





KERRY MOUNTAIN RESCUE TEAM RESPOND TO CALL OUT

Kerry Mountain Rescue team were called to Knockaluggane near Ballyvouney, close to the Cork-Kerry border on Monday afternoon where a walker had sustained a suspected broken leg after falling while walking on a forest track.

A HSE ambulance crew was unable to reach the injured man after responding to the accident. He was treated for his injury at about 5pm, before being airlifted from the scene by the Shannon-based Irish Coast Guard helicopter and transferred to Kerry General Hospital.

GOOD NEWS FOR KERRY FISHERMEN

KERRY Fine Gael TD, Brendan Griffin, has welcomed a deal secured in Europe by Minister Simon Coveney that will allow Irish Fishermen to bank a portion of this year's fishing quotas and transfer them into 2015.

The measure will help support the sector depending on mackerel, herring and horse mackerel fisheries from the adverse impact of the Russian import ban.

Deputy Griffin said that the deal is a positive development in the face of a potentially damaging trade dispute and commended Minister Coveney for achieving a flexible outcome.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSING AT FAIR HILL

At the October 2014 Killarney Municipal Area Meeting, Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that Kerry County Council in conjunction with the National Roads Authority (NRA) would provide a pedestrian crossing at Fair Hill, Killarney.

Kerry County Council replied that the road design section of the Council will be asked to examine a location for a pedestrian crossing on the eastern side of the Friary roundabout in the vicinity of the Outlet Centre in accordance with NRA standards. Subject to design and compliance with appropriate standards an application for funding can then be made under the Low Cost Safety Improvement Scheme for non-national roads.

Councillor Gleeson stated that this is a very heavily trafficked road and as a result pedestrians wishing to access the bus station or the Outlet Centre have great difficulty crossing. A dedicated crossing would ensure greater safety for all.



MONEY MATTERS....

WHERE TO INVEST YOUR **MONEY**

Interest rates for deposits in banks are the lowest they have been in years. Another problem for people looking for good interest rates is that as well as interest rates being low is that DIRT tax is very high at 41% and since the 1st January this year a PRSI levy of 4% can also be applied. The effective tax rate on interest earned on savings can be as high as 45% as both the new higher rate of Deposit Interest Retention Tax (DIRT) tax and the PRSI levy on unearned income have both come into force. If you invested €20000 over 12 months at 2.50%, taking into account DIRT tax and the levy you may only get €275 after DIRT tax and the PRSI levy. Because these returns are so poor people are looking for alternative investments. Thankfully there are other investment options available to you.

Investment providers have introduced many different types of products because of the very low returns on deposit accounts and it is very important that people know about all these products before deciding on what products suit them best. A mixture of different type of investments may be the best way to spread your investments rather than having all your eggs in one basket.

TRICK OR TREAT SAFETY FOR YOUNG CHILDREN!

Halloween is really about the fun children can have dressing up as their favourite character, playing seasonal games with their family and friends and of course trick or treating. However, such trick or treating can actually be quite dangerous as it usually takes place in the dark and in dangerous situations such as near fireworks or bonfires. Here are a few tips for your children to go trick or treating safely.

- 1. Take a torch
- Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- Avoid dogs, even if you know them because fireworks can upset even friendly dogs.
- 4. Children should carry a parents phone

number and mobile phone in case they are separated from the group.

- Plan what streets and houses you plan to visit.
- Don't knock on the doors of elderly people on Halloween night - it can greatly upset and frighten them unnecessarily.
- Explain the dangers of fireworks, bonfires and costumes to the trick or treaters.
- Always avoid placing or leaving children too close to bonfires and fireworks.

So this year, make sure that your kids are safe when trick or treating, so that they can really enjoy Halloween without any unnecessary frights or injuries!

HALLOWEEN FIREWORK SAFETY!

