Have you an interest in the unique wildlife and biodiversity of Kerry? Would you like to learn more about the different types of bird, animals, insects and other creatures, great and small, that live with us in the Kingdom? Biodiversity Week is just around the corner and offers a range of family friendly, fun events that celebrate Kerry's wildlife. From May 20th until

May 28th, Kerry County Council, in association with several local groups, is running a number of short workshops, days out, walks and talks on the many wonderful aspects of Kerry's wildlife. The series kicks off with an introduction to coastal life in Tralee Bay followed by wildlife gardening in Gortbrack Organic Farm, Ballyseedy. There are boat trips, talks, sea safaris

and rock pool dipping not to mention a jellyfish workshop in Dingle Oceanworld Aquarium. This year, music and film will form part of the week thanks to events organised by the Fenit Development Association. Waterville will host a sea safari by marine biologist Lucy Hunt and there will be the ever popular nocturnal ramble in Killarney National Park. Kayaking with Wild Water Adventures and coastal walks in Fenit and the Maharees will allow participants experience the beautiful coast.

Other events are supported by Clean Coast (An Taisce), Team Bramble, Tralee Wetlands Centre, Annascaul Adventures, Swift Conservation Ireland, the Irish Whale and Dolphin Group, Killorglin Tidy Towns, the Kerry Branch of the Irish Wildlife Trust, the Community Water Officer, Maharees Conservation Association and many more.

So if you have an interest in learning more about Kerry's biodiversity come along and take part. Most of the events are free, open to everyone and several are suitable for children. KILLARNEY NATIONAL DEDICATED TO FINBARR SLATTERY

DURING and after his term as the highlyregarded secretary at Killarney racecourse, Finbarr Slattery had always maintained that the staging of a Killarney National would be a very significant event and a big attraction at his local track.

His dream came true when the inaugural event was staged a few short years ago and on last Monday night, just two months after his passing, the feature 2017 €40,000 Killarney National was held in his honour.

In a poignant gesture by the Killarney Race Company, under the chairmanship of Gerard Coughlan, the white flag was raised at 7.40pm for the Finbarr Slattery Memorial Killarney National Steeplechase, making it an emotional experience for those that knew and admired the former Race Company secretary from Countess Road, Killarney.

"It was always Finbarr's wish to have a Killarney National and we are delighted to be in a position to remember him with a race dedicated to his memory," said Mr Coughlan.

"A real gentleman and an incredibly intelligent man, Finbarr packed so much into his busy life but he always had a very special place in his heart for Killarney Races," he added.

Members of the Slattery family were there to witness the occasion and, fittingly, it was a class horse that won the race when the JP McManus owned Auvergnat, piloted by Mark Walsh, romped to victory ahead of Kansas City Chief

and Georges Conn.

The late Finbarr was secretary of Killarney Race Company from 1977 to 1991 and it was under his watch that Lester Piggot and Princess Haya of Jordan raced in Killarney. He was also responsible for the memorable Dublin Millennium Day at Killarney Races in 1988 as well as a special tribute day in honour of legendary broadcaster Micheál Ó Hehir.

Another poignant event at the racecourse on Monday evening was the dedication of the first race to the late Killarney mun-of-two Sheila MacGillicuddy-Kelliher – popularly known as Sheila Mac – who passed away in January 2016. That race, with a value of €11,000, was won by Carrigmoorna Matt.

MINISTER OPENS NEW STABLE BLOCK IN KILLARNEY

A new, state-of-the-art stable yard, part of a major development costing close on €500,000, was officially unveiled at Killarney Racecourse on Sunday by the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Michael Creed.

The 54-unit American barn style facility brings the total number of stables at the track to 145 and, the minister noted, the quality of the development will play a major part in attracting more top trainers and horses to the scenic course.

"Killarney is the most beautiful racecourse in the entire country. There is no place quite like it and now it is one of the most modern in terms of facilities," Minister Creed said on the opening day of the three-day May meeting.

He said the equine industry was a global force and Ireland was on top of its game due to the vision and hard work of those involved, including Horse Racing Ireland and dedicated people like those involved in the Killarney Race Company.

