THINKING ABOUT FEELINGS

When someone comes along to counselling and begins to talk about what is troubling them, one of the difficulties that sometimes emerges is their sense of having feelings that are 'bad' or 'wrong'. Perhaps they have been experiencing feelings of anger, or frustration, or maybe sadness, or regret. They may see such feelings as negative or self-pitying, and not compatible with being a good and kind and positive person. They wish these feelings would just go away. But, however much they try to wish them away, the feelings stubbornly persist. So then they experience shame and anxiety about having what they see as such negative feelings, and this shame and anxiety gets added to the mix, and just makes everything worse.

Counselling can offer us time and space in which we can talk about, and think about, all the different aspects of our emotional life, without using labels like positive or negative, right or wrong, good or bad. Instead, the counsellor provides a non-judgemental relationship, in which all aspects of our emotional experience can be heard and thought about. If we can slow things down a bit, begin to make sense of our feelings, and see them as an unsurprising response to aspects of our life experience, they are much less likely to cause us anxiety.

Gradually, we become more able to manage our feelings and get on with our lives, instead of our feelings managing us, perhaps by making us anxious or irritable or unconfident or withdrawn. We learn to accept that, if we face difficult and challenging situations in the future then, naturally, we are bound to experience difficult and challenging feelings within ourselves. And when we have to bear particularly difficult circumstances or events in our lives, there is no shame in seeking support to work through our feelings about them.

A counsellor is able to sustain an open and accepting attitude to another person's feelings, without anxiety getting in the way, because, through their own training and personal development, they accept that having emotional responses to life's events is a part of what it is to be human. Perhaps then, the more accepting and tolerant we can be towards our own emotional life, the more kindly and accepting we are able to be towards the feelings of others.

PLANNING TO **BECOME PREGNANT-**

GENERAL ADVICE BY DR MOLONEY

CONTINUED **MEDICAL CONDITIONS**

Women with certain medical conditions may benefit from advice before becoming pregnant. See your doctor if you have concerns about a medical condition which may affect pregnancy. For example:

- For some conditions, the medication or treatment may possibly affect the pregnancy or the unborn child - for example, epilepsy.
- For some conditions, the condition itself may require special attention during the pregnancy - for example, diabetes.
- If a hereditary condition runs in your family, you may benefit from genetic

MEDICATION: The effects of some prescribed drugs have been well studied and it is known that certain drugs are safe in pregnancy. For example, paracetamol at normal dose is safe and useful for headaches, backache and other aches and pains that may occur during pregnancy. However, some drugs are not safe, and may be harmful to a developing baby - in particular, if you take them in the early weeks of

Therefore, always tell a doctor or dentist who prescribes medication for you that you are pregnant, or intend to become pregnant. Also, don't take drugs that you can buy over the counter (including herbal remedies) unless they are known to be safe in pregnancy. The pharmacist will advise.

If you already take regular medication (for example, for epilepsy), it is important to discuss this with a doctor before becoming pregnant. If you have an unplanned pregnancy, discuss with your doctor as soon as possible any medication that you take. FOOD AND DIET: Eat a healthy balanced diet: Aim to eat a healthy diet (which everyone should be eating, not just pregnant women). Briefly, the bulk of most meals should be starch-based foods (such as bread, cereals, potatoes, rice, and pasta), with fruit and vegetables. Eat protein foods such as meat, fish, pulses, chicken, etc, in moderation.

Don't 'eat for two' by over-eating when you become pregnant. Too much weight gain increases your risk of developing problems later in the pregnancy. Also, extra weight is difficult to lose after the birth.

Include foods with plenty of iron, calcium and folic acid

A growing baby needs these nutrients right from the start of the pregnancy:

- Iron is mainly in red meat, pulses, dried fruit, green vegetables and fortified cereals.
- Calcium is mainly in dairy products such as milk, cheese, and yoghurt.
- Folic acid is mainly in green vegetables, brown rice, and fortified cereals.

WHAT ABOUT SUPPLEMENTS?

As mentioned, folic acid and vitamin D supplements are recommended for all pregnant women. No other supplements are routinely advised if you have a normal diet. However, some women have low iron stores which puts them at risk of becoming anaemic during pregnancy. The routine blood tests that are done during pregnancy will detect anaemia and the need for iron supplements.

