

Ayoung Killarney girl has been Pplaced 2nd in the world at the World Irish Dancing Championships U12 in Greensburo, North Carolina, USA.

Caoimhe O'Halloran from Ballinamanagh, Kilcummin is the daughter of Geraldine and Gary O'Halloran and is a pupil in Kilcummin National School.

Caoimhe began dancing at the eager age of 5, and progressed quickly to Championship dancing. She competed her first Munsters at U6 and since competed in all Irish Dancing Majors including All Scots, Great Britains, North America Nationals, British Nationals, All Ireland's and Irish Nationals.

"She has been in the top 5 of all of these Majors since placing 5th at the Worlds in Glasgow last year. Caoimhe's commitment, determination and passion for dancing can't be underestimated and for an 11 year old she has made many a sacrifice and choice to pursue her dreams", Caoimhe's mum Geraldine told the Killarney Outlook.

"She trains at least 3 evening per week, and more coming up to big competitions and has Féis's most weekend. Huge thanks must go to her dancing teacher Aine Murphy from the Aine Murphy Dance Academy in Gneeveguilla, who dedicates endless hours of her time to all her dancers and ensures every dancers achieves their potential", Geraldine added.

Caoimhe is one of these lucky girls and is very grateful to Aine for the time, interest commitment she gives her both in class and at competitions.

"Leaving Ireland Caoimhe was adamant she was getting her hand on a bigger Globe than last year's 5th place and so she did. Reaching 2nd place in the World is no easy task at any age but 11 year old Caoimhe did it in style making for a very emotional prize presentation and lots of celebrations since", her mum said.

The family are now enjoying a tour of Disneyland before returning to home.

11 year old Roisin Collins is a 5th class student at Firies National School and the brave little girl has already spent some time in Temple Street Hospital following her surgery.

Speaking to the Killarney Outlook before the trip to Germany this week, Roisin's dad Tim said she was in great form.

"The therapy that Roisin needs is only available in Germany and we plan to spend six weeks there while she receives it", he said.

"She is a really brave girl, the tumour was in the centre of her spine and the proton radiotherapy will kill any cancer cells that are left", he added.

A member of the Firies Under 12 football team, the

club are holding a fundraising walk to assist with the family's expenses and to show their support for Roisin.

"We are asking all our club members, and the wider community to come out tomorrow, Saturday 20th April and Walk for Roisin.

Starting at the GAA pitch Farranfore at 12 noon we will walk the old road/bog road route in Farranfore (approx. 5k) and back to the GAA pitch for light refreshments", a member of the club told the Killarney Outlook.

The club are asking for donations of €10 per adult & €5 per child to take part in the walk.



ANNUAL CHARITY WALK TO ST FINIAN'S HOLY WELL

KILLARNEY WELCOMES 5,000 DANCERS

5,000 dancers and their families spent the week in Killarney for the 2019 An Chomhdháil World Irish Dance Championships which kicked off at the INEC Killarney on Saturday, April 13.

Competitors from America, Scotland, England, Europe and all over Ireland are competing for a world title in the championships which run from April 13 to 19. Over forty competitions take place across the seven-day championships and winners are announced every day after each competition. The competitions are held in the INEC and The Gleneagle Ballroom. The youngest dancer in the competition is nine years old and the oldest is twenty-one. Over 5000 dancers will take to the stage over the course of the seven days.

The 5000 competitors are accompanied by an entourage of organisers, teachers, adjudicators, musicians, families, friends, supporters and spectators. This is Killarney's fourth time hosting these particular championships.

An Chomhdháil, the organisation who run the World Irish Dance Championships have an extensive branch network worldwide and is one of the most progressive Irish Dance organisations, being the first Irish dance organisation to bring in the no makeup rule for girls under thirteen years of age in 2007.



Both male and female world champions will be crowned across a range of age categories from under ten through to adult while approximately 400 teams will take part.

KILLARNEY AND DISTRICT MOTOR CLUB LAUNCH 40TH RALLY OF THE LAKES

Killarney and District Motor Club launched its 40th anniversary Cartell.ie Rally of the Lakes to a packed Gleneagle Hotel on Sunday evening.

