Dara mixed the humour with the sincere and got great commentary from the lads on what club, school and county mean to them with interesting insight on the injury risks faced by younger players which all agreed was something that merited more analysis. Spa's upcoming O'Donoghue cup semi final this Saturday got plenty attention given the lack of an O'Donoghue cup title in the club in so many year. The minors were immediately

Dara O'Cinneide expertly judged the insightfulness and sincerity of all present – Michael Gleeson, Donie O'Sullivan and Paudie O'Mahony. Michael Gleeson talked about the value of community in a GAA club and entertained all present with an anecdote on his brief rugby career when studying in Dublin. Association) in the game and Donie excellently responded with a well considered argument about the privilege and the responsibility of being selected to play for your county and the risk that the existence of the GPA could lead to elitism within the playing GAA community of county versus club. This provided plenty talking points for the final panel of Donnchadh Walsh and Darran O'Sullivan of Kerry and Brian Fenton and Ciaran Kilkenny from Dublin. questioned all on the threat of Australian rules and the attraction it presents for young gaelic footballers. Kilkenny recounted his experience of spending time in Australia playing Australian Rules professionally where he decided guite quickly it wasn't for him. He said the appeal of winning all Irelands with Dublin and the prospect of success with his club proved too alluring. Dara commented that it hasn't turned out to be a bad decision for him to date. Fenton and Kilkenny poked some fun at each other saying they were familiar with each other all the way up through the ranks since U7 with Kilkenny saying he wouldn't fancy his chances having to mark the 6 foot Fenton quipped, 6 inch Fenton nowadays. tongue-in-cheek we hope, that he thought the referee in the Kerry v Dublin game this year was the best around which got a good response from Donnchadh and Darran as well as all in attendance. HSE STATEMENT ON ST MARY OF THE ANGELS

HSE representatives including Chief Officer Ger Reaney met with representatives of the St Mary of the Angels Parents and Relatives group on Wednesday November 9th at St Mary of the Angels in Beaufort, Mary Smithwick, Communications Manager CHO Cork/Kerry told the Killarney Outlook. The HSE's aim for the meeting was to allay some of the concerns and anxieties which have arisen for the families of some residents at St Mary of the Angels.

The HSE acknowledged to the representatives of families at the meeting that the initial communication in relation to plans for residents of St Mary of the Angels fell short of the standard the HSE expects. The HSE has advised management at St John of God Services that any discussions in the future with residents or their families around opportunities for living in smaller settings in the community will be discussed face-to-face, as part of the normal care planning process. The HSE welcomes the link now established with the family representative group. A number of points were agreed at the meeting, including: - Residents will only move out of St Mary if they and their family members agree that it's in their best interests. Any opportunity for residents to live in smaller settings in the community will come after considerable planning and discussion with those residents and their families.

- If any resident moves from St Mary of the Angels, it will be on the basis that it will enhance their life. Anyone who moves will continue to access the services they require. If a resident experiences difficulties after moving out all options will be explored – including moving back to St Mary's of the Angels for a short or long period of time.

- No planning for any move will take place without an open and inclusive discussion with residents and their families based on the assessments and as part of the care-planning process.

- The HSE agreed to take on board a suggestion from the representative group that a group representing family members, St John of God and the HSE should be established. The aim is to work together in the best interests of the residents.

COUNCIL ACQUIRES LAND FOR NEW KILLARNEY WALKING AND CYCLING ROUTE

A new walking and cycling route which will like Muckross Road to Ross Castle is set to go ahead following news that Kerry County Council has acquired a parcel of land beside the River Flesk in Killarney. The new route will mean that walkers and cyclists will now be able to avail of an off-road facility all the way from the Flesk Bridge via Ross Castle and onto Fossa.

In recent days, Kerry County Council has purchased land from Killarney Racecourse to allow for the completion of a walkway and cycleway from the Flesk Bridge at Maurice O'Donoghue Memorial Park via the banks of the river and on towards the Ross Road just a short distance from Ross Castle. The Council will now look at funding options to progress the project.

Cllr. Michael Gleeson told the Killarney Outlook that " Following on many Notices of Motion

and questions to Councils I am most pleased to inform that all contracts with property owners have now been signed in order to allow for the development of the walkway/cycleway from Ross Road to Muckross Road partly adjacent to the northern bank of the River Flesk.

When completed, hopefully reasonably soon, this way will not only be a short cut from road to road but will also be a safe and enriching experience for all who will travel along it", he added, thanking all the property owners for their co-operation and to compliment Council management for their commitment to a very worthwhile project.

