

Niall himself was many times the star performer for that very U16 side and it was a testament as to just how popular he was that his fellow clubmates remember him on such an occasion. As is the norm after winning any trophy there is a feel good factor and it lifts the moral of one and all. So when the devastating news came later in the week that Niall had lost his battle with illness it had a enormous effect on all of us. Having recently been given some positive news it :

A CENTURY OF POLITICS IN THE KINGDOM LAUNCHED




A County Kerry Compendium of Politics in Kerry was launched last night by authors Owen O'Shea and Gordon Revington

Scandals, punch-ups, election-campaign shenanigans, bitter inter-dynastic inter-dynastic contests and the stories of the groundbreaking politicians from Kerry who made their mark on the national stage and beyond, feature in a new book from Kerry authors Owen O'Shea and Gordon Revington, which will be launched at Tralee Library on Thursday evening next.

Since the establishment of Dáil Éireann 100 years ago, Kerry's political history has taken many lively, colourful and compelling turns largely thanks to its wide roster of fascinating politicians, from Austin Stack to Kathleen O'Connor and John Marcus O'Sullivan to Dick Spring. Drawing on original research, newly published material from the political parties' archives and candid interviews, A Century of Politics in the Kingdom is published to coincide with the centenary of the First Dáil. Owen O'Shea and Gordon Revington mine a unique political environment. They contend with the dramatic and entertaining episodes, and with equal depth they outline the controversies and seminal debates as well as the vociferous character of Kerry's TDs, senators and political hopefuls over the past century.

From the first sitting of Dáil Éireann, when Piaras Béaslaí TD read its Democratic Programme, to Dan Kiely's Supreme Court challenge on how votes are counted in Ireland, and the role of several Kerry ministers in sensitive Anglo-Irish negotiations, Kerry politicians have been at the heart of matters nationally, both symbolic and significant. Even if, as is continually attested, they have had to shout a little louder than many of their counterparts to have their priorities heard, Kerry politicians have indelibly



influenced the

course of Irish politics and left a lasting legacy in their home county.

Remarkable tales, like the councillor who was unseated for plying voters with drink, the north Kerry woman who became a politician in Pakistan, the aristocrat who was invited to Buckingham Palace as a child and went on to become the first woman elected to Kerry County Council, the Kerry senator who received an apology from the BBC, the story of all of Kerry's female politicians, the councillor who took his own council to court, the night the gardaí were called to a meeting of a Fianna Fáil cumann in north Kerry, and the Dáil byelection candidate deselected because he wasn't popular enough, all feature.

Featuring the first ever definitive record of every Kerry Oireachtas member since 1919, A Century of Politics in the Kingdom captures the excitement and tension, the rivalries and resentments, the key debates and discussions, and the good old-fashioned fun and games that have characterised the political cauldron in the county over the last century.

The new book was aunched by former Tánaiste, Dick Spring at Tralee Library last night, Thursday 18th October, and will be will be available from the middle of this week in all good bookshops, online, and from www.merrionpress.ie, as well as the launch on Thursday (RRP €19.99)

NEW STROKE DAY SERVICE LAUNCHED

A NEW pilot Stroke Day Service, providing nursing and physiotherapy supports to people recovering from a stroke has been launched in Tralee and Listowel.

The one day a week service will deliver a six-week programme and is now open for referrals.

Led by Baile Mhuire Day Care Centre for Older Persons, Tralee and Ard Chúram Day Care Centre in Listowel, with the support of the HSE, the service will offer clients additional supports to help them through the rehabilitation process after a stroke.

Brian Carmody, himself a former stroke patient and who now runs the only voluntary stroke support service in Kerry, said: "This is the best news I have heard in a long time. I had my stroke 12 years ago and at that time once you were out of the hospital and finished with the treatment, there was no support. Now we have a service that will help stroke sufferers here in Kerry. It's vital for them and their families to have a place to go and meet fellow stroke sufferers and get expert help for all of us who have suffered a stroke. It's important to let them know that they are not alone or isolated anymore with this new Stroke Support service in Kerry."

People availing of the service will receive physiotherapy, nursing care and other allied professionals inputs, peer support and can avail of physical and mental stimulation programmes, morning tea and a midday meal.

