# **GIVING KILLARNEY A TIDY TOWNS EDGE:** *If the cap fits...*

Killarney opted to throw its cap into the ring when it came to county clean-up day and Kerry's premier tourist town certainly led by example with a big army of volunteers lining out.

The most famous cap wearer in the country, Minister of State Michael Healy-Rae, was certainly made to feel at home when he turned up for the official launch where all the volunteers waiting to greet him were clad in similar peaked-cap attire – just to give themselves a head start.

The fun gesture was in keeping with the good humour and feelgood factor that prevailed all over the county on Saturday which marked the 13th year of the KWD sponsored county clean-up day.

There was good news on the ground as well as the volunteers reported a significant reduction in rubbish collected on the roads which they attribute to the success of the bottle and can Re-turn scheme and the Killarney coffee cup project.

A total of 183 groups registered for the clean-up in Kerry with over 4,000 volunteers taking to the roads and KWD distributed no less than 12,000 distinctive red refuse sacks to volunteers which they filled for collection. "What we found out there was very encouraging in terms of litter management and it is obvious that the Re-turn scheme is working well and, in Killarney, the ban on single use coffee cups has had a hugely positive impact," said Killarney Tidy Towns volunteer Johnny McGuire. Kerry GAA legend Colm Cooper led the team in Killarney as they set out in several different directions from national Tidy Towns sponsor Daly's SuperValu car park early on Saturday morning and it was certainly a case of hat's off to a great day.

During 2024 / 2025, the brothers worked collaboratively with the National Parks and Wildlife Service to design a boat, in keeping with the traditional design, but with a capacity to cater for people with limited mobility and /

or neurodiverse quests.

An Cathal is fitted with a fixed stairway to enable people access / egress the boat with ease and has fasteners built into the floor to allow wheelchairs be securely attached.

"A key aspect of our new offering is to support neurodiverse people. To this end we have a dedicated diversity section on our website (www.rosscastleboattours.ie). In addition, we have developed a Sensory Box which will be carried in the boat. We are delighted to also confirm that all our staff have

completed 'AsIAm' Online Training and are aware of the role of Assistance Dogs, who are welcome on-board", Mike Fleming said.

"Finally, we are committed to expanding our



support services and are currently working on a Visual Guide for inclusion on our website. This will highlight what guests can expect on arrival and during a tour. We support quieter tours on request and early morning / late evening tours if required", Tony Added.

The launch of "An Cathal" will take place, tomorrow, Saturday 19th April, at 11am at Reen Pier.

has seeped down through the generations, with his sons, daughters and grandkids all actively involved.





Following a devestating fire in Killarney National Park last week, Staff of Killarney National Park - National Parks and Wildlife Service are patrolling the National Park 24/7 along with the assistance of Drone operators, Helicopter emergency surveillance. The Staff at NPWS are fully trained in fire control and along with the assistance of our Unsung Heroes in Kerry Fire Service who already are under enormous pressure to contain the fires in Kerry are on high alert for fires.

The local volunteers in Mountain Meitheal, Killarney Tidy Towns, local residents are also only too willing to help in this crusade and prevent fires taking place in our UNESCO Biosphere Reserve.

It is a very sensitive time of the year for our Flora and Fauna (especially little birds and mammals).

One of the Conservation Rangers who attended the scene said: "Unfortunately, there was another fire in Killarney National Park this week - our precious Reenadinna Woodland on the Muckross Peninsula. Kerry Fire and Rescue Service crew and NationalPark and Wildlife Service Staff attended the fire and managed to put it out quickly.



This fire was started by a disposable BBQ and it quickly set part of a cliff alight, damaging a variety of trees, bryophytes, ground flora and it was in an area where there is evidence of our native red squirrel and many bird species.

It was very close to taking over a very large area of one of the most important sites in our National Park. Reenadinna Woodland is a vew woodland and is one of the largest of its kind in Europe, this is a very rare habitat on a national and international level.

Lighting fires or BBQs is unacceptable behaviour and will not be tolerated in the National Park. The staff of Killarney National Park and the staff of Kerry Fire and Rescue Service are working tirelessly during these high risk warnings and putting themselves in danger



for situations that could be avoided. The crews had to traverse over rough ground in the dark and put out a fire that spread down a cliff face. We were very grateful to members of the public who saw the plume of smoke and notified ourselves and the emergency services immediately. Early intervention is of the utmost importance in these situations and the more eyes and ears we have out there, the faster we can respond to a fire, the less damage that is caused to the National Park."

We need your help across the Country, most especially the people of Killarney, who love their Park. If you suspect smoke or the lighting of fires PLEASE call EMERGENCY SERVICES 999 OR 112.

# Con's passing is like a bright light being quenched

John O'Mahony, Killarneytoday.com pays tribute to the late Con O'Leary.

he passing of Con O'Leary in Killarney has marked a real end of an era in the town where he was instantly recognised, hugely popular, greatly respected and much loved.

One man, in his time, plays many parts and so it was with Con who was a very forward-thinking businessman, a great family man, a proud Killarney man, a quick wit and a wonderful storyteller and when one is asked to name a character of real substance, the name Con O'Leary immediately springs to mind.

The Laurels bar and restaurant, owned and operated by the O'Leary family for three generations, has long been a landmark in the town and it has had a magnet-like lure for locals and visitors down through the years.

The secret to that success is that Con and his family always ran and still run a good house. There was never a need for a welcome mat at the door as the warm greeting that awaited inside was taken as a given.

Whether it was as a busy coffee shop back in the day, a live music venue for several years, a buzzing bar with a lively atmosphere, a place where team-mates celebrated a win together or commiserated with each other following a loss, a gourmet-style pub or just a friendly local hostelry where pals met up, everybody will have their own favourite memories of The Laurels. Socially and geographically, it has always been very much the heart of the town.



It was always refreshing to meet Con when he was behind the bar. He was interesting, he was interested and conversation always flowed freely. The topic of the day could vary from the antics of characters from yesteryear whose colourful personalities added so much to the town or the latest carry-on by the political decision makers, be it nationally along the corridors of power in Dáil Éireann or locally, as it was then, on the first floor of the town hall.

Many in Killarney will have particularly fond memories of the famous nightly music and dance sessions in the back lounge with Dick Willis, Davy Stone and the Irwin School of Irish Dance, among others, entertaining the masses.

There were the lively rugby club and basketball club get-togethers, the special atmosphere at the annual December 23rd disco, fun table quizzes and, of course, there was the popular Christmas treasure hunts with the questions set by Con as he sent half Killarney off in every direction trying to solve his cryptic riddles.

