With the world literally at his feet a young Killarney athlete is set for international stardom.

20 year old David Kenny from Ballyhar is set to become one of Ireland's top athletes according to his coach and mentor Rob Heffernan.

The CIT student's sporting discipline is Race Walking and last weekend he competed in the European U23 Championships in Galve in Sweden.

Following a very competitive and fast pace race David finished in a fantastic 9th place in a new personal best time of 1.25.43 which is a very high standard for a 20 year old.

"I was delighted with the way the race went and I hope to be in the medals in two years time in this competition which will be held in Bergen in Norway", David told the Killarney Outlook.

World Champion Race Walker Rob Heffernan is David's coach and sees huge potential in the young athlete. "David is fantastic young man - not only is he training, he attends college and also works part time" Rob told the Killarney Outlook. "David is competing against full time athletes and is constantly breaking his personal best - he certainly is one to watch in the future", Rob added.

David has a long list of accomplishments to his name, at the National Athletics Ireland 20km race walking Championships in June, David finished in 2nd place in a time of 1.25.58 and has the distinction of being the fastest 20 yr old over the 20km distance in Irish History.



David has competed at all levels in Countries such as Czech Republic, England, Lithuania and Isle of Mann where he has broken all personal records. He will be competing on the 28th July in Santry in the National 10km championships to close the season. An Engineering student at CIT, David trains daily under the guidance of his coach Rob Heffernan and also trains with Olympian Brendan Boyce. He has competed in the University competitions and has won both the indoor and outdoor titles.

David is the son of Noel and Mary Kenny and a member of Farranfore Maine Valley Athletic Club.

He would like to say a special thanks to Jerome Crowley and to club mate Michael O' Connor who introduced David to race walking many years ago and created the foundation and belief for his success.

Killarney Parkrun has a new home in the grounds f Killarney House with the first event taking place tomorrow, Saturday, July 20th at 9.30am.

The Parkruns originally took place in Muckross house and gardens to the grounds of Killarney House. The first event in Killarney house will be on Saturday 20th July at 09:30. Parkruns are free, weekly, timed events across the world, organised by local volunteers. Everyone is welcome at parkrun - whether you walk, jog, run or volunteer. Register once, print off your barcode and you can take part in any parkrun event around the world every week for free! The course is three laps of Killarney House and organisers are hoping to attract hundreds to the first event at the new venue.

There are 4 entrances to Killarney house: 1) Golden gates, Haha 2) Knockreer, Demesne 3) Mission road (opposite Tesco carpark) & Ross Road and you can register: https://www.parkrun.ie/register

Killarney parkrun started on 6th June 2015. Since then 3,093 participants have completed 10,607 parkruns covering a total distance of 53,035 km, including 1,649 new Personal Bests. A total of 185 individuals have volunteered 1,470 times.

Racing and breeding industries contribute almost €65m per annum to the Kerry economy



The horse breeding and racing industries in County Kerry generate an economic return of almost €65m per annum. This is the key finding of a Regional Economic Impact Study conducted by Horse Racing Ireland and Deloitte. The study highlights the economic reach of the industry in the county - with almost 250 jobs in direct, indirect and secondary employment - and has found that County Kerry has 50 registered breeders and that over 40 horses are in training in the region. Kerry has produced a host

of leading racing figures in recent years. Cheltenham Festival winning trainer Tom Cooper is based close to Tralee and is the father of Gold Cup winning jockey Bryan Cooper. Killarney's Jim Culloty is a three-time Cheltenham Gold Cup winning jockey and trained Lord Windermere to win the race in 2014. More recently, brothers Jack and Paddy Kennedy are flying the flag for the county with their continued success in the saddle as is Oisin Murphy who is likely to be crowned champion jockey in Britain this year.

Killarney racecourse, renowned the world over as one of the most scenic racecourses, holds its tremendously popular fiveday July festival this week and the star attraction was Frankie Dettori who was riding at the track on Wednesday.

