A Killarney couple who are celebrating 50 years of wedded bliss were joined by their newly married son and his bride for a blessing at St.



We just can't wait.... Killarney will be celebrating American Independence Day as the town hosts its second Killarney 4th of July Celebrations - a day early ."The Big Parade "will take place on Friday evening the 3rd of July..... could only happen in Killarney.

The Big Parade on Friday evening kicks off what will be an action packed weekend of Fun, Frolics and Football not to mention the awe inspiring Ring Of Kerry Charity Cycle on Saturday 4th of July.

Following the huge success of Killarney 4th of July Celebrations last year this year's offering is shaping up to be even bigger, better, and more colourful than last year.

This daylong celebration of America's Independence is again being organised by a subcommittee of Killarney Chamber of Tourism & Commerce under the stewardship of Diarmuid Leen and supported by Kerry County Council, Failte Ireland, IPB Insurance, O'Donoghue Ring Hotel Group, Heineken Ireland, and The Henggeler – Moriarty Family.

Down town Killarney will be transformed into Main Street USA and the town will come alive with street entertainment throughout the day. Watch out for The Wild West Troupe as they roam the town shooting up the place looking for an easy target or Bank to raid. Brass bands and cancan girls will perform on the streets and if you are feeling peckish don't forget the celebration charity BBQ at 2pm at Scott's Hotel Scott's Street kindly sponsored by the Henggeler-Moriarty Family in aid of Kerry Cancer Support Group.

The Big Parade will commence at 8.30pm and will follow the same route as last year, so make sure you take up your vantage point along Main Street or New Street for the best view. As last year

The Big Parade will wind its way into the Beech Road Car Park where revellers will be treated to a fantastic evening of American Swing Music with "The Swing Cats". No 4th of July Celebration even if it is on the 3rd of July would be complete without a spectacular fireworks display which will round off the evening and light up the night sky over Killarney.

All of this of course coupled with the fact that this will be the evening prior to the fantastic Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle will ensure that the town centre will be a hive of excitement, activity and fun for all the family.

Business owners are encouraged to participate in the celebration and decorate their premises accordingly; to this end USA flags are available for purchase from Kate O' Leary at The Laurels Public House Killarney.

On the 4th of July celebrations this year will come to a close with the 7 am "Dawn Chorus" of the Star – Spangled Banner performed by a chorus drawn together from local choirs specially for the event, and the ceremonial hoisting of the USA flag over the Town Hall. SCHOOLS TO DELIVER SAFETY MESSAGE

Schools in the county have been asked by the Health and Safety Authority this week to help in the prevention of farm accidents involving children.

The Authority has written to all primary school principals asking them to make the last message they give to children before the summer break a farm safety message. Farm accidents have claimed the lives of 23 children in the last decade and farms remain the only workplace where children still continue to die. Recent weeks have seen the death toll rise again in what is always a horrific tragedy for families and heart-breaking for their communities. Summer holidays are a high risk time for children who are off school and spend a lot of time on their family farm or visiting friends' and relatives' farms.

Chief Executive of the Health and Safety Authority, Martin O'Halloran said, "We are calling on schools to join us in a national effort, to prevent children from being seriously injured or dying in a farm accident this summer. I am asking every teacher to spend 30 minutes communicating key farm safety messages to children. Summer is a very busy time for farmers when much work needs to be done. Farmers need to be prepared for the presence of children during the holidays."

The top risks to children on farms in the summer period are: tractors, machinery and other farm vehicles; travelling on farm vehicles; playing where there is work activity on the farm; unsupervised access to farm animals; playing near slurry pits or being around slurry agitation activity.

"At the June meeting of the council Councillor Michael Gleeson asked that every effort would be made to ensure that forestry owners would ensure that trees on their property growing close to

roadways would be made safe.

The Council replied that under Section 70 of the Roads Act there is a statutory obligation on all landowners to take all reasonable steps to ensure trees growing on their property are not a hazard or a potential hazard to users of public roadways.

It is the objective of the County Development Plan to ensure that afforestation is not located in a manner that would adversely impact on the maintenance of the public roads or on users of those roads. However only large plantations require planning permission. Smaller plantations are exempt from planning and therefore the council cannot enforce specific conditions prior to planting.

Councillor Gleeson stated that he is greatly concerned for the welfare of road users at a number of locations due to the tall trees swaying precariously over the roadways. He asked the Council to be proactive in seeking to ensure that forestry owners maintain their trees as safely as possible and that it would lead by example and refrain from the roadside planting of trees that grown more than 3 or 4 metres in height.

HALF OF YOUNG IRISH MAY HAVE MENTAL DISORDER

More than half of young people could have a mental health disorder before the age of 25 according to a new study.

