KILLARNEY HOTELS IN THE TOP TEN IN THE WORLD

It has been proven yet again this week that Killarney hoteliers are at the top of their game. The town has been ranked in the top 10 destinations in the world for its hotels by the hotel search website trivago.

The annual reputation ranking was released by the website this week and the town came in eighth place in the world and is also the only Irish or British destination to make the top 30. Speaking to the Killarney Outlook, Conor Hennigan, Director of the Killarney Chamber of Tourism and Commerce said "it is a fantastic achievement for Killarney to get an accolade of this type on an international scale".

"While it is based on hotels and hotel ratings, hotels are dependent on destination so the accolade is also for the town of Killarney", he added.

Last November, the Killarney Park Hotel came second in Trivago's top hotel awards.

Galway is the only other Irish town to make it into the top 100, coming in at 57th place

Trivago PR for the UK and Ireland David Lintott said Killarney consistently "punched above its weight" to outrank some of the major cities around the world.

"It is interesting to note that smaller destinations dominate this year's list, which suggests that holidaymakers rate their stay based on their experience rather than by a destination's reputation. A number feature on Unesco's World Heritage List, which shows the continuing lure of historically-significant regions," he said.

Turkey's Göreme took the number one spot followed by Matera (Italy), San Gimignano (Italy), Gramado (Brazil), Hanoi (Vietnam), Lecce (Italy), Siem Reap (Cambodia), Killarney (Ireland), Sorrento (Italy), and Funchal (Portugal).

US Republican presidential hopeful Donald Trump has been urged to take a leaf out of the Healy-Rae book.

The fame of the Kerry political dynasty has spread to America where the Irish Voice newspaper, read widely by the diaspora, has devoted column inches and website space on IrishCentral.com to the Healy-Rae phenomenon.

Writer Cormac MacConnell, who has been penning a popular column in the New Yorkpublished paper for 25 years, says Trump could learn a lot from the Healy-Rae style of politics. Devoting a recent column to Donal Hickey's new book, The Healy-Raes – a 24/7 political legacy, he tells Irish-American readers they might think they have a very colourful and flamboyant character in Trump, but he doesn't match the late Jackie Healy-Rae.

"Jackie Healy-Rae, born in poverty in hard times on a tiny Kerry mountain farm, beats Donald Trump into a cocked hat on every point of the scale," writes MacConnell.

"If Donald Trump wants some tips on how to captivate the grass roots of your states he should lay hands as quickly as possible on Donal Hickey's highly entertaining history of the dynasty.

"Trump will pick up a lot of folklore and you will get a good belly laugh as you turn every richly rascally page."

Recounting Jackie's 38-year political career, his days on Kerry County Council and Dail Eireann,

he says Trump "is only trotting after him". And Trump might also do well to shun the suits and spin doctors in Washington.

Catriona was not on her own though as alongside her was her boyfriend Neil who hails from Glenflesk and her brother David who has just recently moved to England for his new job. The two lads cant join us for a coffee unfortunately as Neil is heading off to train the nearby Glen Rovers U16 Gaa football team and David is off to do his own training.

Myself and Catriona decide to head for the Tudor Arms for light refreshments and a chat about Catriona's new life here at the foot of the Chiltern Hills. Straight away I could sense that she was happy here and although she does admit that one day she would like to return home, just not for a while yet. Catriona is a physiotherapist having originally studied in Carlow for two years and then obtained her degree at the University of Hertfordshire and is currently working at Harefield Hospital which specialises in heart and lung care and finds her job very interesting indeed. I told her that I remembered her doing physio for the Legion seniors a few years back and she said that whenever she used to be home on holidays from college she used to love helping out at the club.

I asked Catriona to talk me through her early years in Killarney and she told me that sport always played a big part of her life so it is of no surprise that she opted for the career that she did. Catriona who grew up in Arbutus Grove before moving to Oakhill in Ballydribeen, started playing football at the age of seven and played at all age groups up to and including senior and actually played for the boys underage teams up to U14 where she reckons Galen Carroll and David Murphy were the pick of the bunch at the time. She says that she can still hear the screams of Paudie Breen.

Id have loved to have stayed longer as the conversation was great but I had to make my apologies as I had to head to Heathrow Airport as I had a flight to catch to Western Australia.