Killarney Race Company Chairman, Gerard Coughlan, said the new stable block and the renovated existing stables was an indication of the many big improvements to come at the track.

He said his main aim as chairman will be to work more closely with the local business community and to develop stronger ties between the town and the racecourse.

"The races have a great deal to contribute to Killarney with the three annual festivals bringing 80 races over a total of 11 days. The conservative estimate is that the races are

worth in the region of €6.2 million to Killarney with an additional €1.42 million in prizemoney," he said.

Mr Coughlan said the reputation of Killarney as a top class racing venue is growing at a great pace and that was very much in evidence last Monday evening when 2017 Cheltenham winner Rock The World – trained by Jessica Harington and now owned by JP McManus – competed on day two of the meeting and didn't actually win.

The chairman also revealed that Killarney will seek to add to its 11 days of racing annually, whether by adding days to the three festivals or opting for a new stand-alone festival.

On Sunday the 9th of April 2017, the men, women and children from the Listry Greyhound Supporters ran their annual Greyhound Rag Meeting, in aid of Kerry Cancer Support Group, on the farm of Kieran Kennedy in Lahard. The event was very well supported by the greyhound community not only in Kerry but we had owners and trainers from as far away as Galway and Kilkenny, making the long journey to the foothills of the Macgillycuddy reeks. You would have to ask yourself what makes a person sit into their car and brave a journey of 3 or 4 hours for such an event. The answer to this can quickly be understood by having a 5 minute conversation with any of the doggie men and women who attend the event year after year in their droves. "The day runs like clockwork", "The gallop is always in tremendous shape and very safe for our greyhounds", The hospitality at Listry is second to none", "The committee are a credit to the parish, it's always a great day out, we wouldn't miss it", these are just a sprinkling of the glowing comments received from far a wide for an event that is in its 31st year since its inception way back in 1986.

While being a great fundraiser for Listry GAA Club over the past 30 years, in most recent years, it has become direct fundraiser for a very worthy charity, Kerry Cancer Support Group. Over the past 5 years we are delighted to have donated in the region of €9,000 to a charity very close to the hearts of our community. Having spent the past five years trying to come to terms with the loss of a family member to this disease, we felt it is important to stress how absolutely vital this service is to our community. The most important part of this charity for us is in its title, "Support". That's where you need support and that's where the Kerry Cancer Support Bus comes in, providing daily transport to and from CUH, servicing all of Kerry and parts of Cork, totally free of charge. This ensures you don't have to go through the journey alone, you are facing it as part of a group of people who all understand where you are coming from and can relate to battle you are fighting. What an incredible

The recent passing of father Pat Moore, former parish priest of Duagh county Kerry, shone a new light on the daily struggles faced by cancer patients and their families. Father Pat kept an online blog at the caringbridge.org site throughout his battle with cancer over the past 2 years and even published a book called "Weathering the Storm" in late 2016, which focused on his battle with the disease. He bared his soul by documenting the daily trials and tribulations he went through; giving a detailed insight into the many great people he met along his journey that supported him in his battle. The blog reached many thousands of hits online and the humility with which he delivered it struck a chord with people across all generations. On the evening of Sunday the 9th of April, as our committee members dusted themselves down after another successful running of our Listry Fundraiser, father Pat was to make his final contribution to the Kerry Cancer support group, by donating €3,000 from the proceeds of his book to the charity. Unfortunately only a few weeks later, his 2 year battle with cancer was to come to end and he slipped away on the 1st of May 2017. The huge legacy of support he has left behind him will comfort cancer patients and their families long into the future. His journey and the many challenges he faced, is unfortunately the plight of many of our family members, neighbours and friends. Support at this time is everything, it doesn't have to be a fundraiser, it might only be a chat over a cup of tea, a quiet word of support on the street, calling unannounced with a cake or taking that loved one for a drive, vou don't realise how much that could do for someone who is in their darkest hour. I think Sean Keane sums it up best in the words of his song "Never Alone",

I have to be honest As much as I wanted I'm not gonna promise that cold winds won't hlow So when hard times have found you And your fears surround you Wrap my love around you You're never alone......