The conditions are mostly mood disorders, anxiety, abnormal eating habits and alcohol abuse, said the research published in the "Irish Journal of Psychological Medicine"

The study involve a large representative sample of young people from schools in North County Dublin, across the whole economic divide, interviewing them at age 12-15 and following them up when they were 19-24 years old.

The research found 28.4pc had mood disorders, 27.1pc suffered anxiety, and 22.7pc had substance abuse disorders. One in four had more than one problem.

Personality disorders were found in 2.3pc while lifetime prevalence of binge-drinking was 75pc and cannabis use 65pc. The results underline the importance of early intervention in order to give young people the best chance to get on with having full, productive and normal lives, said the College of Psychiatrists in Ireland.

Other research shows that family is central to the young person's mental health.

The majority of mental illness begins in childhood and adolescence. What the research highlights is that young people do not seem to cope with modern life. Most young people now are just learning virtual relationships on screens, and are not learning relationships with their own self. They live in the reality of other people on screens, and then they do not appear to be able to cope with their own reality.

This is having serious consequences for our young people, and I am not being paranoid when I predict that we have a tidal wave of Mental Health issues for young people coming in the next ten years.

The sad reality is that we do not have the

mental health services to cope with this rising tide. There is hope however, and hope lies in the family. If we can just educate parents and society just to live life more consciously, family can play a very important role in helping our young people. In my programme "Manage Your Life by Managing Your Mind" the great feedback the people come back with is their "wonder" at how simple it is to be well if we have the right tools. We do need to learn to sit back and take a breath as a society, because all the signs and research are now telling us, that we are on a fast track to poor physical and mental Health Tsunami if left unchecked.



KILLARNEY ATHLETIC'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY

As Killarney Athletic Soccer Club prepare to celebrate their 50th anniversary, Killarney Outlook will feature highlights of the autobiographical account of the formation of the club by founder Dan Harrington. Dan was a member of the Garda Siochana and served in Killarney from 1965 to 1969,

THE FIRST DAYS OF THE CLUB — 1965

In September 1964 I joined the Garda, trained at Templemore and in January 1965 on the completion of training I was posted as a Garda to Killarney; my 19th birthday had just passed. My duties in those early days of my career included foot patrol in Killarney Town Centre. It was one afternoon in the spring of 1965 that I was patrolling High Street when I saw a group of youths playing soccer in the public car park known locally as the 'Sand Pit Car Park', now the High St Car Park. I walked into the car park and the immediate reaction from the youths was to start running away. Three of four stayed behind, Donagh Gleeson being one. They told me

that they were schoolboys from St Brendan's College. And that they "were going to run away too because when anyone in authority or from the GAA sees us playing soccer they tell us off in no uncertain manner".

I told them that I was a soccer player myself and that the following day I would be finished my morning shift at 2pm and that I would come and join in with them for a kick around. This I did and I cannot remember whether I played for the The Oranges or The Bananas but I do remember that Donagh Gleeson, Kieran O'Brien, Tom 'Sossy' Mullins, possibly Don O'Donoghue and others were there. My apologies for the exclusion of names. I recall also, at other times when I was on patrol in the town and the boys were on their way home from school, informal meetings and chats about a soccer club took place at the Market Cross.

Later on that year more formal meetings took place in the town hall in a room given free of charge and it was at these meetings, particularly in the winter of 1965/66 that the plans for the future took place. It was mainly younger players who attended but were also joined by some slightly older boys such as Sean O'Donoghue, John Sparling and 'Big' Jim O' Sullivan. The large Hilliard's shop on Main Street allowed us to advertise in their shop window – mainly about meetings and get-togethers.

As the weeks progressed through the spring and summer of 1965, MrO'Brien, a builder and father of Kieraney (one of the youths) gave us permission to train and play on a patch of land that he owned next to the St Finan's Hospital wall and at the back entrance of the GAA ground (now Torc Terrace). I remember that scaffolding poles were used as goalposts. However, the strip of land was too narrow for a full size pitch. Nonetheless, we were delighted and grateful for his kind offer and it was here that the players in the U16/minor teams were trained and developed.

The 50th anniversary history celebration of the club of course is not all about the foundation of the club back then but also very much about the people, teams and events that have happened within the club in 6 different decades since. From traffic to tractors - help with the big issues affecting you on the road Continued from last week ...

TRACTORS

Tractor drivers often have sound-proofed cabs or wear ear protectors, so they may not hear approaching cars. Tractors don't have to be fitted with brake or indicator lights unless used at night so in daylight be prepared for them to stop or turn without warning.

