260 Killarney Students Collect Their Leaving Cert Results

The air of anticipation was palpalable around Bishops Path on Wednesday morning as the students from the three secondary schools in Killarney made their way to their respective schools to collect their Leaving Certificate Results.

Over 1800 students in Kerry sat the Exam and this year - which was the second year of the grading system which was reformed in 2017 with the introduction of a new 1 to 8 numeric system replacing the previous system of letter grades (A1-NG).

Over 70 students of the class of 2018 collected their Leaving Certificate results from St. Brigid's Presentation Secondary School on Wednesday.

There were cheers and smiles as the agonizing wait finally came to an end when the girls gathered in the school from 9a.m. and collected their results from school Principal, Ms. Róisín Moore.

"We are delighted with the results this morning - they were an excellent group of girls who contributed significantly to school life over the past 5 or 6 years. They were all rounders. One of our students achieved 7 Higher Level Grade 1's. 13% of the girls achieved over 550 points while 25% achieved over 500 points and 67% of our Leaving Certificate Applied class received distinctions. These grades are well above the national norms. All of the girls can be very proud of their achievements", Ms. Moore told the Killarney Outlook.

"We would also like to congratulate their teachers for their dedicated work and the parents who have supported the girls and our school over the past 5 or 6 years. We wish all the girls the very best on Monday when the CAO offers are made", she added.

80 students at Killarney Community College received excellent results on Wednesday.

"Results in both Leaving Certificate and Leaving cert applied were very strong with distinctions and merits achieved in leaving cert applied and in the Leaving certificate Higher grade 1's achieved in Mathematics, English, Irish, Languages and History. Mathematics results were particularly strong with success rates well above the national norms, with all students

reporting that they well attained Maths scores that will take them into further education and College. ", a spokeperson at the college told the Killarney Outlook.

The College Refectory in St Brendan's College was filled with the rich air of anticipation for the group of 110 students as they awaited the arrival of the results envelopes which heralded a passport to a new phase of their young lives.

"With the cohort now heading for courses in Trinity, UL, NUIM, UCC, CIT, ITT, UCD, the Agriculture College in Pallaskenry, with targets of PLC's, apprenticeships and the occasional "Gap Year", these young men are now stepping into the next phase of their lives", Sean Coffey told the Killarney Outlook.

Principal Coffey also emphasised his satisfaction that students had achieved at the highest level in the twenty subjects on offer at Leaving Cert level in the College. He also recognised the myriad levels of ability in the year group and congratulated all those who had worked to achieve their best in accordance with their ability.

For the vast majority the focus for students now moves to Monday and the offer of CAO places in Third level. Career Guidance teachers will be on hand at the each of the three schools to advise and guide any student with regard to their options at this stage.

Valentia calling.... Lighthouse & Lightship Weekend taking place

romwell Point Lighthouse on Valentia Island will once again play host to the Kerry Amateur Radio Group (KARG) this weekend 18/19th Aug, as part of the 21st International Lighthouse & Lightship Weekend (ILLW). This is an annual amateur radio event held on the third full weekend in August. Over the years, the ILLW has grown to become an international event for amateur radio enthusiasts from all over the world. This year there are over 450 entrants for the event.

As this weekend is held on the third full weekend in August, it coincides with the International Lighthouse Heritage Weekend organised by the Association of Lighthouse Keepers, where many lighthouses worldwide are opened to the public. The main aims of the weekend are to promote awareness of lighthouses & lightships and the need to preserve and restore them, while at the same time to promote amateur radio & to foster international goodwill. During the event which runs for 48 hours from midnight on Friday 17th until midnight on Sunday 19th August, the members of the Kerry Amateur Radio Group will be making wireless radio contacts with fellow amateur radio enthusiasts worldwide, via voice, morse code and digital radio transmission modes.

During this time, members of the public are very welcome to visit the lighthouse and an active amateur radio station in operation, communicating with other radio enthusiasts, who will be broadcasting from lighthouses & lightships worldwide. Last year KARG communicated with radio operators in over 50 countries, including South Africa, San Marino, Ecuador, Japan & Kuwait.

Valentia is very popular with international visitors and during last year's event, visitors from many countries including Australia, New Zealand, USA & Germany visited the lighthouse. Cromwell Point Lighthouse is one of the 12 Great Lighthouses of Ireland, and as such, offers a great day out.

The operation from Cromwell Point Lighthouse is being facilitated by the Valentia Island Development Company (VIDC) & the Commissioners of Irish Lights.