Hugely intelligent and extremely well read, Con had poetry and prose and words of wisdom on tap and he had a wonderful ability to build up a great rapport with people of any age and from any



walk of life. Con loved nothing more than a good natured wind-up and, with his roguish sense of humour, he was never short of opportunities in that regard.

His place of business has always been immaculately presented, festooned with elaborate displays of flowers, shrubs and hanging baskets, and it was little wonder that it was a serial winner in the Killarney Looking Good Competition year after year.

He must have been asked how the The Laurels got its name tens of thousands of times but he never tired of recalling the story of a great greyhound who bought fame and fortune to Con's father, Thado, when winning the high-profile Laurels race at Wimbledon in 1930.

And if any proof was needed, the portrait of the champion hound, Kilbrean Boy, has always had pride of place over the main fireplace in the bar. Many years later, when Con took over the family business after his father's death, to mark that great achievement he changed the name of the pub to The Laurels.

Thado was one of the founding fathers of Killarney Race Company and Con followed in his footsteps at the Ross Road track with Con's daughter, Kate, currently a director.

Con loved the lakes and the sea, he was a keen sailor and he had a detailed knowledge of Killarney and Kerry that was difficult to rival.

The passing of Con O'Leary is akin to a very bright light being extinguished in Killarney. Always chirpy, personable and with a very caring manner, he lived a good life, he lived a full life and, in the process, he touched the lives of many other people in a very positive manner.

Killarney will miss Con O'Leary and of that there is no doubt but he leaves a rich legacy of great memories for so many people and he certainly made his mark.

He passed away, peacefully and surrounded by

his loving family, in the early hours of Sunday morning.

The beloved husband of Anne and loving father of Kate, Niall, Tara and Lorna, he is further survived by sons-in-law Owen Daly, Ronan Quirke and Alfie Gemillan, his grandchildren Robert, Jason, Roan and AnnaKate, his sisters Carmel Slattery (Killarney) and Colette Hurley (Lahinch), brothers-in-law, many other relatives, the wonderful team at The Laurels, his carers and so many friends.

Following his Requiem Mass on Wednesday at 10.30am, cremation took place on Thursday in the Island Crematorium, Cork.

#### TRIBUTE FROM KILLARNEY CHAMBER OF TOURISM COMMERCE

Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce has led the tributes to the late Con O'Leary, an extremely popular and very successful businessman in the town, who passed away in the early hours of Sunday.

Con was a vibrant and popular personality in Killarney where he operated The Laurels on Main Street, a thriving bar and restaurant, which he inherited following the passing of his father, Thado. The business organisation said from a social perspective, The Laurels became the beating heart of the town and it was a landmark at the Market Cross in the same way as Clery's clock was in the capital city.

Chamber said Con's passing really marks the end of an era as he was one of a golden age of inspirational local business people who developed and built Killarney, through hard work, bravery and great commercial flair, and helped create the wonderful tourist attraction and holiday destination it is today.

#### CULLINAGH the Hidden Holly village

A hidden village is being uncovered on Tomies Mountain where huge machines are helping clear miles of rhododendron. Stands of holly (cuileann), along with old oat and potato drills are also being unveiled.

We celebrate Tomies now for its last stands of oak in Ireland but it is worth remembering timber from this woodland beloved of the Fianna was sold by Lord Kenmare to the British navy as recently as the 1900s.

By coincidence, I have been reading the Annie Proulx book Barkskins which I came across in the Killarney library.

She wrote the Shipping News and Brokeback Mountain and I went to see her once at the Galway Arts Festival.

Barkskins is more terrifying than a gothic novel. It is about a family's "fortunes" in the taking down of the forests of the US and Canada by the French and the English beginning in the 17th century - around the same time the Irish forests were being cut down.

The wasting of the forest and the native Indians by the Europeans is brutal.

The book ends with their descendants, botanists, hunting the old medicines hoping



the replanting of trees will replace what was destroyed. But they can't ever fully succeed because the old plants were surrounded by healthy, not young, weak and diseased trees. Pete Coghlan teacher in Cullina School in his book on Beaufort talks about the forests ancient, and not so ancient.

"First class larch" was taken out of Tomies during the 1940s and smaller Arbutus woods, Yew and Mountain Ash and "the friendly holly" were "ruthlessly torn down and in the Gap especially were wantonly burnt down", the late Pete writes.

The giant mixed woods had sheltered and nurtured the Irish just like the Indians on the other side of the Atlantic. The sadness felt by the Irish at the destruction of their woods was almost unbearable.

At times near where I live, I come across white stitchwort. It is a sign of where old oaks grew. Like Proulx says in her novel, we just don't understand the symbiotic relationship between plants and trees. Lose the trees, lose a colony. Hopefully, the recovery of "the lovely holly" on ancient Tomies may see a kind of return.

#### Technology may arrive at the courthouse

Just one courthouse in Kerry has video-link and video viewing facilities - Tralee. Since Covid video link to prisons has become a staple of



court hearings at District Court level where accused are on remand in Cork Limerick and Portlaoise.

The technology saves prisoner transfer from prisons unless books of evidence are being presented and they are being sent forward for trial.

That only Tralee District Court has video link - which means cases from the four other courts - Cahersiveen, Listowel, Kenmare and Killarney and Dingle have to be transferred to Tralee clogging court lists in Tralee.

The Wednesday District Court List in Tralee frequently numbers in excess of 330 offences for the day.

CCTV footage - a staple now for late night assault cases, burglaries etc even in lower courts - is also not available and these cases too have to be aired in Tralee which other than video links has sub standard facilities for persons in custody and all others.

Additional expense and time which could be better spent is also incurred in witnesses and gardai having to travel to Tralee.

Killarney is set to link to the "Government cloud" in the coming weeks so the technology can be installed, the courts service has told me. Tralee and Listowel are both already connected to the Government cloud "and Killarney will be connected in the coming weeks," the spokesman said.

We will keep an eye out!

#### Taking the lawn out of Green Lawn

Last October I think it was when councillors were told the best of option for a multi-storey car park for Killarney was New Street, in the lower car park off Beech and Mission Road.That was for a three-floor, 516 space multi-story with roof parking.

Now we find a proposal to go before the council in which the nearby lawn is being taken out of Green Lawn for tarmacadam. That whole western corridor as we have labelled it in a previous column is the one most clogged already.

As well as the current surface parking in lower New Street, you also have the car park on the Credit Union side of Beech/Mission Roads. Further down you have the cathedral car park which will eventually become municipal. The street itself has also lost parking spaces during Covid - which have yet to be returned.