Cathaoirleach of the Killarney Municipal District, Cllr Brendan Cronin said the acquisition of land meant the new amenity route could now proceed to public consultation and planning approval: "This will be an absolutely wonderful addition to Killarney's selection of walkways and cycleways and will provide locals and visitors alike with a fabulous riverside amenity connecting Muckross Road and Ross Road," he said.

"What is more important is that this additional amenity effectively extends the off-road route from the Muckross Road towards the N71 at Fossa near the Hotel Europe giving walkers and cyclists the option of travelling all the way from Fossa right into the heart of Killarney National Park on the Muckross side of Killarney town. This will further enhance Killarney's international reputation as a walking and cycling destination and will provide users with a dedicated, safe, off-road route to enjoy at their leisure. I look forward to its completion at the earliest opportunity," said Cllr Cronin.

PLANS FOR ST. FINAN'S HOSPITAL

At the recent Regional Health Forum meeting Cllr. John Joe Culloty asked "what plans the HSE have for St. Finan's Hospital in killarney." He received the following response:

"It is anticipated that the O'Connor Unit will be vacated in 2017 and that work will continue on supporting the residents in Cluain Fhionnain to move to community living. Under the HSE Capital Plan 2016-2021, funding is being provided for a new community nursing unit in Killarney. This will replace St. Columbanus Home and Killarney District Hospital. The land adjacent to St. Finan's Hospital is one of the locations being considered for this new facility. Apart from the community nursing unit outlined above, the HSE has no further requirements for either the accommodation or lands attached to St. Finan's Hospital. The HSE has met with Kerry County Council in regard to St. Finan's campus. It is envisaged that the HSE will continue to develop part of St. Finan's campus to meet its requirements in relation to its Older Persons accommodation programme. In relation to the remainder of the campus the HSE has asked Kerry County Council to identify whether the site offers any strategic opportunities to the local authority in relation

to their requirements. Discussions are ongoing with the council in this regard.

" I have a question on the agenda for next weeks Killarney municipal meeting seeking an update on discussions with the HSE", Cllr. Culloty told the Killarney Outlook.

DIABETES AWARENESS: 43% have never been tested for diabetes

Figures from a new study released reveal that 33% of people in Ireland have a family member with Diabetes. One in five people (21%) have a family member with Type 2 diabetes and overall, three in four people (77%) know someone who has diabetes. Diabetes or Diabetes Mellitus is a disorder characterised by hyperglycaemia (high blood glucose levels).

DESCRIPTION: When the food we eat is digested, most of it becomes glucose (sugar), which the body uses for energy. In order for this to happen, the glucose must leave the blood and enter the body cells. The hormone that helps glucose enter the cells is called insulin. It is produced by an organ called the pancreas. In Diabetes, the pancreas either doesn't produce insulin, or the body is unable to use the insulin properly. This causes glucose to build up in the blood instead of entering the cells, a process called hyperglycaemia.

THERE ARE 2 TYPES OF DIABETES:

TYPE I – Insulin Dependent Diabetes. In this type of Diabetes, the pancreas produces little or no insulin.

TYPE II – Non-insulin Dependent Diabetes. In this type of Diabetes, the pancreas produces insulin but the body does not use it properly. This is called insulin resistance. Diabetes is a condition requiring life-long management. There is no cure, but symptoms can be controlled with careful attention to diet and medications. Poorly controlled Diabetes may lead to serious complications.

COMPLICATIONS OF DIABETES INCLUDE:

A progressive loss of vision that can lead to blindness
 Nerve damage that can cause a loss of sensation in the lower limbs and may lead to foot ulcers, joint problems and infections.
 Kidney disease Heart disease

Signs and symptoms (May include the following):

- Feeling thirsty all the time
- Urinating more frequently
- Blurred vision Lack of energy
- Numbness and tingling in the feet or legs
- Recurrent infections

PREVENTION: Type I cannot be prevented but can be controlled with careful management

Type II tends to be linked to several risk factors which increase with age. These risk factors include:

- High blood pressure
 Obesity
- Family history of Diabetes
 History of heart disease
- Smoking Excess alcohol consumption

Formed in 1996 by Pat Gill and the late Pat Corcoran, the association has gone from strength to strength over the past two decades. Nationally, Community Alert was formed in 1987 following a spate of crime on rural communities around the country and the founders of the Lissivigeen Community Alert Association were aware of the number of elderly people in their community and how they would benefit from services offered by the organisation.

A strong link was quickly formed with the local national school and with the principal there, Michael McAuliffe.

Local children attending Lissivigeen National School were always involved Community Alert initiatives and held a number of competitions from literary to sporting in the memory of the founding member Pat Corcoran. The Pat Corcoran Perpetual Shield is held in high regard both in the school and in the local community.

