acclaim for the production.

The Film has at its centre language, landscape and light. Monsignor Padráig Ó'Fiannachta, a distinguished linguist, scholar and poet, acts as the guide. Both the English and Irish language play a prominent role in the narrative, as well as occasional quotations from Latin and Greek epic poems. Pope Francis' recent encyclical on the environment is read from by narrator Kelsey Lang McCarthy. The central question of the film circles around the age old philosophical question 'what is the good life?'.

The film was chosen and screened at The Museum of Modern Art in NYC on the 21st of December last and had its Irish Premiere in April at the Omniplex in Tralee where the President of Ireland and The First lady were in attendance. Speaking after the film, President of Ireland Michael D. Higgins said "it's an elemental and beautiful film, combining powerful cinematography with the Spiritual contemplation of the wonder of nature, such a great contribution to heritage, it is a work of Art, a wonderful and moving experience."

THE LATE SEAMUS HEALY

Although he was born in the small village of Dunmore in North Galway and was a fiercely proud son of that great county, Killarney was home to Seamus Healy since 1968, when he first put on his "chef's whites" and commenced work in the kitchen of the then Killarney Great Southern Hotel (today known as The Malton).

Having just successfully completed a two year Chef Apprentice course in the Athenry Catering School, Seamus was posted to the GSH in Killarney as his very first job.

Little did he or indeed did anyone else know, Seamus was to devote the next thirty-eight years of his life to the grand old Killarney Great Southern, the last eighteen of them in the incredibly difficult and highly responsible position of Head Chef.

Even when he retired from there in 2006, Seamus still stayed within the industry working for the next number of years with the Randles family at the Dromhall and Randles Court Hotel before finally fully retiring. Seamus was universally liked and admired by all who worked with him in the course of nearly fifty years at the very coal-face of the Irish Hotel and Tourism Industry. Almost uniquely for a Chef, especially a Head Chef in an intensely highpressure kitchen atmosphere, Seamus Healy was the epitome of calm and the essence of politeness and courtesy.

honour and decency had taught Seamus that the way to get the job done and the mission accomplished was with respect and dignity for all rather than with ranting and pot-walloping! Throughout his many years in Killarney, Seamus developed a wide and diverse circle of friends, many of them people that he first met all that time ago back in 1968.

The spreading word of his passing away last week, after a long fight with cancer, and borne with the determination and dignity so reflective of the man that Seamus was, was greeted with great sadness and a profound sense of loss by all who had the good fortune to know Seamus Healy. Seamus is survived by his two brothers and three sisters and their families.

After reposing in O'Shea's Funeral home in Killarney, his remains were removed to his native Galway and he was buried among his own in his home place.

May he rest in peace under the sod of his native Dunmore, and may his wide circle of Kerry friends forever cherish their fond memories of a man of whom it can be truly siad, "When God made him, he threw away the mould". RIP Chef.

a researcher in DCU's Vascular Biology and Therapeutics Group; to further her research into identifying the type of cells most common in causing heart disease. This would further enable the development of new treatments that could enable the prevention of fatal heart attacks and strokes. The annual scholarship, worth €2,500, was established in memory of Orla Benson, a DCU Biotechnology student from Killarney, who was tragically killed in Boston in September 1995.

The scholarship provides support for one DCU researcher each year who demonstrates outstanding potential in biotechnology. It

allows the researcher to develop a particular aspect of their research at a university abroad, where they can establish international links to facilitate research co-operation.

Mariana, a previous recipient of the Government of Ireland scholarship from the Irish Research Council, has dedicated her research to understanding why healthy blood vessels become damaged and how that is linked to heart disease. By identifying the cells responsible for causing blocked vessels, Mariana's work aims to prevent or reverse potential artery damage by developing a drug that circumvents the harmed vessels. This year's award will allow Mariana to further her studies of heart disease with Dr. Carolina Cristina in her laboratories in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

The Benson family has worked with the DCU Educational Trust to establish the scholarship as a legacy to their daughter's dedication to and love of biotechnology. To date, the Orla Benson Memorial Endowment Fund has provided scholarships for fifteen students.