INCREASE IN CYCLIST **INJURIES IN 2012**

The Road Safety Authority (RSA) has published an in-depth report on cyclist casualties that occurred in 2012, which shows that cyclist injuries hit a ten-year high (2002 to 2012) as 630 cyclists were injured on Ireland's roads. This represents a 59% increase compared to cyclist injuries in 2011.

335 or just over half of all cyclists were injured in Dublin alone.

The report revealed that the mid-week, evening and morning rush-hour, including lunchtime, were the times cyclists were most likely to be injured. Cyclist injuries peaked during May to September, where over half (54%) of cyclists injuries occurred. Three quarters of cyclists injured in 2012 were male, while over half were aged 25-49.

The RSA is asking all cyclists to be aware of their vulnerability on the roads and is advising cyclists to make sure they are equipped with the correct safety gear when they are out on their bike. It is also vital that cyclists follow the rules of the road and traffic regulations in order to ensure their safety on the road.

The number of cyclists on the roads has increased in recent years, particularly in cities, and Central Statistics Office (2011) figures show a 9.6% increase in people cycling to work, and that men account for the majority of cyclists in Ireland (75%).

THE RSA HAS THE FOLLOWING ADVICE FOR CYCLISTS & DRIVERS:

Never cycle in the dark without adequate lighting - white for front, red for rear

Always wear luminous clothing such as hi-vis vests, fluorescent armbands and reflective belts so that other road users can see you

Wear a helmet

Make sure you keep to the left. Always look behind and give the proper signal before moving off, changing lanes or making a turn Steer well clear of left-turning trucks / buses: let them turn before you move ahead. Remember if you cannot see the driver the driver cannot see you.

Maintain your bike properly - in particular, your

brakes should work properly and your tyres should be inflated to the right pressure and be in good condition

Watch your speed, especially when cycling on busy streets and going downhill

Drivers need to pay greater attention to their speed, particularly in urban areas, as this precrash factor has the biggest bearing on survival

Drivers should choose a speed that is appropriate for the environment and their surroundings, this is especially true when sharing the road with cyclists and pedestrians

Drivers should watch out for cyclists in their blind spots and at junctions, especially when turning left or right.





ROWING TO RIO

The Monika Dukaraska Blog The story of a professional athlete

The week leading up to the national trials was filled with uncertainty and as it appeared later on, some crucial last minute decisions. My preparation for trials

was divided between bike and water work. I had to assess the condition of the body on daily basis to ensure that I'm in a good shape for the camp as well as to continue training. I have finally got back into my single scull and covered around 12 to 16 kilometers uninterrupted. Unfortunately I was not in a position to go through with my race preparation during the week due to the number of recent niggles. The racing preparation consisted of high rate (often flat out) 2,000m, 1250m, 750m and 250m pieces in the days leading up to the trial. Not doing it was a precaution as the training camp in Varese. Italy is a big stepping stone for the Irish crews in the lead up to our first international event in May and it is crucial to complete the camp in full.

There is often an inside struggle in the athletes mind as to whether race or not. If I am not going to give my 100% best, I don't want to do it at all. When I race, I race flat out, leaving everything on the water. Although my recent injuries have nearly settled there was a possibility that I would put myself in danger and I could aggravate the leg ligament during the race. Hence, it was only smart to opt out from racing at the weekend and recover in full for

On a positive note. I have made huge improvements in my single. Having spent so much time away from the boat enabled me to work on my posture, core strength and as a result I have improved my pattern of movement which again resulted in a better boat speed. Injuries often enable athletes to work on areas which are neglected due to volume of the programme. I am getting stronger day by day and I'm looking forward to return to full training on Monday in Varese, Italy.