Killarney hosts a four-day meeting in August and the following month attention switches to Listowel for the seven-day Harvest Festival which begins on Sunday, September 8 and is home to one of the best attended race days of the year for the Guinness Kerry National on Friday, September 13.

Are you ready for the Ring of the Reeks Cycle Challenge





The 7th Ring of the Reeks Cycle will take place on Saturday, 27th July from Beaufort G.A.A. Club.

There will be four routes this year. Cycle 1 is a 100km Ring of the Reeks challenge route. It is a loop route of Ireland's highest mountains-the McGillycuddy Reeks and suitable for intermediate to experienced cyclists. Cycle 2 is a 60km Caragh Lake loop cycle route taking in some of the most scenic landscape in the area. There is also a 35km Ring of Beaufort and a 5km family cycle.

Start time for Ring of the Reeks will be 9am. Start time for Caragh Lake Loop and Ring of Beaufort cycles will start at 11am. The 5km cycle will start at 11.30am.

After the cycle, there will be food and refreshments at Beaufort Community Centre.

This is a Cycling Ireland approved event. All Under 16s must be accompanied by an Adult and are restricted to the 60 km route or less. Under 12s are restricted to the 5km route.

NO ROADSIDE HEDGE CUTTING DURING AUGUST

The Minister for Culture Heritage and the Gaeltacht, Josepha Madigan TD announced this week that she will not be proceeding with regulations that would have allowed general roadside hedge cutting during August this year on a trial basis.

The decision recognises the increasing threats to biodiversity nationally and globally and follows a number of Government initiatives to protect and nurture Ireland's flora and fauna.

The minister was given discretionary

powers under the Heritage Act 2018 to allow the cutting of roadside hedges during the month of August on a trial basis in 2019 and 2020.

Hedge cutting for road safety purposes will still be allowed at all times of the vear.

Minister Madigan commented, "Hedgerows are a very important wildlife habitat, providing food, shelter, corridors of movement, nest and hibernation sites for many of our native flora and fauna."



CLLR. CALLS FOR FOOD TO BE DONATED

At the July 2019 monthly meeting of Kerry County Council, Councillor Michael Gleeson proposed:

"That Kerry County Council would call on the Government to introduce legislation that would make it compulsory for all Retail Outlets to donate food that is about to reach its Best Before Date to charitable/humanitarian organisations".

Councillor Gleeson stated that the amount of perfectly good food being committed to composting is outrageous. He said that tens of thousands of tonnes of food is disposed of in this manner every year. Estimates have suggested that up to one million tonnes of perfectly edible food is so consigned annually. This squandering is a gross abuse of the fruits of the earth especially when so many are in need and hungry. There are many charitable organisations who would gladly accept this food and distribute it wisely. He acknowledged that some supermarkets at present donate this food to deserving causes and thanked them for so doing but stated that there is much room for improvement. He suggested that legislation may ultimately be the only means of ensuring that all food is wisely used. The old adage of "Wilful waste makes woeful want" is still applicable. The Motion was seconded and will now be forwarded to Government for consideration.

On Saturday 20th of July Killarney will play host to one of Ireland's premier running events when more than 3000 competitors take part in the Gleneagle Hotel Run Killarney half-marathon and 10K road race.

This sold out event will welcome all types of runners, walkers, newcomers and people who just want a challenge and a great day out. Participants will represent 15 countries from around the world including China, Brazil, Republic of Congo, Australia and UAE. For the first time ever Run Killarney will be plastic bottle free, replacing cups and bottles with compostable cups for water at the various water stations and the finish line.

As part of this year's event, organisers have teamed up again with The Sanctuary Runners to help raise awareness of their mission and to collect donations of running gear from the public and those taking part in the race.

The race routes give competitors the chance to run one of the world's most breathtaking and scenic road races through Muckross House and the Killarney National Park.

Both routes are fast downhill courses with amazing scenery. The half-marathon starts at Molls Gap and continues through the National Park to the finish line and party atmosphere at the Gleneagle Hotel.