POLITICAL OUTLOOK

OPINION POLL BAD NEWS FOR TRALEE TD'S

There was little comfort in this week's TG4 Ipsos MRBI opinion poll for both Tralee based TD's, which predicts that, both will struggle to retain their seats. Based on the Poll it looks likely that both Michael and Danny Healy Rae, along with both Fine Gael deputies Jimmy Deenihan and Brendan Griffin and Fianna Fails John Brassil will be the big winners.

The survey was carried out among a sample a 500 adults in Kerry last Thursday (11th Feb) and Friday (12th Feb).

The poll reveals that Deputy Michael Healy Rae is in a commanding lead in the new five seat Kerry constituency on 33%. Just 9% points cover the next

seven main players, which will make transfers a vital ingredient for success.

Fine Gael's Jimmy Deenihan and Brendan Griffin both received 13%, which puts them for the moment in a position to secure a seat each. The showing of Grace O'Donnell on 1% will be a disappointment for them and both may need the transfers of other candidates to secure re-election. However, with a candidate in both the old North and South Kerry areas, the divide will certainly be to their benefit. Next is Fianna Fails John Brassil on 11%, it is a welcome boost to the Ballyheigue man who has put in a mammoth ground campaign and was seen from early on as the main Fianna Fail front runner. He will be hopeful that his running mate Norma Moriarty who is on 6% might give him the push

needed to nick a seat. Meanwhile Labour's Arthur Springs showing can be viewed as a glass half-full or a glass half empty. From the off it looked like a tough call for the first time TD to secure a seat but still being in with a chance at this stage, could likely play into his chances. The Labour campaign over the last 2 weeks has been more visible and was seen to good affect this week with the visit of Joan Burton to Tralee, while Dick Spring's presence on the doorstep is seen as key.

Sinn Fein will certainly be disappointed with Martin Ferris's 7% showing. The TD first elected in 2002, is said to have polled well in the North Kerry area but has not had a good showing in the South Kerry area, where Sinn Fein struggles despite having a Councillor in Killorglin. At their recent launch MEP, Liadh Ni Riada warned of complacency saying, "legends don't get elected because of their reputation, they are elected with votes", so expect a more aggressive closing to the Ferris campaign. In many ways it might kick start it.

Next comes Danny Healy Rae on 4% and while it looks small, Healy Rae was only announced on the day of the poll and is currently running a strong ground campaign in the Killarney Municipal Area and looks likely to gain from an overly generous surplus of his brother to put him in a very good position to take the 5th seat. The Green party's Michael Fitzgerald secured 2%.

Of the other candidates Renua's Donal Corcoran, Independent Michael Pixie O'Gorman both secured 1% with Mary Fitzgibbon, Kevin Murphy, Brian Finnucane and Henry Gaynor all just under 1%

The poll will certainly give candidates plenty food for thought over the next few days and expect a strong counter from Labour's Arthur Spring and Sinn Fein's Martin Ferris, who still have plenty time to claw back some ground, while the Healy Rae's will try to keep their momentum going. Fine Gael, despite their sound showing will be concerned that the party nationally has dropped 5% recently and will hope that this will not affect them, while it will be interesting to see if Fianna Fail put in an extra effort to secure that both their party candidates continue to be transfer friendly. There is a concern for them that votes may not transfer from South to North Kerry, which could put their chances at risk. For the smaller candidates, mostly without parties opinion polls can be cruel as they fail to get countywide exposure mostly due to financial constraints. The lack of posters, airtime and advertising all have a bearing on opinion polls and each of them will continue to fight for each vote. While they may not feature at the business end, when it will come to the final counts, they will certainly have a bearing on transfers. Tralee based candidates will hope to pick up transfers from each other with six candidates from Tralee on the ballot paper. Still the results are only a poll, the

FF TO EXTEND MORTGAGE INTEREST RELIEF TO 2020

Kerry General Election candidate John Brassil has described the party's proposal to extend mortgage interest relief for owner occupiers to 2020 as a major boost for hard pressed families. Mortgage interest for home loans is currently available to persons who purchased their home between 2004 and 2012. 310,400 mortgage holders are in receipt of mortgage interest relief on their home. Parents in Killarney are being urged to have their child's car seat checked as research from the Road Safety Authority (RSA) indicates that as many as 4 out of 5 child car seats are incorrectly fitted. The RSA 'Check it Fits' service will be visiting Kerry in January where child car seat installation experts will be available to ensure car seats and restraints are correctly fitted. The service takes between 10-15 minutes, is free of charge and offers parents and guardians reassurance that their child is safe while travelling in the car.