The Green Lawn 139 space car park will see a new entrance from the Mission Road to the lower New street car park and access to the Green Lawn

In other words, the western corridor will draw even more traffic. Traffic that won't be relieved even if the N22 bypass is ever built.

Is the whole of New Street to become a car park?

I know that residents of Green and Bridewell lanes are preparing a submission and among their concerns - and let's face it it is an awful

imposition on this quiet area are: noise, late night disturbance, clogging up the Mission road even more, light and air pollution, exhaust and other fumes. I think they might also look at the runoff from polluted surface water into the lake and the Deenagh from yet more diesel and petrol spillages.

The single biggest issue in Killarney is traffic flow and parking. Killarney is surrounded with plenty of land. Could the golf course or the national park or farmers be encouraged to create green car parks to facilitate park and ride?

A niggling question remains: Is New Street being forced to make up for one third of the spaces being lost to the health centre in Aras Phádraig? People have until the afternoon of May 15tth to make observations to the town hall.

#### Why do we celebrate Holy Week?

In Holy Week we relive with Jesus his road the

Cross: the triumphant entry into Jerusalem; the institution of the Eucharist and the ministerial priesthood; his loneliness and agony in the garden as he is betrayed by the disciple Judas; his trial before the Romans and the Jews; his once and forever sacrifice upon the Cross; the emptiness of a world where Christ appears lost; and his alorious Resurrection on Easter. Christians have been observing Holy Week since the earliest days of the Church. Early Christians would travel to Jerusalem at Passover to reenact the events of the week leading up to the Resurrection. The earliest accounts of Holv Week were recorded by Egeria in the 380s A.D.

From her accounts we know that on Palm Sunday, crowds of Christians waved palm

fronds as they processed from the Mount of Olives into the City. She also details how the community gathered on Good Friday at Golgotha to honour the wood of the True Cross and to remember the

Crucifixion. Customs spread from Jerusalem to around the Christian world. And we do it this year in pray and participate in the Lord's suffering, death and resurrection.

Please note that all Holy Week Ceremonies this year are taking place ONLY in St. Mary's Cathedral so as to have a whole parish celebration.

#### Kerry-Based Leader Helps Save Irish Boxing's Olympic Future

Kerry-based Niall O'Carroll has played a leading role in protecting Ireland's Olympic boxing ambitions, guiding the Irish Athletic Boxing Association (IABA) through one of the most turbulent periods in its history.

O'Carroll, who runs his own consultancy, NiallOC.ie, stepped into the role of Chairperson of the IABA at a time when the organisation faced an existential threat. Irish boxing lost its Olympic status due to continued affiliation with the IBA, an organisation expelled by the International Olympic Committee (IOC).

At stake were Ireland's Olympic legacy and the dreams of hundreds of young boxers across the country. Over the last 15 months, O'Carroll, globally respected high-performance culture and leadership expert, led a cultural transformation across the organisation, rebuilt trust with clubs, and helped guide a difficult national conversation on aligning with World Boxing, the new IOC-recognised governing

This week, that work paid off. The future of Irish boxing as an Olympic sport was secured as the vote at the Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) was successful. This decision ensures Ireland's continued participation on the world's most prestigious sporting stage and preserves the hopes of future generations of Irish boxing

"This wasn't just about governance," said O'Carroll. "It was about identity, legacy, and the future of our young athletes. It was about trust, both rebuilding it and earning it."

Despite the complexity and scale of the challenge, his work was entirely voluntary. At the same time, he continued to lead his consultancy, working with leaders, organisations, and elite teams to create highperformance cultures and drive lasting change.



O'Carroll's story is one of local roots and global leadership. His experience managing crisis, building alignment, and facilitating strategic conversion now supports organisations right across Ireland, from his base in Kerry.

With the 2028 Olympics back on the horizon for Irish boxing, O'Carroll's leadership proves that the same skills that build champions in the ring can transform organisations and cultures in every sector.







#### FROM UPGRADED DISCOVERY POINT

Contruction has begun at Bray Head, Valentia Island, on the upgraded Wild Atlantic Way Discovery Point. The new project received an investment of €2.13 million from Fáilte Ireland and will be delivered in partnership with Kerry County Council. It aims to enhance the existing Wild Atlantic Way Discovery Point at Bray Head by restoring and conserving the historic Bray Head Signal Tower building, installing a new concrete spiral staircase and viewing platform offering visitors spectacular views of the Skellig Islands and South West coast. It will also include upgrades to the access road and car park to improve accessibility. The Wild Atlantic Way Discovery Points, first developed in 2014, showcase areas with spectacular views and unique historical sites along Ireland's west coast. Bray Head is one of 187 points along the 2,500km route, each marked with a distinctive Wild Atlantic Way signpost. Located at the most westerly point of Valentia Island, Bray Head offers breathtaking views of the Skellig Islands, the South West coast, including the Blasket Islands, Puffin Island, and Portmagee Channel. Once complete, the Discovery Point at Bray Head will complement the nearby Discovery Points at Kerry Cliffs and Fogher Cliffs on Geokaun Mountain.

In 1990 Dermot got the call to join Radio Kerry as a country music presenter. At that time he did four country music evening programmes and also Sunday mornings. It is estimated that over the 35 year period he would haveplayed in excess of 145,000 songs.

n Monday 14th April 2025, Minister : for Justice, Jim O'Callaghan, visited Kerry Community Youth Service (KCYS) in Killarney for a tour of this state of the art youth centre, get a flavour of the organisation's integrated youth work model and to hear more about the crucial role its range of services, including a County-wide Youth Diversion Project (YDP), plays in preventing youth crime and supporting young people who have engaged in criminal activity in the region.

KCYS, a cornerstone of community youth services in Kerry, has been running its Youth Diversion Programme with great success for many years, offering young people aged 12 to 18 years old, alternatives to involvement in criminal activity. The programme, which is funded by the Department of Justice, provides Early Intervention, Youth Work, Family Support, mentorship, skills development, and structured activities that help young people to engage in positive activities within their communities. Most recently, KCYS Youth Diversion Project was one of three YDP's selected to pilot a national Court Accompaniment service.

During the visit, Minister O'Callaghan met with staff and youth participants to gain a deeper understanding of the impact of the Youth Diversion Project, how the KCYS integrated youth work model works, as well as discussing

potential for expansion and further support in Kerry to meet the needs of young people and families in the area. Minister O'Callaghan's visit to KCYS underscores the Government's commitment to enhancing youth support services and addressing the underlying causes of youth crime across Ireland. It is expected that the Minister will advocate for additional resources to further strengthen such initiatives nationwide.