All competitors will receive a customised t-shirt and finisher's medal and can embrace the great atmosphere at the Gleneagle hotel once they cross the finish line.

Local residents are to be aware of the road closure on the N71 Molls Gap to Muckross House Killarney from 6.30am to 11.30am on Saturday the 20th of July.

CALL FOR LYME DISEASE SIGNAGE IN KILLARNEY NATIONAL PARK

Cllr. Maura Healy Rae has called on Kerry County Council to engage with the Department to urge the National Parks and Widelife Services to erect signage in the National Park, Killarney reminding visitors to check themselves for ticks in order to prevent

Lymes Disease". "I outlined that unfortunately many of us here know someone or of someone who is suffering with Lymes disease. If any of us fail to fit into one of those categories we certainly all saw the recent RTE documentary 'Living with Lymes Disease'. It was striking to learn about how destructive this disease is physically and emotionally with many suffering from depression and suicidal thoughts", she said. I stated how incredibly proud I am of the area I represent and I recognise the work the people of Killarney put in to making it what it is. I was clear in that this wasn't a scaremongering tactic, but as Dr. Eamon Shanahan said in the documentary, it is all about 'awareness raising'. I applealed to the media to publicise the following points given the difficulty that I am having in getting the NPWS to carry out public awareness: wear light coloured trousers to see the tick easily; wear smooth materials that the tick can't attach onto; don't wear shorts; tuck trousers into socks and spray insect repellent on to wrists and ankles. Critically, in the documentary Dr Eoin Healy, Biologist, UCC said there is a period of 12 hours before ticks begin to transmit the disease, therefore, if there was adequate signage making people aware they would have sufficient time to check themselves

for a tick. I also hgihlighted that in general people in Kerry have knowledge of Lymes disease, however, it is fair to assume that many of our visitors would not.

I commended people such as Anthony Morris for his bravery in telling his story and his continuous campaigning. I also acknowledged the efforts of the children of Loreto National School who have produced tick kits and how it was incredible that children were seeking to make the public more aware than a government agency. The consequences are too serious, it is a matter of life and death. KCC have agreed to investigate the possibility of erecting signage at the entrances to the National Park. On foot of this notice of motion, a letter will be sent to the Minister for Environment, Heritage and Local Government asking that he would urge the NPWS to erect adequate signage. Furthermore, Deputy Danny Healy-Rae has put down a parliamentary question regarding this.

Container Gardening

A s gardens become smaller and apartment iving more popular, many people are growing plants in containers to decorate patios and balconies. Three of the most useful kinds of container are: Window Boxes, hanging baskets, large planters.

The style and material used in their construction should fit in with the proposed environment. Wood, reconstituted stone and terracotta are suitable for older houses but good quality plastic, fi breglass and concrete may be more suitable for modern homes.

Compost for Containers

Ordinary garden soil is unsuitable for containers and special compost, either loam-based (i.e. soil based) or loamless is needed. Loam-based compost can be bought from garden centres or made up at home. Four parts of sterilised loam can be mixed with 2 parts of peat and 1 part of sharp sand.

It is important to use a good quality loam that is rich in organic matter and not heavy and sticky like clay soil nor light and gritty like sand.

Peat based compost is light and easy to handle. Because it is light, containers are less stable and may blow over. Conversely, where weight is a problem e.g. in window boxes or roof gardens, peat is the preferred compost.

Coir or bark may be used instead of loam or peat-based composts but results tend to be more variable.

Preparation for Planting

Window Boxes

Window boxes made from softwood must be treated with a plantsafe wood preservative before planting. The box should be fixed in place on the sill before filling and planting. Secure fi xing is especially important for boxes on upstairs windows. Boxes must be at least 20 cm deep and 20 cm wide to prevent plants from drying out too quickly.

Cover drainage holes with small stones, crocks or fine mesh to prevent blockage. If weight is not a problem add a 2 cm layer of gravel as an aid to rapid drainage and partially fill with compost.



