






HUNT FOR ARSONISTS CONTINUES By Rebecca O'Reilly

A special Garda team has been set up to track down the s culprits who started the huge fire that threatened to damage homes and destroyed thousands of acres in Killarney National Park last weekend.

The fires began Wednesday afternoon and lasted until the early hours of Saturday morning destroying flora and fauna in the vast parkland

This week members of An Garda Síochána, the Department of Agriculture, NPWS and Kerry Fire & Rescue held a meeting to form an inter-agency response team.

The fires were eventually extinguished following trojan work by the fire service, civil defence and the Air Corps helicopter which scooped water from the Upper Lake near Killarney on Friday to put out the blaze.

The Mangerton and Torc areas were the worst affected with several homes barely escaping. All efforts will now go in to finding the culprits who started the fires six weeks after the season for legally burning scrubland had closed.

Betty Rohan, or to use her maiden name, Betty Neeson, is a native of Killarney. She comes from a family with a strong artistic flair. Her nephew Joe

Neeson is a well-known sculptor whose bronze Sea Eagle is displayed in Main Street, Killarney. Her niece Mary Neeson specialises in elegant ceramics at the Blue Pool Gallery in the old Post Office in Muckross. And her other niece Lorraine Neeson does art installations and lectures.

Betty is a self-taught artist. She began painting in the early seventies, and studied through the books of Killarney library. She has exhibited through the years working in oils, acrylics, watercolours and has done some icon work too. This is Betty's second "one-man" exhibition in aid of the Kerry Stars Special Olympics Club in

Killarney. We are all aware of good causes but it is only when we are touched as individuals or families that we realise the tremendous value, the strength of commitment and the demands on the time on supporters of such a cause.

The emphasis is on taking part rather than winning at all costs.

Killarney was very proud to send Janet O'Donoghue of Glenflesk to the Shanghai World Games in 2007. In 2011 Michael O'Leary played golf with distinction at the Athens Games and this year in 2015 Brendan O'Connell of Kerry Stars will swim at the Los Angeles Games. While these athletes are in the public eye, all the athletes who train every week and who do their best deserve just as much credit, praise and encouragement. "I wish to thank the staff of Killarney Library who gave me great help in organizing this event", said Betty. Finally let us remember the oath recited at the Opening Ceremony of each games:

"Let me win. But if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt." This is to remind everyone, including the athletes, that they are part of a brave tradition and that the goal is to compete with their whole effort and to exhibit bravery by pushing themselves to ever greater heights.

The Official Opening will take place on Tuesday April 28th 2015 at 7pm by Cllr John Joe Culloty, Cathaoirleach of Killarney Municipal District and the exhibition will run until Friday 29th May.

QUIZ TIME FOR KENYA EDUCATION PROJECT

A big hearted Killarney teachers is continuing in his efforts to support children in Kenya on their educational journey.

Eddie Sheehy, a Career Guidance teacher spends a month every summer in Kenya, accompanied by his daughter Triona, who is a primary school teacher helping students in the village of EmbulBul, Nairobi with their education.

As part of the fundraising Eddie is planning his annual table quiz in aid of the Kenya Education Project for Thursday April 23rd in the Castlerosse Hotel Killarney at 8 30 p.m.

The table quiz is a major fundraiser for the project which was set up in 2003. All funds raised go to help students with their education. The Project is also involved in a number of other ways in the village, by providing funding for a feeding programme, assisting in the work of local volunteers who visit families in need and working with a local soccer Academy. Each year some money is set aside for school building and for equipment and badly needed equipment for the day to day running of the schools.

Since the outset of the Project the support and generosity of people around Killarney has been wonderful and a big thank you is due to the loyalty and continued support of all. This generous support ensures that the Project continues to help young people achieve their dream of completing second level education.



Know Your Rights: HEALTH INSURANCE AND LIFETIME COMMUNITY RATING

APRIL 2015

OUESTION

I don't have health insurance and I've been told it will be more expensive for me after 1 May because of my age. Can you explain what is changing?

ANSWER

Up to now, the cost of an inpatient health insurance policy has been the same for everyone regardless of age. This is known as community rating. From 1 May 2015 a system of lifetime community rating will apply, which means that people may be charged more if they are older when they first take out health insurance. This change will not affect you if you already have health insurance before 1 May 2015 and continue to be insured.