OUR COUNTRY ROAD CODE

Keep plenty of distance behind a tractor, in case it stops suddenly - remember the 2-second rule

A tractor may be longer than it appears there may be a loader on the front. Make sure you have plenty of room to get past before overtaking

Slow down if you come across a spillage - a bale of straw hit at speed will cause considerable damage to your car

Don't park in a gateway or passing place they are farmers' field access points Drive carefully after rain - dry mud can turn roads into a skidpan after a downpour

GLARE

Sun glare causes many accidents, particularly under clear skies at dawn or dusk. Keep a clean and unscratched pair of sunglasses handy

RSA & GARDAI TARGET NEW CAMPAIGN AT CYCLISTS & HGV DRIVERS TO HIGHLIGHT 'BLIND SPOTS' ON TRUCKS

IF YOU CAN'T SEE THE DRIVER, THE **DRIVER CAN'T SEE YOU!**

54 Vulnerable Road Users killed in urban areas following collision with trucks

TO MARK BIKE WEEK 13TH - 21ST JUNE, the Road Safety Authority and An Garda Síochána, this week launched a new campaign, targeting cyclists and truck drivers. The aim of the campaign is to highlight the existence of the 'Blind Spots' around trucks.

Due to their size and design, a truck has significant blind spots that present a danger to vulnerable road users. A driver's field of vision, within a cab, is limited; the area immediately in front, behind and to the left of the vehicle is often hidden from view and cyclists and pedestrians are at an increased risk of being struck.

In Ireland's urban areas, between 2007 and May 2015, 54 Vulnerable Road Users (cyclists, pedestrians and motorcyclists) were killed in collisions involving trucks. involving trucks accounted for 20% of urban VRU fatalities.

Commenting on the new campaign Mr Paschal Donohoe TD, Minister for Transport Tourism and Sport said, "A blind spot is an area around a vehicle not visible to the driver and there are many on a truck which pose added risks for both cyclists and pedestrians. Sadly, this issue has directly led to a number of fatal and serious injury collisions. Ireland has taken progressive steps to improve the indirect vision of a truck driver by requiring the fitment of additional mirrors on the cab since 2010 which has halved the number of deaths linked to the blind spot issue. However, it hasn't eliminated casualties, therefore I really welcome this new campaign. which will help to raise greater awareness of the issue among cyclists and truck drivers."

According to Ms Moyagh Murdock, Chief Executive, Road Safety Authority, the message is simple, "If you cannot see the driver, the driver cannot see you. Cyclists need to be aware of the existence of the 'Danger Zone' on trucks and should never ride along the kerb side of a truck, especially if it's turning left. Truck drivers too need to be aware of the fact that the mirrors on their cab will not always give them a total view of any cyclists that may be riding alongside or behind the vehicle. So drivers should lookout for cyclists at junctions and especially when turning left."

Ms. Murdock also took the opportunity to highlight the danger of the blind spot on trucks for pedestrians, particularly older pedestrians. "Collison investigations have shown that pedestrians crossing the road in slow moving urban traffic too close to the area immediately in front of a truck, which is normally hidden from the driver's view, may well have been a significant contributory factor in the deaths of older pedestrians. Pedestrians, especially older people, are therefore advised never to cross the road in

front of large vehicles."

Chief Superintendent Mark Curran, Garda National Traffic Bureau (GNTB) said, "This is a very worthwhile campaign and An Garda Síochána fully supports any initiative that makes it safer for our most vulnerable road users. Cycling in particular is a very safe activity, a popular mode of transport and a great way to keep fit...but we all must realise the dangers that are out there, especially when in close proximity to large vehicles at junctions and when turning left. This new video released today really shows the difficulties that drivers of large vehicles face and as said already if you can't see the driver, the driver cannot see you."

While (Class VI) 'Cyclops' mirrors are now required on the front of all larger trucks to help eliminate this problem, Ms Murdock reminded drivers that they needed to be positioned correctly or they wouldn't be able to detect pedestrians or cyclists in the space immediately in front of the cab.

To mark Bike Week 13th - 21st June the RSA has developed a new 30 second video to highlight the danger of the blind spot on trucks. The video is aimed at both cyclists and goods vehicle drivers and will be deployed online and promoted on social media. In addition the RSA will be screening its 60 second cycling safety TV advert, running 20 second cut downs of the ad through Video on Demand (VOD) and promoting its four Rules of the Road for Cyclists videos online.

Tipperary put it up to the Kingdom for long spells of this keenly contested Munster SFC semi-final clash. They had more than their share of chances, and Kerry were very lucky not to concede a third goal when Brendan Kealy pulled off a magnificent save in the 57th minute to thwart their challenge.

Down referee, Ciaran Brannigan issued six yellow cards during the course of the game, four to Kerry and two to the home side.

Tipp's finishing too left them down at times, they had 13 wides over the course of the game. compared to Kerry's five.

The Premier County had 1-1 on the scoreboard inside the opening three minutes, the goal coming from full-forward Michael Quinlivan, who scored a brace, while the point came from the boot of Under 21 footballer of the year, Colin O'Riordan, who was an injury doubt prior to the game.

