals who set up a qualifying business; having been unemployed for a period of at least 12 months prior to starting the business. It runs from 25th October 2013 to 31st December 2018.

Who qualifies for this relief?

You may qualify for this relief if:

(a) you have been unemployed for twelve months or more, and (b) during that period you were in receipt of any of the following:

- crediting contributions
- jobseeker's allowance
- jobseeker's benefit
- the one-parent family payment
- partial capacity payment

Periods of time spent on certain training courses and schemes will be treated as part of a period of unemployment. If you were entitled to jobseeker's allowance or jobseeker's benefit immediately before starting on the training course or scheme, then any allowance paid for attending such a course will be treated as if it were jobseeker's allowance or jobseeker's benefit.

Examples of training courses and schemes would include FÁS training courses, Community Employment Schemes, Job Initiative and Back to Education Schemes.

MAYO CATCH KERRY IN THE END TO CLAIM VITAL WIN

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS FROM A BITTERLY COLD AUSTIN STACK PARK LAST SATURDAY NIGHT.

KERRY 1-10 MAYO 0-15

Mayo inflicted the first loss of 2017 on Eamon Fitzmaurice's charges when they came to Tralee and plundered the precious pair of Allianz NFL points following the sides Round 2 clash in Tralee on Saturday evening. 8,991 paying customers passed through the turnstiles at the Tralee venue and the Mayo fans who made the journey to the Kerry capital certainly went home the happier. The main stand was packed to capacity and had to be closed half an hour before the start of the game and the electric atmosphere really caught the imagination of the attendance.

Respective managers Eamon Fitzmaurice and Stephen Rochford were forced to make changes prior to the start, with Kerry's marquee forward James O'Donoghue ruled out through injury, being replaced by his Legion Clubmate Conor Keane, while Mayo lined out without Evan Regan and Alan Freeman, who were replaced by Conor O'Shea and veteran stalwart Andy Moran respectively.

Andy Moran, Eir TV's Man of the Match, really caused havoc for the Kerry defence and posted three points as Mayo despite the late dismissal of Tom Parsons on a second yellow card hung on to claim the spoils. Kerry's night went from bad to worse as they created five gilt-edged goal scoring opportunities, converting just one. They lost Paul Geaney and Killian Young through first half hamstring injuries while Ronan Shanahan was forced to leave the game in the 57th minute due to concussion, having made a dramatic goal line clearance. With the outstanding Jack Barry leading from midfield, Kerry began brightly with points from Barry, Jack Savage and Paul Geaney which gave them a 0-3 to 0-0 lead by the third

Kerry were growing in confidence and were unlucky not to goal in the 5th minute when Adrian Spillane's goalbound shot thundered off the crossbar and back into play. Mayo's opening scores came from Tom Parsons and a Cillian O'Connor free (the Ballintubber man converted nine from placed balls out of 12 attempts), before Paul Geaney pointed a free at the other end to leave Kerry leading 0-4 to 0-2 with 8 minutes gone.

Kerry missed another golden opportunity in the 11th minute when they were awarded a penalty following a late foul on Adrian Spillane but David Moran's effort lacked conviction and

ALTERNATIVE FOR TABLE SALT:

Salt is one of the most widely used and oldest forms of food seasoning, it's not very expensive, and it has many great benefits you might not know about – here are just a few:

- * Wash your shower curtain with saltwater when you first buy it, and it will never grow mould.
- * To relieve the itching caused by midge bites, simply moisten the tip of your finger with water, dip it into salt, and then rub the mixture over the affected area.
- * Cleaning copper with salt works wonders. Just mix this seasoning with vinegar and flour, or add some lemon juice to it and rub the tarnished surface.
- * Sprinkle a little salt in the frying pan before adding meat or fish to fry. This will keep hot oil from splattering.
- * Eliminate bad odours from smelly shoes by putting cloth bags full of salt into them. Let these bags do their work, and your shoes will smell better in a couple of hours. You can also just sprinkle some salt inside your shoes, shake them, and vacuum up the salt.
- * Keep fresh fruit and veggie slices from turning brown by putting them into a bowl filled with saltwater.
- * The oils in garlic and onion leave a scent on your hands after slicing. However, the solution is quite simple: wet your hands, rub them all over with salt, then rinse.
- * To make your own all-natural air freshener you will simply need 1/2-1 cup of salt and 20-30 drops of any essential oil or rose petals. Arrange all of your ingredients in a bowl or jar, and get ready to enjoy your fresh-smelling home. You can also use the peel of half an orange as a natural bowl.
- * If a grease fire in your kitchen is getting out of control, pour salt on it. It will cut off the flow of oxygen and smother the flame. It's always a good idea to keep a container of salt handy when cooking with cooking fat etc.
- * A paste made of lemon juice and salt can be used to clean stainless steel sinks and fixtures and it works even better than popular chemical cleaners.