The camp will be challenging and demanding on the body and the mind. I will let you know how I am doing next Thursday! Watch that space Keep up to date with Monika on twitter at @MDukarska

WHERE ARE THEY NOW

New Zealand in my mind had always been a barren, dry country but I couldnt have been more wrong, as its lush green landscape is in fact very similar to Ireland, but with a warmer climate of course, and as I travelled southwest from Hamilton to a small town called Te Aroha, I noticed even more similarities to home as dairy farming was evidently a big industry here. Located at the foot of the 952m high Mount Te Aroha, the town of the same name is home to just under 4000 inhabitants of which four of them hail from Woodlawn Road Killarnev. namely former underage and senior Legion footballer Pat O'Sullivan, his wife Julia and their two kids, Torin aged 11 and Seren aged 8. Its actually in the dairy farming industry that Pat has mostly worked since he arrived here in New Zealands North Island back in 2005 and as he readily admits that prior to arriving here that he knew absolutely nothing about dairy farming or any other kind of farming for that matter but he reckons that, because during his original interview with dairy company Fonterra, they couldnt understand a word that he was saying, only that he appeared supremely confident that they decided to give him the start and he has worked there since, going from his original role in project management at the cheese processing plant to his new post since September 2014 a vendor manager in procurement. Pat, now 46, grew up in Woodlawn Road in Killarnev and is a son of Paddy and Lucy and has a brother Steve and a sister Liz and its here where the Legion interest continues as Liz is married to current club juvenile chairman, Paddy Osbourne and their three children, Robert, David and Rebecca have all been involved with the club, 1977 was the year that Pat first donned the green and white and he says in his early days most of the games were played in what was then known as St Finians pitch and its from here that Pat has one of his first memories of club people that would go on to have an influence on him throughout his playing career"I always remember an under 10 training session up at the 'mental" pitch. I don't think I touched the ball during the game and came off thinking that I wasn't very good

and Weeshie Fogarty coming up to myself and my mother and saying what a great little player I was and how hard I had tried. Weeshie was always great and picking players up and giving them a bit of self belief," says Pat. Pat went on to recall a few of his underage succeses but as he says, it was only a few but he does remember winning an u14 and an u21 East kerry title and then achieving success again at u21 level in the County Championship with Killarney (Legion/ Spa). Pat was on the Kerry Vocational Schools team that won the All Ireland title in 1986 and with the opposition on the day being Offaly, who better to give a dressing room talk before the game than Bomber Liston and with the famous "82 final still raw in Listons memory, to say that his speech was animated, would be majorly underestimated, recalls Pat. Pats displays with the club and school earned him a well deserved Kerry Minor trial but with, Larry Fagan due to collect him on Saturday morning to drive him to north Kerry for that session, Pat picked up an injury the evening before and missed out on what surely would have been a place on the minor panel. Pat has great praise for Larry Fagan, who did trojan work for the club and he also has special mention for Johnny Culloty who, at u12 level drilled in the importance of "pass and move". Pat continued playing senior for the club right up until he left Killarney in 1990 having the distinction in the previous August of being on the first ever Legion senior team to play in Derreen, lining out on the day alongside the likes of Donal O'Donoghue, Conor McNiece, Tomas Lyne, Gerry Griffin and captain Connie O'Carroll. Pats last game for the club was against Spa shortly before he emigrated to England in June 1990, where he would stay for the following 15 years. Pat did however line out once more with the club as he took part on a winning team in the clubs then annual O'Meara cup during a visit home during the Xmas of 1992. In 1995, the couple moved back to London where Pat had secured a job with Guinness, then the parent company of Diageo in Stansted. Pat stayed active during this time, playing Sunday league football but after a succession of injuries, Pat

hung up his boots in 2003, the same year that their first PAT O'SULLIVAN child, Torin was



born. Two years later, they departed England and headed to the southern hemisphere where they still reside today.

Pat has since swapped his football boots for a squash racket and has played regularly since he moved here almost ten years ago and he also stays in shape by recently taking up Cross Fit training. Pat stays in touch regularly with club affairs, mostly through the results section on the Kerry Gaa website and the clubs facebook page and it was on the facebook page that he really enjoyed watching match highlights and he says that he would love to see this being ressurected again. When I last met Pat, it was back in 2013 in Killarney, while Pat and his family were home but due to the long distance involved, he reckons it will be next year 2016 before he gets to visit again but he is already looking forward to it as he does admit to missing the craic in Killarney, especially in the Summer months and going to the pub for a pint of Guinness or two or ten. As for returning home on a permanent basis, Pat says that it isnt in his plans at the moment.