The rally, set for May 3rd to 5th will feature many new innovations including the reversal of stages like Ardgroom and Cod's Head, running east to west for only the third time in the rally's history. Sunday's Sheen River, the full-length version of Gortnagne from Ballydaly to Headford and a new stage near Rathmore promises a challenging route for competitors.

This year marks the 10th anniversary of Cartell.ie's sponsorship making it one of the longest serving rally sponsorship agreements in Irish motorsport.

The Rally of the Lakes has set standards other rallies could only follow when it comes to the publishing and distribution of stage rally maps to help officials, competitors and spectators. This is due to the rally's support from Ordnance Survey Ireland which stretches back over 20 years.

While the rally is celebrating its 40th anniversary, The Gleneagle Hotel has acted as event headquarters for 39 of them and group MD Patrick O'Donoghue is already looking forward to next year.

"We will have another reason to celebrate next year," he said. "We have been here through thick and thin and through the good times and the bad times. We were happy to support the event in the tougher times to make it what it is today."

KDMC chairman, Diarmuid Cronin said: "40 years is a long time. It is great to see many of the people who were involved 40 years ago still here today. It takes a large number of people from our own club and our neighbouring clubs, 240 volunteer marshals are required but we cannot do it without them so a huge thanks to them."

The rally will get underway on Friday night with a rally festival in Killarney's Fair Hill Car Park where each competing crew will get interviewed by former RTE Sunday Game host Michael Lyster. A static display of rally cars of historical importance will also take place before a rally interview forum is scheduled for Scott's Hotel at 8pm where Lyster will engage leading competitors in a Q and A session on the eve of the rally.

"This year is our 40th year and it is important to put our best foot forward," said the clerk of the course Dermot Healy. "This year we are going to pull out all the stops." Entries have already toped the 130 mark, with a more expected after this weekend's Easter Stages. Frontrunners already entered include Sam Moffatt, a previous double winner of the rally, his brother Josh, both driving Ford Fiesta R5s, Robert Barrable who finished second last year returns in a Skoda R5 and rising Welsh star Meirion Evans in a Hyundai i20 R5 makes his first appearance. Craig Breen's entry is expected to be lodged this week.

Locals on the entry list include Noel O'Sullivan who is starting his 37th Rally of the Lakes and Charlie Hickey who faces Moll's Gap for the 34th time.

"The dream is to have the fully entry of 170 cars," added Dermot at Sunday's launch.

Rally legend Phil Collins, who first came to Killarney in 1981 and has rarely missed a year since returns in his famous Ford Escort.

MURPHY, MULLINS & DE STAIC Celebrate 75 Years ON HIGH STREET



o celebrate the 75th year of a family business, renowned jeweller Brian de Staic will launch his Cill Aírne Collection at a celebration to mark the occasion. Margaret (Mairead) Mullins and Brian de Stack continue to follow in the footsteps of Margaret's parents Tom and Mary Mullins who established their business in the early 1940's on High Street. Tom Mullins and Mary Murphy bought 19, High Street in the early 1940s where they opened a shop. They married in 1946 and raised 4 Children June (Twomey), Thomas, Patrick & Margaret (Máiréad de Staic)

Tom Mullins was born in Kilgarvan in 1910. He came to Killarney when he was 16 to train as an apprentice tailor.

The High Street premises was bought to open a tailor's workshop. The premises had a bar licence. When someone offered to buy the licence for a considerable sum of money at the time, Mary Murphy decided to hold on to it. The couple ran a Bar and Grocery shop. The

tailor's Shop was on the third floor. "As children we all helped out in the business",

Margaret told the Killarney Outlook.

"Weighing up bags of sugar, stocking up the shelves, washing out the sweet jars and best of all picking out our favorite sweets from the assortment of loose chocolates sold by weight - we loved to help out" she added.

"At one stage Tom employed 6 tailors. The business was booming. He was a master tailor and did his masters in Cork City", Margaret said, and although tailoring wasn't his own career choice he was very successful at it.

He made all the vestments for Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty - The Scarlet Pimpernel of The Vatican. Tom, Mary & The Monsignor were great friends. "My father told lots of great stories about him. He was very proud of The Monsignor's accomplishments", Margaret said. Tom happily gave up tailoring in the late fifties. The arrival of ready made suits saw a downturn in the tailoring market and he concentrated on running the thriving Grocery & bar business.