CALL FOR VACANT PROPERTIES FOR USE BY KERRY COUNTY COUNCIL FOR SOCIAL HOUSING

Kerry County Council has issued a call for properties which have been vacant for more than one year for possible use for social housing purposes. The newly launched Repair and Leasing Scheme targets vacant properties as a possible source of social housing and provides property owners with an income stream that may be otherwise unavailable.

The scheme provides that repair and improvement works to bring such properties up to the standard for rented accommodation are funded by the relevant local authority, in this case, Kerry County Council. The cost of the works is then deducted from rent/lease payments over an agreed lease term of at least ten vears.

There are a number of requirements in relation to the scheme:

- · The scheme is not available for private renting ·The property must be vacant for at least 12 months
- · There has to be a social housing demand for the property locally
- · The property has to be viable to provide



accommodation

- · The minimum lease term is dependent on the cost of repairs with a minimum lease period of 10 years and a maximum period of 20 years
- · The maximum cost of repairs allowable under the scheme will be €40.000
- · The lease payments will be based on the general terms of social leasing which is set at 80% (85% for apartments) of the current market rental rates in the property location
- · The scope and cost of the works are agreed

between the owner and Kerry County Council Properties in all areas will be considered but in particular the council is anxious to source properties in the main towns and villages in the county. The benefits for those considering availing of the scheme include:

- · Upgrade your property at no capital outlay from your own resources
- ·Guaranteed rent
- ·No loss of rent during vacant periods
- · No collection of rent or finding a new tenant
- No dealing with tenants or routine maintenance
- · No advertising costs



LOOKING AFTER YOUR SUMMER BEDDING

- If you look after your bedding plants throughout the Summer you will have colour until early autumn or the first early frost.
- A liquid feed of Tomato feed every 2 to 3 weeks is an ideal way to feed your hanging baskets, window boxes and containers.
- Make sure when you are feeding them to do it in the evening time and keep the liquid off the foliage as much as possible.
- As the summer goes on you will notice that some of the flowers will start
 to go off. All you have to do here is take the dead flowers off, a process called
 dead heading.
- It only takes a couple of minutes and it will ensure that new flowers will grow.
- Later in the Summer if a plant looks bad in the basket or window box, remove and replace it with something else like a trailing ivy. Otherwise the whole hanging basket, window box or container will look as it its gone off, and a new plant will give it a new lease of life.

Good exam techniques will improve your grades in the State Exams



(By Billy Ryle

With the State Exams beginning in three weeks, on Wednesday, 7th June, it's now time to focus on your answering strategy.

Candidates who adopt a planned approach to answering the question papers will be successful. Begin with a detailed study of the exam timetable. Get a personal copy and highlight the days and times when you are due to sit for a subject.

Each subject is answered in an A4 style covered booklet. Write your exam number, the subject and tick whether you intend answering through Irish or English. Read the directions on the back cover before you write anything. Each page of the answer book contains two margins. Only the number of the question and each sub-question should appear in the left-hand margin. The right-hand margin is for the corrector's use only. Write your answers between the margins and work neatly down the page. Write clearly and legibly. Keep your answers well spread out for easy reading. Number each question and sub-question clearly in the left-hand margin to make it easier for the corrector to follow your work.

Don't split questions by answering a part of a question on one page and then the other part a few pages further on. If you are unable to completely answer a question leave a page blank to which you can subsequently return. Use diagrams, sketches and illustrations if they enhance your answer. Small drawings aren't helpful and may be difficult to interpret. Use decent size diagrams, as they are quicker to draw and allow greater inclusion of detail. While the presentation of your answering won't merit extra marks, a well-presented script will make a favourable impression on the corrector.

The core of any exam is the quality of your answering. The content of your answer to each question must be relevant to the question asked. Read each question carefully before deciding which ones to answer. Tackle a good question first to settle you down. Before answering a question list the key points around which you will build your answer. Be concise, accurate and relevant. Don't be long-winded or wordy. Waffle and repetition will not impress the corrector.