- Never use illegal fireworks: They are very unpredictable and often result in tragedy with the young in particular being injured, sometimes very seriously. It may be cheaper to just buy cost effective fireworks but they could be very unreliable, even when handled carefully.
- Report dangerous firework activity to your Garda Station.
- Warn your children about the danger of fireworks.
- 4. Make sure your pets are indoors: They can be frightened and injured by fireworks. If a dog runs under your bed after a rumble of thunder, imagine how he or she would react if he or she heard explosions in the skyl
- 5. Make sure an adult or parent is present at all firework use and at bonfires: The flames of a bonfire and/or fireworks can spread and get out of control very quickly. When a bonfire is monitored and controlled by an adult or a group of adults, such events are far less likely to have such adverse results. It is often said that there is a huge need to respect fire and fireworks, especially with regards children. Tips such as the above may prevent catastrophes from happening!

EYE BALL CAKES...... COOKING FOR KIDS

(BY MARK DOE, JUST COOKING)

115g of Self raising flour V: tsp baking powder 115g caster sugar 115g soft margarine or butter 2 medium eggs Strawberry jam

Strawberry Jam Ready roll icing

Food coluring, red green and black

Red food colouring pen

- Pre-heat your oven to 180c/ fan 170c/gas mark 5.
- Sift the flour and baking powder into a bowl, then add the sugar, margarine and eggs together. Beat all the ingredients well, (an electric whisk is best) until smooth and creamy.
- Place paper cake cases into a muffin tray and put two teaspoons of the mix into each case.
- Bake until golden, for approx 15-20 mins. Once baked leave to cool on a baking tray.

- Using an apple corer, cut out a circle from the centre of each bun. Put a teaspoor of strawberry jam in the hole then put the removed piece of cake back on top and gently press down.
- Roll out some white icing and cut a circle of icing roughly the same size as the bun. Gently press this on top of the bun.
- 7. Cut the remaining icing in half and colur half with the black food coloring and the other half with the black.
- Cut a small circle from the green icing and an even smaller one form the black icing.
- Place the green circle on top of the cake, followed by the black one. Draw blood shoot eyes with the red food colouring pen.








MOTORSPORT FANS SET TO FLOCK TO THE KINGDOM OF KERRY **IN NOVEMBER**

County Kerry is the place to be for motorsport fans in November as the Irish rally season draws to a close on the roads of The Kingdom.

Two of Ireland's most-popular rallies will take place just three weeks apart.

TOP TIPS FOR DRIVING AT DUSK

There are challenges to driving at all times of day or night:

During the day, we might be blinded by the sun During the night, we might not see very well even if our vehicle's headlights are illuminating

But one time of day we don't think about is dusk. Unfortunately, dusk is a very difficult time to drive. Here are some top tips to drive at dusk:

1. Be aware of the quickly changing light conditions. One moment might be extremely sunny so we are forced to wear sunglasses, but within moments, the sun can darken and our sunglasses end up doing more harm than good. And, if we don't have sunglasses, be aware that the rapidly changing light conditions can be very difficult on our eyes (which have a hard time adjusting to those fast-changing conditions). There isn't a lot you can do about it but awareness helps.

- 2. Be aware of the setting sun. Have you ever had momentary blindness after a camera has flashed? The same thing can happen if look into the sun while we are driving. This can happen if we are driving west during sunset or if we are driving east (and see the sun reflected in our mirrors). If possible, use your car's shades and adjust the mirrors. Consider pulling over to the side of the road to wait for sun to set a little first, or take another route that doesn't drive directly toward the setting sun.
- 3. Turn on headlights. With rapidly changing light conditions, it can be easy for someone to miss our car, especially if the headlights aren't on and it becomes dark quickly. Turn on your headlights if you will be driving during dusk, even if it is still quite light out.
- 4. Be aware that this is a time for animals to come out. Although timid animals might not come out during the day, many of them come

out at night when it feels safer. But they also come out because they are dazzled by the headlights of vehicles. Drive a little slower during dusk and pay special attention to the sides of the roads (especially in rural areas) to watch for movement among the grass that could indicate an approaching animal.

5. Be aware of changing temperatures. It's easy to point out the obvious changing light conditions. But temperatures also change at night and this can have an impact on our ability to drive safely: If the temperature and humidity inside our car is different than outside, our windows could fog up. You can correct this by opening the windows slightly or by running the defroster.

Every time of day offers different challenges when we drive. When you have to drive at dusk, use these 5 top tips to help you drive

STACKS THROUGH TO ANOTHER DECIDER **AUSTIN STACKS 2-13 DINGLE 1-9**



Bookies favourites Austin Stacks qualified for another Garvey's SFC final when they defeated Dingle by an easier than expected margin in the opening Garvey's County SFC semi-final clash at Austin Stack Park on Sunday.