If you are taking out health insurance after this date and you are 35 years of age or older, your annual premium will increase depending on the age you are when you start - by 2% for each year over 34. This increase is called a loading. So, for example, if you are aged 35 there will be a 2% loading, but if you start health insurance at 39 there will be a 10% loading. The maximum loading will be 70%.

If you previously had health insurance but let it lapse, the period for which you had health insurance will be taken into account to reduce the loading that applies.

An allowance (of up to three years) can also be made if you gave up health insurance since the start of 2008 because of unemployment.

People who move to Ireland from another country after 1 May 2015 can avoid having a loading applied if they take out health insurance within 9 months and continue to be insured.

If you have health insurance, you can change your health insurance policy or change your insurer without affecting your loading. A gap in insurance of up to 13 weeks is allowed.



KILLARNEY YOUTHREACH STUDENTS GIVE A HELPING HAND TO KILLARNEY TIDY TOWNS



With just seven weeks remaining before the Leaving Certificate and Junior Certificate exams get underway on Wednesday, 3rd June, candidates can face up to these exams with considerable optimism. Results achieved in the state exams continue to be very impressive and the current generation of young people is well able to successfully negotiate the hurdle of exams. In addition, places in further and higher education courses are very



The stigma of failure is long gone from the state exams. There was a time when failure in Irish meant overall failure. Thankfully, those days are far behind us. Every candidate's performance is now acknowledged by individual certification. The State Examinations Commission (SEC) also provides a range of exam supports, known as "reasonable accommodations," for candidates with physical, visual, hearing and learning difficulties in order to remove, as far as possible, the impact of the disability on the candidate's performance in the exams. This enlightened "reasonable accommodations" facility ensures that no candidate for the state exams is disadvantaged because of a disability.

Despite the criticisms that have been levelled at the state exams, they have stood the test of time and they provide the Irish economy with one of the best educated workforces in the western world. Both Junior and Leaving Certificate exams are invariably acknowledged as an impartial, unbiased and comprehensive test of each candidate's level of achievement. The vast majority of candidates can be fairly certain that they will do well in the state exams. A large number of them will achieve results that are considerably above average.

Despite all the hype about exam pressure, all that is required is a cool head, a positive attitude, optimum use of the remaining weeks, good personal and time management, plenty of nutritious food, rest and a programme of exercise to burn off any excess stress. Approach the exams with confidence, do your best during the remaining weeks and at the actual exams. Then forget about them and enjoy the summer. Exams should be kept in perspective. They are just another hurdle on the fascinating journey through life; a hurdle which thousands of candidates negotiate very successfully year after year.

With second level schools reopening on Monday for the final term of the academic year, the oral language and practical music exams get underway over a two week period. Practical exams in Art, Construction Studies and Engineering follow from Monday 27th April to Friday, 8th May. The Leaving Cert Vocational Programme (LCVP) written exam is scheduled for Wednesday, 6th May. Engage fully with the oral and practical exams which you face in the next few weeks. As the saying goes, "Tosnú maith leath na hoibre." A goód start is definitely half the work so the next few weeks provide you with a golden opportunity to bank very precious marks. Of course, in the final term, the written papers become the major focus of attention as the June written exams draw closer with each passing day.

In the next article, I'll give you some advice on how to make the most of the last term before next June's exams.

WATCH OUT FOR CHILDREN ON THE ROADS

With summer just around the corner, the Road Safety Authority (RSA) is asking motorists to be aware of children when using the roads and to take extreme care when driving. Parents and guardians are also being reminded to teach their children about road safety and ensure they play safely during the summer holidays.

The RSA is also reminding parents to teach their children the importance of road safety and ensure that underage children are supervised if walking or cycling.

A spokesperson for the RSA has said "It's really important for parents and guardians to teach their child just how important it is to be safe on the road as they are our most vulnerable road-users. Your child will learn from what you do, so make sure you always set the right example. When you get into the car, put on your seatbelt, no matter how short the journey. Make sure your children are safe on their

bicycles by ensuring they wear a helmet and high visibility clothing. And if they are playing in an area where there are cars, make sure they play safely," he added.