### **HEALTH CAPITAL FUNDING**

Health Capital Funding has been announced with €8.61m allocated to Kerry. Much of the Kerry allocation is going to University Hospital Kerry (UHK) with €350,000 towards the consideration of a new Ambulance Station for Cahersiveen Community Hospital.

The announcement has been welcomed by Fianna Fáil's Deputy Michael and Councillor Tommy Cahill.

"There are a number of proposed projects being funded at UHK, significantly the Acute Inpatient Bed Capacity Expansion Plan 2024/2031, the provision of an additional Theatre (Obstetrics) plus upgrade of existing theatres and plant and the purchase and fit out of a building at John Joe Sheehy Road, Tralee to rehouse the Women's Health Team. These are all projects that are urgently required to support the provision of safe, modern Health Service" stated Deputy Cahill.

"The Ambulance Station initiative at Cahersiveen Community Hospital is vital also in the interests of safety and speedy transfer of patients" added Michael Cahill TD.



# Minister Foley welcomes the expansion of the Hot School Meals programme to a further 33 Kerry schools

Minister for Children, Disability, Equality and Kerry T.D Norma Foley has welcomed the expansion of the Hot School Meals programme to a further 33 Kerry schools.

The scheme was first set up in 2019 with a pilot of 30 schools but has now expanded to almost 2,850 primary schools.

Around 81 primary schools in Kerry are currently operating the Hot School Meals programme and this is now being extended to a further 33 primary schools in the county.

Minister Foley said:

"I'm really pleased to confirm that 33 additional schools are now joining the hot school meals program in Kerry. As a former teacher and indeed Minister for Education, I know the value of young people having the opportunity to receive food in schools. It improves their learning, improves their activity levels in school as well and indeed throughout the day.

I'm particularly pleased as well to acknowledge that there will be a review around the nutritional elements of foods that are available in school too. So huge thanks to my colleague, Minister for Social Protection Dara Calleary and indeed to the schools who operate and make this work every single day throughout the country.

There will be a review of the nutritional standards in the Hot School Meals scheme and the removal of the optional food that is high in saturated fat, sugar, and salt from the school meal menus.

### SHORT TERM LETS

Kerry Fianna Fáil TD, Michael Cahill has weighed in strongly on the political row about short-term lets in the county.

Deputy Cahill has contacted the Taoíseach, the Tanaiste, the Minister for Tourism, Peter Burke and Minister Patrick O'Donovan requesting that they take into consideration the serious implications for the Tourism Industry in Kerry that a short-term let register will have on established short-term let accommodation providers in the county and the perception which will be viewed as a new ban on short-term lets, in Tourist towns such as Killarney and Tralee.

"I have recently raised this important matter as a new TD and previously on a number of occasions as a County Councillor in Kerry.

I believe the Government should give favourable consideration to introducing a planning exemption for those involved in short-term lets in Killarney and Tralee for the past 3 years and longer" stated the Rossbeigh man.

"Accommodation providers, in short-term letting in Killarney and Tralee now feel that they are being partially blamed for the Housing crisis and that they are being forced into long-term letting. Surely when private individuals make investments, they should control their own destiny and should not be dictated to and should be allowed to freely invest in whatever they wish, with their own money" said Deputy Cahill.

"Is it accepted that Tourist accommodation in Ireland is made up of a mixture of types, that suit different categories of visitors to the different areas of the country. There are Hotels, Guesthouses, Bed & Breakfasts, Houses, Apartments, Hostels, etc, and more recently, Airbnbs. All of these accommodation options are essential to the success of our Tourism Industry in Killarney and Tralee. These are all legitimate business operations, adding value to our tourism product,

different potential customers preferring a particular option for themselves, depending on their circumstances. Some may wish to avail of the many additional facilities of a hotel, some less so, without pools, bars, prepared meals etc. I don't agree that different regulations should apply to any option being made available to our visitors, as long as everybody is on the same hymn sheet, providing safe, comfortable accommodation and are complying with the present laws" stated the Kerry TD.

"Tourism provides employment and income for our people and tax returns to the Exchequer. In Kerry, it is more visitor accommodation that is required, not less and we should welcome new entrants to a market which I see growing enormously with the opening of facilities, such as the South Kerry Greenway and indeed the North Kerry Greenways" said Deputy Cahill.

"In the case of the South Kerry Greenway, it is a widely known fact that a substantial increase in accommodation will be required to service the anticipated hundreds of thousands of additional visitors to the region on an annual basis and the same will applyvto the Tralee to Listowel Greenway when developed" stated Kerry's newest member of Dáil Eireann. "Not everyone can afford to get involved in Tourist Accommodation with the traditional forms of Hotel or B&B for example, but the Airbnb model does offer an opening to people to rent one or two rooms or a renovated cottage, etc,. Airbnb for most people is just a small additional income of €5,500 to €6,000 per annum, offering flexibility to hosts and visitors. The more varied offerings and options we here in Kerry have for our potential visitors, with different levels of holiday budgets, the more people will visit here to sample the delights of our county" added Michael Cahill TD.

I will continue my representations to ensure HIQA do not delay the registration process like it has done so in the past.




### **FOSSA ROADWORKS**





Following the success of the 2024 edition, the Dornan Rás Mumhan returns with the Team Time Trial once again opening the race. The committee's commitment to introducing new challenges each year is evident with the reintroduction of the iconic climb in South Kerry, Cuam an Aispig, and a new stage finish in the village of Portmagee. The route from Killarney via Beallach Oisin will be crucial for team managers, as the prevailing southerly winds and open coastal exposure could disrupt even the best-laid plans the panorama of the region will be of little interest to the riders, but it will certainly provide a backdrop that is rarely experienced.

The opening Team Time Trial will be a strategic game of poker, with squads possibly hesitant to reveal their strengths too early, given the four demanding stages that follow. The coveted yellow jersey, while prestigious, can attract unwanted attention and may deter favourites from taking it on too soon. The first road race stage to Knocknagoshel, where last year's winner George Kimber of Spirit Race made his mark, promises to be a tough, lumpy challenge. Stage 3 to the Kerryman's Table above Millstreet in North Cork will test those who haven't fully recovered from the previous day's efforts in Portmagee. The fast and challenging start will highlight the strength and depth of the teams supporting their General Classification (GC) contenders.

Last year's runner-up, Dom Jackson of Foran CT, who went on to win the 2024 Rás Tailteann, is determined to add Rás Mumhan to his palmarès. The ever-present Daire Feeley, winner of the 2022 Rás Tailteann, will undoubtedly have his own plans for the race. Domestically, riders like Con Scully of Team Dan Morrissey Pissei, recent winner of the Bobby Power Classic, and Ruairi Byrne of UCD, winner of the Des Hanlon, are expected to bring the necessary firepower.