Large crowds and long queues outside the ticket vans near the grounds prior to the start of the game led to a 15-minute delay. County Treasurer Dermot 'Weeshie' Lynch apologised for the delays on Monday and stressed it was unavoidable due to the large attendance.

On an ideal afternoon for football, Stacks, for whom veteran William Kirby started instead of Darragh O'Brien, had matters pretty much their own way for most of the game. This was a team performance by Stephen Stacks' side who, on this evidence are justifiable favourites for the decider, having lost two previous finals to Dr Crookes in 2010 and THE AUSTIN STACKS TEAM WHO PLAYED DINGLE IN THE GARVEY'S SUPERVALU SENIOR COUNTY FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP SEMI FINAL AT 2013. Once again, Kieran Donaghy was central to the Stacks win. As well as scoring two points Donaghy, who

was earlier in the week named as the GAA's Gaelic footballer for September and nominated on the 2014 All-Stars team, set up several other scoring chances for his colleagues, and was here, there and everywhere like the proverbial will o'the wisp.

Indeed, one has to question the wisdom of the Dingle mentors in placing Kerry minor centre-back Marc O'Connor on Kieran Donaghy. To give him due credit, O'Connor stuck with Donaghy in the early stages but once the 'Star' gets the right type of service into him, he is simply un-

markable and this was seen to great effect again last Sunday. Dingle were two reliant on the Geaney cousins, Paul and Michael, who scored 1-7 of their 1-9 tally between them, with Paul, who went off injured

towards the end of the game, amassing a personal haul of 1-6. Dingle put it up to the Rockies in the early stages of the game and were only one point in arrears with 18 minutes of the first half gone, Stacks leading 0-4 to 0-3 at that stage. But with Donaghy coming into his own, Wayne Guthrie, veteran William Kirby rolling back the years, Shane Carroll, Mikey Collins and Shane

O'Callaghan impressive up front, the Tralee side clicked into overdrive and scored 1-7 without reply, the goal coming from Shane O'Callaghan when Kieran Donaghy set him up. This gave the Rockies a 1-11 to 0-3 lead at the interval.

Dingle tried very hard to muster a fight back and early points from Matthew Flaherty and Paul Geaney cut the deficit back to nine points. The fight back was brief, as a second goal for the Rock which came from a wicked deflection from an unlucky Dingle defender who at the time was under severe pressure from Kieran Donaghy, effectively killed off any hope the West Kerry side had.

Dingle did win a penalty late in the game when Barry O'Sullivan was fouled, Paul Geaney dispatching the ball to the net, but that only put a better reflection on the scoreboard as Stacks place in the decider was assured by then.

As expected, Mid Kerry advanced to a Garvey's County SFC final meeting with Austin Stacks following an easy victory over Shannon Rangers in a very disappointing second semi-final at Austin Stack Park on Sunday. With so much at stake, both sides adopted a very defensive approach, often dropping players back in numbers when their opponents had possession.

Rangers goalkeeper Darragh O'Shea made a number of superb saves, and helped keep Mid Kerry's margin of victory down.



TRYING TO PREDICT THE **WEATHER FOR NEXT YEAR**

As the nights close in and the weather turns toward winter, the predictions for next year are already in the papers. It is a harmless pastime; forecasts of this kind have been around since long before Caesar was a boy. Over the centuries people have tried to make a profit out of such prophecies but none so successfully as Patrick Murphy. Originally from Cork, he immigrated to London in the 1820s and by the 1830s was writing books and almanacs on the weather. In the winter of 1837/38 he hit the jack pot. In his entry for January 20 he predicted "fair and probably the lowest degree of winter temperatures", he was spot on. The temperature in Kent hit -26 degrees Celsius, in London it fell to -20 Celsius. The Thames froze; people could walk and skate on the ice from The Tower of London to Hammersmith, Fires were built on the ice, sheep were roasted on a spit, a carnival of sorts ensued and Murphy became a sensation. His book sales went into overdrive, 45 editions and a profit of £3000, a serious sum of money in those days. Unfortunately the reliability of his later predictions did not live up to scrutiny and by year end he was the subject of a one act farce and uncomplimentary little ditties. Undeterred he continued to publish his almanac, to a much smaller audience until his death in 1847. If his weather forecasting skills were poor, his financial acumen was no better, by the time he died, his fortune was gone, lost speculating on corn futures. "Murphy's winter" however lives on in folklore and became an enduring legacy to an enterprising Corkman.