The lighthouse is open to the public for guided tours from Easter – September, daily 11am-6pm, and now has a coffee shop open in the former Light Keepers house.

oughguittane Lake is one of six locations across Kerry that Irish Water working in conjunction with Kerry County Council have deployed divers.

. The divers have been busy gathering various information in relation to water supply assets in lakes which supply drinking water to the county. Divers were investigating if pipes were suitably positioned during the drought conditions to adequately intake water to be treated and if also to examine if any leaks needed to be repaired on site. They also measured the volume of water available to Irish Water for production which is key for the utility in order to plan for the weeks ahead as drought conditions continue. Water levels in the lake have dropped 45 inches since June.

The busy towns of Killarney and Tralee are supplied by Lough Guitane and are dependent on water from the lough especially during the busy tourism season. Divers inspected the inlet pipes to ensure they were appropriately positioned as the new water treatment plant is due to come into affect imminently. This €30M investment by Irish Water will ensure security of supply for the region and improve the quality of water for homes and businesses. Irish Water and Kerry County Council are working to alleviate pressure on these schemes by fixing leaks throughout the network. Most schemes in the county are experiencing water supply difficulties due to the ongoing drought conditions and these are being addressed through a number of measures, including the exploration of new spring sources, tankering water to supplement supplies where necessary and investment in emergency measures in both networks and treatment plants to improve performance during this challenging drought period.

Any measures taken to reduce consumption, no matter how small, will help in terms of replenishing water supplies. Simple steps like taking a short shower instead of a bath, turning off taps and fixing leaks in outside taps or farm troughs all help to make a difference. We are also reminding people to report any leaks they see in the public network by calling 1850 278 278 or on the Irish Water website.

GRADUAL CHANGES GIVE A GLIMMER OF HOPE AT GORODISHCHE

Gary McGowan, a final year Physiotherapy student at UL has just returned from his 5th visit to Belarus. The Killarney native, and son of Jerry and Julie McGowan tells Killarney Outlook about his experiences and how he sees a change in the orphanage that he volunteers in.



A s the dust settles on another amazing trip to the Gorodishche orphanage, I can't help but feel like this trip was a little different to others. For the first time, I began to notice the accumulation of the gradual changes that have taken place in the past couple of years, to produce some pretty positive outcomes, along with a glimmer of hope for the future.

In the past, I feel like I was somewhat blind to this. When I first travelled to Gorodishche in 2016, all I could see were the smiles in front of me. I was unable to contextualise the transience of those smiles while we were there and failed to acknowledge the reality of the future the kids face as they move through the orphanage system. With each successive trip, I feel that became more and more apparent to me, which was challenging at times. The absence of a loving parent and the daunting fate of an adult asylum were two of the more potent realities that you have to come to terms with as a volunteer, which isn't easy.

However, as I said, while on my fifth

trip this time, it was different. I found it easier to pull myself away from any negative thoughts, instead focusing on what can actually be done in the here and now to create some sort of positive change. That's not easy to do, as we are all pretty much programmed to focus only on the negative aspects of just about everything.

There have been a lot of positive changes in the orphanages in Belarus, thanks to the Burren Chernobyl Project and other such charities who work tirelessly to better the lives of the kids and adults within that system. These changes include better healthcare, bedding, independent housing, mobility aids and other such specialised disability equipment, along with a lot more. One of the pitfalls of so much specialised equipment being donated is that not everyone is familiar with how to use it, unless they have a background in physiotherapy, occupational therapy or another profession involved in the management of physical disability. Thankfully, due to our volunteer group's physiotherapy background, we were

able to dust off some of the amazing equipment that had been donated and put it into practice.

As you can see in the images, standing when you have never stood is a pretty good feeling. Sure, we could get caught up in the benefits of standing on bone mineral density, circulation and so on, but the biggest perceived benefit to both us and the kids themselves was the joy that it brought them. Thankfully, some of the very kind teachers at the orphanage were interested in how to use the equipment, so now that they know, we hope that it will be put into practice long into the future.

Change is not about overthrowing everything at once. Change is about small, gradual improvements that accumulate over time to produce positive outcomes. The orphanage system in Belarus is not going to change overnight, nor are the attitudes of the public toward keeping a child

with disabilities. But what can change are all of the minor details that go into improving the lives of each and every child, which becomes incredibly meaningful over time.

As always, I want to thank the Burren Chernobyl Project for the amazing work that they do, along with those volunteers more experienced than me who have helped to carve the path for more and more young people to visit Gorodishche. I am sure I can speak for all of our group who travelled when I say that it has and will continue to be a life-changing experience that we are eternally grateful to be part of.