Since 'Check it Fits' began in October 2013, the RSA service has checked over 8,000 child car seats and restraints across Ireland. Of these, 82% required some adjustment. Worryingly, 75% of seats required a major adjustment, of which 4% were deemed not fit for purpose and condemned, meaning they have the potential to cause injury or even death in the event of a collision. If your child's car seat or restraint is incorrectly fitted, the 'Check it Fits' experts will advise on how to fix the problem, demonstrate how to fit the restraint correctly and answer any queries participants might have to avoid potential serious or fatal injury in the event of a collision

Post Leaving Certificate (PLC) courses offer a route to employment and higher education

The CAO route isn't always the best one for people to continue in education. Some may not be ready for higher education while others may not secure a CAO course offer or, perhaps, may be unhappy with the offer received. PLC courses provide an attractive alternative to higher education and have established a niche link between



second level and third level. Colleges of Further Education have sprung up throughout the country to offer PLC courses leading to awards at Level 5 (Certificate) and Level 6 (Advanced Certificate) from Quality and Qualifications Ireland (QQI).

A PLC course is ideal for a person who has completed the Leaving Cert and requires further vocational education and training to enhance her/his prospects of employment. A PLC course provides anyone who is not sure of her/his career preferences with the opportunity to try out a course before committing to a third level course. It's also tailor made for a student who has completed the Leaving Cert Applied (LCA) or who didn't achieve sufficient points in the Leaving Cert for entry to a CAO course. A PLC course is perfect for a mature student, who may not have completed the senior cycle but has the capacity to benefit from the PLC course.

PLC courses are full time, mainly one year, programmes of general skills education, vocational training and work experience. The courses are an end in themselves, leading directly to employment in many cases. Increasingly, they are used as an alternative entry route to third level education. Last year, more than 16,000 applications to the CAO were from students with a PLC qualification. This is a very healthy development as it provides an alternative route into third level. Another attraction of PLC courses is their availability nationwide at nominal cost in Colleges of Further Education. There are a number of colleges in Kerry providing an excellent range of PLC courses. These include Kerry College of Further Education (KCFE Tralee), North Kerry College of Further Education (NKC Listowel), St. Joseph's Secondary School (Ballybunion), Killarney Community College and 0 Connell Centre (Caherciveen). The PLC courses cover an extensive range of options in areas such as Business and Secretarial Skills, Computer Skills, Art, Craft and Design, Multi-Media, Child and Community Care, Sport and Leisure, Tourism and Catering, Theatre and Drama.

Through the higher education links scheme (HELS), the PLC courses provide an alternative route into CAO courses other than Leaving Cert exam results. This year, over forty higher education institutions including universities, institutes of technology and private colleges are offering a variety of courses to PLC graduates. A PLC course normally involves completing eight modules in the academic year. Students' entry to CAO colleges is then based on a scoring system for PLC awards achieved at Level 5 and/ or Level 6 on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ). Full details about the scoring system are available on the QQI website, www.qqi.ie.

There isn't a centralised application system for PLC courses. Each PLC college looks after its own application process. Entry requirements normally consist of Leaving Cert standard of education and satisfactory performance at interview. Mature applicants are assessed on their life's experiences. PLC colleges are now accepting applications and it's important to apply early as places on the most popular courses fill up quickly. Contact your local PLC course provider, check the PLC colleges' websites or access all the relevant information on www.qualifax.ie.

PLC students may apply to Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI) at www. studentfinance.ie or www.susi.ie for a means tested maintenance grant. Applications for student grants will be accepted by SUSI from early May until the closing date of 1st August. All full time PLC courses are free from tuition fees. PLC students are required to pay registration fees up to a maximum of €150. The Department of Education and Skills (DES) also charges PLC students a course participant contribution of €200. Exemptions apply to medical card holders and a number of other categories.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: REGISTERING TO VOTE

QUESTION

I want to vote in the upcoming general election. How do I add my name to the register?

ANSWER

The Register of Electors is published every year on 1 February. The 2016/17 register comes into effect on 15 February 2016. You can check if you are on the Register at checktheregister.ie or at your local authority, Garda station, post office or public library. The closing date for submitting changes to the Register was 25 November 2015.