Satellites and super computers are tools among many available to Met services today. People expect much



from these services, at the very least a strong indication of the weather for the next few months. It has not been plain sailing. The UK Met Office must feel a little like Murphy in recent years, they have had a miserable run. Three summers in a row of wrong predictions, a "warmer than normal" projection for the winter for 2010 turned into a major embarrassment , the severe cold costing farmers alone over £100 million in lost crops and collapsed buildings. Then the clanger of early 2012, Britain had been through a dry autumn, winter and early spring, in March, the met office forecast a continuation of the dry period for the next three months, with April being the driest. April broke records across the country for rainfall, June did much the same. This from a computer that cost £33 million to build.

What hope then for a forecast that hangs its hat on the moon. There is a lot of wisdom in ancient observations but our weather, according to Dr Andrew Edmonds, is governed by chaos. Is there ever going to be a model that can predict weather beyond a couple of weeks? I doubt it but I live in hope.

ICOS PRESIDENT WELCOMES BUDGET CHANGES TO ASSIST SUCCESSION PLANNING

The purpose of the recent review of existing reliefs in the agri-sector by both the Departments of Finance and Agriculture was in part with a view to enhance benefits that seemed to be working well and to identify measures from other countries that would have benefits for Irish Agriculture. The President of ICOS, Bertie O'Leary has welcomed proposals to increase the income tax exempt thresholds by 50%, together with the introduction of a new threshold for leases of 15 years and over and the removal of the current 40 years of age threshold for leasing relief. He said this will provide greater certainty when it comes to succession planning. It should facilitate more frequent and earlier transfer of productive assets to a younger generation of trained farmers. This will create consequent benefits with increased output from farms and increased value added from the agri-sector. Income

volatility is a huge issue for farmers. ICOS welcomes the measures introduced in the Budget which increases the averaging period for farm incomes from three to five years This will provide farmers with valuable assistance as a form of buffer against income volatility.

Bertie O'Leary concluded by stating it is essential following Budget 2015 that Government policy is driven by a reasoned plan for the public finances. As an exporting nation, Ireland's input costs must be kept competitive. The recent surge in Ireland's growth performance, while very welcome, is too recent for there to be confidence that it can be sustained. With the current mediocre performance in the growth of some of the key euro countries, there continues to be a strong argument for keeping a buffer on the public





Treatment

Treatment options which may be considered include surgery, chemotherapy, radiotherapy and hormone treatment. Often a combination of two or more of these treatments is used. The type of treatment used depends on the grade and spread of the cancer and the presence or absence of receptors as well as the general health of the patient.

A discussion should be had with the specialist as to the treatment aims. If in the early stages then the overall aim of treatment may be to cure the cancer. In other cases treatment is aimed to slow the progression of the cancer.

Depending on the size of the tumour much of the breast tissue may be conserved. A lumpectomy (wide local excision) are terms used to describe conservation of breast tissue. In some cases the breast may need to be removed. This is referred to as a mastectomy. It is now possible in many cases to reconstruct the breast at the time of surgery. This can also be done at a later stage if preferred.

A sentinel lymph node biopsy may be performed. This is a way of assessing if the main lymph nodes draining the breast contain cancer. If they are clear then the remaining lymph nodes in the armpit will not need to be removed. If it is not possible to do this, one or more of the lymph nodes in the armpit may be removed. This helps to stage the disease accurately and to guide the specialist as to what treatment to advise following surgery.

Radiotherapy

Radiotherapy is a treatment which uses high-energy beams of radiation which are focused on cancerous tissue. The aim is to kill the remaining cancer cells or stop them from multiplying. Radiotherapy is often used in conjunction to surgery (referred to adjuvant radiotherapy).