The return of the West Frisia team from the Netherlands, along with a Lithuanian squad



and several British teams, adds an international flair to the competition. Liam Crowley, showing good form with Austrian Team Vorarlberg, aims to improve on his top ten finish in the 2024 edition. The presence of junior provincial squads, with stages averaging 120km, will showcase emerging talent and could reveal the next generation of riders.

The final stage in the theatre that is Killorglin, the traditional finish for this annual race, will likely determine the general classification. As we anticipate the spectacle that is Dornan Rás Mumhan 2025, we can only imagine the thrilling battles and emerging stars that will define this year's race.

The Headline sponsor Dornan have made the impossible, very possible, and the Committee is well aware of this fact. Entrusting their brand with Ras Mumhan endorses the race as one of the premier events on the calendar of sporting events in Ireland. For this we are very thankful as well as the riders, support crews and the



general public.

With a roster of international teams, the plentiful ingredients needed to create the fireworks on the roads is nearly complete. The committee is very much looking forward to seeing the annual crowds lining the roads in supporting our athletes. Roll on Dornan Ras Mumhan it can't come quick enough.

Shane Daly had interchanged with Oisin Spring to great effect in the opening period but he was now about to take centre stage. He hit a swift basket on the break and then nailed a huge three. Tyrone Gonga and Fazande were trying hard to keep pace but Sheehan and Daly were now rampant, combining for eleven points, to open up a 34-22 lead. Cian Forde was now adding his intensity to the effort and Carroll was stamping his authority inside, all those factors helping to maintain a ten point advantage, 38-28. Templeogue may have felt the game was in hand at this stage but a superb three from Sheehan put the kibosh on that notion.

# LADIES DIVISION ONE FINAL

#### Kerry 4-14 Armagh 0-11

Kerry and Armagh have an interesting recent history in the National League - they have had our number more often than not in recent meetings. Not this time - most emphatically not. It wasn't even close. Declan Quill and Darragh Long set a very high benchmark, but Mark Bourke has put his own stamp on this team and they are starting to look really good. I know, I know, it's early days and Brendan Martin isn't on the table just yet. But silverware is silverware and the way that Kerry won it was even more impressive than the fact of it happening. Kerry looked good here. Really fast, really strong, and very direct. Armagh are a really good team at directing the traffic and leading opposition players i possession down blind channels. Here they never got a chance because Kerry simply ran past all the roadblocks. Armagh were reduced to picking off what points they could; Kerry were hunting goals. For that matter, we could have added at least three more if they needed them.

Armagh had early chances but couldn't raise a flag. Kerry were only starting to settle themselves. Then a loose kick-out was directed towards Siofra O'Shea – the one player Armagh didn't want to give the ball to – and she promptly fed Niamh Carmody, who dropped a beautiful lob over the head of the backpedalling goalkeeper. A small enough mistake by Armagh, but Kerry extracted the maximum penalty. Danielle O'Leary was almost in for another one, but Louise Kenny denied her with a brilliant piece of defending. Siofra

Aoife McCoy cut in along the endline but her pass across to Niamh Reel was a tad overcooked and Kerry got away with it. Fine margins....

Armagh were pushing forward a bit and leaving a lot of defenders one on one – against this Kerry forward line? I admire a positive approach, but it's not that fine a line. Sure enough, Danielle O'Leary skins her marker. Her first effort comes back off the post but the rebound falls kindly to her and if you give a player like Danielle a second chance, you know as well as me what the result is going to be. 2-1 to 0-0.

Nice movement by Kerry to find Niamh Carmody in space and she coolly splits the posts. 17 minutes gone and Lauren McConville finally gets Armagh on the scoreboard. Eve Lavery adds another and then points again. Are Armagh staging a mini-revival?

Danielle O'Leary has other ideas, surging through and laying off to Jadyn Lucey for a score. Once Danielle gets her hands on the ball, Armagh just can't dispossess her. I considered Jadyn a 'possible' rather than a 'probable' as a championship starter; she is changing my mind here.

Armagh are still pushing up the field. It could very well throw a young team off their game. But an experienced side like Kerry? The likes of Aishling O'Connell, Kayleigh Cronin, and a very impressive Deirdre Kearney are breaking the line easily and passing through the gaps, and once Kerry get the ball into open space.... maybe there is an undercurrent that I'm not understanding, but it feels to me like Armagh are being naive. Their Plan A is meat and drink to Kerry. Danielle O'Leary, definitely the bean laoch so far, makes it 2-4 to 0-4.

Lauren McConville wins a free. Very tricky kick, but Niamh Reel judges it to perfection. Great score, but Kerry's response is dynamite. Siofra O'Shea emerges to gather a good ball in and flick it across to Jadyn Lucey. Kerry are so good at timing those support runs, and Anna Carr ends up picking the ball out of her net for a third time. Kerry ahead by 3-4 to 0-5 at the break. I can't really see Armagh turning this around, but you never know....

Danielle opens the second half scoring to put Kerry nine clear. It wasn't far away from being a goal. Armagh, with a more traditional format, are looking much livelier though. Aoife McCoy brilliantly slices through a defensive gap and it took a moment of real brilliance by Kayleigh Cronin to clear off the line. Just two minutes

later Niamh Henderson's thunderbolt cracks off the post and goes wide. A goal from either of those chances would have changed the narrative completely. Would Aimee Mackin have made a difference? Be fair about it, of course she would. A player like Aimee Mackin will make a difference in any game; this is one of the all-time greats. But enough of a difference? I can't see it, not here. Kerry are simply too strong, too fast, too dominant in almost every sector.

Kayleigh Cronin isn't exactly known as a scorer, but it turns out she has that in her toolbelt as well as she puts Kerry ahead by 3-6 to 0-5. This is Kayleigh's last game before heading to Australia on a professional contract; what a way to bow out. Armagh are fading now, simply losing too many individual duels at either end. Kerry's movement is excellent. There is a touch of luck about their fourth goal, though. Jadyn Lucey was going for a point when her shot drops short but is misjudged by the unfortunate Carr, who gets a hand to it but only enough to steer it into her own net. It happens in both ladies' football and camogie more often than you might think.

Niamh Carmody forced a great save out of Anna Carr before pointing the rebound. Again, that could as easily have gone under as over the crossbar.

To be honest, this is effectively over. Kerry have another gear in them if they need it, but they don't look like needing it.