In an effort to keep a watchful eye on the elderly in the community the association have provided 25 monitored alarms to people in the locality. This facility, along with a text alert system which originates at Killarney Garda Station goes out to 250 residents in the area and gives great peace of mind to people. The association have a fantastic social side and regularly organise trips to places like Gougane Barra, Ballymaloe and in 2012 they travelled to Cobh for the Centenary of the sinking of the Titanic.

There one of the residents of Lissivigeen at the time, the late Jackie "the Farmer" O'Sullivan was accorded the Freedom of Cobh. Jackie had just turned 100 four days previously and was in Cobh to accept the presentation.

The accolade was also bestowed on other Lissivigeen residents who had family members on board the Titanic when it sank in 1912.

In 2010 Sean Hurley from Radio Kerry presented a two part programme called "The Spirit of Lissivigeen – Bridging the Generations".

The whole parish got behind the show which went on to win a PPI award much to the delight of those involved. As part of the show, children from Lissivigeen National School visited the local farm museum at the home of Sean O'Donoghue. Sean guided the children through the fascinating array of farm machinery and held a questions and answers session with them before they tucked into treats supplied by the Gentleman Farmer.

Other events covered on the show were a gardening demonstration, a day at the bog, where residents went to Raheen Bog to cut the turf, baking a griddle cake in Muckross Traditional Farms and a visit to Patrick McGillycuddy's forge in Ballydribbeen.

Here, Jackie "the Farmer", then aged 98, arrived at the forge on pony and trap and engaged with Pa Mac who was shoeing horses while the children from Lissivigeen NS watched on.

A trip to the Town Council chambers was organised by the then Mayor of Killarney, Lissivigeen resident Michael Gleeson who explained the workings of the Town Hall.

In 2008, one of the first Rambling Houses to be held in Lissivigeen took place in Darby O'Gills) now the Torc Hotel) and attracted over 150 to the night. Elderly people in the area told stories, musicans played music, dancers danced and a fantastic night was enjoyed by all. This was to be the first of many Rambling Houses to be held in the hotel. Sean Hurley from Radio Kerry broadcasted his show from the hotel that night. The committee were also responsible for hosting a special environmental awareness meeting with Micheal O'Coileáin from Kerry County Council who spoke to a full house on environmental issues such as pollution, radon gas and sewage related issues.

The second half of the meeting was presented by Dr. Alan Mee from the White Tailed Eagle Programme. Dr. Mee explained to the gathering which included representatives from the farming community, locals and politicians, what the programme entailed and eased the minds of many who were unsure about the project. The meeting proved to be an outstanding success and as a result, some of the committee were invited to the release of the eagles at Tomies Mountain. Teagasc representative Mr. Michael Godstein and Inspector Barry O'Rourke were also in attendance.

Held tightly together by social and cultural ties, the community of Lissivigeen should be very proud of their way of life, how they look out for each other and how they place such emphasis on the elderly and young in the parish.

€15,000 INVESTED IN KILLAGHA ABBEY

Work on a 13th century Abbey near Milltown has just been completed.

Kerry County Council – with the support of the Heritage Council – spent €15,000 on the project. It follows calls for restoration works on the historic structure by a local community group which brought the issue before councillors in the South and West Kerry Municipal District earlier this year.

Conservation work included the removal and re-setting of the cornerstones at the northwest corner of the abbey, the raking out and re-pointing of loose and unstable mortar in all joints in the west gable and the resetting of stones on the parapet over the gable wall.

"The north-west corner of the building had become unstable and a number of structural stones had fallen while others were loose. This was mainly due to the adverse winter weather over the last few years which washed out mortar and loosened joints," said Kerry County Archaeologist, Michael Connolly.

Killagha Abbey, just off the N70 road between Milltown and Killorglin, is an Augustinian abbey founded in 1216 which was occupied by the Canons Regular of St Augustine until 1576. Its well-known East Window was restored by a community group in the 1990s.

"The existing Conservation Plan for the abbey commissioned in 2012 was updated recently taking into account the current condition of the gable and an application for funding was made to the Heritage Council. It awarded a grant of ϵ 6,000 towards the project which cost ϵ 15,000 in total. Ministerial Consent for the works was granted by the National Monuments Service," said Michael Connolly.

The works were carried out by David Russell Construction and overseen by Malachy Walsh & Partners, Consulting Engineers.

THREE KERRY NATIVES TELL THEIR RURAL ELECTRIFICATION STORIES IN NEW BOOK

It was 1977 before the Black Valley finally received electricity after years of campaigning. In a new book, Then There Was Light, the stories of three Kerry natives feature prominently in this book of memories of the roll-out of the Rural Electrification Scheme across the country 70 years ago this month. Then There Was Light is a collection of tales of the time when Ireland left the dark ages as the ESB brought electricity to even the most remote communities in the largest ever undertaking by the fledgling independent nation.