Be familiar with the format of each paper well before the date of each exam session. Know how the paper is presented. What topics are examined? How many questions must be an-



What styles of question can you expect on any exam paper? Familiarise yourself with the choice available on the paper. Is one or more question compulsory or is there an unrestricted choice available to you? Be particularly careful about a paper, which is subdivided into subsections. Without prior knowledge of such a paper you could easily fail to address the relevant number of questions. Over the next few weeks, as you do past papers, and again at the exam, read the instructions carefully. It's a good idea to handle a recent past paper in each subject for physical familiarity.

Doing well in any exam involves not just knowing the course material but also in presenting your answers within the time allowed. Be determined to attempt the required number of questions. If you don't attempt a question you can't possibly earn any marks for it. Be aware of the marking scheme for each paper and work out in advance the approximate time you can afford to devote to each question. The time allocated to each question should be in direct proportion to the marks available for that question. Let me reemphasis that the candidate who attempts the required number of questions is the one who has the best chance of maximising her/ his grade in that subject. So work out in advance, and write down, the approximate time at which you should be completing each question.

When your exam paper is handed to you read the instructions in case there is a change in format. Then spend about five minutes reading the entire paper. This preliminary

scrutiny of all the questions gives you the feel of the paper and allows you to settle down and gather your thoughts. Stick to your own

pre-prepared answering plan and once you have made your choice of questions, start with a question you can answer well. As you warm to your task, you will be pleasantly surprised at the font of information that comes to mind, as you need it.

When you have finished answering each question, reread it to ensure you haven't omitted any part. Allow at least five minutes at the end of the exam to read back over your answers and to check your enumeration and your overall presentation.

In the next article, I will have some advice for parents of exam candidates.

- Leave some blank space at the end of each question in case you wish to revisit it

- Keep your answers concise, accurate and relevant
- Familiarise yourself with the logistics of each exam paper
- Be careful with a paper which is subdivided into subsections
- Handle a recent past paper for familiarity with its physical appearance and colour
- The time spent on a question must be in proportion to the marks for the question
- Proper allocation of time will enable you to attempt the required number of questions
- Reread the question when you have an-
- swered it to ensure you haven't left out a part



PENSION TERM ASSURANCE - LIFE COVER WITH TAX RELIEF

Pension Term Assurance is a great alternative to a level term life cover policy with the added benefit of tax relief available on premiums paid. You can qualify for this kind of cover if you are self-employed or if you're not included in a company pension

The life cover is designed to last until you retire, usually age 65. At that point, you have the option to convert your policy into a new life cover policy, for the same lump sum. That new policy will expire when you turn 75.

Pension Term Assurance also known as a Section 785 policy can be used by sole traders or those not covered by a company pension scheme, to protect their families in the same way as a traditional level term assurance policy. However with the added benefit of tax relief, they will pay less for their cover.

You are entitled to tax relief at your marginal rate of tax. If you are in the lower tax bracket, you can claim relief at 20%, but if you are in the higher bracket, you can claim relief at 40%. For example, a higher rate taxpayer paying a monthly premium of €50 could claim €20 of that back off income tax, for a net premium of €30.

when the great Gleneagle side were the top team in the country.

good team then. Paudie O'Connor stood out and was a player ahead of his time. He had all the attributes of a great player and with two outstanding Americans in Tony Andre and Arnold Veasley alongside a good squad of local players, Killarney were a step ahead of many other teams in the league back then," he said. Pete returned to Ireland several times over the years coaching at various basketball camps in Dungarvan and other venues. At one particular camp in Castleisland in June 1988, Pete met a young John Teahan for the first time and in-

spired his interest in the game. It was John's first time playing basketball and was the start of an amazing journey where he went on to win national leagues and cups as well as playing for the Irish senior mens team. Now in his mid 40s, John Teahan is still playing competitive basketball in the Kerry county league.

At Wednesday night's clinic, Coach Strickland and Coach Harney worked with young players from Rathmore and St. Paul's demonstrating excellent coaching skills and how to get the best out of young players. St. Paul's Basketball Club Chairman Padraig Weldon made

special presentations to Pete and Chris to mark the occasion of their visit to Killarney. Padraig also thanked Sean Murphy of Murphy's and Lord Kenmare's Killarney for facilitating their stay in town by providing accommodation for them.