Long road ahead, and plenty of it uphill. But – and I know that this kind of fitness is hard to sustain in the long term – I can't see too many living with this Kerry team when the air gets thinner. Mind you, we all spent three decades saying that; let's stay quiet for a while yet.

Aberg is beginning to put pressure on Rose. Aberg? Look, if you told me beforehand that it was the name of a pokemon card, I wouldn't have argued.... DeChambeau reels in another shot as well. In fairness to Rose, he birdies the fifth. Anyone catching him is going to have to accelerate. Fair enough, that's how it should be. DeChambeau is doing exactly that, but another good birdie for Rose on the 12th gives him daylight. Rory is making solid pars. Good golf – actually, almost incredible golf, I think we all forget exactly how hard this is and how good these players are – but he isn't really making up any ground.


Matt McCarty is burning up the course. Who is Matt McCarty? And why does he spell it without the 'h'? Well, he's the clubhouse leader (-5); he can do what he wants. Including possibly imposing tariffs; the criteria seem a little mixed on that.

Rose with a bogey. The sharks aren't moving in close just yet, but they are definitely starting to circle...

Rory on the 13th. I was actually out at the time and not following it, but suddenly I could hear whatsapp message humming into the phone. What, eagle? Okay, it's the US Masters. Did Rory shoot two under par, or has Rory actually eaten an American Eagle? One is slightly more likely (there's almost no meat on bald eagles) and yes, suddenly Rory is five under and just three shots off Rose.

Blast it. You know what's going to happen. Rory is going to go on a run, get into contention.... and end up dropping late shots to finish just inside the top ten.

Except....Rory was ambitious on the 15th yesterday and it cost him a double bogey. Today he deliberately goes for the two putt. I like it. Sure, he's left a potential eagle behind. But I'm pretty sure that what he actually left behind is a bogey, and instead he picks up a shot. In a weird way, that was his least spectacular golf and simultaneously his best. Hours of consistency will beat moments of spectacular brilliance. Par on the 17th. Same on the 18th. 66 for Rory, 68 for Shane. Rose at eight under, DeChambeau on seven under, Rory and Connors one behind. DeChambeau and Scheffler dropped late shots. Bernhard Langer with his last ever hole at the



Masters. I like Langer, always did. Jaysus, we used to make jokes about his surname back in the early days of secondary school (Cork idiom more than Kerry). I feel old.

#### **Day Three**

Yep, Rory goes for the long drive over the bunker on the first. He makes it, but I'm convinced that he'll go for those all day now.... and drop the occasional shot as a result. He birdies it, fantastic birdie. Back within one shot of the leader now. A few friends are getting excited on the whatsapp. Calm down, children. I'm not just a glass-half-empty pessimist. I'm a 'that glass is going to explode in this heat' kind of pessimist.

DeChambeau with a birdie. Joint leader now. I can't see Rose staying with him to the tournament finish. Scottie is playing some absolutely brilliant golf, but mostly to save pars. Rory....certainly not impossible, but like I said, he is carrying a big monkey on his back.

Eagle. And Rory, completely unfettered by that weight, almost nonchalantly slots his

second eagle of the Masters. He leapfrogs both DeChambeau and Rose. Shane Lowry with a birdie as well. He is within two shots. Drops one pretty fast, though.

Another birdie for Rory! He dropped for shots in three holes in his opening round. He has just picked up four shots now in three holes.

A very solid par for Rory. DeChambeau drops a shot. You are getting to the business end now, no player can really afford those.

Par on the fourth for Rory, and then a long putt for birdie on the fifth. Of course, he makes it. He obviously heard me earlier on; he's just mocking me now. I can't say that I blame him. Justin Rose drops a shot, Shane Lowry gains one. Back into joint third. Rory is in trouble on the sixth.....great save. Makes par. I actually have a bit of a long drive home at the moment; for once, that suits me fine.

DeChambeau, Rose, and Rory all drop shots. Rory will be disappointed; the top players almost expect to pick up shots on the par fives. Birdie chance on the nine. Doesn't get it, but he is halfway round in 32.

#### ALL THINGS **SPORT**

DeChambeau picks up a shot and it's twice as valuable when Rory drops one. Conners picks up a third birdie in a row. Moving Day...it feels like tectonic plates are starting to shift.

A good par for Rory on the 11th. They are all playing solid. DeChambeau drops a shot. There's a definite leading pack at the moment. Overall, I still fancy DeChambeau. But then he drops another shot. I don't have a leaderboard in front of me (obviously) and I'm struggling to remember the order of contenders. That's okay; confusion is kind of my default setting anyway. Birdies for both Rory and Conners. Rory is 10 under, Conners is -8.

A good par on the 14th for Rory, Conners is unlucky not to pick up a birdie. Too bad about him. Spell your surname correctly and you'd have made it.

15th. Disastrous for Rory on his first round, brilliant in his second. I'm not superstitious, but Augusta can be capricious enough. So can Rory, and oday Augusta's 15th does what it's told. Another eagle, and suddenly there is serious daylight between Rory and the chasing pack. Birdie chance on the 16th, but Rory will be happy out with par. Right now, it's about not dropping shots more so than picking up shots. Same story with the 17th, could have been a birdie, but par is grand. Great approach on the 18th, an even better birdie chance. DeChambeau is making a bit of a charge. Two late bogeys for Shane Lowry, that's tough. Played some great golf, but just couldn't nail those chances.

A second 66 at the Masters for Rory. Another good day. DeChambeau hot on his heels. Can Rory lose it from here? Umm, yes. He really, really can. Say nothing yet.

Shane Lowry certainly isn't saying too much. It's no secret that he and Rory are great friends but asking the Offaly native about Rory's chances after he has just bogeyed two of the last three holes himself? Shane is curt enough about it, and he is absolutely right.

#### **Day Four**

I like RTE for the most part, but what was the point in going to Rory's home town and asking his Holywood neighbours if they are rooting or him? What exactly were ye expecting? What would make this truly great is for some-one to say "Not at all, I've hated the McIlroys for years". Otherwise it's a bit pointless.

Opening birdie for Rose. Morikawa is quietly creeping up on the leaders. Zach Johnson with an eagle. Five under, not out of it at all.

Bunker on the first for Rory. Putt for par, but he puts a lot too much on it and has to settle for double bogey. Justin Rose picks up another shot. Just like that, Rory has no room for error. DeChambeau makes par and is level.

Rose drops one on the fourth, but Rory is straight into sand. Does well to save par, while DeChambeau was too timid with the eagle effort and does well to make birdie. He's on his own at the top of the leaderboard.

Third green. Both have birdie putts. Rory makes his, DeChambeau doesn't. And then Bryson misses again. Rory back in front.