Kerry poet, Phil Lynch, sets the scene for his 'Changing The Light' poem by recalling how the rest of the family waited in the dark for their father to come in from the fields before he switched on the lights and dazzled him and everyone else in the family half to death. In that moment, he says: "Inside the light would never be the same." Tralee native, Noel King, sets down in his story, God Is Understanding Of Progress, how the fear and the mystery of the light also had a sense of foreboding. His wonderfully crafted tale was the 100th creative piece of his career.

Cork Engineer, Michael Daly, was in charge when the last leg of the national scheme was put in place in Kerry's Black Valley.

The area had campaigned for decades to get on the national grid and finally joined up in 1977. Michael remembers an RTE programme 25 years on when a resident said that while it was a major benefit, it came at a cost to the old ways, like card playing and storytelling.

This book, co-edited by PJ Cunningham and Dr Joe Kearney, contains scores of stories celebrating the 70th anniversary of the scheme that eventually wound up in the late 1970s. The stories for this collection come from eyewitnesses, ESB employees and the general public as they recall the suspicions, worries and welcome the scheme faced during arguably the most important Ireland rural undertaking in our history. They are diverse in

subject matter and geographical spread and encapsulate the pioneering work carried out on what became a rapidly changing rural landscape.

The ending of a relationship can be a very painful time whether you are the one who has ended the relationship or not. It may have come as a great shock – which can be very upsetting. Even if it had been coming for a while, the grief that accompanies a break up can be devastating. Following a break up we may feel overwhelmed with feelings of loss, grief, anxiety, loneliness, guilt and sadness and it may feel as if our lives will never be the same again. We may find that we have one good day, only to feel flooded with sorrow the next. This is very natural and part of the grieving process. If we were the one to end the relationship we may experience feelings of guilt, loneliness, sadness and/or relief. Whatever you are feeling, it is important to allow yourself time to grieve. Healthy grieving means experiencing our feelings, whatever they may be. Gradually we come to accept the loss and re-adjust to a life without that person. It can be difficult to move that person from being at the centre of your life to somewhere peripheral. This is made all the more challenging if you have children together or work in the same office. Minimal contact – however tough – is advisable.

At times grief can feel like a physical pain – so working with our body can help to release the sadness. Gentle movements such as stretching, walking dancing, yoga, massage or tai chi can all help our mind and body to express our grief.

Although your grief may feel very intense it will change over time. It is important to remind yourself that the heartbreak will heal. Gradually you will begin to notice that you're not checking your phone as much anymore, you have a night out where the sadness isn't present or you're not crying all the time. It is vital to notice these changes - as no matter how small they may seem - they signal change and herald a new beginning.

Grief can be a very isolating experience, so it is important to seek support and reach out to others. You may choose to talk to friends or consider speaking to a counsellor to help you through this time. Remember you don't have to go through this alone. Other great sources of support include spending time with family, walks in nature, pets, reading a good book, watching a movie or going to the gym.

TAX Matters with



CAPITAL ACQUISITIONS TAX

Capital Acquisitions Tax comprises Gift Tax, Inheritance Tax and Discretionary Trust Tax. Gift tax is charged on taxable gifts taken (other than on a death) on or after 28 February, 1974 and Inheritance Tax is charged on taxable inheritances taken (on a death) on or after 1 April, 1975.

Rates of Tax and Thresholds applicable

The standard rate of tax is 33% in respect of gifts and inheritances taken on or after 6th December 2012.

Reliefs and Exemptions from Capital Acquisitions Tax

There are a number of reliefs available in relation to Capital Acquisitions Tax, including Business Relief, Agricultural Relief, and Favourite Nephew Relief. Exemptions may apply to certain classes of property and to certain classes of individuals.

The Pay and File date for CAT is the 31 October. Therefore all gifts and inheritances with a valuation date in the 12 month period ending on the previous 31 August will be included in the return to be filed by 31 October.

Thresholds for Capital Acquisitions Tax

For the purpose of Gift and Inheritance Tax, the relationship between the person who provided the gift or inheritance (i.e. the disponer) and the person who received the gift or inheritance (i.e. the beneficiary), determines the maximum tax-free threshold - known as the "group threshold".

MOTORING OUTLOOK

ANTIFREEZE

WHAT DOES IT DO AND WHICH SHOULD YOU USE?

Making sure that you've got the correct antifreeze in the right concentration is critical to the health and well-being of your engine.

The coolant capacity of modern systems is smaller and the operating temperatures and pressures higher, while greater use of lightweight materials such as aluminium increases the risk of corrosion.