KILLARNEY OUTLOOK'S COLUMNIST LOOKS BACK ON A WEEK SPENT IN UHK AND DISCOVERS THAT GAA IS THE BEST MEDICINE BY A HURLER ON THE DITCH

I ended up in University Hospital Kerry (UHK) for a week of tests, to rule out a host of unthinkable possibilities that, thankfully, were all negative in finding anything, which was a positive result for me.

Having transversed the initial tests of the Accident and Emergency Ward, I was transferred to Clonfert Ward for my stay. It was late, when I landed. All were bedded down for the night. No time to acquaint myself with my roommates. However, next morning, as we roused ourselves for an early shower, blood pressure, heart-rate and temperature test and breakfast, I began to get to know my neighbours - all GAA men. Across the road was a Gneevequilla man and the man beside him was a Laune Ranger. The last man on that side was from my neighbouring club Spa. Next door neighbour on my side shared my own colours of black and amber - but his were of the Currow flavour.

Family and friends are great for visiting on these occasions, to while away the long hours. However, they can spend only so much time with you. The staff in TUH do more than their bit too. But, there are still long tedious hours to fill and when the sight is impacted and you can't read or watch TV - those hours can drag on. And here is where the GAA family came in. "Do remember that game in Gneeveguilla..." or "Is so-and-so still playing?" or "I remember a game I played back in...". By the time that story



had ended and the ancillary stories it stemmed, it was dinner time - where did the time go? And after the dinner, we might start in on the Kerry teams: how would they do this year?: were this year's Minors as good as previous years?; what new players might come in? We even resolved the problem that encompassed the Under 21 campaign this year. And already it was tea-time. These conversations were held in pairs and groups and you slipped in and out, as you pleased and as the call for tests allowed. A call for tests was a big thing, for that is what was detaining you and depending on the

outcome, it could lead you on to different paths of treatment. No matter what test you went for, you got the good luck of all as you left the Ward. I've been at games and never heard a Laune man shout for Crokes or Crokes cheer for Gneeveguilla. But on my way out, I had the backing of Currow, Spa, Laune and Gneevequilla with me and this was reciprocated when it was their turn. The angiogram was another event that caused a bit of a stir. It meant a trip to Cork and if it showed blockages, you stayed to get a stent, if all was clear, you returned to home base. Laune left in the ambulance and it was turning late in the evening. It looked like it was a stent job for him. But, then he arrives back late - "clean as a whistle" was the verdict. He was cheered back into Clonfert by the entire

The medical staff will do their bit to get us all back into full fitness. However, there is a state of mind in every patient that needs to be in the right frame to speed up recovery. The dose of GAA medicine I received in Clonfert Ward had a significant positive impact on my stay there. GAA - the best of medicines.



TODAY IS - WORLD FAMILY DOCTOR DAY

CHARLIE HOPS HIS WAY TO PEOPLES HEARTS

Charlie lovingly goes about his daily routine at the William E. Christoffersen Veteran Soldiers Home in Salt Lake City. People pet him, hug him, and feed him treats, and then Charlie hops away to his next duty station. This awardwinning animal brings love to everyone he sees, especially the veterans at the home. The odd thing is that Charlie is a red kangaroo.

Charlie started at the home in March 2015 as a baby. He shows love towards everyone he meets. It doesn't matter what kind of condition or disability someone has, Charlie treats everyone with the same tenderness. His handler, Noralyn Kahn, says Charlie's love helps bring families together as he eases the fears of children coming to visit relatives. Younger children become less afraid because they can meet with a cool kangaroo while visiting grandma or grandpa.

The residents of the veterans home love Charlie's presence as he brightens up the surroundings. He's one of about a dozen therapy animals that visit residents on a regular basis. The animals love to be held, touched and petted. However, Charlie is unique. He's the only one that hops. His soothing presence works so well that he also visits special education classes and hospice care patients.

Ms. Kahn says that Charlie lessens people's depression and makes everyone happier at the veterans home by giving veterans something warm and cuddly to focus on. All other concerns of the moment seem to melt away and disappear, which is the point of therapy animals.