Mary Murphy was born in 1916 in Mangerton View Killarney and attended The Mercy Convent Primary School and The Loreto Convent Secondary School following which she took up a position in the Accounts Department of Macky Ó Shea's, MD O Shea now.

She was a talented actress and a shrewd business woman. As Tom was running the the bar & grocery, Mary took the opportunity to

open a Guesthouse & and Café upstairs. Business was booming in the 60s and early 70s in Killarney. Mary bought an Ice Cream fridge in the early sixties against everyone's advice.

It was a shrewd marketing decision and attracted new customers who purchased a lot more than ice cream. The building was renovated in the late 60's to incorporate more bedrooms and to open a restaurant Downstairs. The grocery shop was replaced by a lounge bar. Mary was one of the first in Killarney to introduce Pub Grub and also one of the first to buy a television 6 to 8 months before Mullaghanish made its first transmission in 1962.

People thronged the bar to see the first broadcast by Charles Mitchel. Tom and Mary bought 18 High Street, Killarney in the mid 60s. When they sold 19, High Street they moved next door and opened a guest house.

Always the business woman, Mary converted the sitting room into a retail outlet with a large pane glass window and a separate entrance.

30 years ago she convinced Brian & Margaret de Staic to open up a jewellery shop in High Street, Killarney and loved helping in the jewellery shop. The past 75 years has seen the business survive post-war depression Ireland, the economic recession of the 80s & the financial crisis in 2008.

"The business flourished during the booming 60s & 70s, the Celtic Tiger and Brian de Staic is still going strong today", Margaret said proudly. The first year in business in High Street, Tom's brother Johnny brought a trailer of turf from Kilgarvan. As Tom was unloading the turf another publican remarked to a passer by

Plan your strategy for the final weeks before the State Exams

Candidates preparing for June's State Exams have already done a fair amount of work. Many of them have worked diligently throughout the year. Others may have been less motivated on the road to June's exams. But the fact remains that every exam candidate has a foundation of work on which to build over the next few weeks. Efficient use of the remaining time will be sufficient to get you safely over the finish line. No matter how little work you have done to date, you can still achieve a worthwhile result in your exam if you put your best effort into the remaining weeks. Also appreciate that you know a great deal more than you give yourself credit for.

The immediate priority now is to clarify your goals and make a plan of action for the run into the exam. The time for procrastination has passed. It's essential to have clear goals and an action plan to help you to be successful. Your goals will have to be SMART – specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and timelined. Your focus must now be on your total readiness for next June's exams. Avail of all the help that is at your disposal during the next few weeks to ensure that you are in tip top shape for the challenge of the exams.

The subject teachers at school, who are the experts, will guide you through the last few weeks in revision, exam techniques and overall subject strategy. Attend school regularly during the final term and maintain a diligent work schedule to give yourself every chance of doing a good exam. Be clear in your own mind as to what exactly your goals are. Have confidence in your ability to achieve them.

Make a plan to accomplish your aim and, critically, execute your plan by doing the necessary work.

Carry out an honest review of your exam programme straight away. Make a decision about the level - higher, ordinary or foundation - of the paper you will answer in each subject. Set a target grade in each subject to help motivate you. It's vital at this late stage to be realistic. For example, if you feel you may not be able for a higher level paper in a particular subject, are you not far better off taking an ordinary level paper in that subject where you may achieve a decent grade? Consider what you would like to do after the Leaving Cert exam. A singular determination to achieve enough points to get a place in your course of interest is a great motivator. Perhaps, your primary motivator should be to do yourself justice in the exam and to achieve results that reward your ability and effort. Having clear and focussed goals will make your last term more productive and rewarding.

Regard the next few weeks and the actual exam as a challenge that you will meet headlong and with determination. Approach it with confidence and belief in yourself. Take total control of your life and channel your energy in a positive direction. Every time you have a doubt or a negative thought about yourself replace it with a positive one. You will feel better about yourself if you are in control of your situation. To assume that control set aside some time to make out a plan of action. Decide what topics you need to revise between now and the exam. Make out an overall time schedule, a weekly schedule and a daily schedule. Make out that plan of action over the next few days so that you will hit the ground running. In the next article, I will take a detailed look at how best to implement the action plan.

