

# Go ahead for Macroom **By-Pass**

Approval to award a construction contract for the N22 Baile Bhuirne to Macroom Road Project was announced yesterday, Thursday. The significant investment of €280 million is the largest Government investment in the region

This project will deliver many benefits for the southwest region and the proposed new road development will commence to the west of Baile Bhuirne, tying into the existing N22 on the main Cork/Killarney/Tralee route. The route then bypasses the town of Macroom before crossing the River Laney and River Sullane and re-joins the existing N22 at Coolcour. The road development comprises:- Approximately 22km of Type-2 Dual carriageway, Three compact grade separated junctions, Six Roundabouts (Five off-line), Four river bridges and Seventeen road bridges.



### WHEN CAN YOU ACCESS YOUR PENSION & WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS WHEN YOU WANT TO RETIRE?

Many pensions can be accessed from age 60, a lot of the rules depend on whether you are an employee or self employed. Tax Free Cash: Most people will be entitled to a tax free lump sum, the amount varies however generally you will get at least 25% of the value of your pension in a tax free cash lump sum.

Taxable Cash: You may be able to take sum of your pension in taxable cash. Annual Pension: This is a guaranteed income for the rest of your life that is purchased with the money left after your tax free lump sum.

Approved Retirement Funds: You may be entitled to keep some of your money in an approved retirement fund, money can be taken from the fund to give you a regular income.



### YOUTH EMPLOYABILITY INITIATIVE LAUNCHED



initiative new targetting 16 18 year olds, not employment, education or training, was launched in Kerry this week.

The Youth Employability Initiative (YEI) was established in

to "improve the employability skills of young people who are at risk of being furthest from the labour market". Within the KDYS, this initiative has been split into three projects, which are located in Tralee, Killarney and Listowel. This project is funded by the Department of Children and Youth Affairs (DCYA) and is administered through Kerry ETB.

The purpose of this programme is to work with young people, in order to assist them in ascertaining and developing an array of skills which will both increase and improve their level of opportunity for future employment. This piece of work will be carried out on both a one-one basis with the young person and also in a group setting (where appropriate) and will be tailored to the needs of each individual participant.

The criteria for this programme are as follows: the young person must be between the ages of sixteen and eighteen years old, live within the relevant catchment area (i.e. Tralee, Killarney or Listowel) and must not currently be in education, training or employment. Our

purpose is to 'engage the disconnected'.







#### WHAT IS BLEPHARITIS?

Blepharitis causes eyelids to become red, swollen and inflamed. It doesn't normally cause serious damage to the eyes, but it can be very uncomfortable. It tends to be a long-term condition, which means you're likely to need ongoing treatment. Severe cases do have a risk of causing long-term damage, but fortunately these are quite rare.

#### TYPES OF BLEPHARITIS

There are two main types of blepharitis – anterior and posterior.

#### **ANTERIOR BLEPHARITIS**

When the front (anterior) part of the eyelids becomes sore, this can be caused by an infection, allergy or a general sensitivity to bacteria present on the eyelids. It can also be associated with some scalp conditions, such as very dry or oily skin and dandruff.

#### **POSTERIOR BLEPHARITIS**

Also known as meibomian gland dysfunction (MGD) is when the glands that make the oily part of your tears become blocked. Both types of blepharitis can cause dry eye or make it worse if you already have it. Many people will have a combination of blepharitis, meibomian gland dysfunction and dry eye.

### **RISK FACTORS**

Blepharitis is more common in people over the age of 50, but anyone can develop it. This is often because the glands that make the normal tears, particularly the oily part of the tears, tend to become less effective as you get older.

### SYMPTOMS

Blepharitis can cause crusting and white scales may stick to the roots of eyelashes. Your eyelid edges may become red and your eyes will feel gritty, burning, sore or itchy. If you experience these symptoms, make an appointment with your optometrist.

### TREATMENT

There is a range of products designed especially for treating blepharitis, such as sterile pads, individual moist wipes and separate cleaning solutions.

As part of the treatment, you need to remove all the crusting and debris from the edge of your eyelids and from between your eyelashes. You should use a special lid cleaning product. Treatment of blepharitis is a long-term procedure. You may not see any improvement for several weeks.

Continue the treatment twice a day for at least one month, then less often as it starts to get better. You will probably need to continue to clean your lids at least twice a week to help prevent the blepharitis from returning.

The Employment (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act

A GUIDE FOR EMPLOYERS STATEMENT OF TERMS

Within five days of an employee commencing employment, the employer must notify the employee in writing of certain core terms of employment. The five core terms to include are as follows:

- the full names of the employer and the employee;
- the address of the employer or principal place of business;
- the expected duration of a contract, if temporary or, the end date of a fixed term contract;
- the rate or method of calculation of the employee's pay and the pay reference period;
- the number of hours which the employer reasonably expects the employee to work.

#### ZERO-HOUR CONTRACTS

There is a provision under the Act; to prohibit zero hours contracts except in very limited circumstances, such as genuine casual employment or in emergency situations

#### MINIMUM PAYMENT

In the event of an employer failing to require an employee to work at least 25% of the time the employee is required to be available to work for the employer, the employee is entitled to payment for 25% of the contract hours or 15 hours, whichever is less.

BANDED HOURS CONTRACTS

The Act enables employees to request to be placed within a band or range of hours. The bands of weekly working hours are: A 3-6 hours - B 6-11 hours - C 11-16 hours - D 16-21 hours - E 21-26 hours F 26-31 hours - G 31-36 hours - H 36+ hours STEPS FOR EMPLOYERS

- · Review procedures for new hires and ensure the systems are in place to provide the core terms and an employment contract on time:
- Review current contracts to check for zero hours contracts, whether they can be justified or need to be discontinued; and
- Review contracts and time sheets and be prepared for requests, regarding banded hours.