Excellent Leaving Cert results in Kerry but view and photograph your exam scripts

he eagerly awaited Leaving Cert exam results were issued yesterday by the State Examinations Commission (SEC) to about 58,000 candidates. The results dovetail nicely with the Rose of Tralee Festival so celebrate your achievement but keep a close eye on the closing dates. There are deadlines to be met in order to secure a place on your course preference. The early indications are that Leaving Cert results achieved in Kerry are excellent, so offers of third level college places will flood into the region next Mon, 20th Aug, when the first round of college offers is issued by the Central Applications Office (CAO).

It's in your best interests to view your marked Leaving Cert scripts this year, so return the completed application form to your school by Tue, 21st Aug. You will be assigned to one of the viewing sessions, which will be held on Fri, 31st Aug from 6.00pm to 9.00pm (Session 1), Sat, 1st Sept from 9.00am to 12.00noon (Session 2) and Sat, 1st Sept from 2.00pm to 5.00 pm (Session 3). Make a copy of your Leaving Cert scripts at the viewing by mobile phone, tablet or digital camera.

If you wish to have any of your subject scripts re-marked through the appeal process, use the Appeals Application Service, which will be available from noon on Mon, 20th Aug. Useyour exam number and PIN on www.examinations. ie to access the Appeals Application form. Select the subjects you wish to appeal. Print the Appeals Application form after you have paid the appropriate fee and return it to your school no later than Mon, 3rd Sept. The appeal fee is \in 40 (LC) or \in 15.50 (LCA) per subject. Results of Leaving Cert subject appeals will be released in mid-October. Last year, 9806 grades in individual subjects were appealed by 5615 candidates. 1425 of those grades were upgraded, which is about 14%. Only four grades were downgraded. The SEC automaticallyinforms the CAO of all changes of results. If you are entitled to a furtheroffer from CAO as a result of the outcome of the appeal, the CAO will automatically issue that offer to you, although it may be for entry in 2019.

The CAO vacant places facility opens on Tues., 21st Aug. (noon) at www.cao.ie. This facility is open to both those who have already made an application to CAO, whether placed or not, and to those who have not applied to CAO. Persons who have not applied already may make a vacant place application on payment of a fee of \notin 45.00. Persons who have already applied to CAO may apply for a vacant place on-line without payment of a further fee.

Leaving Cert results are personal and private. You decide who should know about them. However, if you need any advice, avail of the National Parents Council Post Primary confidential help line which became available yesterday. During the next few weeks, Guidance Counsellors are staffing that invaluable help line, providing advice and guidance for candidates and their parents. The help line operates on Wed 15th Aug (10am-7pm), Thurs, 16th Aug (10am–7pm) and Fri, 17th Aug (10am-1pm) following the release of Leaving Cert results. The help line will also be available on Mon, 20th Aug (8am-7pm), Tues,21st Aug (8am-7pm) and Wed, 22nd Aug (10am-1pm) following the release of CAO offers. The free phone number is 1800 265 165.

In the next article, I'll analyse the trends emerging from CAO Round One offers, which will be issued on Mon. I'll also give some advice about accepting your CAO offer online.

Prepare early for Third Level Costs

With the latest round of CAO offers out next week, Killarney Credit Union is advising parents and students to call in now to discuss their college finance options.

With the average cost of living for a student in Ireland studying away from home for three years amounting to over \in 33,000, and those living at home amounting to \in 20,502*. The credit union is recommending that parents call in and speak to a dedicated student loans officer to discuss their needs.

Speaking about Third Level costs, Helen Courtney Power, Business Development Officer with Killarney Credit Union stated "With the first round of CAO offers out on August 20th, there is pressure on parents and students to quickly organise accommodation, pay student contribution charges and meet the array of costs associated attending college.

We are recommending that parents and students come in early, discuss potential college finance needs and provide the necessary loan documentation. The member can then obtain pre-approval for the student loan, and they need not draw it down until its required. The amount required may also be adjusted later to suit the students course duration or college attended.

Helen added "Both parents and students can find meeting the costs of third level stressful and daunting and recent research have shown that approximately six-out-of-10 parents get into debt to cover college costs^{**}. Killarney Credit Union have put in place dedicated student loans officers for the month of August who can meet parents and students by appointment in each of their branches. Appointments can be made with Karena in the Beech Road branch, Donogh in the Park Road branch and Eileen in the Kenmare branch on 064-6631344.