County Library Hosts Starlight Exhibition

Kerry County Library in Tralee will host a major exhibition on the night sky by members of the Dublin-based Irish Astronomical Society from Friday, April 26th to Friday, May 10th. The "Images of Starlight" Exhibition is a stunning collection of sixty images of stars, planets, galaxies and other space objects photographed through telescopes in Ireland including a number taken from the Kerry International Dark Sky Reserve in South Kerry. It will be officially opened on Thursday evening, April 25th, by the Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, Cllr. Norma Foley.

The event, which premiered in the National Botanic Gardens in Dublin in November and attracted several thousand visitors, is on its first visit outside the capital. 

CLLR CALLS FOR LEGISLATION



When was your last Sight Test?

As well as an eye health check, a sight test may detect signs of underlying general health conditions, such as diabetes, high cholesterol, and high blood pressure. It is especially important in early identification of leading causes of preventable blindness such as glaucoma and diabetic retinopathy. Everyone should have a sight test every two years or more often if recommended.

Glaucoma

Glaucoma affects 1-2% of the population, and is a leading cause of sight loss. In the majority of cases, glaucoma is asymptomatic, so regular sight tests are important for detecting glaucoma. The majority of patients with glaucoma are diagnosed following referral from an optometrist. Without regular sight tests, the prevalence of late presentation, sight threatening glaucoma, would rise.

Diabetic retinopathy

People with diabetes are at a high risk of developing retinopathy and possible blindness if untreated. Attending regular sight tests



allows signs of developing retinopathy to be identified

Risk of falls

Uncorrected vision in older people also increases the risk of falls. Falls are the leading cause of disability and death from injury among people over 75 in the UK

Risks for children

Undetected conditions such as amblyopia (lazy eye) have been shown to affect reading ability and therefore may impact on future educational attainment.

Hyperopia, or long sightedness, has also been linked to poorer literacy in young children. Spotting vision problems through regular sight tests is critical to a child's future health and education.

Driving risks

Undiagnosed vision problems can increase the risk of accidents, particularly those that affect distance and side vision.

To peel or not to peel...

Exfoliation is one of the most important part of your beauty routine and more often than not is either overdone resulting in dry sensitized skin or underdone leaving your skin flaky and uneven, so let's talk about what exfoliating actually does! The layer of our skin that is visible to the naked eye is actually made up of 5 individual layers and a bit like a production line, they each have an important function and work their way to the surface resulting in a protective layer of dead skin cells that keep out infection as well as giving us a layer of natural moisture creating the 'skin' that we apply all our lotions and potions to! As our skin cells renew themselves every 4-6 weeks (depending on your age and lifestyle) it is important to slough off the dead keratinised cells which if left untreated prevent the new healthy cells coming on behind from giving our skin healthy, smooth appearance(not to mention the layers of fake tan and makeup residue that accumulates)


There are exfoliating products suitable for all skin type, even the most sensitive widely available, the most common being the traditional scrub which should be used weekly after cleansing by gently massaging a 20cent coin sized amount of product onto damp skin, focusing on pesky areas such as sides of your nose and chin where pores tend to get congested and don't forget to include your neck of course as it can often show , the earliest signs of ageing. There are a few things to consider when choosing a scrub, most importantly your skin type as drier skins often mean thinner more sensitized skins therefore it is important to use a product with a very fine grain to avoid damaging an already fragile skin. In essence, the larger the exfoliating particles, the rougher the exfoliation, which should only be used on skin that can tolerate it such as thicker oilier skins or indeed the body! Citizens Information

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I've just booked my summer holidays for this year and plan to travel around Europe with my partner and my 10-year old son. How do I make sure we have access to public healthcare while travelling?

ANSWER

Each member of your family will need a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). This card allows you to access public healthcare service in another EU or European Economic Area (EEA) state for free, or at a reduced cost. (The EHIC was formerly known as the E111 form).

All member states of the EU are covered by the card, along with Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland.

The EHIC card is free of charge and you can make an application for yourself, your partner and any dependent children under the age of 16. You have two options to apply:

•If you already have a medical card or Drugs Payment Scheme card, you can apply online for your EHIC at ehic.ie. •Or, you can download an application form from ehic.ie or get one from your Local Health Office. You need to provide your name, address, date of birth and Personal Public Service Number (PPSN).