I asked Pat if he saw much of a change in the GAA between his days playing football and the game as it is today and his response was fact that it's still an amateur sport played by people because they love the game. However, the level of expectation from supporters and the scrutiny from the media, especially at inter county, goes beyond the pale at times. I read the match reports on line. Oh yeah, and when did all the players start doing the body building and trying to look like mini - Schwartzneggers?? I hadn't realised you needed big biceps to play football". I then bid Pat and his lovely family farewell as we all looked forward to 2016......

Tommys Farming Week

February is a month that refuses to be pigeonholed, it is, according to the weather people, still winter. However, the ancient Irish saw it differently, Imbolc or St Brigid's day celebrated the imminent arrival of spring. Days are getting longer, sun warmer and life is once again appearing all around us. It is no wonder that St Brigid is the patron saint of dairy cows, farmers and milkmaids. Their years' work traditionally started in earnest around the same time. Good friends of ours, farming in Maryland, USA, called their farm after St Brigid for that reason. Google "St Brigid's Farm" for an interesting visit. February is the month when farming in Ireland returns, quite literally, to life.

Calving cows "en bloc" is a tough experience, yet it is the aim of every self-respecting modern dairy person. Over the past decade, we have strived to breed cows capable of going in calf at the mere mention of AI and we appear to be succeeding. When Padraig scanned the cows last autumn, we had ninety animals due to calve within the month of February. Busy days ahead.

The phrase "be careful what you wish for" springs to mind after the week just ended on this farm. Last Sunday started quietly, no newborn calf on the ground, milking, feeding and other jobs done by ten, basketball at eleven in Tralee. Home by one, heifer in labour, put into calving shed, early afternoon start to milking, basketball in Killarney at five thirty. Heifer not calved when leaving, Jack on duty. Text at six, calf delivered, all fine. Home at eight, stomach tube calf with colostrum, tag and move. Go through springing group, five animals in labour. All moved to calving shed. Three calved by one am, another by two, all calves stomach tubed and tagged, half an hour later nothing happening, move heifer to the crush to investigate. Dead calf deep in the womb, badly presented. Four am, physically exhausted, shattered, counting the years to retirement, I set my alarm for seven and fall

Monday, calves and cows without problems, life is good again. Milking getting tougher, five new heifers to "train". Bed at ten, heifer going into labour, set clock for one. One on clock, calf caught at the hips, pulled easily but heifers hock nerves deadened. More problems for Tuesday. Alarm set for six thirty. Leaving the yard at midnight on Tuesday night, twenty calves on the ground, all stomach

tubed or trained to feeder nipples, ten fresh heifers in the milking parlour, one heifer requiring TLC, all since Sunday l was evening praying for a quiet day on Wednesday. Thankfully only one delivery the following day and a full night's sleep. By today, less than three weeks into calving, almost seventy of those scanned ninety are delivered Things should get easier shortly but a sobering experience, roll on March, stiff breezes and sleep filled nights beckon.



These are therefore the primary grasses sown in reseeds. When we reseed, it is because ours swards have less than 80% PRG content and possibly have low fertility levels and high weed infestation. Soil testing before sowing will give the best indication of what the ground needs.

TEAGASC LOOKING TO TRAIN FARM MANAGERS

€17,500 a year and Ireland needs 150 new dairy farm managers every year to cope with the projected dairy expansion in Ireland.

The Irish Farm Managers Association's Professional Diploma in Dairy Farm Management (PDDFM) is fully paid course and is looking to increase its student intake from the current number of 16 to 150.

"We believe to truly upskill future dairy farmers and meet the requirement for capable people at farm level there must be 150 graduates per year from the PDDFM," said John Fitzgerald, Chairman of the Irish Farm Managers Association.

"This will include people who plan to farm at home in the future and those who won't inherit a farm and will pursue a career in farm management or share farming."

He also said that more people need to be employed to run the PDDFM.

"There is currently only one person to both support the learning of students in the programme and to promote the course to potential candidates.

"More of the 600 students entering Level 5 education in Teagasc every year must be recruited."

an option to pursue a Level 8 qualification so as to attract ambitious students seeking a degree level qualification.

There are currently 600 students entering Level 5 education in the Agricultural Colleges and this group of 600 students are the primary target in terms of candidates for the Diploma in Dairy Farm Management, he said.