GETTING STARTED

3. LEARN HOW TO WALK BEFORE YOU CAN RUN: I know it sounds obvious but please don't try and start a jogging programme without completing at least a 3-4 week walking programme, where at the end of it you are nearly about to break into a jog as you are going so fast in your walk. All too often I see people wanting to jog and they literally have been sitting on the couch for the past few years. Injuries start kicking in after weeks 1-2 and usually they are back to the couch before they know it feeling defeated and deflated and back comfort eating, so please don't let yourself be one of these. It is important to sensibly prepare the muscles and joint in the body for the impact of jogging, and walking is the best way to do this. You will still burn calories, be getting fit, and will start seeing results, so preparation is key so get walking if you aren't an existing walker for the next few weeks. I would advise walking for about 4-5 days if you aren't doing any other form of exercise, and if you are doing other classes or exercise activities, a good power walk 2-3 days for 40mins should suffice.

4. BUY RUNNING SHOES: Decent running shoes are your most important piece of kit. They'll pay for themselves by keeping you injury free. Cross training shoes or tennis shoes don't have enough cushioning to handle the impact of running- nor does a pair of running shoes you last wore 2 years ago. It is advisable to ask an expert in your local sports shop to assess which type of running shoe best suits you. There are several different types of running shoes so it is important you purchase the one that best suits your foot. I would also recommend custom fitted insoles (available locally in Elvery sports). These are well worth the investment.

Learning to manage stress is important at all times in our lives – and not just around exam time. Tips to give you more control over you life include: Eating healthy food as much as possible and avoiding junk food as

much as you can. Exercising regularly, even if it is for a few minutes a day. Walking, jogging, yoga, anything will do. Developing good relationships. Sleeping well. Keeping a balanced view. Learning techniques of stress management and stress relief. Remembering your past achievements and taking strength from them.

SCHEDULE TIME FOR YOU: A really good habit to develop now, which will stand to you for a life-time is to set aside a half an hour each day to do something that just makes you feel good. Read a book or a favourite magazine, take a walk, dance or ride your bike. This time that you take for yourself will help you focus when you sit down to finish your homework. But you may be asking 'What Can I do Now?' The first important thing to remember is that a relaxed body and mind is better equipped to deal with stresses and tensions. So looking after your mind and body at this time will help you to cope better with exam pressures.

EXAM-TIME: 1. Set Priorities. What is the most important and what needs to be done first. You do not need to do everything in one night. Prioritize what needs to be done early in the week, and what can be done later. If you are focusing on a few subjects a night rather than worrying about all of them every night you will do a better job overall.

2. Give yourself a break. Whilst it's important to do your best – don't try to over-achieve. Give yourself time to relax too.

3. Set Realistic Goals. Set goals that you can see yourself achieving within a week, two weeks, etc. Setting goals that are too high can make you feel more stressed if you cannot realistically achieve them.

4. Acknowledge your feelings. It is normal to feel stressed at exam time. However, if you are feeling especially stressed or depressed, you may want to look at everything you are doing see if there are one or two things you can cut out until you feel better. Be sure to talk to someone if you feel this way.

5. Take care of yourself. Now more than ever it's vital that you take care of yourself. Don't sacrifice your health because you feel you are too busy. A combination of a healthy diet, regular exercise and plenty of sleep helps relieve stress.

If you feel stressed or overwhelmed, it is important to speak with the adults in your life. They may not be aware of just how much pressure you are feeling to get everything done. Talk to a parent, teacher or counsellor, and ask for help in dealing with stress.

TAX Matters with



WHAT EXPENSES CAN I CLAIM?

You can claim for any business expenses which you have incurred in order to earn your profits. These expenses are normally referred to as revenue expenditure. Revenue expenditure is your day to day running costs and covers such items as:

- Purchase of goods for resale
- Wages, rent, rates, repairs, lighting and heating etc.
- · Running costs of vehicles or machinery used in the business
- Accountancy fees
- Interest paid on any monies borrowed to finance business expenses/items
- Lease payments on vehicles or machinery used in the business
- If you are registered for VAT the expenses you claim should be exclusive of VAT.

WHAT EXPENSES CAN'T BE CLAIMED?

- The general rule is that you cannot claim for any private expenses i.e.
- Any expense, not wholly and exclusively paid for the purposes of the trade or profession
- Any private or domestic expenditure e.g. your own wages, food, clothing (except protective clothing), income tax etc.
- Business entertainment expenditure i.e. the provision of accommodation, food, drink
 or any other form of hospitality.