THE RSA HAS THE FOLLOWING ADVICE FOR **PARENTS AND MOTORISTS:**

Travelling by Car:

- Motorists, be aware of children when driving, particularly through residential areas.
- All children should be restrained when travelling in a car.
- Select a restraint that is based on your child's weight and height and is suitable for the type
- Remember it's safer if children travel in the rear of a car.
- Never leave children alone in a car.

Walking:

- Small children should not cross roads alone. They cannot decide how far away a car is or how fast it is going.
- Children walking on country roads should wear reflective armbands and bright clothing
- If there is no footpath, walk on the righthand side of the road facing oncoming traffic keeping as close as possible to the side of the road.
- Show your child how to cross the road by example. Choose safe places to cross and take time to explain why i.e. footbridges, zebra or pelican crossings.

Cycle Safety:

- Make sure they are highly visible by wearing a reflective belt and bright clothes and wear a bicycle safety helmet on all journeys.
- Check that the bicycle's brakes, lights, reflector and bell are in good working order.

SUMMER MAINTENANCE TIPS

Summer is a great time for driving, but the improved weather can cause its own problems. To prevent an unexpected summer walk, here are some tips to prevent a breakdown.

UNDERSTAND THE SIGNS

- Pull over immediately if you detect a burning smell or see steam or smoke coming from the engine. If you don't, you run the risk of permanently damaging your engine and it could end up costing you a lot more than an annoying delay on the side of the road.
- Remember to check your instruments regularly, and stop immediately if the gauge shows an unusual reading - very high or very
- If you decide to add some coolant to an overheated radiator, DO NOT REMOVE THE

RADIATOR CAP WHEN THE ENGINE IS HOT!

First let the engine cool and then make sure the engine is running while you add the coolant so that the sudden change in temperature doesn't cause damage to the engine.

ELECTRICAL SYSTEM

- The main causes of heat related breakdowns are failures of the cooling and electrical systems. The stress put on the electrical system, especially the battery, can be hard to predict. Here are some common troubleshooting points Cooling system
- Look at the hoses and drive belts for cracks, wear and tear.
- When the engine is cold, check the level and condition of the coolant.
- Externally look for at the radiator core for

insects and other blockages and clean them out by hosing down. Don't attempt to brush the core, as the fragile cooling fins could be damaged.

 Don't ever try to drive in an overheated car as you risk damaging the engine. If you can't find the problem, let the car completely cool down, check the coolant level and have the car checked at the nearest service station,

Air Conditioning

• Make sure your air-conditioning is working efficiently. If in doubt, have it checked by a qualified professional. The most important benefit of effective air-conditioning is that it reduces driver fatigue, keeping the driver alert, refreshed and more comfortable.

ROWING **TO RIO**

The Monika Dukaraska Blog. The story of a Professional Athlete



Never underestimate the Irish. Our first international regatta this season and two gold medals in the bag. The focus for

the past week was on the 2015 Piediluco Regatta in Italy (Memorial Paolo d'Aloja Regatta). It is an invitational international regatta with 25 nations competing for medals this year. In the lead up to it, we completed a solid block of an aerobic/endurance training, which consisted of long distance rowing sessions, It gave us a great paddling platform, which will feed into our racing speed later on in the season. There was no specific race preparation conducted for this regatta as this weekend was used as groundwork for the European Rowing Championships at the end of May.

I arrived in Piediluco on Wednesday night after an entire day of travelling. This day would be considered a day off from training. The following day we arrived at the rowing venue and we rigged our boats. We had two short training sessions on the course to loosen out after travelling and to learn more about the course and the conditions. We were based only a short drive away from the course, which was very beneficial as our races were usually early in the morning.

There were seven entries in the Women's Pair event on both days. Piediluco Regatta is run over three days and takes place from the 10th to the 12th of April, It's a double regatta. This means that competitors race the heats on Friday to qualify for Saturday's finals. On Saturday afternoon, there are heats again to gain qualification for Sunday's finals. Due to Republic of South Africa pulling out due to medical reasons, we ended up having a straight final on both days, the Saturday and the Sunday.