Changes to the published Register after the closing date are taken into account in a supplement to the Register of Electors. If you are not listed on the register, you can apply be added to the supplement using form RFA2. The form is available online at checktheregister.ie or from your local authority, post office or public library. You can make this application at any time, but in order to be included in the supplement used at an election, your application must be received by your local authority at least 15 days before polling day (Sundays, public holidays and Good Friday are not counted as days for this purpose). In general you must sign the form in the presence of a member of the Garda Síochána from your local Garda station unless you are unable to for certified medical reasons

If you are on the register but your address has changed, you can have your new address added to the supplement by completing form RFA3. This will also remove you from the register for your previous address.

Request a PAYE Balancing Statement/End of Year Review (P21). The quickest and easiest way to do this is to avail of Revenue's electronic service, either:

- 1. Complete the eForm 12, which is the electronic version of the paper Form12.
- Via <u>PAYE Anytime</u>, which is Revenue's on-line service for employees who pay taxes under the Pay As You Earn (PAYE) system.
- Alternatively you can submit your Form P60 (and, if relevant, a Form P60 for your spouse or civil partner) to your Revenue Office along with details of your claim.

WHAT IS A PAYE BALANCING STATEMENT (P21)?

This is a statement of your total income from all sources and it gives a breakdown of your tax credits, income tax and USC paid during the tax year. You may request a <u>PAYE Balancing Statement (P21)</u> if you want your tax liability reviewed as:

- you have overpaid income tax during the year (i.e. you were not granted the correct tax credits or perhaps you were on the emergency basis or a week-one basis during the year),
- · you wish to claim additional tax credits (e.g. health expenses),
- you are applying for a Grant and you are required to submit a P21 to your local authority.

ACTS OF KINDNESS: KEY TO HAPPINESS FOR CHILDREN & TEENS

Most parents want children to be happy. To that end, parents find themselves doing things for their children to make them happy, like buying gifts, taking them for ice cream, playing games together, or helping with homework. Unfortunately, we don't make children happy by simply enabling them to be receivers of kindness. We increase their feelings of happiness and well-being, reduce bullying, and improve their friendships by teaching them to be givers of kindness. The truth is that children are born to be altruistic givers. But somewhere between birth and 4th class, they are socialised to think more about themselves than others. (And, we all play a role in how this occurs). The goal of "Four Steps to Create a Culture of Kindness" is to help children become more mindful about doing acts of kindness and aware of feelings of gratitude when they experience pleasant activities. Follow these four steps to increase happiness for children – and all of us!

• Educate Yourself - Learn about the importance of kindness and its benefits for children and adults. The Random Acts of Kindness Foundation website is a great place to begin as you will find ideas for home activities for all ages of children.

• Create a Family Activity - Devise a monthlong activity where the whole family record one act of kindness or one pleasant activity per day. You might call it your "Happiness Project" or "Happiness Diary." These activities might include helping with dishes, letting someone else go first, going out of way for a friend, taking care of an animal, hugging someone to make them feel better, etc. Or they might include visits to places and experiences that make us feel good, like visiting grandparents or the park.

• Share on a Weekly Basis - Each week, take time to share as a family. It's not important to share everything in one's diary. What's important is to share enough so that everyone learns from each other's acts of kindness and begins to understand the kinds of experiences that bring gratitude to life. Sharing encourages reflection and helps bring meaning to our actions.

• Find Ongoing Opportunities to Practice - It may not be practical to keep up a "Happiness Diary" and share it on a regularly basis for much more than a month at a time. But is it possible to choose one month a year for this project? Are there other opportunities to reinforce and instill kindness throughout the year?

FLORIDA MAN SHOOTS PUPPIES, PUPPY SHOOTS BACK

Florida man Jerry Allen Bradford had 7 puppies he couldn't find a home for. So he decided to shoot them, however, things went slightly wrong for him. He was holding two puppies, one in each hand, when the puppy in his gun hand put his paw on the trigger and shot Bradford. After being treated, authorities found three puppies in a shallow grave. The other four are in good health and have been taken by Escambia County Animal Control and placed for adoption. As far as Bradford goes, a felony charge of animal cruelty is awaiting judicial review.