WHAT ABOUT EXPENSES WHICH ARE PARTLY FOR BUSINESS AND PARTLY PRIVATE?

Where expenditure relates to both business and private use, only that part which relates to your business will be allowed. Examples of such expenditure are rent, electricity, telephone charges etc., where the premises involved is used partly for business and partly for private purposes. These expenses will need to be apportioned to exclude the private use.

LIGHTING

Lighting is a very important part of decorating, yet sometimes its importance can be underestimated. The correct lighting can utterly transform a room. There are 3 types of lighting to consider for each room, they are: Ambient, Task and Accent. Using these correctly is called 'Layering Light'.

Grasses can add great colour to any shrub bed and they also look great in containers.

Ornamental grasses don't need much feeding as this only encourages a lot of growth in the foliage at the expense of flowers.

There is a large selection of grasses to choose from. There are grasses like the Pampus, which is tall to the Carex Algold which is small.

If you are planting small grasses in the garden try and plant them in groups of three rather than on their own.

Grasses are also ideal plants for containers but only choose an evergreen one such as a Phormium or an Astelia As they will give you colour all year and you can plant your seasonal plants around them.

Know Your Rights: TAX APPEALS COMMISSION

QUESTION

What is the new Tax Appeals Commission?

ANSWER

The Finance (Tax Appeals) Act 2015 came into operation on 21 March 2016. This Act gives effect to a revised tax appeals process and established a new independent statutory Tax Appeals Commission (TAC), which replaces the former Office of the Appeal Commissioners.

The TAC adjudicates, hears and determines appeals against Revenue decisions concerning taxes and duties under the Finance (Tax Appeals) Act 2015, the Taxes Consolidation Act 1997 as amended and other related legislation. There are currently two Appeal Commissioners, appointed by the Minister for Finance for a period of seven years.

The main change to the tax appeals process is the requirement that all appeals (other than customs duties and Registration Tax "first-stage" appeals) are now made directly to the TAC and not to Revenue in the first instance. The Appeal Commissioners have sole responsibility for accepting or refusing appeals, although Revenue can raise objections to appeals. If both parties agree, the Appeal Commissioners can make determinations based on written submissions (rather than a full hearing). However, you can insist on a hearing if you wish.

By default, all hearings are held in public. However, you can request that a hearing (or part of a hearing) be held in private. To improve the transparency of the appeals process, the Appeal Commissioners are required to publish anonymised versions of all of their determinations. Another significant change is that appeals can no longer be re-heard before a Circuit Court Judge. You can appeal to the High Court on a point of law, but not in relation to the facts.

SYRIANS DISPLACED BY WAR HELP CANADIANS DISPLACED BY FIRE

Syrian refugees living in Canada organised relief efforts to help locals affected by the devastating Fort McMurray bush fire, in which at least 1,600 homes were destroyed and thousands of families had to flee the area. Grateful for Canada's hospitality, the Syrians see it as a way of giving back.

A 24-year-old Syrian refugee and his family did not hesitate to offer help though they were only reunited in Canada last January and wondered how much help could they offer, while still struggling to learn English, find jobs and get accustomed to their new surroundings. "We really know the meaning of losing everything in one moment ... To lose everything in one moment you will lose your whole past, everything you have been building since you were born," he said, my father had an established chocolate factory in Damascus for 20 years, now we sell our handmade chocolate in a market every Saturday and we will be giving a portion of our earnings to the Canadian Red Cross he said. One little boy from a different family started collecting his toys and other items for the Canadian children. His mother said he wanted them to have them because he remembers too what it was like to lose his own. In another relief effort donations started coming in when Ms. Khanchet posted a Facebook message asking other Syrians in Canada to help. A friend reposted it on the page of the Syrian Refugee Support Group, and soon the support group for Syrians was supporting native Canadians.

All the Syrians are saying, 'I'm ready to give, I'm ready to give" and with donations of whatever they can afford - some just \$5 or \$10 - the new Canadians are doing just that – and the list of kindness just continues.

Since November 2015, Canada has accepted more than 25,000 Syrian refugees. It has also contributed an estimated 1 billion dollars in aid for humanitarian relief efforts.

I WONDER WHO CREATED JACOB SHEEP?