PREGNANT WOMEN ARE **ADVISED STAY AWAY FROM** LICUORICE:

Doctors have long advised pregnant women to avoid consuming too much of anything that contains liquorice root because it contains a



chemical called glycyrrhizin. In normal, healthy people, glycyrrhizin tastes bittersweet, can help soothe sore throats, and may even combat liver disease. But in pregnant women, the compound had been associated with low birth weight and slowed development.

In the study, published recently in the American Journal of Epidemiology, a team of Finnish researchers followed 920 mothers who, when they gave birth in 1998, reported how much liquorice they consumed. Doctors followed up with the 378 children 13 years later. A series of psychological and physical assessments found that the children whose mothers consumed high levels of liquorice scored lower on cognition tests by an average of about seven points, especially in verbal productivity and memory. They were also three times as likely to have been diagnosed with ADHD; puberty had set in earlier among the girls in the group, which has been associated with increased likelihood for diseases like cancer later in life.

Though this study presents a strong association liquorice consumption between developmental issues, its design means that scientists can't identify the exact cause of the issues. If the pregnant women reported their consumption correctly, glycyrrhizin might be the cause, but there also might have been other factors at play (such as the way the baby was delivered or environmental exposure to other kinds of chemicals). These findings support researchers' earlier assumptions about the effect of liquorice on developing foetuses, but they would need to conduct further studies to be certain. Plus, the researchers note, the limitations of the study mean there appears to be "no safe exposure"—that is, they don't know how much liquorice it takes for the negative effects to set in. Short of more information, it's smart for pregnant women to avoid liquorice altogether.

BABYSITTER DONATES PART OF HER LIVER TO SAVE THE **BABY'S LIFE:**

Kiersten Miles had only been babysitting 9-month-old Talia Rosko for a few weeks before she decided to make a big sacrifice that would end up saving the baby's life.

Talia was born with biliary atresia – a rare liver

disease that can be deadly if not treated within the first couple years of life. Although she was on the transplant list to receive a new liver, her parents were told that she wouldn't live beyond two years if a suitable donor could not be found. When Kiersten was first hired by the Roskos in June 2016, she became curious about the process of donating an organ. She made an appointment to get tested, to see if she was a match for Talia – as fate would have it, she was.

The selfless 22-year-old college student was never hindered by the thought that surgery would be much of a sacrifice.

After a 14-hour procedure at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Talia and Kiersten spent a week in recovery before being released with a healthy diagnosis.

"After going through the entire process from start to finish, I would 100 percent do it again. I think it's very important that people know exactly what they are volunteering to do and what the recovery is like, but it's such a small price to pay in comparison to saving a life," said Kiersten.

Locke and several other New Yorkers started scrubbing away at the markings.

"I've never seen so many people simultaneously reach into their bags and pockets looking for tissues and Purel. Within about two minutes, all the Nazi symbolism was gone".

A MONKEY FOUND A HOMELESS PUPPY LIVING ON THE STREET AND ADOPTED HIM:

In Rode, India, locals were touched by the compassion of a Rhesus macaque monkey who had adopted a homeless puppy. Town locals thought it was bizarre at first, but the apparent love between the two animals was too much to deny which just goes to show that love knows no species.

The monkey cares for the little puppy and keeps the little one close as if she were caring for her own baby and doesn't let the puppy out of her sight for a moment and has even defended him from other street dogs. When villagers, started to leave food out for the pair, the monkey always allowed the puppy to eat first.

The details of how the two met are unclear, but the puppy, who was likely born on the streets, seems well taken care of.

It's remarkable that a difference in species didn't keep this monkey from becoming a responsible parent to a puppy who otherwise would not have had anyone to care for him. That just goes to show that compassion has no limit!

YOUR DATE'S BIGGEST TURN OFF COULD BE YOUR PHONE:

Match.com released the findings from its seventh annual Singles in America study recently, showcasing trends in dating rituals and preferences.

Match surveyed 5,509 single men and women, ages 18 to 70+ years, across the U.S. to capture the attitudes from singles across generations when it comes to love, sex, and relationships. The study revealed that some of the biggest turns off involved a mobile device.