If your EHIC has expired you can renew it online at ehic. ie. You will need your old EHIC number and your Personal Public Service (PPS) number. If your details have changed (for example, your address) you will need to contact your Local Health Office to renew the card.

If you have concerns about getting a new or renewed card in time, you can get a Temporary Replacement Certificate, either online or from your Local Health Office. You may also wish to consider taking out private travel insurance for expenses not covered by the EHIC (such as the costs of repatriation or the expenses of relatives who travel to you if you fall ill abroad).



REGISTERING FOR TAX

If you're setting up a limited company in Ireland, you will need to register for tax. Below are the main tax and vat rates for businesses;

CORPORATION TAX

There are two rates you can pay for Corporation Tax; 12.5% and 25%. To qualify for 12.5% Corporation Tax you will need to prove to Revenue that your company is centrally controlled and managed in Ireland, if this cannot be proved you will pay 25%.

EMPLOYER PAY AS YOU EARN TAX

If your company or business has employees, you will need to register your business as an employer. Once you are registered as an employer, you business is liable to pay PAYE (Pay As You Earn).

If you are registered for ROS you can register for PAYE online.

RELEVANT CONTRACT TAX

Relevant Contracts Tax applies where a principal contractor is paying a sub-contractor for carrying out or supplying labour in relevant sectors such as construction, forestry, and the meat processing industry. As a principal contractor, you need to file the contract on the Revenue system.

VALUE ADDED TAX

You will need to register for VAT once you reach the VAT Threshold, €37,500 for services and €75,000 for goods. The rates of VAT are dependent on what service or goods your business provides.

SCIENTISTS HAVE DEVELOPED **NEW THREADS THAT CHANGE** COLOUR WHEN HARMFUL GASES ARE IN THE AIR

Engineers from Tufts University in Massachusetts have developed a novel fabrication method to create dyed threads that change colour when they detect a variety of harmful gases. Woven into clothing, smart, gas-detecting threads could provide an affordable safety asset in medical, workplace, military, and rescue environments.

The researchers demonstrated that the threads can be read visually, or even more precisely by use of a smartphone camera, to detect changes of colour due to analytes as low as 50 parts per million.

Such an approach could make the technology accessible to a general workforce, or to lowresource communities that can benefit from the information the textiles provide as repeated washing or use underwater does not dilute the dye, the threads can be relied upon for consistent quantifiable detection many times over.



Emotional intelligence can be a key to success in life and the ability to developing good relationships. Therefore El is a very important skills for parents to teach their children. When parents have it themselves, their child will automatically learn El. Parents with El will naturally attune to their child and understand what their child is feeling. This in turn helps the child to learn how to read and respond to his own feelings and those of others in a healthy way.

However parents who struggle with El themselves may lack the necessary skills to teach their child. This can set up a cycle of low El within a family across the generations. When we ignore a child's feelings, don't notice when they are upset or anxious or tell them that their feelings are irrelevant, we are teaching them to ignore their own feelings. The child therefore grows up to believe that feelings are irrelevant. As adults they can struggle with emotions and in their relationships.

The following are ways in which parents can enhance their Child's Emotional Intelligence.

 Know your child's true nature: Pay attention to see what your child likes, dislikes, gets angry about, is afraid or struggles with. Communicate these observations to your child in a non-judgemental way. This helps your child to begin to see themselves through your eyes – and they can feel how well you know them. Your child will see themselves reflected in your eyes, thus helping them to know who they are. This can boost their confidence and make them resilient to life's challenges.

 Connect emotionally to your Child: Make an effort to empathise with your child and feel what they are feeling. Your child will feel an instant bond with you when your feel their emotion. This in turn helps your child to learn how to be empathic with others and to form healthy relationships. When your child sees you trying to understand their feelings or feel their feelings, they receive a powerful message.

 Respond non judgementally. When you child is emotional do not judge their feelings as right or wrong – instead look beyond the feelings to the source of this emotion. Help them to name and manage the emotion rather than judging it. This will help your child to develop a healthy relationship with their own emotions. It also teaches them to regulate and manage their emotions.