Researchers at the state-run Xinjiang Academy of Zootechnical Science in China have bred

five sheep with different coat colours using the new gene-editing tool known as CRISPR-Cas9. Two of the sheep have black and white fur "like cows," another two have black with white spots like "spotty dogs" and the fifth sheep has brown and white like "unstirred cappuccino." This is the first time that scientists have altered the coat colours of large animals using the controversial technique, colour alteration has been previously achieved on mice.

"The lambs, born in March, have become our lovely pets," head researcher Liu Mingjun said, adding that with the CRISPR-Cas9, pet owners can order their pets with customised fur colouring. He also noted that consumers will be able to buy wool products in various colours that don't need to be dyed. The research team reportedly edited the animals' ASIP gene which affects the colour of their fleece. "The application to large animals indicates more strains of animals, not limited to livestock, will be developed via the approach, with different patterns not limited to coat colours," Liu said about the burgeoning CRISPR technique. "Compared with traditional gene mutation approaches in which researchers take decades to breed a new strain, gene editing is much more effective" he added.

HANDY HINTS

 If your pet has covered your sofa in hair again, run your hand over it while wearing a damp household glove. This will cause the hair to cling to the glove rather than your prized furniture.

 Pour salt over a wine spill or stain and the salt crystals will absorb it.

• Lime buildup can be taken care of by making a paste from one tablespoon of vinegar and two tablespoons of salt. Apply the paste to your shower, sink or other fixtures and rub the lime buildup with a cloth to remove it.

The bands will prevent the wall from getting damaged.

• Rubbing waxed paper along your shower's curtain rod will stop your shower curtain from getting stuck every time you try to open or close it.

MALAYSIA PROPOSES DRASTIC NEW FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Malaysia has proposed to amend the Environmental Protection Act so that the state can seize badly burning land, often set alight by palm oil interests looking to clear land cheaply.

"It will not matter if the land is owned by smallholders or plantation giants — as long as there is a substantial fire, the government will take control of the land," Malaysian Environment and Natural Resources Minister Wan Junaidi Tuanku Jaafar said.

A major heat wave in the Southeast Asian nation has depleted water reserves and encouraged fires to spread, including in the peat-rich Kuala Langat Forest Reserve and in an palm oil plantation run by Malaysian's Federal Land Development Authority.

Mr. Junaidi's ministry detected 1,460 cases of open burning between January 1 and the end of April. "Existing laws are unable to prevent open burning... so we want firmer action In Sarawak, we call it 're-enter the land' where the land is handed over to the government," he said. "I have directed the department to take action on offenders."

Richard East of Tasmania, guit his job, sold his house and packed what possessions he had left into a Volkswagen van to travel around the country and for company brought his cat, Willow, along with him. "Willow was living in my house but was no longer wanted, so I vowed to look after her for the rest of her days. At the time I was making that commitment to her, I didn't realise what my future plans were. I did the obvious thing and took her with me" Mr East says. Traveling and living out of their van since December 2014, Mr. East documents his travels with Willow on Instagram, Facebook and YouTube. So far he and his cat have travelled in Tasmania, New South Wales and Queensland, and plan on tackling the Northern Territory next, followed by Western Australia.

NEW TECHNOLOGY GIVES DOGSTHE ABILITY TO 'TALK' OR 'TEXT'

A research team at the Georgia Institute of Technology has developed a new vest that allows dogs to send texts to their owners. The vest comes equipped with sensors that the dog can use to send text notifications or audible messages to a smartphone. These messages are crucial for bomb detection and search and rescue teams, as well as for owners of therapy dogs, said Melody Jackson, an associate professor at the school who created the vest. "At present a bomb-sniffing dog has one alert that says, 'I found an explosive, but the dog may know more than that, like what type of explosive it is, if it's something stable, or something unstable and dangerous, that needs to be handled carefully, the problem, is "they have no way to tell their handler" she said. Professor Jackson's own Border Collie named Sky, has helped the team to design a lot of the sensors, by telling them what works and what doesn't work. "He's a very critical part of our design team" she added. All that Sky and other dogs need do is trigger side sensors on the vest with a bite or a nudge of their nose. They're being trained with toys and can identify between a ball or a Frisbee, which they in turn, relay to their handler. "This is what's called a "discrimination task" and can be translated to more important tasks, such as bomb detection, where the dog would tell his handler what explosive they have scented Professor Jackson said. The research team have also developed a medical alert vest that allows a dog to find a missing or trapped person, activate a sensor and let that person know that help is on its way. This would be key to helping and saving lives during an earthquake or other disaster Ms. Jackson added.

