

# KILLARNEY MUNICIPAL DISTRICT MEETING





Councillor Michael Gleeson:

"If the width of the Pedestrian
Crossing from High Street
car park side to Park Place
apartments complies
with TII standards as
some people find great

Kerry County Council replied that the Council designed and built the Junction and Pedestrian Crossing in accordance with TII standards. The Council has again inspected and reviewed the Crossing. When designed and built the Crossing allowed additional time for universal access across the junction. The Council is now proposing to trial a Pedestrian Countdown Timer in order to assist pedestrians across the junction.

Councillor Gleeson stated that some people are finding it difficult to cross at this junction and have relocated to the Library crossing. He asked that the re-assessment would take place with all due haste."

#### Councillor John Sheahan:

To ask Kerry County Council if there is a weight restriction on the Mill Road in Killarney. Large trucks are using the route as a short cut and residents are suffering as a result?

**REPLY:** Yes there is 3 tonne Weight Restriction on the L-3911 and weight restriction signage in place.

#### Councillor John Sheahan:

Have the council considered approaching the Presentation Sisters with a view to purchasing lands in front of the Convent, adjacent to the Cathedral for parking?

**REPLY:** The land in front of the convent adjacent to the Cathedral is in the ownership of St. Brendan's Trust. The Council has had a number of meetings with St. Brendan's Trust.

#### Councillor John Sheahan:

To ask Kerry County Council to proceed without delay, the opening of the Tomies Woods Walk as the funding has now been delivered?

**REPLY:** The development of the car park and access road at this location is being carried out by Summer 2019.



#### Councillor John Sheahan:

Has there been a decision made as to the best location for a multi-storey car park for Killarney town?

**REPLY:** A project team is now in place to advane the Aras Phádraig site. An application for funding under the Urban Regeneration

Development Fund to prepare a mastrplan for the Aras Phádrag was successful. The Council will now advance the preparation of this masterplan. The development of a multistory will be reviewed as part of the Master Plan

#### **Councillor John Sheahan:**

To ask Kerry County Council to expedite the purchase of lands necessary to ensure the safety of traffic on the bypass in Killarney. **REPLY:** The Part 8

Public Notice for the proposed works at Lewis Road/Kilcummin Road will be published in January 2019. On completion of this process, the acquisition process for the neces

acquisition of this process, the land acquisition process for the necessary lands will be commenced and it is hoped to have the lands acquired and to have the Construct Contract procured to the end of 2019 with the works being carried out I 2020 subject to the availability of the necessary funding.

#### **Councillor John Sheahan:**

To ask Kerry County Council to install the promised street light at the entrance to Cahernanne Meadows, Killarney.

**REPLY:** The estimated cost to provie 1 No. new 6m column and 32w LED lantrn is €3,500. This work can be funded via CSMDOF.

Cllr: John Sheahan and Cllr. Michael Gleeson have allocated funds to have this issue resolved.


2018 marked the 37th year of the GOAL Mile, which is one of the

#### **SHOULD YOU BE CONSIDERING SWITCHING YOUR MORTGAGE**

Yes, because some of the Irish mortgage lenders have much lower mortgage interest rates compared to others. There has been a lot of discussion recently in the media recently as regards mortgage switching this is because there can be a very substantial difference in interest rates and monthly repayments between lenders. For example on a mortgage of €200000 over 30 years based on a property value of €300000 and comparing current fixed interest rates one lenders 2 year fixed rate is as slow as 2.30% (3.90% APR) which costs €770 per month whereas another lenders 2 year fixed rate is as high as 3.30% (APR 3.96%) monthly repayment €876 per month. The monthly repayment for the lender with the higher rate is a staggering €106 per month more expensive. Over the term of the mortgage you could pay €38,271.60 (approx) more in interest based on the above difference in interest rates and based on interest rates not changing. With anything that is done in life, there is always a reason behind it and it is no different with our single use plastic bottle initiative. The main reason behind why our initiative was set up is to help change the present to make a better future.

#### TAX STATEMENTS REPLACING THE P60 AND P45 **CHANGES FROM 2019**

As part of PAYE modernisation, P45's and P60's have been abolished and replaced with an online system. Since 1 January 2019, employers have to report details of their employees' pay, income tax, PRSI and USC to Revenue every time they pay their employees. Employers must also give details of any employees leaving their job.

Your 2018 P60 is the last P60 that you will get from your employer. From 2019, an end of year statement will be available to you through Revenue's myAccount service. An end of year statement includes details of all your pay and deductions from all employments for that tax year.

You will no longer get a P45 if you leave your job. Instead, your employer will enter your leaving date and details of your final pay and deductions into Revenue's online system and you can access these details through Revenue's myAccount service.