Chairpersons Paddy Garvey of Baile Mhuire and Tom Pierse of Ard Chúram said: "We are delighted to be leading this new service in Kerry. Both groups are grateful to the HSE for supporting this service which was identified by the Kerry Stroke Support Group. When a person survives a stroke, it's not only their life that may be turned upside down, it's their family and those closest to them who are also affected. There can often be an impact on people's capacity to access services to promote their rehabilitation. We are confident that the new Stroke Day Service in Tralee and Listowel will be a success and of immense benefit to all stroke survivors. It is our hope we will demonstrate the effectiveness and value for money of this community-based approach and that similar projects will be developed in other areas."

Both Chairpersons would like to acknowledge the support of staff and management in both HSE Community Services and University Hospital Kerry as well as the National Office for Service Improvement of Older People.

The Stroke Day Service will commence in November and it will operate one day a week in Ard Chúram Day Care Centre, Listowel on Mondays and in Baile Mhuire Day Care Centre for Older Persons, Tralee on Fridays from 10am to 3pm in both locations. 
The Relatives & Friends Programme will begin from Tuesday 6th November at Randles Hotel, Killarney.

USING YOUR PENSION TO PAY LESS TAX

Pension contributions provide a way of paying less income tax. Up to Revenue Limits, contributions to a pension qualify for relief from income tax. This effectively means that, where the higher rate of income tax is 40% and you are a higher rate taxpayer, a €100 contribution to a pension will only have a net cost to you of €60 (had you not made the contribution, the other €40 would have gone to the government as income tax).

Pensions carry another tax benefit: they grow free of tax, unlike deposit accounts in Banks etc (which are generally subject to tax on interest in the form of DIRT) or investment in property or shares (where rent or dividends are liable to income tax and gains in value are subject to Capital Gains Tax). When pension benefits are drawn down, a Retirement Lump Sum can usually be taken either completely free of tax or subject to a beneficial rate. The rest of the benefit, usually taken in the form of a retirement fund or a pension for life, is taxable. However many people will find themselves in a lower tax bracket in retirement than when they were working and making pension contributions, and so will often not pay a lot of tax on their pension income when they retire.




Some of them had not met since they left the college and others had never been back there. They were given a tour of the buildings by Mr Coffev.



TIM GIVES HIS LAST COW TO RWANDA

An East Kerry farmer has spoken of his joy at the seeing Afirst-hand how his very last dairy cow, which he gifted to a

Tim Moynihan, from Gneeveguilla, along with his daughter Doreen travelled to the heart of Rwanda in central/eastern Africa to see themselves the remarkable impact that the last dairy cow from his farm has had on the Rwandan family.

family to a family in Rwanda, has transformed lives.

Tim gave up dairy farming six years ago and rather than sell his last cow he donated it through Bóthar to a family near Rwamagana in east Rwanda.

The single cow is just one of an ever growing 'Bóthar' herd that is transforming the lives of families across Rwanda – a nation that was savaged by the fastest killing spree in the history of the world almost 25 years ago when up to 1million people were slaughtered in its 90-day genocide.

The aid agency has been sending Irish dairy cows and other foodand-income producing animals such as goats, pigs and sheep to Rwanda – it also has projects elsewhere in Africa, Eastern Europe and Asia - since the late '90s thanks to the generosity of the Irish farmers and the wider public.

Its current programme in Rwanda is in support of the Rwandan government's 'One Cow Per Family' project which aims to reduce extreme poverty in rural areas of the country by providing each poor family with a cow.

The cow donated by Tim Moynihan has not alone given the parents and children of the recipient family a daily source of





nutrition they otherwise would not get but proceeds from excess milk and sale of calves born to her have enabled them to educate their children and buy land.

Tim said he was overjoyed at seeing the difference the cow had made and also at being reunited with her one last time. "I never dreamt in my life I'd ever again see that cow. I think she recognised me. We took a photograph of that cow before she left the farm and I have that photograph at home.

"The calf is the spit of her mother, star on the forehead and the stripe on the shoulder."

Looking back on the donation and the reasons for it, he said: "My farm is situated in East Kerry. And we milked cows there all my life. And when we decided to give up the cows, we went into suckling.

"We said we'd donate this heifer to a country that would need it more, and this was the last heifer to come from my farm."

He was also delighted with her condition. "The farming practice is very good here," he said. "I'm delighted. Couldn't be happier that I made this donation. I would over and over again. "I've heard that she has been very successful with the farmer. She's a champion cow. They had Little hope

of him ever being a good farmer. Well, he's beaten all the odds; that cow is the best milker in that part of Rwanda."

Tim's daughter Doreen travelled with him and spoke of the impact the trip had on her father. "This trip means a huge amount to my father to see how his donation has changed the lives of this family and what legacy this cow has given from its offspring being passed on and the help it's given to other families, not just one," she said.