Fourth. Great approach shot by Rory. DeChambeau has another bogey. Rry has

another birdie putt.....and makes it. That feels to me like a big, big moment.

Rory hits the trees on the fifth. Good recovery shot, but DeChambeau has a birdie chance. Ludvig Aberg moves to 8 under. DeChambeau misses, a let-off. Rory makes par. That was a real chance for DeChambeau to close the gap. Shane Lowry has dropped another shot, though. He's out of contention.

Rory and Bryson both save par on the seventh. Rory's drive goes left on the seventh, but he hits a brilliant recovery shot. Birdie chance; he ends up with a good par. DeChambeau finds sand, but again it's a great recovery.

8th hole. Par five. But they both find sand and both have to lay up. Nice wedge by Rory to give himself a birdie chance. DeChambeau overcooks his just a tiny fraction – jaysus, but Augusta is unforgiving. Has to be, I suppose. Shane Lowry has dropped another shot. Sadly, he's in freefall right now. Justin Rose is quietly and carefully creeping up with birdies.

Two putt by Rory and a safe par. For a lot of his career, he'd have staked everything on the birdie putt. Playing it safe is the right move. This is business, Rory, not entertainment (it's colossal entertainment for everybody else, of course). They all have to chase you, not the other way around. DeChambeau does the same thing and secures his par.

Eagle by Sung-Jae Im. He's seven under now and in the hunt. Justin Rose makes another birdie. Patrick Reed has four birdies in a row as well.

Great approach shot by Rory on the nine. His tee shots have been shaky enough today but that was good. Real chance for a birdie and he could do with it. Rose, Aberg, DeChambeau are all on nine under and no way will all three be dropping shots.

Birdie for Rory. It can all fall apart yet, but even a sceptic like myself is starting to believe that he can pull this off. No, stop it, we have been here before.

Great approach on the tenth by Rory. DeChambeau is on the green as well but it's a harder putt. Rory slots his birdie, DeChambeau makes par. Another chink of daylight. Another birdie for Justin Rose.

Poor tee shot by Rory. Gets lucky with his second, on the edge of the water. DeChambeau does hit water and ends up with a double bogey. It's that fast and that cruel. Golf is absolutely merciless, just one mistake and you can be gone. Rose has dropped a shot as well. Five clear. Jaysus, Rory, I'd bring it home from this position (the arrogance of self-delusion, Stevie Wonder would destroy yours truly at golf). Rory isn't five clear for long though, he takes a bogey himself.

He navigates the 12th well and comes out with another par. DeChambeau drops another shot, but Justin Rose picks up another one (almost an eagle). Patrick Reed and Scottie Scheffler are pushing to the front of the chasing pack.

Justin Rose with another birdie. In fairness, he is eating up this course today. Patrick Reed has three-putted, though.

Boom. Rory in the water. That sense of foreboding was right all along. Double bogey. Justin Rose with a birdie. It felt inevitable. They

are tied for the lead on 11 under and the smart money must be on Justin Rose now. He has definitely been the most consistently excellent player today.

Rory with yet another poor tee shot on the 14th. It'll be difficult to rescue par here – it basically hangs over the hole but doesn't drop. Justin Rose is a shot clear. What's more, another birdie for Ludvig Aberg sees him right on their heels. The only good thing is that they will be finishing ahead of Rory; he'll know what he will need to do. I'd suggest a drop of holy water but in this instance I want Rory staying far away from any kind of water.

Bogey for Rose on the 17th. Three way tie now on ten under.

Rory on the 15th. Par five, and he has to go for it. This is a huge test of his mentality. Decent tee shot and an incredible second. That's just magic. It's an eagle chance. Doesn't go, but takes his birdie quite comfortably. He's back in front on the leaderboard.....Justin Rose takes his last shot of the 2025 Masters.....and birdies the 18th. It mightn't have been his last shot after all, this could well end in a play-off. You couldn't script this. This isn't any Hitchcock movie, this is all Tarantino.

Birdie chance for Rory on the 16th but it rolls past. Just millimetres away, but he makes par safely.

Two tough par fours ahead of him. Has to par to force a play-off, a birdie to win.

Once again it's not a great opening drive on the 17th. But, not for the first time today, his approach shot is sheer brilliance. Three feet from the pin, and he slots it as though it was just a practise round. Rory McIlroy is just one hole away from a career Slam. I can't ignore it; I'm just hoping that he can.

18th.Great tee shot. That was the big hurdle as far as I am concerned. Three shots to hole it from here? Rory McIlroy? Superstition be damned, he's got this.

Except that he doesn't. Straight into the bunker. Big ask now. Decent recovery, but that's not an easy par. And it doesn't drop. Play-off.

Rory and Rose tee off at the 18th. Sudden death. Good drive by Justin Rose. Rory matches it. Great second shot by Rose. Even better by Rory. He should birdie this.

Justin Rose has to go for it...close, but no cigar. Rory has a bread and butter putt to birdie and win. Put it in, Rory, for my sake if not your own. I want to go to bed; I'm up early in the morning. And there it is. Green jacket, money...blah, blah, Blah. Rory McIlroy becomes just the sixth player in history to have won the Big Four (I presume Donald Trump claims to have done it, but I also presume that he is lying). Gene Sarazen, Ben Hogan, Gary Player, Jack Nicklaus, Tiger Woods (the only man to hold all four titles simultaneously, though it was over two years, not one) and now, Rory McIlroy.

Apparently there are people who play this game to relax. What do they do for excitement? Juggle chainsaws?

# O'LEARY INSPIRES KERRY TO 13TH LIDL NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE CROWN

#### LIDL NATIONAL **FOOTBALL LEAGUE DIVISION 1 FINAL** Kerry 4-14 Armagh 0-11

Danielle O'Leary struck a magnificent haul of 1-5 at Croke Park on Saturday evening as a goal-hungry Kerry secured a record 13th Lidl National Football League Division 1 crown with a comprehensive victory over Armagh at Croke Park on Saturday evening.

Having lost out to Armagh in last year's NFL top-tier decider at the same venue - a few short months before triumphing in the TG4 All-Ireland senior football championship - the Kingdom emphatically reclaimed a trophy they had most recently won back in 2023.

Picked out by Siofra O'Shea after she gathered an Armagh kick-out, last year's All-Ireland winning skipper Niamh Carmody floated a looping effort over the head of Armagh netminder Anna Carr for a deadlock-breaking goal on seven minutes.

This major was complimented by a pointed free from O'Shea and after her initial strike on goal had rebounded off the post, livewire cornerforward O'Leary fired home a second Kerry goal in the 13th minute.