Hormone treatments

Some types of breast cancer are affected by the female hormones oestrogen and progesterone. Hormone treatments used are aimed to reduce the level of these hormones in the body and thus slow cancer growth. Hormone treatments include:

There are different type of hormone medication used including Oestrogen blockers (Tamoxifen), aromatase inhibitors (block production of oestrogen) and GnRH analogues.

An alternative which may be considered for women before the menopause is to remove the ovaries (or to destroy them with radiotherapy). This stops oestrogen from being made.





Previous Ebola outbreaks have been repeatedly contained at small numbers. But the scale of this epidemic has swamped the region's weak health systems. Liberia has less than 1 doctor for every 100,000 people. Governments are providing funds, but there just aren't enough medical staff to stem the epidemic.

If just 120 doctors among us volunteer, it will double the number of doctors in Liberia.

Other volunteers can help too—lab technicians, logisticians, water sanitation workers, and transport workers. Volunteering means more than time. It means risk. Ebola is highly contagious. Health professionals have already died fighting it. But if there's any group of people that would consider taking this risk for their fellow human beings, it's our community, members on the Avaaz team are ready to take that risk with you, traveling to the front lines of this crisis.

Great things come from listening to the deepest voices within us. If you're a health professional,

or have other skills that can help, I ask you to take a moment, listen to the part of you that you most trust, and follow it.

Raising your hand to volunteer is the first step. You'll need to get, and provide, a lot of information to ensure you're well matched to an available position. You will likely need to discuss this decision with your loved ones, and you can withdraw from the process later if you choose to. For this effort, Avaaz is working with Partners in Health, Save the Children, and International Medical Corps, three of the leading organisations fighting this deadly disease. We are also consulting with the governments of Liberia, Sierra Leone, and Guinea, and the World Health Organization.

While there is substantial risk, there are also clear ways to contain that risk. Ebola is spread by physical contact, so with extreme care, the risk of contracting it can be minimized. So far, 94 health care workers have died of Ebola in Liberia, but almost all of them have been national health workers, who sadly are far less well equipped than international volunteers. With treatment, the chances of surviving the virus are better than 50%.

If Ebola spirals further out of control, it could soon threaten us all. The fact that a weak health care system in a small country can let this monster grow to a size that threatens the world is a powerful statement of just how interdependent we are. But this interdependence is far more than just interests. We are connected, all of us, in a community of human beings. All the lies that have divided us - about nation and religion and sexuality - are being torn down, and we are realizing that we really are one people, one tribe. That a young mother and her daughter in Liberia fear the same things and love the same things as a young mother and her daughter in Brazil, or the Netherlands. And in this unfolding understanding, a new world is being born. Out of the darkest places come our brightest lights. Out of the depths of the Ebola nightmare, let's bring the hope of a new world of one people, willing to give, and sacrifice, for each other. With hope and determination,

HOW TO GET OUT OF DEBT

Debt elimination involves three steps:

- Stop acquiring new debt.
- Establish an emergency fund.
- Implement a debt snowball.

Here's how to approach each step.

• Stop acquiring new debt. (This step can be accomplished in an afternoon.) This may seem self-evident, but the reason your debt is out of control is that you keep adding to it. Stop using credit. Don't finance anything. Cut up your credit cards.

That last one can be tough. Don't make excuses. Stop rationalising that you need them.

You don't need credit cards for a safety net. You don't need credit cards for convenience.

You don't need credit cards at all. If you're in debt, credit cards are a trap. They only put you deeper in debt. Later, when your debts are gone and your finances are under control, maybe then you can get a credit card.

After you destroy your cards, halt any recurring payments. If you have a gym membership, cancel it. If you automatically renew your World of Warcraft account, cancel it. Cancel anything that automatically charges your credit card. Stop using credit.

 Establish an emergency fund. (This step will probably take several months.)

For some, this is counter-intuitive. Why save before paying off debt? Because if you don't save first, you're not going to be able to cope with unexpected expenses. Do not tell yourself that you can keep a credit card for emergencies. Destroy your credit cards; save cash for emergencies.

How much should you save? Ideally, you'd save €1,000 to start. (College students may be able to get by with €500.) This money is for emergencies only. It is not for beer. It is not for shoes. It is not for a Playstation 3. It is to be used when your car dies, or when you have a medical emergency.