"The experience we just had, seeing my father's cow now on this farm was just amazing; quite emotional actually to see how well she's done and how much she's done for the family."

The donation of Irish cows, which have a yield six times that of the best local cows, have had a transformational effect on the lives of an estimated 1.000 plus families.

Bóthar heifers arrive in calf, with each recipient family agreeing to pass on the first-born female calf to her to another family. Bóthar returns each year to re-impregnate the cows, so the cycle continues.

Prior to being given a heifer, each family undergoes a six-month programme of training in animal husbandry, water-harvesting and basic horticulture practices.

Women remembered at Tree Planting Ceremony

A tree has been planted in the grounds of County Buildings in Tralee by the Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council to mark the centenary of the extension of parliamentary suffrage to women in 1918. Cllr Norma Foley planted the oak tree at Áras an Chontae this afternoon to mark the one hundredth anniversary of the first general election in which many Irish women were entitled to vote for the first time.

In February 1918, the Representation of the People Act extended the vote to all men aged at least 21 and women aged 30 or older who were university graduates or owned property. The general election of 14 December 1918 was the first occasion on which women in Ireland were entitled to vote in a parliamentary poll.

'As Cathaoirleach of Kerry County Council, I was pleased to mark this important centenary by the symbolic planting of a tree in the grounds of Áras an Chontae, said Cllr Foley.

The enfranchisement of women in 1918 was an important first step to achieving full suffrage for women in Ireland and is one of the many important centenaries that occur at this time.

'This centenary is also an opportunity to honour the women who have served as members of Kerry County Council over the past century. While women were eligible to vote and stand in local elections from 1899, it was 1920 before a woman was first elected to Kerry County Council. Albinia Brodrick (Gobnait Ní Bhruadair) was a councillor from 1920 to 1926 and was followed on the council since then by 17 other women who have all played a role in shaping our county and our society.' 'I hope that this tree will serve as a symbolic memorial of the centenary of the first extension of the parliamentary vote to women in this country,' said Cllr Foley.

THE PLACE WHERE PEOPLE LIVE THE LONGEST

There is a small hamlet in south west Italy where more than 10% of the people are aged over 100, and 20% of this number live to be 110. This extraordinary statistic completely dwarfs the number of Irish, American, British or Australian centenarians, which stands at around 1 per 5,000 of the population. It's for this reason that a study has just been conducted to find out why the beautiful village of Acciaroli is the place with the oldest residents in the world.


The amazing thing about Acciaroli is that the local people here live a happy life, and don't pay much attention to their health. Not only do they smoke a lot, but they also eat greasy, fried fish, drink coffee all day and wine in the evening. They do not spend their time on exercise regimes. They neither jog nor do yoga.

Yet, they do not suffer from the typical chronic diseases that most western elderly people are prone too: illnesses like heart disease, obesity and Alzheimer's and no one over 80 had cataracts, which most people who reach a grand old age are afflicted with. It's for this reason a study was commissioned to find the secret of the beautiful Italian hamlet. The 6-month study of the area by Sapienza University and San Diego School of Medicine found that the local inhabitants of Acciaroli have amazingly good blood circulation for their age. After analysing the blood samples taken from just over 80 elderly people, the researchers realised that each of them had unbelievably low levels of a hormone known as adrenomedullin, which helps to widen blood vessels. When people age, their bodies usually produce more adrenomedullin, which contracts the blood vessels. This leads to circulatory problems and a whole host of debilitating health issues. Yet, the levels of adrenomedullin in these retired locals are at the same level as those of healthy people in their 20s and 30s.

The residents of Acciaroli generally eat local food, including locally caught sardines and anchovies. The anchovies are eaten in virtually every meal, which is interesting because this fish is full of antioxidants, which reduce cholesterol and inflammation. Many of them keep rabbits and chickens, which they kill for meat. Furthermore, the olive oil, wine, fruit, and vegetables are all locally grown too. Rosemary is also used in almost every meal and is also an ingredient in their Olive Oil, The lack of imported foods means they consume very fresh food, uninfected with pesticides.

The people of Acciaroli are incredibly active, though they don't exercise for the sake of it. Because the region is hilly, they are simply forced to drag themselves up and down, around and around, day after day.

Acciaroli is a quiet little town, far removed from much of the hustle and bustle that typifies modern living. Thus, the people there are relaxed. They enjoy sitting in cafes, where they talk politics, read the newspapers, drink coffee and take it easy.