The impressive Carmody proceeded to split the uprights for a rampant Kingdom, before Armagh finally got up and running with three unanswered points from Lauren McConville and Eve Lavery (two).

Inside forwards Niamh Henderson and Niamh Reel (free) were also on hand to raise white flags in response to Jadyn Lucey and O'Leary at the opposite end, before a third goal courtesy of Lucey on 28 minutes propelled Kerry towards a 3-4 to 0-5 interval buffer.

O'Leary added to her tally on the resumption with another fine point, but the Kingdom faithful breathed a sigh of relief when Aoife McCoy and Niamh Henderson both went close to shaking the opposition net.

Yet Kerry continued to possess a potent attacking threat and after centre half-back Kayleigh Cronin broke free for an excellent point, a speculative strike from distance by Lucey dropped into the net for her second goal (and Kerry's fourth) on 37 minutes.

This effectively eliminated any prospect of a dramatic fightback from Armagh, but Kerry still kept the scoreboard ticking over with four points without reply courtesy of Carmody, O'Shea, Niamh Ní Chonchúir and O'Leary.

Yet with O'Leary (two), O'Shea and Rachel Dwyer all firing over scores of their own, Kerry eased towards a deserved victory.



# KERRY COUNTY COUNCIL STOPPING HOUSE BUILDING IN KERRY

With the country in the midst of a unprecedented housing crisis and builders are putting the blame for this squarely on the shoulders of senior management staff of Kerry County Council, accusing them of making the problem worse.

# ERRATIC PLANNING DECISIONS WITHOUT CONSEQUENCES FOR KERRY COUNTY COUNCIL

Builders have expressed the view that it is easier to build houses in Cork than it is in Kerry. In Cork, for example, builders carry out the work, a snag list of any outstanding issues is created, the builders rectify those issues and any bond funds are promptly returned to the builder. Bond funds are amounts of money held back from the builder by the bank until all work has been completed. If the council delays signing off on the completion of the snag list, the bond funds are not released back to builder and they are left out of pocket. In Cork, once the snag list has been signed off, the maintenance of any new housing development is promptly taken over by Cork County Council. Builders claim that it is much more problematic dealing with Kerry County Council. It can take years for an official snag list to be created. The saga does not end here. When that list is finally completed, more maintenance issues are added. Builders have claimed that this final stage can take years and can add unnecessary financial stress. In effect, builders are being used to maintain an estate, post-build. In many cases, the builder ends up just forfeiting the bond, as it becomes too costly to continue completing the constant snag lists generated by Kerry County Council. Works are rarely carried out with these bond funds and ultimately the money ends up in the road maintenance programme for the whole county.

While waiting for Kerry County Council to take over the maintenance of their estate, the residents are obliged to pay for that maintenance themselves, and all the while, Kerry County Council continue their delaying tactics. These residents already pay road tax which goes towards road maintenance. And they are also paying local property tax. Why are the most pressured group in society being treated so badly? Typically these are young people with young families struggling to pay bills and Kerry County Council has the power to make their lives a little bit easier but unfortunately, the opposite is the case.

A number of County Councillors have said that they do not have the power to change things. They were critical of council management who have just brushed their concerns aside.



A builder built an extra thirteen houses in an existing housing estate. The builder rerouted heavy traffic away from the estate and used an existing farm road at the rear of the site to access the building site. The photo shows the relief road and this road was in existence long before his company built these houses. After the houses were built the Council instructed the builder to go onto private property and dig up the relief road and turn the area into a green field otherwise Kerry County Council will take €20,000 via a bond from the builder. Kerry County Council contacted this publication stating that the heading of this article is "grossly misleading and incorrect". Nobody wants badly built estates but this example does not entice builders to build houses.



This is a photo of a manhole that was built in 2008.

This manhole is in perfect condition after sixteen years.

The specifications on building a manhole has changed recently and Kerry County Council wants all the manholes in the estate dug up and rebuild under the updated specifications and this work will cost the builder £45,000.

Kerry County Council does not accept that this decision is a gross abuse of power. There is no appeal system and no consequence for the decision makers.



This is a photo of an item on a snag list from a builder. Kerry County Council wants the builder to remove the fence and replace it with a fence that's a few inches taller. Because there is a slope in the green area the fence measures 2 mtrs when measured from the back and 1.85mtrs when measured from the front because of the slope in the green area. Does it really matter if this fence is a few inches shorter. This is an example of the nonsense that builders have to put up with from Kerry County Council.



## PLANTING A COLOURFUL FLOWER BOWL

When planting a colourful flower bowl, choose your bowl from either terracotta or plastic but make sure to get a saucer underneath when purchasing. Then put some gravel around the base surrounding the hole and add compost mixed with slow release



Fill your bowl to about one inch from the top as this will make it easier when watering afterwards. When choosing the plants start with the centre piece. An ideal plant for this would be an evergreen grass. This is an ideal plant as when you are finished with the bowl, the evergreen grass can be planted outdoors.

There are a huge range of plants with colour to fill around the centre piece. Some of the most popular to choose from are trailing variegated ivys, heathers in flower, primroses, polyanthus, forget-me-nots and you will also still be able to get some potted daffodils

When finished planting, make sure to water the plants well, and if you decide to keep the flower bowl indoors make sure that the saucer is underneath. Keep the finished bowl in as much light as possible and this will flower well into the time for Summer bedding. As certain flowers go off before others, dont be afraid to remove them as this will keep your bowl looking good for longer.

Welcome back dear student, as we celebrate Resurrection Sunday this weekend I pray you enjoy a joyous time of fellowship with your Saviour! God gave us His best gift ever Jesus, His Son. The Lord tells us not to be stressing about life, because God already knows all our needs, and He wants to look after us completely (Matthew 6:25-33). We all have needs and they differ from one person to another; for example, one may be in poverty or drowning in debt, while another has plenty of money, but is lacking good health, while yet another may be fearful, isolated and lonely. Needs vary, even from season to season; but one need we all have whether rich or poor, young or old is - we need a Saviour!

No one is good enough to approach the Righteous God. He is Holy, and our sins cannot enter His Presence. Whether those sins are murder, theft, unforgiveness, or gossip — all sin is equal in God's view, and must be repented of, and that lifestyle turned from to receive Salvation. This can be hard to swallow, as the world ranks sin from 'bad sins' that some call mortal, right down to perceived 'little' sins - referred to as white lies. No dear friend, in God's sight they are all the same. He wouldn't be the God of Justice if He graded sin - that is man's theology. Jesus resisted Satan and his relentless afflictions, but make no mistake, the battle was unimaginable!