Out of those surveyed, 75% said they don't like it when their date answers the phone without prior explanation. People also reported getting upset when their date sends or reads a text message. It actually seems that the idea of a



phone being present at all is frowned upon by many. The survey shows that 58% of single people don't want to see a phone on the table, especially if it's face up. It's not unusual for Middle Eastern airlines like Emirates, Etihad and Qatar to allow these birds of prey to travel inside the cabins. In fact, the "Pets allowed in the passenger cabin" section of the Qatar website specifically mentions only two pets: service dogs ... and falcons (the airline only allows six inside per flight).

Falcons in the Middle East are even issued special passports in an effort to prevent smuggling. Their passport ID numbers match numbers on bands they must each wear around one of their legs. The passports first became available in 2002. By 2013, they'd been issued to more than 28,000 falcons.

Falcons are a big status symbol in the Middle East, especially in the United Arab Emirates (UAE), where they're the country's national bird. They are pampered by their rich owners and the Abu Dhabi Falcon Hospital is dedicated to state-of-the-art treatment for them

The falcons live with their owners family in the living room, some sleep in the same bedroom and like the owners, they have the same place in the car.

Falcons are also used in racing events, known as the exclusive "sport of sheiks" in the UAE. The top prize in one competition is €125,000 and a brand-new Bentley (the price tags for these luxury vehicles are around €170,000 and up).

ELDERLY WOMAN IN A BATHTUB FLOWN THROUGH THE AIR BY A TORNADO:

An elderly Texas woman went for a once-ina-lifetime ride when a tornado picked up the bathtub she was taking sheltering in, spun it in the air, and put her back down in the woods without injury.

75-year-old Charlesetta Williams was watching television with her son when the twister approached her home. They raced to the bathroom and she hid under a blanket in the tub for shelter, a choice that proved to be wise.

The tornado continued in a northeast direction, crossing CR 3300 at which point it removed the roof of her home then lifted the tub out of the house and deposited it in the woods with Ms. Williams still inside the tub.

Following the incident Ms. Williams said "I wasn't looking. I was under that quilt, I feel blessed to be alive and I don't want to ride through another one."

MEET LILOU - SAN FRANCISCO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT THERAPY PIG:

To help airline passengers with travel anxiety, the San Francisco International Airport has hired the nation's first airport therapy pig. She has joined the airport's Wag Brigade which includes about 300 cats and dogs whose presence help make the strains of travel a bit easier and was chosen for her winning personality, and her overall cuteness

She spends her days greeting travellers in a series of costumes and she loves performing tricks for her audiences and when she's not on airport duty, she visits several other facilities in San Francisco, including senior centres and hospitals.

SIBERIAN MAN BUILDS HIS VILLAGE A CHURCH OUT OF SNOW:

Aleksandra Bityokhin solved his remote village's church shortage by building a 10-foot-tall Orthodox house of worship out of snow.

The 41 year old former construction worker said it took him about 45 days to carve the small church out of snow so that Orthodox residents of his village, Sosnovka, would have somewhere to worship without traveling dozens of miles to the nearest facility.

"As soon as the first snow fell in Sosnovka, I prayed and got down to work, first I created a draft of the chapel. I decided it would have 12 arches, in honour of the 12 apostles. Then I began to press the snow, step by step, laying the foundation and the walls of the church" Mr. Bitvokhin said.



GARDENING

FOCUS ON EARLY SPRING FLOWERING SHRUBS

Now is a good time if you are planning a new garden or trying to add some colour to an established garden to plant some early flowering spring shrubs. One of the best known shrubs is the Camellia and these popular shrubs are starting to flower in most places at the moment. The Camellia is a very valuable shrub in the garden as it can give a focal point to any shrubbery all year round with its glossy green leaves and showy blooms from early spring. A lot of people think that Camellias are a difficult shrub to grow, but in fact they are no more difficult than Rhododendrons or azaleas, and most varieties on sale now are hardy. When choosing the spot to plant your Camellia, make sure it is sheltered from cold winds as they can damage the flowering buds as can frost. When planting your Camellia make sure to

mix plenty of moss peat with the earth, rather than on its own around the plant, as it will tend to root out quicker. Camellias are also ideal for growing in containers. Remember if you are planting your Camellia in the ground, that it might be small initially but most will grow to the size of a small tree, so allow plenty of room around it. There is very little maintenance with Camellias only to prune out old dead wood, clean up the old blooms that fall to the ground, and to mulch around the base of the plants every spring with some moss peat. There are a lot of other good spring flowering shrubs, here is a list of just a few: Forsythia, Cythisus, Corylus, Berberis, Darwunnii, Ribes and Skimmia.

Next week I will focus on hedging.