When Charlie grows up and reaches puberty he will be much larger and stronger, he will then go to a ranch to live out his retirement years. The Red Cross honoured Charlie with the "Animal Hero of the Year" award for his service to veterans. Charlie was the first kangaroo to receive this honour.

Charlie's story illustrates that the love shown by animals doesn't just come from dogs and cats. Any animal can make a difference in someone's life, including in the lives of veterans who deserve to be happy in their golden years.

"THE GREEN REAPER"

Death is a natural part of life that everyone must deal with, but when the financial burdens of funeral costs and burial services mount, families are often heaped with an unnatural amount of stress after losing a loved one.

That's why one mortician in Boring, Oregon decided to make a difference—bringing her big heart and lower-cost biodegradable options to the funeral business in her small town.

Since she opened Cornerstone Funeral Services eleven years ago, Elizabeth Fournier has given hundreds of mourners affordable services, and sometimes foregone fees altogether.

"As long as the mortuary board is happy with me, and I am being ethical I tend to march to my own drum," Elizabeth told Good News Network. "If a family is truly having a hardship, I have no issue giving services away."

Elizabeth guesses she has excused over forty parents from paying any money for child burials or cremation services, and has financially assisted over 20 families with regular services. Typical funeral costs in America average around \$7,500 or more, but Elizabeth charges only \$2,000.

As well as offering steadfast affordability, Ms. Fournier cares about the environment and has earned the nickname "The Green Reaper", she creates her own biodegradable urns out of dryer lint, flour, and water which she has donated to poorer families. The urns are just one of the many ways the Green Reaper cares for Mother Earth, such as using biodegradable shrouds and wooden coffins rather than concrete, embalming fluids, or expensive caskets.


"Being an undertaker has helped me with many daily things," says Elizabeth, "from wearing my seatbelt and always telling my family that I love them, to bigger things such as knowing that I am on this earth for a greater purpose outside myself. I truly view my job as my ministry."

Elizabeth followed an unwavering interest in funeral science since her childhood at age 8 when her mother and grandparents passed away. "The funeral industry seemed like a natural

A mass communications student in college before studying to be an undertaker while working odd jobs, the now 47-year-old mother with a husband who met her at a crematorium, Ms. Fournier continues to serve the families of Oregon with her motto "Cornerstone Funeral Services: Where Compassion Guides."

"Dealing with loss is hard. I advocate for people to dialogue and have conversations and go to support groups and read on the Internet and get whatever nourishment or guidance they need to work through the loss. When someone dies, the rug really is pulled out from underneath you. You are cracked wide open. It's important to fill that crack with positivity and love" she concluded.

MT. EVEREST IS COVERED WITH OUR RUBBISH

At 8,848 meters tall, Mount Everest, also known in China as Mount Oomolangma, still did not manage to escape our debris. Fortunately, much of the waste that has accumulated on the iconic mountain will soon be making its descent. Tibet has launched a huge clean-up campaign in the high-altitude area of Mount Everest that is also the first endeavor of the kind. The aim of the campaign is to collect all the waste left on the mountain by hikers and campsites.

The cleaned campsites are at altitudes between 5,200 meters and 6,500 meters on the north side of the mountain. Heightened human activity in that area with as many as around 60,000 people visiting the north side of the mountain every year, left the so-called "Roof of the World" looking rather vandalized - covered with tin cans, plastic bags, discarded tents, and a variety of other equipment and climbing paraphernalia. The official team taking part in the project was joined by volunteers from Tibet and from abroad and in the first five days collected four tons of litter

Tibet government is now planning to install sorting, recycling, and degradation stations throughout the camping areas of the mountain. Thanks to this great step, the mountain will hopefully suffer much less from the recklessness of the climbers in the future!

Even if you haven't climbed Mount Everest (or even considered it...) you can help reduce the impact of our global trash problem. Each of us has the power to take little steps to reduce the amount of disposables, particularly plastic, that we produce. From bringing a reusable water bottle to work and always remembering to carry a cloth tote bag, you can keep hundreds of plastics out if landfills and the oceans every year.