Kerry, with Anthony Maher and Bryan Sheehan getting a grip at midfield and Colm Cooper playing on the forty in his first championship game since the 2013 All-Ireland semi-final against Dublin, got to grips with the situation and Sheehan settled the nerves of the travelling support with a much-needed point.

The Gooch was back to his brilliant best, providing scores for his colleagues as well as executing three superb scores, one a free.

Then in the 17th minute Kerry took the lead for the first time when Barry John Keane goaled following a flowing move involving Colm Cooper

Tipp finished strongly and points from substitutes Kevin O'Halloran and Barry Grogan put a better gloss on the scoreboard for them.



ROWING TO RIO

The calls "tap down, outside hand, inside

hand, hips through, rhythm, anticipate the pick-up, move with the boat are ringing in my head.

Over the past week, Leonora and I received a lot of technical input and the changes, which are now evident in paddling, are slowly filtering through into our race pace. The boat feels much more balanced while rhythm is much more attacking. At the weekend, we did some high rate pieces designed to recruit the deeper muscle fibres, the pieces ranged from some short powerful bursts and lengthened with time where rate and rhythm at pace were key, it meant that the longest race pieces were left to the end when we were both fatigued and we had to really challenge ourselves to deliver fast speeds. Overall, we did 12 pieces incorporated within 18km of rowing. During outings like this one, you really learn about yourself, your partner and your limits. About the latter, you often exceed them; you push harder, further and create new limits, which in time become targets. It is all about the self-improvement. Sometimes it may take longer to improve on things like those that physiology but some changes are observed quite quickly, which act as motivators to train harder.

Leonora and I have a number of testing pieces over the coming days, which will be closely monitored. I hope to see an improvement especially at the start and the end of the racing piece. The aim is to get off the blocks first and have enough left in the tank to wind at the finish, increase the rate and the boat speed.

This weekend lalso managed to get home for a day and enjoy some quality time with my family as well as to call to Killorglin Rowing Club, see some racing at Cahersiveen Regatta and have a sleep in until 7:30am, which still feels like a treat. I treasure the time spent at home, as it takes me away from my work environment, which is the National Rowing Centre and Cork. Also, I was on a voting campaign as I entered the Nissan Generation Next competition and I have a chance of winning a Nissan car for a year. This time however, I cannot line up on the start line and race for it; it is in your hands! You are competing on my behalf by voting with your e-mail every day (one vote every 24hours) until sixth of July. Voting can be done

Tommys Farming Week

The news that a case of BSE was discovered in County Louth was greeted with dismay, it was inevitable that first reactions would be very negative, both within and outside the farming community. Memories of the dramatic fallout from the original outbreak are still fresh, people thought it could finally be consigned to history but it is a tough customer. Ireland has been bouncing along the bottom in relation to new cases now for some years, only ten cases in total in the last six, no one last year. Recognition of that fact, within the food industry came only a week before, now we must assume that will be up for review We may never know the cause of this particular infection, the suggestion that residual contamination of a feed bin was a possible source sounds farfetched but this prion is extraordinary. The procedure of destroying surgical equipment following operations on CJD patients tells its own story, it is not to be trifled with. Will it remove access to our recently regained markets, we can only hope not, it would be a very harsh decision but politicians do strange things when public perception demands

There was a story in the Sunday Times this week that got me smiling, it seems that bees are not

dying out half as fast as recent articles tell us they are. The urban jungles of Ireland are being overrun by swarms of bees. We have been told that bees are disappearing from Europe, the Americans have been told that bees are disappearing from America, the Canadians are being told likewise, somebody obviously forgot to tell the bees. Since the recession, according to the Federation of Irish Beekeepers, the number of keepers on their books have doubled, many more have taken up the hobby without membership. The result, new colonies of bees on the streets in search of new homes. I had to see if this phenomenon was true only in Ireland, what I found left me confused but not surprised. The Food and Agricultural Organisation of the United Nations publish all sorts of facts and figures, obviously our illustrious journalists reporting on the Green spawned "Beepocalypse" don't look at them. There are more than TEN MILLION extra beehives in the world now than there were a decade ago. Numbers are up in North America (300,000 extra) and Europe (500,000 extra). So what, you might ask, well one of the most successful campaigns run by the green movement in recent times led to the banning of a relatively new type of pesticide called neonicotinoids. The entire premise was that this pesticide was leading to significant reductions in the honey and wild bee populations. The benefit of the product, according to the manufacturers, was its incorporation into the seed, no need to spray the crop, therefore no harm to farmers, locals or innocent insects,including bees. The only victim was the attacker of the seed, a win win situation. Sounds plausible. Not so said the environmentalists, bee populations are being decimated. Politicians follow votes, the invoked.

precautionary principle neonicotinoids are banned, farmers go back to indiscriminate spraying. Someone is not telling the truth, I wonder who?.