"Having consulted with Dairygold and Kerry Group, they each believed that they need approximately 75 highly skilled young people entering the dairy industry in their respective catchment areas. This is not taking into consideration the requirements of all other dairy producing areas of the country."

He said that anyone undertaking a college course is paying in the region of €7,000-€8,000 a year, while the Diploma in Dairy Farm Management has a payment involved for those undertaking it.

The two-year course sees students working on two Irish farms with the option of going to New Zealand for a six month placement.

ELEPHANTS ARE NOT AFRAID OF MICE:

This myth has been depicted in movies, cartoons, and even touted as fact, but there is no scientific basis to the claim that elephants are afraid of mice. Researchers have disproved this myth and attributed it to elephants being startled by anything that blends in with their environment and then suddenly becomes present — which can be any small or large camouflaged animal.

Experts actually discovered that as an evolutionary safeguard for plants that would otherwise get trampled by elephants, when plants are blanketed by ants the massive animals stay away.



4 SIMPLE WAYS TO MAKE YOUR CAT HAPPIER:

There's a common misconception that cats are self-reliant, that they don't need anything special to be content but that couldn't be further from the truth. If you take a little time to enrich your cat's environment you'll have a happier cat and you don't have to spend a fortune to do it.

There are some very simple changes you can make to your home and your daily routine that will help give kitty the stimulation she needs to keep her entertained while you're away and promote bonding while you're together.

The process starts by observing your cat and her preferences (does your cat prefer to be up high or down low? Does she like to scratch horizontally or vertically?) and then catering to those preferences

1. A cat superhighway provides a way for a cat to navigate around a room without touching the floor. You can start by looking at the existing furniture in the room and rearranging it to make it easier for your cat to jump from one surface to the next. You may need to add some cat shelves or a cat tree to connect your superhighway, and make sure to attach nonslip mats or carpet pieces to the surfaces to prevent slipping.

2. Schedule some interactive playtime with your cat every day. For these workout sessions, use a wand toy with a feather or other eyecatching attachment on the end of a string. Make your cat jump and chase the toy just like she would do with her prey in the wild. Use your new cat superhighway as part of the racetrack.

So kitty will have something to stalk while you're away, make sure to have some smaller toys that she can toss around and carry in her mouth. (Just don't leave out any toys with string, ribbon, yarn or rubber bands while you're not at home.) Many cats enjoy toys with catnip, plus there are several other herbs you could try. Remember to check with your veterinarian before giving your cat any herbs.

s he 3. While you're away, kitty will play, so why not give her a little challenge? Puzzle toys and treat dispensers are great ways to keep your cat entertained and active. These toys are designed to dispense treats or food while your cat bats them around, encouraging her to exercise and catering to her natural instinct to hunt prey. If you're trying to cut kitty's calories, rather than adding treats, you can divide the normal food allotment for the day into smaller meals dispensed by the food puzzle. Another alternative is to use a larger puzzle box that can be filled with small toys (big enough not to present a choking hazard) instead of food. Fill puzzles with treats or toys before you leave in the morning and before you go to bed at night. Place them around the house so your cat will come across them as she goes about her daily or nightly activities.

4. You don't want things to get boring for your cat, so think about changing the environment a little on a regular basis. Try moving the cat tree to a different corner or to the centre of the room — your cat may see it as new again. Rotate the cat toys by putting some away for a while and then switch the toys for variety.

AUSTRALIA'S **OLDEST** SPENDS FREE TIME KNITTING TINY SWEATERS FOR INJURED **PENGUINS:**

109 year old Alfred "Alfie" Date, likes to spend his free time knitting little sweaters for injured penguins in his room at a retirement home in New South Wales.

Alfie picked up the hobby over 80 years ago, when his sister-in-law handed him a pair of needles and some wool and asked the man to knit a jumper for her baby boy.

The great-great-grandfather continues to knit and enjoys taking requests, so when two nurses asked if he wanted to knit sweaters for needy penguins, Alfie started putting on the stitches.

His creations were donated to Victoria's Phillip Island Penguin Foundation to help little penguins affected by an oil spill. Little penguins are a rare species only found in Australia and New Zealand, with just 32,000 living on Phillip Island.