POLICE DONATED **BLOOD TO THE VERY PERSON** WHO SHOT AT THEM

After spotting two men with backpacks trying to scale a boundary wall of a housing block around 4am, the police were informed immediately and soon, Assistant Sub-inspector Ramashray Singh,



Head Constable Rajesh Kumar and reached the spot.

The two suspects now known to be 24 year-old Nitin and his accomplice Salman managed to buy some time by climbing a wall and jumping onto the road outside, but their ploy failed and they ended up face to face with their pursuers. Finally, the suspects were cornered by the policemen and in their final bid to escape, took out their guns and opened fire.

"A bullet whizzed past my left ear and I pulled the trigger in self-defence. My colleague, ASI Ramashray, too began firing," Constable Ashok

During the shootout, nine rounds of bullets were fired by him and Ramashray Singh with their service revolvers, severely injuring Nitin in one of his legs, both arms and lower back. However, it was that lone bullet lodged into his back that did the maximum damage and put an end to the firing. His accomplice, in the meantime, had managed to escape. The three Policemen rushed him to the nearest hospital, where he was taken into surgery to remove the bullets.

SS Rathee, the station house officer of Prashant Vihar police station, who was present at the Ambedkar hospital where Nitin was taken into surgery, was told by doctors Nitin would survive but required three or four units of blood, SS Rathee immediately offered to donate and upon his request

both Raiesh Kumar and Constable Ashok. without thinking twice, gave blood. "Firing at the criminal at the time of shootout was my duty as a policeman. At the hospital, I was performing my humanitarian duty," Constable Ashok said following the incident.

Despite receiving the 4 units of blood, Nitin, a native of Kasganj district in Uttar Pradesh, about whom the doctors had initially shown hope for survival, could not make it and succumbed after a long surgery.

FACIAL RECOGNITION HELPED PARENTS FIND SON 27 YEARS AFTER ABDUCTION

Some experts believe that as many as 70,000 Chinese children — mostly boys — are kidnapped every year. The Chinese government puts the estimate closer to 10,000 and the United States government estimates 20.000. These children are usually sold to foster parents or people who use them for slave labour or prostitution.

When Fu Gui was six, he was abducted on his

way home from school in Chongging, China. He was then trafficked to Quznahou, about 1,000 miles away, where he was sold to foster parents. Now, 27 years after he was taken from his family. he has been reunited with them. And it's all thanks to the latest cross-age facial recognition technology from Chinese tech giant Baidu.

In 2009, nearly two decades after Gui was kidnapped after school, he uploaded the earliest photo he had of himself, taken when he was 10, adding it to the database of tens of thousands of images. In January of this year, Gui's father uploaded a photo of Gui when he was 4.

Baidu arranged a meeting between Gui and his biological family, but Gui was suddenly hospitalized. Instead their first reunion took place over video conference on April 8. Gui's birth mother was overcome with emotion when she saw her son's adult face on a phone screen. The family later visited him at the hospital.

PEOPLE AN ASSAM **ARE** VILLAGE USING UMBRELLAS TO FIND THEIR WAY IN THE DARK

Like many parts of rural India, the state of roads and power supply in the villages of Assam are not very promising. After sunset, there are very rare occasions when there actually is a steady supply of power. "One major worry for the people in my village is to get back home safely before it is twilight", 21 year old Dhrubajyoti Kakati says So he has put together an umbrella with a 4-inch solar plate that can fuel a battery of 6-volt capacity and it also charges mobile phones. The solar plate on the outside top of the umbrella can charge the battery, even on days with low sunlight and the battery can also be charged by electricity. This entire assembly that is attached to the handle of the umbrella weighs about 300 gm and can light up a torch with a LED bulb. The device, embedded in a box, is equipped

with an LED torch that can be detached from the umbrella's handle and also used as a flashlight. Mr. Dhruba has previously invented a multipurpose crutch for the physically challenged that is equipped with a seat and a small table that is lightweight and easy to use, a seed driller, that is perfectly suited for small-scale farmers which helps with furrow making and covering as

well as setting seed, a pedal-operated grinder, a concrete mixer and a brick-making machine etc. all of which are easy to operate.