NUNS ARE IN DANGER OF BECOMING AS HOMELESS AS THE DOWNTRODDEN PEOPLE THEY HELP

The Nuns of The Fraternite Notre Dame Mary of Nazareth Soup Kitchen has been feeding people in San Francisco's "Tenderloin" district for the last eight years. The Nuns sleep in the same facility where they feed those in need and sell baked goods and are now in danger of becoming homeless as their landlord has raised their rent by more than 50% [from \$3,500 to \$5,500], they can't afford it, and the lawyers are fighting it out. The nuns have about one month before being evicted. And practically everyone whose lives they have touched is incensed, from the hungry homeless to those who run other nonprofits. The nuns' religious order was founded in France in 1977 and has a U.S. headquarters in Chicago.

FORLAND-MINESURVIVORS IN MOZAMBIQUE, A NEW CHANCE AT A WHOLE LIFE

The morning of May 1, 2009, began as a normal one. Then 12-year-old Alfredo Wireless walked from his family's humble home in Mocumbura - a community located in Tete province, in northern Mozambique - to attend school about three miles away. That day, his professor announced a special assignment for all the students: Build a cart from found objects near their homes. After school, Alfredo wandered into the woods, searching high and low for various raw materials and pieces of wood. At one point, he found a round metal object he decided would be perfect for the cart's wheel. Using a small piece of wire, the young boy gently pierced the object in an effort to pass the wire through it. The explosion happened in an instant - the round object, which was a land mine, detonated and tore through Alfredo's upper limbs, resulting in the amputation of his hands and forearms. He was also blinded in his right eye. Despite the end of the country's war of independence (1964 to 1975) and its civil war (1977 to 1992), Mozambique's nearly three decades of conflict have left a terrible legacy: thousands of land mines hidden throughout the country, where, for decades, innocent people have paid the high price of war. Halo Trust has been clearing land mines in Mozambigue since 1994, detonating and destroying more than 171,000, and on Sept. 17, 2015, Mozambique was officially declared free of land mines - 22 years after the end of the civil war. However, survivors must live with their injuries for the rest of their lives. In response, Halo Trust created a service project for land-mine survivors, providing them with prosthetic limbs for the first time. In October, 14 survivors - the first beneficiaries

of the program - were taken to Zimbabwe for measurements for custom prostheses. By early December, the prostheses had been made, and the project was a success. Among them was Alfredo Wireless. Now 18, he received a prosthetic arm and has improved to the extent that he is already able to ride a bicycle. In November 2014, 14-year-old Virginia Pita Masotte, had recently married and moved with her husband, near the capital of Manica province and were building their house in Dombe, one day, she left home to pick up clay to make some bricks for their house, when she was digging a hole to remove the clay, the mine exploded. She lost her left leg and her husband abandoned her as a result, she had to return to her parents' house. Now 15, she struggles to walk with little more than wooden crutches made by her father, but there is one source of comfort: along with six other people, she was to receive a prosthesis for her left leg by the end of January.

CAMBODIA: SUGAR FOR THE EU IS DESTROYING OUR LAND

Cambodia exports sugar worth millions to Europe under an EU trade deal. The initiative, which was intended to fight poverty in developing countries, has led the sugar industry to grab the land of 12,000 Cambodian small farmers and their families, leaving them destitute. Women and children sobbed as their huts went up in flames, but the soldiers of Battalion 313 remained ruthlessly efficient: "They burned everything - even the rice in our fields. They destroyed our homes." explained smallholder Yoeung Kheung in the wake of the land grab. The armed men were clearing the ground for Phnom Penh Sugar's new 20,000-hectare sugarcane plantations. The villagers now live in poverty in makeshift bamboo huts near the plantation. "We barely have enough to eat," complains Yiey Loeum, an 85-year-old peasant woman. Europe's sweet tooth is responsible for the misery of people in Cambodia. The EU's "Everything but Arms" trade initiative eliminates duties and guotas for imports from least-developed countries to strengthen their economies and fight poverty. In practice, however, it has been an invitation to businesses to engage in wholesale land grabbing for plantations. In 2008, no sugarcane was grown in Cambodia. Today, more than 100,000 hectares are dedicated to the crop. Forests and protected areas are being destroyed and villagers often have no alternative but to work as labourers on the very plantations for which their land was stolen. They typically pull weeds and harvest sugarcane for around €2.50 a day. Children also work to help their families make ends meet. The EU and the Cambodian government have been discussing compensation for the families since last June. This will not fix the root cause of the unfolding humanitarian crisis, but it does suggest that the EU has recognized the consequences of its policy.