As a rule of thumb, only about 28% of the thermal energy released by burning fuel in the engine is available for driving the car.

• About 7% is used to overcome friction in the engine, drive train, tyres etc.

 Another 35% disappears out of the exhaust, and

• The remaining 30% has to be removed by the coolant or the engine block would go into melt down.

Engines are constructed from several different metals and it's important to prevent corrosion and scale build up in the cooling system at normal operating temperatures. Around 60% of engine failures can be attributed to cooling system problems.

Antifreeze is multi-functional and vital to the correct operation of the engine. A modern coolant/antifreeze needs the following features:

- Corrosion prevention
- Excellent heat transfer
- Protection from freezing
- Prevention of scale build up
- Compatibility with hard water
- Stability at high temperature
- Compatibility with plastics and elastomers used in the engine
- Low foaming

COOLANT EXPANSION TANK

Since around 1930 the necessary freeze protection and heat transfer has been provided by mixtures of water and ethylene glycol. This is available in large quantities from the petrochemical industry and has the added advantage of raising the boiling point of the mixture.

More recently propylene glycol has been introduced as a less hazardous alternative to ethylene glycol although this is much more expensive and some manufacturers have been reluctant to use it.

The important recent technical advances have been in the field of corrosion prevention, hard water compatibility and control of scale build up. Engine design has changed to improve fuel efficiency and lower emissions as well as reducing weight and costs. These demands have made engine operating conditions even more severe, so that much more is required from the cooling system.

The coolant/antifreeze used at first fill is chosen by the vehicle manufacturer as the most suitable. Subsequent service top ups or renewals should use a product meeting the original specification so the vehicle warranty is not affected.

Beyond the warranty period, it is still best to follow the vehicle manufacturer's recommendation, however the coolant/ antifreeze used should at least meet minimum specifications such as BS6580:2010 or ASTM D 3306. These are national standards that provide a basic level of performance for cars and light vans.

The concentrate is diluted with water prior to use and to ensure adequate cooling system protection a concentration of between 40% and 50% (by volume) is recommended. It's important to remember that vehicle cooling systems are sealed and, under normal circumstances, should not need topping up. If the coolant level in the radiator expansion tank drops, the cooling system should be checked fully.

Developments in coolants have led to the introduction of Organic Acid Technology (OAT). The corrosion inhibitors in OAT products last much longer in service than those in traditional antifreeze and are usually only changed every 5 years.

In spite of improvements in the quality and life expectancy of the products there are many older vehicles which still use traditional antifreezes and these must be renewed every 20,000 mile or 2 years. These coolants are cheaper than the longer life technologies and, although they do not achieve the same corrosion protection performance at the higher temperatures generated in modern engine cooling systems, they should at least meet recognised national standards e.g. BS6580:2010 or ASTM D3306. WATER QUALITY

Although tremendous progress has been made in improving the performance of modern day antifreeze/coolants there is still one factor that can reduce their effectiveness – the quality of the water used for dilution! High levels of calcium and magnesium in tap water, that cause furring of kettle heater elements, can also lead to deposits and scale build up in the engine cooling system. If you are in a hard water area it is advisable to use distilled or deionised water in the cooling system rather than tap water.

The latest data confirms that across the European Union the number of patients infected by resistant bacteria is increasing and that antibiotic resistance is a major threat to public health. Prudent use of antibiotics can help stop resistant bacteria from developing and help keep antibiotics effective for the use of future generations.

IRISH TOWN BUILDS MEMORIAL TO THANK NATIVE AMERICANS WHO HELPED DURING THE POTATO FAMINE

A sculpture has been erected in Ireland to thank a Native American tribe for sending what little money they could to the Irish people suffering from starvation at the height of the Great Potato Famine. On March 23, 1847 the Choctaw Native American tribe, who had known great hardship during their forced march to Oklahoma, collected whatever spare money they could and sent \$170 to Ireland through a charity relief group. To remember their generosity and friendship, a huge stainless steel sculpture of nine eagle feathers has been installed in Midleton, County Cork, on a grassy expanse in the town's Bailic Park.

The Choctaw people donated the money 16 years after they, and other tribes, were stripped of their lands in Mississippi, Alabama and Florida and were forced by the American army, at gunpoint, to march 500 miles across mountains and snow to Oklahoma. There was no food or shelter for them at stop points along what is now known as The Trail of Tears. Many of the frailest perished due to disease, malnutrition and exposure during one of the coldest winters on record.