Hanging Baskets

A hanging basket can weigh over 20 kg when planted so that it is important to ensure that the supporting hook or bracket is secure. To facilitate fi lling the traditional wire basket with compost, the round bottom should be supported in a bucket or large pot. A 2 cm layer of moist sphagnum peat should be used to cover the interior of the basket.

A liner, placed in the open basket before fi lling with compost, is essential to reduce watering. Pre-formed liners are available for standard-sized baskets in a range of material including plastic, coconut fibre and bitumen paper.Waterproof liners greatly reduce the need for watering especially in summer. A small saucer can be placed at the bottom of the container to serve as a small water-holding reservoir. Compost is added to the basket during the planting operation.

Large containers

If large pots, troughs or barrels are used, these should be slightly raised above the ground using small blocks or bricks. This aids free drainage, prolongs the life of wooden containers and reduces the risk of entry of soil pests. Place a five cm layer of small stones or broken brick at the base of the container to aid drainage and top up with compost.

Plants for Containers

Window Boxes

A wide range of plants can be used including pansies (for winter colour), dwarf bulbs (for spring), annuals and perennials such as pelargonium (for summer) and dwarf shrubs (for permanent planting). Plants should be selected carefully so that they can be seen from inside the house but will not be so tall that they block out light.

Kerry ensured their incredible unbeaten home championship record which stretches back to the 1995 Munster final would survive another year when they put Mayo to the sword in no uncertain terms at Fitzgerald Stadium on Sunday afternoon.

This was easily Kerry's best performance this year as the Kingdom dominated in all fasets of play.

WORKPLACE STRESS

Whilst we can't control everything in our work environment, we're not powerless to make some changes – even in very difficult circumstances. Fear of losing our job, increased pressure to perform to meet rising expectations, staff cutbacks and increased overtime can all lead to excessive workplace stress. The way in which we deal with workplace stress and pressure is crucial. The key factor is to focus on those things that are within our control – namely ourselves. The better we are at managing our own stress, the less we will be affected negatively by other people's stress. Strategies to manage our own stress include

It is important not to ignore the warning signs of work stress as these can lead not only to less productivity and effectiveness but to physical and emotional problems. Some signs and symptoms of excessive job stress include lack of interest in work, sleeping problems, social withdrawal, headaches and muscle tension, fatigue, difficulty concentrating, feeling anxious or irritable and stomach upset. If you are experiencing any of these symptoms then it is time to take action. Taking care of you involves making more positive lifestyle choices – one step at a time.

1. Keep Active. Regular exercise is a powerful stress buster. Try to get at least 30 minutes of heart-pounding exercise at least 5 times a week. This will enhance your mood, increase your energy and relax your body and mind.

 Healthy eating is vital for dealing with stress. Eat small but frequent meals to maintain a balanced blood sugar, avoid mood swings, keep your energy up and help you to concentrate.
 Smoking can lead to higher levels of anxiety as nicotine is a very strong stimulant.

Don't drink to relieve job stress as this can lead to problems down the line.

 Aim to sleep for 7-8 hours per night as a good sleep can keep us emotionally balanced and better resourced to deal with stress.
 We've all heard how 'a problem shared is a problem halved' – so share how you are feeling with family or friends.

7. Prioritise and Organise your responsibilities. Good time management and organization can significantly reduce stress levels. Make a list of 'to-do' tasks and attend to them in order of importance – with high priority tasks first.

 Break tasks into small steps – and focus on each manageable step one at a time. This will prevent you from getting overwhelmed by taking on everything at once.

Next week we will look at further strategies to reduce Workplace Stress.

Know Your Rights:

QUESTION

I have a second property, which I would like to rent out to visitors for short stays? Are there any procedures I need to follow?