It was my first international regatta in the Women's Pair event. Leonora Kennedy and I raced in the Women's Double Scull in 2013 but it was our first competitive race in the Women's Pair. We began this project early in March 2015 and since then we raced only at the National trials. This event was a great learning curve for both of us as a crew as well as individually. I was very uncertain of what to expect, as we are not in a position to race against other pairs at home in Ireland. The thought of racing other nations in the same boat category was exciting but scary at the same time. The first race was like testing the waters, we went off the starting blocks slightly behind the competitors but we fast discovered that we can go harder and started catching other crews and leading the race with 500m to go. It was our first competitive race and a first win. This gave us a great confidence boost. After the race, we analysed our race strategy and adjusted the race plan for Sunday. On Sunday, we decided to lead from start to finish. We did just that! We went off the blocks much harder and kept the rate higher. We were confident as a crew. The focus of our rowing was on the process behind every stroke rather than the outcome. The outcome however was the same – first place for Ireland. Spain has put a huge push with 500m to go but we held them off, keeping our own rhythm and staying in our zone. The results were as follows: Ireland 1st, Spain 2nd and Italy 3rd on both days.

Piediluco Regatta happened to be my best regatta to date. Two races - two gold medals - two trophies - two victories. I am truly delighted and highly motivated to train harder and prepare well for the European Rowing Championships in Poznan in Poland. Next stop is Varese, Italy for a training camp until 22 April.

With Dublin defeating Cork its sets up a Kerry /Cork semi final clash on Sunday 26th April.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW

Norway is a country that I had always wanted to visit but never got around to it so when I realised that former Legion and Kerry minor goalkeeper, Kevin O'Donoghue has been living here since 2008, it was the perfect excuse to come here. As I make my way through the Arrivals hall of Moss International Airport in Oslo, I am greeted by the Woodlawn Park native who is accompanied by his four year old son, Sean Darby who is obviously named after his late grandfather.

Kevin tells me that his wife Bekit is busy at home preparing a typical Norwegian dish "Lapkaus" for us which he quickly tells me after seeing my skeptical glance that it is very similar to Irish stew.

Son of Margaret and the late Darby, who passed away in 2011 only months after meeting his grandson, Kevin has two brothers Robert [Killarnev] and David [Dublin] who both played for the club and a sister Zelie who is still living

As the three of us travel the one hour journey to Kevins home just outside the city, I note that the weather is quite similar to home at the moment but interestingly he says that the summers can get very warm with near twenty four hour daylight but this only serves to counteract the many snowfilled months of winter.

We use the the travel time to catch up on Kevins footballing days, not that his sporting days are over as he hopes to join up shortly with a newly formed Gaa club in Oslo. He tells me that it was Jim Trant that initially recruited Kevin to the club, a man that Kevin always respected along with men of the calibre of Dan Moynihan, Mickey Culloty and Sean Costigan. He says that they did trojan work back in a time when the amenities were substandard to nowadays, he laughs as he recalls togging out under a tree at St Finians pitch compared to the facilities that players have today.

I asked Kevin what made him want to be a goalkeeper and he told me that he didn't actually start playing in goals until he reached U16 level which makes it all the more remarkable that just two years later in 1994 he would play in goal for the Kerry minors only to lose out in Munster to Cork on a side that included Dr Crokes defender John Cronin and Gaeltact legend Dara O'Sé. That same year, Kevin tells me he enjoyed one of his two favourite sporting highlights when he was part of the "Sem" team that won the Corn Ui Mhuiri cup, his other being the previous year when he was on the Legion senior panel when they won the County league Div 1 final, a day he remembers for more reasons than just winning the game as he remembers that the entire squad were going to town that night to celebrate and with Kevin having school the following morning, he wasn't allowed to join his team mates but Kevin wasnt going to miss out and by the virtue of his bedroom window, he made it to town unbeknownsed to his parents Festivities ensued into the small hours and Kevin got home with just enough time to brush his teeth before being called for school. I asked him who he remembers as the top footballers in town at the time and he said witout hesitation that Denis Doody was the nicest footballer that he ever watched playing and with some reluctancy he added that Diarmuid O'Donoghue could give a decent display every now and again. Other players that stood out for Kevin were Legions John Cronin and his cousin Tom O'Connor and



Crokes players Traoloch O'Lionard and Sean O'Donoghue.