SAVING A LIFE WAS MORE IMPORTANT THAN PROTECTING A RELIGIOUS GARMENT TO ONE MAN IN INDIA

Sarwan Singh noticed a crowd gathering around a canal in India's Punjab region and investigated. "I was shocked to see that onlookers were letting a dog drown before their eyes and no one was actually helping," he told reporters. He unwrapped his turban, the holy garment of the Sikh which "shocked the people standing around, they thought I was disrespecting my faith, but what was important at that point was to save a living being" he said. He had to follow the dog for around 200 metres before he was able to wrap his turban around the dogs neck and pull him to safety. Well done to Mr. Singh who acted quickly and saved a life, instead of giving in to pressure to do otherwise.

AUSTRALIAN MP WHO SHOT, KILLED AND ATE AN ELEPHANT HAS RESIGNED

More than 30,000 African elephants are killed every year by poachers for their tusks, with some scientists observing they could go

extinct by 2020 if the current rate of killing is sustained. Within this context an Australian MP, Robert Borsak, from the Shooters, Fishers and Farmers Party, (first registered with the Australian Electoral Commission on 27 August 2007) has stated that he shot, killed and ate an elephant on a hunting trip in Africa because it is humanity's "right" to do so. Borsak defended the consumption of the elephant during a speech he made before New South Wales parliament against the "insidious growth of skewed animal rights ideology", referring to an initiative by the country's Green Party to end "Australia's killing culture" against species such as kangaroos etc. African elephants are listed as vulnerable by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), while the Asian elephant is classed as endangered. It is the responsibility of humanity to ensure elephants survive, for future generations and for the rights of the animal.

PETS ARE AS DIFFICULT AS CHILDREN TO KEEP SAFE

On June 6th a young German shepherd somehow managed to get her head stuck inside of a discarded tire on property in Sonoma County, California. The one-yearold dog struggled to breathe with her head tightly wedged inside of the rim. Though the dog's owners attempted to free the dog, their efforts were fruitless and it was obvious that outside help was necessary because the trapped dog was in distress. In desperation, the owners called 9-1-1 for help and responding firefighters determined that they were not able to safely remove the rim.

A veterinarian with the Sonoma County Animal Control was then contacted for help, but the rescue effort would not come quickly because the vet was in the midst of surgery. Until help arrived, over two hours later, firefighters helped keep the dog comfortable by providing her with oxygen. It took a sedative, and lubricant, to free the mischievous, or perhaps too curious, pup from the tire - she was immediately transferred to a local veterinary office for further treatment.

WUNSTER SENIOR FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP SEMI-FINAL EARLY KERRY GOALS HELP LOWER THE BANNER

KERRY O'SHEA REPORTS FROM THE MUNSTER CHAMPIONSHIP SEMI-FINAL CLASH AT FITZGERALD STADIUM

KERRY 2-23 CLARE 0-17

First-half goals from Colm Cooper and Stephen O'Brien, who finished the game with a personal haul of 1-5, all of which came from play, were the vital ingredients as Kerry advanced with ease to another Munster SFC Final.

Kerry will now face the Liam Kearinsmanaged Tipperary in the Munster decider in Killarney on July 3rd, the first time since 1998 that the sides have met in a decider.

Watched by an official attendance of 11,358 and played in overcast and ideal weather conditions under the beautiful backdrop of the famed McGillycuddy Reeks, the home side got off to a separational start when they struck for

sensational start when they struck for two goals inside the opening five minutes.

The first came with a mere 65 seconds gone on the stopwatch when Colm Cooper's lob from 35 yards out somehow deceived Clare keeper Joe Hayes and ended up in the net.

Five minutes later, Stephen O'Brien, who gave an exhibition of score-taking especially in the first half, was at the end of a sweeping move involving Bryan Sheehan and Paul Murphy to supply goal number two.

However, despite the concession of these hammer blows, Clare showed determination and stubborn resistance in several areas of the field.

Colm Collins' charges asked plenty of questions of Kerry's rearguard but poor shot selection and decision making in front of goal cost them dearly.