NEW CHARTER SETS CLEAR OBJECTIVES THAT UNDERPIN RIGHTS OF FARM FAMILIES

Following the conclusion of protracted negotiations, IFA President Eddie Downey said the Association had secured significant improvements in the new Charter of Farmers' Rights.

Eddie Downey said, "Specifically, in the areas of payment targets, inspection protocols and appeals, the new Charter has set out clear objectives that will underpin the rights of farmers".

He said the IFA negotiating team led by Deputy President Tim O'Leary had a clear focus to ensure that CAP and other payments were made as early as possible, with no unnecessary delays.

"The inspection regime had become a real bone of contention between the Department and farmers. The new Charter will go some way towards delivering fairness and respect for farm families, both on inspections and appeals."

Eddie Downey said the Minister now has a responsibility to ensure that all farm families are advised of their rights, and that Department officials deliver on the commitments in the Charter of Rights and ensure the new standards are fully implemented.

BEEF CALF BIRTHS 2% HIGHER THIS YEAR

Over 649,000 beef calves have been born so far this year, according to latest figures from the ICBF.

Beef calf births are up some 15,441 head or 2% on figures over the same period in 2014.

According to a recent report by AIB one third of beef farmers in Ireland intend to increase the number of suckler cows on their farms.

Half (48%) of beef farmers in Leinster are planning to increase the number of suckler cows they have, compared to three out of 10 farmers in the rest of the country, the survey found.

Some 26% of farmers aged over 60 years of age intend to increase their suckler herd and also half (49%) of farmers aged under the age of 45 intend to do so, the AIB survey found.

7 GOLDEN RULES FOR A SAFE BARBECUE

- 1. Keep perishable foods like salads, coleslaw and quiche in your fridge until you are about to serve them.
- 2. Burgers, sausages and kebabs, pork and poultry must be cooked all the way through but steaks or whole meat joints of beef or lamb can be served 'rare' as harmful bacteria are on the outside only (and not in the centre).
- 3. If you like to marinate meat, make sure any marinade used on raw meat is not then used as a sauce to coat vegetables or cooked meat as it will contain raw meat bacteria.
- 4. If you barbeque any frozen food, it must be completely thawed on the bottom shelf of your fridge before you cook it.
- 5. When handling raw meat and poultry, wash

your hands thoroughly and frequently, and most importantly before going on to prepare salads and other ready to eat foods.

6. Once your meat is cooked thoroughly (piping hot, no pink meat and the juices run clear), make sure to keep cooked meat separate from raw meat and use separate chopping boards, cooking utensils and plates. Harmful bacteria in raw meat, poultry and their juices can crosscontaminate cooked food and lead to food poisoning.

7. If there are BBQ leftovers, allow the food to cool before refrigerating, however make sure to refrigerate food within two hours of cooking. And always remember that with any leftovers if in doubt, throw it out.

Citizens Information

Know Your Rights: UK CITIZENS AND MOVING TO LIVE IN IRELAND

JUNE 2015

OUESTION

I am a UK citizen and I am thinking of moving to Ireland. Are there any restrictions on taking up residence?

ANSWER

Citizens of the United Kingdom (UK) are entitled to live in Ireland without any conditions or restrictions. Unlike the citizens of other countries, they are not subject to the Aliens Act 1935 or to any orders made under it. This means that you, as a UK citizen, do not need a visa, any form of residence permit or employment permit to live in Ireland.

In general, while living in Ireland, UK citizens are entitled to avail of public services on the same basis as Irish citizens living in Ireland. For example, UK citizens who are resident in Ireland are entitled to health services in the same way as Irish citizens who are resident. UK citizens resident in Ireland whose income is from a UK source and who do not have any income from Ireland may be entitled to a medical card regardless of their means.

Unlike other EU citizens, UK citizens may retire to Ireland without having to establish that they have sufficient resources or that they have private health insurance. UK citizens living in Ireland are eligible for social welfare payments in the same way as Irish citizens living in Ireland. However you need to meet the requirements of the habitual residence condition (in the same way as Irish citizens living in Ireland) to qualify for many meanstested social welfare payments. If you have recently moved to Ireland, you may find it more difficult to establish that your main centre of interest is in Ireland.

UK citizens living in Ireland are entitled to vote in Irish elections, with the exception of Presidential elections and referendums.

The UK government has published a short guide on gov.co.uk for UK citizens who are living in Ireland and travelling to Ireland.

SEX EDUCATION & PARENTS

For parents, the whole area of 'sex education' can feel like a minefield. How do you bring it up? What do you bring up? What do they need to know? How much do they need to know? Considering that most parents' own experience of sex education may have been either sparse or non-existent, the whole area can be a bit over-whelming.