I asked Kevin if he had ever travelled anywhere else before coming here to Norway and he told me that he only came here in 2008 but that he actually left Killarney in 2000 when he went to the USA along with another Woodlawn park native Brian Connolly and he stayed there until 2005 when he went back to Ireland for a couple of years before heading up here to the land of the Fjords. I knew that Kevin worked in some part of construction but wasnt quite sure what trade and he tells me that he is an electrician with a company that work on many of the large city contracts, having served his apprenticeship with Killarneys Denis O'Carroll. As we neared Kevins home, I asked Kevin if there was anything that he really misses from Killarney and straight away he says family, and then he added that he also misses the craic and he thinks that there is a banter at home that is unique to Killarney. He says that although he misses certain things from home, he finds it great to be kept updated with town and club affairs from friends like Enda Walsh and Timmy Doolan.

Just as our interview is almost complete, so is our journey ,as we pull into Kevins driveway , timing is perfect.

There is still uncertainty about how far milk prices will fall this year but Jim Woulfe's comment about an average of 30c/litre being optimistic is comforting. It is not a commitment but it is a solid aspiration from Dairygold. There are so many factors to be included in any prediction that it is hard to be accurate. When will output in the US start to fall and when will Asian buyers reenter the market are just two of the unknowns.

. The fall in prices to date will take some of the projected increase in EU production off the table but unfortunately milk price in the US has defied the market rationale in recent months. That has started to change and a reduction in milk price there will be quickly followed by a correction in milk output, especially with beef prices at historical highs. The US farmer is a veteran of volatile prices at this stage. When market returns are good, cows are retained including those normally culled, they will use better quality rations, more cows will be treated with bst to enhance performance and some herds will move to three times a day milking. But when the price slide begins these businesses will quickly offload less productive cows and cut out unprofitable practices. Marginally profitable milk will disappear quickly. Potentially 20% of the cows destined for slaughter last year got a reprieve because of the high milk price, their day will shortly come and an extra year of culls will go more quickly than normal.. US farmers have seen this drama played out like clockwork over the

last decade or longer, approximately every third year milk price drops to an unsustainable level, rises to a new peak and then repeats the process. When you are dealing with a perishable commodity, the price is very susceptible to small swings in supply and demand, understanding this dynamic is vital to our future here as well. The reason why it took so long for US price to follow European and New Zealand prices down will be of interest, with 12% of their output now traded internationally, it was reasonable to assume it would happen quickly. The pain we feel here is magnified elsewhere, our fellow producers in Northern Europe are our likely competitors in expansion, with the exception of Britain their ability to control production costs is limited. High cost systems lead to losses in years like 2015 especially where farm indebtedness is higher than here in Ireland. In New Zealand the situation is worse, many farmers have invested in high cost systems in recent years and have been comfortable gearing their farm to 100% of its value, presuming on capital appreciation and their own labour to pull them out of the risk that it poses. A prolonged dip in price will hurt and may drive many under. Time will tell if Woulfe got it right but the reality is that without the dip there could not be a peak, managing both sensibly is the key to success. My brother has a humourous slide that sums it up nicely "it is only when the tide goes out that you realise who has been swimming in the nude".





WORKPLACE STRESS II

Last week we looked at various strategies to reduce workplace stress. These focused primarily on the one thing we have control over in our lives i.e. ourselves. This week we will look at more key ways to deal with stress in our lives. Knowing we are stressed when we are stressed is important. Each person is different - so know your own 'stress busters'. The following are some tips:

- 1. Taking Responsibility for our own physical and emotional well-being.
- 2. Avoid knee-jerk reactions and falling into old habits.
- 3. Learn to communicate better which can improve relationships with coworkers.
- 4. Recognise your own emotions and know how to control your emotions and behaviour. If you ignore your emotions you will be unable to fully understand your own needs and find it difficult to communicate with others.
- 5. Delegate responsibility let go of the need to control every
- 6. Be willing to compromise finding a middle ground with a coworker can help reduce stress levels for everyone.
- 7. Balance your daily schedule as all work and no play leads to burnout. Balance your time between work, daily responsibilities, family life and social activities - ensuring you get some downtime.
- 8. Avoid over-scheduling your time by trying to fit too much into one day. If you have a lot on - distinguish between the 'shoulds' and the 'musts' and drop any task that isn't completely necessary to the bottom of the list or delete them entirely.
- 9. Give yourself time getting up or leaving home ten minutes earlier can decrease stress levels and avoid that frantic rush to get to work on time.
- 10. Take a quick stroll during the day to clear your mind.
- 11. There is no better way to alleviate stress than a good laughwatching a comedy or meeting up with friends and sharing a joke can all help to reduce stress.
- 12. Don't try to seek perfectionism this will only add to unnecessary stress. When you set unrealistic goals you set yourself up for failure. Aim to do your best.
- 13. Watch your thoughts. Negative thinking can drain our energy and motivation - so try to stay positive and avoid negative people as much as possible.
- 14. Don't try to control the uncontrollable. Many things in life are beyond our control - especially the behaviour of other people. Rather than focusing on the things we can't control, we give our attention to that which we can control - i.e how we react to the problem.

RHINITIS

Seasonal allergic rhinitis or Hay fever as it is also called is a common condition. It often first develops in school-aged children and during the teenage years. Symptoms return for a season each year. Hay fever is caused by an allergy to grass or hay pollens. Grass pollen is the most common cause and tends to affect people every year in the grass pollen season from about May to July.

Symptoms are due to your immune symptom reacting to the pollen. Cells in the lining of the nose and eyes release histamine and other chemicals when they come into contact with pollen. This causes inflammation in the nose (rhinitis) and eyes (conjunctivitis). Sometimes the sinuses and throat can also be affected.

Hay fever tends to run in families. You are also more likely to develop hay fever if you already have asthma or eczema. The conditions asthma, eczema and hay fever are known together as atopic conditions or atopy.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

The symptoms of hay fever can vary from person to person. Some people only have mild symptoms that tend to come and go. Others can be severely affected with symptoms that are present everyday during the pollen season: Common symptoms — these include a runny nose and itchy nose, a blocked nose, sneezing, itchy and watery eyes and an itchy throat. In some cases only nasal symptoms occur and in some cases only eye symptoms occur.

Less common symptoms – these include loss of smell, face pain, sweats and headache.

HOW IS HAY FEVER DIAGNOSED?

Your doctor can usually diagnose hay fever from your typical symptoms that can occur during the hay fever season. They may also ask if there is a history in your family of hay fever, asthma or eczema. If the diagnosis is in doubt the doctor can do a blood test to confirm a pollen allergy.

WHAT ARE THE COMMONLY USED TREATMENTS?

The commonly used treatment options used for hay fever are: antihistamine nasal sprays, antihistamine tablets, steroid nasal sprays, and eye drops. If your hay fever symptoms are not controlled on the medication that you are taking after 2-4 weeks, you should discuss this with your doctor. You may need to try a different treatment or add in another treatment.

Antihistamine nasal spray

A dose from an antihistamine nasal spray can rapidly ease itching, sneezing and watering. It may not be so good at easing congestion. Antihistamines work by blocking the action of histamine. This is one of the chemicals involved in allergic reactions.

6 TIPS THAT YOU MIGHT FIND USEFUL:

- 1. Check a Warm Fridge's Temperature Dial Make sure it hasn't been turned way down. Children may have messed with it, or someone might have hit the knob. Also, make sure that food containers don't block the fridge and freezer compartments' vents—they supply the flow of frigid air.
- 2. Test the Outlet If any electronic item suddenly won't turn on, don't immediately assume it's broken. Plug in a radio or lamp to make sure the socket works.
- 3. Get a Low-Flow Showerhead Showerheads are the second-heaviest water users—and also major energy eaters, since 70% percent of the water used is heated. By reducing hot-water consumption, a low-flow unit can pay for itself in a short time. Many of today's water-efficient showerheads use new technology to provide a high-flow feel.
- 4. Fill Gaps Under Sinks Check where pipes enter exterior walls, and you may see gaps around the pipes. Use expanding foam to seal those gaps. Shake the can vigorously, then squirt the foam around the pipes inside the wall. Don't completely fill the gaps—the foam will expand.
- 5. Dab a light-switch cover with glow paint No more groping blindly at night. You can find glow-in-the-dark paint at hardware stores and home centres.
- 6. Easily inspect your gutters You don't need a ladder to find out if they need cleaning. Attach a hand mirror to the end of a long old PVC pipe that you've cut at a 60-degree angle so the mirror will reflect the inside of the gutter.