Still, they finished the game with a very respectable tally of 0-17. Kerry fans will be worried about leaking such a high score as will manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice who did concede that much work remains to be done in this area.

The Kerry lineout showed five changes from the side defeated by Dublin in the National League decider in April.

Newcomers Brian O'Beaglaoich and Tadgh Morley were given championship debuts by Eamonn Fitzmaurice and both can feel relatively satisfied with their championship bows.

Morley had a very useful outing before retiring with a knock midway through the second half while O'Beaglaolich, who was marking Clare livewire Podge Collins, was given plenty to think about, but the Gaeltacht man finished the game very strongly.

Another positive aspect too was the return of Anthony Maher who had his first slice of inter-

county action since last year's All-Ireland final loss to Dublin.

The big Duagh man came on with six minutes remaining and was one of eleven Kerry players including four substitutes to sign their names to the scoresheet for the Kingdom.

Kerry finished the game with 13 players as Killian Young limped off injured and Michael Geaney was black-carded.

These incidents happened very late in the game and Kerry had used up their full quota of six allotted substitutes by then.

Following Cooper's opening goal, Clare sharpshooter David Tubridy with a personal haul of 0-7 including 0-4 frees and 0-2 '45's, opened his account with a point before Stephen O'Brien replied with a 1-2 salvo to push the Kingdom 2-2 to 0-2 clear inside the opening 8 minutes.

Podge Collins, who prior to his controversial harsh black carding in the 27th minute for what Longford referee Fergal Kelly deemed a deliberate trip on Kerry's Tadgh Morley, was one of Clare's most influential figures and a pleasure to watch.

Collins and Eoin Cleary added points before Paul Geaney, with a quick brace of points in the 11th and 12th minutes increased Kerry's lead.

Clare were almost through on goal in the 13th minute when Podge Collins' effort was saved by Kerry keeper Brian Kelly at the expense of a 45 which David Tubridy converted. Kerry had further points from Bryan Sheehan who struggled to make an impact and Stephen O'Brien (2) before Clare replied with efforts from Gary Brennan and Eoin Cleary.

The outstanding and hard grafting Paul Geaney and Colm Cooper with a typical effort, added a brace of points. Clare responded with scores from Gary Brennan and Cathal O'Connor. Killian Young and substitutes Pearse Collins exchanged scores to bring the first half action to a close with Kerry leading 2-10 to 0-9.

Clare needed goals at this stage if they were to have any chance of getting back into contention but the Kingdom were in no mood to drop their guard.

Darran O'Sullivan and David Tubridy exchanged points at the start of the second half as Kerry maintained their seven-point cushion and further scores from Bryan Sheehan (free), Darran O'Sullivan and Colm Cooper moved the home team 10 points clear with 46 minutes gone on the watch.

Kerry manager Eamonn Fitzmaurice emptied his bench, David Moran and Barry John Keane (0-2) added their names to the list of scorers as the Kingdom stretched nine points 2-17 to 0-14 clear with 56 minutes gone.

David Tubridy and the influential Pearse Lillis, who did not start despite being named on the team during the week added points for the visitors.

However, Kerry finished with a flourish and points from Paul Murphy, Stephen O'Brien, Colm Cooper (free), Paul Geaney (2, one free) and Anthony Maher rounded off the scoring. While Kerry had a good day, there is quite a lot of work to be done before the clash with Tipperary, who at this stage would like nothing better than to bring the Kingdom down.

BASIC CAR CHECKS

HERE'S A SIMPLE WAY TO REMEMBER WHAT TO CHECK.

Rain or shine, it pays to give the car a good check over every couple of weeks – you could prevent a breakdown and perhaps a large, unwelcome bill.

FUEL Top up when you pass a filling station rather than delay looking for one until the fuel light comes on – particularly if you're driving in an unfamiliar area.

LIGHTS Clean all exterior lights regularly and check for blown bulbs and cracks in the lens.

OIL Cars can consume as much as a litre of oil every 1,000 miles. Check the oil level regularly (your handbook will show you how). Don't wait for the red oil pressure warning light to come on - engine damage may already have occurred by then.

WATER Overheating is a common cause of breakdowns, especially in hotter weather. Check the coolant level regularly (the handbook will show you how) and if the level always seems low, check for leakages. Top up the windscreen washer fluid too.