Oil from the spill caused the penguins' feathers to stick together, allowing cold water to reach their skin. Sweaters from generous knitters like Alfie helped the birds stay warm while they waited to be cleaned up. The garments also prevented the penguins from picking at their feathers and accidentally consuming the

Thanks to Alfie and thousands of other knitters from around the world, Victoria's Phillip Island Penguin Foundation was overwhelmed with cosy jumpers, which allowed the foundation to fully rehabilitate many of the birds.

SKITTLES THE SOON TO BE **SERVICE DOG:**

Skittles is a six month-old female Amaley Sheltie pup with an extraordinary purpose. She is ready and waiting to commit her life to a veteran, who has given some of the best years of his/her life in the service of Canada and returned home with severe operationalrelated wounds and disabilities.

Born in Manitoba on June 14, 2014, she is intelligent, has a beautiful disposition and is exceedingly gentle and friendly. She started her service dog training when she was six weeks old and is being trained to Level 3, which is the highest standard and the most complex training done by Courageous Companions dog trainers. She will be paired with a veteran with multiple disabilities which could include missing limbs, seizures, debilitating anxiety, brain trauma, vision and hearing impairment, or severe psychological injuries.

Meghan Search and Rescue, a training standards organisation, and Courageous Companions, a non-profit organisation supporting veterans, are training Skittles to provide psychiatric support, deliberately disobey and redirect the veteran's negative behaviour, prevent or interrupt emotional awaken the veteran from nightmares, provide a calming effect, do crowd control and panic prevention in public, arouse the veteran from fear or disassociating episodes, assist a veteran to leave an area by finding an exit, identify danger and hazards that a veteran may not be aware of, help the veteran to feel calm in congested space by expanding the space, and detect seizures and high blood pressure. All of this is a very big job

for a little dog with a big heart, and she is up to it!

In the Courageous Companions program, there are no costs to the veterans. Sponsors cover expenses. They have 31 dogs ready to go to veterans and another 43 veterans with dogs waiting to continue their training, but demand exceeds their ability to keep pace with funding.

One solution to address the waiting list could lie with the Royal Canadian Legion. According to their Dominion Command, the 2013 annual Poppy Campaign alone raised \$14 million, Each branch of the Legion has the ability to provide 25 per cent of their Poppy Funds for service dogs. That's \$3.5 million nationally. That may be enough to provide a service dog for every qualifying and waiting veteran in Canada, but for reasons unknown the Royal Canadian Legion's Ontario Provincial Command will no longer permit the province's branches to allocate any Poppy Funds to service dogs, all that can be hoped is that the remaining Provincial Commands will not follow Ontario's example.

Know Your Rights: RENT INCREASES

FEBRUARY 2015

QUESTION

I have been renting an apartment for over a year and my landlord phoned me last week to tell me that he is increasing my rent. Does he have the right to do this?

ANSWER

The amount of rent payable for a property is agreed between the landlord and tenant at the start of a tenancy. If you are living in private rented accommodation, under the Residential Tenancies Act 2004, your landlord must follow certain procedures if he wants to raise the rent.

Your landlord has the right to review the rent once a year. A rent review can result in an increase or reduction of the rent. Unless the accommodation has changed substantially, it cannot be reviewed more often than this, or during the first 12 months of the tenancy.

Your landlord must give you at least 28 days' notice of the amount of the proposed new rent and the date from which it is to take effect. The notice must be in writing. Emails, text messages and phone calls are not valid forms of notice.

Threshold, the national housing charity, publishes detailed advice on how to deal with rent increases, including a list of tips on dealing with your landlord. You can contact Threshold for advice on your particular situation by calling 1890 334 334 or through their website, threshold.ie.

The Private Residential Tenancies Board (PRTB) deals with disputes between landlords and tenants, including disputes about rent reviews. If there is any dispute about the amount of rent being proposed, either side can refer the dispute to the PRTB. If the landlord has given you a valid written notice of the rent increase, you must contact the PRTB with your dispute before the date that the new rent comes into effect or within 28 days of getting the notice, whichever is later. There is no time limit if the notice is not valid.

You must continue to pay your current rent until the case has been determined by the PRTB.