CARING AMBULANCE WORKERS TOOK A DETOUR TO GRANT DYING MAN'S WISH FOR ICE CREAM

Thanks to the attention and kindness of two Australian ambulance workers, a dying man was able to have the last meal he most desired.

After 17 years of fighting pancreatic cancer, Ron McCartney was set to be taken into palliative carea few months ago. His wife Sharon, however, needed to call for a medical escort after her husband's sickness took a bad turn. While the Queensland paramedics conducted an evaluation in the ambulance, they discovered that the 72-year-old had not been eating for several days. The two paramedics, identified only as Kate and Hanna, asked the senior: "If you could eat anything... what would it be?" He replied, "A caramel sundae."

The medics then detoured from their route, so they could buy Mr. McCartney the sweet treat

before arriving at the hospital.

Shortly after the ambulance ride, Mr. McCartney's daughter Danielle Smith expressed her own appreciation for the compassion shown to her father before he passed away.

REMOVING GOATS BY HELICOPTER

Olympic National Park in Washington State is a 1442-square-mile expanse of mountains, meadows, and old-growth forest and is the rightful home of dozens of creatures. Spotted owls nest in its trees. Black bears trundle through its fields. Mazama pocket gophers burrow into its soils, and Roosevelt elk munch on its shrubs.

But it is not the rightful home of the mountain goat. At least, so say park officials, who have been trying to get rid of the goats—an introduced species—for decades. Recently, in collaboration with the USDA Forest Service and the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife, they began their latest, and most ambitious, removal effort.

The goats are suspended in slings, wearing blindfolds that fit snugly beneath their horns and hang vertically from a helicopter before being placed in the trailer of a lorry and if all goes well, over the next couple of years, hundreds of mountain goats will travel by helicopter and truck from Olympic National Park to the North Cascade Mountains, about 150 miles east. (There's a naturally occurring goat population in the Cascades, and the hope is that these newcomers will bolster it.) Eventually, goats that are too hard to capture will be killed. "The goal is to get to a zero population level," said park spokesperson Penny Wagner. Until about 1925, there were zero mountain goats on the Olympic Peninsula. The first four came to the area in 1925, brought over from British Columbia as game for local hunters. Over the next few years, these were joined by seven or eight more, this time shipped in from Alaska. While hunters did kill a fair number, the frisky goats outpaced them. By the early 1980s, this herd of a dozen had grown to 1,175.

Do you find yourself repeating similar patterns in different relationships or in a particular relationship over time? Perhaps you often feel lonely or jealous in your relationships. Maybe you try to earn the other person's attention by being overly nice or giving without paying heed to your own needs or desires. Do you fear rejection or being abandoned? Could it be that you choose partners who are distant and can make your feel and/or believe that you're not good enough. Do you focus so much on your partner that they feel stifled? Often these patterns can reflect our inner experiences and our beliefs about ourselves and our emotional availability to others. Psychologist John Bowlby defined attachment as a 'lasting psychological connectedness between human beings' and attachment theory can help us to understand the ways in which we connect with others - particularly those who are emotionally significant to us. We develop our attachment style in childhood - and the way in which our parents and/or caregivers responded to us will impact on our relationships.

For example, a child who believed that the only way he/she could be loved was when they were doing something for others, may grow up believing that they need to earn the attention and love of others. Adults who believe they are inadequate and unworthy of love may have learned this in their early years - which will inevitably lead to difficulties in their relationships. They may believe that the other will leave them or that they are going to disappoint the other - leading to them clinging to the relationship and/or getting jealous easily.

However, the good news is that with awareness we can discover our own attachment style and learn to cultivate healthier relationships. Some of the ways in which we can bring more awareness to our relationship patterns include the following:

- 1. Bring your awareness to your bodily sensations. How do you feel in your body? Being aware of this can help you to understand how you are feeling and/or thinking.
- 2. What thoughts are you thinking about you/ the other? How do these thoughts impact on your feelings and emotions?
- 3. Which emotions do you struggle with how do these emotions affect your thoughts and beliefs about yourself?
- 4. Are you overly self-critical? Can you show yourself some selfcompassion, support and care the way you might a close friend or a small child?
- 5. Learn to communicate more directly about your thoughts, feelings and needs. Once you become aware of what these are then you can express them more fully to others.

Next week we will focus on the importance of communication and how counselling can help us to find our own voice, and become more confident as we make ourselves known to another person.