ELECTRICS Battery problems are the number one cause of breakdowns at any time of year. Renew an old, tired battery before it lets you down. Also make sure that your electric radiator cooling fan starts running when the engine gets hot – you can check this by running the engine with the car stationary.

RUBBER Incorrectly inflated tyres are not only unsafe, they wear out faster and can increase fuel consumption by around 5%. If you're driving with extra passengers or luggage, remember to increase your tyre pressure accordingly (see your handbook).

INCORRECTLY

Parents in Kerry are being urged to have their child's car seat checked as research from the Road Safety Authority (RSA) indicates that as many as 4 out of 5 child car seats are incorrectly fitted. The RSA 'Check it Fits' service will be visiting locations across Kerry between the 7th and 10th of July where child car seat installation experts will be available to ensure car seats and restraints are correctly fitted. The service takes between 10-15 minutes, is free of charge and offers parents and guardians reassurance that their child is safe while travelling in the car.

Since 'Check it Fits' began in October 2013, the RSA service has checked over 8,000 child car seats and restraints across Ireland. Of these, 82% required some adjustment. Worryingly, 75% of seats required a major adjustment, of which 4% were deemed not fit for purpose and condemned, meaning they have the potential to cause injury or even death in the event of a collision. If your child's car seat or restraint is incorrectly fitted, the 'Check it Fits' experts will advise on how to fix the problem, demonstrate how to fit the restraint correctly and answer any queries participants might have to avoid potential serious or fatal injury in the event of a collision.

Aisling Leonard, Senior Road Safety Promotion Officer for the RSA commented "Almost 2 out of 5 children killed are passengers and Garda reports into collisions indicate that 1 in 10 children were not wearing a seatbelt or using a child restraint in 2014. More recent statistics have shown an increase in child passenger fatalities on the road. The reality is that if a child's car seat isn't fitted correctly, it could lead to a serious or fatal injury in the event of a collision. Having a correctly fitted car seat is a simple measure parents, grandparents and guardians can take to ensure children are safe while travelling by car."

Moyagh Murdock, CEO of the RSA, while speaking about the service said "The RSA'Check it Fits' service is there to provide professional, trustworthy advice to parents and guardians around child car seat safety. Parents all over the country are availing of this service to get practical advice and expert fitting of their car seats. We would advise all parents to ensure that when they buy a new car seat, that they get the seat fitted by an expert. We would also



advise that parents to check the label on their car seat to make sure it's appropriate for your child's age, weight and height, to make sure your seat is firmly installed in the car, and to always ensure that your child's harness is fitted snugly for every trip. Coming into the summer months you may need to tighten the harness as your children are wearing lighter clothes."

DRIVER DISTRACTION

Driver distraction is a diversion of attention away from activities critical for safe driving toward a competing activity. A distraction can often occur simultaneously – at times resulting in a complete loss of control. Distraction can be visual, manual and cognitive.

Based on international evidence it is estimated that driver distraction could play a role in 20-30% of all road collisions in this country. This means that driver distraction could be a contributory factor in over 1,400 fatal and injury collisions annually.

CHILD DISTRACTION

The two biggest distractions for drivers in Ireland are the mobile and children. But did you know that child distraction could be the more lethal? According to researchers at Monash University in Australia they are 12 times more distracting to a driver than talking on a mobile. The study also found that on average a parent takes their eyes off the road for three minutes and 22 seconds during a 16-minute trip. The most common types of distractions that children cause include the driver turning to look at the child or watching the goings on in the back seat in the rear-view mirror, engaging in conversation with the child, leaning into the back to help or pacify the child and even playing with the child.

This was the subject of two ads from of the RSA on the subject of driver distraction over the Summer of 2015. The first ad deals with child distraction and is entitled 'Looking Back'. (A second ad will follow later in the summer and deals with the issue of mobile phone distraction).

In the 40 second ad we see a woman looking back, over the duration of her entire life. She's

looking back with regret at something that happened many years ago. By the end of the advertisement, we see what this event was. The moment she looked back in a very concrete sense – looking back to her child while she was driving. We cut before she crashes into an oncoming car and loses this child forever.

We end with the message: Don't lose a lifetime looking back.

Never let a child take your focus off the road. Pull over if you have to.

The cost is too high to take your focus off the road to look at your child for even one second.

We're asking drivers to give the road all of their focus, and if they need to, pull over.