TWO OF THE WORLD'S OLDEST WOMEN DIE WITHIN A WEEK OF EACH OTHER:

* Misao Okawa of Japan, died on April 1st of heart failure just a month after celebrating her 117th birthday, not only did she hold the record as the world's oldest woman but she was also officially recognised by Guinness World Records as the world's oldest living person, following the death of Japanese man Jiroemon Kimura on 12 June 2013 until her own death on 1 April 2015.

Ms. Okawa was the verified oldest Japanese person ever, the oldest person ever born in Asia, and the fifth oldest verified person ever recorded. Ms. Okawa was the 30th person verified to have reached age 115, the tenth verified person to reach the age of 116 and the fifth verified person to reach the age of 117. She was also the last living Japanese person verified to have been born in the 1800s.

Ms. Okawa was born on 5 March 1898, the fourth daughter of a draper in the Tenma district of Osaka. She married Yukio Okawa in 1919 and had three children (two daughters and one son), of whom her son, Hiroshi, and daughter Shizuyo survived her. Her husband died on 20 June 1931. She had four

grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. From 1997, she lived at a nursing home and was able to walk until she was 110, when she began using a wheelchair to prevent falls but was able to propel herself using her wheelchair.

* Gertrude Weaver (née Gaines; July 4, 1898 – April 6, 2015) was born in Arkansas near the border with Texas. She became the oldest living person in the United States upon the death of Dina Manfredini on December 17, 2012, and became the oldest living person in the world on April 1st 2015, until her own death five days later. At the time of her death she was the seventh verified oldest person ever and the third oldest person ever from the United States.

Ms. Weaver was born in southwestern Arkansas to Charles Gaines and Ophelia Jeffreys who were African American sharecroppers and spent much of her life working as a domestic helper. She married on July 18, 1915 and had four children. At the time of her 116th birthday one son, Joe was still alive at age 93.

At the age of 104, she moved to a Nursing home in Camden, Arkansas after breaking her hip. With rehabilitation, she recovered from the injury and was able to move back to her home with the help of her granddaughter. At 109, she returned to the nursing home in Camden, her health declined somewhat after her 115th birthday but she still left her room for meals and activities at the nursing home. Ms. Weaver did not have any chronic health problems; she slept well and did not drink alcohol or smoke. She said she owed her long life to "Trusting in the Lord, hard work, loving everybody, eating her own cooking and always trying to do her best".

At her 116th birthday celebration, the Gerontology Research Group (GRG) announced that they had verified Ms. Weaver's age making her the oldest verified living American and they presented her with a plaque inscribed with her title as oldest American. The GRG and Guinness World Records established that Ms. Weaver was also the oldest documented living person in the world.

Ms. Weaver also received a letter from President Barack Obama, and the Mayor of Camden which declared her birthday "Gertrude Day."

On April 6, 2015, Ms. Weaver died from pneumonia aged 116 at Silver Oaks Health and Rehabilitation Centre.

Kathy Langley, an administrator of the Nursing Home in Camden where Gertrude lived, said that Gertrude "knew everything and certainly enjoyed it, she was alert and oriented. She knew that she was the oldest person in the world, and she enjoyed that distinction greatly. She enjoyed every phone call, every letter, every comment — everything was read to her".

Gertrude was looking forward to her 117th birthday, which would have come on the Fourth of July. She was hoping President Obama would show up to celebrate her birthday with her Ms. Langley said and added that the entire staff is devastated by her loss." At time of writing, Jeralean Talley a 115-year-old Detroit-area woman is listed as the world's oldest living person.