In 2018, if your income is €13,000 or less you pay no Universal Social Charge (USC). (This limit was €10,036 from 2012 to 2014, €12,012 in 2015 and €13,000 in 2016 and 2017.) Judy Martin, widow of Beatles producer George Martin said she "envisioned a grand future for the English landmark and the plan to open Strawberry Field to the public for the first time – so people can see a unique exhibition about the home, how and why the song was written by John, and allow visitors to explore the grounds as John did as a child – is very exciting,". Strawberry Field is projected to open in the

summer of 2019.

RUBBISH IN RIVERS BEING COLLECTED AND RECYCLED TO MAKE FLOATING PUBLIC PARKS

The Recycled Island Foundation has been collecting litter from the Maas River in Rotterdam and recycling it into floating islands that benefit people and the aquatic ecosystem on which they drift.

For a year and a half, the organisation used litter traps placed at strategic points along the river to collect trash from the water.

The Dutch group then sorted and recycled the materials into hexagonal platforms that are designed to float on the river's surface.

By filling the platforms with greenery and native plant species, the platforms can benefit larger land creatures and offer up shelter and breeding grounds for microorganisms and fish.

After 5 years of research, development, and work, the foundation's first recycled park opened in Rotterdam on July 4th. The innovative public space is 1,500 square feet of habitat made from 28 hexagonal platforms.

GUIDELINES ON MUNSTER COUNCIL DEVELOPMENT GRANTS

It is that time of year when clubs start preparing their application forms for grants. Munster Council Grants are categorised as follows:

· Category 1 - Purchase of ground for playing pitch (including first, second or third pitch)

· Category 2 - Construction of new Dressing Rooms or Extension of existing Dressing Rooms

· Category 3 - Schools Grounds Purchase & Development

· Category 4 - Construction or Refurbishment of Handball Court

· Category 5 - County & Major Grounds Development

 \cdot Category 6 - Other Club Development Project

· Category 7 - Sanding Grant Scheme

 \cdot Category 8 - Regularisation of legal ownership of property

Application forms and guidelines for the various grant categories were issued in May. The closing date for grant applications is the last Friday, in September each year. Applications for grants received in Comhairle na Mumhan after the last Friday, in September in any year and incomplete applications received before that date shall be returned to the Club in question. Late applications shall be resubmitted for processing and approval the following year. Applications shall be deemed incomplete if any of the necessary documentation is not supplied. Only expenditure of a capital nature (providing a long term asset) is eligible for support under the Grant Schemes. Applications for grants shall only be considered from County Boards, affiliated clubs, handball clubs and schools, except in exceptional circumstances, within the province of Munster. In general only one application can be made for grant approval for the same project and proposed phasing of development must be stated in all applications for grants in first year of application. All GAA units in receipt of development grant funding are required to provide the use of their facilities to provincial, county, clubs, schools, colleges and other GAA units free of charge. Clubs found to be submitting incorrect or fraudulent documentation will be subject to sanctions as deemed appropriate by the Council up to and including suspension from the scheme and repayment of monies paid. All grant payments shall be made in favour of the applicant unit and will be paid out at a meeting organised in each County by the Munster Council representative. Payments in respect of approved grants shall be paid, where possible before the end of the year. Please contact Éamon Whelan, Development Officer for further information.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I have an extra room in my home and I would like to rent it out. Will I have to pay tax on this rental income?

ANSWER

If you rent out a room in your home, the rental income you earn is exempt from income tax, PRSI and the Universal Social Charge – provided it is less than $\in 14,000$ in a tax year (1 January to 31 December). This is called rent-a-room relief. Rental income includes the total rent and any money that the tenant pays directly to you for food, utilities, laundry or similar services. The income you get must be under the exemption limit of $\in 14,000$. If it is over this limit, you are taxed on the total amount.

Your home must be in the State and you must occupy it as your sole residence during the year of assessment. This means that it is your home for most of the year and is where people would normally expect to make contact with you.

Some self-contained units qualify for this relief but they must be attached to your home, for example, a basement flat in your home.

You do not have to own the property to get rent-a-room relief – you can be a tenant sub-letting to someone else. In this case, you should check with your landlord that sub-letting is allowed.

The rent-a-room relief applies only to residential tenancies, not to short-term guest arrangements, and tenants must use the room on a long-term basis. So, renting a room to a student for the academic year or for a one-month course is covered, but providing accommodation to occasional visitors for short periods, for example, through an online accommodation booking site, is not.

You cannot claim the relief if you are renting a room to your civil partner, son or daughter, or if you are an employee and your company pays you to allow clients to use the room on an occasional basis.