POPE SHARES PIZZA LUNCH WITH 1500 POOR PEOPLE

An estimated 120,000 people filled St Peter's Square in Rome for the Canonisation Mass for Mother Teresa. Applause erupted in St Peter's Square even before the pontiff finished pronouncing the rite of canonisation, proof of the admiration Mother Teresa enjoyed from Christians and non-Christians alike during her life and after her death in 1997. The canonisation is the highlight of Pope Francis' Holy Year of Mercy who as a member of the Franciscan order, his papacy has been dedicated to ministering to society's most marginal. Pope Francis also shared a pizza lunch with 1,500 homeless people at the Vatican after the canonisation ceremony, most of those invited live in shelters run by the new saint's order, the Sisters of Charity. They were brought to the Vatican by bus from across Italy, to be present for the canonisation Mass, where they were given seats of honour. The lunch was cooked by a Neapolitan pizzamaker, who brought 20 members of staff with him as well as three special ovens. The pizzas were served to the guests by 250 nuns and priests of the order.

IRELAND IS CREATING THE LARGEST GROVE OF REDWOODS OUTSIDE OF CALIFORNIA

The Birr Castle Gardens in County Offaly will become the home to the largest grove of redwoods (outside of California) in Spring 2017. Spearheaded by Lord Rosse – the seventh Earl of Rosse – and environmental organisation Trees For Ireland, the grove will help breed and protect the species during the next 1,000 years. Lord Rosse described the project as "very close to my heart. Our grandchildren, their grandchildren, Birr, Ireland and the world will benefit from this magnificent forest grove. These will be the biggest trees in Ireland and the largest collection outside of California."

While thousands of tourists visit the gardens every year, they are also a home to dozens of different tree species from around the world. As a thriving example of biodiversity and environmental conservation, the Birr Castle Gardens will hopefully protect the precious forestry despite the threat of climate change.

*52-year-old Democrat Catherine Cortez Masto became the nation's first Latina Senator after beating Representative Joe Heck. A granddaughter of a Mexican immigrant and a former Nevada attorney general, Catherine will replace Democratic minority leader Senator Harry Reid.

* In California, State Attorney General Kamala Harris was elected as the state's first freshman Senator in 24 years. Ms. Harris is the first black politician to represent California, the second black woman ever to join the Senate, and the first woman ever elected as California attorney general. The Democratic daughter of Indian and Jamaican immigrants will be replacing the retiring Democrat Barbara Boxer.

* 48 year-old Tammy Duckworth, a congresswoman from Illinois and the first disabled woman to be elected to the U.S. House of Representatives, won the race for US Senate. An Iraq War veteran, Ms. Duckworth served as a U.S. Army helicopter pilot and suffered severe combat wounds, losing both of her legs. She defeated incumbent Republican Senator Mark Kirk.

* Former Refugee Ilhan Omar became the nation's first Somali-American legislator after she won a House seat in Minnesota. The 34-year-old succeeded with 80% of the vote, making her an important representative of the largest Somali immigrant population in America.

UNIVERSITY TO HOST FREE COURSES ON CARING FOR THE ELDERLY

Brazilian university students can now learn to take care of their elders free of charge. The Hospital of the Federal University of Minas Gerais (UFMG) started receiving applications recently for their new course on senior caretaking. The whole course consists of 60 hours of teaching divided into units of learning, tutoring, forums, chats, and lectures. Geriatric doctor Edgar de Moraes, the coordinator of the course, explained the initiative is related to the aging population.

"Our focus is taking care of both, the family and the professional," says Mr. Moraes. "We estimate that there are 28 million seniors in Brazil alone, and every year, one million more citizens reach seniority. It's a fast growing population." Since the course will occur on a regular basis, the applications will be reviewed in an ongoing basis. Its tuition – as well as required pedagogical materials – are completely free.

A MAN WHO HAS FED MILLIONS

John Travis "Jacko" Garrett aged 72 is a secondgeneration rice farmer from Danbury, a tiny farm town of 1,700 southeast of Houston in Brazoria County, Texas. He's a legend there, leading catechism classes for the entirety of his adult life at St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church. He's a legend as well, though an unsung one, thanks to the almost six million pounds of rice he has donated to the Houston Food Bank, and the millions upon millions of free meals created from that rice. The contributions of his Share the Harvest charity are vital - providing over 11 million servings of rice each year through the Food Bank and its 570 partner charities in 18 counties around Houston. In 1984 he first began donating a portion of his rice crop each year to charity when his father and himself sent a truckload of rice into the Houston Food Bank that first year. Soon, Garrett Farms was shipping thousands of pounds of rice to the Houston Food Bank every year. In 1999, Mr. Garrett founded Share the Harvest to better gather and distribute the rice from both his farm and the other area rice farms he'd talked into donating. "I'm a farmer," Mr. Garrett says, first and foremost. "I've gotta make a living." That's a challenge these days, both for the industry as a whole and Share the Harvest. Increasing costs have made it incredibly difficult for younger generations to start or take over farms of their own. "A tractor

today is \$250,000; when I went into business, it was \$3,000," he says.