Keep this money liquid, but not immediately accessible. Don't tie your emergency fund to a debit card. Don't sabotage your efforts by making it easy to spend the money on non-essentials. Consider opening a seperate savings account. When an emergency arises, you can easily transfer the money to your regular checking account. It'll be there when you need it, but you won't be able to spend it spontaneously.

 Implement a debt snowball. (This step may require several years.)

After you've stopped using credit, and after you've saved an emergency fund, then attack your existing debt. Attack it with vigour. Throw whatever you can at it.

Many people say to pay your high interest debts first. There's no question that this makes the most sense mathematically. But if money were all about math, you wouldn't have debt in the first place. Money is as much about emotion and psychology as it is about math.

There are at least two approaches to debt elimination. Psychologically, using a debt snowball offers big payoffs, payoffs that can spur you to further debt reduction. Here's the short version:

Order your debts from lowest balance to highest balance.

Designate a certain amount of money to pay toward debts each month.

Pay the minimum payment on all debts except for the one with the lowest balance.

Throw every other penny at the debt with the lowest balance.

When that debt is gone, do not alter the monthly amount used to pay debts, but throw all you can at the debt with the next-lowest balance.

With the debt snowball, it still takes time to pay off your debts, but you can see results almost immediately.

Supplementary solutions

You can do other things to improve your money situation while you're working on these three steps.

First, focus on the fundamental personal finance equation: to pay off debt, or to save money, or to accumulate wealth, you must spend less than you earn.

Curb your spending. Re-learn frugal habits. (Frugality is something with which most college students are all too familiar.) You can find some great ideas in the archives of the Get Rich Slowly archives site, also check out Frugal for Life through your search engine.

TOKYO IS THE WORLD'S MOST POPULOUS MEGA CITY, WITH 38 MILLION PEOPLE

With more and more of the world's population moving into urban centres, the number of such areas with more than 10 million people has exploded in the last quarter century.

In 1990 there were only 10 of these "megacities," with about seven percent of the global population. Now there are 28, according to the UN report on World Urbanization. The total number of people living in megacities has grown from 153 million to 453 million during that period, says the UN report. About 12% of the world's population lives in one, while 54% lives in an urban area, expected to grow to 66% by 2050. By 2030, the world is projected to have 41 such megacities.

Of those 28 megacities, sixteen are in Asia, four are in Latin America, three each are in Africa and Europe, and two are in Northern America. Tokyo leads the list with more than 38 million people living in its metro area. Delhi is a distant second with 25 million. However, the population of Tokyo is projected to shrink somewhat while Delhi is expected to grow rapidly until the two cities are nearly equal in population. Shanghai, Mexico City, Sao Paolo and Osaka follow with over 20 million apiece. Beijing has almost 20 million.

Meanwhile, the rural population is expected to shrink. It's currently at 3.4 billion and is expected to decline to 3.1 billion by 2050. And a majority of Earth's 3.9 million urban residents

live in smaller cities, although many of those are among the fastest growing.

GOOD NEWS

A duck in Wichita, Kansas, is lucky to be free and alive, thanks to one woman's kindness and determination. Debbie Fanning and her dogs were on a routine walk one July day, when she stumbled upon a duck across the pond clearly in distress. The poor duck had a plastic six-pack holder around its head.

Debbie knew that she wanted to help, but like most of us she didn't know the best way to help the struggling duck, so she tried calling upon the experts. Debbie tried to reach out to ten local animal welfare and rescue agencies, and they said that they couldn't help her or the duck. Many claimed that they didn't handle wildlife cases. One of the ten groups devoted to helping animals shockingly told Debbie to just "let nature take its course."

Thankfully, Debbie didn't listen. She finally got in contact with the Wichita Animal Action League (WAAL). WAAL usually handles domestic dog and cat cases — including fostering animals in emergency situations and performing trap-neuter-return (TNR) programs — but Sarah Coffman, the organization's founder and director, agreed to at least try and help the duck fighting for her life.

Ms. Coffman was dismayed when she heard of Debbie's struggle to find help for the innocent duck. She was even more appalled when she heard the line about nature taking its course. As Ms. Coffman said "I don't think a plastic sixpack holder wrapped around a duck is natural. It's littering."