# CAO applicants must keep a close eye on the timeline

You may use the online Change of Course Choices facility, fee €10, from 5th Feb to 1st March to add any restricted courses not already listed. Restricted category applicants may also use this facility. All other applicants should use the free Change of Mind option, between 6th May and 1st July, to make any course changes. Completed online Higher Education Access Route (HEAR)/Disability Access Route to Education (DARE) forms must be submitted by 1st March. HEAR/DARE supporting documentation must arrive in CAO by 1st April. Late online applications, fee €60, will be accepted from 5th March to 1st May. From 6th May, you may register a change of course choices online at www.cao.ie. Check that your courses have been updated by using the "My Application" facility before 1st July. Before the end of May, you will be sent a Statement of Application Record to verify that all your information has been recorded accurately. If you find any error in the document, contact the CAO.

Course choices and preferences may be changed as often as desired, free of charge, between 6th May and 1st July. If you submit a Change of Mind, it cancels all the previous course choices, which you have submitted. The two categories (Level 8 and Level7/6) are completely separate from each other for this purpose. Any restricted application course, added for the first time via a Change of Mind won't be considered unless it shares the same assessment procedure with a course you had applied for by 1st Feb.

In early July, offers of places (Round A) are issued to deferred applicants, mature applicants and to those who need to make visa arrangements. In early August, offers of places (Round Zero) are issued to certain non-standard categories of applicants such as FET/QQI and graduate applicants. Round One, the main body of offers is likely to be issued on the 19th August. Last year, 50,746 applicants received offers in Round One. Following Rebecca Carter's successful High Court Case last year, CAO plans to release details of the finalised 2019 offers and acceptance schedule in early 2019. I will analyse the new schedule if its available before the end of the current series.

In the next article, I will guide you through "Apply" - the CAO interactive online application system.

#### 6 Tips for planning meals

Eating healthily is a challenge for all of us. Parents often tell us that planning really helps them provide healthy meals and snacks no matter how busy things get. Here are six ways to make planning part of your weekly schedule.

#### 1. GIVE YOURSELF TIME TO PLAN

- Set aside about 30 mins each week to make a meal plan. Keep to it each week.
   Once you get into the habit of planning, you will need less time.
- Think about
- a How many meals you need to prepare for the week
- b Your weekly schedule and when you need to make quick meals or prepare them in advance
- Good meal plans means you will save time in the supermarket and probably reduce food waste also.

#### 2. CHECK WHAT YOU HAVE

 Before you start planning check to see what ingredients you already have in your cupboard, fridge or freezer. This may help to give you some recipe inspiration.
 For example if you have eggs you could make an omelette.
 Use up vegetables with a stir-fry.

#### 3. MAKE IT FUN WITH FAVOURITES

- Make a go-to list of meals that your family enjoys and alternate between these.
   Introduce new recipes each week and if it's a hit add to your favourites.
- Get the kids involved by asking them what they would like to eat. Kids are more likely to
  eat meals that they have helped to plan.
- If you're struggling to think of new ideas why not introduce a themed night, for example Mexican Monday, Italian Tuesday, Fishy Fridays or Something New Saturday.

#### 4. LOVE YOUR LEFTOVERS

- Plan meals that can be refrigerated and heated up or eaten cold the next day such as pasta bake, soup, shepherd's pie, curry, lasagne or beef stew.
- You can use leftover vegetables in an omelette, soup or salad while leftover meat could be added to a curry or stir-fry.
- Remember leftovers stored in the fridge must be used within three days.

#### 5. COOK IN BULK

- Cook extra and refrigerate or freeze the leftovers. Pies, curries, stews and casseroles all freeze well.
- If you are using the oven, think about what else you can cook at the same time. If you are doing a casserole, you could cook some chicken breasts to go in sandwiches.

#### 6. MAKE YOUR INGREDIENTS WORK

- Chose recipes that use the same key ingredients to save time and money by reducing the amount of food you need to buy.
- Introduce variety by picking 2-3 main vegetables and adding them to a meat, pasta or fish
  dish. For example peppers, broccoli and sweetcorn can be added to a beef stir-fry but can
  also be used to make a vegetable pasta bake or served with meat or fish.







#### How do I know if my child has an eye problem?

Some eye conditions do not display any signs or symptoms, so the only way to know for sure is to take your child for a sight test.

Signs which may show there is a problem with a child's sight include:

- •an eye appearing to drift inwards or outwards;
- difficulty concentrating;
- •headaches;
- •sitting too close to the television; or

•rubbing their eyes a lot.
The condition 'lazy eye' can run in the family, so if someone in your family has either an eye turn ('squint') or suffers from reduced vision in one or both eyes('amblyopia'), it's a good idea to take any related children for a sight test.

#### What is vision screening?

Some children have their vision screened at school – this is usually a basic test, designed to pick up children who have reduced vision in one or both eyes. If a problem is suspected, children will usually be referred for a full sight test. What is a sight test?

A sight test is a comprehensive check which can pick up many conditions,

including colour vision defects, problems with the development of 3D vision and any need for glasses. Taking children for sight tests from an early age helps to build good eye health habits into adulthood.