But now Mr. Garrett had troubles of his own. His wife, Nancy, for whom the term beloved doesn't begin to describe his feelings, is getting older. His daughter Tracy Garrett LaChance, with whom he once ran Share the Harvest, took a job elsewhere. He's sold off large acreages of Garrett Farms to keep his head above water and he also worries about his employees, many of whom have never known another employer. One man has worked on the farm for 17 years. Another has been on the farm for 36; still another has worked for Mr. Garrett since he was 15. The average tenure of a Garrett Farms employee is 26 years. Even though he no longer has the time or the energy to knock on doors asking for donations for Share the Harvest, Mr. Garrett will never give up rice farming. It's all he's wanted to do since he was 12 years old, and it's all he's ever known, he will also continue to donate a portion of his harvest each year as charitable works are part and parcel of Mr. Garrett's strong religious convictions. His business cards are emblazoned with the passage from Galatians - "As a man soweth, so shall he reap.

MAN DUG A WELL IN 40 DAYS FOR HIS WIFE AFTER SHE WAS DENIED WATER, WHOLE TOWN BENEFITS

A man in India has proved his whole village wrong by doing what was considered impossible, in a determined frenzy that neighbours called crazy. After his wife was turned away and insulted by locals for trying to drink from a well, Bapurao Tajne was pushed to the edge hearing about the disrespect of their poorer working caste condition. Mr. Tajne put his back and tools to work for six hours every day digging a new water well all by himself in their village of Kalambeshwar - a task that typically requires a team of four or five men. Villagers ridiculed the man's mission knowing such a feat had never been accomplished before and other attempts to locate new sources of water in the area had already failed. Then after only forty days, the unwavering husband struck gold - and his newly-created well will provide water for all the other previously-insulted working class villagers - known as Dalits - in the Washim district of India. "I don't want to name the well owner for I don't want bad blood in the village," Mr. Tajne said "However, I feel that he insulted us because we are poor and Dalits. I came home that day and almost cried. I resolved never to beg for water from anybody. I went to Malegaon (the closest town) and bought tools and within an hour I started digging." After his efforts revealed the water source, his two sons aided him in digging deeper than his initial 15-feet-depth. The success is not unlike that of Dashrath Manjhi, the "Mountain Man" who single-handedly carved a path through

a mountain by toiling away for 22 years to provide his wife an easier route to town.

HAMSTER WITH NO HAIR GETS HAND-KNIT SWEATER FOR THE WINTER

Silky the hamster may not have the same furry coat that other creatures have, but thanks to a kind animal shelter worker, she will be able to face the oncoming winter with a lovingly knitted tiny sweater. Since the 1-year-old rodent has been hairless since birth, she has been living at the Oregon Humane Society in Portland, Oregon. The shelter's technician, Selene Meija, saw Silky shivering in her cage one day and decided to crochet a sweater that would fit her little limbs. "Silky is hairless due to a genetic mutation," said Diana Gabaldon, OHS staffer. "While she isn't fluffy like a normal hamster, she is just as cuddly and playful as any other hamster. She does need to be kept in a heated environment, especially during the winter, and have a higher protein diet to keep her warm."

HOTEL RETURNS LOST TOY AND MAKES PHOTO ALBUM OF RABBITS VIP STAY

When a little girl left her oldest and favourite stuffed animal behind at a hotel, the staff gave the bunny five-star treatment - complete with turn down service - until they could be reunited. "I lost my owner at breakfast" the Adare Manor Hotel posted on its Facebook page, showing a picture of the bunny that a staffer had found. "I have to stay at Adare Manor tonight, hopefully my owner will come to collect me tomorrow," said the photo caption showing 'Jellycat' settled in for the night with the TV remote and chocolate on the bed. By the next day, the hotel in Adare Village, Co. Limerick had tracked down the owner, Kate Hogan. With the crisis averted, Jellycat could relax at the manor, enjoying all the amenities, until Kate picked him up.

There are photos showing him chilling out on the patio... having tea and cakes... taking a stroll around the manor grounds, after getting directions from a hotel employee... before Kate arrived to take him home. "Reunited at last ... yippee!" Jellycat posted on the hotel's Facebook page. "I got lots of lovely hugs from my pretty owner Kate and now we're heading home for our next adventure." Know Your Rights: HELP FOR PEOPLE IN MORTGAGE ARREARS

QUESTION

We have not been able to manage our mortgage repayments and other loans for a long time. The bank keeps sending us legal-looking letters and at this stage we can't bear to open them. Is there anyone who can help?