PUPPY TEETH

Pups are born with no erupted teeth. This allows for easier nursing and less discomfort for the nursing mother. "Baby teeth," develop and erupt in the first few months. They allow young dogs to begin eating solid foods. Over the next few months the puppy teeth are gradually replaced by adult teeth so the dog can eat a more substantial food.

BRONZE AGE BURIAL CREMATORIUM NEAR STONEHENGE DISCOVERED BY A BADGER

Objects found in a burial mound at Netheravon, Wiltshire, include a bronze saw, an archer's wrist guard, a copper chisel which still has its decorated bone handle attached and cremated human remains. Experts believe the burial may have been that of an archer or a person who made archery equipment. A senior archaeologist said the badger had dug out the cremation urn and sherds of pottery were lying on the surface when they were spotted, a full archaeological dig was then carried out on the site. The items are due to be put on display at Wiltshire Museum in Devizes later this year.

NOBEL GOOD SAMARITANS

First as a trickle, then like a flood, they washed up along Greece's coast in rickety overfilled boats: men, women, and children fleeing war and terror. And every day, Greek islanders went out to meet them. They brought blankets and warm milk for children soaked to the bone, and opened their hearts and homes to hundreds of thousands of refugees. Alkmini, an Avaaz member, believed these brave women and men deserve recognition for their compassion, so in just a few minutes she started a petition on the Avaaz.org site calling for these Greek Good Samaritans to be nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. She sent it out to all of her friends and watched it take off, building fast to half a million signers, and grabbing the attention of the local, and then the global media. And now over 200 academics and two Nobel laureates have nominated the islanders for the world's biggest peace prize!

Avaaz - meaning "voice" in several European, Middle Eastern and Asian languages launched in 2007 with a simple democratic mission: organize citizens of all nations to close the gap between the world we have and the world most people everywhere want.

C A R B O N - C A P T U R I N G PLANT PORES

If you're breathing right now, you might consider taking a moment to thank stomata, the tiny plant pores that are less than the size of a pinhead absorb carbon dioxide and push out oxygen. Stomata are all around you - on the leaves of trees (and bushes and flowers and houseplants) all over the world - you just can't see them with your naked eye.

But if you have a heart condition or take fright easily, you may not want to see stomata, at least not through an electron microscope, where they appear to inhabit a wondrous but grotesque world of mouths and horns and alien landscapes.

TITANIC II SCHEDULED TO SET SAIL IN 2018

Australian billionaire Clive Palmer's fullyfunctioning replica of the Titanic being built in China will be launched in 2018, two years later than initially planned. It will look virtually identical to the Belfast-built luxury liner which sank on April 1912 after hitting an iceberg on its maiden voyage, despite being four meters wider in order to meet today's maritime safety regulations, and the hull will be welded, not riveted, satellite controls, digital navigation, radar systems and modern evacuation procedures. Its maiden voyage will not be from Southampton, nor will it travel to Cherbourg in France nor to Queenstown (Cobh) and then head for New York but instead The Blue Star Liner will sail from Jiangsu, China, to Dubai in the United Arab Emirates. The nine deck cruise ship will offer first, second and third-class tickets, for the 840 cabins which are capable of accommodating 2,400 passengers and will have a crew of 900. The cost of a first class berth ticket on the original Titanic back in 1912 would have set you back \$150 (\$2975 - €2,635 today), with some of the suites going for over \$4,350 (about \$83,200 - €73,716 today), Second Class £12/\$60 (\$1200 – just over €1,000 today) Steerage Passengers (Third Class) £3 to £8 (\$298 to \$793 - €264 to €700 today) for a one way trip. An example of the Crew Salaries: Captain E.J. Smith, £105 a month. Stewardess Annie Robinson: £3 and 10 shillings a month. The range of wages was guite extreme in 1912. In today's money, Captain Smith earned about \$125,000 (€110,750) per year while Stewardess Robinson earned \$4100 (€3,630) per year! Around 40,000 people had enquired about tickets to sail on Titanic II and half a dozen offered more than a million dollars to make sure they get on the maiden voyage before construction had even began.