Quite often we approach the area of 'sex education' as something to get done (and over with!!). Have you ever asked your friends 'Did you give him the talk yet?' Have you ever breathed a sigh of relief when you have received a note from the school asking for your permission for your child to attend an RSE (Relationships and Sexuality Education) talk! If only it were that simple. We now know that RSE needs to encompass so much more than just biology and facts. This is vital as our young people are bombarded with messages from media - TV, movies and social media. In fact we now know that for many young people the internet has become the 'default sex educator'.

Our approach to RSE therefore needs to counteract and challenge these influences. Our experience at SouthWest Counselling in delivering workshops in secondary schools is of having to correct misunderstandings and re-educate young people. Often we hear that young people would like parents to be able to talk to them about relationships and sex however our experience is that many parents baulk at the idea of it ..'Oh God that is embarrassing' they say or 'sure they don't have a clue'. This is why the ideal scenario is for schools and parents to work together to support and educate our children.

So where does the parent begin - remember don't let the phrase 'you don't have a clue' put you off. First of all – have faith in your ability to influence your child. You are doing it already. Sex education is happening continuously in the home where your messages and values are absorbed by your children. They learn through our relationships where respect and empathy are valued, through touch and behaviour, and through messages spoken and unspoken.

SUGGESTION FOR THE WEEK: Take time to link with your teenager and look for 'teachable' moments. So for example take time to watch a TV programme with them. Maybe you could make a comment on something you are seeing – the story lines in Home and Away should give you a lot of cues - e.g saying 'I'm not sure that was a respectful or healthy way to deal with a relationship problem'.

From our work with young people, it appears more and more young people are viewing pornography at an earlier age. The average age globally that a young person first views pornography on the internet is 11 years - 'but here in County Kerry that can't be the case. can it? We will discuss this in more detail next week and how to address the topic of pornography with young people

POLYCYSTIC OVARY SYNDROME 2

DIAGNOSIS/ TESTS REQUIRED: Tests may be advised to clarify the diagnosis, and to rule out other hormone conditions.

• Blood tests may be taken to measure certain chemicals (hormones). For example, a test to measure the male hormone testosterone and luteinising hormone (LH) which tend to be high in women with PCOS. • An ultrasound scan of the ovaries may be advised. The scan can

detect the typical appearance of PCOS with the many small cysts

(follicles) in slightly enlarged ovaries

WHAT IS THE TREATMENT FOR POLYCYSTIC OVARY SYNDROME? There is no cure for PCOS. However, symptoms can be treated, and

the associated health risks can be reduced: You should aim to lose weight if you are overweight. Losing weight helps to reduce the high insulin level that occurs in PCOS. This has a knock-on effect of reducing the male chemical (hormone) called testosterone. This then improves the chance of your ovulating and so can help with period and fertility problems and may also help to reduce hair growth and acne. The increased risk of long-term problems such as diabetes, high blood pressure, etc are also reduced. Even a moderate amount of weight loss can help. The best foods to eat for someone with PCOS are those which are slowly absorbed keeping blood sugar levels steady. (These are referred to as low glycaemic index (low GI) foods). This means avoiding white bread, pasta and rice, and choosing wholemeal alternatives. Potatoes and sugary foods and drinks are also best avoided. Most fruit, vegetables, pulses and wholegrain foods are both healthy and have a low GI.

TREATING HAIR GROWTH: Hair growth is due to the increased level of the hormone testosterone.

• Unwanted hair can be removed by shaving, waxing, hair-removing creams, electrolysis, and laser treatments. These need repeating every now and then, although electrolysis and laser treatments may be more long-lasting (but are expensive).

• A cream called effornithine may be prescribed to rub on affected areas of skin. It can reduce unwanted hair growth, although this effect quickly wears off after stopping treatment.

• Some tablets can also treat hair growth, such as some contraceptive pills. These can also help to regulate periods and may reduce acne.

TREATING ACNE: The treatments used for acne in women with PCOS are no different to the usual treatments for acne.

TREATING PERIOD PROBLEMS: Some women who have no periods, or have infrequent periods, do not want any treatment for this. However there is a slight increased risk of cancer of the uterus (womb) if you do not have any periods over a prolonged duration. For this reason some women with PCOS are advised to take the contraceptive pill, as it causes regular withdrawal bleeds similar to periods. If this is not suitable, another option is to take progestogen hormone for several days every month, which will cause a monthly bleed like a period. Another option is a coil which releases small amounts of progesterone into the womb preventing a build-up of the lining.

FERTILITY ISSUES: Although fertility is often reduced, contraception is still required to be sure of not getting pregnant. The chance of becoming pregnant depends on how often ovulation occurs. Some women with PCOS ovulate now and then, others not at all. Losing weight can help to improve fertility.

METFORMIN AND OTHER INSULIN-SENSITISING MEDICINES

Metformin is a medicine that is commonly used to treat people with diabetes. It makes the body's cells more sensitive to insulin. It is sometimes used in PCOS, especially if there are fertility problems. It is usually only started by a specialist.