Jeralean was born in Montrose, Georgia on May 23, 1899 to Samuel and Amelia Kurtz. One of 11vchildren, she spent her early years living on a farm picking cotton and peanuts and digging sweet potatoes out of the ground. She moved to Inkster, Michigan, in 1935, and has lived there since. A year later, she married Alfred Talley and had one child, a daughter, Thelma Holloway, born in 1937. Ms. Kurtz and Mr. Talley were wed for 52 years before her husband died in October 1988, at the age of 95. She has three grandchildren, 10 great-grandchildren, and 4 great-grandchildren.

According to her daughter Thelma, Jeralean stayed active in her later life by sewing dresses, making quilts and playing the slot machines at casinos. She bowled until she was 104, when her legs got too weak, but still goes on annual fishing trips with her friend Michael Kinloch and his son Tyler (who is also her godson). She does not drive a car, saying that she tried it once but pushed the wrong pedal, causing it to go in reverse rather than move forward. She never wanted to try again. Ms. Talley is a member of the New Jerusalem Missionary Baptist Church, whose members celebrated her 114th birthday by officially naming the church's driveway after her. Ms. Talley also received a personalised letter from U.S. President Barack Obama, who wrote that she was "part of an extraordinary generation". Ms. Talley lives by the Golden Rule: "Treat others the way you want to be treated". Known in the community for her wisdom and wit, she has sometimes been asked for advice. She has previously advised people to use common sense, saying "I don't have much education but what little sense I got, I try to use it"

HOW TO HELP STOP 1 BILLION BIRDS FROM FLYING INTO WINDOWS AND BUILDINGS:

A billion birds a year are accidentally flying into windows and buildings. The problem is particularly bad in the spring and fall, when birds are migrating across continents and hemispheres rather than staying put. Though birds have developed their migratory routes over thousands of years, evolution hasn't prepared them for one particular obstacle: tall glass buildings.

Smaller birds are especially prone to crashing into glass windows and walls. When they're flying, the birds get thrown off by lights left on inside buildings or get disoriented by smooth, transparent glass surfaces. They can slam right into a window and die upon impact.

If you'd like to make sure birds bypass your windows rather than crash land, you can do the following:

- Position bird feeders away from glass windows, so that birds won't see a bird feeder reflected in the glass and aim for it instead of the actual feeder.
- * Pull blinds or shades down in front of sunny windows to reduce reflections. This will also help keep the shaded room cooler during hot months.
- * Plant trees where they can obscure glass somewhat and make bird strikes less likely.
- Use a patterned window film that allows light to enter a room, but will repel birds.

DID YOU EVER WONDER WHERE MAPLE SYRUP COMES FROM?

Turning maple tree sap into amber nectar is no easy feat. It was even harder in the days before plastic tubing and vacuum pumps. There are accounts of Native Americans tapping maple trees and boiling down the sap for use as a sweetener dating back to the 1500s and oral traditions that would indicate the practice goes even further back in time.

Most people associate maple syrup with Canada, which is the world's largest producer, despite the fact that there are more tappable maple trees in New York State than anywhere else in the world.

Maple syrup is produced by tapping trees during the 20-or-so prime tapping days a year. These are days when the weather is right: In the 40s (Fahrenheit) during the day and below freezing at night. Then, the collected sap is heated to evaporate the extra liquid, forming a thick syrup, and then often barrelled over several days. In order to barrel the syrup on the same day, it's necessary to produce enough syrup to fill at least one barrel. While this seems like an easy task, it becomes more daunting when you realise that it takes 40-50 gallons of sap to make one gallon of syrup. Over a season, a single tap will produce anywhere from a third to a half-gallon of syrup. At 40,000 taps, a light day can be as little as one barrel, while 10 barrels can be made on a good day.


DID YOU KNOW?

The Indonesian volcano Krakatoa erupted in 1883 killing between 40,000 and 120,000 people and produced a sound that was reportedly heard nearly 3,000 miles away. The eruption began in earnest in June 1883 and culminated with four monstrous blasts a few months later in August — blasts that were heard in both Perth, Australia (2,200 miles away), and on the island of Rodrigues in the Indian Ocean (3,000 miles away). A huge tsunami followed shortly thereafter, reaching more than 150 feet high in some places. The final and most cataclysmic blast exploded out of Krakatoa at a speed of more than 675 miles per hour and was so powerful that it blew out the eardrums of nearby sailors and continued to be readable on barographs all around the world for days afterward.