ANSWER

Yes, there are new regulations for short-term lettings that you may need to follow. These regulations came into effect on 1 July. They aim to bring properties used for short-term tourist lettings in Rent Pressure Zones (RPZs) back to the long-term rental market. The regulations cover people who let out property for short stays (less than 14 days) in RPZs, which are areas where rents are highest and rising quickly. The Residential Tenancies Board has a rent pressure zone calculator where you can check if your property is in an RPZ to see if the regulations apply to you. If your property is in an RPZ and you want to let it out on a short-term basis for the first time, you will need to get planning permission so it can be used for tourism and short-term letting purposes. If you are already renting your property on a short-term basis, you will need to apply for retention permission. You apply for planning permission to the local planning authority, who will decide on your application within eight weeks. However, it should be noted that in areas of high housing demand, where there is high rent inflation, insufficient supply and lots of applications, it is unlikely that permission will be granted.

The regulations do not apply if your property is outside an RPZ. They also do not apply if your property is a holiday home, or is used for longer-term flexible lettings, or is a normal letting used for longer stays of more than 14 days.

The Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government website has an FAQ document about the regulations, which includes further information.

BEWARE OF WATER INTOXICATION IN DOGS!

On the first anniversary of the death of their dog Max an English animal lover has issued the following warning to Dog Owners.

Just a year ago after a day filled with fun, fetch and swimming in Lake Windermere, Myself, Lucy and Tiggy had to say goodbye to our best friend Max.

He collapsed and was rushed to the nearest vets where he was diagnosed immediately with Water Intoxication and put on drips of sodium, potassium and mannitol to increase his electrolytes and relieve pressure on his brain.

After 7 hours of determination from the vets and nurses, Max was unable to pull through.

"Water Intoxication is a relatively rare but frequently fatal condition in dogs. At highest risk are dogs that enjoy playing in the water for long stretches."

We are so unbelievably devastated that a simple game of fetch in the water, something we had done a hundred times before, resulted in such a perfect day turning into our worst nightmare.

Water Intoxication was something we knew nothing about. At this time of year, so much awareness is spread about not leaving dogs in hot cars but no one ever mentions the hazardous effects of your dog ingesting too much water whilst playing.

We have had to learn the hard way and all we can do now is spread awareness of this terrible condition in the hope that other dog owners are informed.

*Water intoxication is caused by excessive water intake by the dog while playing in the water. Symptoms to look out for are loss of coordination, glazed eyes, lethargy, nausea, vomiting and excessive salivation. ... if you suspect your dog is suffering from water intoxication, they need immediate medical attention.

NEW ZEALAND'S CAPITAL CITY HELD ITS FIRST MANAAKI DAY LAST NOVEMBER

When 6-year-old Eddie Writes decided the world needed a little more kindness, he did the only thing he thought would work he wrote to his city's mayor and asked for help putting on an annual "Kindness Day" and the surprising thing was Wellington Mayor Justin Lester wrote back.

As a result on Nov. 16, New Zealand's capital city held its first Manaaki Day (manaaki being the Maori word for kindness), taking Eddie's ideas of how to encourage and celebrate charitable acts - buying toys for children that hadn't any," for example - to improve the social well-being of citizens.

"I am pleased to see a change in politics in New Zealand that I hope focuses more on listening," says Eddie's mother, the noted Kiwi writer and feminist Emily said "Kindness should be what politics is all about. When you become a politician, it shouldn't be for money or power or privilege it should be because you had a dream right from childhood that you could work with others to make our world better."

The mayor's support for the new holiday was part of a new wave of progressive, childcentred politics sweeping New Zealand, led by Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern, herself a new parent, who pledged New Zealand would be "a kind and equitable nation where children thrive, and success is measured not only by the nation's GDP but by better lives lived by its people."

This was despite the fact that the Mayor of Dublin had issued a ban on flying balloons as when they were floating over the city, work levels and production dramatically fell as the locals stared up in wonder at the flying crafts. Beaten by severe weather conditions that caused his balloon to descend into the Irish Sea, about halfway between Ireland and Wales, he was rescued by a ship that had been following his progress from below. A statue of him was erected in Ranelagh Gardens, Dublin to honour his heroics.