When the WAAL rescue team arrived on the scene, the situation was worse than they expected. Not only did the duck have a plastic

pop carrier around its head, but the plastic had wrapped three times around her head and around the duck's beak. Ms. Coffman described how the duck's beak had begun to grow around the plastic. This affected how the duck would eat, so she would have become malnourished and starved to death.

Volunteers had to think fast. They started throwing meal worms in an attempt to lure her closer to them. Finally, after feeding her and her duck friends delicious meal worms for close to an hour, they caught her with a net and pulled her to shore. Volunteers carefully snipped away at the plastic until she was free.

Happy to be in the water again, the duck swam and splashed around, but Ms. Coffman said that she did come back towards the group of "volunteers and just stared as if to say 'thanks." WAAL also won because not only did they save a duck, they also got a new volunteer since Debbie has plans to help the organisation. While WAAL made the rescue happen, it would've never been possible without Debbie's determination to find help.

PLASTIC IS DESTROYING OUR ENVIRONMENT

While one duck in Wichita is lucky to be free and alive, many more animals aren't as lucky. Degradable plastic like the six-pack holder can still do damage before it degrades, like we've seen in this story. Had that plastic at least been cut up, then the innocent duck wouldn't have been caught in the first place.

According to WHOI, turtles are confusing plastic bags with jellyfish and some seabirds are ingesting plastic pellets taking them for fish eggs.

- Plastic wraps around living corals, suffocates and kills them.
- The substance is capable of holding and attracting dangerous elements, like PCB and DDT.
- There's actually a place 500 miles off California's coast called "plastic island," also known as the Great Pacific Garbage Patch. At 7 billion pounds and twice as large as Texas, plastic island is nothing more than a monstrous patch of floating plastic that's formed from currents.

5 SIMPLE WAYS YOU CAN HELP:

- 1) Avoid plastic as much as possible
- 2) Cut up all plastic rings from milk containers, bottles, 6 packs etc before disposal.
- 3) Properly recycle plastic
- 4) Become informed and share what you know 5) Consider joining a roadside, river or ocean clean-up where they'll inevitably be plenty of plastic.

FOCUS ON CONTAINERS

FILLING WINTER

Now is the time to start filling your winter containers, pots and baskets. First thing to do is empty your pots of the summer display including compost and give it a quick wash inside. Then put some gravel around the drainage hole at the bottom of the pot. Now add some new compost and fill it about 2 inches from the top of the pot and firm it down but not too hard.

Next it's time to choose what plants you're going to use, first plant what will be your centre piece, which could be anything from a conifer to a grass, such as a phormiumn or if it's a very large pot or container you could choose something like a pyramid or a standard bay-tree which is a bit more expensive but you will have them for a long time.

Next plants to choose would be something trailing such as ivy or a Vinca and plant three of them like a triangle in the pot, in between these you can plant some primroses, polyanthus, winter pansy, cyclamen, etc and also you can plant some tulip or daffodils as well.

After planting remember to water in well.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights:

HOUSEHOLD BENEFITS PACKAGE AND WATER CHARGES

OUESTION

I live alone and get a State Pension. Will I be able to get any help with the new water charges?

ANSWER

Domestic water charges have been applied since 1 October 2014 and the first bills will issue from January 2015. A free allowance of a certain amount of water will be provided for every household, with extra allowances for children. If you are getting the Household Benefits Package, you will also get help with the cost of water

From January 2015 the Household Benefits Package will include a new annual Water Support payment of €100 (made up of four equal payments of €25). The Water Support payment will be paid to everyone who qualifies for the Household Benefits Package. This includes people who are not customers of Irish Water and who either have their own water supply or are members of a group scheme.

If you are currently getting the Household Benefits Package and get your allowance as a credit on your bill, the Department of Social Protection (DSP) does not hold payment details for you. In September 2014 the DSP contacted customers to ask them to complete a form with their bank account information so the Water Support payment can be paid directly. The Water Support payment can also be paid in post offices.

The Water Support payment will be paid directly to you, not to Irish Water. If your home is connected to a public water supply (or to public wastewater services) you will need to set up an account with Irish Water to pay your water charges and to claim the free household allowance. Irish Water has sent customer application packs to all households, to be returned by 31 October 2014.