PREVENTING FUTURE PROBLEMS As the risk of diabetes is increased with polycystic ovaries, it may a good idea to have regular check (once/year) for diabetes, especially if obese, aged over 40 or if there is a family history of diabetes. During pregnancy women with PCOS need to be screened for gestational diabetes (diabetes of pregnancy).





EXTRA TIPS TO PREVENT FALLS IN THE HOME

- 1. Exercise, Exercise, Exercise! Exercise programs should include balance and strengthening to be effective in reducing falls risk. Balance exercises are those that challenge your balance, like standing on one foot (with a stable surface nearby for support if you need it), stepping outside your base to the sides and back, etc. Strengthening exercises involve using resistance to build muscle bulk and bones and can include use of weights, therapy bands, or your own body weight as resistance.
- 2. Check all Medications Have your doctor or pharmacist check all your medications (including prescription and over-the-counter) for possible interactions and side effects -- like drowsiness, dizziness, and cognitive "slowing" -- that can increase falls risk.
- 3. Beware of Dangers in the Home For example, remove obstacles such as throw rugs, electrical/phone cords, and clutter, so there's a clear path through every room. In the bathroom, don't use towel rails or toilet roll holders for support -- instead have grab bars properly installed by a professional or a handyman.
- 4. If you get up during the night to use the bathroom, sit for a moment or two before standing to give your blood pressure a chance to adjust to your upright position. Point and flex your feet a few times to get the blood flowing, do the same after sitting for extended periods, like at the pictures or dinner (especially in winter, when people tend to be sitting for long holiday meals), or when watching TV.
- 5. **Wear Shoes** It's important to wear shoes both inside and outside the house. Well-fitting shoes that support your feet and have low, flat, wide heels; a back; and nonslip soles are safest. Have a dedicated indoor pair if you don't like to wear outdoor shoes inside. Avoid long, loose, flowing clothing that may trip you. Have adequate lighting in each room, and easy-to-reach light switches at the entrance to

every room.

- Tack down rugs with double-sided carpet tape to make sure that rugs don't slip and that the corners sit flat.
- Have a sturdy step stool, with a bar and nonskid steps for reaching high places. Better still, move frequently used items to within reach (waist height), and regularly check and change light bulbs, or retrieve seasonal items so your parents don' have to climb up to get thinas.

5 KINDS OF DOGS WHO ARE MOST AT RISK FOR SUN DAMAGE

Of course, any dog's health can be compromised by the negative effects of the sun's rays or be at risk for cancer, so talk with your Vet about proper protection for your pet. If your dog has any of the risk factors mentioned below, you'll want to pay extra attention to protecting your pet from the sun.

- White Dogs Just as your pale friends seem to burn more easily during a beach weekend, white or light-coloured dogs have a greater risk of sun damage than their dark-furred counterparts.
- Dogs With Short Coats One function of your dog's fur is to protect her from the sun's damaging rays, and short-haired dogs simply have less of that protection.

Hairless Dogs - Hairless breeds like the Chinese Crested, Xoloitzcuintli and Peruvian Inca Orchid should wear sunscreen and not spend too much time in bright sunlight.

- Light-Nosed Dogs Does your dog have an adorable pink or light-coloured nose? Less pigment translates to a higher risk of sun damage. Even if your pup has a thick coat on most of his body, your vet may recommend applying sunscreen to the parts of his body that aren't covered in fur, like his belly and
- Sunbathers Is your canine sun goddess constantly claiming all the good sunbeams in and around your house? You may not realize how risky it really is. Dogs who like to lie in the sun on their backs are particularly prone to developing squamous cell carcinoma in the thinly haired region of the tummy.

PLEASE RECYCLE YOUR OLD MOBILE PHONES PROPERLY

Frequent upgrades offered by phone companies lead to quicker turnover of phones, even if they are not obsolete. People upgrade their phones for different reasons—they may just want the latest model, or their old phone may be broken or lost. All too often, the replaced phones are not returned for recycling and can end up in landfill, leading to a loss of valuable resources. Researchers looked at the life cycle of a mobile phone and found that in Great Britain alone, 85 million unused phones are sitting around, containing \$170 million worth of gold among their internal parts. That gold, along with other precious metals in the phones such as copper, silver, and cadmium, could be recovered and reused in new phones if the gadgets were properly recycled. But a lot of the old phones are thrown into the rubbish, with all that gold and other precious metals, leading to more mining to supply those crucial materials. Mobile phones and other e-waste also contain toxic materials that can create hazardous waste problems in landfills not built to handle these substances. Every year Americans dump phones filled with \$60 million worth of gold and silver. In Britain

four tons of gold are sitting in the country's estimated 85 million unused phones. For every 1 million mobile phones that are recycled, 35,274 pounds of copper, 772 pounds of silver, 75 pounds of gold, and 33 pounds of palladium can be recovered.