ANSWER

Yes, there is a new scheme of aid and advice for borrowers in home mortgage arrears. This scheme is part of Abhaile, the national Mortgage Arrears Resolution Service. It provides a range of services to help you to deal with your situation, including financial advice, legal advice and insolvency advice. Panels of qualified and regulated professionals have been set up to provide services under the scheme. It is co-ordinated by the Department of Justice and Equality and the Department of Social Protection and is operated by the Money Advice and Budgeting Service (MABS) in conjunction with the Insolvency Service of Ireland (ISI), the Legal Aid Board and the Citizens Information Board.

You will qualify for advice and assistance under the scheme if:

• You are insolvent – this means that you are unable to pay your debts in full as they fall due and

· You are in mortgage arrears on your home and

You are at risk of losing your home (for example, if your mortgage lender has initiated repossession proceedings or indicated that they plan to do so; if they have said that they consider you to be non-cooperating; or if they have asked you to consider selling or surrendering your home) and
The costs of staying in your home are proportionate to your reasonable accommodation needs

FOCUS ON CHRISTMAS HOUSEPLANTS

This is the time of year when people will give and receive gifts of houseplants such as Cyclamen, Azalea, Gardenia, Poinsettia etc. Christmas houseplants obviously give their best display this time of the year but they have to be kept in the right conditions like the right temperature and humidity level to prolong their lives into the new year and longer.

The conditions of a house environment can be a challenging place for houseplants because of central heating which is very drying to houseplants especially for ones that come from humid tropical parts of the world.

There are several ways to improve conditions for your plants in the house. You can avoid placing them in draughts, especially in places where temperatures will fluctuate from very hot to very cold or in very hot areas like above or beside a radiator.

Water your plants by placing them in a container of water for about twenty minutes.

For plants that need more humidity place them on a tray of gravel with some water but make sure that the plant is sitting on the gravel not the water.

Introduction

Kerry County Council (KCC) and Killarney Municipal District (KMD) have completed a Traffic Management Study for Killarney Town. This Traffic Management Study has, at its core, sustainable transport initiatives with measures set out to enhance the town centre environment. The need for additional car parking, on the periphery of the Town and on the incoming radial roads into the Town, was identified as a requirement to reduce the traffic circulating in the Town Centre area.

The Traffic Management Study has outlined a variety of short term, medium term and long term recommendations. The purpose of this Expression of Interest and Market Sounding is to identify possible sites for this additional car parking and to explore the possible financial parameters within which such additional site acquisition might be progressed with private sector interests.

Potential Car Parking Sites

It is envisaged that the additional car parking requirement could be provided in a number of possible ways, as follows: -

- Offering for sale to KCC and KMD sites suitable for car parking, provided that they are in line with the requirements of the Traffic Management Study.
 The offering of suitable car parking sites for use by KCC and KMD facilitated by an
- The offering of suitable car parking sites for use by KCC and KMD facilitated by an agreed commercial arrangement such as leasing, joint management or other agreed methodology.
- Enhancement of existing KCC and KMD car parking sites, using an agreed commercial arrangement. This could include the provision of multi-storey car parking, supplemented, if necessary, by other commercial activities.

Expression of Interest/Market Soundings Proposals

Interested parties shall provide information on the following basis:-

- Parties with sites for sale should identify those sites and confirm that appropriate Land Registry mapping and legal documentation confirming ownership of same will be provided if requested. The possible costs to KCC and KMD in acquiring such sites should be outlined in broad terms.
- Sites being offered for leasing, joint management or other such arrangements should be clearly identified and confirmation should be given that appropriate Land Registry mapping and legal documentation confirming a legal interest in same will be provided if requested. Proposals in relation to such sites should also include the broad financial parameters within which the arrangement with KCC and KMD would be progressed.
- Proposals for enhancement of existing KCC and KMD facilities should identify the location of such sites and provide a broad outline of what is proposed to achieve that enhancement. This outline would describe the extent of additional car parking being provided, the nature and extent of any ancillary commercial requirements and the broad outlines of a commercial proposal outlining the costs to KCC and Killarney KMD in progressing such an arrangement.

Kerry County Council and Killarney Municipal District Assessment Incoming proposals will be considered on the following basis: -

- The suitability of the proposal in line with the requirements of the Killarney Town Traffic Management Study;
- The suitability of any proposal in relation to planning, procurement and environmental rules and guidelines, and
- 3. The commercial costs, whole-life costs and sustainability of any proposal.

Progression

KCC and KMD will consider the suitability and sustainability of any valid incoming proposal. In the event of such proposals being of commercial, sustainable value to KCC and KMD then discussions may, at the discretion of the Council, be initiated with the submitting parties to further explore how such proposals might be progressed.