#### What can I do if I don't want my child to wear glasses?

Some parents avoid taking their children for a sight test, because they do not want them to wear glasses

It's important to understand that some children do need visual correction so their vision can develop normally and to achieve their full potential. The good news is there is now a much wider range of attractive frames to choose from and less stigma attached to wearing glasses. Many children are also suitable for contact lenses. This is particularly helpful for children who take part in regular sports activities and they can be successfully worn from an earlier age than most parents expect.







# IT'S PET DUMPING TIME AGAIN - AND THE BEST THING TO DO IF YOU FIND A STRAY

Firstly check to see if a dog has an Identity tag, sometimes numbers can be written on a disc on the collar or inside the collar.

Secondly if there is no contact number take the dog or cat to the nearest vet to scan for a microchip, if the animal cannot be caught or the vet is not available immediately take a photo of the pet and send as to as many rescue centres Facebook pages as you can.

Send a photo, description of the pet, male/female, young, old and most importantly where it was found. Also pm the page your contact number. Make sure when you post on the rescue's FB page you put the post on public settings.

Keep hold of the pet for a day or two or try to get a friend or neighbour to do so, the animal or bird is more than likely owned in the area if it is genuinely straying. Sometimes it takes a day or two for word to reach the owner but can be longer. Rescues are under huge pressure and may be full, and taking an non vaccinated pet can put their other animals at risk.

Contact the Gardai, put up posters, ask the postman in the area, the post office, shops, pubs is a great place to place a poster as many people use them who may not be on the internet. Most if not all Radio Kerry Presenters are extremely obliging at making the public aware of Lost and Found animals during their programmes.

If someone comes forward claiming to be the owner please get proof of ownership through photographs or part of the animals description that you have held back, observing the pets attitude with the person is not always enough as some pets are overly friendly with strangers and there are many pet thieves out there.

It is the law to microchip your dog, but it is a very good idea to microchip all of your pets and in the case of dogs it is also essential that they wear a



collar and identity tag as not everyone has the means to take it to a Vet for chip scanning.

If you have changed address or have become the owner of a micro chipped pet be sure to notify the microchip database, if you did not get the certificate with the pet ask your Vet for advice.

## SCHOOL DESKS FROM OLD CARDBOARD

In a novel initiative, students of the Indian Institute of Technology-Madras have collected discarded or used cardboard boxes from e-commerce websites, retail stores, and households from around Chennai and created eco-friendly desks for 400 students studying in government schools. This is a part of REACH, a student-driven social development initiative, which seeks to serve both the people as well as the environment by promoting education and reuse, attached to the varsity's flagship annual technology festival, Shaastra.

"Social initiatives such as REACH have been a part of Shaastra since 2016. One of the heads of the REACH initiatives explained that " this is our way of giving back to society. During a previous year's initiative when we went to government schools to provide them with liquid handwash, we saw students sitting on the floors with hunched backs and without desks, The emphasis now is to further this initiative with assistance from a network of other non-profits and assist government schools that often suffer from a shortfall in basic infrastructure.

REACH comprises a team of about 11 students who coordinate work on the ground and come up with new ideas, the first campaign they embarked on was Pledge a Book, where they collected unused books and facilitated the construction of libraries in rural and underserved areas of cities like Chennai. In the following year, the started Synk, an initiative that recycled plastic bottles into bricks that would later be used to construct toilets in rural areas. The students have already developed a prototype of this brick and will approach experts in the field to further this initiative.

As social beings, we are hard wired to connect and most of us feel the need for rewarding social contact and relationships. Loneliness is the feeling we get when our need for this type of contact is not met. Loneliness of course is not the same as being alone. We may choose to be alone and live very happy lives without much contact with others. Or indeed we may have much social contact, be constantly surrounded by people, and yet feel very lonely. Loneliness can have a significant impact on our mental health and can contribute to mental health problems, such as anxiety and depression. Loneliness can have many different causes and affects people in different ways. Some people feel lonely due to their personal circumstances (e.g. moving to a new area, loss or bereavement). For others however, loneliness can be a deeper more constant feeling that comes from within.

Connecting with the world around us can be a great way to combat loneliness. This may be having a small conversation with the cashier when we pay for our groceries or saying hello to someone we meet in the street. Phoning or sending an email to family and friends can be a good reminder that we do have people in our lives.

Our brain can try to make sense of the feeling of loneliness by telling us things such as 'It is because nobody loves me' or 'There is something wrong with me' These thoughts are not facts - and can make us feel worse. Thus it is important to accept how we are feeling without overreacting. When we feel lonely, the tendency might be to withdraw into ourselves and this can be counterproductive. The healthiest thing to do if we are feeling lonely is to reach out and cultivate friendships. Reaching out can be difficult and at times we will resist it. However, think of it in the way you might approach exercising - whilst we may feel tired or lazy it is a beneficial thing to

We need to tackle loneliness one step at a time. It may involve finding a new hobby or joining a club or exercise class. Another skillful way to combat feelings of loneliness is to volunteer as it's a great way to meet new people and also to learn new skills.

Loneliness is a profoundly human emotion and a signal that our need for connection is going unmet.