GROW NATURAL AIR **FRESHENERS**

Plants are the air fresheners of nature; they produce oxygen and also remove toxins and particulate matter from the air. Your garden isn't the only place you can grow these plants, and you won't believe the difference a lavender, a thyme, or a mint in your living room can make. Stroke or gently brush the leaves to release their fragrance into the room.

LIBRARY FOR CAT LOVERS DOESN'T HAVE A SINGLE **BOOK**

There's a library in Las Cruces, New Mexico, that doesn't have a single book, but those who frequent it say it's full of potential love stories. Right now, this very special library is occupied by kittens looking for forever homes, and judging by the library's success, it won't be long until these kitties are adopted.

The building's receptionist, Becky Garcia, doubles as the kitten librarian, and she watches over the adorable balls of fur and makes sure the "shelves" of the kitty condo stay stocked. The cat library has been in existence for about three years and the kittens come from the Animal Service Centre of the Mesilla Valley. "Most animal shelters are out of the way outside of towns, so you have to really be thinking of adopting an animal to take the trouble to go over there," Tiffany Tillison, a government employee said. "But with this programme, hundreds of people come through our lobby every day, so they can't miss seeing them." Exposing employees and visitors to a daily dose of cute was all part of the county's plan. Officials knew that if people spent a few minutes cuddling a kitten in need of a home, the odds were good that people would find a way to provide one. And they were right. So far more than 100 kittens have been adopted from the library.

ENJOY YOUR TEA WHILE YOU STILL CAN

Tea is one of the world's most popular beverages, with rich roots in both India and China — and whether you take it plain, sugared, milky or with lemon, you might not be taking it at all pretty soon, thanks to climate change. The world's tea crop is facing significant risks due to increasing temperatures in the zones of the world where it's grown. This could create a ripple effect throughout communities, because in tea-producing regions, it's a keystone crop for subsistence farmers, labourers and a network of people involved in the growth


and production of tea products. The troubles with tea illustrate a microcosm of how global warming is changing the face of the planet. The conditions under which tea is grown are extremely precise. Farmers work with

bushes that can grow for sixty or more years, meticulously cultivating them and exercising extreme care when they harvest to select the best leaves and promote healthy, even growth. They baby their plants because they represent a serious investment: Planting, growing and maintaining tea bushes is expensive, and they don't take well to being transplanted. In other words, once they're established, they're there to stay. Unfortunately, tea plants are also extremely sensitive to growing temperatures. When it comes to minor temperature variations, this can affect the phytochemicals in the leaves that dictate flavor — which can be a good thing, leading to a diversity of teas as the leaves are further processed after harvesting. But when it comes to big ones, tea plants may start to develop bitter, acrid, flavourless leaves, and ultimately, the plants can die. There's only a narrow zone of altitudes and temperatures at which tea can be produced commercially. Tea cultivation involves the work of hundreds of people on each plantation. In addition to the owners, a horde of workers swarm over the bushes during harvest season, and once leaves are harvested, they need to be carefully processed: Dried, roasted as appropriate, fermented, and otherwise handled to develop teas with different flavours. These can include delicate white teas, earthy green teas, and much, much more. All of these individuals rely on tea for their livelihood, as does the surrounding community. Lose the tea plantation — or start earning less due to degrading quality — and quality of life can drop for an entire village.

SWITZERLAND HAS DIRECT DEMOCRACY

In Switzerland citizens elect a new Parliament every four years, and the Parliament chooses a group of seven councillors from different parties. They are the head of state. The presidency (a mostly symbolic role) rotates among the members every year. But the keystone of Swiss democracy is the regular use of referendums, in which citizens vote on everything from their town's new sports centre to the country's immigration policy.

Referendums give citizens year-round political leverage. Voting is easy, with no need to register, every citizen receives a ballot for each vote, which can be returned by mail. Electoral turnover varies widely depending on the issue but, on average, it's about 46%. And decisions aren't final. If a law has already been passed, people can still overturn it by getting 50,000 signatures in 100 days. The bill then has to be voted on by the public. Swiss citizens can also suggest their own laws by "popular initiative." If 100,000 people ask for a change in the constitution, the Parliament is obligated to discuss it and submit the proposal to a popular vote. This system has been working for them since 1848.

The lack, in this country and in our world today, of proper instruction and understanding of God's Word in the political, religious and business world is the cause of so much failure and so much evil and so much fear. Because of this lack of understanding of God's Word the population follow their own instincts and understanding which do not line up with God's Word. 'Trust in the Lord in all your heart, lean not on your own understanding in all your ways acknowledge Him and He will make your path straight' (Proverbs 3:5-7). 
